Salvation Army rings out for help



The Salvation Army has sounded the alarm for more help from the public to serve needy families on Christmas. The reason is that more people are asking for

Because more families than ever are showing need this holiday season, the Salvation Army is making an emergency call for help.

"There's an urgent need for businesses, churches, civic groups or families to become sponsors or adopters for our Adopt-A-family program, said Howard Matthews, program di-

The emergency is sparked by a record number of families seeking

help this holiday season.

We already have about 250 (families) that have been screened and we are trying to match up," Matthews

That number, reached before Thanksgiving, already surpasses the 240 families helped through the program last year.

"We feel there's going to be a lot more, maybe 300 families or more than that," before Christmas, Matthews said. "We need as many adopters as possible.'

Matthews stressed that interested families should not ask about the program when calling the Plymouth Salvation Army.

"If they're interested, call 453-5487 and request an information packet," he said, adding workers don't have the time to explain the problem to everyone who calls.

Why so many? "I think the economy, one, and aggressive work on our part getting the word out to the families," he said.

"We can keep their names confidential if they request it - In this area there's a lot of people that don't want it known if they need help."

Families seeking help through the program are screened to determine if their need is real. The Salvation Army follows government guidelines on what constitutes poverty level, but Matthews said these aren't strictly

Those seeking to adopt a family are told clothing sizes, gender and ages of family members.

"We treat people with respect and dignity and as much as possible guard their privacy," he said.

While the Salvation Army is a Christian organization, Matthews stresses that people of all beliefs get help if they meet financial guidelines.

Public input welcomed at meeting

The first meeting of the new Plymouth Township board of trustees was marked by new emphasis from supervisor Kathleen Keen-McCarthy on public participation.

And among those members of the public anxious to participate was Jim Haar, head of the union representing township firefighters.

Haar urged trustees to hire three new firefighters, to adequately protect residents. 'I realize the new board has only been in

office a few days," he said. But Haar stressed that the new \$1.5 million

fire station at Beck Road and a new fire truck and ambulance at the site "are all sitting idle due to a lack of staffing."

"This is not a dollars and sense issue, this is a life safety issue," he told trustees.

TOWNSHIP BOARD

The board didn't respond to Harr's comment during the meeting, but Keen-McCarthy said this issue was a top priority item to be addressed by the board.

Other new board members are trustees Kay Arnold, Charles Curmi and Kay Mueller and clerk Marilyn Massengill. The only remaining members from the previous board are trustee Ron Griffith and treasurer Mary Brooks.

We want to encourage greater citizen participation," Keen-McCarthy said in opening the meeting.

She's moved up the portion of the meeting devoted to citizen comments from later in the meeting to right near the beginning. And on each agenda item the board takes up during a meeting - they're usually scheduled for the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month citizens comments will be sought.

"We hope that these changes will encourage people to be involved," Keen-McCarthy said.

The new supervisor has planned a "team building session" to include township board members and administrative staff Dec. 4 and 5 at Schoolcraft College.

The time and exact location for the sessions have not been set, but will be open to the public, Keen-McCarthy said.

She also plans to schedule study sessions on issues before the township board in public study sessions to be held from 7:30-9 p.m. the first and third Tuesdays of each month.

Keen-McCarthy said one would be scheduled for Dec. 8, at the township board room.

Fight complaint


Plymouth police were called to Mr. B's restaurant on Ann Arbor Road shortly after midnight Nov. 24 to break up a fight. The complainant was a 22-year-old Plymouth man. The second man, who was bleeding from the back of the head, was a 21-year-old from Dearborn man.

The two said they'd exchanged hostile words all evening and then things exploded. The Dearborn man couldn't remember who started the fight or how he sustained a head in-

The complainant and his brother also had trouble remembering how the melee began. According to police, the complainant and witnesses said the Dearborn man made a loud statement confessing he was crazy. He then spiked a cue ball into the pool table. The cue ball bounced by the complainant, distracting him. The Dearborn man then punched the complainant in the mouth, cutting the inside of his lower lip, police said.

A witness made an effort to separate the two, but the Dearborn man punched him in the right eye. The cut to his cheek required stitches.

Onlookers eventually broke up the fight. The Dearborn man was issued a ticket for assault and battery.





Charges expected in fatal crash

Canton police are waiting to serve a warrant against a 21-year-old Plymouth man who has been charged with causing his brother's death in a car accident last month.

"Our department does not intend to serve the warrant while he's hospitalized," Canton police information officer Tammie Colling said last week.

The prosecutor's office issued a one count felony warrant against the Plymouth man for operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol and causing a

The suspect is recovering from injuries sustained in the Oct. 23 one-car accident. He was listed in good condition last week at the University of Michigan Hospital, Ann Arbor.

His brother, William Tustian, 26, was killed after the 1985 Dodge convertible the suspect was driving left the roadway and rolled over on Warren Road just east of Lilley where the road curves. It was ap-


proximately 3:50 a.m. Police believe the convertible top was closed at the time of the accident. The brothers, however, were not wearing seatbelts.

The accident occurred, apparently after the brothers were at a bachelor party in honor of William Tustian who was to be married the day after the accident. Initial studies indicated the car was traveling an estimated 64 mph.

As in all accidents where a death is involved, Canton police conducted a thorough investigation and gave results to the Wayne County Prosecutor's office. Canton police declined discussing details of the investigation until the warrant is issued.

"I don't feel comfortable with releasing information about the blood alcohol level and the speed until after he's been arraigned," according to Canton police Detective William Keppen, who is in charge of Canton's accident investigation team.

The charge, operating a vehicle while under the influence and causing a death, is a new statute adopted earlier this year. It carries up to 15 years in prison. The new law in many cases, replaces manslaughter charges, which carries the same prison

Utley inspires those who are physically challenged

Bob Moore, 19, paralyzed in a car accident two years ago, con-vinced his dad to drive him to Plymouth from Hillsdale Friday afternoon. Michael Hudy, 12, of Redford also got here thanks to his dad, Mike Hudy. Michael has spina bifida and is in a wheel-

Sophie Ethans drove from Benton Harbor, picking up her dad, Gus Ethans, in Livonia on the

Beth Stephens, 11, has dwarfism and came with her father, Leland Stephens, from Dearborn.

What inspired them, and hundreds of other folks, to come to Plymouth's Blackwell Ford Inc. was Mike Utley.

Utley, formerly a right guard for the Detroit Lions, was in town for the Oilers-Lions Thanksgiving Day game at the Silverdome. Paralyzed in a freakish accident in the Nov. 17, 1991, game against the Los Angeles Rams a year ago, Utley was honorary captain in Thursday's game.

As a thank you to Blackwell, which gave Utley and his girlfriend. Debbie Riddle of Rochester, use of a 1993 Thunderbird for 10 days, Utley offered to sign autographs for a few hours in the dealership showroom.

The affable Utley smiled, joked, visited and posed for photos with fans who arrived in such a steady stream he really didn't get a

Utley autographed 8 x 10 action photos of himself and sold "thumbs up" T-shirts with the help of Jim Wauldron and Tony McDonnell of the Livonia-based Wauldron Corp., who set up the

The T-shirts are Wauldron's brainchild. When the Plymouth resident saw Utley give the thumbs up sign as he was carried from the field on a stretcher after his injury, it gave him an idea. Wauldron designed thumbs-up T-shirts, sweatshirts and caps and secured an NFL license to sell the merchandise for all 28 NFL teams

Of the \$300,000 raised by the Mike Utley Foundation for Spinal Cord Injury Research Foundation thus far, more than \$150,000 has come from the sales of thumbs-up merchandise. The NFL is donating royalties to the foundation.

Utley's goal

Determined to defy doctors and walk again, Utley is turning over the foundation's proceeds to research in hopes of finding a cure for paralysis.

For No. 60, some might think it's fourth and long. But not Utley - who has regained movement in many of his muscles - and not those who came to see him.

Jason Carruthers, Tom Hoffman and Jeff Mielke, buddies from Field Elementary School, waited in line to meet Utley.

Jason and Tom wore their Honolulu blue-and-silver Canton Lions jackets.

When they first came out with the shirts, I ran out and bought one," said Jason, who plays tackle for the Lions. "I want to see how Mike is doing and ask him if he thinks he'll ever walk again.'

"I was at the game where he got paralyzed," said Tom, a running back with the Lions. "I saw him give the thumbs up sign." Bob Moore broke his neck when

the car he was riding in flipped on the way to a local bar. Moore and his buddy were going to meet friends after a high school basketball game.

"I've read articles about Mike Utley, and he says a lot of the same things I say. So I decided to come see how he's doing," said

A quadraplegic, Moore says his philosophy is, "Day by day, life's OK. Inch by inch, life's a cinch."

Len Gossman is Blackwell's general sales manager. "Mike Utley is an excellent role model, not just for kids, but for life in general," he said. "He's a very strongwilled, determined person.

"We could all learn a lesson from Mike, and that's commitment to yourself. Give yourself 110 percent. Decide what you want out of life and what you want to do, and you can overcome just about any obstacle."

Rucinski was nominated for the award by parents and staff at Farrand. She is known as







Drunken-driver victims' testimony stirs crowd

The Wayne County chapter of Mothers Against Drunk Driving eased into its holiday campaign last week with a press conference that began with boilerplate speeches by various officials and finished with two poignant stories by victims of drunken drivers.

The contrast was startling. After digesting the routine talks of Wayne County Sheriff Robert Ficano, Wayne County chief assistant prosecutor George Ward, state police Capt. Anthony Philipps and Dearborn Mayor Michael Guido, spectators felt their guts tighten as Speed and Joyce Gant poured out their story in a restrained emotional manner that would have filled a collection plate with 10s and 20s if one had

The Gants were driving 25 miles per hour in Detroit in March 1990 when a drunken driver doing 70 mph without the benefit of license, insurance or headlights hit them head on.

been passed.

"Neither one of us saw him coming," Speed said. "I thought (Joyce) was dead and I'd just breathed my last breath."

As the two of them lay there half in and half out of the car.

"The worst part of the whole thing was I didn't have any control over this. As long as there are drunken drivers on the road you don't have control over your own life. The next time you take a drink I want you to remember this thing (the brace) and I want you to remember me.'

Speed with seven cracked ribs and a crushed hand, Joyce with a broken neck, fractured wrist and severe bruising - two men attempted to rob them. Luckily, the police arrived in time to prevent that final indignity.

"To tell you that I'm lucky is a major understatement," Joyce said. She wore a halo traction brace for three months thereafter, a device that "works on the principal of a vice. The pins were bolted to my skull. For three months I was unable to take a shower or a

Livonia resident Darlene Hodges had a similar story to tell

about her son Craig. Newly graduated from Franklin High School in 1989, Craig was on spring break in Florida with friends. Craig and one of his buddies were struck and killed by a drunken driver blowing a red light at 70 miles per hour.

The man who killed my son was found four hours later, and at the time was found to have a blood alcohol level of .21," Hodges said. As it turned out, the drunken driver was on parole from a sentence served for killing two people in a previous accident.

That pain will continue with me for the rest of my life," Hodges said. "My son's life is gone now

The purpose behind all this testimony is to highten popular sensitivity to how tragic a drunken-driving accident can be, particularly around the Christmas and New Year's holidays when folks tend to imbibe to excess and then

The severity of the punishment for drunken driving in Michigan has increased over the years, in part due to MADD's efforts.

A first offender can get up to 90 days in jail and a two-year suspended license.

Second offense: Up to one year in jail and revocation of license. Third offense: Up to five years

in jail and revocation of license. In a drunken-driving accident causing death, one can be jailed up to 15 years and have his or her license revoked.

Of the 1,425 traffic fatalities in Michigan in 1991, 44.6 percent occurred in accidents where alcohol played a part.

On the national level in 1990, there were 44,529 traffic accident deaths. It's estimated that 22,083 of them (49.6 percent) occurred in alcohol-related crashes.

MADD encourages Michigan residents to put red ribbons on their cars to show that they're opposed to drunken driving. Businesses all over town are distributing the ribbons. For more information, call MADD at 422-6233.

Parents question policy on films shown in class

As a negligence lawsuit involving the death of Plymouth-Canton student wends its way through court, some parents are questioning whether films their children are shown in class are potentially harmful.

Stephen Nalepa, 8, of Canton Township hung himself March 24, 1990, the day after viewing "Nobody's Useless" at Gallimore Elementary School.

Attorneys for his parents, Larry and Debbie Nalepa, allege the schools were negligent in showing the movie about a handicapped boy who decides life is worth living after trying to take his own life. The main character first attempts to kill himself by jumping off a bridge, then by hanging himself with a belt.

A Plymouth mother of boys ages 9, 7 and 3, Debbie Madonna says she is troubled by Stephen's death and is afraid other children could be harmed.

"I'd like to know how films are chosen, and what the guidelines are," said the parent, one of several who've expressed concerns in the aftermath of the death.

"I don't burn books, and I don't want to come off as a troublemaker. I like the teachers my kids have had. "But I'd be real upset if my

kids saw that movie. Kids don't think. I could see my 9-year-old doing something goofball and not asking me first.

"It's tough enough raising kids without something like this being done in school," said Madonna.

"From what I know about the movie, I don't see any merit in it. If they think kids are going to get the whole point, that's making an awfully big judgment."

Teachers work hard, but 'sometimes we don't always use a lot of common sense, and kids get lost in the shuffle," she added.

"At times, decisions are made that aren't in the kids' best interest. It's not the teachers' fault; it's 'trickle-down' education. From a clinical standpoint, yes, they're right; the schools didn't do anything. But my kids have 30 students in their class. How is the teacher to know if something is having a negative effect?"

Wayne Circuit Judge Samuel Turner ruled recently that school officials were not negligent in Stephen's death. The decision is being appealed. "Nobody's Useless" hasn't been shown in the district since Stephen's death.

Policy not followed

The Nalepas' attorneys say that contrary to school district policy, parents were not informed of their right to challenge the use of the film.

"I heard about the movie on the 12 o'clock news the Monday after Stephen died," said Debbie Nalepa. "They were interviewing kids at the bus stop, and they said they knew the reason Steven died; they said he was just doing what he saw in the movie Friday. I thought, 'What movie?' I'd talked with the principal (Joyce Reefer Deren) twice on Sunday and didn't hear a word about it." Nalepa said Deren later told her she hadn't seen the movie herself, but that it had redeeming qualities and wouldn't be banned.

Dr. Michael Homes, Plymouth-Canton assistant superintendent for instruction, declined comment because of the lawsuit.

The district's community relations director, Richard Egli, said teachers are "well-advised, cer-tainly," to preview films; "it's just good basic teaching.'

While parents do have recourse, "letters don't go home in advance of every movie being shown," said Egli. "If you did it for every resource, book or slide, it would be a difficult task."

Policy defined

School policy says: "In recognition that at various times there may be areas considered as controversial, the selection policy shall ensure that resources shall be . . . suitable to the age and intellectual capacity of the potential users, and avoiding sensational-ism for its own sake. Standard review sources will be used as selection guides, beyond those evaluations made through actual

examination or preview. Egli said any film can be reviewed or challenged "by anyone who has concerns. Parents are certainly encouraged to work with teachers. We recognize the value of the teacher and the parent col-

laborating on a child's education. "If parents have any questions about the kinds of resources in any class or grade level, they're welcome to ask teachers, and teachers will let them know what is being used." That's one of the reasons for parent-teacher conferences, he added. "It's not as though there is an inability to ask

what is happening.' Judge Turner earlier held that the district's administrators and school board members are not entitled to governmental immunity in the suit. School district attorneys have appealed.



If it weren't for the Wayne County homeless shelter in Westland, Gail Zander and her family would be living in a car.

"This was our last resort, ac-cording to Zander's husband, Perry Looper.

"It's a great place for people to try to get their lives back together. It gives people a second chance."

Everything started to unravel for Zander, Looper and their three children, Natasha, 5, Bradley, 4, and Leonard (Fuzzy), 3, last December when a pipe-bomb went through a window in the Inkster home they were renting.

Tough times

Fragments of the bomb shattered Zander's jaw and penetrated her cheek. Almost a year later, her face is scarred and she continues to undergo surgery.

"I've been going downhill ever since that happened," Zander said.

She lost her job as a waitress. The family moved out of that house and into a Michigan Avenue motel where Looper had a job as maintenance manager.

It wasn't the best place to live, according to the couple, but at least it was somewhere to sleep. Even that fell through when Looper was fired.

Evicted from the hotel, the family went to live with a friend until

They had no money, and nowhere to turn. Zander said that the thought of living in a shelter

made them nervous. "We heard a lot of bad things about shelters," Looper said. "It's really much better than we imagined. I can't say enough good things about it."

Zander and Looper talked about their misfortunes inside a spacious shelter room with a large bed and three smaller cots for the

Looking ahead

They have 60 days - the maximum stay allowed in the shelter to turn their lives around. It might be just enough time. Looper, who has experience as a jeweler, recently went on a second interview at a jewelry shop in Southfield.

"Basically, right now, we're taking it day-to-day trying to find a house we can afford to rent, Looper said.

They came to the shelter during the height of a dispute between Wayne County and the agency hired to run the shelter — Wayne Metropoiltan Community Services Inc.

Judge Gail McKnight of Westland's 18th District Court recently signed an order to evict the agency from offices on Henry Ruff and Michigan Avenue. Wayne-Metropolitan is charged with

mismanagement and misappropriation of funds.

Luther Flanagan, Wayne-Metropolitan executive director, denies the charges.

Safe haven

Meanwhile, the shelter has been a haven for Michelle Hayden and her daughter, Crystal, 3. They sat in a television room down the hall from Looper and Zander.

"It's a lot nicer than I imagined," Hayden said. "I imagined a room with all these beds in it. I almost freaked out when I heard that you get your own room."

Ten days earlier, Hayden traveled from California to Michigan to live with a friend who paid for the bus ticket.

"He was supposed to put us up and he decided not to," Hayden said. "He dropped us off at the Social Security office and they said to come here. I didn't even have phone money.

Joann Hamlein and her twoyear-old daughter sat on a sofa across the room.

Hamlein, who said she was onemonth pregnant, chewed on some ice as she explained that her mother dropped her off at the shelter five days earlier. Hamlein said she came to the shelter because she had gotten "into a really bad fight" with her boyfriend

and he threw her out of the house. Like all families at the shelter, Hamlein receives a room, food, clothing and counseling.

Inside the television room, her daughter played with Hayden's daughter at a plastic school desk.

Hamlein and Hayden were among 14 families, including 46 people, registered at the facility one day last week. The shelter is equipped to house 26 families.

"The county expects us to have 100 percent occupancy," Flanagan said. "The Waldorf Astoria doesn't have 100 percent occupancy.

When the shelter opened in 1991 it was touted as the first and only suburban shelter in the nation designed for families. More than 800 people have passed through the shelter.

Shelter dispute

"That's more than double what HUD (Department of Housing and Urban Development) had expected" when they awarded Wayne-Metropolitan a grant for \$162,000, which is administered by Wayne County. The agency also receives funding from other entities.

The facility was renovated in part with block grant money from 10 western Wayne County communities.





In addition, the condition can cause neck pain. A joint that connects the first two cervical or neck vertebrae together is a synovial joint. It has the same features of the joints of the hand and feet that are the sites of rheumatoid arthritis.

Protest against war toys is a little bit off-target

t's not often I disagree with WAND.

You know, they are the newly named Women's Action for New Directions group, formerly Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament.

And they are usually right on target or they change their name so they

But I'm wondering about their annual war toys protest, held last Friday at the Southfield Toys "R" Us store. There, 50-100 protesters peacefully demonstrated against war toys, to increase awareness of parents and grand-

Their protest is against such items as G.I. Joe, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles, Transformers and Nintendo video games.

And of course, any toy gun, whether it be a plastic water pistol or a gun-like toy which is designed to teach colors,

would make their don't buy list. On the surface, they are well-intentioned.

But then I think back to my brotherin-law, Phil. When I first met him, he was 8 and had the largest stock of toy guns I ever saw. He kept them in a toy chest at the foot of his bunk beds and they were his most precious possessions and he took them everywhere he went.

Bam, pow, rat-a-tat-tat were heard emanating from his room for years until the sounds of rock and roll took

His parents, my in-laws, were very much pacifists — and my mother-inlaw was a social worker. They would never have considered having a real gun in their home. They were even against hunting. And they certainly made their views known to their chil-

And lo and behold, despite his childhood ways, Phil also turned out to be very much a pacifist - and a social worker. Now, his own son, Ben, is also into a "gun period." And, although Phil doesn't encourage it, he does not forbid him from having or playing with

Meanwhile, this women's group is mostly aiming at toys which are the province of boys. If they're so dead set against giving them a playful way to act out aggression, then shouldn't they also be worried about prompting the kinds of feelings which result from giving dolls to young girls?.

We emphazize that dolls are children's "babies." We allow and even prompt them to cuddle and dress them. Do we consider if that kind of "play" might eventually translate into wanting a real baby at too young an age

or, even at an appropriate age, without a defined father?

The bottom line is if they have good parenting, from a parent or other adult whom they respect, it probably doesn't much matter whether children play with guns or dolls.

And, if they have poor parenting, it doesn't much matter if a child never has had a so-called "war toy." They will probably act on their feelings in a negative way.

WAND and other well-meaning peace groups certainly aren't doing damage. But their efforts are aimed at the symptoms and not the malaise.

Language and its implementation: key to it all

ecently on this page, I prayed for a Bill Clinton presidency. Now that this will be, I'd like to pose a related riddle that I recently asked an Oakland University class I'm teaching: What is our greatest invention? The wheel? Nintendo? Political action committees?

My class of talented educators offered many thought-provoking answers, such as "man's landing on the moon" and Ferndale Schools' Donna Bialach's response - language.

Bialach is right. When our ancestors adapted their organs of breathing and eating to the purpose of speaking and began making symbolic sounds at each other, they separated us from all other forms of earthly life and paved a prehistoric path toward the future.

While other primates have been taught to communicate with us via computerized picture-symbols, we are this planet's only creators of symbols the factor that produces our perceptions, knowledge and institutions. Since the human mind cannot think or act without words, the limits of our language are the limits of our world.

The mission of American education is to render our children fit to function cooperatively by persuading them to learn, accept and apply democratic codes - the conventions of communication whereby our republic holds itself together.

Often, unfortunately, American children also are taught not only what words are to symbolize what things, but the way in which society separates things from each other. Anthropological convention undemocratically divides people racially; political convention prejudicially differentiates Democrat from Republican, and grammatical convention imperially decides which experiences shall be called objects and which shall be called events or actions.

How arbitrary such conventions are

is demonstrated by the question, "What happens to your fist (noun-object) when you open your hand?" The object miraculously vanishes because an action was posing as a part of speech usually assigned to a thing. Thus objects are also events, so our world really is made up of subjective processes that can set the course of all objective entities, for good or evil.

As Weingartner and Postman said in their landmark 1969 book "Teaching as a Subversive Activity," "Since all knowledge is learned via language, the meaning we ascribe language gives knowledge both its weight and ambigu-

Demogogues exploit that ambiguity in order to fake having said something when they avoided saying anything; e.g. Pat Buchanan's platitudinous pronouncement last February on CNN: "We shall keep going forward; we shall never take a single step backward."

Talleyrand cynically said that language was given to conceal thought. Buchanan uses it to conceal absence of thought.

Despite this potential for fakery, language and the technology to amplify it remain our most evolutionary - and revolutionary - invention.

Our articulate new president's interactive use of that invention can reunite and re-revolutionize America. Bill, as you lead we'll be listening, because we know that we won't have to read your lips. Also we know that you'll listen to us as well.

Make assisted suicide a felony punishable by four years in prison and a \$2,000 fine from about April 1 (effective date of the law) until the end of 1994. With Dillingham working behind the scenes, this amendment was added on the House floor by Reps. Ken Sikkema, R Grandville, and Joseph Palamara, D-Wyan-

Set up a study commission for 15 months to study such complex questions as the difference between assistance and inaction, "non-causal facilitation," encouragement of suicide and active participation, as well as suicide pacts.

The penalties sought by Dillingham, Sikkema and Palamara would expire three months after the commission reports but no later than Jan. 1, 1995.

The Senate is scheduled to vote on it Thursday. Dillingham said it would be taken straight to the floor without going through a committee. The Senate passed Dillingham's bill to criminalize assisted suicide months ago.

House chiefs lose

Bullard, as chair of the House Judiciary Committee, sat on identical bills by Dillingham and Rep. Nick Ciaramitaro, D-Roseville, to criminalize assisted sui-

Instead his panel reported out House Bill 5401, the study commission bill of Rep. Tom Power, R-Traverse City. That bill had been recommended by a special

subcommittee headed by Jondahl.
"We spent the last two weeks putting
it (the amendment) together," said Dillingham, who prides himself on his ability to work with House members and Democrats. "Yesterday I spent all day making sure we had 72 votes.

House passage came on a vote of 72 to 29 with nine absent.

Area members voting yes were: Demo-crats John Bennett of Redford, William Keith of Garden City, James Kosteva of Canton, and Wilfred Webb of Hazel Park; and Republicans Lyn Bankes of Livonia, Barbara Dobb of Union Lake, Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills, Georgina Goss of Northville, John Jamian of Bloomfield Township, and Gordon Sparks of Troy.

Voting no were Democrats Justine Barns of Westland and Maxine Berman of Southfield and Republican Shirley Johnson of Royal Oak.

The vote came one day after "Dr. Death" — retired pathologist Jack Kevorkian of Royal Oak — assisted a sixth woman to commit suicide in Michidence because the votes were in place to pass the bill well in advance. "The birthday cake and candles were in place. All he (Kevorkian) did was light the can-

Essentially, the House took the text of Dillingham's bill, added the sunset and tacked it onto Power's bill.

"Some of you accuse Dr. Kevorkian of playing God," said Berman of Southfield. "Attempting to ban assisted suicide is playing God, too."

Power voted against the bill he spon-sored and asked that his name be removed from it. A conservative Republican, Power splits with most of his party on abortion and assisted suicide questions. He is leaving the Legislature to become a circuit judge.

The House debated the bill more than four hours. It added an amendment from Jamian of Bloomfield Township to place a coroner to the study panel.

'Yes — reluctantly'

The bill was short of the two-thirds

needed to give it immediate effect. In-stead it will become law 90 days after the Legislature adjourns, or about the first of April 1993. Gov. John Engler said he will-

"It doesn't make me happy we did it," said Bankes of Livonia. "I voted yes

very reluctantly. Most people saw the bill as banning suicide, but Bankes underscored that "it's temporary. We've put a moratorium on it until we get guidelines."

There's much public support for regulating suicide, she said. "Almost 100 percent of my mail is supportive of leaving that option open to people, Bankes said.
"Everybody's centered on Kevorkian.

Kevorkian is drawing attention to it. He has gone from lethal injection (in his earlier assisted suicides) to carbon monoxide (in the Nov. 24 death of Catherine Andreyev). But other doctors are doing this quietly with no one knowing about it that's where we're doing the damage," Bankes said.

Kevorkian's attorney, Michael Schwartz, said he may challenge the act's constitutionality.



New condominium to be raffled off

Lot 93 in the Lagoons of West Bloomfield subdivision now sits empty, nothing more than an empty parcel of land covered with construction debris.

Highlights of the lot along Sandpiper Lane now include two mounds of frozen dirt, wood scraps and miniature red and orange flags placed to signify where electric and telephone cable wires are buried. Laying flat on the hard ground is a blue-andwhite lot marker, with the number 93 painted on it.

"If they don't sell 2,500 of the 5.000 tickets then there won't be a home made available, then it (fund-raiser) would revert to a 50-50 raffle," said Norm Finkelstein of Irvine-Jacobson Development, the company which is building the Lagoons subdivision near Pontiac Trail and Halstead.

But Finkelstein, a member of the activities center organizing committee, said he and others are optimistic the "Dream" raffle -

slated for 3 p.m. Feb. 21 at Pals restaurant, on Maple east of Orchard Lake Road — will succeed.

"Everybody seems to be very confident (about it)," Finkelstein said. "So much interest has been expressed already.


A barometer of that interest will be held 7-9 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 3, when an advance ticket sale kickoff party will take place at the Lagoons model home. Tickets subsequently (on Dec. 7) will be made available to the public.

After the raffle, if it brings in the necessary amount of money, the home would be completed in about five to six months, Finkelstein said

Meanwhile, people wanting to know what they might get for their money can stop by the Lagoons to view the Bedford, an attractive brick-and-wood home featuring vaulted ceilings, walk-in closets and wide-open spaces.

"We're happy to show the home to anyone who is interested in buying a ticket," Finkelstein said.



Bring out the flavor of pasta with cheese

When Italian food is mentioned, the first to come to mind is pasta. The second? Cheese. Not just any old cheese or heaven forbid, something out of a shaker can. Something nutty, something sharp. Something to bring out the flavor of the pasta.

Ah, but what is good pasta without the customary grating of a fresh block of Parmesan, Asiago or Percorino Romano cheese. A simple dusting. A complex outburst of taste.

Of course, too much of the so called "simple dusting" of cheese and you can undo all the good. No sense dwelling on the salt content, cholesterol and fat contents of these cheeses. Why spoil such a delectable experience? Let's face it, you don't want to mask the flavor of the pasta, but simply

If you haven't already guessed, good, aged cheese is as important as a fine grade of pasta. You wouldn't make a cake from scratch and top it off with canned icing? Why even consider doing the same with shaker-can Parmesan cheese and a plate of steaming pasta?

Imported cheese

Unfortunately, imported grating cheese like Asiago, Parmesan and Romano aren't readily available in most markets and must be searched-out, usually in small local Italian groceries or gourmettype food shops.

Every now and then, I stumble on one of those super "supermarkets" that have a deli with imported cheeses, but true Italian cooks look for the seals present on all imported cheese indicating its type and origin. Ask to see labels and rinds of the block. There are many varieties of grating cheese, both imported and domestic. The flavor difference always stands out.

Take Asiago, for instance. Asiago cheese is golden, nutty, and in my opinion, has more flavor than Parmesan and Romano. When I want to toss a simple pasta not covered with a flavorful sauce. I choose Asiago because it complements the pasta rather than covers it. Asiago can be purchased two ways, Stravecchio (very old) and Vecchid (old).

Of course, the best is the very old variety but in some markets, I've seen this priced as high as \$9.00 per pound Look around and you should b able to find it in the \$6 per pound price range.

Don't think you have to purchase a pound. Four ounces will grate one cup of cheese. Be careful, once you try this flavorful and nutty variety, you'll be hooked.

Perfect Parmesan

When it comes to Parmesan, the best variety available is called Parmigiano Reggiano, made the same way as it was in the 10th century. This is a finely textured, golden cheese and is very hard and aged to perfection. If you want the best, this is it. There is no other in comparison. Other dependable brands include Polenghi, Salbani and Locatell but purists seek out the Parmigiano Reggiano.

Contrary to popular belief, imported Parmesan should have a light sweet flavor and be slightly nutty, and have almost no trace of saltiness. You'll pay even more for imported Parmesan than you will Asiago so shop around and check out the market deli areas for the best prices and trendy little Italian markets like Alcamo's in Dearborn for availabilities.

Romano is a hard white cheese that is somewhat salty in flavor, and has a tendency to be very sharp. Pecorino Romano is the best Romano available and when you see it called for in a recipe, I suggest using half Romano and half Parmesan or Asiago for an improved, less sharp flavor. Remember, you want to compliment, not overpower simple pasta.

Great graters

Enough said about cheese, now a simple word on cheese graters. Every kitchen has (or should have) the standard hand grater with four sides and available at local houseware stores for about \$4. However, if you really want to get the best, search out the Mouli hand grater.

Now you're cooking Italian. Food processors such as the Cuisinart and mini-grinders can handle small chunks of cheese but because these grating varieties are best aged more than three years (and some for up to 10 years) they are extremely hard. Trying to cut them up into small chunks for grinding in a food processor is senseless. (I think this is the first bad word I've ever said about my Cuisinart).

When it comes to storing grating cheese, keep them tightly wrapped as they can impart flavors to other foods and vice versa. I've found that the freezer works best for long storage. (Just allow the cheese to come to room temperature after grating and before serving).

You have probably heard the old adage "they broke the mold when you were born." This doesn't hold true after spending a few hours with Lynne Rossetto Kasper, author of "The Splendid Table," (Copyright 1992, William Morrow Publishers, \$30, hard-cover).

Kasper recently visited Kitchen Glamor in West Bloomfield, and prepared several recipes from her book.

Undoubtedly, you have heard me speak many a time of my Wyandotte upbringing and Kasper bears a very close resemblance to Mrs. Kopernick, a neighbor on Sycamore Street who shares Kasper's joy of cooking.

Mrs. Kopernick's claim to fame come from writing the definitive cookbook of recipes from the Emilia-Romagna region of northern Italy like Kasper's, but her baked goods were the first to be snapped up at St. Joe's bake sales. Her zest of food ,and it's many offerings were evident when, at Halloween, neighborhood goblins and pirates were treated to homemade popcorn balls. As her old Detroit Times carrier, I was treated to homemade fudge and cookies all tucked neatly among shards of tin foil in an Armstrong's shirt box.

Mrs. Kopernick was undoubtedly Kasper's precursor. An ardent traveler to Alcamo's Italian grocery in Dearborn, the Oaza Bakery and Ko-

walski's, she would arrive home carrying two of those French expanding string bags filled to the gills with ethnic goodies after the 30 minute le on the Schafer express

Mrs. Kopernick passed away about 10 years ago but there's little doubt her spirit lives on in the likes of Lynne Rossetto Kasper.

A Brooklyn native with roots in the Emilia-Romagna area of Northern Italy, (before arriving in New York) Kasper's culinary tome of recipes from the region explore the rich heritage from one of the best known food areas in the world.

Dubbed "The heartland of Northern Italian Food," this region is the home of real Parmesan-Reggiano cheese, Balsamic vinegar and the famed Prosciutto de Parma ham.

Kasper's roots are from the region, and after spending five years

there researching and learning from the locals, she compiled her book of recipes and basic information.

The book, and I hasten not to call a cookbook because of the pages of stories about the region, is a compendium of recipes and cooking tips featuring the best of what any Italian would require to enjoy his or her last meal.

"Ask any Italian where to take only one meal in Italy, and, after recommending his mother's house, he will more than likely send you to Emilia-Romagna," writes Kasper.

Unlike most cookbooks, in addition to sharing the recipes of her homeland, Kasper incorporates stories from the region. For example, a short three paragraph story on the history of pasta claims that "it (the pasta) may have been born of crusts of bread discarded after Medieval

banquets ... Once the bread was soaked with meat juices, they were thrown away to be gathered by peasants who waited eagerly for lefto-

The book dissects nearly all forms of Italian pasta including colorful stories of Strozzapreti or "priest stranglers" thickly cut and hand twisted pasta and Sarganelli which are cut, placed on combs and rolled around quilled pens, the theory being that pasta not rolled smooth and instead is 'rough' holds the sauce better.

The recipes also include tips on "working ahead," wine and menu suggestions and the seldom seen 'cook's notes" that end the recipe with those secret little tricks of the trade that separate a cook from a food preparer.

If learning more about the regional cooking of northern Italy intrigues you then Kasper's book should be a de rigeur addition to your kitchen library. Even if you don't choose to spend the time cooking, the short stories about the birth of prosciutto, balsamic vinegar et al are worth the price alone.

Mrs. Kopernick would have loved living next door to Lynne Rossetto Kasper and you will love Kasper's



Using a sharp knife, cut the chilled dough into 24 slices, each 5/ 16 inch thick. Arrange the slices about 2 inches apart on the prepared baking sheets. Flatten the slices slightly with a fork, and top each with a walnut half.

Bake until golden brown, 10 to 12 minutes. Let cool on the baking sheets for 2 minutes, then transfer to wire racks to cool completely. The cookies will keep, stored in an airtight container, at room temperature, for 3 days. Makes 24 cookies.

Scrub the potatoes and place them in a 6-quart pot with enough cold water to cover. Put the lid in place and set the pot over high heat. Bring the water to a lively bubble. Adjust the heat so that the potatoes do not boil over and keep the pot partially covered.

Cook potatoes 15-20 minutes or until easily pierced with a fork. Meanwhile, pour 1 cup of the milk, the butter and 1 tablespoon of olive oil into a bowl. While the potatoes are cooking, heat the remaining three tablespoons of oil into a 12inch skillet over high heat. Add the onions and all but 2 tablespoons of the parsley. Turn the heat to medium low and cover. Cook 15 minutes or until the onions are soft and clear. Stir occasionally. Uncover and cook over medium high heat, stirring frequently for 8 minutes or until the onions are golden brown. Then stir in the garlic and basil and cook another minute. Add the water and scrape up any bits left in the skillet. Season with salt and pepper. Turn into a large bowl. When the potatoes are tender, drain and peel them. Pass the hot potatoes through a coarse blade of a food mill set over a large bowl or mash them with a potato masher. Blend the potatoes with the ingredients in the bottom of the bowl. Season to taste. If the potatoes seem dry, add

more milk. The mixture should be like very thick whipped cream, but not so loose that it will not hold a high mound on a spoon.

Lightly oil a shallow 21/2 quart

baking dish. Spread half the potato mixture over the bottom of the dish. Top with half the cheese and then spread the remaining potatoes over this. Sprinkle with the rest of the

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly cover the potatoes with aluminum foil and bake 30 minutes or until hot in the center. Just before serving, sprinkle with remaining parsley. Serve hot.

In a large mixing bowl stir together 1 cup of the flour, the brown sugar, baking powder, cinnamon and baking soda. Add pumpkin, molasses, eggs, margarine or butter, milk and gingerroot or ginger. Beat with an electric mixer on low to medium speed for 30 seconds or until combined. Beat on medium to high speed for 2 minutes, scraping the sides of the bowl occasionally. Add remaining flour; beat for 2 minutes or until mixed. Divide the batter

For topping, stir together walnuts

and sugar, sprinkle evenly over batter. Bake in a 350-degree F oven for 40 to 50 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center of each loaf comes out clean. Cool loaves in pans on wire racks for 10 minutes. Remove from pans. Cool thoroughly on wire racks. Makes 4 loaves, 8 servings each.

To freeze: Wrap each loaf tightly in freezer wrap. Seal, label and freeze for up to 6 months. To thaw, let stand, loosely covered, at room temperature for 1 hour. Or, to thaw in the microwave oven, place one unwrapped loaf on a microwavesafe paper towel. Cook, uncovered, on 30 percent power 1 to 11/2 minutes.

Weinstein also suggested parents, if they are able, match the funds children save themselves for presents, or supplement their allowances before the holidays with the understanding that the extra money is for gifts.

Mall managers urged parents shop ping with youngsters to set a date early in the shopping season, before the stores get too busy, preferably when the stores first open and everyone is fresh.

"Children should shop with a list of people and amounts, not with specific gift ideas in mind," said Elaine Kah, marketing director at Twelve Oaks Mall in Novi. "For kids, too specific a list can be limiting and frustrating. It's better to wander through a store with inexpensive tems and let their imaginations go.'

She said she sees many kids just buying wrapping paper or candy for homemade gifts that stretch their gift

Jim Reichel of Novi said his children buy presents at the Santa Shoppe sponsored by the PTA group at school. Many schools provide this service so kids can have fun and surprise their parents with gifts they bought themselves.

Kids can shop from 3-6 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturdays. Gifts are priced from \$.50 to \$5. The Community House is located on Bates Street between Merrill and Townsend.

The mall stores no longer set up special shops for children, however, at the Renaissance Center in downtown Detroit, children's shopping is a weekend feature until Dec. 24 between Towers 200 and 300 in the Fashion Plaza.

Lakeside Mall merchants have compiled a list of gifts under \$5 for youthful shoppers. The list includes scented soaps, travel mugs, cassette singles, flavored coffee samplers, mints wrapped to resemble tree ornaments, socks, and musical tooth-

Dennis Jaboro, 15, of West Bloomfield said he expects to spend \$500 to \$600 for family gifts this year.

Thieves look for unlocked cars to gain easy access to packages left in the backseat, according to Capt. Scott Jackson, whose security firm contracts with several area malls. They watch for wallets left on counters during transactions. They notice purses left unattended in public restrooms

"Before a family or couple enters the mall they should agree on a meeting place in case they become lost or separated. Parents should make sure their little ones know their name and phone number."

'Don't shop with large amounts of cash," advises Sgt. Christopher Carr of Tel-Twelve Mall in Southfield. "We don't have many purse snatchings or pick pockets here, but shoppers should always be

Don't become overloaded with packages, said Lt. William Tullock of the Troy police, who reviews crime reports from The Somerset Collection and Oakland Mall. "If your hands are filled with Nintendo games, Barbie dolls and

other gifts, you have identified yourself as a defenseless target. Birmingham police Cmdr. Richard Dimock said the police depart-

ment is in the middle of downtown and a police officer patrols the district on horseback. Some suggestions: "Women carrying packages should wear a

shoulder strap purse inside their coat. Females should shop in pairs and avoid parking in dark, unlit Cmdr. Michael Gardner of the

Plymouth Police Department said street crime during the holidays in downtown Plymouth is almost non-existent. "I just tell people to use common sense and be alert."

An angry soul expresses frustration

his latest release on David Geffen Growls the Livonia native on his latest release on David Geffen Records: "We stack the courts and we tax the poor/Got Johnny Lunchbox to fight our wars/ . . Tax him to his knees and make him love the flag/We got corporate freedom. He gets a body bag."

At times, the onslaught of apocolyptic visions of disintegration, hopelessness and dispair on "Salutations from the Ghetto Nation" become overbearing especially when weighted down by pounding metal guitars. There's no rainbows here.

"There's some definite throwing up your arms in the air on this album," said Clarke, whose band performs Friday, Dec. 4, at the Ritz in Roseville. "Sometimes that's just the way you feel.

"Other parts of the album I'm 18 and I don't know what I want . . It goes through all the emotions.'

Clarke's musical career has spanning more than 10 years and includes everything from slashing punk to blistering hard rock. He performed in local outfits such as L7 (not the California all-female outfit) and Trial before venturing to New York to form Warrior

His musical journey has been marked by candor. He speaks his mind, spilling bile indiscriminantly and never apologizing for its messiness.

Social commentaries about himself can be equally oblique. He carves up bitter introspection in songs such as "Punk and Belligerent," which was written in anger after a brief separation from

Declares Clarke on the power chord proclaimation: "I'm going out tonight/And I'm going out drinking/Don't bother waiting up/'Cause I'm coming home stinking.'

Yet for all this Miller Lite inspired bravado, Clarke keeps one guessing as he evokes a sense of tenderness in the arena rock pop of "The Golden Shore," which covers the tried but true theme of going on the road and being separated from a loved one.

"There's me yelling at my wife on this record ("Punk and Belligerent"), There's me making up with my wife on this record," said Clarke, who graduated from Livonia Bentley High School. There's me getting drunk and yelling on this album. There's me making fun of the Republican party on this album."

The latter, "The Party," displays the pitfalls of political commentary in the rock medium. Clarke tries to kick the GOP in the teeth with the searing num-

But the song now sounds dated with Clinton cleaning their clock in November's election.

"I predicted they would lose 15 months ago," Clarke said, "but no one listened to me."

Few have bothered to listen or acknowledge Clarke's success here despite Warrior Soul being number one on many metal charts with its 1991 album, "Drugs, God and the New Republic." At the time, Clarke was irate at what he

Aladdin' rekindles Disney's classic spell



A new golden age for Disney animation? The artistic and popular success of Beauty and the Beast" and "The Little Mermaid" certainly hints at it. Though not of the same caliber,

"Aladdin" pro-vides a good-na-tured blend of rollercoaster adventure and non-

Aladdin, a handsome young thief, lives off his wits on the mean streets of Agrabah. When he saves the life of a young maiden in the marketplace, he realizes only later that she is the Sultan's daughter Jasmine.

The Sultan's advisor Jafar tall, black-robed, and bearing more than a passing resemblance to an older Joan Crawford — uses

Aladdin to acquire a magical lamp that will grant three wishes. The sand-monster who poss it insists that only this noble boy can enter his gaping mouth to re-

There's plenty of adventure along the way, especially involv-ing a flying carpet brought alive through the magic of computer animation. You can count on it to woosh beneath Aladdin when he's falling deep into a chasm or playfully toppling off Jasmine's veranda.

Disney made one of its best moves ever when recruiting Howard Ashman and Harold Menken to score these pictures. Lyricist Ashman contributed three clever songs to the project before his death last year. Tim Rice, collaborator with Andrew Lloyd Webber on "Jesus Christ Superstar" and 'Evita," added another two.

The tunes range from thoughtful to raucous, from jivey Broadway tributes to modern Whitney Huston-style ballads. Best are the spirited ones, including "One Jump Ahead," as Aladdin outwits palace guards, and "Friend Like Me," where the Genie from the lamp unleashes a garish display of his powers.

Robin Williams, who provides the Genie's voice, dominates "Aladdin's" second half. You'd almost think he directed the animation, since the nonstop barrage of rapid fire gags completely plays into his over-the-edge comic style.

He appears as a game show host telling Aladdin what he can and can't order from the lamp. In the flash of a second, he transforms his gassy physique into charicatures of Groucho Marx, Jack Nicholson, commentators at Macy's parade, and even Disney's Pinocchio.

And while he is truly outrageous, the craziness make it hard to focus on the movie's underlying message. Be yourself, "Aladdin" says, and keep your word, including Aladdin's broken promise to the Genie that one of his wishes will be used to release the spirit

from slavery. Disney cartoons thrive on their timelessness. "Pinocchio" and "Snow White," from Disney's original Golden Age in the 1930s and '40s, can be reissued from here to eternity because they exist."

in their own unique world. How will future generations view "Aladdin's" topical gags during the film's 2012 re-release? Probably the same way we look today at the vintage Warner Brothers cartoons, where animators tried to outdo each other with the most gags per minute.

"Aladdin" doesn't possess the emotional clarity and meticulous eye for atmosphere that distin-guish the best Disney features. But don't let that stop you from having a great time on this well-crafted magic carpet ride.

and Eugene" looks at the lives of Dominick Lucithe brothers, very well played by Tom Hulce and Ray Liotta, at a time when some changes are likely. Dominick holds his job and is pretty independent, if gullible. He tends to believe the outrageous stories spouted as gospel by a coworker.

Dominick supports his brother, who is finishing his internship and wants to do his residency at Stanford, far from their home in Pittsburgh.

The brothers, whose parents are both dead, have been inseparable for years but their relationship isn't ideal. Strained by the demands of medical school, Eugene can blow up at his brother when he forgets to walk his dog or won't stopping talking in the middle of the night. Eugene is quicktempered but saves his real fury for a guy who takes advantage of Dominick.

Hulce is very good as Dominick, who is concerned that maybe he is stupid, not just slow. Without being maudlin or overwrought, he makes Eugene a real person who is dealing with some extra challenges and basically doing pretty well.

Dominick has befriended a boy who lives along his trash collection route and shares his love of

comic books. For his trouble, Dominick is berated by the boy's abusive father.

When Dominick witnesses his young friend being abused by his father, the shock and terror on his face reaches far beyond what he has just seen. It's a heartbreaking scene, as the painful memories flood over Dominick who is too distraught to speak. Hulce plays the scene very well, making Dominick's subsequent action noble and completely well intentioned.

Director Robert M. Young keeps the film on a steady course that avoids the pitfalls of melodrama. These are people who care deeply for each other but sometimes inflict the most damage on those they love most.

Kickers caused game to change

alt Bazylewicz, a long-time football coach in the Detroit Catholic League, has never been too fond of placekickers.

He didn't even need one when his coaching career began about 40 years ago at Detroit St. Thomas High School. "When I first started coaching at Lodge Park on

the east side, we didn't even have goal posts," he said. To hear 'Bazy' tell it, he could still do without

goal posts.

As football modernized, Bazylewicz hesitated to accept field goals - especially from a converted soccer player who didn't play offense or defense.

Bazylewicz had no problem with a 200-pound lineman trying a point-after-touchdown kick but watching a guy half the size of his teammates come in on fourth down to attempt a long field goal wasn't his idea of football.

"It's a foreign part of the game," said Bazylewicz, currently an assistant at the University of Detroit-Jesuit High School after spending the previous three seasons as Redford Bishop Borgess coach.

Now, you must understand 'Bazy' is a great guy as friendly as they come - he just comes from the old school and thinks it's a crime to see a defensive team do a good job, stop the offense on the 40, then have "some guy who is not even an athlete kick a 50-yard field goal."

(Bazy probably doesn't watch too many soccer games because those guys are pretty good ath-

Bazylewicz began really turning on placekickers after hearing former Miami Dolphins kicker Garo Yepremian describe a winning kick on television.

"He said, 'I kick a de touchdown,' " Bazylewicz recalled. "He didn't even know it was called a field

Redford Catholic Central's Adam Borchert speaks fluent English and is a good athlete, but like Yepremian, only handles the placekicking and kickoffs. His other after-school duty includes

playing soccer for CC coach Phil LaJoy. CC coach Tom Mach used to be against the idea of having a placekicker on loan from the school's soccer team.

But after watching Borchert make field goals to beat Troy and Utica Eisenhower in the playoffs, he's glad he changed his mind.

"I always felt if you weren't on the team, doing things you're supposed to every day, it would be hard to step in and kick it," Mach said. "But with time and age, you get a little smarter in some

Kerry Zavagnin was the first soccer/football player Mach used, beginning in 1990. Mach was leery at first about having a part-time kicker.
"Not after I saw him kick," said Mach.

Scouting Report update

Bill Lelich, who owns a franchise for Scouting Report, a recruiting service that markets high school athletes to colleges, is trying to make up for the mess a colleague made.

"Every industry is going to have a 'bad apple,' " said Lelich, a 1974 Birmingham Brother Rice graduate who makes his home in Birmingham. 'My objective and our industry's objective is to weed out these people. We don't need any unscrupulous, unethical operators.

Lelich bought a Scouting Report franchise in April, 1992. He has spent the last couple months trying to make up for Silverman's unannounced departure last spring by contacting some of Silverman's clients and following through with the original promises.

"I feel it's my responsibility to come to their rescue," Lelich said. "We're dealing with athletes who have devoted their lives to academics and athletics. Silverman has destroyed dreams and it's very disheartening to them. I felt it was terribly unethical and promptly contacted the media and all the families.

Lelich played on Rice's '74 Class A basketball championship team and he was a letterwinner for the University of Michigan in 1977 with Rickey Green and Phil Hubbard. He earned business and speech degrees at U-M and a master's degree in business administration at the University of De-

"I can empathize with the thousands of nonblue chip athletes who are interested in playing

Shamrocks regain state crown



Redford Catholic Central captured its third state football championship under coach Tom Mach with a thrilling 21-20 victory over Saginaw Arthur Hill in a rematch of last year's final.

Redford Catholic Central's football team carried out its season-long credo that "the magic is in the believing."

The Shamrocks willed their way to the school's third state championship, capping a 13-0 season Saturday with a spellbinding 21-20 victory over Saginaw Arthur Hill before 15,404 at the Pontiac Silverdome.

The game pitted two unbeaten teams that were ranked No. 1 and 2 all season long.

It was a virtual replay of last year's Class AA final, with a slightly different twist. It was only a year ago that Arthur Hill upset the Shamrocks, 13-12, but this time it was CC's turn for redemption.

"I've been in a lot of big games, but this is one of the greatest because it went back and forth," Catholic Central coach Tom Mach said. "We didn't want to go through the whole season like we did last year and not win the 13th game.

"Our team showed tremendous determination. They were down three times and wouldn't be beat."

Mach, noted over the years for his smash-mouth, ball-control style offense, orchestrated a game plan that kept Arthur Hill's defense off bal-

The eventual game-winning touchdown came with 1:09 left in the third quarter and the Shamrocks staring at 20-14 deficit.

yards in 19 carries on the day, surprised Arthur Hill when he completed a 37-yard halfback pass to Brady Pankow for a touchdown.

Junior Freddie Taylor, who had 90

Adam Borchert drilled through the extra point, his third of the day, to give CC a one-point lead.

CC then dug in defensively, stopping the Lumberjacks' last-ditch drive in the final quarter.

With only five seconds remaining and Arthur Hill on the CC 47-yard line, senior quarterback Marvin Wright, who was brilliant in defeat with 286 yards total offense, zipped a pass over the middle to a wide-open Kedrick Redeemer just inside the 20.

The ball, partially deflected by CC's Ken Rys, bounced into the hands of Redeemer, who could not hang on for the grab despite a clear path to the end zone.

"I'm sure this is as difficult for me to be in this position as it was for Catholic Central last year," Arthur Hill coach Jim Eurick told the press gathering afterward. "We played it hard and we played it fair, but we got beat by one point and we have to ac-

'They (CC) just hit the heck out of you. I was impressed with their offensive line. They left tread marks on our backs and at the end of the game our kids were dog-tired.'

It would seem, however, that the Lumberjacks would never get tired running or throwing out of their op-

tion attack. They racked up 393 total net yards to CC's 286.

Speedy tailback Howard Foster, who led all rushers with 108 yards in 12 carries, scored on a perfect pitch from Wright from 5 yards out with 4:03 left in the opening quarter, capping an 80-yard, 11-play drive.

But Wright, a 6-foot-2, 197-pound senior, missed the extra point, a play that would loom large the rest of the

CC took a 7-6 lead early in the second quarter when Taylor broke the plane of the goal line from 2 yards out. The drive covered 72 yards in 10

Wright, dangerous at both running (89 yards) and passing (170), then burst through the heart of the CC de-



Brady Pankow contributes in many ways to the Redford Catholic Central football team, but rarely on offense.

His forte is defense, where he plays in the secondary, and he also returns punts and kickoffs.

Pankow added another role Saturday when he became a star wide receiver in the Class AA championship game at the Silverdome. The Livonia senior caught three

passes for 99 yards, including the game-tying touchdown, as the Shamrocks opened their offense and defeated Saginaw Arthur Hill 21-20.

"If you follow us, you know we don't throw too many passes," said Pankow, who understated the usually conservative CC offense.

"We were working on the pass all week and it hit me: Oh, my gosh, I have to be a receiver, too. I have to make something happen on offense."

CC coach Tom Mach told Pankow on Friday that he would catch two passes, but Pankow didn't anticipate the big plays that kept CC in contention with the explosive Lumberjacks and eventually propelled it to victory.

Fred Taylor threw a 37-yard, halfback-option pass to Pankow, who got

behind the defense and ran the final 15 yards to the end zone. The TD tied the score at 20 late in the third quarter, and Adam Borchert kicked the decisive extra point.

"It was mostly adrenaline that helped me put in in there," Pankow said. "I was so tired because I usually don't play offense so much." The play was all the more amazing

since Taylor threw the ball with a sore right shoulder, which he hurt when he landed on it diving for a pass in the Catholic League title game.

"(Mach) said he was going to try it," Taylor said, adding the Shamrocks had only practiced the play but never completed it. "I was concerned because of my shoulder. (Mach) said 'Don't worry about it. You won't feel any pain in the game."

Taylor had trouble getting the ball ready to launch at first, which might have helped cause the deep defender to take the run fake.

"There was a rush and I thought

someone was going to get me," he said. "Brady was supposed to hesitate, and I didn't know if he was going to get open. I was kinda scared, but he got open. Pankow, who had three receptions

for 18 yards in the first 12 games, also caught a 60-yard pass from quarterback Chris Barbara, putting CC on the Arthur Hill 4 in the second quarter. That helped the Shamrocks take a 14-12 lead. "I knew Chris could get it out to

me; he has the arm to get it there, Pankow said. "I told Chris to 'do something with it. If you get it to me, I want the big play.' I was thinking touchdown all the way.'

That pass made possible what might be one of the fastest scoring drives in CC history. How often do the Shamrocks go 80 yards in five plays? The last TD also was a relative quick strike for CC - eight plays and 91 yards. Barbara completed three of six

passes for 75 yards. The Shamrocks rushed for 182 - swingback John Raasch was an effective runner with 75 yards on nine carries - but complemented that with 112 passing

Lally pops Trice,

Durable is defined as "lasting in spite of hard wear or frequent

That's what middleweight champion contender Tyrone Trice called Westland John Glenn graduate Brett Lally on a radio talk show before Tuesday's Fight Night at The Palace of Auburn

Lally gave new meaning to the word durable as he won a controversial 10-round decision from Trice in front of 9,743 in Auburn

Despite having a bloody and swollen left eye, Lally pulled off the upset. The crowd didn't necessarily agree with the decision.

Judges Chip Acey and James Smith scored the bout 96-94 for Lally, while Rosemary Grable saw it a 95-95 draw.

"I'm very happy," Lally said. "I won and that's all that matters. I'm not looking at a rematch. I'm looking at a middleweight cham-

pionship fight now." Lally, who improved to 31-7. was battered most of the night but was found to be the aggressor,

especially in the later rounds. Lally successfully passed examinations from the ringside doctor in the sixth and seventh rounds. Referee Tom Paskevitch thought Lally's wound to his eye might have been bad enough to stop the fight, but the doctor saw the injury as superficial.

Trice, who survived the fight looking unblemished physically, sat in disbelief in his locker-room chair following the decision.

"I thought I won the fight," said Trice, who fell to 41-6. "I

I thought they would take a point away from him in the last round."

"I asked the judge what he changed. I saw him change something (on the scorecard) before he turned it in."

Lally, who resides in Canton, came out strong in the first round with several good combinations. The first five rounds were even.

But it was Lally who started showing the signs of punishment first. His left eye swelled.

Trice took control of the middle rounds with good blows to Lally's face. Lally, looking worse as each round passed, connected on several counter punches and often returned blows on off-balanced lunged towards Trice.

The fight seemed to belong to Trice entering the final round. Lally increased his intensity and, with 30 seconds remaining, took Trice with both hands and threw him to the mat. After Lally was given a warning, he controlled the rest of the fight.

"I started putting it together in the later rounds," Lally said. "He hit me with a couple good rights, but it didn't hurt me. I knew if I tried boxing Tyrone Trice, I

couldn't beat him." Each boxer's careers may go in separate directions now. Lally was making a comeback after being knocked out last year by Terry Norris. Lally was ranked 13th by the World Boxing Council, while Trice was ranked ninth.

Trice, who started a near riot at the previous Fight Night by challenging International Boxing Federation champion James Toney, all but lost his shot at a title bout.

"It was a lackluster performance on my part," Trice said.

'Dead Ahead' a powerful indictment

HBO chronicles Exxon Valdez oil spill

By Steven Alan McGaw

Moments after midnight on Friday, March 24, 1989, Exxon's oil tanker. The Valdez, ran aground on a reef in Alaska's Prince William Sound. The accident ruptured several of the ship's storage tanks and eventually spilled 11 million gallons of oil into the sea. Over 1,000 miles of previously pristine shoreline were affected and the impact on the area's wildlife was colossal, killing nearly 400,000 birds and thousands of fish and land animals. The most conservative scientific estimates say the true toll of the event will not be sufficiently appreciated until well into the next century.

On Saturday, Dec. 12, HBO unveils Dead Ahead: The Exxon Valdez Disaster, a dramatic chronicle of the event and its aftermath.

Christopher Lloyd stars as Frank Iarossi, an Exxon executive in charge of shipping. Within hours after the Valdez accident, Iarossi is awakened in his Houston home and

dispatched to Alaska to ensure the safe containment of the tanker's remaining oil and oversee Exxon's role in the massive cleanup. What follows, however, is day after day of finger-pointing, name-calling and argument, as Exxon, the Alyeska pipeline consortium, various envinronmentalist groups and even the Coast Guard squabble over who's to blame, who should do what and whose head(s) should roll.

Dead Ahead producer Leslie Woodhead says the real problem became shockingly clear as he and his staff did their 18 months of research. "What was going on," he says, "was an attempt on all parts to clean up their own image, rather than clean up the oil spill." The result, he charges, was a "devastating inertia" in mobilizing cleanup efforts, making the disaster far worse than it had to be
