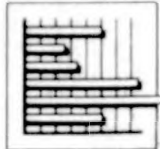

Church scraps seminary deal



For the second time since closing St. John's Seminary in Plymouth Township, the Archdiocese of Detroit has scrapped an agreement with a developer interested in creating a retirement community at the 175-acre site.

The deal to turn the former St. John's Seminary in Plymouth Township into a retirement community has been scrapped by the Archdiocese of Detroit.

But developer Eric Lindquist said

Friday he still plans to do the project. He maintained the Archdiocese announcement is a misunderstanding.

The Archdiocese on April 2 entered into an agreement with Lindquist's firm Windmill Pointe Interests of Detroit. The plan was to turn the seminary, on 175 acres southeast of Shel-

don and Five Mile roads, into a retirement village.

But on Nov. 22, the Archdiocese nixed the plan.

"The agreement was contingent on Windmill Pointe Interests providing evidence of its financing, which did not occur," said Archdiocese spokesman Ned McGrath.

"This permits the Archdiocese to pursue other options," McGrath said. He declined to say if the Archdiocese has received other inquiries or offers on the property.

"We understand the problem is they've got other offers on the table," Lindquist said Friday. "People see what we were planning and they say, 'Why don't we do it?'" he added.

"We're under the impression that everything can be worked out. We're disappointed but we're continuing to move forward and make progress," Lindquist said.

The estimated project cost was \$210 million.

Parent angered by charge

A Farrand Elementary School parent says she is outraged over the manner in which her child's teacher and principal handled a suspected case of child neglect.

Kristen Schneider of Plymouth Township was shocked to be met on her doorstep Sept. 20, her birthday, by a Department of Social Services worker. The social worker said she wanted to talk about a charge by Farrand staff that her son Ben was being left home alone for extended periods of time while his mother worked.

Schneider says there's no truth to what her son said, and that by doing a little checking, teacher Kim Martin would have realized that.

"It scared the heck out of me. I was devastated," said Schneider. "Legally, they could have taken my children away. It's a shame we are all guilty until proven innocent. That's what's scary."

Ben wears his bike key on a cord around his neck. "He told his teacher that was his house key," said Schneider. "Well just by looking, anyone could tell it wasn't a house key. The first week of school, Ben started making up stories like this. He thought it was the greatest thing, because someone was buying this."

Schneider is a dental hygienist who is not working outside the home. Schneider said it was evident the social worker hadn't done her homework, because she didn't know Schneider and her husband Robert have two other children, Brandon, 11, and Scott, 9. The worker also didn't realize that Kristen Schneider doesn't work outside the home.

Patrick O'Donnell, Plymouth-Canton executive director for instruction, said, "It's not for the teacher to make a judgment, but to act on the suspected condition. I think that is the whole issue in question here. I know it has the potential of creating problems between families and school personnel. I don't know what she was told, but if you read the law literally, the person did what she was supposed to."

School board president Roland Thomas said it's the district's policy "to follow the intent of the law. My understanding is the law is initially nebulous. They've provided no guidelines to go with the law. You can raise the question should we as a district do something? Maybe it's something we ought to consider."

Schneider says it "eats away at me that the teacher felt she did nothing wrong. I'd like other parents to know something like this can happen. Nowadays a kid could say anything they want about their mom or dad and it would make them suspicious enough to act."

Schneider says at the very least, she's owed an apology.

Mettetal runway project could cause stir in town

A Mettetal Airport Advisory Board member believes a long-term plan to move the runway 300 feet south — which would require Canton Township approval — violates the spirit of a contract between the township and the state.

"The spirit with the state is about to be broken," said Mike Stankov, who objected to two projects on a wish list of projects for the airport.

A plan to move the runway 300 feet from Joy Road, which requires the purchase of a portion of parcel 12, south of the airport, is included on a wish list organized

by Randy Collier, Mettetal manager and state Bureau of Aeronautics licensing and enforcement manager.

The wish list of short- and long-term improvements for the state-owned facility at Joy and Lilley roads has been compiled by pilots, state representatives and advisory board members.

"This has been discussed before with the township," Collier said, referring to plans for moving the runway. "We would like to move the runway 300 feet from the road. That would shorten the runway. So we would like to put it at the other end."

Stankov took exception to the plan because of an agreement be-

tween the state and township that accompanied the state's \$4 million purchase of Mettetal.

The agreement was designed to protect interests of residents. It calls for maintaining the runway length at 2,556 feet, which cannot be changed without written approval of Canton Township. The runway also cannot be shifted onto parcel 12 without the same township approval.

"The spirit was broken by seeing those things today," Stankov said, based on those provisions of the agreement.

Pat Nowak, Michigan Department of Transportation director, told township trustees that only

an air easement over parcel 12 was needed and the state would not buy the land.

"This is a major cost thing. It's years down the road. But if we didn't say it now, people would think we're keeping it secret," Collier said.

Collier said moving the runway away from Joy Road would improve safety at the airport. "It's not that it's not safe now. But it would create a margin of safety," he said.

While discussing the wish list, board vice chairman Mark Merlanti of Canton said any type of expansion would have to be spelled out, including how changes would affect the airport's

operations.

"There will be some strong concerns on how the operation will be changed," he said.

Stankov reminded Collier that the community "was sold" on the state purchase based on assurances the airport would not be expanded. "It was just a point I needed to make," he added.

Because of a displaced threshold — where the planes touch the runway when landing — the runway provides 2,105 feet of landing length. In a sense, Collier admitted, moving the runway south 300 feet would increase the landing length and would allow for larger planes.

"But that's not our intention.

We intend to abide by the agreement. Those items listed there are very important items (on wish list). My boss and I have no intention of doing them without township approval," Collier said. "If the township doesn't agree with it, it doesn't happen."

The advisory board will continue to review the wish list at future meetings.

"Before I can make much of a decision, I need cost estimates," said board member Elaine Kirchgatter, Canton treasurer.

Collier said estimates for the list of projects are expected within the next couple months.

'Wayne's World' debate fanned by area residents

Renee Reyer has been on radio talk shows from as far away as California and Minnesota. She has received telephone calls from around the country — and Canada.

But despite the Canton resident's efforts to stop McDonald's restaurants from selling "Wayne's World" — a movie based on char-

acters from "Saturday Night Live" — sales of the video are continuing, restaurant officials said.

A telephone poll of McDonald's restaurants in Plymouth, Novi and Livonia revealed that the video is still available. Protests led to the end of the video's sales in some area stores, including one in Canton.

"There has been no direction to

stop the sales. We are offering a variety of videos and did not set out to deliberately offend anyone," said Jody St. Andre, McDonald's regional marketing supervisor.

St. Andre said local McDonald's operators have the option of discontinuing any premium or product that they do not feel is of interest to their customer base.

But Reyer, who along with Livonia resident Phyllis Counts organized a Nov. 26 picket of two area McDonald's restaurants, disagrees.

Reyer believes that restaurant officials are quietly attempting to ease themselves out of a marketing blunder.

"I've talked to several McDonald's managers who agree and say that this was a bad choice

for McDonald's."

Reyer said she is also concerned with media reports which paint her plight as a one-woman protest.

"I have heard from all kinds of people — teachers and parents — who want to get involved," she said. Although she added she does not want to censor materials, she does not believe a traditional family restaurant should sell the video, rated PG-13.

She calls the movie's language and characters inappropriate for children and added, "Even if we don't succeed in having them (McDonald's) ban the video, the

next time, they'll think about what they want to put on the market."

Although Colleen Brown, a Plymouth resident, won't buy the video, she's not sure that picketing area McDonald's is the answer, either. Brown — the mother of three children, ages 12, 8 and 4 — is a PTO board member and active school volunteer.

"Ultimately, it is the parent's responsibility to monitor what the children see. I'm disappointed that they would choose to sell it, but the time could be used more wisely to benefit children than to picket McDonald's," she said.

Lindquist said in November he planned to start the first phase of construction in the spring after the project would win zoning approval from Plymouth Township officials.

But in a Nov. 24 letter to Lindquist, Archdiocese attorney David Hipp wrote, "We request that you cease any contacts with Plymouth Township regarding this property."

"Furthermore, we request that you cease representing or implying to anyone else that you have an interest in St. John's Seminary at this time."

The Archdiocese's announcement came just one week after A.J. Etkin Construction Co. announced it had been awarded the contract to perform renovation at the seminary to create 2,100 living units and a geriatric clinic over 5-

10 years.

The developer had appeared before the township planning commission to detail some aspects of the plan. While the land is zoned for residential housing, township officials said they were favorable toward the creation of a retirement community at the site.

Township officials have assessed the site including buildings at about \$3 million. Because the land is church-owned and tax exempt, sale to a private owner could mean more than \$200,000 annually in new tax revenue for the township.

The 40-year-old seminary was

closed in June 1988.

This marks the second time the Archdiocese has scrapped a purchase agreement with a developer seeking to turn the seminary into a retirement center.

Retirement and Health Services Corp. of Baltimore had signed a \$5.5 million purchase agreement to convert the buildings. The Archdiocese in 1992 voided the agreement, saying their approach was to sell the property as a whole.

While the Baltimore firm filed suit to keep the sale on track, the Archdiocese won the resulting court case.

"Considering its distinguished history and reputation, it is still hoped that the St. John's property can and will retain much of its original identity," McGrath said.

That opens up a large issue, said O'Donnell. "Any time a person would file on the basis of suspected neglect, you're going to have to turn around and apologize. The law doesn't require that. I don't mean to sound callous, but that's beyond their mandatory obligation."

Added Thomas, "If the child had not done what he had done, we would not have been in the situation we were in. I'm not agreeing or disagreeing. I'm just saying had her son told the truth, we

wouldn't have been in this situation."

Schneider said she took her son out of the teacher's classroom, which was upsetting to him, after the incident. She had planned to volunteer in the office at Farrand and get more involved, but feels too uncomfortable to do that now.

"If I could, I would like to take my kids to another school, mostly because of the way (the teacher) handled this. If she's so busy that important matters like this get overlooked, I feel it's a big cause for concern."

INSUFFICIENCY FRACTURES
Insufficiency fractures are hairline cracks in the bone, that occur in the elderly.

The name "insufficiency" is unfortunate. The implication is that if the individual had done something more "self-sufficient" this problem would not have arisen. The fact is that these fractures are an accompaniment of growing old and cannot be prevented by any known regimen of diet, medication or exercise.



Pilots shushed at airport

Before pilots take off from Mettetal Airport, they'll see signs posted at the ends of the runway.

"It's trying to remind, especially the transient pilots, that there are noise abatement procedures," said Randy Collier, Mettetal manager and state Bureau of Aeronautics licensing and enforcement manager.

Some Plymouth Township residents in November complained to the Mettetal Airport Advisory Board about noisy plans flying loudly over their neighborhoods, particularly east of I-275.

Collier assured residents then that signs would be placed on the runway to inform pilots to use noise abatement procedures. However, he also reminded residents it is pilots' prerogative not to use abatement if more engine power is needed for safety.

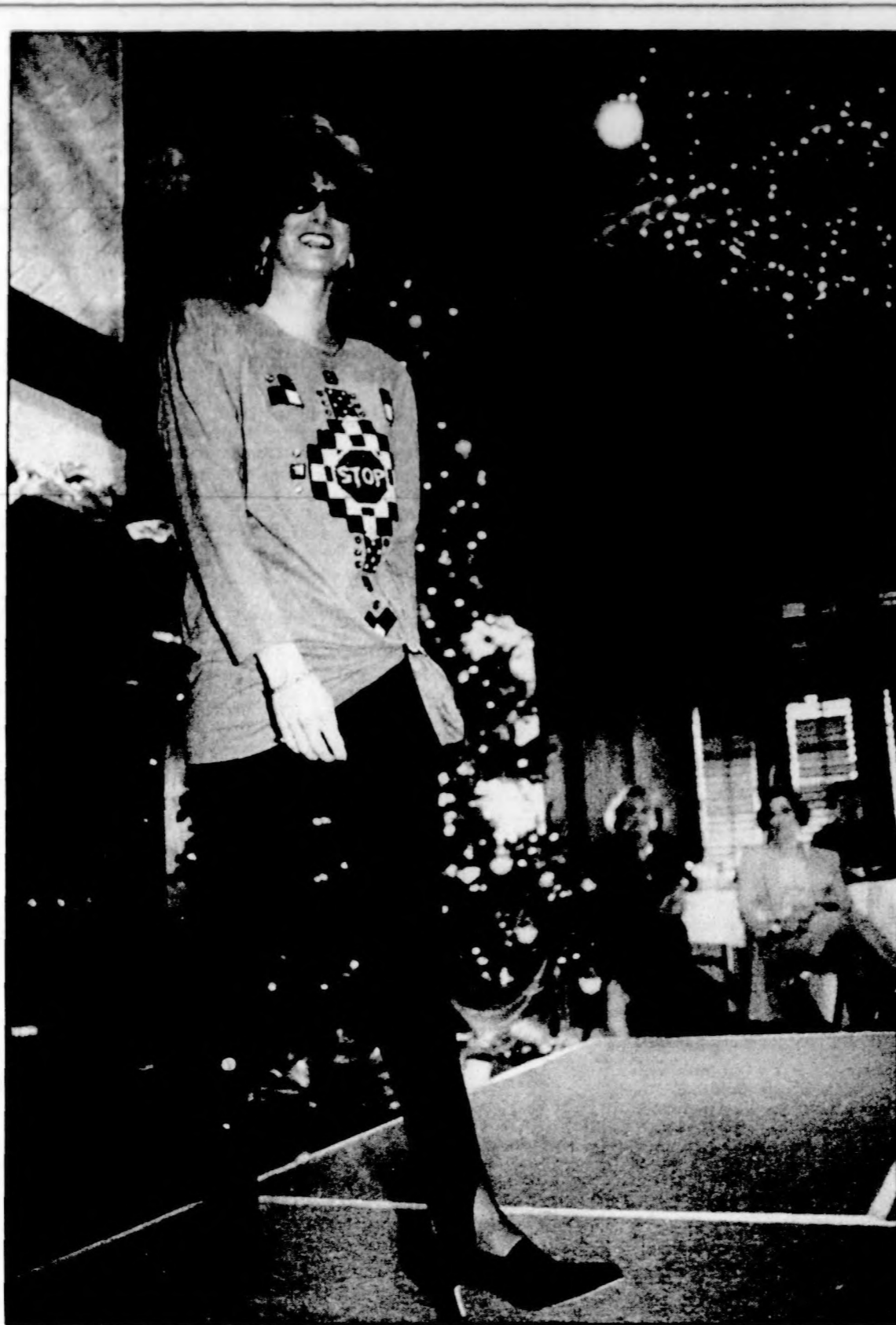
Pilots can reduce their power settings once they clear the runway and nearby obstacles, such as trees. "They can do it once they have a margin of safety," Collier said. "But you don't want to tell them to reduce power while they are taking off."

It's unknown whether the pilots who are not using noise abatement over residential areas are Mettetal pilots or from outside the area. "If the pilot doesn't know (about a noise problem), we can solve it. The pilots I talk to seem to want to cooperate."

Residents can contact the airport's administration office at 459-9096 to report a problem. It would be helpful, however, if the resident can provide airplane identification.

When planes are flying lower than usual, residents should be able to identify the 12-inch numbers on plane wings. The color of the plane, as well as whether its a one- or two-engine and where the engines are located, and identifying items on planes, Collier said.

"We would need anything that would help us identify the aircraft," Collier said.

Jeanne Dumas of Plymouth and Pam Lyle of Plymouth Township keep things running smoothly. The Plymouth-Canton Community Schools district provides the portable building and pays the utility bills.

Referrals come primarily through local schools. Some adult education students also come to the clothing bank, so donations of adult clothing, including business attire, come in handy.

"Our biggest need always is children's pants, elementary age," said Kocik, who's worked at the clothing bank for about 11 years. "Jeans are always good. Jeans and sweatclothes are the most popular." Clothing is needed for boys,

girls and adults. "We appreciate cash donations so much, because we are able to buy socks and underwear," Kocik said. Clothing bank volunteers like to provide clients with new socks and underwear each year.

"We always need shoes and boots. This time of year, we particularly need boots." Mittens, gloves and hats are also needed.

Area churches have recently held clothing drives for the clothing bank; one church provided new shoes, which were much appreciated.

Different community organizations, churches and schools support the clothing bank; individuals also make donations. "We're really very fortunate with the amount of support we get," she

said. Most school districts don't operate clothing banks, Kocik said, but the nearby Wayne-Westland district does.

Plymouth-Canton volunteers ask that clothing be "gently used" and clean. In addition to clothing, linens, including sheets, curtains, towels and blankets, are needed.

Clients come in twice a year, once for fall/winter clothes and then for spring/summer clothes. Clients are asked to make appointments by calling the clothing bank at 451-6673. The facility has a dressing room and full-length mirror.

"Every day we probably have five to six families in here. We've been steadily busy since we opened in September," Kocik

said. "This is our busiest time of year."

Those making donations are asked to stop by during clothing bank hours if possible; donations can also be left at the nearby school district warehouse during school hours Monday through Friday. Donated clothing shouldn't be left outside of the clothing bank when it's not open.

Checks should be made payable to Plymouth-Canton Community Clothing Bank. Donations are tax-deductible.

The clothing bank got its start more than 15 years ago, with Flossie Tonda, who was then on the school board, instrumental in getting it going. Volunteers found that local students and their families were in need of help.

"There's a large, large number of working poor," Kocik said. Many are receiving some form of public assistance.

Items that can't be used are given to the Salvation Army, so that nothing goes to waste. The three volunteers have a pretty good idea of what's in style among area young people.

"Jeanne has teenage children and she keeps us on our toes," Kocik said. Teens who come into the clothing bank don't hesitate to let volunteers know what's popular.

"Everything large and baggy," Dumas said. "Flannels, in fact we're real short on flannels." Teenage girls take large flannel

shirts to wear. "Just up-to-date," Lyle said. "They want them big to wear over their other clothes."

All styles of jeans are popular, Dumas said, as are lightweight denim shirts.

Some rather unusual donations have come in, including a wedding gown. "We've gotten a lot of formals that we try to save for prom time," Kocik said.

Volunteers are pleased to see clients' financial situation reach the point where they no longer use the clothing bank.

"We're always really happy when somebody's coming and their situation improves," Kocik said.

Hopping MADD

Ex board members protest firing of director

Four former advisory board members of Wayne County chapter of Mothers Against Drunk Driving have come to the defense of the executive director who was fired last summer.

Redford Township resident Michele Kubicz was fired as executive director of the Wayne County Chapter of MADD on July 28.

Four advisory board members later resigned in protest.

"The way Michele was treated was shameful," said Agnes Scott, former board member. "She was badly abused in the process."

"I can't say enough about Michele and her character," said Doug Brandon, former board member. "She's a good quality person."

Howard Cox and Edward Deeb also resigned from the advisory board after Kubicz was fired.

The local chapter officials and national officials of MADD say Kubicz was fired for financial irregularities in chapter business. MADD national officials in Texas issued an unsigned statement on plain white paper with no letterhead saying, "An audit completed in early July 1993 revealed expenditures by Ms. Kubicz that violated MADD's financial policies and procedures. The amounts in question were less than \$1,000, but Ms. Kubicz provided no explanation for these expenditures and was terminated in late July 1993."

Kubicz believes the expenditures in question are:

- Giving MADD coffee cups to volunteers.
- Buying lunch for some Navy recruiters who

occasionally helped carry boxes or steer handicapped folks up the stairs to the MADD office.

- Paying for the babysitters of volunteers.
- Buying refreshments for New Year's Eve phone bank volunteers.

All these expenditures were reported monthly to the national MADD office, Kubicz said.

Bethany Goodman, state MADD director, said the problems "went way beyond that." But Goodman would name no specific discrepancy found in the audit.

Kubicz joined MADD in 1984 after her husband Steven was killed by a drunken driver. On July 23, 1992, the Wayne County MADD board of directors hired Kubicz as executive director. On May 13, 1993, a new board was elected; Robert Totten, Carole Ravichio, Linda Alexander, Sandra Hoard and Darlene Hodges. Only Hodges, a Westland resident, was a member of the previous board.

Then on June 23, state MADD director Goodman paid a visit to Kubicz at the Livonia MADD office and showed her a directive from the national office putting Kubicz on administrative leave pending a financial audit.

Kubicz was asked to leave the office and her personal effects were searched, she said. "It was like having the Gestapo rush in on you. They went through my things as if I had thousand dollar bills stuffed in my notebook."

Goodman said the audit was conducted at the request of incoming MADD board members, who wanted to make sure everything was square before they took over on July 1. Goodman also said that Wayne County MADD staff members "expressed concern regarding financial accountability."

The audit results would not be released to the Observer, Goodman said. "To protect the employees' privacy I'm not able to give you a lot of detail."

Goodman discounted the testimony of advisory board members on Kubicz' behalf because "they're not privy to the details of the day-to-day activities."

Kubicz and her allies say that some MADD members didn't like Kubicz' emphasis on prevention programs as opposed to victim services. "That was my major crime," Kubicz said.

Darlene Hodges, the current Wayne County MADD board president, said she had no problem with Kubicz' prevention work and that Kubicz "was doing a wonderful job." But she claim that Hodges frowned on prevention work "is so much hogwash, it's unbelievable," she said.

As for the accusations, Hodges said, "there are always two sides and we're not allowed to tell our side."

Hodges joined MADD in 1989 after her son, Craig Allard, and one other Franklin High School student were killed by a drunken driver in Florida.

So far neither side has taken legal action. No one at MADD has accused Kubicz of a crime or filed a lawsuit. Kubicz has not filed a lawsuit but said she has consulted with an attorney.

School boundaries drawing scrutiny

State representatives launched a bill to study the boundaries of intermediate school districts and community college districts over the objections of many rural and suburban legislators.

Rep. Leon Stille, R-Ferrysburg, sponsored the bill to create an educational boundary commission to review the service areas of 57 intermediate and 29 community college districts.

Stille said students populations in intermediate range from 4,000 to 380,000. "Each ISD has the same needs for administration, facilities, equipment and staffing, yet each one serves a vastly different population base," Stille said.

The House passed his bill 64 to 38 on Nov. 30.

Supporters included Republicans Lyn Bankes of Redford, Penny Crissman of Rochester, Barbara Dobb of Union Lake, Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills,

John Jamian of Bloomfield Township and Jerry Vorva of Plymouth; and Democrats Maxine Berman of Southfield and William Keith of Garden City.

Opponents included Republicans Shirley Johnson of Royal Oak, Greg Kaza of Rochester Hills and Deborah Whyman of Canton; and Democrats Justine Barns of Westland and Richard Young of Dearborn Heights.

The bill is a companion to Gov. John Engler's proposal to set up a commission to study public school district boundaries. Michigan has 562 school districts ranging from a few dozen to 175,000 pupils.

Rep. Dan Gustafson, R-Haslett, said his rural districts in Ingham County fear "a loss of local identity" if local districts are consolidated. Students would have to travel longer distances, he said, and rural people see no economies of scale.

So This Is East Lansing — various artists



"So This Is East Lansing" shows that there's viable talent up there besides the standard college rock bar fare. Names often associated with East Lansing music scene — major label candidates the Verve Pipe, the Hannibals, Groovespoon and comedian/acoustic musician Wally Pleasant — contributed tracks to the 14-song CD.

Putting those four aside, there's other up and coming acts that go largely ignored who are featured on the disc. Groovemeisters Heckyl & Jive and Cuttin' Heads bring their funky sound to the release along with the rock of Gone Dog, dt's, the Oxymorons, Bad Oskar, Ymi and Flushbutton. The Huntunes' acoustic "Get Me Out of New York" will have your head bobbing within the first few notes.

"So This Is East Lansing" was produced by Keri Valmassi and Wendy Aaron, both former DJs at WDBM, Michigan State University's radio station, who thought that the area's music went unappreciated.

The CD is sponsored by Michigan Warehouse Records, Maximum Headroom, In Flight, Capital Times, Harvest Productions and Music Manor. It's available at Off the Record, Repeat the Beat and Play It Again, all located in Royal Oak, and Ann Arbor's Warehouse Records, Schoolkids Records and Discount Records.

Acoustic Highway — Craig Chaquico



Life after glory can be tough in the darkness for many performers, but Jefferson Starship's former lead guitarist Craig Chaquico proves that he possibly wasted his time in the spotlight. With his first solo instrumental debut "Acoustic Highway," Chaquico shows he is more musically diverse than one might have guessed.

Released on the Higher Octave Music label, which is known for its independently distributed New Age material, "Acoustic Highway," with its free-spirited, orchestrated acoustic guitar-based material is much more mature than its style's stigma.

The nine-track release with its mix of electric guitar, bass and keyboards, swings from romantic melodies to easy flowing pieces.

Even with a solid sound, Chaquico is able to poke fun at his musical counterparts by constructing introductions resembling other's work such as "In Your Eyes," from Peter Gabriel, "Stairway to Heaven," by Led Zeppelin, and Peter, Paul and Mary's "Leaving on a Jet Plane," while creatively pulling the song's energy into an entirely new structure.

"Acoustic Highway" maybe composed by a famous rock star and is produced by a label which specializes in New Age works, but this release strives a clearer plateau than it maybe allowed.

"Pop Smear" — The Verve Pipe



"Pop Smear," the Verve Pipe's second album, begins with a chaotic clashing of cymbals, guitars, drums and violins but swoops into the year's best release by an unsigned Michigan band.

The 12-song album concentrates on the band's acoustic side but is not without rock. The hook-laden "Wanna Be" questions rock stars' intentions ("Tell us of your abuse, we stand so amused and what you said about the audience, simple lyrics will do 'cause they don't have a clue.")

The rappy "Senator Speak" lashes out at politicians' double speak by blending an endless stream of tongue-in-cheek lyrics with their trademark harmonies ("Row, row, row your boat is sinking, the cold war of the world beat around the Bush campaign in the ask yourself absorbing (junior) the economy.")

Listening to "Pop Smear" in pieces will make it seem almost unfocused. The first song "Pretty For You" begins with the aforementioned clattering, blends in acoustic rock and ends with an almost loungey jazz fade. It continues by jumping from ballads to rock songs.

The lullaby-like "Sleepy Town" is an interesting diversion on the record. If there are any leaks on this pipe, it's the horn lines throughout the release that could be toned down a bit but the cello, viola and violins add a new dimension to The Verve Pipe. The broken down harmonies in

Fans: Groove is in the Spoon

■ With its debut release "Psychic Gyration" Groove Spoon hopes to make a few waves of its own. The nine-member band boasts two horn players, a percussionist and two female back-up singers making them one of the area's biggest draws.

Those planning to go to Groove Spoon's show at Lili's on Friday should dress light. The pride of East Lansing is known for its hot shows — literally.

"We play better when it's extremely hot — temperature wise — and it's all sweaty," said singer Riley Padgett. "At the Small Planet (in East Lansing) I sneak over to the thermostat and turn it up to 72, 75."

Things have heated up for Groove Spoon now that they've released their debut CD "Psychic Gyration." For example, as a testament to their funk roots, Groove Spoon is tentatively slated to open for former Parliament-Funkadelic bassist and songwriter Bootsy Collins next month in Chicago. They were also nominated for numerous Detroit Music Awards this year and featured on the independent compilation "So This Is East Lansing!"

The release of "Psychic Gyration" was held up for months as the band negotiated with a well-known funk record label. On the advice of their lawyers, the frustrated Groove Spoon decided to release the 22-song CD on its own.

"We hired lawyers, these big entertainment lawyers, and . . . there were four major problems (with the contract); (The record company) deceived us on a few things," said bassist/guitarist Eric Signs.

"In a one-hour meeting, he crushed all our little dreams," Padgett added.

Not all of them, however. The band is actively promoting the CD by assigning a different job to each member. Some club owners say the band doesn't need to do that much work.

Part of the attraction is the band's nine-member roster including two female singers (one singer is Cathy McDermott of Troy), two horn players and an additional percussionist. They're an eye-ful to watch on stage with McDermott and Delaney Hogan swaying back and

forth and brightly clad horn players Norm Vanaman and Chuck Rourke running around with Signs following them.

Guitarist Mike Pale runs circles around his bandmates while Mark Jagmin and Allen Quail bang on the

skins. Padgett taps his foot, sometimes straps on a bass, and sings — emanating a quiet kind of cool.

Groove Spoon's groovy sound — and look — is addictive, accomplishing Signs' original vision.

"The bands I was seeing at the time, like Joe Cocker, had horn sections, girl back-up singers. I thought, 'Why can't we do that?' We did it and all these bands started adding horn sections," Signs said modestly.

The band completes its whole "experience" by arriving for shows in a yellow school bus designed like a tour bus inside. Wooden bunks separated by curtains and cushioned benches line the inside of the bus. They'll soon debut their new bus — a purple one with Groove Spoon painted on the side of it.

Since its inception, the band has

become almost as well known for its clothes as it is for its music. Groove Spoon's closet is filled with '70s-type garb such as pants modeled after the American flag, fur vests and yellow suits. Within the last year, they've hired their own clothing designer, Alexandria Sandow.

Sometimes deciding the evening's wardrobe turns into an inter-band battle.

"We sometimes compete to see who can look the wackiest," Padgett said.

Some would argue that it's Groove Spoon's fans who are the wackiest. They show up at gigs, waving white plastic spoons at Padgett as a sign of their loyalty.

"It's definitely cool. In every town, there's a handful of people like that," Padgett said.

Signs added that he's surprised at how successful his band has been.

"We've got this little small thing starting to evolve; I'm surprised we're going over," he said. "A few years ago in Michigan alone, an original band wouldn't go over. The original music scene is really picked up and people are giving us a favorable response. If you're a cover band, the respect is less than if

you're an original band." Groove Spoon learned first hand of its popularity when it shaved its name down to Spoon earlier this year. Six months later they were forced to change it back "because of the hostility from our following," Padgett said.

The band switched its name because of the number of bands adopting the "groovy" frame of mind. "One of our reasons is that there were so many bands with the name Groove."

Ironically, another of the reasons why they switched back to Groove Spoon was because there was a band named Spoon in California.

Steve Nardella: Still singing the blues

When Steve Nardella and the Silvertones were signed by Blind Pig Records, then of Ann Arbor, in 1977, the phrase "roots rock" had yet to be coined. With the release of his brand spakin' new "Daddy Rollin' Stone," and guitarist George Bedard's "Upside!" both on Ann Arbor's Schoolkids label, the former co-leaders of that locally legendary band have come full circle. For Nardella, the player pegged most likely to succeed these past two decades, it signals a sometimes old story that still rings true.

"I'm trying to get by," he said recently by phone from his Ypsilanti home. "I hang in there. I keep doing it."

Sometimes you can just feel the sigh in a person's voice, feel the weariness. Certainly, Steve Nardella has the sort of musical track record that any sane musician would be proud of. It's just that he knows how good he is,

and you know that he feels he's still working his tail off for far too little recognition, even locally. He's just off his first foreign tour, opening throughout Scandinavia for Eddie Burns, and there's the superb new disc (his first since 1979's "It's All Rock & Roll," also on Blind Pig, the label that grew out of the popular Ann Arbor pub) to consider. The label has since moved to San Francisco and became one of the most respected in the blues world. Steve Nardella clearly should have made the transition to the big leagues along with them. He's been doing this roots thing out there and better than most.

A triple threat vocalist/guitarist/harmonica player, he's gotten even more impressive since 1978. Back then, it was his considerable harmonica skills (check out his "Detroit Shuffle" of his version of Eddie Boyd's "Reap What You Sow" off the

Rudolph's 'Equinox': Small jackpot

"Equinox" sees the world as a dangerous place. Indigents are everywhere, many of them violent, while women in mink coats stroll by as if protected by invisible armor. Advertising for the lottery, displayed on billboards and reflected in car windows, promises quick money and the easy life.

It's into the unnamed city that two men, identical twins separated at birth (both played by Matthew Modine), lead startlingly different lives. Freddy, ruthless and cocksure, serves as hit-man and driver for a gangster named Paris (Fred Ward). The mousy Henry works in his foster father's garage.

The basic premise predates Shakespeare, but through the lens of director Alan Rudolph, it all seems somehow new again.

Rudolph, who apprenticed with Robert Altman in the 1970s, seems to have a double life of his own. He nimbly jumps between standard Hollywood assignments

("Mortal Thoughts" was the best) to edgy, adventurous movies that fall firmly in the category of "art film."

His "Choose Me" and "Trouble in Mind" were tongue-and-cheek mixes of hard-boiled characters and a retro urban environment. His "The Moderns" was the most colorful depiction yet of the turn-of-the-century Parisian salon and art scene.

"Equinox," while it compares impressively, will turn off as many viewers as it excites. The intentionally confusing story can seem painfully stylized, yet there are some genuine emotions at work and some knockout visuals.

If nothing else, Rudolph extracts a competent performance from Matthew Modine, an actor who has always seemed to me the Hollywood equivalent of 2 percent milk.

The rest of the cast recalls the

glory days of Hollywood character acting. M. Emmet Walsh is all over the place as Henry's foster father, a garage owner and ex-vaudevillean destined to pass down to Henry a headful of corny jokes.

Since "Equinox" was finished almost two years ago, we see Marisa Tomei before she copped the Academy Award, making a real person out of the cliched role of the prostitute who lives across the hall from Henry. Fred Ward, meanwhile, gets obvious pleasure from playing a gangster who Freddy regularly compares to Hitler.

Lara Flynn Boyle plays the mysterious bob-haired beauty who has a rocky relationship with the similarly uptight Henry. She wanders around her apartment, reading Emily Dickinson and referring to herself in the third person. She waits patiently by the phone for Henry to call.

Add to all this another plot point: a medical examiner (Tyra Ferrell) starts to piece together clues about an inheritance that will reunite the brothers and

make her wealthy. She's probably the most appealing in a string of desperate characters, all looking for their own versions of the Lotto jackpot.

When you're not trying to keep up with the characters and plot twists, sit back and soak in the visuals. There's plenty of shadowy cinematography and a breathtaking final shot.

Without giving away too much of the ending, the camera, apparently mounted on a helicopter, careers around the Grand Canyon in a long shot that may last a good couple of minutes. You may still be in the air after leaving the theater, but the shaggy dog story in "Equinox" proves uniquely entertaining and absorbing.

'Hear My Song' serves up Irish charm

The manager of a failing London nightclub sets out to find a legendary Irish tenor and ends finding out a lot about himself in the charming 1991 comedy "Hear My Song."

Club owner Micky O'Neill, played by Adrian Dunbar, is a flexible kind of guy when it comes to making a living. When his singer comes down with laryngitis, Micky steps in and gamely warbles a tune dedicated to his girlfriend.

Micky is also the kind of guy who will book a singer named Frank Cinatra to headline his club. "They fall for it down south," one of his booking agents assures him.

Booking homonymic named singers can only take you so far before Micky finds himself having run afoul of the night club owners. The 10 imposing women of the Ryan family aren't ones to be trifled with and want Micky out

of their establishment since they haven't been paid their rent or commission.

Instead Micky comes up with a booking guaranteed to melt the hearts of any good Irish man or woman — Irish tenor Josef Locke

"When he sings women weep," is the standard comment when Locke's name is mentioned. The only problem is that Locke is a tax exile and wanted man who hasn't been seen in England for 25 years. Always quick on his feet, Micky says they will naturally advertise an appearance by "Mr. X" but everyone will know it's really Locke.

For a while, Micky is cruising along quite nicely. His girlfriend is happy, her mother — Jo's former girlfriend — is happy. Even the Ryans are happy. Then everything hits the fan because Mr. X isn't Jo Locke after all.

So without a job or girlfriend and with a shiner, Micky decides the only thing he can do to redeem himself is to find the real Locke and get him to find in London.

Finding Locke, played with charm and a dash of menace by Ned Beatty, living incognito in Ireland turns out to be easier than convincing him that Micky isn't working for the police. When he hits the bottom figuratively and nearly literally, Micky figures out what is really important in his life.

The performances are all terrific with lots of fun bits from char-

acters like the two portly good-natured booking agents who break into a dance while hanging posters or the formidable Ryans.

An added bonus is the fine Irish tenor of Vernon Midgley who dubs Beatty's singing voice. The film is based on a true story and Locke, still in exile, lives in County Kildare.

the chorus of "Wanna Be" also seem somewhat showy.

But actually it's the little things in this album that make it ingenious. The driving guitar in sync with the line, "We all love a millionaire on the radio, with a great video and all the orchestration backing up your screaming guitar" in the song "Wanna Be," the clicking cameras in time with Donnie Brown's drum beats in "Senator Speak," and the delicate viola, violin and cello throughout the album.

Singer Brian Vander Ark's voice has matured significantly since The Verve Pipe's critically acclaimed debut "I've Suffered a Head Injury." He handles upbeat songs with his almost growling vocals but has the ability to tone his voice down perfectly for the sweet ballads ("What You Wanted" and "Out Like a Lamb").

On "Pop Smear" The Verve Pipe continues its ability to write vivid, image-provoking lyrics. "Bullies on Vacation," penned by the Vander Ark brothers, depicts what would happen if someone sought revenge on the neighborhood bully.

Brian Vander Ark's "What You Wanted" takes an honest look at feelings after a breakup and in "Out Like a Lamb," Ark describes the uneasiness in relationships.

It's tough to say which are the best songs on "Pop Smear." Each one is memorable for different reasons. That's one of the things that makes The Verve Pipe a truly incomparable band. They'll celebrate the release of "Pop Smear" with a record release party Thursday, Dec. 9, at the State Theater in Kalamazoo.

POINTS OF VIEW

Differing styles of learning, teaching successful

QUESTION: We recently came from out of state to live in Michigan. In our former school district, they used what is called the developmental approach in the elementary schools. In some classes, they used learning centers. Our two elementary children did quite well; however, now we hear concerns from some of our neighbors. Who do you believe?

ANSWER: After talking with you, it was evident that your two children were nurtured in a home in which you read to them from day one and where you exposed them to all types of learning experiences. In your situation, your children would learn from almost any educational, philosophical approach. Not all children come from your nurturing type of background, and therefore their education needs to be considered in that light.

We certainly don't want the "drill and kill," 100 percent ditto-workbook mentality in elementary, especially in lower grades. But some structure, taking into consideration children are indeed all different, must be addressed, especially for children with poor basic skills.

First, the developmental approach tends to get an unjustified bad rap. It is not new, nor different than what most elementary teachers have been

using for eons. It uses teaching methods that should assimilate to the age and experience of the child. Early childhood experts believe children ages 4-6 learn better through interactive experiences (possibly learning centers) rather than in an environment where the i.e., kindergarten child sits passively and the teacher dumps facts and figures into their little heads.

Learning activity

Take, for example, a science learning center in a kindergarten or 1st grade. It is November . . . Thanksgiving time . . . pumpkin time. The kindergarten or first grade children bring pumpkins to school. They measure the circumference of their pumpkins and note it. They weigh the different pumpkins and compare figures, noting the differences between smaller and larger pumpkins. They read about how pumpkins grow, draw a pumpkin patch, tell a story of their pumpkin.

This is an excellent learning activity, grasped at a timely (Thanksgiving) period; a learning experience that will transfer into their own bank of knowledge. However, there are other teaching environments that can also generate learning. Let's face it, some teachers handle learning centers masterfully; some teachers do not function as well

in learning center environments.

The problem with learning centers, as in any educational modality, is whether the concept is implemented properly. And, theory regarding the implementation of learning centers does vary.

Let's say an early elementary classroom has five Learning Centers: math, science, reading, art and writing. Let's say little 6-year-old Mary Jones selects the art center five days a week. She loves to draw, and may be a fine art student some day. But she avoids the math, science and reading centers. According to some learning center theorists, Mary will eventually move into the science and math centers when she is interested and ready for the science and math center.

As an assistant superintendent for

instruction, it was my principal's responsibility to see that little Mary Jones gets her math and reading and science in balance with her love for art. A 5- or 6-year-old child is in school to learn more than art skills. It is not a democratic vote on what little Mary likes.

All this withstanding, learning centers, structured and administered by the teacher appropriately, can be an excellent learning experience for children.

Structured format

Conversely, I've known many early elementary teachers who lean more toward whole group and small group instruction who did an excellent job. They operate better from a structured format. Indeed, in districts that mandate learning centers, they will play along but once their door is shut and central office is out of the building, they go right back to what they believe is their strength . . . a more structured approach. And frankly, their children learn as well as any other children in the building.

Learning centers are fine for early elementary. But in upper elementary (at the fifth grade), where the teacher is under "pressure" to prepare the children for the middle school curriculum, with its six classes a day and its struc-

tured environment, that teacher is under the gun to get those little kids ready.

Educational leaders are always saying, "Each child is different and this fact has to be taken into consideration when working with the children. Some are auditory learners; some visual learners, etc."

So why don't we realize that teachers are different? And contrary to the theorists, there is no concrete evidence that students in a learning center or in a more structured environment learn more in either system.

When a manager of a professional baseball team starts spring practice, he reviews his pitching staff. One pitcher throws "smoke" fastballs and is successful; another throws curves and is successful. Should the manager try to make a fast-ball pitcher out of curve-ball pitcher, it won't work! Same with teachers. They should teach from their base of strength . . . as long as they are getting the job done.

I have to confess to retaining enough sexism, not being evolved as some put it, to feel more than a little bit of embarrassment when a woman knows the woods better than I. And when she can also have dinner ready on time, it's a double humiliation.

When alone in the woods, especially as dark approaches, I feel a great dread coming over me. I envision walking in circles all night and freezing to death 20 feet from my minivan.

The scene wouldn't be material for a Chrysler commercial, but it would make a great opening passage for a book on feminism: The she-wolf deer hunter steps over the body of the chub-

by, balding 45-year-old male as she drags her deer to the car.

However, later reality set in. After dinner at the guide's house, both the guide and his teammate wife confessed to being frightened to go into the woods alone after reading "Crooked Tree," a terror in the timbers novel by Redford Township writer Robert C. Wilson.

"I kept hearing things behind me in the woods," said the guide, who then faithfully went on to describe scene after scene from the book.

Wilson has not only managed to frighten a guide in his own backyard, but the author also managed to describe a newspaper office in which I worked in Bay City. I was lucky enough to meet Wilson in a Livonia book store

earlier this year and was able to ask if he had been inside the paper. No, he hadn't, but he had driven by.

Wilson has a new book out, "Second Fire," which I'm now glad I didn't have time to read before deer season. I think I'll save it for January when the only thing I hunt or fish for is Wild Turkey, the bottled kind.

Lawmakers OK bill to repeal ban on fortune-telling, tipsters

Michigan lawmakers are moving toward repealing a ban on fortune-telling — a ban that also applies to stock market tipsters and weather forecasters, according to Rep. Dick Allen, R-Caro.

The House Tuesday approved the bill 78 to 24 and sent it to the Senate.

"This bill is good evidence Michigan needs a part-time Leg-

islature," scoffed Rep. Deborah Whyman, R-Canton, the only Observer & Eccentric area lawmaker opposed. "I thought members were busy working on school finance and reform. Apparently some members aren't busy enough."

Added Rep. Harold Voorhees, R-Wyoming: "The law restricting fortune telling and psychics was

enacted for the protection of the people of Michigan from unscrupulous people who would take advantage of those seeking advice. Michigan's law has never been deemed unconstitutional by the state's standards or federal standards."

School deadline looms

Legislators face marathon sessions

State representatives this week face marathon sessions as they try to pass school quality and tax reform laws before the holidays.

"Be prepared to go all day and all night Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday," Democratic floor leader Pat Gagliardi warned them Thursday after the session disintegrated over the question of schools of choice.

"We were told to wear comfortable clothing," Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Redford, revealed afterwards.

Key battle this week will be over an amendment to the school code involving cross-district school choice, much desired by Gov. John Engler and most Republicans. It begins:

"The board of a school district shall not interfere with the ability of a school-age child residing within its territory to attend school outside the school district's boundaries or attend a public school academy or to change his or her school of enrollment during the course of the school year."

Republicans were a few votes shy of the 56 needed for passage.

Portfolio OK'd

The main measure, House Bill 5121, is aimed at improving school quality. It would set up a system of state-endorsed diplomas, school accreditation and

fast-track teacher certification. It also could provide for lengthening the school year from 180 days, where it has been for two generations, to 210 days by the year 2010. Virtually every detail was being debated.

Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City, won approval of his amendment requiring school districts to maintain a portfolio on each student. The portfolio would contain standard academic transcripts, career preparation, job experience, and recognition of non-academic competencies.

The House rejected an amendment to require high school graduates to show 12th grade proficiency in math and science in order to obtain a state-endorsed diploma. Sponsor David Jaye, R-Utica, said it would amount to truth-in-diploma-granting.

Opponents said some required courses like geometry and biology are completed by the 10th grade. "This amendment would not be fair," said Rep. Richard Young, D-Dearborn Heights, "unless we give a four-year notice to students beginning with freshmen in September of 1994."

The Jaye amendment went down 31 to 71. Area supporters included Republicans Greg Kaza of

Rochester Hills, Jerry Vorva of Plymouth and Deborah Whyman of Canton.

Lobbying stays

Vorva's pet amendment — forbidding school districts to lobby — went down 12 to 86. "But did you notice how many of them gave 'no' vote explanations?" Vorva said. The state constitution allows legislators voting against any measure to have an explanation published in the permanent journal. Examples:

Penny Crissman, R-Rochester: "This amendment would adversely affect the democratic process of communication with my district, and it would give organizations such as the Michigan Education Association greater ability to influence government."

Whyman: "This definition is entirely too vague. Does this mean my superintendent cannot call and lobby me during work hours? He is paid with taxpayer dollars. If this were adopted, the only major lobby group would be the MEA."

John Jamian, R-Bloomfield Township: "It would disallow the

Oakland Intermediate School District government affairs person from representing the entire Oakland County school system and their issues. It would force our superintendents to travel to Lansing everytime a school issue comes up, taking them away from time on the job of managing the school district."

Tom Middleton, R-Ortonville: "It is overly broad. It threatens even the ability of superintendents and school board members to use long-distance phone calls to contact their representatives in the Legislature."

Rep. Ilona Varga, D-River Rouge, had no trouble, however, with her amendment allowing students who come to school with a knowledge of a foreign language to obtain credit by passing a test without taking the course. "This will allow students who are bilingual and proficient in a foreign language such as Spanish, German, Polish, Italian, Arabic, Japanese or others to earn high school credit for their proficiency," she said.

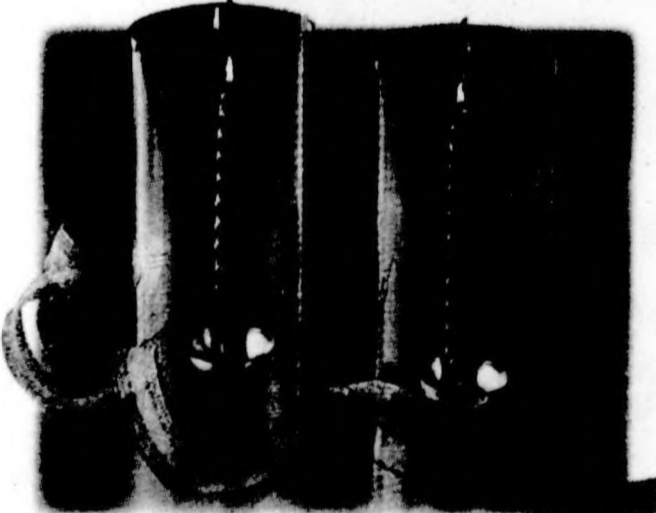

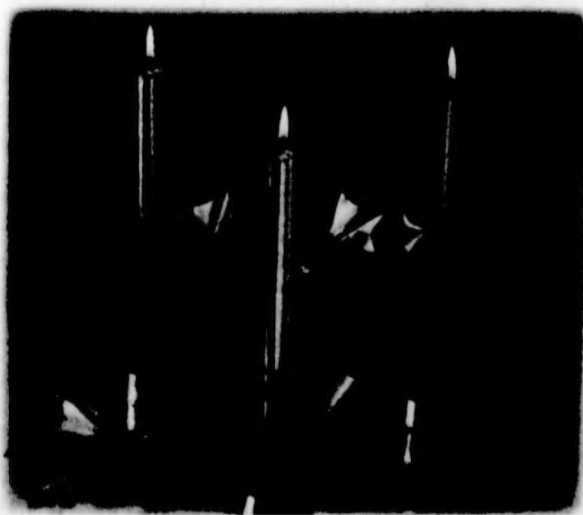

Easy gourmet goodies make merry holiday gifts

It's amazing how many enjoyable things there are to do year-round in anticipation of the holidays. You can dry spring and summer flowers and herbs for holiday bouquets, and search garage sales and flea markets for vintage toys and gifts.

There are all sorts of recipes for gift giving any time of the year. Unfortunately, the Janes Gang does not have time, energy or financial resources to be as imaginative as Martha Stewart during the busiest time of the year.

Not that there's anything wrong with Martha Stewart. But I can assure you that Martha has never stood in line at Meijer's with two cranky kids, a full grocery cart and realized, all of a sudden, that the checkbook was in the glove compartment of the 1985 Toyota parked in the parking lot.

Some families are full of crafty relatives who crochet tissue box covers, afghans and slippers. The craftiest anyone in our family ever got was a few years back when Aunt Vickie gave us all a jar of her "holiday jam." Upon serving it Christmas morning, everyone noticed a remarkable resemblance to a Smucker's jar with the label soaked off.

Knowing that Aunt Vickie had recently returned from a senior citizen's trip to Atlantic City, I was pleased just to be remembered.

If your house is as frazzled as our house is, you will certainly appreciate these hints for surviving the holidays. It's way too late to take advantage of catalogs this year, but if you ask your co-workers, neighbors and relatives about the catalogs they receive, you can get the addresses and get on mailing lists for next year.

Everything from Asian avocados to holiday zucchini bread is available in one form or another from a catalog.

Food gifts

Personal favorites are the "Mo Hotta The Betta" (for great condiments) and of course, Williams Sonoma for those who like to dream of a Martha Stewart-type kitchen.

For last-minute shopping, holiday favorites are Raphael Spice and J.R. Hirt's at the Eastern Market in Detroit. If you've never been there, you gotta go. It is a trip in olfactory sensualism.

Buy a couple of pint jars and a gallon of plain vinegar from Raphael's and stick in some fresh garlic cloves or a sprig of dried herbs, and you have a gourmet gift Julia Child would appreciate.

Hirt's has baskets that you can fill with mustards, oils, vinegars, coffees, candies, cheeses, meats, specialty foods and gadgets. Check out Hirt's third floor for baskets and gift items. Service is always with a smile, and they are both open Monday through Saturday, but if you enjoy the hustle and bustle, Saturday mornings are an adventure in people watching.

Not trying to steal the thunder from dearly departed Aunt Vickie, but if you have a favorite recipe for pumpkin bread, nut bread, fruitcake or whatever, you can bake a batch in sterilized Mason jars for an easy gourmet gift or take-along.

Nut breads

If you use the one-pint Mason jars, simply wash, dry and then fill them with one level cup of batter and place them in the center of a preheated oven and bake for 35-40 minutes, depending on your recipe. About 10 minutes before the cakes are done, bring a saucpan of water to a boil and put in the jar lids.

Cover and remove from heat and keep in hot water until ready to use. When cakes are done, remove jars from the oven and, if the rims need cleaning, use a clean moist paper towel. Carefully put lids and rings in place, then screw the tops shut.

Place jars on a wire rack and they will seal as they cool. You can figure on 5-7 jars per basic recipe. If Aunt Vickie were here, she'd probably use a box mix.

For those whose talents lie outside the kitchen, there are hundreds of recipes that need no cooking whatsoever. Bourbon Balls are a personal favorite and can be made weeks in advance. They get better with age, as long as they're stored in an airtight container.

If you can melt a chocolate bar, you can dip in apple slices, cookies, pineapple chunks, Rice Krispy treats and anything else sweet and luscious. Dipping spoons are available at Kitchen Glamour and other baking supply stores, but you can use your fingers and simply allow the chocolate to drip from a wire rack until firm. No fair licking in between dippings.

CHEF MAKES COOKING A FAMILY EVENT

Who knows! If George Dragisity's father hadn't been responsible for the cooking operations at a U.S. Army officer's club in Germany, maybe George wouldn't be an executive chef today. And, maybe if he didn't help his father in the club's kitchen on weekends while he was a teenager, he wouldn't be Group Director of Deli/Seafood Operations, Michigan Group (Farmer Jack and A&P Divisions) Great Atlantic and Pacific Tea Company.

"Soon after I started helping out at the officer's club, I discovered that I

not only liked preparing food, but I was good at it!" said the Beverly Hills resident.

When the Dragisity family returned to the states and settled in Detroit, George began his successful climb in the food preparation business, starting as an apprentice chef at the Golden Mushroom in Southfield, and at the Ponchatrain Hotel in downtown Detroit.

In 1974, Dragisity graduated from the prestigious Culinary Institute of America in Hyde Park, New York. For the next decade he assumed a number of sous chef and chef positions at restaurants in metro Detroit area, and at restaurants in other parts of the country.

"I had the opportunity to work with and learn from good people, and at the best places in town," Dragisity said. "Although I felt extremely lucky, preparing food was not enough for me. I wanted to continue my education, and at the same time, share my enjoyment of food with others."

Dragisity was able to accomplish both of these goals. He earned a bachelor of science degree in hospitality management at Florida International University in Miami, and was a food and beverage management instructor in the University of Houston's Conrad

N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management program. While in Texas, he earned a master's degree in business management from the University of St. Thomas.

Although his current administrative tasks took him from the kitchen to the front office, Dragisity continued his chef studies, and earned his Certified Executive Chef rating from the American Culinary Federation in 1991, became a Certified Culinary Educator.

"Although my first love is cooking, I enjoy being in charge of a major food operation because it gives me the opportunity to be involved in all aspects of food preparation and distribution. In this position I know firsthand what the general public wants and needs and what lifestyle changes are popular."

"Consumers are more health conscious and, although deli is still popular, our customers are demanding more low-fat products," he said.

Dragisity and his wife, Michelle have three children. He is also health conscious when it concerns his family. He is teaching his children to cook well-balanced meals.

"We consider cooking a family event, and we try to make a meal together at least twice a week," he said. "We try different things so that the

kids can acquire a good palate. And we make healthy things that taste good."

He added that his family rarely gets sick and believes that this is due to the healthy foods they make in the home. "We make lots of our own soup, from scratch. I stay away from canned goods."

Here are some of his tips for healthy family cooking:

- We eat all kinds of meat, but I always look for the lean pieces whether it's pork or beef - the medallion pieces that don't contain a high amount of fat. We also eat a lot of seafood.
- How you prepare your food is almost as important as what the food is if you want to serve healthy meals. That is why I grill the meat most of the time.
- We cook with lots fresh vegetables. They're not only good, but preparing vegetables is a good task for the children.

Dragisity said his "Chef's Secret" is he looks for uncomplicated recipes, and plans ahead. "I get out everything I need, which usually isn't a lot," he said. "Some people think you need a lot of gadgets to be a good cook. That's not true. All you usually need is a good, sharp knife, a cutting board, and good pots and pans."

Simplify party plans to be with guests

"Holiday parties should not add stress to an already busy lifestyle," said hair stylist Gordon Doyon, who takes great pride in his profession and simplified party preparations.

Doyon is partners with his brother Gene in Doyon Brothers Styling in Birmingham.

"I enjoy hair styling because it makes people look good," he said. "When people look good, they feel good. A hair style needs to match the lifestyle and personality of the individual."

"I believe it's the same with entertaining. Busy professionals want and perhaps need to entertain, but business demands require simplification of party plans. The whole point of a party is getting together with people you enjoy. It's not pleasurable if a person spends six hours preparing and only two hours with friends. The timeline should be reversed."

Doyon cooked at home when he was growing up. His mom was a basic cook who served balanced meals to her large family. "When mom made goulash, it was basic," he said. "She'd ask me to get it ready when I got home from school. That's when I'd go to work in the spice cabinet and start doctoring her recipe." At age 16, Doyon gave his first sit-down dinner for 28 guests.

From opening punch preparations through finger foods, salads and cold platters, Doyon keeps it simple and offers the following suggestions:

"I prepare all the ingredients in advance and

store them in resealable bags to maintain freshness. I do this whether I'm entertaining at home or I'm taking a dish to someone's house. Even if the host doesn't ask friends to bring a dish.

"I usually feel more comfortable when I take one. I inquire if a buffet table is planned and prepare a simple Tex Mex or something like kosher salami with apricot sauce."

Doyon takes the salami with apricot sauce from the oven just before leaving for a party and says it stays sufficiently warm en route.

Doyon also makes use of prepared foods rather than making everything from scratch. "Cherry tomatoes stuffed with tabouli are festive for the Christmas holidays and appeal to vegetarians." He buys the tabouli from Anita's Kitchen in Troy.

"I use the resealable bags again if I'm serving a cheese spread. If you fill the bag with the spread, then cut off a corner at serving time, the plastic bag doubles as a pastry bag for easy piping of the spread."

While Doyon epitomizes a busy professional who cooks, we consulted two professionals who party plan for a living. Barbara Obert and Marlene Szczodrowski are partners in The Icing And Batter Shoppe, Catering Too! in Redford.

Although their specialty is wedding cakes, they cater a long list of appetizers, complete lunches and dinners. "We try to keep food preparations simple," Obert said.

"We frequently prep from scratch on site at a client's home, so simplicity is essential. Caterers focus on design and presentation. The home cook often forgets this."

- 1 8-ounce package cream cheese softened

- 1 10-ounce can crushed pineapple, squeezed as dry as possible
- 2 tablespoons diced green pepper
- 2 tablespoons diced onion
- 2 tablespoons pimento
- 1 ½ teaspoons Lawry's seasoned salt

Mix all ingredients together and spread on crackers.

THAIZERS

- 1 bunch leaf lettuce

- ½ cup powdered sugar

Sift together the cocoa and 1 cup of powdered sugar. Set aside. In a small bowl, combine bourbon with corn syrup and mix well. Stir into cocoa and sugar mixture. Add vanilla wafers and pecans and mix until thoroughly blended.

Roll mixture into small balls and roll in ½ cup powdered sugar. Makes about ½ pound. Keep tightly sealed for best results.

HOLIDAY TREE ORNAMENTS

- 1 ¾ cups boiling water
- 1 cup salt

- 4 cups all purpose flour
- Egg Wash: 1 egg beaten with 3 tablespoons cold water

Pour the hot water into a large bowl with the salt and stir for 1 minute. The salt will reduce in size, but not really dissolve. Add the flour and blend until all the water is absorbed.

Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface and knead for a few moments until dough is smooth and pliable.

Cover the dough and allow to rest for 5 minutes. Roll the dough out to ¼-inch thick on a floured surface and cut out the shapes with cookie cutters. Don't forget to punch a hole at the top for a string to hang.

Place the cookies on a non-stick baking sheet and brush lightly with the egg wash. Bake in a preheated 300 degree oven for 1 hour and 15 minutes or until golden brown. Allow to cool completely before stringing.

Cook safely in your microwave

"The microwave oven has become a common household item which can be a real boon for saving time," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service. "There are some very simple yet effective tips to help you cook safely with your microwave."

The main concern is ensuring that food is completely cooked, yet not so hot that it may burn a baby's mouth. Cold spots can occur because of the irregular way the microwaves enter the oven and are absorbed by various foods.

"Learning placement and special microwave techniques is a

good idea," adds Treitman, who suggests either buying a microwave book or taking a class.

Some tips to help with safe microwave cooking:

- Arrange food items uniformly.
- Turn food several times — or stir or rotate dish during cooking.
- Observe standing time when called for.
- Use utensils made for the microwave.
- Avoid use of cold storage containers, like margarine tubs they can melt.
- Never use brown bags or newspapers which can catch on fire.
- Heat leftovers to at least 165 degrees.

LOUISIANA CRAB CAKES

Crab meat stuffing:
 1/2 cup butter
 3/4 cup onion, chopped very fine
 1/2 cup carrots, chopped very fine
 1/2 cup celery, chopped very fine
 2 1/2 cups backfin crab meat
 1 cup heavy cream (whipping cream)
 1 jar (4 ounce) pimentos, chopped

1/2 teaspoon powdered Cajun seasoning
 Salt to taste
 1 1/2 cups bread crumbs

Heat butter in large, heavy frying pan. Add finely chopped onions, carrots and celery and cook until vegetables are tender, about 10-12 minutes over medium heat. Stir in crab meat, mix well and remove from heat.

Stir in cream and pimentos, stir to incorporate. Season with a bit of salt and Cajun seasoning. Stir in bread crumbs and mix well. Cover and refrigerate overnight to blend flavors.

To cook: Shape crab cake mixture into eight circular cakes. Heat 3 tablespoons of oil in a large, heavy skillet and saute 4 crab cakes at a time over medium heat for 3-4 minutes. Flip and continue cooking for 4-5 minutes or until golden brown.

Repeat with remaining crab cakes. Serve each crab cake with lemon slices and garnished with fresh parsley sprigs.

Serves 4 (2 crab cakes each) for an entree or 8 individual crab cake appetizers.

Chef's note: Crab cakes are especially good when served with rice pilaf and coleslaw.

MISSISSIPPI MUO PIE

1 1/4 cups graham cracker crumbs
 1/4 cup, plus two tablespoons butter, melted
 1 package semi-sweet chocolate chips (about 14 ounces)
 1 egg
 3/4 cup heavy cream
 2 cups miniature marshmallows
 5 tablespoons Tia Maria liqueur (optional)
 1/2 cup whipping cream
 2 tablespoons sugar
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/4 cup coconut (toasted)

In a 9-inch deep dish pie plate, combine graham cracker crumbs and melted butter. Press mixture onto bottom and sides of pie plate and bake at 350 degrees for 5 minutes. Set aside.

Melt chocolate chips in the top of a double boiler over simmering water and stir until smooth. Set aside. In a heavy saucepan combine heavy cream and marshmallows and cook, stirring constantly over medium heat until marshmallows are melted. Remove from heat and whisk in melted chocolate chips.

In a small glass bowl, combine

egg with Tia Maria and beat for 10 seconds. Stir into the chocolate mixture, pour into the prepared pie shell and refrigerate overnight.

Just before serving, pour whipping cream into a chilled bowl and beat, sprinkling in sugar and vanilla to incorporate and whip until stiff peaks form. Using a pastry bag, pipe whipped cream mixture onto pie and sprinkle with toasted coconut. Serve immediately. Makes one 9-inch pie.

Chef's note: To toast coconut, sprinkle coconut on cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes, stirring once.

Tips for storing, defrosting and cooking meat

AP — Pick up meats and other perishables last at the supermarket.

At home, immediately store meats in the coldest part of the refrigerator (36 to 40 degrees F). Use steaks, chops, roasts and deli

meats within three to four days. Use ground meats within one to two days. Meats that are wrapped in plastic film can be stored in the home refrigerator if they are used within the recommended time.

Place meats in separate plastic bags for refrigerator storage so raw juices do not drip onto other foods.

Arrange food on refrigerator shelves and in the freezer so air can circulate freely and maintain proper temperature. Overcrowding can cause the temperature to rise.

To defrost meat safely, take it out of the freezer and place in a cold (36 to 40 degrees F) refrigerator. Place in a plastic bag or utility dish to prevent juices from dripping onto other foods. De-

frosting time for a large roast is 4 to 7 hours per pound; for a small roast, 3 to 5 hours per pound; for a 1-inch thick steak or chop, 12 to 14 hours. Never defrost frozen meat on the kitchen counter.

Keep a refrigerator-freezer thermometer in the refrigerator and freezer to monitor temperature. Refrigerators should maintain a temperature of 40 degrees or below; freezers should be at 0 degrees or below.

Keep everything that touches food clean including hands, utensils, bowls and countertops. Wash hands with warm soapy water prior to preparing any food, and after handling raw meats. Also, use separate platters and trays for cooked and uncooked meat.

Keep the interior of refrigera-

tors and freezers clean, too. Pack perishables in coolers when cleaning and defrosting.

Wash cutting boards in hot soapy water after each use. To sanitize cutting boards, use a solution of 2 to 3 teaspoons household bleach in 1 quart of hot water, followed by a plain hot water rinse; rinse thoroughly.

Ground meats must be cooked to at least medium doneness (160 degrees) with no pink remaining; juices should run clear. Cook roasts to 5 degrees below the following recommended internal temperatures for doneness of meats: medium rare (150 degrees), medium (160 degrees), well done (170 degrees). Roast temperatures rise about 5 degrees during standing time (allow 10 to 15 minutes).

Roasts should be at refrigerator temperature when they are put into the oven.

Use an oven thermometer to check cooking temperature. To cook food properly, an oven temperature of at least 300 to 325 degrees F is recommended. Do not eat raw meat. Use a meat thermometer to check the internal temperature of meat for doneness.

Avoid partial cooking, very low temperature roasting methods and long or overnight cooking of meat, all of which may encourage bacterial growth before cooking is complete. Do not use brown paper bags for roasting because they may not be sanitary and are not approved for use as a cooking material.

Chill leftovers quickly in the

refrigerator or freezer to reduce the possibility for bacterial growth that may cause illness.

Promptly store meats, sauces, gravies and other foods in several small, shallow, covered containers. Cut large roasts into slices or smaller pieces that will chill more quickly. Do not cool leftovers on the kitchen counter.

Cooked meats, well wrapped and tightly covered, can be kept three to four days in the refrigerator. For longer storage, meats should be frozen.

Thoroughly reheat leftovers; bring gravies and sauces to a boil before serving. Stir occasionally to make sure the heat is evenly distributed.

Fruity white Burgundy wines ideal for winter

Premium wine grape varieties have European origins. The ancestors of cabernet sauvignon and merlot came from France's Bordeaux region. Riesling finds its origins in Germany, while sangiovese hails from Italy's Chianti region.

Chardonnay, which has become the generic term for white wine in the United States, is the grape responsible for the great white wines of Burgundy. White Burgundy? An oxymoron you say, Burgundy is red! Yes, most Burgundy wine is red (over 80 percent) and made from pinot noir, but in Burgundy's Cote d'Or (golden slope) chardonnay is the grape that makes the most famous white wines in the world.

Although white Burgundy is made from chardonnay, very little of it has the grape name on the label. White Burgundy wines, like most of the wines of Europe, are named after the place where they

are grown. Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet and Chassagne-Montrachet are the places where chardonnay thrives in Burgundy.

With such small quantities of white Burgundy available worldwide, it is interesting that one man has specialized in making and selling only white Burgundy, France's chardonnay. Louis Trebuchet, a young Parisian businessman jealous of French country life, moved to Beaune (the center Burgundy), married the daughter of the auctioneer at the

Hospice de Beaune and got into the wine business.

When Burgundy producer Robert Drouhin bought the negotiant firm of Jaffelin, he hired Trebuchet to run it. After 10 years, Trebuchet was ready for a new adventure when he met grower-producer Jean Chartron. In 1984, Chartron was assuming the reins of his family's domaine in Puligny, and Trebuchet was looking to establish his own negociant business.

They decided to work together to sell the wines of Domaine Chartron and to begin a negociant business under the name Chartron & Trebuchet. Chartron brought 30 acres of prime vineyards and three generations of winemaking experience to the new venture. Trebuchet brought his business acumen and familiarity with the Burgundy growers.

A negociant buys grapes from growers to make his wine. Chartron & Trebuchet make their negociant wines exactly the same

Sparkling suggestions

Creative ways to use leftover roast pork

AP — If you've got leftover pork roast, the National Pork Producers Council has the following suggestions:

- Mince leftover roast pork. Mix with cooked leftover potatoes for a hearty breakfast hash.
- Dice chilled leftover roast pork loin or tenderloin. Toss into a main-dish salad with cooked green beans, cherry tomatoes, potatoes and chopped lettuce. Dress lightly with a lemon vinaigrette.
- Spread a flour tortilla with a little cream cheese and horseradish, top with thinly sliced leftover pork roast and alfalfa sprouts. Roll up for a sandwich.
- Prepare gravy from a packaged mix or use a purchased jar of meat gravy; mince leftover roast pork and add to gravy; top a baked potato with this mixture.
- Dice leftover pork roast, mix with some fruit yogurt and drained mandarin oranges; tuck into a pita pocket bread and top with chopped pecans.
- Cube leftover pork roast,

skewer on toothpicks and serve with honey-mustard or mustard-jam mixture for dipping.

■ Heat diced leftover pork roast with a jar of spaghetti sauce, stir in some chopped olives; use to top hot cooked noodles and serve with grated Parmesan or Romano cheese.

■ Slice leftover pork roast. Heat gently with your favorite barbecue sauce; serve on sandwich buns.

■ Coarsely chop leftover pork roast, mix with a little salad dressing or mayonnaise, pickle relish, chopped onion and mustard for a tasty sandwich spread.

■ Cube leftover pork roast, stir into curry sauce (packaged mix) and serve over rice with raisins and salted peanuts.

■ Slice leftover pork roast into spears, heat and serve with your favorite dipping sauces for a finger-licking good snack.

■ Cube leftover pork roast and simmer it with a can of meatless chili or stew for a hearty meal. Serve with cornbread.

Value strategy

Chris Morrisroe, spokeswoman for Hudson's, had the official word for the lower prices phenomenon "value strategy."

"At Hudson's, our buyers have been working hard to bring in the same quality as in year's past at lower prices," she said. "Value strategy is in place. We found manufacturers to make the quality merchandise we want under our Boundary Waters label. We've expanded our price points

so they begin at lower ranges. We've had more promotions this year than ever before. Shoppers still want the good stuff, and there are so many places to buy it from. Competition is tough."

Last month, the Taubman Shopping Centers conducted a survey of their national retailers who insisted prices are no higher, and in many cases lower, than 1992. Local Taubman malls include Fairlane, Lakeside, Briarwood and Twelve Oaks.

"This is a holiday where everyone comes out ahead," said Larry Hunt, vice-president, regional manager for Taubman. "Shoppers will enjoy good prices, merchants will see strong sales and the Detroit-area economy will get a welcome holiday gift. Retailers have been forced to re-evaluate everything about their businesses, from inventory mix to price points."

Crista Kuegl, vice president of Fredericks of Hollywood, with 205

stores across the country, said consumers will find some of the best pricing in years because retailers across the board have been absorbing manufacturer's increases and re-evaluating prices. "We have not passed manufacturer's increases on to the customer at all," she said.

Generation X factor

Generation X, less affluent than the Baby Boomers, may also be influencing consumer direction.

"I think they're the ones leading this search for value and the baby boomers are following along," said Tom Podgorski, vice president of marketing for CPI

Photo Finish with 680 stores nationwide. "During boom times in the '80s, Generation X was just at the fringe, so I think that they're more practical and more conservative by nature."

John Kolon, president of Kolon, Bittker & Desmond marketing communications firm in Troy, said Generation X or "busters" as he calls them, are not down and out but cash poor.

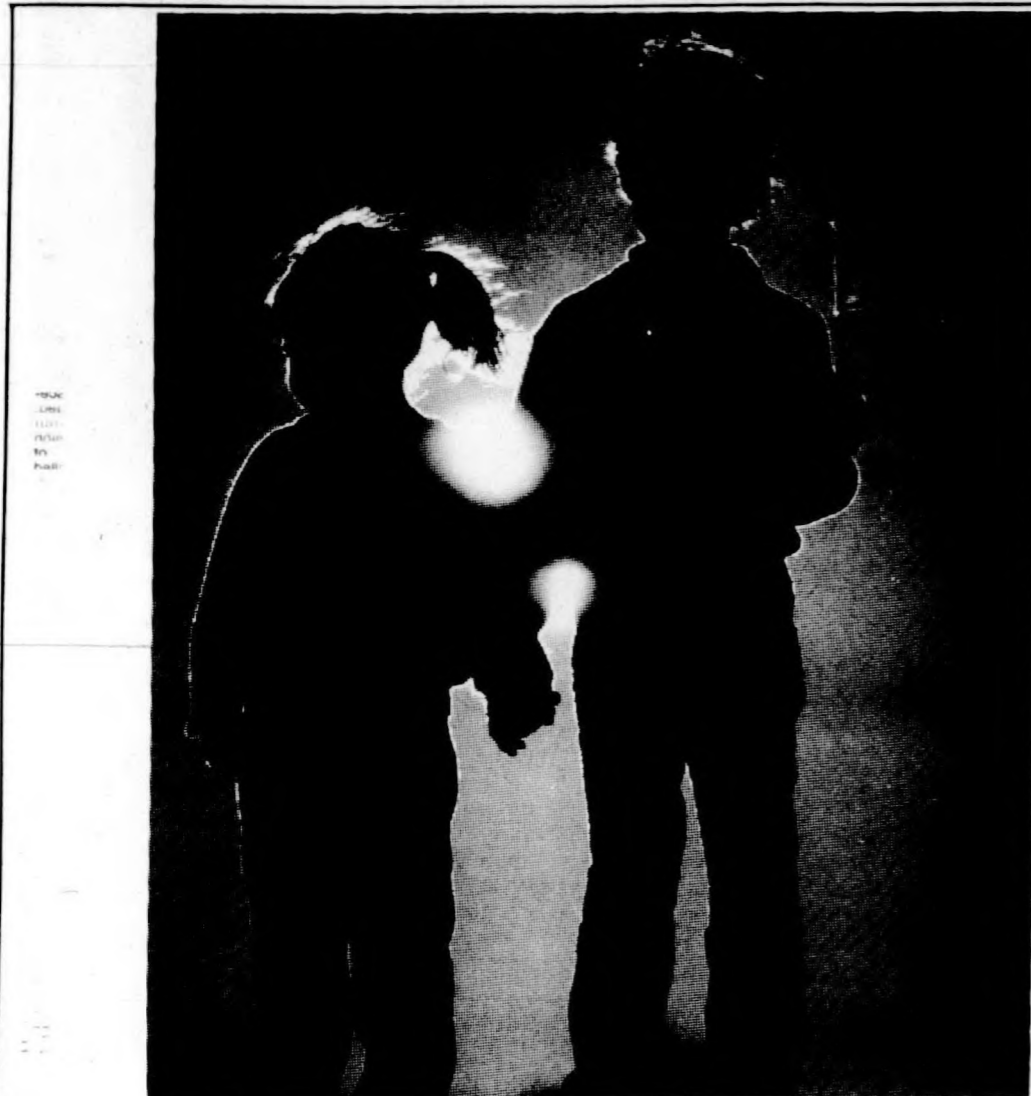
"These folks, also known as twentysomethings, are over educated and under employed because the job opportunities available to their counterparts 10 years ago just aren't there anymore. Their purchases tend to be more active products, the replacement

stereos, cars they can buy without a co-signer. They look for value."

Colleen Creagh of Marx/Layne, a Farmington Hills public relations firm specializing in retail accounts, said even the upscale Somerset Collection in Troy recognizes the influence of the Generation X shopper on pricing.

"That's why stores like Crate & Barrel, J. Crew and Armani Exchange are doing so well," she said. "Generation X still throws New Year's Eve parties but they don't come wearing silk and velvet. They're in jeans and drinking out of glasses not crystal."

The Generation X factor, she said, will figure squarely into the planning of Somerset North next year.

sleep a little easier. Not so.

There's no question the Rocks will be a contender for the Western Lakes Activities Association title with the return of senior James Head, an all-area player who signed to play for the University of Iowa next season.

The 6-foot-6, 210-pound Head averaged 14 points and 11 rebounds last season while shooting 51 percent from the floor. He helped the Rocks to a 21-4 mark and will attempt to lead this year's team to the WLAA title game for the 10th consecutive year.

The Rocks lost to Walled Lake Central in the WLAA final last year and were later eliminated in the regional final by eventual Class A champion Detroit Pershing.

Though Head returns, Salem lost its other four starters to graduation, including twins Mike (19 1/4 points) and Brandon Slone (13 points and 8 1/2 rebounds) who are playing at Madonna University. Guard Todd Forbes and forward Brian Jensen also graduated.

"We're definitely going to be missing some scoring punch," Brodie said. "But I think this year's team is quicker and might be stronger inside."

Head, a threat from any spot on the court, has assumed a greater role on the team as a senior, according to Brodie.

"He has taken over the leadership role and is helping the other players, which is something he hadn't done in the past," Brodie said. "He's older and more mature, but hopefully we won't become a one-person team. We're going to have to rely on the other players to step up."

Senior center Harold Shanks (6-3, 185) will be a force to be reckoned with underneath. Shanks, who averaged six points and six rebounds, is one of six players Brodie is considering to put with Head in the starting lineup.

Borgess girls reign supreme in Class C

Credit the record-setting three-point shooting performance.

Or the multi-faceted attack.

Or even their supreme speed.

Certainly, all played a role in the Class C girls basketball state title captured by the Redford Bishop Borgess Spartans Saturday at Battle Creek's Kellogg Arena. The 64-41 triumph over Iron Mountain in the final proved what Borgess coach Dave Mann knew from the start of the season: That his team is supreme.

However, the reason the Spartans were able to survive challenge after challenge through their tournament trek was far more basic.

Defense delivered the second state championship in Borgess history (the first: 1975 in softball).

The final game, ironically, was the easiest of the last three for Borgess (23-4). The Spartans struggled against Goodrich in the quarterfinals and Williamston in Friday's semifinals.

They won those matches with their defense. Against Williamston, Borgess shot just 31.8 percent from the floor. However, the Spartans limited their foes to 16.7-percent shooting in the second half and forced 21 turnovers en route to a triumph.

Asked if his team's superior speed and quickness, which the Spartans used defensively to pressure and

overwhelm opponents, was the difference, Mann replied, "It has to be, in every game for us."

It was against Iron Mountain, too, although a quick glance at the stat sheet would indicate the offense was clicking. Don't be fooled. Borgess' offense is generated by its defense.

Maxann Reese might not have been able to get off nine three-point attempts (she made six of them, a state finals record) if her quickness hadn't put the Mountaineers back on their defensive heels. "When I drive to the basket," the sophomore said, "I know I can get by them, with my quickness. So they step back. That's what opens it up for the three."

Reese finished with a game-high 24

points, five assists and three steals. LaZandra White scored 10 and Adriane Bryant netted eight, with seven assists and three steals. Marrie Dubose also scored eight, and Yalonda Holt had six and nine rebounds.

Iron Mountain, which finished with a 22-5 record, had just one player reach double figures in scoring: Janell Schupp, with 11. Leslie Jerks and Brenda Verrette had eight apiece.

The Mountaineers were 17 of 57 from the floor (30 percent) and committed 20 turnovers. Borgess was 24 of 46 (52 percent) with 17 turnovers.

Although the Spartans dictated the game's tempo, their halftime lead was

Madonna's run ends in NAIA quarters

How are you supposed to feel? You know, heck, you *proved* you were one of the eight best NAIA volleyball teams in the country. You certainly feel some pride and elation over that.

But, man, you were so close to getting into the Final Four, so close to winning it all. A dig here, a service reception there, maybe one more big run in that last game and boom, you are No. 1.

How are you supposed to feel?

"The girls are heartbroken," said coach Jerry Abraham, whose Madonna volleyball team was knocked out in the quarterfinals of the NAIA National Volleyball Tournament in San Diego Friday night, but in the process won acclaim and national respect.

"But they know they played so hard and so well and accomplished something that not a lot of people thought they could. We aren't disappointed at all, really. We played outstanding."

Madonna entered the tournament, played at the oceanfront Point Loma Nazarene College in San Diego, as the

No. 8 seed and promptly raised a ruckus in pool play.

After pumeling Nova College of Florida (15-2, 15-8) and St. Andrews of North Carolina (15-0, 15-11, running off a string of 19 unanswered points) on Thursday, the Lady Crusaders stunned No. 1-seed and No. 1-ranked Montevallo of Alabama on Friday, 15-12, 15-4.

"We weren't supposed to beat that team," Abraham said.

Montevallo had entered the tournament with 39 straight wins, but Madonna, with 6-2 Julie Martin (Livonia Stevenson), 6-1 Kari Van Deusen and 6-0 Kelly McCausland patrolling the net, was overpowering.

In that match, Martin had seven kills and Van Deusen six. Both had three blocks.

Madonna's only loss in pool play was to No. 4-seed Westmont (15-12, 15-12), a Westmont, Calif., school.

The 3-1 record advanced Madonna to the quarterfinals, where they ran into No. 2-seed Henderson State of Alabama and, according to Abraham

and several other coaches, the best player in the tournament: 6-0 senior Cherie Buckley.

"We just ran into a hot team (48-2 and riding a 40-game win streak) and great player," Abraham said. "She did some things that we just hadn't seen before."

Buckley had posted a tournament-high 63 kills in four pool matches. The second-leading spiker had 41. Against Madonna, one of the best net-play teams in the tournament, she put on a clinic with 33 kills — overshadowing otherwise solid 13-kill efforts from both Martin and Van Deusen, and a 15-kill, 14-dig performance by Maureen Paulin (Mercy).

Henderson State won the match, 15-5, 10-15, 15-10, 15-13. Madonna, which hurt itself with 22 attacking errors and nine service errors, led game four 13-9.

"Madonna was so well-coached," said Henderson State coach Rhonda Thigpen. "When you beat a team 15-5 you figure you are just going to run them out. But Madonna came back and gave us a different look. Win, lose

or draw, those girls never stopped playing."

Henderson State, Puget Sound (Wash.), Westmont and Hawaii-Hilo played for the title late Saturday night.

Some individual highlights for Madonna:

- Van Deusen had 48 kills and Martin 44 for the tourney.
- Setter Mazie Pilut had 45 assists against Henderson State and 39 against Westmont. She finished with 120.
- Julie Wood posted 14 digs against Henderson State and 13 against Westmont.

Traditional powers lead all-area team again

Two of Observerland's traditional powers in high school football re-emerged in 1993 following down years as first-team, all-area selections.

Farmington Hills Harrison and Westland John Glenn had just three players between them on the last All-Observer team, but they did much better this year.

Harrison, the Western Lakes Activities Association and Class A state champion, has five players on the first team and WLAA and Class AA runner-up Glenn seven.

Redford Catholic Central didn't get a chance to defend its AA title but had another outstanding team and also was accorded seven first-team berths. Between the first and second squads, nine players from each of the three schools are honored.

The '93 all-area team includes three repeat selections — Bryan and Derek Besco of Glenn and Redford Thurston's Jeff Lance. CC running back Fred Taylor, Salem linebacker Rob Shepley and Glenn linebacker Jeromey Cosby were second-team picks a year ago.

Jack Reardon, who guided Livonia Stevenson to its best season (7-2) since 1987 with a team dominated by juniors, was named Observerland Coach Of The Year.

FIRST-TEAM OFFENSE

Doug Brzezinski, lineman, Redford CC: Brzezinski was a two-way starter the last two seasons for the Shamrocks, who are 21-1 during that time. He opened holes on offense and helped plugged them as a defensive tackle, recording 39 tackles, including seven solos and three sacks. Brzezinski visited Notre Dame last weekend and has scheduled visits to Boston College, Michigan State, Vanderbilt and either Colorado or Northwestern, according to coach Tom Mach.

"Doug may be overall our best 48-minute lineman ever," Mach said. "He could dominate both sides of the ball; he has the size, speed and agility. One of his greatest assets besides his size and talent is his work ethic."

Tony McGill, lineman, Wayne: McGill was a two-way starter the last two years for the Zebras and, despite being on the smallest side, dominated most of his opponents. At linebacker and defensive end, McGill had 26 solo tackles, 44 assists, two fumble recoveries and two sacks.

"After the John Glenn game, one of the Glenn kids told me that's the best guard he's played against all year," coach Chuck Howton said. "Most of the better players I've had have been around 6-foot, 190, and he fits right in that mold."

Matt Schwartz, lineman, Glenn: Schwartz was a two-year starter at offensive tackle and helped make the Rockets a fine offensive team with his blocking. He's an intelligent player with good work habits, according to Glenn coach Chuck Gordon.

"He played super well for us, and we had a lot of confidence in him," Gordon said. "He was our most consistent blocker and had very good technique. He could have played anywhere on the line and done a good job."

Chris Pratt, lineman, Redford CC: The senior has been a hit with the books throughout his years at CC with a 4.0 grade-point average. He received equally impressive marks from Mach after starting for the first time on the offensive line.

"He was a great surprise in that he progressed at a tremendous rate and gave us a great year," Mach said. "He was consistent and solidified the line."

Mike Bint, lineman, Glenn: Bint started for three years at tight end and also played inside linebacker. He had 14 pass receptions for 184 yards and four touchdowns, and he also caught a pair of two-point passes. On defense, Bint had 33 solo tackles, 62 assists, two sacks and one interception.

"He had an outstanding senior year," Gordon said. "He got better and better each week of his career. He developed into a good blocker and has good hands as a receiver."

Scot Lord, tight end, N. Farmington: Lord recovered from a devastating knee injury in basketball last December to have an outstanding senior year in football. He caught 39 passes for 495 yards and five TDs. As an outside linebacker, he had 36 solo tackles, 47 assists and two sacks. He also forced six hurried passes and knocked down six others.

Lord was a unanimous all-stater as a punter. He averaged 44.58 yards for 36 punts, with his longest being a school-record 72 yards. He was 10-of-10 on extra points and kicked three of five field goals (longest 42 yards). Big Ten and Mid-American Conference schools are recruiting him.

"I hope he decides to play as a kicker, because that's his bread-and-butter," North coach Jim O'Leary said. "He's the best kicker I've ever had and one of the best players I've coached as far as versatility. You don't get kids like him often."

Brad Morgan, receiver, Stevenson: Morgan set a single-season record for receptions with 45 for 747 yards and 10 TDs. He also owns Stevenson career records for passes caught (71) and yards (1,145). Morgan intercepted three passes as a cornerback and also punted for the first time this year, averaging 33 yards per kick.

"Everyone talks about his offense, but when we played teams who throw well we put Brad on their best receiver," coach Jack Reardon said. "One thing he does real well, when run comes his way, he comes up and hits people. He'll go after that football no matter what. We've had a couple first-team all-staters, and Brad is as good as any of them."

Ryan Ostach, receiver, Canton: Ostach was a big target and a tough tackle for defensive backs. He caught 36 passes for 578 yards and four TDs. He also returned punts and kickoffs and played some in the defensive secondary. Ostach averaged 41 yards per punt.

"He has outstanding ability as a receiver and is a great runner after he catches it," Canton coach Bob Khoenie said. "He has a heckuva future if someone just wants him to kick, but he's also a great receiver. He has good speed, size and hands — all the tools."

Nick Burgess, receiver, Harrison: Harrison's tight ends are always good deep threats, and Burgess caught 26 passes for 473 yards and four touchdowns. He also played free safety on defense, and he was fourth on the team with 67 tackles, of which 52 were first hits.

"He was our most outstanding all-around player," Herrington said. "He was slowed by a back injury late in the tournament, but he was never off the field. He was the best at supporting the run since John Miller."

Kevin Szczembara, quarterback, Stevenson: In his only year as a starting quarterback, he completed 82 of 156 passes for 1,184 yards with only eight interceptions. His 14 TD passes tied a single-season school record. Szczembara didn't play quarterback until his junior year after playing defensive back and receiver his first two years.

"He has progressed so well, and his potential is tremendous," Reardon said. "He's worked so hard. Everything he got, he deserved. He scrambles and puts the ball in peoples' hands."

Joe Pesci, quarterback, Harrison: Pesci was a tight end a year ago and hadn't played quarterback since he was in Little League. But coach John Herrington knew what he was doing when he put him there, and Pesci became the leader Harrison needed at that position. He completed 84 of 189 passes for 1,406 yards. He threw 16 touchdown passes as opposed to seven interceptions.

"We made him a quarterback because of genetics," Herrington said. "He comes from such an athletic family that we knew he would be a good leader. Last year he

had trouble throwing a spiral, but he developed into an excellent passer." **Freddie Taylor, back, Redford CC:** A second-team All-Observer choice a year ago, Taylor continued to impress in '93 with 951 yards on 126 carries for a 7.6 average. He scored 11 touchdowns rushing and also caught five passes for 54 yards. His statistics would have been even better, but Mach chose to go with other runners during the second half of some games when the Shamrocks enjoyed big

leads. Mach said Taylor is the best CC back since the late Aaron Roberts. "Freddie has all the qualities of a great back. He has great speed, runs the hole well and is very explosive," Mach said. "I think he can play Division I if they want to give him the opportunity." **Matt Howton, specialist, Glenn:** Howton wore a lot of different hats for the Rockets. He played tailback, wide receiver and free safety, and he also returned kicks and punts. Howton, who missed five games with a

broken collarbone, returned five punts for a 49½-yard average and four TDs, and he averaged 23-plus yards and scored a touchdown on six kick returns. He had 38 first hits, 29 assists and an interception on defense. Howton also averaged 8.3 yards rushing and ran for one TD.

"Matt has outstanding speed and is a very exciting player," Gordon said. "He has one speed; that's 100 miles per hour all the time. He played the pass well and was excellent on run support."

Nick Kallas, lineman, Redford CC: Kallas made quite a contribution to the CC program despite not coming out until his sophomore year. He injured an ankle early in the season but was a force on defense, making 36 tackles, including seven solos and three sacks.

"Nick has great movement and is a great athlete who works real hard," Mach said. "Since he didn't play as a freshman, he's one year away from being a great one."

Brock Gove, lineman, Harrison: Gove excelled at defensive end and was a key player during the playoffs, especially in the regional final at Northville. He was third on the team with 71 tackles. Gove also played fullback in the power-I and was a key blocker for Nick Williams. He made five of nine field goals — his longest was 42 yards — and 31 of 34 extra points.

"He might be the most improved player in the area," Herrington said. "He was one of the most dedicated players we had. He took his kicking very seriously and came to be an outstanding defensive end."

Jason Fuller, lineman, Glenn: Fuller is a converted linebacker, moving to a down position for the benefit of the team this year. He had 29 first hits, 46 assists, three sacks and 14 quarterback hurries. He bench presses 390 pounds and has a 4.0 grade point.

"He was one of the key reasons for the success of our team," Gordon said. "Moving him to noseguard really made our defense solid, and he made the move with a great attitude. His unselfishness in doing that really typified our team."

Bryan Besco, lineman, Glenn: Besco was an incredible pass rusher, sacking quarterbacks 12 times and forcing them to hurry a pass 26 times. He also had 47 solo tackles, 35 assists, three fumble recoveries, a tackle for a safety and an interception.

As an offensive end, he caught 16 passes for 318 yards and four TDs. He also rushed for one TD.

"He's one of the best players I've had the privilege to coach," Gordon said. "He works hard to see just how good he can really become. He was a guy we could always count on."

Joe Pongracz, lineman, Redford CC: Pongracz was around the football most of the time, recording 41 tackles, with three sacks and six solos. He had one fumble recovery.

"Joe did a great job as a first-year starter," Mach said. "He's a tremendous hitter and has great toughness. He made his mark in many games with hard hits."

Derek Besco, linebacker, Glenn: Besco made 46 solo tackles and had 41 assists, and he also had two sacks, 16 hurries and two fumble recoveries. He received the big-hit-of-the-week award five times.

He also led the team in scoring with 74 points. Besco was an offensive end but moved to tailback for several games at midseason. He caught 24 passes for 350 yards and six TDs, and he rushed 74 times for 543 yards and six TDs.

"He was a real team player," Gordon said. "He would do whatever we needed him to do and did it well. He's also one of the best players I've had the pleasure to coach."

Tate Dobbs, linebacker, Redford CC: The two-year starter led a CC defense that held opponents to 21 points in nine

games. Dobbs had 78 tackles, including 15 solos. He made all the defensive adjustments for the Shamrocks.

"Tate was the heart and soul of our defense, a coach on the field," Mach said. "He's been in the thick of things, near the ball the last two years."

Charles Bambenek, linebacker, Harrison: Bambenek isn't a big player but used his intelligence (3.75 grade point) to put himself in position to make a lot of tackles. His play during the post-season was a big reason the Hawks won the Class A title. Bambenek led the team with 85 first hits and 112 total tackles.

"He came on late in the season to be an outstanding linebacker," Herrington said. "He just played great against Fraser. Against a big team like that, he was a real key to stopping their power attack."

Jeromey Cosby, linebacker, Glenn: Cosby was a two-year starter at linebacker, a fierce competitor and a student of the game, according to Gordon. He was the leading tackler with 123 (62 solos and 61 assists), had three sacks and three hurries and returned an interception for a TD.

Cosby also rushed 52 times for 306 yards and six TDs. He returned six kickoffs for an average of 30 yards, including a school-record 85-yarder for a TD. He scored 50 points.

"He's perhaps the best linebacker we've had at John Glenn," Gordon said. "You never want to lose a player to injury, but this is a guy we could not afford to lose. He was part of the foundation of this team."

Rob Shepley, linebacker, Salem: Shepley is the only player during coach Tom Moshimer's 35 years in the profession who started and lettered for four years. He played fullback, wingback, noseguard and middle linebacker. Shepley, who missed some games due to injury, had 41 tackles and two sacks, and he carried the ball 140 times for 577 yards and seven TDs.

"He's one of the best fullbacks I've had," Moshimer said. "Wherever we needed him is where he played. He was a four-year starter; that speaks for itself. We'll have a big hole in our program without him."

Kevin Bryant, back, Harrison: Bryant was Mr. Versatile for the Hawks. He started the season at tailback but moved to wide receiver where he had 25 catches for 553 yards and eight TDs. Bryant had 51 tackles, three interceptions and two fumble recoveries (one for a TD), and he also blocked a half dozen punts or kicks. He averaged 33½ yards on eight kickoff returns and 13 on seven punt returns. He rushed for two TDs.

"He has great skills and is a major-college prospect," Herrington said. "He improved his tackling and catching skills this year. He can do it all."

Jeff Lance, back, Thurston: A repeat player on the All-Observer first team, Lance was a force whether he was trying to catch a pass or knock one down. As a three-year varsity player, Lance caught 82 career passes for 1,467 yards and 17 TDs. He had 14 career interceptions, returning two for TDs. Lance had 28 catches for 537 yards and 11 TDs, eight by reception, this year.

"In three years, Jeff never missed a practice, and one of the things he improved on this year was really becoming a hitter," coach Bob Snell said. "Football is such a team sport, but whenever a big play was needed he was in a position to make it."

Dave Morelli, back, Redford CC: A two-year starter at cornerback, Morelli covered all the top receiving threats the Shamrocks faced. Morelli had eight career interceptions, two this season. He had 36 tackles (13 solos) and also played wide receiver.

"He has a nose for the ball and great ability to get to the ball in the air," Mach said. "We put him on the toughest receiver, and he handled himself against anybody."

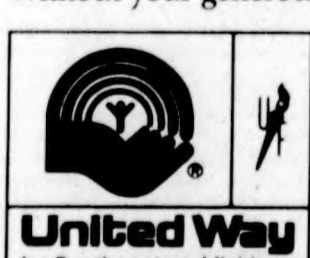

Francis Ford Coppola has joined forces with TBS to produce "Century," a 10-hour thematic documentary on the 20th century. Director Paul Schrader and producer Philip Kaufman will collaborate on the project, which is due in 1996.

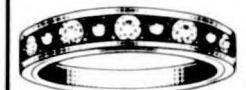

Midler soars as Mama Rose in CBS' lacerating 'Gypsy'

Bette Midler has the role she was born to play as the stage mother from hell, in "Gypsy," which premieres Sunday, Dec. 12, on CBS.

Angela Lansbury won a Tony for her performance in a revival. Ditto, Tyne Daly. Inexplicably, the role's creator, Ethel Merman, didn't. Count on Midler as a Best Bette in the Emmy race next year.

Theater connoisseurs generally consider "Gypsy" to be the ultimate "book musical" (as the term implies, a musical that tells a genuine story, as opposed to the spectacle of, say, "Cats.") Playwright Arthur Laurents obviously knew what he was onto when he subtitled his script "a musical fable."

Opening in Seattle during the early '20s, "Gypsy" tells the fact-based story of stripper Gypsy Rose Lee (Cynthia Gibb), her mother, Rose (Midler) and sister, June (Jennifer Beck). Long before the phrase "dysfunctional family" came into vogue, "Gypsy" nailed the concept — and with music, yet.

Audiences who don't know the show may be startled by how dark it

is. Rose Hovick drives her children to achieve the show biz success she never garnered herself, moving down everyone in her path — including their agent, Herbie (Peter Riegert), who loves her. And anyone who knows "Everything's Coming Up Roses" only from elevator muzak is in for a shock: In context, especially as performed by Midler, this is a very scary song.

"I've always wanted to play that character," Midler says. "I'd never really thought about where I would play it. I would have played it in stock, if I had the chance. It's a great part. The score is extraordinary. The writing is just incomparable."

Not only is it incomparable — it's intact. Not wanting to argue with success, CBS, thankfully, filmed the play using the original script. Even Jerome Robbins' original choreography is recreated.

"And what's nice about our show is that a good deal of it is live," Midler says. "It's live singing. That was a real step forward for us. We were nervous about it, but we just took the bull and we ran with it. And that's something that's hardly ever

done anymore. And we were very anxious to do it, because, first of all, nobody does it. And it's a big challenge. And we felt we rose to the occasion. I hope everybody feels that way, but if they don't... there's always the remote!"

The show's most shattering moment comes during "Rose's Turn," the musical theater equivalent of an operatic mad scene, in which Rose vents her decades-old rage at having to enjoy only vicarious success. Midler says she found the number daunting, to say the least.

"That was the real challenge," she says. "It's full of emotion. It's full of — all those HIGH Bs! 'Rose's Turn' was hard because it's very intricate. It has key changes and tempo changes. A lot of it is done 'ad lib rubato.' It's a terrifying piece of music because it's one of the two famous arias in the musical comedy lexicon, the other one being the soliloquy from 'Carousel.'"

"Gypsy" has whetted Midler's appetite for other musical comedy vehicles and she gleefully solicits interest from potential producers. "I'd like to do 'Mame.' I'd like to do 'Annie Get Your Gun,'" she says. "I'd like to do all those kind of 'broad' parts, you know?"

Although Midler plays a driven stage mother in "Gypsy," she says she would hate for her daughter, Sophie, to go into show business. "I think it's a very hard life," she says. "Especially if you're not in the big, big, big, big, big, big time. You know, if you just meander along, it's hard. It's really, really hard. And I don't want her to have to suffer those things."

But if Sophie insisted? "I'd have to try to whip her. Soundly."

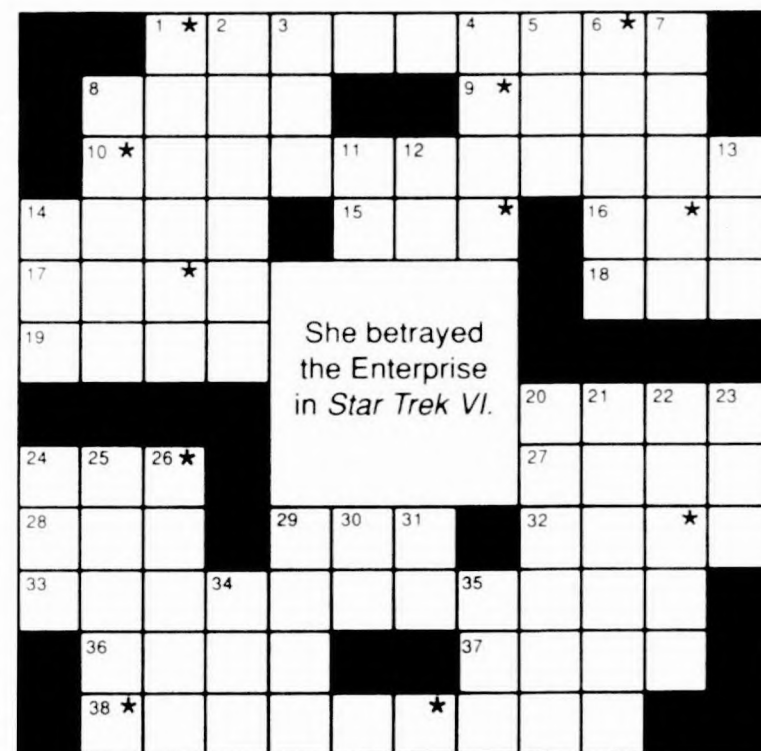
Walker was also the evil Liza Colby on "All My Children" several years ago. Liza was the woman who always caused problems for Jenny and Greg.
