## Pursell complicates GOP race



Republicans in the Plymouth area were ready to support Spencer Abraham in his bid to unseat U.S. Sen. Donald Riegle, but that all changed when Riegle announced he wouldn't run and when hometown former U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell said he would run.

Plymouth and Canton republicans thought they would be supporting GOP state chairman Spencer Abraham in the 1994 race for U.S. Senate.

But that all changed on Tuesday

when Democratic U.S. Sen. Donald Riegle announced he wouldn't run for the seat he has held since 1981.

That announcement prompted a hometown Republican political prodigy, former U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, 60, to toss his hat in the ring for the senatorial seat that has eluded

Republicans for 12 years.

Pursell's announcement, on Wednesday, that he would explore running for the U.S. Senate and announcing his decision in November is expected to shake the party faithful in the Plymouth and Canton areas.

The announcement comes at a time when at least one Republican leader in Plymouth said, "There's this feeling out there that Abraham can't win because he has never held elected office."

He said the push is on to support Abraham, but with Pursell in the

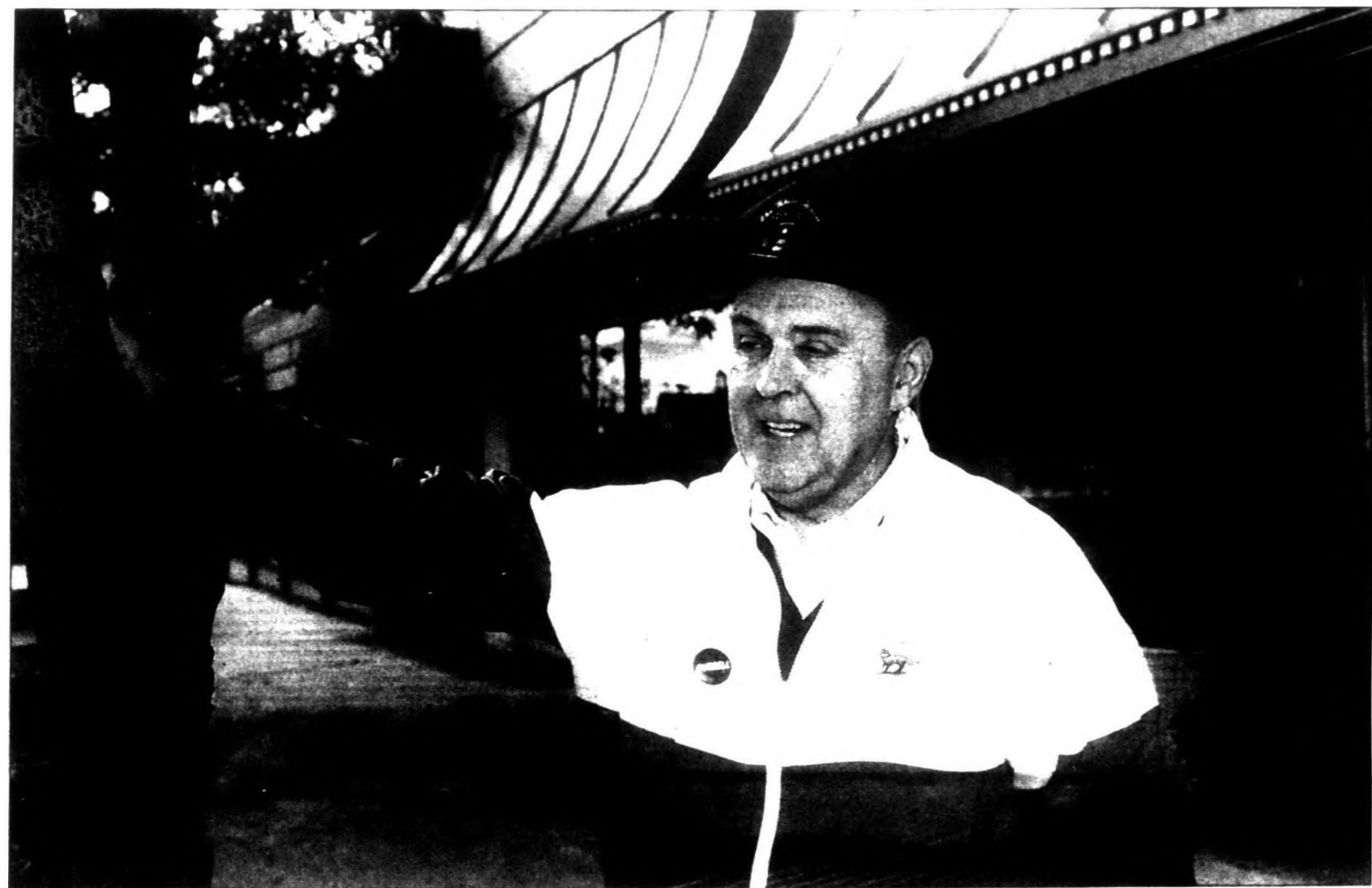
race, Plymouth and Canton Republicans will be reassessing whom they will support.

And there's a good reason. For local Republicans like Elaine Kattanner, Canton Township treasurer, Pursell "squared them out their teeth on politics."

"I remember working on his campaign from a storefront when he ran for county commissioner. I know a long way with Carl."

Ron Lowe, City of Plymouth at-

## School doors open to community groups

The Plymouth-Canton school district is now opening up its buildings and facilities after an

Following the failure of the millage in August, the school board in a cost-cutting move decided to close its doors after school hours to community groups. That despite pleas from the Plymouth Symphony, which faced the prospect of having to hold its concerts in venues outside the community.

A member of the Symphony Society recently pointed out to the board that its decision to allow the Plymouth Community Arts Council alone to use school facilities flew in the face of a U.S. Supreme Court ruling.

The board then devised a fee

schedule which for the first time requires a \$10 application fee and hour charges.

Facilities will be available seven a week. "We still look to use the buildings on Sundays as an energy conservation measure unless they're rented by an outside agency," said Superintendent John Hoben.

Fees will differ for non-profit and for-profit groups. Available for use will be cafeterias, kitchens, classrooms, music rooms, racquetball courts, locker rooms, swimming pools, outdoor facilities and the Salem Auditorium, pending the recall of the pink slipped auditorium manager. Rates will range from nothing for practice fields to \$75 per hour for use of swimming pools by for-profit groups.

For example, an 18-seat adult ballroom, 10% of which used Plymouth-Canton facilities, the decision came to light. Schoolcraft College made other arrangements, representing a loss to the district of \$2,000 in rentals.

Because it was in a time crunch, the symphony went ahead and secured concert facilities in Belleville and Navy for its 1993-94 season. Not only will the symphony's decision mean a revenue loss for the school district, it also may mean a loss for the symphony because of dropped attendance and lower ticket sales.

Symphony society president Linda Alvarado projects losses for the season at \$24,000, based on last year's experience when scheduling conflicts forced the symphony outside the

community.

The symphony spent \$5,800 in 1991-92 renting Salem, and \$3,000 last year, when several of its performances were outside Plymouth-Canton.

Ray Hoedel, associate superintendent for business, said guidelines are yet to be established for school-related activities after hours. He said the goal is for the community use of facilities to pay for itself.

Community education director Larry Masteller encouraged the board to act promptly. "We eliminated a program that was paying for itself," he said. "We need to get our feet out there and our brochures printed. We can't wait until the end of January to make decisions."

Some observers predict a verbal donnybrook at 7 p.m. today, when the city commission meets.

It's the first meeting since commissioner Bill McAninch took former Republican congressman Carl Pursell to task in a letter to the public for injecting partisan politics into the non-partisan commission election.

Commission watchers say chances are good that commissioners from either camp will jump into the fray tonight.

The show should begin just after the pledge of allegiance, scheduled for 7 p.m.

### Leaves in township

Plymouth Township residents should not rake leaves in the street or roadway, according to the township public services department.

Unlike in the city, leaves and compost in the township are not collected by a vacuum machine. In the township, leaves are collected through the

curbside compost collection program.

Leaves raked into the street clog sewers, causing flooding and other problems, township officials say.

Burning leaves is prohibited by township ordinance.

Township residents should place leaves and grass clippings in clear plastic bags, special paper composting bags or containers marked with a large "X" or "compost."

Brush should be tied in bundles with branches not more than 6 inches wide or 3 feet long. Compost must not exceed 65 pounds.

Compost should be placed at the curb on regular trash days by 7 a.m.

Compost collection in Plymouth Township runs through Dec. 3. After that, compost is collected with regular trash. Direct questions to the township DPW at 453-8131.







# Senate hopeful boasts long career in Plymouth

For those who watched Carl Pursell climb the political ladder to Capitol Hill, the heights he reached are no surprise.

From the time he was a youth, his educational, civic and business pursuits prepared him well for public office.

The retired congressman from Plymouth last week announced the formation of a committee to explore the possibility of running for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Democratic Sen. Don Riegle.

After hearing the news, former Gov. William Milliken said from his Traverse City office, "I have the highest regard for Carl Pursell. I think he served the Michigan Legislature with great distinction, and I think he did the same in Congress. He is a person of great quality. I respect him and the kind of record he wrote in the Legislature and in the Congress. He is my idea of a fine Republican and a fine public servant."

Pursell has long been active in recruiting young people into party politics. "At Republican conventions in a sea of young people, one bald head was usually evident. That was Carl's," said one observer.

### Early ability

Dating to the 1960s, Pursell showed the ability to build coalitions, solving problems by bringing together as many as involved parties as possible. He's credited with being among the first to attempt to clean up the Rouge River.

Robert DeMattia, a developer based in Plymouth Township, is a longtime friend of Pursell's who chaired the congressman's finance committee.

"Carl worked very diligently on fiscal constraints in the federal government, but because he was a member of the minority party he really could never get the clout needed to enact legislation he proposed," said DeMattia.

Whetting his appetite for politics early on was Pursell's father, an independent conservative who ran unsuccessfully for governor on the American Independent ticket in 1960.

Pursell was 14 when his father took him to Washington, D.C. Pursell has been a reader of the Congressional Record ever since.

As a teenager in the 1940s, he was attracted to the career of Plymouth's first congressman. When the Plymouth Historical Society came out looking for an heir of the latter position, it was Pursell they sought.

### Common sense

State Sen. Phil Abbott, 87, of Whitehall, a 38-year-old floor leader, was on the Republican caucus staff when Pursell was in the state Senate. "Carl makes up ground on a lot of other people just through hard work," said Arthurault. "There aren't many people in any line of work who put as much time and effort and dedication into their jobs. I think the reason he was elected as often as he was was people identified with him. They know they worked hard to get ahead, and they know Carl was working hard."

He has old-fashioned common sense, he added. "So he was casting votes on the issues that he knew was right. People respect that and appreciate that."

Born in Inland City and raised in Plymouth, Pursell graduated from Plymouth High School. At Eastern Michigan University, he majored in education and school administration, earning bachelor's and master's degrees. It was during his stay in Ypsilanti that Pursell organized a young Republican group in 1952.

Pursell served in the U.S. Army as an infantry officer from 1957-59 and was in the reserves through 1965. While in the service, Pursell pursued his interest in sports, coaching tennis and basketball.

In 1962, Pursell became active in George Romney's campaign for governor. Pursell became chairman of the Republican Party in Plymouth in 1964. He was named Outstanding Young Man of the Year by the Plymouth Jaycees.

### Early years

Pursell did his graduate work in political science at the University of Michigan.

As a youngster, Pursell learned the printing trade in his father's shop on Main Street. He later opened his own store, Western Office Supply, across the street from his dad's business.

In 1960, Pursell served as president of the Plymouth Chamber of Commerce.

Pursell spent two years, 1968-70, as a Wayne County commis-



sioner. From 1971-76 he was a member of the state Senate, serving on the on the appropriations committee. The Michigan press corps named Pursell outstanding first-term senator.

Pursell was elected to the 95th Congress in November 1976. He was re-elected to successive terms and served one year after resigning in 1981 for Plymouth Township.

While in Congress, Pursell credited himself with being one of only 10 representatives who lived in his district, maintaining close ties with constituents.

Patrick Anderson, chairman of the 23rd Congressional District Republican Committee, the state's largest, lamented the fact that the state, through redistricting, lost a congressman of his quality. He was well respected for his efforts to cut government spending. Carl is someone who is known to be an attractive candidate. However, we already have some very attractive candidates, like Speaker Anagnostis said Anderson.

torney and chairman of the 13th district Republican Party committee, summed up his feelings about Pursell and the dilemma faced by local Republicans.

"I've known Carl through the party and my family as a friend for years," Lowe said. "However, as district chairman I have to remain neutral during the primary."

But although Abraham has the blessings of top Republicans, Pursell is pushing forward. He is outfitting a camper with fax machines and other communication equipment for a swing through the state to assess his support.

Also, he's putting together a staff and a committee to raise money for a campaign that's expected to be one of the highest spending in recent years. There hasn't been a race for an open U.S. Senate seat since Riegle won in 1976.

Pursell was drawn into the race when Riegle stunned both Democrats and Republicans on Tuesday by announcing he wouldn't run.

Pursell retired from Congress in 1992 when redistricting pushed his old 2nd District west out of Wayne County, replacing it with the district represented by U.S. Rep. Bill Ford, D-Ypsilanti.

Since then, Pursell has been getting active in local politics, attending meetings and helping to run the campaign of Tom Prose, a candidate for Plymouth City Commission.

Pursell's return to the political scene surprised more than local Republicans. Even former Michi-

gan Gov. William G. Milliken, a fellow moderate Republican, was caught off guard by the Pursell move.

"I hadn't heard that Carl was giving some thought to it," Milliken said in a telephone interview from his Traverse City area home. "I respect him and the kind of record he wrote in the legislature and in Congress. He is

one of the top Republicans."

But despite the praise, Milliken didn't tip his hand on who he would be supporting in the race.

"And that's the challenge that's facing Pursell."

outh, said. "If you stop and look at the geographical area that Carl Pursell has represented over his years representing the people in government, he's covered a rather large and diverse geographical area on the Wayne County Commission, as state senator and congressman."

"He goes from Jackson all the way into Detroit and large portions of a number of counties,"

Vorva said. "His appeal across the state shows he's a proven performer as far as a vote getter."

Ron Lowe, City of Plymouth attorney and chairman of the 13th district Republican Party Committee, said "Carl can win a campaign. He can put money together."

Although Plymouth has been Pursell's power base, his influence extends into Canton.

Even a Democrat like Jim Kosove, former state representative from Canton and Plymouth, had good things to say.

"Carl would be a capable challenger. He has a solid record as a congressman and is able to reach both sides of the partisan aisle. But, I expect there to be numerous Democratic challengers."

# Romancing success

## Writing duo poised to hit big time with 1st effort

When authors Jan Greenberg and Karen A. Katz—who now make up the pseudonym "Jillian Karr"—decided in 1991 to collaborate on a romance novel, little did they know their eventual work, "Something Borrowed, Something Blue," would threaten to grab Big Time glitter.

"We just said it'd be fun to do a story about four women, a big, juicy book about different characters," Greenberg, 41, said about their collaboration.

Her writing partner, Katz, said, "We wanted to make a real good 'beach' book. The one they'd read on vacation."

But more than two years later their tale about four brides-to-be with violent passions and dangerous desires is on the runway for take off.

The currently available October issue of Cosmopolitan includes an excerpt that takes up more than 10 pages of the magazine.

A 357-page hardcover tome is being published by Doubleday and will be available in November.

"Something Borrowed, Something Blue" has been optioned to CBS TV for a made-for-TV movie. Chances are 50-50 for eventual broadcast.

"We'll just go back and forth to Hollywood when they do the TV

film," said Greenberg with a laugh. "We'll just sit in."

But first, the duo will work on promoting their new book, which will sell for about \$15. Planned is an Oct. 28 book signing at Book People at Orchard Mall in West Bloomfield. A May 1994 paperback printing from Bantam Fanfare also is scheduled.

A notion of what the story is all about is apparent on the cover itself. There's a wedding dress-clad bride pulling up the hem to slip on a garter. At her feet are flowers, a wedding band and a dagger.

"That's to let people know that the suspense and danger is in there," Greenberg said.

Katz, a graduate of Wayne State University, noted that the

novel was developed "totally out of the imagination" without basing characters (including manicurist Teri Mathews from Livonia) on real life experiences.

Other characters include fashion model "Eve Hamel," movie superstar "Ana Cates" and "Monique D'Arcy," editor of a floundering magazine. "Monique, she's our favorite character. She pulls it all together," Katz said.

Both women, who spent hours and hours teaming up at home computers or brainstorming ideas while "walking the dog," said the strength of the story itself is the reason for its pending success.

"We're both Virgo's, we're both perfectionists," Katz said. "And

we'd never let anything slide if we weren't happy with it."

According to Greenberg, who also writes solo under the "Jill Gregory" pseudonym, "We know in order to keep readers turning pages it has to be a good story." "Jillian Karr" actually is culled from three names: "Jill Gregory," Jan and Karen.

In their quest for perfection, they left no stone unturned, especially while doing research for the book.

For example, to know more about what would make actress "Ana Cates" tick, they traveled to Toronto. That's where Karen's brother John Tintori was editing the movie "Used People." "We spent three days soaking it all

in," Katz said.

Time also was spent learning more about yachts, to make one particular scene more believable.

"A lot of times you're writing and you can't go any further, because you need to check something out," Greenberg said, adding that having two people working together was beneficial in a way besides research.

Greenberg said she enjoys "bouncing ideas" off of her colleague. And vice versa.

"There's a lot of uncertainty when you're working alone," said Greenberg, a graduate of the University of Illinois at Champaign. "You just hope your talents and instincts are taking you in the right direction."

# Police pursue suspects in series of area holdups

Livonia hair salons and other area businesses staffed primarily by women have been the targets of a pair of armed robbers in recent weeks, police said.

Salons on Middlebelt were robbed Tuesday and Wednesday.

Police said Friday they are closing in on a suspect in those cases and also September robberies at a northeast Livonia record store

and similar businesses in Redford Township.

The suspect was identified in a photo lineup and has been named in an arrest warrant.

The holdups last week were the first involving an accomplice, police said.

"He seems to favor places where most of the employees are women, where he isn't likely to encounter resistance," said Livonia Police detective Sgt. Jesse

Bartlett.

Police said the gunman and his partner held up the BoRies salon, 19592 Middlebelt, Tuesday afternoon and struck a few blocks north Wednesday at Hair Etc., 20313 Middlebelt.

The gunman apparently acted alone in a Sept. 11 robbery at the Record Collector, 28143 Eight Mile.

An assistant manager at BoRies told police two unidentified

men came into the salon at 2:20 p.m.

The gunman walked past the front desk and announced the holdup while his accomplice stayed back, apparently acting as a lookout, witnesses said. The two ordered employees and customers to the back of the store and fled with \$224, witnesses said.

A customer who resisted was hit in the face with a gun butt but not seriously injured, police said.

The two walked into the Hair Etc. salon about 2 p.m. Wednesday.

The gunman inquired about a haircut and followed an employee to her work station before revealing a dark-colored handgun tucked into his waistband and announcing the holdup, witnesses said.

A total of \$165 was taken from employees in that robbery, according to police reports. The Sept. 11 robbery occurred

just before noon. The robber browsed in the store for a few moments and questioned an employee before showing the gun and announcing the holdup, police said.

The robber in all three incidents was described as white, in his early- or mid-30s, with a medium build, reddish blond hair and a mustache.

His partner was described as a heavy-set black man with a shaved head and mustache.

# Engler education reform plan to include job skills training

It will be just fine with western Wayne County folks if Gov. John Engler makes job skills training part of his education reform program Tuesday.

Engler last week praised bills by Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City, the Legislature's champion of employability training in high schools.

A source close to the Republican governor said Engler spent two hours discussing Keith's program. Engler will address a joint session of the Legislature at 2 p.m. Tuesday to reveal his plan for replacing the \$6 billion in revenue caused by repeal of local school property taxes.

House Democrats Monday surveyed 70 people attending a town hall meeting in Wayne Memorial High School set up by Keith.

They voted 66 to one in favor of the statement that "business should play a more active role in helping K-12, community colleges and higher education prepare students for the world of work."

They agreed 68 to one that "many entry level jobs will require that workers have a back-

ground in technical reading and writing, applied physics, statistics, probability and measurements — curriculum changes strongly advocated by Keith.

They agreed 56 to 12 that education should "change its focus from a theoretical, philosophical base to a more application, hands on based education."

Keith, as co-chair of the House Education Committee, has studied German technical high schools and brought in Dr. Willard Daggett, a voc ed guru, to speak in Michigan.

The audience was dominated by teachers, administrators, parents, students, Democrats and protectors of public education. There were only one taxpayers

group speaker and one identified Republican.

The 20 who spoke came from Wayne, Westland, Livonia, Garden City, Inkster, Lincoln Park, Plymouth and Novi.

Among other answers to Keith's survey:

Amending the constitution to "permit public tax dollars to be used for the support of private, nonpublic and home schools," the so-called voucher plan — 14 yes, 54 no.

Letting uncertified individuals teach in public schools — 11 yes, 56 no.

Lengthening Michigan's school year from 180 days to the 240 required in Japan, China and Germany — 44 yes, 24 no.

Requiring students to pass a state competency test to receive a high school diploma — 52 yes, 15 no.

Allowing the state rather than school districts to set salaries of school administrators and teachers — 23 yes, 45 no.

Expanding early childhood education for "at risk" pupils — 52 yes, 7 no.

Supporting schools of choice where the parent must transport the pupil to school — 32 yes, 35 no.

# New reps question veterans over hidden state spending

A band of freshman Republicans gave senior state representatives a bad time over hidden items in state spending.

Their targets: aid to the Pontiac Silverdome stadium, secret perks for the governor and Legislature, pay hikes and possible casino gambling.

For example, an \$800,000 subsidy for the Silverdome is lumped in a single line item with \$450,000 apiece in aid to horse race track cities such as Livonia, Northville and Hazel Park. Senior politicians did that to prevent Gov. John Engler from vetoing the Silverdome money.

Reps. Greg Kaza of Rochester Hills, Jerry Vorva of Plymouth and Deborah Whyman of Canton made protest statements in the permanent House Journal as lawmakers finished work on budget bills prior to the Oct. 1 start of a new fiscal year.

They were joined by Dan Gustafson of Haslett, Mike Goschka of Brant (who toppled former speaker Lewis Dodak in 1992), and others.

The Silverdome and track money, along with \$2.3 million to supervise Indian run casino gambling, were contained in the \$59 million Department of Agriculture budget bill, which the House barely approved, 58 to 40.

Voting yes were Republicans

Lyn Bankes of Redford, Barbara Dobb of Union Lake, and Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills, and Democrats Maxine Berman of Southfield, David Gubow of Huntington Woods and Richard Young of Dearborn Heights — all senior lawmakers.

Opposed freshmen Kaza, Vorva, Whyman and Penny Crissman of Rochester, joined by second term John Jamian of Bloomfield Township and senior member Shirley Johnson of Royal Oak.

Missing the vote were Democrats Justine Barns of Westland and William Keith of Garden City.

The battle got rougher as the House turned to the \$2 billion "general government" budget, covering the governor, Legislature, appellate courts, attorney general and several smaller departments.

"The House Fiscal Agency scandal underscores the need for more openness and good government in Lansing," said Kaza, a fiscal conservative and free market devotee.

Kaza was particularly unhappy about the oldtimers' tactics. In July he won 87 to 1 approval of an amendment to spell out the line items in Engler's staff budget and in legislative budgets.

Things fell apart in appropriations conference committees, however, where senators insisted on lump sum spending. Senators even objected to the House listing

its line items because public pressure would force them to do the same, Kaza said.

That bill "omitted important provisions for accountability and openness in legislative budgets," added Whyman, Vorva, Gustafson and others in a joint statement.

Other lawmakers complained that the bill contained a \$4 million increase for Detroit courts, \$2.3 million for southeastern Michigan auto emissions tests, \$4 million for Lottery advertising, \$1 million more for Civil Service and pay hikes for judges.

The executive office's \$4.3 million budget contains 85 jobs. The Legislature's \$84 million budget shows salaries for members and staff but not how many staff members are employed.

That bill squeaked through 59 to 38, with 56 needed for passage.

Voting no were Kaza, Vorva and Whyman, joined by Dobb, R'Union Lake.

Other area members voted yes except the absent Barns and Keith.

The bills also were passed by the Senate and sent to Engler for his signature. Many believe the governor may veto the combined Silverdome and racetrack line item.

## Studios develop a niche

■ Most have had humble beginnings — in basements or garages. Local recording studios have become an important part of the metro area music scene, offering bands a place to record their music.

years ago.

Armed with a simple mixing board and a 16-track recording machine, Feeny started The Tempermill recording studio.

"My mother baked cookies and at the time we did a lot of punk, guitar groups," Feeny said with a smile. "Any kind of problem which could have happened, happened. The furnace would be too loud and when we recorded vocals, I turned off the blower."

The earliest visitors to the Tempermill included Hippodrome and the Orange Roughies — both of which have helped Feeny develop the company into a 80-hour-a-week business. After three years, Feeny's parents weren't too pleased with his venture under their roof, so he decided to make a professional effort and relocated to his present location in Ferndale.

"This used to be an old chiropractor office building," Feeny said, "and what I thought would be a weekend and a case of beer turned into a six-month project."

Now more than three years later, six months of hard labor has transformed a 3,200-square-foot building into a mammoth recording studio complete with massive mixing and recording equipment and Nintendo video games. With such groups as The Final Cut, The Charm Farm, Goober & The Peas, Elvis Hitler and Majesty Crush using his facility, the studio has made quite a name.

The Tempermill is one of hundreds of independent recording studios in the metro Detroit area. Some are simple with just enough equipment to record while others are elaborate and possess unique charm. The studios play host to local and na-

tional performers who create their art regardless of style.

Typically larger studios are inconspicuous, due to the enormous equipment value, hidden behind blackened windows or a simple doorway with an address number hanging over it.

Each studio provides something different which adds to its charm whether it's roomy recording rooms or pool tables. Each contains the essentials: microphones, sound boards which capture each sound and tunes it, mixing boards which take sound and combine it with others and track machines which record the sound onto individual cassette tracks.

## STREET BEATS

The latest staple of modern recording studios are computers which assist in running sound and mixing boards as well as capture, dub, create and overlay sounds many times in chorus.

Like many other performers and producers, Kevin Saunderson, president and founder of KMS Records and recording studio in Detroit, has his Macintosh Apple-compatible computer to assist him in recording and creating his techno-dance music.

"I think it's very important for the sound, not for the technology, but to see what you're doing," said Saunderson, a Southfield resident.

With the help of his Macintosh computer and program, Saunderson can run tracks and create sound all from one spot.

"I don't have to get up from my chair to record or play," he said. "It's quite important for what technology is worth for the future."

Feeny also sees the future of recording spearheaded by microchips. The Tempermill has a combination of vintage recording equipment and modern technology, such as a Macintosh II SE and IBM compatible computer to further sound quality.

"There are stuff on computers that you can't do on tape," Feeny said. "It gives you flexibility. . . . You get hundreds of extra fingers. . . . The recording process varies from performer to performer depending on the musical style, medium, production and money allotted to the production. Nevertheless, studios are typically open 24-hours, seven days a week to accommodate recording demands. Some studios have a month-long waiting list even for the midnight slots."

The White Room Studios in Detroit is renowned for its vintage equipment having housed bands like 700 Miles, Walk on Water, Every Mother's Nightmare, The Exceptions, Junk Monkeys, Spanking Bozoz and Forehead Stew. The studio occupies 10,000 square feet of the third floor of an office building. Co-owner Michael Nehra feels the classic API sound equipment is the draw of the studio.

"The studio has been revolving around vintage recording equipment, but now it's a good variety of old and new," said Nehra, one of the three owners. "I think we get a fatter sound, granted, it helps when you

have a good engineer.

"We try to leave some rough edges in the music because that's our sound."

Historically, studios start off small, but once incubated, they can develop into a multi-million dollar investment. Saunderson knows that pathway too well.

As a Eastern Michigan University student Saunderson started recording his own dance music on an eight-track recorder, drum machines and keyboards in his Ypsilanti apartment.

"I got kicked out of several places because of my music," he said.

"Back then I didn't know what the hell I was doing. Now my sound sounds a lot cleaner."

To many, Saunderson is better known for his success in the European house band Inner City, which won several gold and silver records in the United Kingdom with hits like "Big Fun" and "Good Life," but is primarily only heard in dance clubs stateside.

Today, Saunderson rents out his facility for up to \$60 an hour which includes an engineer, a far cry from his early days. Now his facility is used for recording for Mike Banks, Jennifer Williams and Kaos to remixing for New Order and the Pet Shop Boys.

National acts have found inspiration and technological assistance in the metro area studios, but local acts are more inspirational, according to Feeny. The most memorable was when alternative dance band The Charm Farm used the studio to remix songs.

# Toddler's effort to dress self is normal behavior

**Voice mail message:**  
Barbara,  
My toddler is two years old. I believe he should be beginning to dress himself and to care for himself. He is, but the process is going very unevenly.

Sometimes he is eager to help; sometimes he wants to do it entirely himself; sometimes he insists that I do it, and sometimes he won't let either one of us do it. If he does it, he insists that I watch. I don't know what to expect.

This is my first child, so I admit I am somewhat insecure about how I handle things. Should I insist that he do it himself or is his refusal appropriate, and should I go along with it? I sometimes get tired of sitting and watching him when he is so obviously capable of putting on his own shirt. Is he manipulating me?

Dear Caller,

Your son's erratic behavior is normal and appropriate. He is manipulating you, but that, too, is normal and appropriate at his stage of development.

During the toddler stage, the child learns to own his body and to care for it; physical self-care is the toddler's life responsibility. As he learns to wash, go to the bathroom, feed, and dress himself, mother learns graciously to relinquish control to him, and thus to encourage his independence. It is during this time that the child becomes autonomously by mastering bodily care and control.

The progression is: (1) mother does for child; (2)

mother and child do it together; (3) mother watches and admires as child does it by himself; and (4) child does it alone, without mother's admiration.

Usually, as you describe in your call, this is not a smooth process, but a jerky ride, starting, stopping, moving forward and moving backward. Often, it is a complicated power struggle between mother and child, not simply a physical changing of the guard. Your son may no longer need your physical help, but he does need your emotional support. Your gift to him of power and authority over himself must be continually reinforced by your appreciation of his ability to do the things you used to do for him.

In this relationship, as in any relationship, compromises must be made. What is best for one person is often not best for the other. That is true of your relationship with your toddler.

Sometimes you will be able to go along with your toddler's needs, then you will both feel great. At other times that won't be possible and often you will both feel frustrated. Handling the frustrating times without blame, guilt or anger will enable you to gain confidence in your mothering abilities. The goal is to respect his needs while understanding they cannot always be satisfied.

Practically, educating yourself by attending lectures, reading books, and learning from other mothers, are possible ways of overcoming insecurity.

# Shorts festival showcases originality

At their best, short films are satisfying worlds unto themselves. Short and to the point, they provide us with intimate character sketches in a startling economy of vision.

At their worst, they're 10 minutes of fancy camera tricks intended to open doors in Hollywood. Often accomplished technically, they project the sincerity and slickness of a Nike commercial.

"The First International Festival of Short Films," screening this weekend at the Magic Bag Theatre in Ferndale, offers a little bit of both. Consistently entertaining but not overly experimental, the package of 10 films from five countries tries hard to offer something for everyone.

The opening entry, New Zealand's "Lounge Bar," finds a man walking into a bar circa 1975 wearing a clumsy head brace. The bartender and a female customer

think they've seen him somewhere before, but, as the bell-topped lounge singer notes, "he could be almost anyone."

While we probably don't need yet another "Twilight Zone" take-off, the color short is cleverly edited and does set the mood for the eclectic mix that follows.

Next comes an intriguing American-made documentary in black-and-white called "Stealing Altitude," about a daredevil parachutist who leaps from the tops of tall buildings. The diver calls it "Base Jumping" and supposedly it occurs almost daily in downtown Los Angeles.

The hyperactive "Urban Tragedy" forces laughs as a henpecked man and his "motorcycle mama" wife battle cockroaches in their seedy apartment. In Great Britain's "The Childeater," gorgeous pastoral scenery serves as backdrop for a dull story of a little girl

forced to stay with her mysterious uncle.

Black-and-white cinematography by Yuri Neyman ("Liquid Sky," "D.O.A.") highlights "Tom Goes to the Bar," a surreal monologue about life from the perspective of the title character, who hangs upside down at the local saloon. It's a bizarre idea well-executed.

For me, the cleverest offering was "Safari Holiday" from the U.S., about a nerdy teenage boy and the sexy college girl he picks up while on vacation with his parents. You can almost see the hormones raging as he tries to make small talk with her at the pool, then coaxes her back to his hotel room.

His parents and kid sister are supposed to be en route to Sea World, but they've forgotten the camera. What follows could only happen in the confines of a short film. It's an engaging and hilarious little piece of fluff, all the more rare for its low budget.

The two-hour program, which played across the country earlier this year, recently added "Omnibus," the 1993 Oscar winner from France. Here a man's love affair with the railcar that brings him back and forth to work ends when the timetable changes and he can't get off at his usual stop.

"Omnibus" not only marks the end of the show but also the end of a long-standing tradition, since the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences has recently decided to drop the short subjects category from next year's Oscar ceremony.

For now, anyway, it's a pleasure to see short films given their due on the big screen.

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDINANCE NO. C-93-05

NOXIOUS WEEDS

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 32.040, OF CHAPTER 32 OF THE CODE OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH; TO AMEND THE CHIEF BUILDING OFFICIALS DUTY; PROVIDING FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL OTHER INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE SAVINGS CLAUSE OF THIS ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS: Section 1. Amendment to Chapter 32. That Section 32.040, are hereby amended to read as follows:

32.040 Chief Building Official's Duty The Chief Building Official shall diligently inquire concerning the growth and existence of weeds in urbanized areas of the Township. For the purposes of this Chapter, the term "urbanized area" shall include all areas in the Township east of Napier Road other than areas in, along or adjacent to roads which fall under the responsibility of the Wayne County Road Commission or the State Department of Transportation. (Ord. 81, Sec. 6, 10-22-85)

Section 2. Severability. If any clause, section, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person, firm, corporation, legal entity or circumstances, shall be for any reason adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, said judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons, firms, corporations, legal entities or circumstances by said judgment shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, section, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance thereof directly involved in the case or controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered and to the person, firm, corporation, legal entity or circumstance then and there involved. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the body that the Ordinance would have been adopted and such invalid or unconstitutional provision not been included in this Ordinance.

Section 3. Repeals. All other Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistencies, hereby repealed.

Section 4. Savings Clause. The balance of Chapter 73, except as herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect. The repeal provided herein shall not abrogate or affect any offense or act committed or done, or any penalty or forfeiture incurred, or any pending fees, assessments, litigation or prosecution of any right established, occurring prior to the effective date hereof.

Section 5. Publication. The Township Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its publication.

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH Summary of Ordinance No. C-93-06

COST REIMBURSEMENT FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH BY THE ADDITION OF CHAPTER 9 TO PART I ADMINISTRATION WHICH CHAPTER SHALL BE ENTITLED COST REIMBURSEMENT FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR THE RECOVERY OF COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH EMERGENCY INCIDENTS INVOLVING HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AND HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS AND FOR THE POLICING AND HANDLING OF ACCIDENT SCENES INVOLVING HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AND HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATIONS THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY OF INVALID SECTIONS; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND THE EFFECTIVE DATE.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: ADDITION TO THE CODE

This Section adds Chapter 9, to Part I, Administration of the Code of Ordinances of the Charter Township of Plymouth to provide for recovery of costs associated with emergency services, and policing and handling of accident scenes including hazardous materials and hazardous conditions.

SECTION 9.010: DEFINITIONS This Section defines dangerous or hazardous substances or materials, emergency response, and expense of emergency response.

SECTION 9.020: DUTY TO REMOVE AND CLEAN UP This Section imposes a duty upon any person or entity causing leakage, spillage or dissemination of hazardous substances or materials to immediately remove the substance or material and to clean the area.

SECTION 9.030: FAILURE TO REMOVE AND CLEAN UP This Section provides for the imposition of costs and expenses upon a person or entity which fails to comply with the duty to remove a hazardous substance or material and to clean up the area.

SECTION 9.040: ENFORCEMENT This Section provides for enforcement of the provisions of Chapter 9 and provides that the Charter Township of Plymouth shall have the right to bring an action in the appropriate court to collect costs associated with emergency services.

SECTION 2: VIOLATION AND PENALTY

This Section provides for penalties for violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: SAVINGS CLAUSE

This Section provides that adoption of this Ordinance does not affect proceedings, prosecutions for violation of law, penalties and matured rights and duties in effect before the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY

This Section provides that any unenforceable section can be severed from the rest of the Ordinance.

SECTION 5: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES

This Section provides that all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 6: PUBLICATION

This Section provides that the Clerk for the Charter Township of Plymouth shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner repealed by law.

SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Section provides that this Ordinance shall become effective upon publication.

# 'Wall' between Detroit, suburbs must come down

**B**y chance I was in Berlin in the summer of 1961 — the week before the wall went up. By chance I was in Israel last month — the week before the wall between the Palestine Liberation Organization and the Israelis came down by the signing of the mutual recognition agreement. But it wasn't at all by chance that I was in Southfield last week when both candidates who would be Detroit's next mayor virtually declared that the wall between Detroit and its suburbs would come tumbling down. "We must improve race relations in our cities and it's absolutely imperative that Detroit and suburban communities have mutual respect," Dennis Archer said. "Detroit is the front porch for the rest of Michigan," said Sharon McPhail. "The big problem is self-centeredness and individualism. We have to get on the front porch together."

I needed to hear that. So, apparently, did a lot of other people, since the forum drew the largest crowd in the several year history of the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit's Economic Forum.

The very fact that the two began their campaign for the general election by accepting the invitation to speak before a largely suburban audience at the Radisson Plaza in Southfield lent credibility to their words. And David Page, president of the Jewish Federation, wasted no time in stating the interest and concern of suburban residents, like himself, who grew up in Detroit. "We are indeed all Detroiters, regardless of whether we live or vote there," Page said. But make no mistake, Coleman Young is not the only person in Detroit who thumbs his nose at that kind of sentiment. "There are Detroiters who believe Detroit should be a city run by and for only those who live there — 76 percent of whom are black. So it is significant that Archer and McPhail — with their outspoken, anti-isolationist views — emerged victorious in the primary. But it will take more than words. Actions to make Detroit safe for its residents and its guests are absolutely key to making Detroit economically viable."

Both candidates stressed getting more police on the streets, dealing with the drug problem (90 percent of felonies drug-related, according to McPhail who's on leave as a division chief in the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office) and making schools safe and more effective by getting parents involved. "When we resolve our crime issue, that improves the likelihood of people coming to the city," Archer, the former Michigan Supreme Court justice, said. Although their overall goals were similar, some differences emerged, some overt, some more subtle. I would say Sharon McPhail has a more grass-roots approach — creating

12 neighborhood community councils to empower the people, encouraging Detroiters to spend their money in Detroit and designating that added police officers be put in neighborhoods, not places like Greektown which she says is already safe. Archer seems more systems-oriented. He wants to create a master plan for Detroit, with opportunities for community involvement in forming its parts. He is pushing for a merger between the Detroit and suburban bus lines. And he wants to market one of Detroit's biggest assets — the Detroit Medical Center. Their most open disagreement is on taxes. McPhail wants to coax more businesses to the city by cutting the corporate income tax. Archer says Detroit can't afford to give up that money until it has a balanced budget. There is no short cut to getting Detroit back on its feet. But there are already some pillars to stand on — pillars that have stood even as Detroit has struggled. They are as large as a Wayne State University and as small as a Joe Muer. (I know, I know he's opening a Southfield eatery as well, but lines still form to get in).

No small pillar has been dug by suburbanite Mike Ilitch — rejuvenating the theater district and pulling his own corporation out of the suburbs and into Detroit. Most of us suburbanites don't have the money and power of an Ilitch. But we have what we have. As we watch the outcome of the mayoral race and see what steps are taken to bring Detroit back, we should be prepared to lend a hand. We can express our hope for the city when we travel or meet people from other places; we can include the Fox or Second City or the Gem as part of our entertainment landscape; and we can encourage with all our might a state-wide educational plan that will give Detroit schools the resources to do their job. We in the suburbs have been on our isolated backyard patios too long. Just read the home and hearth magazines. Front porches are back in style. I didn't know any reporters before I got into this line of work. So I can understand people's suspicion when I call and say, "Hi, I'm a reporter and I want to talk to you." If you watch the TV news, you tend to see reporters as an unsmiling, cynical lot — always ready to find fault with somebody and share these faults with others. So I could understand the dissatisfaction of some educators in recent weeks, when we didn't support a millage that failed. But I think they over-rate our role in the millage being defeated by voters. Because at most papers I've worked for, candidates and issues we supported on the editorial pages often got whipped.

When I was a reporter at the daily Marquette Mining Journal, we used to joke about how our endorsements were the sure kiss of death to any aspiring political candidate. Still, the overall theme of some calling to lambaste us at the Observer over the millage failure was to accuse us of having a thing against the schools, against teachers and, in general, against all that is good in the world. If I were to tell them that, hey, I'm just a regular guy like you, our audience is all taxpayers, and our decision was made with no malicious intent, they in their anger probably wouldn't believe me. So I'll say, yeah, what the heck, you're right. We just took that stand to be evil. You see, when you make it known in

college that you're serious about being a reporter, it's not long before someone from "The Media" contacts you. First, they check to see if you — like them — were born evil. When you tell them that, yes, I was born to be nasty, they schedule a secret ceremony. There — at a location I dare not disclose — you take a solemn oath, pledging to harass others at any opportunity. You pledge never to smile, unless you've made up another lie that hurts someone. You pledge to twist the facts to suit your evil purpose, because "they told you" to do it. But if someone should ask how you approach your job, then it's a different story. Tell them you got into this for the

same reason most others in the profession did. You say pleasure comes from showing all sides of an issue. You try to get to the heart of the matter, and present it in a way most will understand. You say there's a certain joy in giving all sides their say and presenting those views fairly, even if you personally might favor one side over the other. Then explain it's just like when they do their job — they try to do a good job in their field, and we do the same in ours. Of course, those down on the press don't believe that one. # Enrollment rises by 482 at WC3

Wayne County Community College reports an enrollment of 10,059 students for the current fall semester.

This is an increase of 482 over the previous year's enrollment of 9,577.

WC3 students who take classes in the summer 1994 semester will be able to use a mail-in registration program. By fall semester next year, the college hopes to have telephone registration available.

Residents of Wayne-Westland, Redford Union and South Redford school districts are in WC3's coverage area and eligible to take classes at the lowest cost offered.

The most popular study programs at WC3 are general arts, nursing and general science, which accounted for two-thirds of the college's 8,360 graduates since 1980, according to a college publication called "Research Notes."

Other interesting demographic

items include:

■ Since 1980 62.7 percent of WC3 graduates (5,485) have been black, and 25.1 percent of graduates (2,305) have been white.

■ Females account for 71.3 percent of WC3 graduates, and males are 23.7 percent.

Continuing to expand its offerings under President Rafael Cortada, WC3 plans to add several new courses next year.

The Electronics/Manufactur-

ing Department will offer three new industrial electronics courses beginning next spring: Programmable Logic Controller, Microcontrollers and Interfacing, and Fiber Optics Communication.

The Political Science Department plans to offer three new courses beginning in the spring 1994 semester, too: The Middle East From 1800 To The Present, The World of Modern Moslem Islam, and Men and Masculinity.

Readers hooked on simple fish recipes

The phone has been ringing off the hook, and if your recent comments about my fishing column are any indication, there are a lot of readers out there who have a love-hate relationship with fish.

Many callers said they would rather eat fish in a restaurant. When they do cook fish at home, callers said they look for recipes that are simple and easy, that can be made with minimal fuss.

Your calls also indicated that there are quite a few of you who enjoy fishing not just as a sport, but also to put food on the table.

Rosemarie Otterman of Troy and Shirley McCullum of Livonia requested more recipes for fish butters to cook fish in, and to serve on the fish.

Here are some reader requested recipes.

BASIL BUTTER

2 teaspoons lemon juice  
2 tablespoons fresh chopped basil (or 1 teaspoon dried)  
1 stick butter or margarine (1/4 cup)  
Combine ingredients, and mix well. Makes 3/4 cup.

MUSTARD BUTTER

6 tablespoons butter or margarine  
2 tablespoons good prepared mustard (Dijon or stone ground)  
Combine ingredients, and mix well.  
You can melt both of these butters in a skillet and pan fry the fish. Another option is to mix the butter, chill, and dot slices of the butter over grilled or baked fish fillets.

Jane Rutter of Farmington called to say she goes wild over the spinach/artichoke dip served as an appetizer at Cooker Bar & Grille. My sources followed up with a recipe that they say is as close to Cooker's as you can get.

SPINACH ARTICHOKE DIP

1 (15 oz.) can artichoke hearts, drained and rinsed, finely chopped  
1 (10 oz.) package frozen chopped spinach, defrosted  
1/2 cup fresh grated Parmesan cheese  
1/2 cup mayonnaise  
1 small onion, grated or finely chopped  
In a large bowl, chop artichoke hearts. Squeeze as much of the water out of the defrosted spinach as possible and mix with artichoke hearts.

Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Spoon into individual or small oven-proof crocks and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes, or place under a broiler and broil for 5 minutes until golden brown and heated throughout.

Serve immediately with crackers, toasted pita bread or vegetables.

Sandy Russell of Livonia called to tell me that a few weeks back I mentioned something about a zucchini-carrot bread and failed to give the recipe in one of my columns.

Sorry about the omission, Sandy, and I'm pleased to pass along my recipe for this quick bread that even the kids enjoy in their lunch boxes!

CARROT-ZUCCHINI BREAD

1 1/2 cups sifted flour  
1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon  
3/4 cup sugar  
2 beaten eggs  
1/2 cup vegetable oil  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 1/2 cups grated carrots  
1 cup grated zucchini  
3/4 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

In a large bowl, sift together the flour, soda and cinnamon. Add sugar, eggs, oil, vanilla and salt. Mix to moisten.

Stir in carrots, zucchini and nuts and mix to blend. Pour this into a greased loaf pan or into individual paper lined cupcake pans.

For bread, bake for 1 hour, then cool in pan for 10 minutes, remove and continue to cool on a rack.

For muffins, fill 3/4 full and bake for 40-50 minutes. Makes one 5 by 9-inch loaf or 12 large muffins.

CHINA EXPRESS

Cook Chinese even if you've little time to shop, chop



Cookbook author Nina Simonds takes the mystery out of Chinese cooking by showing cooks how to stock their pantry with easily purchased staples, and create delicious, authentic dishes quickly with minimal fuss.

Five years ago, before her son was born, Nina Simonds, author of the newly published "China Express," said she cooked Chinese food for dinner almost every night.

Having a baby was only part of what inspired her to write "China Express," (William Morrow & Company, 1993, \$25) explained Simonds during a cooking demonstration on Sept. 26 at Kitchen Glamor's West Bloomfield store. The other part was having a friend who called and asked how to cook chicken Chinese style in only 30 minutes.

Simonds is certainly no newcomer to Chinese cooking as she has been teaching for the past 20 years. She became immersed in the subject when she moved to Taiwan at age of 19.

"I was very lucky to have studied with a woman who was a master chef and taught regional Chinese cooking," said Simonds. For 3 1/2 years Simonds studied with master chefs from all over China

and translated three Chinese cookbooks into English. She later moved to Paris and worked at La Varenne cooking school before returning to the United States.

When the assignment to interview Simonds arrived I was very excited to meet a writer whose work I had read and admired in "Gourmet," "Harper's Bazaar," and "The New York Times." I also eagerly anticipated getting some dearly needed inspiration for getting out of the rut of cooking the same things for dinner.

I wasn't alone. Sonia Faigenbaum of Farmington who attended the demonstration at Kitchen Glamor on Sunday shared my feelings.

"I looked forward to coming to this class to get some new ideas for sauces and seasoning Chinese food. We all get in a rut cooking everyday," she said.

When the demonstration began, Simonds asked "how many people in the audience have studied Chinese cooking?" Few re-

CHEF'S SECRETS

Pastry chef enjoys challenge of teaching

Practice makes perfect are words that pastry chef Kristin Jablonski of Redford lives by and passes along as advice to his students at the William D. Ford Vocational Technical Center in Westland.

"People say I'm driven. I'm consumed by my career. If you enjoy what you do, you won't struggle," said Jablonski. "I'm always trying to create new things. Dessert is like the chef's final signature on a meal. It's what helps make meals memorable."

Jablonski earned a spot on the team to represent the Central Region of the United States, which includes the Midwest, at the 1996 "Culinary Olympics" in Frankfurt, Germany. He tried out in 1989 for the contest held every four years, but didn't make the cut.

"In the preliminary competition the judges taste with their eyes, they know exactly how it should look without tasting it. In the final competition, they judge with their eyes, and by tasting the final product," said Jablonski who won the spot after several rounds of tough competition in Orlando, Fla. He was one of 35 chefs from all over the nation competing.

Also chosen from Michigan were Kenneth Goodwin of the Fairlane Club, Dearborn; Derin Moore of Pike Street, Pontiac; and Matthew Bronski of Loon River Cafe, Sterling Heights.

For the past three years he's been the pastry chef, and a teaching assistant at the William D. Ford Vocational Technical Center in Westland. He's also taught at Washtenaw Community College and Schoolcraft Community College.

"I give them the basics," he said. "I like working with high school students because they're eager to learn, and willing to accept what they see you do, I like to see them start picking up what I've taught them. They're the next generation of chefs."

Jablonski has won numerous awards for his work. He's won two gold medals for his gingerbread houses at the "Festival of Trees" held every November at Cobo Hall in Detroit, silver and bronze medals at competitions sponsored by the American Culinary Federation, and a special judges award at the Epicurium Eiffel Competition in France.

How did you get interested in cooking?

"I took a home economics class at St. Agatha High School in Redford in the 10th grade and enjoyed it. I had entered the kitchen once in a while at home before that. A teacher recommended I apply for the culinary program at Schoolcraft College. There was a 2 1/2 year waiting list. I got on the list.

"At Schoolcraft the pastry chef, Leonard Stec, took me under his wing, and I seemed to fit into that area."

After graduating from Schoolcraft College in 1987, Jablonski continued his education by studying in France and Switzerland, and by taking classes in chocolate and pulled sugar from master pastry chefs.

What do you like about being a pastry chef?

"I like the challenge of being able to create something no one has seen before. It's fun to take a concept like a centerpiece and give it an Art Deco theme. A lot of times chefs look at other fields like architecture for ideas. We use some of the same tools like palette knives for spatulas.

Who does the cooking at your house?

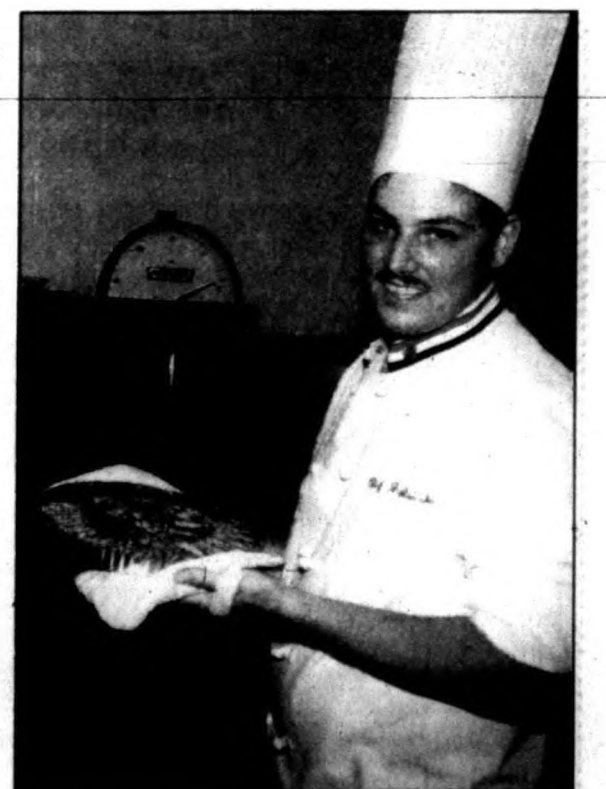
I live at home with my parents (Dolores and Walter Jablonski). When I get home, mom's got dinner on the table. At first I learned from her, now she's learning a few things from me. She lets me into the kitchen sometimes, and gives me time to create things on my own.

What are some baking tips you can share with our readers?

"Instead of flouring and greasing a cake pan, line the bottom of the pan with parchment paper and grease the sides. Your cake won't stick to the bottom of the pan.

"When you're making a cake don't over mix the batter, and don't pull it out of the oven too soon. If you press your finger on the cake and it springs back, it's done. After about five minutes, turn the cake upside down on a cooling rack, otherwise it will continue to cook."

plied, but Simonds got their attention when she said — "I like to look at my audience even if they've had some Chinese cooking classes as if they're all virgins because all teachers have different methods of cooking."

"China Express" is as my publisher likes to describe it, a faster, fresher, lighter and easier way to Chinese cooking."

In order to do that Simonds reduced the amount of ingredients used in a recipe, and incorporated condiments which are available in your local supermarket. She reduced the time it takes to cook a recipe by reducing the amount of techniques without losing the essence of classic Chinese style.

### Basic ingredients

Before any of the slicing and chopping started, Simonds introduced the class to some basic Chinese condiments — soy sauce, rice wine, rice vinegar, sesame oil and hoisin sauce.

"With the arrival of my newborn, I didn't have the time to travel to China Town to buy ingredients. Yet, I longed for the vibrant flavorings as well as a healthy approach to eating," she said.

First on her list was soy sauce. Depending upon the manufacturer soy sauce changes in flavor from brand to brand. To prove her point, Simonds passed around samples of a variety of brands for the class to sample. She recommends using a medium grade soy sauce for everything. Heavy soy sauce she explained has molasses in it, which gives it more viscosity.

Simonds said she tested the recipes in her book with the Kikoman brand. She recommends low-sodium soy sauce for those who must restrict their intake of salt. Increasing the amount of seasonings such as minced garlic, fresh grated ginger and finely chopped scallions used will increase flavor and compensate for the lack of salt.

When a recipe calls for rice wine, Simonds said she prefers to use sake because it doesn't have added salt. Toasted sesame oil also found in the grocery store is used as a flavor enhancer and not for stir-frying.

The first dish which Simonds demonstrated was quite simple, Barbecued Chicken Wings. The sauce is easy to make and versatile enough to be used with pork,

chicken or turkey. While the chicken wings were baking she went on to make a stir-fried dish — Spicy Turkey with Peppers and Snow Peas.

### Successful stir-frying

"The key to successful stir-frying is organization," she said. "Get everything done a head of time. I use a tray to organize my ingredients."

As she cooked, Simonds explained everything step-by-step. As most Chinese chefs do, Simonds did the slicing and chopping by hand with a Chinese cleaver, and explained that it's fine to use a mini-food processor for fine mincing ingredients such as garlic and ginger when you're pressed for time.

Ronald Michalak of Bloomfield Township who loves to cook but only does a little Chinese cooking at home said he thought Simonds was a good teacher.

"Not only did she explain every step and the significance of every step but, but she was able to teach how to balance flavors for a good end result," he said.

To prepare the stir-fry turkey dish, Simonds used a rolled steel, flat-bottom wok. She suggests

that if one is not available a cast-iron deep sided skillet is a good substitute. No matter which pan you use, the first step should be to heat the wok or skillet then add some oil such as corn or canola and add the first ingredient in the recipe to be stir-fried when the wok is hot.

Then, continue stirring constantly over high heat. Throughout the cooking process, Simonds explained that the vegetables in the recipe should be cooked until crisp.

When you're through cooking, Simonds recommends washing the wok with soap and water. After rinsing, set it on a low burner for a few seconds to dry.

In the opening chapters of "China Express" you'll find an explanation of basic Chinese ingredients and substitutions for when they're not available. There are also detailed descriptions for steamlining classic techniques. The book certainly does meet the needs of folks on the go who enjoy cooking Chinese meals from scratch, with little time to shop and chop.

# Apple tart autumn treat

### APPLE FRANCHIPAN TART

- Sour Dough Tart Shells— 1 1/4 cup butter
  - 1/2 cup granulated sugar
  - 1 egg
  - 3 cups cake flour
  - zest of 1 lemon
  - 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
  - pinch salt
  - Franchipan Filling for Tarts
  - 2 cups almond paste (marzipan, found in baking aisle at grocery store)
  - 1/4 cup granulated sugar
  - 1 cup butter
  - 4 eggs
  - 1/2 cup cake flour
  - 2 or 3 Granny Smith apples, peeled and sliced
  - Cinnamon, granulated sugar to sprinkle on top of fruit
  - Apple or apricot jelly for glaze
- Recipe makes two 10-inch tart

shells. To make tart shells — cream together butter and sugar until light and fluffy.

Add egg, cake flour, lemon zest, vanilla extract and salt. Beat together, refrigerate until chilled. Divide dough into two. Roll out each 1/4-inch thick. Line two 10-inch tart shells and set aside.

To make Franchipan Filling for tarts — cream together almond paste and sugar until well blended, then add butter and mix until smooth. Add eggs to mixture, mix until blended.

Add cake flour to mixture, mix until blended. Divide batter between two tart shells and spread smooth.

Place sliced apples on top and sprinkle lightly with cinnamon and granulated sugar over top of fruit.

Bake in a 350 degree oven for 35-40 minutes or until fruit is soft. Cool and glaze with apricot or apple jelly. Serve with caramel sauce or ice cream.

### BARBECUED CHICKEN WINGS

- Barbecue sauce
- 1/2 cup hoisin sauce
- 3 tablespoons soy sauce
- 3 tablespoons rice wine or sake
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 2 tablespoons minced garlic
- 3 pounds chicken wings, about 16

Combine the ingredients of the barbecue sauce and place in a bowl. Add the chicken wings and toss lightly to coat. Cover with plastic wrap and let marinate at room temperature for 1 hour, or refrigerate for several hours or overnight, turning occasionally.

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Line a rimmed cookie sheet or a baking pan with aluminum foil. Arrange the chicken wings skin-side down on the cookie sheet.

Bake for 25 minutes, turn over, and bake for 20 minutes longer, or until a deep golden brown. Transfer to a serving platter, and serve hot,

at room temperature or cold. Serves 6.

### SPICY TURKEY WITH PEPPERS AND SNOW PEAS

- 1 1/2 pounds boneless turkey breast or turkey cutlets
- Marinade: 2 tablespoons soy sauce 2 tablespoons rice wine or sake 1 1/2 teaspoons toasted sesame oil 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- Sauce: 1/2 cup hoisin sauce 2 1/2 tablespoons soy sauce 2 teaspoons sugar 6 tablespoons water 1 1/2 tablespoons rice wine or sake 3/4 pound snow peas, ends trimmed and veiny strings 5 tablespoons corn or safflower oil 1 1/2 tablespoons minced fresh ginger 1 tablespoon minced garlic 1 1/4 teaspoons crushed dried red chile peppers or chile pepper flakes 2 medium red bell peppers, rinsed, cored, seeded, and cut into very thin strips

With a sharp knife or a cleaver, trim away any fat or sinew from the

turkey. If using turkey breast, cut the meat on an angle into thin wide slices about 1/4-inch thick and 1 1/2 inches long by 1 1/2 inches wide. If using turkey cutlets, pound to flat-ten and then cut into 1 1/2-inch square.

Place in a bowl, add the marinade ingredients, and toss lightly to coat. Cover with plastic wrap and let marinate for 30 minutes in the refrigerator. Combine the sauce ingredients.

Heat a wok or a skillet, add 3 1/2 tablespoons oil, and heat until very hot. Add the turkey slices and stir-fry over high heat, stirring continuously, until the meat loses its pink color separates. Remove with a handled strainer or a slotted spoon and drain in a colander. Clean out the pan.

Reheat the pan, add the remaining tablespoon of oil, and heat until very hot. Add the ginger, garlic, dried peppers or pepper flakes, and stir-fry for about 1 minute, then add the rice wine or sake and toss briefly.

Add the snow peas and stir-fry for about 30 seconds, until crisp-tender. Add the sauce mixture and heat until thickened, stirring constantly. Add the cooked turkey, toss lightly to coat, and transfer to a serving platter. Serve immediately. Serves six.

# Expert serves nutrition tips

Here are some nutritional nuggets of information from Karen Collins, registered dietitian for the American Institute for Cancer Research in Washington, DC.

■ Egg whites are a good source of low-fat protein. However, the yolk is actually the portion of the egg that contains the majority of the iron, zinc, vitamin B-12, and folic acid (a B vitamin).

If your diet is well balanced this may not be a problem. Another alternative, is to prepare

eggs using some whole eggs and some egg whites.

When using eggs in cooking, you might cut fat content with fewer nutrient losses by using whole eggs and cutting the amount of added fat by a quarter to a third.

Cutting back on fatty meats such as bacon or sausage served with eggs and switching to leaner foods elsewhere in the day's diet can also cut significant fat without any loss in nutrients.

# How to season a wok

Here's how Nina Simonds, author of "China Express," seasons a flat-bottom rolled steel wok.

The heavier the pan, the better it conducts heat. A 14-inch diameter wok is a good all-purpose size. Most of them are moderately priced near \$20. Look for a wok which is equipped with 2 wooden handles one long and one short

Wash the wok well with soapy hot water and dry thoroughly.

Heat the pan and add a generous amount of oil. (About 1 cup)

Swirl the pan periodically over low to medium heat for about 30 minutes. (Be careful not to allow the oil to smoke).

Allow the wok to cool. Remove the oil and wipe dry.

# Long-term investment pays off at Guenoc Winery

Some 90 miles north of San Francisco, and far from mainstream northern California wine country, is Guenoc (Gwen'-ahk) Valley, an uncommonly beautiful, but extremely isolated, and under-developed area. Here the wine lover finds the 23,000 acres of the Guenoc Estate Vineyards and Winery which in total represents the area of a sizeable city.

Vineyards in Guenoc Valley grow at optimum elevations between 1,000 and 1,500 feet. Grapes reap benefits from the rich California sun by day and very cool temperatures at night. Soils are either loamy with gravel bands or rocky and lean. The former is superior for chardonnay, while the latter simulate the conditions of the Medoc and make a favorable home for the Bordeaux varieties — cabernet sauvignon, merlot, cabernet franc, malbec and petit verdot.

The Guenoc Winery label bears a portrait of the famous stage actress Lillie Langtry who was the darling of both European and American theatergoers in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Langtry owned property in the

Guenoc Valley where she produced wines from her vineyards. Today, more than 300 acres of vineyards surround the original Langtry House, restored to its original Victorian elegance by Guenoc's proprietors Orville and Karen Magoon.

In 1963, Orville Magoon's family exchanged 23 acres of prime real estate in Hawaii for the 23,000 acres in Guenoc Valley because the University of Hawaii needed to expand its campus facilities. At first, the property served as a livestock ranch only, but Magoon's mother Genevieve wanted to plant grapes, considering them more romantic than hay. And so it happened!

from the Genevieve Magoon Vineyard (\$21) on the estate and a Cabernet Sauvignon from the Beckstoffer Vineyard (\$30) in Napa Valley.

At the top of the line are the Langtry Meritage bottlings. If you've seen the term "meritage" on California bottlings and don't understand the term, we'll state it simply. The term meritage rhymes with heritage — it is not a French word and it denotes wines of merit made with grape varieties that are the heritage of the Bordeaux region.

Langtry Meritage White (\$18) is a blend of 84 percent sauvignon blanc and 16 percent semillon. Langtry Meritage Red (\$37) is a blend of all five Bordeaux varieties grown on the estate and named above. In our opinion, the Langtry Meritage wines have few peers in the meritage category. These are stunning offerings of harmonious fruit and oak integration.

Both the wine louse phylloxera and Prohibition destroyed the vineyards planted by Langtry and the Magoon family had to begin back at square one. Orville Magoon travelled to Bordeaux to visit vineyards and came back to the property to plant test plots. The first wines from these plantings were produced in 1976.

In 1980, the Magoons built a winery with an exterior in the original design modeled after the historic Langtry barn. Here winemaker Derek Holstein is crafting some of the most delicious wines made in California. Holstein has been honing his winemaking skills since high

school when he first made wine from plums.

In 1981, Guenoc Valley became the first single-proprietor viticultural appellation recognized by the federal government Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

It's not just Guenoc's wines that appeal to us, but the care that's given to the vineyards. The term organically grown (natural farming) is the buzz word in grape growing. "The logical way to approach natural farming is with what we call 'sustainable agriculture,'" said Holstein. "At Guenoc, we utilize natural cover crops indigenous to our area. Planting these cover crops creates

a natural environment for predators of the pests which are particularly hazardous to grape vines." Building a predator population has allowed Guenoc to eliminate chemical sprays for these pests.

The following is a profile of the extensive product line from Guenoc. The estate selection wines produced entirely from the Magoon's Guenoc Valley vineyards include Chardonnay (\$15) and Sauvignon Blanc (\$12) as the white offerings. Labeled as North Coast are Cabernet Sauvignon, (\$13), Petite Sirah (\$15), Zinfandel (\$10) and Meritage Red (\$13). Two vineyard-designated reserve wines are produced. Chardonnay

# Making nutritious food choices secret to staying fit

Holiday season is just around the corner, it's getting cold outside, and if we're not careful, all those calories we burned off this summer will come back to haunt our thighs and hips. Believe me, it's easy to slide back into old habits. I've been feeling pretty smug about losing over 20 pounds and dropping two dress sizes. So much so that I

started cheating a little on my daily food plan.

It started out with a Pepperidge Farm cookie after dinner with coffee instead of a graham cracker. That led to chips instead of pretzels. When my new skirt started to pinch, I knew I gained an inch.

Losing weight, and keeping it off, is not easy. "People have been led to believe that you have to do everything perfect. Small changes add up," said Dr. Kristine Larson Clark, a registered dietitian, director of sports nutrition, and an assistant professor in the nutrition department of Penn State

University. "Regular exercise, eating a variety of fresh foods and substituting low-calorie alternatives for their high-calorie counterparts, all contribute to better weight management and overall better health."

Clark was in metro Detroit recently on a media tour with NutraSweet brand sweetener. She called me between stops on a car phone.

"Ingredients like NutraSweet revolutionized the way people eat," she said. "Practically overnight there were literally thousands of products available that were lower in calories and still

tasted great."

Healthy eating is synonymous with making healthy choices. In 1955, only five percent of women polled by Gallup said they were on diets. By 1977, the American

diet included 10 percent less sugar than in 1965; one-third more chicken; 20 percent more fish; fewer eggs and one-third less butter.

Today, the average supermar-

ket carries 30,000 different products, a 112 percent increase since 1980.

# Win Schuler Foods back home

As part of Campbell Soup Company, Win Schuler Foods known for their Bar-Scheeze Spread, got no respect.

"They were a sleepy business in a large multi-million dollar corporation, and weren't getting any attention," said Robert Nunez who with his partner Tom Bitterman, bought the product line from Campbell Soup Company in March, and opened an office in Livonia.

Detroit's Vlasic Pickle Company bought the Win Schuler food line from the family in 1982. Just four years earlier, Vlasic had been purchased by the Campbell Soup Company.

Bitterman and Nunez left Vlasic two years ago to go into business for themselves. After scouting a number of food lines, they decided to bring Win Schuler Foods back to Michigan.

"Campbell's, with hundreds of products and over \$6 billion in annual sales couldn't devote the sales and marketing energy that the Win Schuler line deserved," said Bitterman, who managed the products for a time at Vlasic.

The partners have introduced some new products, and changed the packaging of your favorite Win Schuler products, but not the price.

"We felt the Win Schuler brand name was strong and highly respected," said Nunez. "Everyone's got a Win Schuler

story, they feel very strongly about it."

Bitterman and Nunez have introduced a new line of frozen, heat and serve, appetizers including Win Schuler barbecue meatballs, which were served at Win Schuler's Restaurant before dinner with a complimentary crock of cheese.

The two other new products are Grilled Chicken Chunks in a Thick & Rich Barbecue Sauce, and Smoked Sausages in a Mild Chili Sauce. They are available in five pound plastic buckets at membership clubs like Source, Parti-Giant and in two pound supermarket containers at Spartan stores.

Other products in the Win Schuler food line are five flavors of Bar-Scheeze Cheese Spread, Cheese logs and balls; and eight flavors of Bar-Schips snack crackers.

Fall and football season bring back a lot of fond memories for Nunez who attended Albion College and used to sample Bar-Scheeze "at the source" in nearby Marshall. The Schuler restaurants in Marshall, Jackson, Stevensville and St. Joseph Michigan remain independent, and are run by the family. Win Schuler, died in May at the age of 85.

"We all remember Mr. Schuler's touch, his smile, the sparkle in his eye, his insistence on quality products," said Nunez.

"We're trying to meet the consumer needs for quick party

food. We think the consumer wants a variety of products. The meatballs, chicken and sausage are typically things that take time to make."

### BAR PARTY FONDUE

- 1/4 cup butter
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon dry mustard

- 1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard
- 1 teaspoon snipped chives

Using a mortar and pestle, crush the fennel seed, mustard seed and peppers. Set aside.

Trim fat from roast. Place roast on rack in shallow roasting pan. Rub seed mixture over top and sides of roast. Insert a meat thermometer in the center of the roast. Roast, uncovered, in a 325 degree F oven for 1 1/4 to 1 3/4 hours or until a meat thermometer registers 150 degree F to 170 degrees F. Remove

roast from oven. Cover with foil and let stand for 15 minutes before carving.

Meanwhile, for sauce, in a small saucepan cook mushrooms in a small amount of boiling water about 3 minutes or until tender. Drain. Stir together milk, cornstarch and bouillon granules. Stir milk mixture into the mushrooms. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Cook and stir for 2 minutes more. Stir in mustard and chives. Serve with roast. Makes 8 servings.

# Spiral sandwiches put a spin on lunch

AP — These tempting sandwiches are made with Armenian cracker bread (also called lahvosh) Look for it at Middle Eastern markets and specialty food stores.

### SPIRAL SANDWICHES

- 15-inch sesame seed Armenian cracker bread (lahvosh)
- 1/2 of an 8-ounce package light cream cheese (Neufchâtel), softened
- 1 tablespoon snipped fresh basil or 1 teaspoon dried basil, crushed
- 1 tablespoon snipped fresh oregano or 1 teaspoon dried oregano, crushed
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 4 ounces very thinly sliced, fully-cooked smoked turkey or ham
- 1 large tomato, very thinly sliced
- 2 ounces very thinly sliced Monterey jack or Swiss cheese
- 1/2 cup alfalfa sprouts
- 1 large romaine lettuce leaf, rib removed

Dampen cracker bread on both sides by holding the bread briefly under gently running cold water. Place the moistened bread between two damp clean towels, making sure

the sesame seed side is facing down. Let the bread stand at room temperature about 1 hour or until it has softened enough for rolling.

For the filling, in a medium mixing bowl combine the softened cream cheese, basil, oregano, salt, garlic powder and pepper. Use a fork to stir until mixed.

Uncover the softened bread, leaving it on the bottom towel. Using a spatula or table knife, gently spread the cream cheese filling onto the bread. Arrange the turkey or ham slices in a layer atop the cream cheese mixture. Top the meat slices with a layer of tomatoes. Top the tomatoes with a layer of Monterey jack or Swiss cheese. Sprinkle with alfalfa sprouts.

Place the lettuce leaf along one of the short sides of the bread, on top of the alfalfa sprouts. Starting on the side with the lettuce and using the towel to lift, roll up the bread, jellyroll style, so the sesame seed is on the outside of the roll. Cover and chill the roll, seam side down, for 2 to 24 hours. To serve, trim uneven edges. Cut the chilled roll into 1-inch-thick slices. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 1/4 cups thinly sliced zucchini
- 1 cup (4 ounces) sliced mushrooms

- 3 tablespoons fresh chopped basil leaves or 1 tablespoon dried basil leaves, crushed

- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

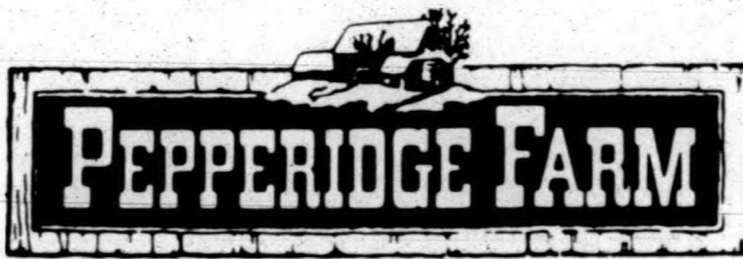

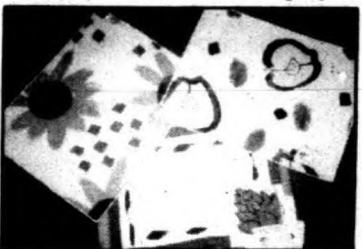

## Deep, rich colors style fall tables

For most of us, the rich, warm colors of fall inspire change. As the leaves seem to magically turn from a pale green to golden yellows, vibrant oranges and harvest reds, we put away summer's lightweight linens and set a table befitting the season.

I wandered through Jacobson's tabletop department in Birmingham last week and admired their artful table linen displays. One of my favorites included these hand-painted placemats by Nancy Cohn (\$10).



The whimsical apples are yellow and red, accented with green leaves. Blue and cranberry borders highlight the artichoke and the golden sunflowers seem to dance across their canvas. Any of the patterns would add a dash of fall fun to your kitchen or dining room.

For a more formal setting I spotted an elegant, fringed ivory brocade runner from the Austin Horn collection (\$112) and a dazzling pearl-encrusted and gold-embroidered table square with tasseled corners (\$155). What glamour for a special holiday table.

They are a palette of tapestry toppers in autumn-rich colors, making them a classic choice for the season. Jacobson's displays a floral and leaf design tablecloth with multi-color fringe (\$186) and a lined fruit motif square (\$142). Their tapestry selection from France includes a Metropolitan Opera-inspired orchestral scene in hunter green and rusts.

Hudson's also features tapestry placemats and runners in its tabletop department. An eye-catcher by Creations de France weaves a garden of wildflowers with friendly forest animals and birds, and borders the playful scene with blossoming tulips (\$30-\$225). Stunning!

### Global spirit

Ethnic-patterned linens impart the same richness of color and design as the traditional fruit and floral motifs, yet they add a new global spirit to our table dressings.

Last year, Hudson's and Harlem Textile works challenged local students from Cass Tech High School in Detroit to create patterns that could be printed on textiles. ## Rukeyser rips new tax burdens



Louis Rukeyser pontificated on the state of America's economy for almost two hours last week, delighting a sold-out audience brought together by Hudson's at the Fairlane Grand Manor. His comments prompted three standing ovations. Here are the highlights.

Television financial journalist Louis Rukeyser said he knew he made it when Rolling Stone magazine published a list of people's favorite programs and Fab Five Freddie of Yo! MTV Raps revealed, "I watch Wall Street Week with Louis Rukeyser, because it's about money and he's cool."

"I am now a hero to my children," the veteran of 24 years of economic analysis broadcasts quipped. "Young people have found that staying home and watching public TV on a Friday night is something better to do. I'm considering a Wall Street Week All-Rap Special."

Rukeyser came to town Sept. 29 as guest speaker for a Hudson's evening of "fashion, insight and information." The financial iconoclast drew a crowd of 650 investors, business leaders and just plain fans, who enjoyed dinner, a fast-paced fashion show and Rukeyser's prognostications.

Rukeyser used the occasion to poke the Clinton Administration's tax plan, "Clinton's made the wrong diagnosis and proposed the wrong cure." He countered that "when gov-

ernments pull back, people move ahead. Prosperity is not created by an ever-expanding government."

He said tax increases from the Bush Administration and tax increases proposed by the Clinton Administration will put America at the highest level of taxation in its history — at 44 to 45 percent when state and local taxes are added in. This can only hurt the economy and prolong the recession.

Rukeyser said the recession is over, the economy is coming back slowly, and Clinton should not intervene and "screw it up."

"Don't just do something, Mr. President, stand there!" he urged to a round of applause. Rukeyser offered six tips families should be following until prosperity returns:

- Don't panic. "Nothing revolutionary or fatal is going on."
- Pay down your own debt.
- Get the household budget in order.
- Reassess your career. "Take a look at your job and your company. If your assessments raise any doubts, market your talent, train for a new career, always be in the business of you."

Ever hear of the 3-11 Rule of Retail? It could make or break your business, according to Bob Dery of Consumer Dynamics.

Dery came to Livonia from Cleveland recently to discuss customer service with managers of the Laurel Park Place stores.

"The 3-11 Rule is based on human nature," he told the crowd. "If a customer is treated well in your store, he or she will tell three other people how

great the service is. If he or she is not happy with the service, they will tell 11 people how lousy your store is."

The moral of the axiom is good service builds business.

OK, what constitutes good service? Dery said it's service that's A.B.C.D. - Above and Beyond the Call of Duty. Without A.B.C.D. service you get customers that D.C.B.A. - Don't Come Back Again.

"Eighty percent of a store's business comes from 20-percent of the customer base," he explained. "Al-

ways remember that a customer is not an interruption of your work, but rather the purpose of your work."

The current retail atmosphere makes customer service even more important than ever because customers have more shopping options than before, Dery pointed out. People can shop by catalog, by television, in strip centers, malls, discount centers, specialty stores or warehouses.

"You've got to cut down a shopper's options," Dery said. "The way to do that is to make sure you provide the

best customer service of anyone."

Dery also advised sales consultants to become actors and actresses, who are always "on," always giving a fine performance.

"A customer should never know when you are down, bored, mad at your husband or worried about your kids," he said. "You must maintain a high energy level, smile, acknowledge and welcome a customer, and be ready to give service above and be-

■ Play the stock market. "Seize every opportunity the idiots give you to buy low. Buy when others are terrified. Invest regularly, systematically."

■ Get smart as a citizen. "Force Congress to stop stealing from you. This slowdown will pass, but Congress goes on forever."

Taking questions from the audience, Rukeyser endorsed the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), arguing that it's inevitable and a way to meet the new challenge from an organized European market.

When asked about the best stocks to buy, Rukeyser responded, "Think where the world's going and what it'll need when it gets there. Put your money in the

companies that have the products and services this new world will need."

More specifically, he recommended the drug industry, energy, high technology, (semiconductors and telecommunications) and financial services.

"Pick 10 or 12 companies you feel have the financial resources to get into the future and invest in them regularly regardless of what the Doom and Gloom sayers preach," he said.

After two curtain calls, Rukeyser left the stage and the audience broke up to discuss his advice.

Don Lynch of Livonia, Don Beesley of Canton, and Graham Porter and Bob Powanda of Dear-

born shared their impressions of the speech.

"A lot of what he said was just common sense," Lynch said. "But very interesting to hear in the Rukeyser style. He's wonderful."

The men agreed that they got their money's worth from the evening, "Rukeyser packed a lot of information into this talk," Porter said.

Beesley was in the audience when Rukeyser spoke in Detroit two years ago. "I think this was a better presentation," he said.

Gerry Steele of Allen Park wrapped it up for everyone, "I think Rukeyser is saying, 'Use common sense and do the research.'"

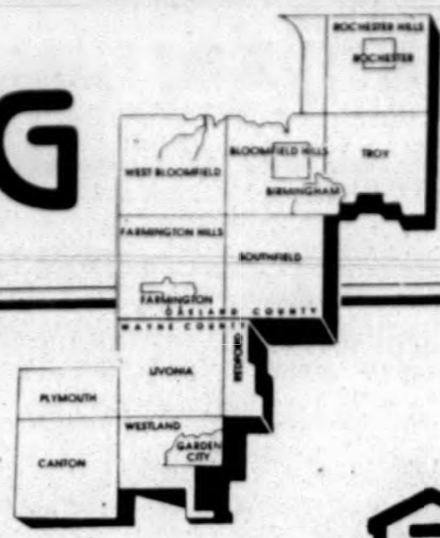

## Davis, Boenheim pay Head visit

Full is here, summer is dead, but winter (basketball) is still ahead.

Speaking of hoops, I heard of some recent developments out in the Plymouth-Canton area.

Inside sources tell me that Dr. Tom Davis (Iowa) and Jim Boenheim (Syracuse) were both in town recently to meet and greet Plymouth Salem's 6-foot-7 James Head.

My eye in the sky tells me that Head performed well at the all-star camp held over the summer at Eastern Michigan University.

Also, the word is out that Plymouth Canton's 6-5 Bryan Whittle, the highly-touted transfer from Poughkeepsie, N.Y., has returned home after only one year with the Chiefs.

Whittle, who struggled last season as a junior, apparently is back at Spackenhill High where he dominated his county circuit, averaging 23 points per game.

Canton coach Dave Van Wagoner, who learned of Whittle's departure after he returned from vacation in late August, said the New York transfer had a good summer season and had attracted interest from Mid-American schools.

### No kickers in Livonia

It's becoming more common in high school football that kickers are a valued commodity.

Most grid coaches look no further than their own soccer teams.

Redford Catholic Central borrowed Kerry Zavgagin and now use Adam Borchert, both outstanding soccer players. Walled Lake Western made a run all the way to the state Class A finals last year behind the leg of Travis Ilacqua.

This season, Canton's Jeff Fliss does double duty; so does Plymouth Salem's Mike Kley and Redford Thurston's Brian Mlynarek.

But in Livonia, school policy prohibits athletes from playing two sports during the same season.

The issue was apparently discussed last spring when an athlete tried to play both softball and run track. The arrangement had the athlete running in the meets, but not practicing with the track team.

Livonia's athletic council couldn't justify that setup, so the policy still stands.

Too bad, because a lack of a kicker has hurt 0-4 Livonia Franklin in a couple of games.

It was only last year that Eastern Michigan University utilized walk-on Bill Adam as its No. 1 placekicker after he used up his eligibility on the soccer team. Adam played soccer, but never placekicked when he was at Franklin. What a shame.

It seems Livonia schools are somewhat at a disadvantage when competing against their counterparts from the Western Lakes Activities Association, in lots of ways.

Gyms and practice facilities are rarely available on weekends, unless a paid custodian is on duty.

Meanwhile, the rest of the WLAA has carte blanche when it comes to access to their own facilities.

If they want their schools to be competitive, maybe Livonia interim superintendent Dr. Ken Watson should reevaluate the policy. Or have his schools join a less competitive league.

### Chuck Donaldson update

I paid a visit to University of Michigan Hospital last week to see Clarenceville football coach Chuck Donaldson, who was seriously injured last summer in a car accident. Donaldson is making progress, but a lengthy rehabilitation process lies ahead.

He was named Clarenceville's new head coach only a few weeks prior to the accident.

U-M assistant football coach Lloyd Carr stopped by to see Donaldson while he was in intensive care. He has also received great support from family and friends, including Schoolcraft College Trustee Richard DeVries and former Central Michigan star Mike Nettie, a teammate of Donaldson's at Stevenson.

I was uplifted to see Donaldson sitting in a wheelchair. We talked about Clarenceville football, Stevenson football and the Michigan-Notre Dame game. Donaldson is tired of hospital food, so maybe somebody could sneak him in a good Italian dish (his favorite).

He's antsy to get out of the hospital. He may get a chance to go home for a few days before returning to U-M for rehab.

"The doctors say I should be out of here by Christmas," he said. "Being in here three months is long enough."

Donaldson is on floor 6-A, Room No. 6410. Keep Chuck in your prayers.

## Canton runners topple Western



The Plymouth Canton boys and girls cross country teams managed to do what no other school has done for several years Thursday — defeat the Walled Lake Western teams in dual-meet competition.

Plymouth Canton scored a pair of important victories Thursday in boys and girls cross country.

The Chiefs knocked off defending Western Lakes Activities Association champions Walled Lake Western, 17-42 in the boys race and 20-36 in the girls. Both teams are 2-0 in the Western Division and 3-0 overall.

The Western boys, three-time defending WLAA champs, had won 24 consecutive dual meets and the girls 15. The boys hadn't lost since 1989 and the girls 1990.

The Canton boys were led by Casey Moothart, who ran the third-fastest time by a Canton runner at Cass Benton Park at 16:57.

The Chiefs took the top four places with Todd Smith (17:14), Matt Demey (17:17) and Jeff Keith (17:19).

Canton's Ian Bedford was seventh (17:48), Brian Crockett eighth (17:54) and Tim Czerniawski 11th (18:20).

"I was happy with our guys," coach Mike Spitz said. "They did a real good job. We're running more like a team and that's going to help."

The Chiefs were competitive with Western last year, losing the dual meet by a point and finishing second to the Warriors by four points in the WLAA. Canton finished ahead of Western at the regional.

### Big win for girls

Canton took a step toward regaining its former status as the girls power in the WLAA by defeating Western.

"In the '90s, they've had a great cross country program," said Canton coach George Przygodski of the Warriors. "We feel today was part of re-establishing our program in the WLAA."

Lana Boroditsch ran a school-

record time of 19:32 at Cass Benton and finished first.

Western's Bridget Bryne was second (19:49), but the Chiefs got the next three places with Laura McWilliams (19:55), Kathleen Landelius (20:02) and Becky Wolfrom (20:38).

Canton's Beth Knight was seventh (21:05), Casey Swanson 10th (22:37) and Erin Hindman 12th (23:15).

"The conditions were good for running, and we responded with our top seven runners running their fastest times at Cass Benton," Przygodski said.

"It was a special dual meet for us because they are the defending league and regional champions and two-time Western Division champs."

## Salem thumps North

A 95-yard kickoff return by senior Andy Coburn got Plymouth Salem off to a fast start Friday as the Rocks blanked visiting North Farmington 21-0 on homecoming.

Salem improved to 3-2 overall and 2-1 in the Lakes Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association. The Raiders are 1-4 overall and 1-2 in the division.

Junior quarterback Brad Lear capped a 15-play, 70-yard drive with a 9-yard run to give the Rocks a 14-0 lead with 4:41 left in the first quarter.

Senior fullback Rob Shepley scored the final Salem touchdown on a 3-yard run after senior linebacker Jay Perko recovered a fumble at the North 15. Mike Kley converted all three of the extra points.

North threatened to spoil the shut-out, but Salem's Brian Halstead recovered another fumble at the Rocks' 14 with 49 seconds remaining in the game.

Shepley carried 20 times for 78 yards, while Marcus Zevalkink rushed 10 times for 60 yards. Coburn and Scott Schumacher led the Salem defense with four tackles each.

The Rocks gained 222 total yards compared to North's 195.

## N'ville outguns Canton

Power football prevailed over the finesse game Friday as host Northville defeated Plymouth Canton 14-0 in an important Western Division game.

The Mustangs rushed for 250 of their 296 total yards and made their running game the dominant feature of the contest.

Northville also was able to contain Canton's passing game and limited it to 91 yards through the air. The Chiefs had just 57 yards on the ground.

"It goes to prove the point you have to be able to run the ball," said Canton coach Bob Khoenle, who expressed that concern previously when the Chiefs won games with their passing. "It's nice to throw the ball, but you have to be able to run it effectively when you have to."

Northville improved to 4-1 overall while snapping a three-game winning streak for the Chiefs (3-2). Both teams are 2-1 in the division.

Tailback Aniel Kersey did most of the damage for the Northville, rushing for 126 yards on 23 carries, including touchdown runs of 38 and 6 yards. But fullback Bryan Kelley added 72 yards on just five attempts, and quarterback Marc Golden added 29 but was always a threat to break a long run.

## Late goal allows Rocks to tie Chiefs, 2-2

Plymouth Salem soccer player Drew Drummond took a modest view of his game-tying goal Thursday.

With the Rocks just minutes away from a second loss to Plymouth Canton, Drummond's perfectly placed shot allowed Salem to escape with a 2-2 tie.

Salem was pressuring in front of the Canton goal when the ball went out to Drummond, who put it in the upper left-hand corner just over the reach of goalie George Tomasso.

"He's a great goalie," Drummond said. "It was pretty much luck. It was

a team effort, not any one person out there. I can't take all the credit; it's the team."

The outcome put Canton at 4-6-1 overall and 2-2-1 in the Western Lakes Activities Association, the Rocks 5-4-2 and 4-2-1.

Drummond's goal with 4:07 remaining altered what appeared would be a win for the Chiefs, who also defeated Salem 3-1 in the final of the Centennial Educational Park Invitational.

Canton led 2-1 at halftime on a pair

of Chad Dale goals and made the lead stand for most of the second half.

"We would've liked to win it, but since we haven't been winning games, a tie will hold us over," Canton coach Don Smith said.

"If George had touched it, it would have been a super save. It was a beautiful hit. (Drummond) bent it right around."

"That's one thing I always say about this team: They never give up," Johnson said. "It's like a morale victory when you come back and tie in a good game. It's not disappointing."

Salem scored first when Scot Buczek redirected a cross from Mark Ma-

cInnis, who had an earlier goal disallowed because of an offside call, at 14:54 in the first half.

Little more than a minute later, Dale lifted the ball past a pair of defenders, and it rolled into the net before Salem keeper Paul Dood could get to it.

Two minutes before halftime, Dale raced up on the left side to head the ball into the corner of the net after Jeff Fliss crossed the ball from the other side.

Salem coach Ken Johnson thought the Rocks should have scored more in

"They play power football, and they have the kids to do it," Khoenle said. "They have a pretty good trio there."

"They run the ball well and don't throw it well. We throw it better than average and don't run it that well. There comes a point you have to be able to run it."

Canton's longest pass play went for 15 yards, in contrast with the previous game when the Chiefs beat Walled Lake Western with long gainers. Ryan Ostach and Tim Moritz caught four passes each for 41 and 35 yards, respectively.

"Their passing game was giving us trouble, but we could control the ball longer than they could," Northville coach Darrel Schumacher said.

The Mustangs had big defensive ends John Gatti and Jason Hollman applying a hard rush, and that forced Canton to throw early and run a lot of short side-line patterns.

"Our game plan was to keep them from setting up," Schumacher said. "If we keep the pressure on the quarterback, that keeps him from throwing long. We were coming with our two (ends) to keep him inside and force him to throw it early."

Senior Kevin Shankie started for Canton, but Khoenle settled on junior Brett Elledge after alternating the two for a couple series.

Khoenle thought the running ability of Elledge would allow the Chiefs to get outside of the Northville ends on the option. Shankie was 3-of-6 passing for 23 yards, Elledge 9-of-15 for 68.

"We weren't afraid to throw it (deep), but we were having trouble blocking their ends and we were holding guys in to help," Khoenle said. "We thought we

would be more successful throwing short than deep and moving the ball by first downs."

"We were trying to figure out what the pattern was," Schumacher said. "We weren't sure if (Elledge) was the option quarterback or the throwing quarterback. They had our kids guessing, but then we said, 'Go get, and they did.'"

Northville scored the first time it had the ball, executing a fake punt at its own 42-yard line for a 16-yard gain by Kersey, who made his 38-yard TD run three plays later at 7:56 in the first quarter.

"We thought about (the fake punt) against Churchill but decided, 'If you don't need it, don't show it,'" Schumacher said. "I thought we needed to score early because they have the ability to score and score often. You have to get up, so they have to play from behind."

The Chiefs drove to the Northville 13 in the second period but lost a fumble. Canton's Kevin Kovachevich, who stopped a possible Northville TD at his own 4-yard line late in the first half, and Derrick Young intercepted Golden passes.

The Mustangs scored again off the second-half kickoff, going 71 yards in just six plays. Kelley ran 43 yards to the Canton 26, and Kersey scored three plays later at 9:05.

Canton moved the ball to the Northville 8 with 8:22 remaining, but Elledge was thrown for a loss on fourth-and-inches. The Mustangs used their ground game to hold the ball for the last 7:58.

"I thought our kids did a real good job and gave a good effort," Khoenle said. "We had chances to score; we made a few mistakes, but overall it wasn't too bad."

After giving up four three-pointers during the opening half — two each by Lisa Craven and Jenny Massey — Stevenson clamped down by holding the Rocks without a field goal in seven third-quarter tries.

Salem had only one more three-pointer the rest of the night and finished with only 14 of 43 from the field (32.5 percent).

The catalyst once again was first-team All-Observer guard Mo Drabicki, who scored eight of her team-high 14 points during the charge. She had seven steals, including two converted into layups, in that third period.

Stevenson never let the Rocks get any closer than 12 points the rest of the night. Junior Claire Schrader's basket put it away with 1:17 remaining. Her hoop made it 48-33, ending a four-min-

ute Stevenson scoreless drought.

Salem coach Fred Thomann came away impressed with the Spartans, who are trying to duplicate last year's 19-2 record.

"Mo is a little better, but they don't have as much size this year," Thomann said. "But they're quicker and they have not fallen down in their ability to hit the shot from the perimeter."

Drabicki led a balanced Stevenson scoring attack.

Sophomore center Stacey Nichols and junior forward Jill Van Tiem each contributed 10 points. Nichols also grabbed eight rebounds, while junior forward Ann Marie Aquino, who may be the team's most improved player from a year ago, collected six points and six rebounds.

Craven, the senior transfer from Livonia Franklin, was the only Salem player to score in double figures with 11.

The loss drops the Rocks to 3-6, but their record is deceiving because of a tough non-league preseason schedule, which has already included the likes of Ro-

chester Adams, Flint Powers, Plymouth Canton, Adrian and Stevenson.

"This win is important because we came out and responded defensively and we beat a pretty good basketball team," Henry said. "I don't care what their record is. Anytime you win at either Plymouth school, it's a big win."

Thomann, meanwhile, is hoping his team will continue to progress as the season goes along.

"At the beginning of the season I said that it (the Western Lakes) would be race between Canton and Stevenson, and nothing so far has happened to make me change my mind," the Salem coach said. "We hope to move into that third and fourth position."

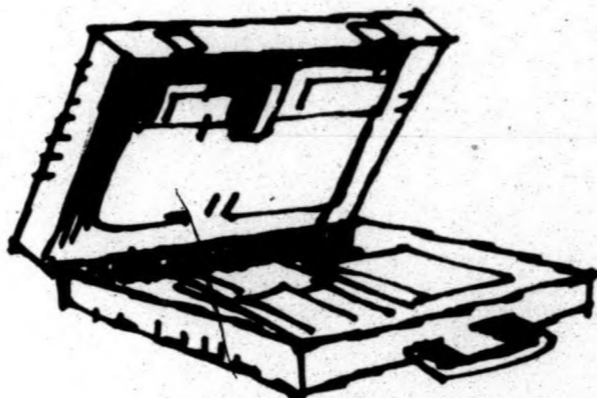




# WRITE IT AND REAP!



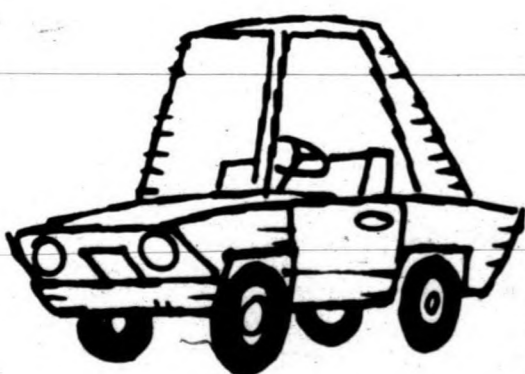
**1. Give the reader specific information.** Pretend you are someone reading the classifieds. What would you like to know about the item, service or job you are advertising? Be sure to add details such as color, size, condition, brand name, age, features and benefits. Be accurate! Don't embellish your ad with misleading information. Stick to the facts and reap the rewards!



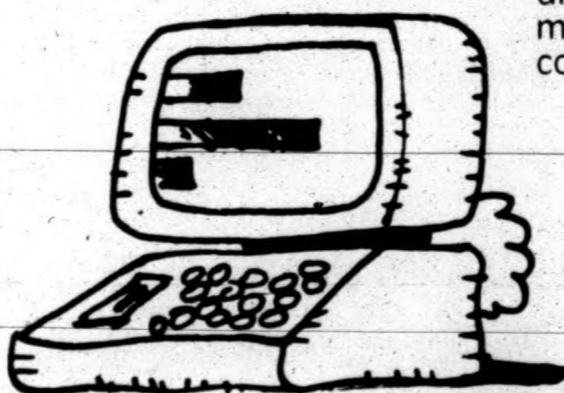
**2. Include the price.** Don't waste your time or a potential buyer's time. If you advertise the price of the item or service you offer, the people who respond to your ad will be those who are genuinely interested. Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.



**3. Avoid abbreviations.** Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WSW (white side wall) tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.



**4. Include phone number and specify hours.** Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a sale!



**5. Run on consecutive days.** Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative.

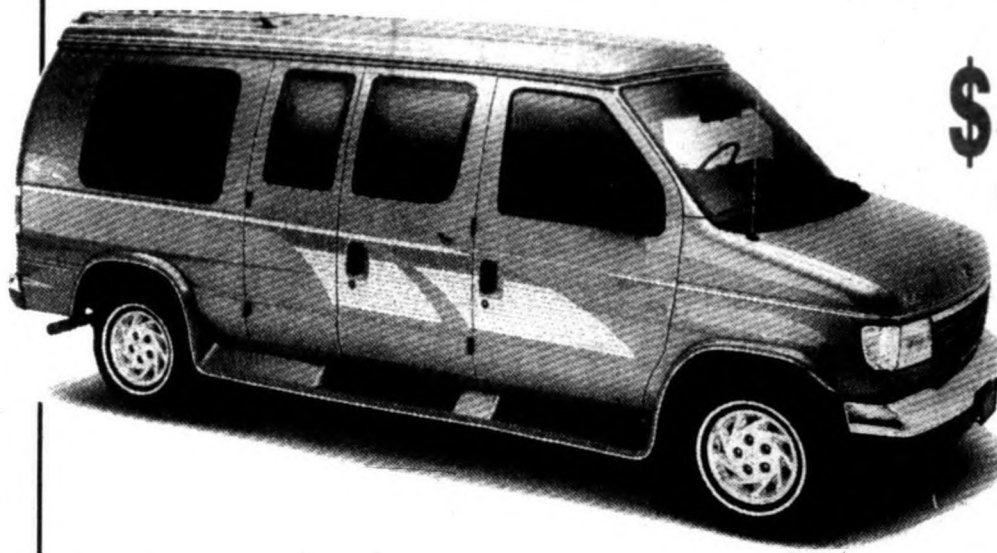
