City vote filing deadline nears



Although the city commission election won't arrive until November, with a possible primary in August, the deadline to file as a candidate is just over a month away. While some incumbents weigh their options, potential challengers have begun lining up.

For potential Plymouth city commission candidates, it's not too early to think about a possible commission primary in August.

That's because the filing deadline for nominating petitions is 4 p.m. May 18.

Still, some incumbents and rumored candidates-to-be say they haven't decided yet on running.

Should eight or more candidates file petitions to run, a primary election would be held in August to narrow the field.

If fewer than eight file, there would be no primary. Regardless, voters will

elect four city commissioners in November.

The spots open are three four-year terms and one two-year term, which goes to the fourth-highest vote getter.

Mayor pro-tem Doug Miller, who is serving that two-year commission term, said he's undecided about running this year.

'I haven't really thought about it a lot; I haven't really had enough time to give it a lot of thought," he said.

Other commission seats up for grabs in November are held by commissioners John Vos III, Stella Greene and James Jabara.

gible to run, having served nearly two consecutive terms.

Vos, who finishes his first four-year term on the commission in November, said he's considering running for re-election.

"I'm talking to the people who supported me in the last election," he said. "I'll probably end up doing it; there is a lot of work."

Greene is serving the term vacated by Jerry Vorva last fall, as he won election to the state House. Will she

Crusader aims at hunters

To some, animal-rights activists are an emotional sort, After all, they throw blood at folks wearing fur coats, right?

But Mike Chiado of Plymouth Township said he was moved to become an animal-rights activist because the intellectual arguments were compelling. Chiado, 37, faced trial last week

in Chelsea district court on a charge of violating the state hunter harassment law in October on state

land near Hell, Mich. The charges were dismissed on a technicality, as it was determined that the hunters approached by the activists weren't

hunting legally.
On his beliefs, Chiado said, "It's having a respect for life. I can't give back a life, so I shouldn't take it," he said.

Before he got into the animalrights movement, Chiado said he was moved to become a vegetarian in the late '70s, after an all-night debate with a hunter.

"I decided I just wasn't going to

eat meat anymore. I was an ethical vegetarian. The next day at breakfast I had eggs and I didn't order

"I thought we didn't have a right to eat them (animals); we could eat other foods. It seems like an obvious way to create more compassion in the world."

When one takes animal rights seriously, there are positive ramifications, Chiado said.

Feds to help fund Mettetal

The government purchase of Mettetal Airport is taking off, as the state is scheduled to receive \$17.3 million to buy state airports.

Sen. Donald Riegle, D-Mich, announced Wednesday that the state department of transportation would get a federal grant to make land available for seven of the state's community airports.

Topping the list is Mettetal Airport at Lilley and Joy in Canton, a \$4.6million project, according to Riegle.

"I'm very pleased that this federal money is coming back to Michigan to help make our smaller airports more prosperous and competitive," Riegle said. "They're an integral part of the local economy and deserve support."

The grant was awarded by the Federal Aviation Administration. The state department of transportation makes the final determination as to which state airports receive money, and how much.

Of Riegle's announcement, state aeronautics commission director Bill Gehman said, "That indicates that federal funds are available."

Gehman said the state is waiting for the committee appointed by Canton supervisor Tom Yack to complete a study of the airport purchase.

We'll review that and if there are any concerns we'll try to address them," Gehman said.

'It would be after that time we would proceed with any purchase of the airport," he said.

"Our past has been characterized by restructuring initiatives that have not been sustained, in part, because we have not presented the faculty with a unified plan and commitment for change," the restructuring committee said.

The intent of the town meetings is to talk about the reasons for restructuring and decide on a restructuring model to pilot in the fall of 1994. Schoolwide implementation is slated for the fall of 1997.

EMU to study Willow Run's impact in area

Small businesses in Canton will be surveyed randomly to determine how the closing of the General Motors Willow Run plant affects them.

"We want to see what effects are out there," said Charles Monsma, director of the Institute for Community And Regional Development at Eastern Michigan University.

Monsma's organization will poll businesses in areas surrounding the Willow Run plant in Washtenaw County, as well as in western Wayne County, through local chambers of commerce.

"Canton, of course, is still growing and booming," Monsma told Canton Chamber of Commerce members Wednesday. "Although this is a little blip, the community is moving in a positive direction."

ICARD has been studying the effects of GM's decision to close the Willow Run plant. The organization conducted a study before the decision to close as well.

"The biggest impact in Detroit will be around here," Monsma said, referring to GM's latest round of closings, including Willow Run.

Approximately 131 Willow Run employees live in Canton.

Monsma's results are skewed somewhat because his studies do not include the announced closing this year of the Livonia Delco Chassis plant, which will put 2,000 out of work.

Altogether, Monsma said approximately 35,000-36,000 GM employees will lose jobs because of plant closings.

"It's a lot, but less than we lost in the 1980s. It adds to the cumulative effect of the downsizing of the economy," he said.

Monsma's planned study will also take a look at how people are dealing with the closings. "Part of that is probing what people think."

Monsma said he also wants to find out what skills those who lose their jobs have, as well as what skills potential employers need from employees.

"We will see what skills they have, what they think they have, and what they need," Monsma said.

The ICARD director told chamber members of Ypsilanti Township's reaction to GM's closing. "The township people were angry, no doubt about it. They felt double-crossed."

Though Washentaw Circuit Court ruled in favor of the township — which argued that GM must keep the plant open because it was given tax abatements — GM is appealing. An injunction, meanwhile, is keeping the plant

"Both sides have an interest in getting this resolved," Monsma said.

Construction on Canton memorial gets under way

Construction of the Canton Veterans Memorial in Heritage Park has begun.

"They have started the foundation," said Tim LaGrow, vice president of the Canton Veterans Memorial Committee.

The memorial is expected to be completed in time for the Canton Liberty Fest. In fact, the committee will kick off this year's fest with the dedication of the memorial on Friday, June 25.

Simpson Granite of Detroit began work on the foundation Wednesday morning. The company is working with the granite components of the memorial. The granite was quarried in Wisconsin and sent to granite craftsmen in

Vermont.

The memorial will be constructed of five panels of granite.
The center panel will be 4 feet wide, 8 feet high, and 1 foot thick.
The side panels will be 3 feet wide and taper to 5 feet high at the ends.

The memorial was designed by Plymouth-Canton High School student John Sheehy and incorporates the emblems of the five branches of the service: Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines and Navy.

While the committee is still seeking donations, the township has absorbed the project into the Liberty Fest, including financing, "We were just struggling," La-Grow said.

The committee has raised more than \$20,000 and expects to continue raising money through the sale of brick pavers on the walkway leading to the memorial. But the township will take care of site work, including landscaping, lighting, a sprinkler system and walk areas.

"We still want to raise money to offset the costs. We would like this memorial to be from the citizens of the Plymouth-Canton area," LaGrow said.

Brick paver orders are moving along well, but committee members want to sell even more. Though there was an April 1 deadline for pavers to be engraved and in place in time for the dedication, sales will continue, including during the Liberty Fest weekend.

Blank bricks will be placed in the memorial walkway to allow them to be removed when someone buys one.

Bricks are available for donations of \$100 or more or \$250 or more. The \$250 brick is larger and allows four lines of 10 characters each for engraving. The \$100 brick allows two lines of 10 characters each. A star will be added to the top of the bricks of service veterans.

"We can't guarantee they will be back in time for the dedication," LaGrow said.

Committee members also would like to know of service men or women who were either killed in action, missing in action, or prisoners of war. The veterans memorial committee will buy a brick for each of these service people and have their names en-

Five generations

Lineage goes back to Bradford

Gov. William Bradford would be proud of Mary Lou Hentges — especially if he found out that she's made her way to Plymouth.

"When we were asked to write a report in school on someone who might be famous in our family, we all did it on him (Bradford)," said Heather, Hentges' 22-year-old daughter.

Bradford, who came to America on the Mayflower, happened to have been the founder of Plymouth — not this one, but the one in Massachusetts. Bradford is important to the Hentgeses because he is one of their ancestors — a direct one, to be exact. Hentges is one of five generations of women who are descended from the former governor, who died in 1657.

The birth of Savanah, Heather's daughter, in December 1992 was not only significant because she is Mary Lou's first grandchild, but she is the fifth generation of first-born women in her family.

"We started working on this on an Easter Sunday to see if we could trace all this back," Hentges said. "I think it's neat there's five generations."

Better yet, all five generations of those first-born women are still alive. Hentges' grandmother, Dorothy, 93, lives in Ohio, as does Mary Lou's mother, Betty.

"I picked up on the first-born of the first-born over five generations," Hentges said.

Gov. Bradford isn't one of those forgotten ancestors. Mary Lou's grandmother — the first of the first-born women — was given Bradford as her middle name. "Her mother must have been a history buff," Hentges said.

To find their roots, Hentges and one of her sisters, Barbara, used their mother's copy of William Bradford's journal.

"It's a little difficult to read,"
Hentges said of the journal,
which is written in 17th-century
English. "But researching our
genealogy was really pretty sim-

Hentges found that she and her ancestors are descended from Bradford and his second wife, Alice. Bradford's first wife and son died in their first year in America. It's believed that Dorothy, Hentges' grandmother, is at least the ninth or 10th generation descended from the Plymouth founder.

No doubt Hentges is fascinated with Bradford. But she's just as fascinated with the history her female ancestors have created. Dorothy, her grandmother, worked for the railroad in Ohio, keeping track of where each car was headed. "She also owned and drove a Model T. She was a little ahead of her time."

Mary Lou's mother, Betty, Dorothy's first-born, worked for American Steel & Wire and went to college for a semester. Dorothy, who has 12 greatgrandchildren with another on the way, returned to work when her son decided he wanted to go to school.

"She went to work at a dime store. I think she may have liked the status of working," Hentges said of Dorothy.

It was sort of a fluke that Hentges found her way to Plymouth. She and her ancestors are really Ohio natives. But work brought Hentges and her husband. William, to Michigan.

"I haven't made a firm decision yet," she said, adding she'll decide after the commission wrestles with parking, streetscape plans, and the budget in the next few weeks.

The name of the second person taking out petitions was unavailable Friday.

A candidate must collect the signatures of 25 city residents who are registered voters, file those signatures with the clerk by the deadline and have them certified in order to become a bonafide candidate.

Talks on police merger take one step forward

Talks on merging fire, police and other services in the Plymouth-Canton-Northville area are gearing up again.

The five elected leaders of reater Canton, Plymouth and Northville agreed April 1 to study the idea of a joint fire-police dispatch and records operation in

They've also agreed to seek pro-

posals from several universities and consulting firms to review op-

Administrators from all five communities have prepared information on potential cost savings for some sort of police departments consolidation. "But it was felt by the elected leaders that a consultant with experience in such studies could help investigate the options," according to a

statement from the five elected government leaders.

May 3 to review study proposals

they receive.

Videotapes showed metal devices slamming into live baboons' skulls - and technicians would sometimes hammer on the live

"They would be laughing about it, holding up their limp bodies - these are live, sentient creatures," Chiado said.

To oppose lab testing of animals, Chiado said, "does not mean compromising human

Animal-rights advocates have a range of beliefs, from those who break into labs to free animals to those "that say cages are OK as long as you make them comfortable," Chiado said.

He attended his first protest, of a veal restaurant in Chicago, in the early '80s. Now, Chiado is on the board of directors of two area animal rights groups, Humanitarians for Animal Rights Education in Royal Oak, and Washtenaw

Citizens for Animal Rights based in Ann Arbor.

In recent years, protests on be-half of animal rights have focused more on hunting. The Fund For Animals - which organized the Hell, Mich. bow-hunting protests which Chiado joined — maintains that this form of hunting is especially cruel, as it can result in the maiming of animals.

"Animal-rights people seem to be misunderstood," he said. "They seem to think that means less people rights - That's quite the contrary. Nowhere does it say there's a finite number of rights.

"We want to expand the moral sphere of consciousness," he said.

Unemployment rates drop in Plymouths and Canton

Unemployment rates fell in Canton, Plymouth Township and Plymouth in February, the Michigan Employment Security Commission reports.

The unemployment rate in Canton fell to 3 percent in February compared to 3.5 percent in January and 4 percent in February 1992.

In Plymouth, the unemployment rate was 2 percent in February compared to 2.3 percent in

January and 2.7 percent in Febru-

In Plymouth Township, the rate was 2.5 percent in February, compared to 2.8 percent in January and 3.3 percent in February

The fall in unemployment rates coincided with the falling of those rates in all but one of Michigan's 12 major labor market areas, according to seasonally unadjusted estimates compiled by the MESC.

"There was a general pattern

across the labor markets of employment gains in the personnel services sector as temporary help agencies increased hiring and among private, state and local schools as employees returned to their jobs after the holiday break," said F. Robert Edwards, MESC director.

Seasonal employment declines occurred in the construction and retail trade sectors, the MESC re-

Oakland Community College chancellor Patsy Fulton said her board is considering increasing tuition as much as 10 percent — \$4 a credit hour on the current base of \$41.

McDowell's Schoolcraft, in northwestern Wayne County, is studying a \$3 increase to \$43.

Fulton said OCC gets only 24 percent of its operating funds from state aid, 37 percent from property taxes and a hefty 39 percent from tuition.

The state's funding formula

visualizes the 29 community colleges getting 50 percent from state aid, 25 percent from property taxes and 25 percent from tuition.

Community college presidents

cite dangers of ebbing state aid

Why? What's going awry in Lansing? The presidents blamed:
■ Flat state aid. The colleges got \$233 million (adjusted) this year. Engler's two-year budget proposes \$233 million for fiscal 1993-94 and \$233 million for 1994-95.
■ Property tax caps. Last year the

Legislature froze assessments. The new school reform proposal on the June 2 ballot would cap assessment growth but not college costs. It promises a 3 percent boost to kindergarten through 12th grade schools but nothing more to community colleges.

Retirement costs. State budgets have shifted more of these costs to the colleges without providing matching dollars.

Fulton said OCC's costs rose by \$4.5 million from \$12.7 million in 1991 to \$17.1 million.

As employees leave, she said, at least half aren't being replaced.

Statewide, said Tom Bernthal of the Michigan Community Colleges Association, health care and retirement costs are rising \$10.4 million this year.

For nearly two decades, the

state gave Wayne County Community College a subsidy on top of state aid because voters steadfastly refused to levy a local property tax.

Only after the Legislature voted to cut the \$7.3 million subsidy did WCCC voters approve a millage. WCCC includes Detroit, the two Redford school districts, Wayne-Westland, the east side and downriver suburbs.

Engler wants to use the recovered \$7.3 million elsewhere in the state's \$8 billion budget. Community college leaders, however, say it should be spread around the two-year colleges.

But Ken LaSalle, WCCC's vice president for administration, asked that his college be given \$2.3 million for one year only to cover "transition" costs. "There may be a cash flow problem," he said.

LaSalle said WCCC had cleaned house by reducing the full-time workforce by 100, turning over six officials for prosecution, closing the western campus near I-275, replacing all top administrators, meeting 143 of 144 audit recommendations and freezing salaries for three years.

But LaSalle was criticized by another president, Gerald Welch of Monroe, for claiming all of Wayne County as WCCC's service area.

Cop caper

Airport police in 'custody battle'

Wayne County Sheriff Robert Ficano will ask the county commission Tuesday to intervene in what he believes is an attack on his authority by county Executive Edward McNamara.

Ficano's chief of staff, Nancy Mouradian, said the sheriff will request "emergency consideration" of methods the commission might use to block the establishment of a Metro Airport police department by McNamara.

Mouradian and two others — Deputy Sheriff Anthony Shannon and Deputy Don Cox, president of Local 502 — said they heard that McNamara has ordered an April 19 creation of an airport police force using officers already in the sheriff's department. Currently the airport is policed by 95 sheriff's department officers.

Neither McNamara nor his chief deputy, Michael Duggan, returned the Observer's phone calls last week to comment on the alleged April 19 start-up

Airport director Robert Braun has studied the value of having a separate airport police force and recommended creation to McNamara, but Executive Department spokeswoman Irma Clark said Friday that McNamara is "not involved" with the issue.

Mouradian believes
McNamara is very involved because he wants revenge on Ficano for beating Redford resident Kevin Kelley (whom
McNamara heavily supported)
in the Democratic primary for
sheriff last year.

By wresting the airport officers from Ficano's control, McNamara would ostensibly weaken Ficano's power base.

"I can't help it if Mr. McNamara is a sore loser," Mouradian said. "I'd just like him to find another object of scorn and leave (Ficano) alone."

To date, the airport director and the sheriff have stressed that the safety of the public is their highest priority. Ficano says that McNamara is the one trying to score political points. Braun says Ficano is swinging his political ax. McNamara isn't saying anything.

Braun says the reason he wants an airport police depart-

ment is because Ficano has been interfering with the airport director's lawful authority over the airport deputies.

The deputies themselves are just trying to stay out of the way as Ficano and McNamara

"We don't care who we work for as long as we have our jobs. We don't want to be in the middle, " said Bob Sheldon, president of Local 3317, representing the department's sergeants and lieutenants.

Don Cox, president of Local 502, representing the deputies, said Ficano has verbally threatened to bar the return to the sheriff's department of any officer who joins the airport police force. "I just can't understand why Mr. Ficano is saying, 'I won't permit you to move in and out of this department,' "Cox said.

Cox and Sheldon say the deputies are mainly interested in protecting their jobs and staying out of the ring with McNamara and Ficano.

"They're highly suspicious of all political people," Cox said.



Area businesses join etching campaign to deter auto theft

Now they're fighting car theft by the numbers, literally.

Aided by the Michigan State Police, the Michigan Auto Theft Prevention Authority and the Alliance for a Safer Greater Detroit, 12 area car dealerships and a glass dealer are offering free VIN etching.

But what's a VIN? It's the Vehicle Identification Number unique to each motorized transportation device sold in the United States.

Using acid and equipment supplied by state police, the etchers will put the VIN on every window of your car. (It takes about five minutes).

That might sound like sacrificing aesthetics for a dubious deterrent, but Det. Sgt. Ted Monsette of the state police said that having your windows numbered makes them and the doors virtually useless to

The VIN-etched glass is traceable, Monsette said, and therefore the people who thieves sell parts to won't buy them. That's not to say some lunatic won't swipe your car for the fancy radio, seats, wheels and tires, but it's a start.

thieves.

"Our eventual goal is to have every dealer in the Detroit metro area a part of this pro-

gram," Monsette said. The dozen dealers on board now include Dick Scott Buick of Plymouth, Lou Lariche Chevrolet of Plymouth, Glassman Olds of Southfield and Bill Fox Chevrolet of Rochester Hills. And all outlets of Henderson Glass are in the program, too.

George Glassman said he's been with the program four months and etched about 50 vehicles. "It serves a worthy purpose," he said. "There's no downside to it. People get hap-

But some car dealers are less zealous regarding VIN etching than others.

"I don't know that we offer it to anyone," said Ron Chaudoin, general manager of Lariche Chevrolet. "There's been no requests for it." Like all the dealers in the program, however, Lariche will etch your glass for free if you buy a new car or have work done to your old car. Henderson Glass will do the etching free as well, but doesn't require a qualifying purchase.

Others, like Bill Fox Chevrolet, aren't quite ready to etch yet. Fox general manager Ken

Garlow said he's still waiting for some necessary computer soft-ware, but will offer etching free to purchasers of new and used cars when the equipment arrives. "That will be a service to show our gratitude," he said.

Other dealers, like Jim Muir Other dealers, like Jim Muli Olds of Sterling Heights and Al Long Ford of Warren, are going "full hog" on the program, Mon-sette said, with Long Ford even etching wheels.

Gary Marr, the sales manager of Long Ford, said he offers free VIN etching to everyone who buys a car, has work done or just pulls in for that specific purpose. They've done 60 cars in the two months they've been part of the program. "It's a great idea," Marr said.

Insurance companies agree, with most of them offering discounts on comprehensive coverage for VIN-etched cars. AAA Michigan offers a 5-percent discount. Other companies go as high as 15 percent.

Thelma Castillo, a spokeswoman for the Alliance for a Safer Greater Detroit, said Michigan is the only state in the country where auto theft is becoming less frequent.

hile I'm not well-acquainted with former Detroit Lion Lem Barney, he and I have many mutual acquaintances. My name and his have appeared together on the stationery of various egalitarian boards and I feel a personal affinity for his athletic background, his support of liberal humanitarian causes and his graceful bearing in the unforgiving floodlights of media attention and crowd pressure.

I was an NCAA All-American sprinter who outran Olympic champions in faster time than they won Olympic gold, went undefeated representing the United States in Europe on the national team and ultimately was relegated to various athletic halls of fame.

Thus I speak as a man who has been tested in brutally competitive crucibles wherein many others have melted away. I also speak as a former coach of high school athletes who later gained

collegiate All-America status while sometime ignoring training rules regarding the use of intoxicatives - both legal and illegal.

During my days as an executive educator, I was denounced as a troublemaker by some community groups and officials - and by many in the media - not only for espousing multiculturalism but also for advocating the decriminalization of drug use.

I come from a prodigiously substance-abusing Celtic family, prominently featuring my alcoholic ex-fighter father (a legendary liberal humanitarian in his time). I also confess that during my more boisterous days I didn't decline a few straight-up hits of Jack Daniels and roach clip now and then - even when I was an international athlete. And, yes I did inhale.

So it is with multiple sorrows that I note Lem Barney's recent arrest for allegedly using illegal substances and his

subsequent hospitalization for depression. He was one of the National Football League's greatest cornerbacks and countless people idolize and emulate

If he's guilty, I can't excuse him. What I can do is empathize — particularly since the pontificating media and the pious general public judge their "fallen heroes" by a far tougher yardstick than they reserve for themselves and their own various vices.

How many of us have never yielded to the blandishments of nicotine or marijuana use, or to overindulgence in alcohol, or to philandering, or to gluttony or to any other form of fleshly weakness? Our behaving in these ways doesn't make them right, but it makes

As a humanly flawed being like the rest of us, Lem Barney deserves the same second chance that we all do. Bear in mind that he isn't accused of selling drugs, as did - for example his old antagonist Bob Hayes, the peerless sprinter who became the Dallas Cowboys' premier wide receiver.

This distinction between being accused of using rather than of selling is a significant one. Recognizing that the role models of our younger years are prey to the same addictive predilections as you or I is a big step toward

It's time to grow up and stop blindly ascribing superhuman characteristics to people just because they've done superhuman deeds on an athletic field.

To expect Lem Barney to behave su-perhumanly off the gridiron is perhaps doubly unfair to him, if only because often he has actually met such expectate

This affable ex-superstar has contributed much to our community in the past. What he needs most from us now is sympathetic support in his very unsuper-but very human-struggle.

Dirt farmers become victims of cultural diversity

ity the poor redneck in these days of cultural diversity. In Birmingham the schools are spending as much time teaching kids. about homosexuality as they are making sure the kids learn math. But of course it certainly changes the equation of things.

And while we're making sure our kids are taught not to slight anyone, the country folk in Canton Township are being insulted by public officials and the public in general.

The reason is that wannabe upper middle class people talk a good game about respecting the rural way of life, but when it comes to smelling the pig excrement, it's a different matter. Country ducks are more to their taste.

Farms are real places, not historical re-creations like the Firestone Farm at Greenfield Village. In other words, old junk sitting around farms is quaint. while new junk is an eyesore. The question is at what point does junk

turn into an antique?

Chances are those old hayrakes and broken plows had about as much quaintness about them in the 19th century as a 1973 Chevy sitting up on cider blocks has now.

The clash between the subdivision people and the rural folks came to a head recently in Canton Township when tax assessments went up on farms as much as 300 percent.

Granted, these folks haven't had a tax increase in 12 years, but it certainly was a shock for the farm people.

And while Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack, and others, treated their concerns seriously, privately others in the township have groused that many of these folks really aren't farmers and they've got too much junk in their back yards.

Pardon the sociologist in me breaking out, but the problem is that city folks have this stereotype of farmers

But farming is more than just making money; it's usually a family tradition. And that's where the junk comes

My own family's farm in Arkansas is of that variety. No, there isn't a car seat in the front yard; they're upscale rednecks. But there is the foundation of the house my great grandfather built, and behind it a falling down barn that my grandfather worked on as a kid. It's top blew down in a storm and nobody has had the heart to demolish

Nearby these's the rusting hulk of a 1963 Dodge still painted with victory slogans from a long forgotten football

A six-foot-long rusty tool box once

used in Little Rock's railroad yards now serves as a barbecue and the tumbled down corral is a reminder of past hog killings.
This collection from the past sits

next to a modern ranch home. The place is nothing special, but it's special to me. And it makes me appreciate the farm homes in western Canton.

All people have their sense of aesthetics usually based on their education and background. If we are to take cultural diversity seriously, schools should be teaching students about respecting the cultural back-grounds of Michigan's rednecks, the dirt farmer, as he is called here.

But instead our children learn about daddy's special roommate. No wonder folks feel free to tax farmers off their land and insult them on top of it.







Be creative; use up those leftover eggs

sn't it enough that egg prices mysteriously rise 15 to 20 percent this time of year? Add to that the cost of Peter Rabbit's trendy Easter

egg dye and coloring kit. Then consider the grocery store bagger wearing headphones and a "Party Naked" sweatshirt who "inadvertently" placed the four dozen delicate ovals underneath the 6-pound pork roast.

Now you're faced with the monumental task of having to incorporate 40 or so of the hard-cooked eggs into the next three days worth of family menus.

You could start by making enough egg salad to serve the 5th Battalion of the National Guard.

You could make a surprise meat loaf and insert the hard-cooked devils in the center, then call it a pate and invite all the hoity-toity folks you know for "hors d'oeuvres."

If worst comes to worst, toss them all in the food processor, shells and all, and make a \$6-perpound garden fertilizer!

Creative leftovers

Or, you can read on. First off, rest assured there are many recipes that can be made with leftover hard-cooked Easter eggs.

The secret is creativity. They can be mashed and stirred into cream sauces. Give Swedish meatballs and stroganoff a subtle richness by stirring in 1/2 cup of mashed hard-cooked egg just before

Hard-cooked eggs can easily be adapted into salads and salad dressings. The classic Cobb salad is a perfect example. Wake up the flavor of a basic "ranch" style dressing with 1/2 cup of mashed hard-cookers.

Even those folks concerned about cholesterol can utilize just the whites in these recipes, placing the hard-cooked yolks outside for the birds and squirrels to enjoy.

Now, for a little disheartening news. To be on the safe side, I called Lois Thielke, extension home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service, and a frequent writer for the Observer & Eccentric.

I needed some info on just how long you and I can safely tolerate the colorful creations before turning them into garden fodder or risk food poi-

Safety concerns

Lois quoted the most recent press release from the food service folks at Michigan State University "Decorated hard-cooked eggs should be consumed within two to three days after cooking, when refrigerated.

"When used for coloring, decorating, hunting and displaying, total time out of refrigeration should not exceed two hours.'

When I think of all those years the eggs sat in the baskets, grabbing an occasional bite, doused with an ample supply of high-blood-pressurized salt, according to Michigan State University, it's a wonder I'm still sitting here writing this! (By the way, if you have questions regarding food safety, you can call Oakland County's Cooperative Extension Food Hotline at 858-0904).

Momma's methods

Momma would always prepare more eggs than necessary for the family Easter baskets. Good Friday was always noted as "egg salad day," when we would chow down on sandwiches made with the eggs that cracked during boiling.

Leftover hard-cooked eggs would be braided into sweetened bread or finely mashed and mixed with bread crumbs to make a tasty coating for salmon

I remember one year Momma mixed some mashed hard-cooked eggs with a little Miracle Whip and grated cheese and placed it between egg-dipped French toast slices for a hearty, appet-


One year, when Dad was temporarily laid-off and money was scarce, mashed hard-cooked eggs were stirred into a chicken broth and rice soup for added protein.

Health conscious consumers can even buy smart eggs" that are supposedly lower in cholesterol than their regular counterparts, and can be used the same way as regular eggs.

As mentioned earlier, anyone with a garden can benefit from the egg shells being tossed into the soil or compost heap.

"Nobody has time to cook after work." Wrong! with a well-stocked pantry, and a little planning, you can

get dinner on the table in 30 minutes or less. Paula Hamilton, Linda Gassenheimer and Mary Bartz, manager of the Betty Crocker Kitchens, made a believer out of me.

I've been following the advice they offer in three newly published cookbooks for the past week with appetizing results. And as an added bonus, I'm saving money and losing weight. Too many carryouts make your budget and belly bulge.

The right equipment is important too. Sharpen your knives - a dull one will slow you down and use the right one for the job. As an example, Hamilton says it's much faster to chop or slice an onion with a large, sharp chef's knife than with a tiny paring knife.

She uses her microwave as a tool - to heat vegetables, melt butter and chocolate - and finishes the job with other appliances. "I like the smell of cooking. It's very nurturing for the family, she said.

Putting her kids to work also saves time. "I was shocked to learn that many kids aren't allowed in the kitchen," she said. "If you don't let them help they will want your attention. Kids are interested in food. They can mix salad dressings. My son, Jeff, who is 9, peels and deveins shrimp."

What good is your food processor if it's hidden away in a kitchen cupboard or the basement? Put it where you can use it, recommends Gassenheimer, author of "Dinner in Minutes" (Chapters Publishing, \$29.95 hardcover, \$19.95 paperback).

"Clear the kitchen so you can kind of hit it running when you come home from work," she said during a telephone interview. Starting with a clean sink can shave as much as 10 to 15 minutes from preparations.'

Gassenheimer is executive director of Gardner's Markets, a chain of supermarkets in Miami. "Dinner in Minutes" recipes originated in Gassenheimer's nationally syndicated Miami Herald column, also called "Dinner in Minutes.

She's also the mother of three grown boys, who developed her style of cooking after 25 years of juggling work and family sched-

■ Make a list of about four meals in advance. Buy fresh ingredients that will keep at least four days in the refrigerator to go along with the staples you already have on

■ Shopping at the end of the day when stores are crowded is tiring, especially if you have to go home and cook too. Keep a cooler in the trunk of your car so that you can shop before work or at lunch.

Let your supermarket help you. Supermarket services available can include precut vegetables, and fruit, prewashed salads and meats and poultry cut for stirfrying. Some markets will shell shrimp for you.

■ Keep pasta, pizza shells and bottled or frozen sauces on hand for emergency dinners.

Freeze good-quality, freshly

grated Parmesan cheese. It can be measured without defrosting and will quickly reach room tempera-

ture. ■ The quickest way to cook rice is to prepare it like pasta in a lot of boiling water. It turns out perfect and fluffy and takes only 10 minutes, or half the normal time.

■ Replace vegetable peelers often. Like knives, they need to be sharp to work efficiently. If you still have one from five years ago, invest in a new one.

If you keep two or three chopping boards available, you won't have to stop and wash a board while cooking. I prefer those that are dish-water safe. I also like a be moved around so I can chop all my vegetables on it and carry it.

■ You really only need three sharp knives on hand. For most cutting tasks, a 13-inch and an 8inch are sufficient. Additionally, a stainless-steel serrated knife is perfect for cutting fruit or toma-





"Destroyed by MTV, I hate to bite the hand that feeds me so much information" — so starts Duran Duran's ninth album, 'Duran Duran.

Discipline pushes for 'Profit'

■ They know there's interest in their music in Norway, but for Discipline the goal at present is to fan the flames of support in the metro Detroit area. One way, the group hopes, is with the release of "Push & Profit."

The Royal Oakbased Discipline has no intention of dwelling on the past, and the fivepiece band hopes with its debut re-

lease, "Push & Profit," things will accelerate in the future.

"One of the problems we are having and we feel we might run into is because the music is so long, (the songs) are not standard pop form and not standard post-punk form, and it doesn't really fit in anywhere, and we are just trying to find an audience that crosses boundaries,' said front man Matthew Parmenter.

"It's our alternative to alternative," added bassist Mathew Kenne-

The eight-track release is a flowing array of mature, electric, orchestrated sound. With the average song length at seven minutes, the band knows its material may be difficult to plug in this era of simplicity.

It will take a while to convince radio stations that's it's OK to play a seven-minute song. . . . It will take someone to break that," said keyboardist David Krofchok. "I think we raise enough eyebrows that if the right people hear it . . . I think we have a shot.'

Regardless if Discipline has "a shot" in the Detroit area or not, the band recently returned from performing in Norway, where the mem-bers were surprised by the crowd's reactions to their material.

"One gig that we played was a club called Alaska. It wasn't very well attended, but the audience was very, very loud, and they had us come out and sing again, and I eventually said I couldn't do it because I lost my voice," Parmenter said.
"They were loving the music,"

Krofchok said. "We had people up on the stage talking afterwards for what seemed to be a good hour, talking about how much they liked this

The band landed the opportunity to play when a Norwegian college student, Pal Bevrfjord, approached

the band after a local show. Bevrfjord was impressed with the band's unique live performance style and was interested in having them play in his home country.

After returning to Norway with a cassette of Discipline's music, he persuaded members of his school's concert committee to sponsor a brief

tour. The college, which is located outside of Oslo, picked up the band's airfare and room and board. Bevrfjord was able to schedule three shows spread out over a two-week period in March.

Besides the Alaska club show, Discipline played an acoustic set in a campus tavern and days later played in a campus amphitheater.

"There were a lot of students stage diving, and if you heard our music, it's kind of weird," Parmenter said.

"We had one drunk that no one would catch," said Jon Preston Bouda with a laugh.

Before they returned home, Bevrfjord expressed interest in bringing the band back next year, but for now Discipline is pooling its energies to raise awareness about the band at home.

"Push & Profit" should accomplish just that. The release was recorded at Tempermill studios in Ferndale during January. It provided the band the ability to polish its sound.

"I think most of it comes from playing live, because you really learn to work together as a unit," Parmenter said. "If something goes wrong, it's kind of interesting how you will get out of it, and when we had the opportunity to record in the studio, it just came off as part of our

we've done plenty of recording in the one-take-live feel, but one of the things is we wanted to go back into the studio and get a more pol-

ished sound. But when we are live I think we do have a polished sound, but it's different.'

"It's a different energy," said drummer Paul Dzendzel. "You are in front of people playing instead of each other in a studio.

The band members are realistic about their future, while concentrating on their current efforts.

"The trip was a good thing, but it was fairly one-dimensional. It doesn't get to the root of the reason why we went (to Norway), because it has to do with the music," Parmenter said. "The trip was great and it said a lot about us, but it's time to move on.'

'Keeper' examines bizarre trial

Known collectively as the 'Ward boys," the four elderly bachelor brothers milk the cows, feed the turkeys and live in a squalor not unlike their livestock. On cold nights, they sleep in the same room and often in the same beds.

The townspeople don't get too close: "You leave them alone, they leave you alone," says one of the Wards' neighbors in rural New York. "If you're in a restaurant, you don't just plop your ass down next to 'em; you might even move down a seat or two.'

But when one of the brothers ends up dead one morning and the police say they have Delbert Ward's signed confession of murder, the neighbors are up in arms. They raise bail money and find a lawyer who can prove that Delbert, nearly illiterate, didn't know what he was putting his name to.

It's the district attorney's job to prove that Delbert, tired of hearing the cries of the terminally sick MOVIES

brother, put his hand over William's mouth and suffocated him.

The documentary account of the trial and the men who went from outcast farmers to fullblown media figures make up "Brother's Keeper." The amazing new film, playing this weekend at the Detroit Film Theatre, is the most exciting documentary to hit area screens since "Roger and

Not that the two have all that much in common. Michael Moore's personalized account of GM's pulling out of Flint was as much about himself as it was about Roger Smith. Here, filmmakers Joe Berlinger and Bruce Sinofsky try to stay out of the camera range, though they can be heard asking usually intelligent

Oh, occasionally they'll stumble into a "how did it feel when

you knew your brother was dead?," but many of their questions are sincere and compelling. And though they've been criticized for further corrupting the rusticity of their simple subjects by filming, they try to remain objective and, by all accounts, accu-

The brothers, Lyman, Delbert and Roscoe, live on the family farm left to them by their mother, who died some 30 years ago. It hasn't been cleaned since. Cats roam the place and dirty clothes lie in piles. A new television set, their main link with the outside world, is simply stacked atop the one that broke.

By following Delbert over the span of a year in preparation for the trial, we see a man changing. Local ladies put on a fund-raising dinner for him, dance with him, and pack the courtroom during the trial. A lighted sign outside a local restaurant keeps drivers updated on trial results while just below it reads "Pork and Ham craft, Livonia 48150.

And while it is sometimes hard to tell "the boys" apart beneath their shaggy gray beards and baseball caps (and harder yet to understand what the heck they're saying), the movie paints vivid portraits of all three. Perhaps the most unforgettable sequence shows brother Lyman (by his own account "the nervous one") shaking, almost dying of fright on the witness stand.



With eight starters back from a winning team, Plymouth Salem already has the foundation in place for another successful softball season.

The Rocks were 18-8 and third in the Lakes Division behind Walled Lake Central and Westland John Glenn with a 6-4 record.

The key position, as it is with every high school fast-pitch team, is pitching and the key question: how good is

Salem has a solid pitcher in senior Jenny Garvey, who begins her fourth season on the varsity. She was 18-6 and an all-division player.

Garvey isn't a finesse pitcher with a lot of fancy pitches but a consistent, dependable one who throws strikes, which is the most important quality of a high school thrower.

"Jenny is a very key player," second-year coach Al Campbell said. "Keep her from getting injured and we'll be competitive. Jenny is going to have a good year."

Campbell's only concern about pitching is depth and a possible injury to Garvey. Her backup is junior Amy Ruthig, who has only JV experi-

"Amy is going to get some; we're going to throw her," Campbell said, adding pitching is most crucial and a team is blessed with a player like Plymouth Canton's Kelly Holmes once in 50 years."

The catcher again will be senior Amber Trombetta, a good defensive player who works well with Garvey, Campbell said. Stacy Sinke is only a sophomore

He wouldn't let you, anyway. George is the kind of coach who be-

Despite hardships, Roseanne's character follow that dream

It's hard to ignore Tom and Roseanne Arnold. For one thing, each is the star of a weekly halfhour comedy series on ABC. Her show Roseanne is a solid hit and sure to stay on the air for as long as she wishes. His (The Jackie Thomas Show - he's Jackie) has received generally favorable response from viewers and critics and is likely to be back next season, though he was saying it's a sure thing long before ABC made any

But those shows just scratch the surface of the Arnolds' presence (some would say choke hold) on the collective American consciousness. Separately and together, Tom and Roseanne are ubiquitous on the nation's talk shows and in the pages of newspapers and magazines.

Understandably, this kind of overexposure, as well as their comeout-swinging approach to their detractors, has given the Arnolds more than their share of navsavers, a sizable public that shuns their every appearance. These are the psople who won't give a fair shot to The Woman Who Loved Elvis, a telefilm starring Tom and Roseanne that airs Sunday, April 18, on ABC.

It's their loss. From Laura Kalpakian's well-regarded novel. Graced Land, writer Rita Mae Brown (Ruby-fruit Jungle) has fashioned a clever, peppery script

that is both weirdly funny and honestly moving. Bill Bixby's direction, though a little sluggish at times, generally serve the story well. Most importantly, the performances by the Arnolds and the rest of the talented cast keep the dignity of their respective characters intact, never opting for the easy or mean-spirited laugh.

Roseanne gives a remarkable performance as Joyce Jackson, an indefatigable mother of two whose front porch is given over to a garish. candleladen shrine to Elvis Presley. Her simple home is similarly decorated and her wardrobe seems mostly to consist of T-shirts bearing the King's smoldering likeness. Her daughters are named Cilla and Lisa Marie (after Presley's wife and child), and her conversation is punctuated with references to the singer's troubled life and charttopping songs. She even owns a shaggy dog she refers to as The Colonel

Buy Joyce's feelings about Presley run deeper that joining the Love Me Tender Fan Club or hoarding commemorative stamps. In Presley's rags-to-riches story. Joyce finds hope for her own redemption. In the beauty of Presley's music that outlasts the lurid details of his later years, Joyce sees the transcendant good in life and dedicates herself to the same charitable spirit that led her hero to perform countless benefit shows,

donate anonymous thousands and even give away Cadillacs. Joyce eschews a Presley fanatic's pilgrimage to Graceland, instead distributing boxes of clothing to grateful needy families "in the name of the King."

But Joyce herself is on welfare, and her unconventional lifestyle, precarious finances and surprising charity work continually attract the attention of local social workers. When her cynical supervisor at the welfare office (Liz Muckley) tells her to check up on Joyce, newly hired Emily Shaw (Cynthia Gibb) is quickly enchanted by the determined single mother's idealism and knack for survival.

Tom Arnold offers a credible, if ungaging, peformance as Jack, the ne'er-do-well husband who fathered Joyce's daughters then left to live with another woman across town. He returns periodically to give Joyce some moneyor wash his motorcycle, but flatly refuses to acknowledge his wife's abiding belief that he will someday come back home to stay.

Danielle Harris and Kimberly Dal Santo are appropriately appealing as Joyce's girls, and Sally Kirkland (Anna) lends her customary fire as Sandee, Joyce's supportive, colorful best friend.

The film makes the most of its sunny Midwestern setting and the soundtrack boasts six Presley tunes




