Board discusses secrecy in secret



The Plymouth-Canton school board discussed concealing the names of school superintendent candidates — and the board went into "executive session" for the talk. One trustee said the board wants to balance public interest with finding the best applicant.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education discussed in closed session whether it should keep secret the names of individuals applying for the job of Superintendent John Hoben, who will retire in June.

The board reviewed a legal opinion

in "executive session" Thursday night on whether the names of applicants should be withheld until finalists are chosen, as recommended by consultants. Consultants interviewed by the board have said quality candidates won't apply if they know their identities will be publicized.

The state's Open Meetings Act,

adopted in 1976, requires meetings of public bodies such as school boards to be open to the public except for specific exemptions which may be discussed in "closed session," not open to the public.

The law permits boards — following a two-thirds roll-call vote — to go into closed session to discuss pending litigation. No one has filed suit over the confidentiality question.

There is no specific provision under the Open Meetings Act for boards to discuss in closed session legal opinions in cases where a lawsuit has not been filed or threatened, which

was the situation Thursday. The act says a board may conceal the name of a job candidate who requests it.

Violations of the act are punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.

Fest has a fresh new look

Japan has long been known for its world-class ice carving competitions, which draw millions of spectators. Fortunately, Michigan lovers of the art form don't have to travel to the Orient.

Beginning Wednesday, they can instead come to Plymouth, where ice carvers from the U.S., Europe and Asia will compete for prize money while transforming 400-pound blocks of ice into "sculpture for the moment" using chisels, chainsaws, drills and hammers.

WJR meteorologist Judy Coy, a celebrity carver invited to the Plymouth International Ice Spectacular, predicts Mother Nature will cooperate. "She said don't worry, this year it's going to be cold," said Mike Watts of Watts-Up Inc., coordinator of the festival.

"There are two new competitions added to this year's event," said Kelle Morse, Watts-Up director of public relations and marketing.

"On Friday, Jan. 14, there will be a 20-hour, two-person professional team competition. Each team will receive 10 blocks of ice and will begin carving at 6 p.m. and will work through the night until 2 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 15. They'll compete for a first-place prize of \$2,000.

"One of the very first college and high school team competitions in the country will take place Sunday, Jan. 16, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.," added Morse. "Each team, consisting of two students, will receive three blocks of ice and will have five hours to carve their ice masterpiece."

Both events will take place in Kellogg Park.

A highlight should be Oakland Community College's interpretation of "Jurassic Park," said Watts. Other colleges participating include Schoolcraft, Henry Ford, Macomb

Pursell pulls out of U.S. Senate race

Carl Pursell has announced his withdrawal from the U.S. Senate race, citing the expense of running a Senate campaign.

"As I got more and more involved in the race, I found I had to spend much of my time asking for money,

and very little time discussing the substantive issues," the Plymouth Republican said Thursday.

"I observed that legislators were traveling the country to raise millions of dollars for their races," he said. "Raising money from all over this

country is not my way of representing the people of Michigan." Pursell's chief competitors for the Republican nomination to run for the Senate seat were Spencer Abraham, state Republican Party chairman, and Ronna Romney, Republican Party activist and former talk radio show host.

State Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, who represents Plymouth and Canton, supported Pursell, but said he has switched allegiance to Romney.

While some observers of the Michigan political scene claimed Pursell lacked charisma, all agreed he had an impressive record of government service, and a reputation for honesty. Community leaders were

surprised by the former U.S. representative's announcement, coming just three months after he declared his candidacy.

"Michigan citizens' choices have certainly been diminished by this loss," said State Rep. Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth. "It seems awfully early for any kind of exit from the race, because it was just about to heat up. Michigan voters have lost an opportunity to have a proven leader as a senator."

Plymouth Mayor Doug Miller said, "I'm sorry to hear it because he would have been an excellent candidate."

But Miller added that in talking earlier with Pursell, "I was amazed at what he told me the average Senate race costs and how much fund-raising was involved;

he was talking about millions of dollars."

"It would have been good to have a local person represent us in Washington; he was able to demonstrate a good understanding of the issues," Miller said.

Plymouth Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen-McCarthy said: "I think it's a loss for the community because I think he would have done a very fine job, but by the same token spending all your time fund-raising is hard — I agree with him. It's a tough call for him to have to make."

Since announcing his candidacy in October, Pursell had toured the state seeking support and opened a campaign office on Main Street.

Pursell said he plans to focus

on his consulting business, and staying involved in the community, and on serving Eastern Michigan University as a regent.

Pursell served in the U.S. Congress for 16 years. His major work focused on attempts to reduce deficit spending.

Pursell never moved his family to Washington, and returned home almost every weekend during his tenure in Congress.

"I always thought the congressman should be in the district on the weekend," he said. "Most of them live year-round in the D.C. area and return for a fund-raiser or ribbon-cutting ceremony. This system is wrong."

Upon leaving Congress, Pursell donated more than \$80,000 from his campaign fund to charitable causes.

candidates with the process we have," said trustee David Artley. "The board did receive last night a legal opinion regarding our options. On Monday night, we are going to add to the agenda reconsideration of our specifications."

"We received the opinion, and people said they wanted to sleep on it; they have a concern with balancing the public's right to know with the need to get the best candidate."

Michigan Freedom of Information chairman Tim Richard said experience in Michigan disproves the consultants' contention, as observed in a Detroit Public Schools' open superintendent search and in numerous other cases.

Citizens still have a chance to get involved with the superintendent search. The school board will seek through the end of this week volunteers to serve on the committee charged with determining what qualities the district should look for in its next superintendent.

So far, citizen response has been "overwhelmingly gratifying," said Artley. "Probably in phone calls and letters we've heard from more than 30 people. We expect a bunch more will come in. We're still looking for people. We see it as opportunity for change and for moving forward."

Search committee

The board expects to choose committee members from a cross section of the community Jan. 17.

Assisting the board and citizens' committee in finding a superintendent at a cost of roughly \$15,000 will be a consultant firm to be decided upon at tonight's meeting, set for 7:30 p.m. at the board office, 454 S. Harvey in Plymouth.

The board identified several potential consultants, all of whom have experience working in Michigan. They include Harry Howard of Ann Arbor; Dick Foster and Carl Plas of Chicago, Ill.; the Michigan Association of School Boards; Hazard and Young Associates of Glenview, Ill.; Bickert and Profit Associates of Northbrook, Ill.; and Sockwel and Associates of Charlotte, N.C.

Foster and Plas, Sockwel and Associates, and Howard opted not

to make presentations to the board.

For a fee of \$10,000 plus expenses of about \$5,000, the Michigan Association of School Boards said it would "help us with the two committees; help us narrow candidates to a pool for interviews; support us in the interview process; and help us understand the community visit process on the finalists after we've interviewed and gotten the field down to say, two," said Artley.

A drawback to working with the MASB is that it can't recruit sitting Michigan superintendents unless directed to do so by the board, Artley said.

The MASB would help the board design a brochure to market the district and to draft application materials. "We still would have to underwrite travel for candidates, advertising and travel expenses for community visits," Artley said.

For \$11,000-12,000 plus expenses of roughly \$5,000, Hazard and Young would perform "pretty much the same services, with the exception that they could actively recruit in Michigan. And they were talking about spending 40 hours in district," he said. "That's a key piece."

Saving money

Bickert and Profit Associates offered the same services, "but had some ideas on ways they could save us money on community visits. Their fee is \$13,000, but they're willing to spend 65-85 hours in district," he said. "That's significant, because a portion will be spent with the community, seeking their input. They were real positive on getting input from citizens, staff, parents, business people, citizens without kids in school and senior citizens."

Their expenses are estimated at \$5,500. Bickert and Profit also could recruit in Michigan.

"When you look at what you're getting, it's almost less expensive per hour to have Bickert in the district," Artley said.

"Either of the two consulting firms, Hazard or Bickert, would be more than glad to spend more time in the district, but they have fee of \$500 a day," he added.

"We will probably pick one of the three firms on Monday (tonight)."



Vandals target forest

The conflict between the Friends of Miller Woods and neighbors of the woods off of Powell Road has turned to vandalism.

In their efforts to protect a climax forest off Powell Road east of Beck from bikes and dogs, the Friends of Miller Woods last year got community and schools backing for putting a four-foot high chain link fence around the woods.

But since the fence went up last month, about 350 feet of it have been taken down by neighbors of the woods, who, say the Friends group is killing the woods with kindness.

The fence was taken down "because it's not wanted by the people in the community," said a man who declined to be named, adding he and several neighbors have worked together to take down portions of the fence as a "community service project."

"If it goes back up it will go back down," he said.

Emily Kennitz, president of Friends of Miller Woods, which has about 75 members, said the group will seek to get the fence put back up. "We're looking at the insurance, it's questionable because there's a deductible for the school," she said.

"It certainly is a big disappointment, because we feel adults are doing the vandalism, it's disappointing after three years of talking with the opponents of the fence that these processes didn't result in any understanding of the need for a fence," Kennitz said.

"We documented the problems and kept track of the abuses so there was no doubt that we needed a fence," she said, adding the fence was supported by University of Michigan botany professors who use the woods for an outdoor laboratory "and managers of other preserves who found that fences help with the problems of dogs

and bikes and off-road vehicles."

"We had hoped we might have a celebration and dedication in the spring. It isn't something to celebrate in its present form," Kennitz said, adding the damage is estimated at around \$10,000.

"I don't know what you can say to get people to not destroy public property," she said.

Barbara Korte, a neighbor of the woods who opposed the fence, got 128 petition signatures last year from neighbors who oppose it.

"I don't know who did it, but I'm not necessarily opposed to what they've done," she said.

"I think it shows the strength of the community reaction. I don't approve of vandalism, but this is a way people are protesting," she said. "The school board didn't listen to this large group of people who didn't want the fence."

The Plymouth-Canton School District owns the wooded area. Dick Egli, schools spokesman, said schools officials would likely soon discuss what to do about damage to the Miller Woods fence.

State vows not to shift Mettetal Airport runway

Cross his heart, Michigan Aeronautics chief Bill Gehman says the state has no intention of shifting the runway at Mettetal Airport.

"We agreed not to do that. And we don't intend to do that," Gehman told concerned residents and the Mettetal Airport Advisory Board.

Michigan Aeronautics Commission Director Gehman and several of his associates drove through heavy snows Thursday night to reassure residents that a proposed shift of the runway can be removed from a list of airport improvements.

Gehman was asked to attend after airport manager Randy Collier, state Bureau of Aeronautics licensing and enforcement manager, included shifting the runway 300 feet south as part of a long-term proposed plan in early December. At the time, Collier said property, a remainder of the fee interest of parcel 12 south of the airport, would have to be purchased for the shifting.

Collier's action reopened old wounds for many area residents, particularly those involved with Concerned Citizens, which has monitored the airport's status over the years, as well as airport board member Mike Stankov of Plymouth Township.

"To even show this in writing as a plan shows bad faith," Stankov said. "Why is it even a plan?"

When the state bought the airport, an agreement between the state and township included a prohibition on any expansion of the runway unless the state received approval from the Can-

ton Township Board of Trustees.

"The township board has no intention of changing that," said board member Elaine Kirchgatter, Canton Township treasurer.

Collier said he created the improvements list from suggestions offered by a variety of people, including pilots. "I was looking at this thing as things to do that cost money," Collier said, adding that he then took out certain policy issues, some suggested by Stankov. "I was trying to organize the list."

Shifting the runway was among those suggestions and it was part of an original plan when state officials first showed interest in buying Mettetal, Gehman said.

"Can we put this issue to bed once and for all?" Stankov asked.

Gehman replied: "As far as we're concerned, we'll go along with the recommendation of this board."

Bob Zaetta of Concerned Citizens told Gehman many residents believe a compromise was reached when the state bought the airport and an accompanying agreement between Canton and the state was reached.

"We felt we had a gentlemen's agreement. It was a win-win situation. A lot of people felt betrayed, Bill," Zaetta said, referring to the shifting proposal.

Though state officials say they will not shift the runway, Gehman said a shifting away from Joy Road would improve safety. Where the runway now stands there is a displaced threshold — where the planes touch the runway when landing — which in effect shortens the length of landing room. As it now stands, it does

not meet Federal Aviation Administration design standards.

"They (FAA) could force you not to use a portion of the runway," Gehman said.

Because the state used federal money to buy the more than \$4 million airport, the state would be expected to comply with regulations. "They will then want you to meet or justify why you can't meet those design standards," Gehman said.

If the state doesn't meet FAA standards, other things could happen. "There's no way they can force us to add to the south, but they could take away from the north (portion of the runway)," Gehman said, adding that would shorten the existing runway.

The design standards also recommend that area beyond the runway be cleared and graded and that certain obstructions, such as trees, be removed. "When they (federal government) start giving you money, it changes from recommended, to you will," said Wendell Proudfoot, of the aeronautics airport development division.

Proposed improvements, such as installing lights to guide pilots in for landing, paving the parking lots, security fencing, carry a bill of more than \$1 million.

"Obviously, there's a bigger list there than we are capable of doing," Collier said.

Proudfoot told the board that an airport layout plan he is working on, which among a number of things, describes the development of the airport, will be sent to the federal government, with an expected final approval in early September.

New name pinpoints airport

What's in a name? Everything. Just ask the Mettetal Airport Advisory Board, whose new stationery will say: Canton Plymouth Mettetal Airport.

"I have a problem with it being called Plymouth Mettetal Airport when it's not located in Plymouth," said board member Elaine Kirchgatter, Canton Township treasurer.

She didn't get overwhelming support. "If Canton wanted to change the name of the airport, it should have bought it when it got the chance," said board chairman Ed Wendover.

Like Wendover, other board members wanted to retain Ply-

mouth in the name. Others wanted to be sure Mettetal — the original owners — remained in the airport's identity.

"I feel it's Canton that has gone out on the limb. We're proud of it. Why not have our name on it?" Kirchgatter said.

But her motion to rename the airport to Mettetal Canton Airport fizzled. The opposition said it doesn't matter that the airport is in Canton. The facility serves the community, which includes the Plymouth area.

Back and forth the board bandied names for the facility. In official pilot guides of airports, the local facility is associated with the city of Plymouth. To change that association would cost big

bucks, said airport manager Randy Collier, state Bureau of Aeronautics licensing and enforcement manager.

But board members said they were only interested in changing the airport's name for the purposes of a sign, stationery and local identity.

Some proposed names that lost in votes were Plymouth Canton Community Airport and Plymouth Canton Mettetal Airpark.

Again, Kirchgatter insisted that Canton be mentioned first in the new name, while board member John Vergonna wanted to postpone the decision.

In the end, Canton Plymouth Mettetal Airport won — but not unanimously.

Timothy Feldkamp, Brian Lizotte, Rainer Mueller and David Yeager were among 45 employees to receive awards Dec. 9 during ceremonies in Dearborn.

"The Henry Ford Technology Award is our Nobel Prize, our Pulitzer, our Academy Awards all rolled into one," said Ford chairman Alex Trotman. "It's a demonstration of the importance we place on our technical experts and the role they play in the future of our company."

Now in its 13th year, the Henry Ford Technology Awards program is designed to recognize a carefully selected group of employees from around the world for their

first-of-a-kind or industry-leading technical achievements. Named after the company's founder, the award is given only after a five-month nomination and review process that involves the company's top management ranks worldwide. Fewer than 400 employees have received the honor in Ford history.

Feldkamp was part of a four-person team honored for designing and developing a sophisticated computer-based on-board diagnostics system that monitors a vehicle's misfire performance. The technology helps Ford meet new governmental regulations and already is being used on the Ford Thunderbird, Mercury Cougar and 3.8-liter Ford Mustang.

Lizotte was part of a five-person team honored for the design, development and product imple-

mentation of a friction-reducing solid-lubricant piston coating. The innovation reduces the friction generated by an engine's pistons by about 20 percent and thus helps to improve a vehicle's fuel economy.

Mueller was part of a four-person team honored for the design, development and production implementation of a new high-speed, high-volume electron discharge machining drilling process. The innovation provides Ford with a way to drill the small deep holes needed in today's engines and transmissions. It also improves vehicle quality and cuts costs.

Yeager was part of a five-person team honored for the design, development and production implementation of a friction-reducing solid-lubricant piston coating. The innovation reduces the friction generated by an engine's pistons by about 20 percent.

Jonathan and Andrew Gupta of Birmingham juggled cones for several of their sisters and a yogurt for Mom. They expertly maneuvered between parking lot and storefront, delivering their ice cream order without a single drip. Jonathan prefers the subtle Bubblegum flavor and Andrew sticks with, what else, Blue Moon.

In Royal Oak, the folks at Ray's Ice Cream Company, 4233 Coolidge, depend upon their regulars during the winter when business is a little slow. They sell more sundaes and fewer cones, according to manager Carly Fox.



But they also find success with their one-of-a-kind novelty items, like ice cream cordial fruit. The hand-crafted ice cream apples, peaches and strawberries are filled with dessert liqueurs specially selected to complement the flavor of ice cream used for each mold. These unique creations are absolutely lifelike in color and shape — a wonderful centerpiece for a dessert buffet.

Ray's also molds its homemade ice cream and sherbets into miniature fruits, flowers, animal shapes and holiday designs. Look for cupid hearts and cooing doves for Valentine's Day.

Yogurt yummies

If you haven't tried Hudson's Yogurt Express, take a break on your next shopping trip and stand in line for a fresh fruit sundae. The nonfat yogurt contains only 90 calories per four-ounce serving and the taste is beyond compare — rich and creamy.

Choose three fruits from among the strawberries, kiwi, melon, bananas, grapes, apples and raspberries. Top with a granola, chocolate chip, raisin mixture and you have a delicious light lunch.

"I usually get a cup of vanilla with strawberries," said Althea Pearson of Detroit. But on this visit to Hudson's at Fairlane, she dared to try a new flavor: white chocolate macadamia. "It's really good," she said. "Plus it's a good price and a large serving." (\$1.65)





Who owns the malls?

In some cases, professional mall owners run chains of retail operations. In

other cases, malls are owned by a private investor whose mall is just one of many diversified holdings.

Lakeside in Sterling Heights, Twelve Oaks in Novi, Fairlane Town Center in Dearborn and Briarwood in Ann Arbor are all Taubman Shopping Centers, owned and managed by the Alfred Taubman Properties headquartered in Bloomfield Hills: Taubman has 20 other shopping centers throughout the United States.

Summit Place in Waterford and Tel Twelve Mall in Southfield are owned and managed by

Ramco-Gershenson, Inc. of Southfield. Ramco-Gershenson also owns West Oaks I and II in Novi, the Southfield Plaza and New Town in Livonia. All totaled, Ramco-Gershenson operates 30 shopping centers in the United States.

At one point, Northland, Southland, Eastland and Westland malls were all owned by the Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States headquartered in Chicago. These centers are operated by retail management firms that periodically changed through the years.

Southland of Taylor was sold in 1989 to the Rouse Co. of Columbia, Md., which owns and operates Southland through a joint venture with Signa. The Rouse Co. has 75 retail centers throughout the country.

Northland of Southfield is still owned by Equitable, but in limited partnership with Shearson-Leahman. It is managed by General Growth Management Co., based in Minneapolis, Minn.

Westland and Eastland remain Equitable holdings, though last

year, the management company changed from General Growth to Compass Retail Inc. based in Atlanta, Ga. The Livonia Mall is owned by partners Jack Shenkman and George R. Klein, trust, based in Farmington Hills. Shenkman owns a second shopping center in Wisconsin.

Schostak shopping

Laurel Park Place and Wonderland Mall in Livonia, Macomb Mall in Roseville and Universal Mall in Warren are Schostak Brothers and Co. partnerships, also managed by the company, which is based in Southfield.

The Schostak company also owns and manages several strip centers in the area: Northpointe in Utica, Seven Mile/Farmington Center in Livonia, Shelby Corners in Utica, Pointe Plaza in Grosse Pointe, Sterling Center in Sterling Heights, Universal Plaza in Warren and Windmill Plaza in Sterling Heights.

The Oakland Mall in Troy is owned by Oakland Mall Ltd., a partnership with managers Jay Kogan and Douglas Mossman, based in Bloomfield Hills. The partnership also owns Oakland Plaza and Oakland Square across from the mall.

The Somerset Collection is a Forbes/Cohen-Frankel property.

Forbes/Cohen has shopping centers throughout the United States.

The Orchard Mall in West Bloomfield is owned by a private partnership, with Arthur Sills, the managing partner, based in West Bloomfield. The company owns several other neighborhood and community shopping centers in Indiana, Ohio and northern Michigan.

Applegate Square in Southfield, and The Boardwalk and Sugar Tree in West Bloomfield, are marketed by Blooma Siegal and owned by several groups of private investors, according to Siegal.

Meadowbrook Village Mall in Rochester Hills is a Robert B. Aikens & Associates Inc. property, which is based in Troy. The company owns several office buildings in the area and three regional shopping centers in the southeast.

Another Rochester shopping center, Great Oaks Mall, is managed by Jacobson's and owned by Troy developer Sam Frankel. The Winchester Mall in Rochester Hills was recently purchased by Sherr Development of Farmington Hills, which also owns a small shopping center at 14 Mile and Orchard Lake Road in Farmington Hills.

Andrea Jovine hopes you will, because she insists she has you in mind when she comes up with her collections.

"I was one of the first American designers to offer designer clothing for women at realistic prices to bridge the gap between the high-priced lines and the mainstream labels," she said. "In 1991, I introduced *Essentials*, 16 to 20 pieces of clothing meant to be the can't-live-without staples of a woman's wardrobe.

"I design knits, primarily, because they're a way of life, not a fashion trend. Knits are comfortable and easy to care for. They

also give a little and cooperate when the scale goes up and down."

Jovine came to town recently to meet customers at Neiman Marcus in The Somerset Collection, Troy. Over tea at the Townsend Hotel in downtown Birmingham, she explained how much she enjoys road trips where she can get feedback on her clothes from the people who buy and wear them.

Jovine and her knits have become a \$70 million business. Under the direction of CEO Victor Coopersmith, former Adrienne Vittadini executive and Andrea's

husband, Jovine has expanded into European and Canadian markets and introduced lines for both petite and larger-sized women. A boutique in China is on the horizon as well as a line of Jovine accessories.

Jovine, in her "mid-30s," graduated from New York's Fashion Institute of Technology and went to work at a lingerie company where she soon became a design assistant.

"My father was a designer and my sister and I grew up with a mother who loved beautiful clothes," she said. "Mom's color-coordinated rolling racks are legendary. I guess I always knew I'd be a designer because I love to sketch and I get inspired by everything around me."

Jovine credits her success in the highly competitive fashion field to an ability to give customers what they want, coupled with a dedicated interest in the inner workings of her garments.

"Before something appears in my collection, I wear it to see how it works," she confided. "If I'm working on a new waistband for a pair of pants, for example, I'll take them traveling for a week to see how it wears."

Jovine collections of savvy sportswear and dresses can be easily accessorized and pieces can be interchanged for different looks. Black dominates but colors are included. It all gets back to giving customers what they want — convenience, quality and value.

"The pieces in my collection are priced between \$100 to \$200," she said. "They're investment pieces that can be interpreted and worn differently by each Jovine customer. My customers are independent personalities who are confident about their clothing."

National ads feature Atticus, Jovine's black Labrador retriever, who has sparked Jovine's interest in animal rights. Atticus resides at the Manhattan headquarters where his face appears on cameos in the Jovine collection.

"Hey, you have to have a sense of humor about what you're doing," she said with a grin. "After all, I'm designing clothes here, this is not brain surgery. I hope this attitude comes across in my collections so they have some spark."

Jovine's president, Dennis Gay, had words of praise for his boss as he listened to her talk about her designs.

"Don't let her fool you," he said. "She works long and hard to bring out a collection. The glamour and glitz of this business is really a myth. At Andrea Jovine, we're all everyday people."

Looking ahead to her spring collection, Jovine said colors will be strong, especially reds, blues and greens. "But always colors that work well with black," she added.

A home under construction on the slopes of Snow Mass in Colorado has Jovine designing interiors these days. "It's a whole new adventure," she mused. "Maybe I'll get into home furnishings some day, too."

Livonia store for what was probably the last time.

"There's hardly anything left," she sighed. "I'm going to miss this store. My daughters shopped here too. It's hard to believe it's already closing. The store was always busy."

The seven Source Club stores, owned by Meijer's, have been liquidating since December. Most

are nearly sold out, a month prior to the designated Jan. 31 closing date. Some will close next week, according to Meijer spokesman John Zimmerman.

"The closing dates will be determined on a store-to-store basis," he said. "The liquidation went well because there were so

many bargains to be had. The few remaining items will be absorbed into Meijer's stock."

Zimmerman hinted that the Source Club facilities may be sold soon. Discussions with prospective buyers have been taking place since November.

According to Source Club employees at the Livonia and West-

land stores, the bulk of merchandise went over New Year's weekend during a buying frenzy when checkout lines stretched across the huge warehouses.

The bright green and white Source Club stores had operated in Grand Rapids, Meridian Township, Taylor, Fraser, Westland and Livonia since 1993.

Photographer uses camera to see reality

Alicia Gbur documents a part of life few people see — female impersonators, transvestites and leather fashion shows in stark black and white photographs.

Last fall she exhibited the erotic, avant-garde images in her first one person show at the Java Coffeehouse in Royal Oak.

Using photography's power to record, Gbur allows the viewer to become a voyeur inside the counter cultures. Her images seem almost cinematic like stills from a movie. She merely acts as a lightning rod attracting all who dare look to complete their own story.

Dressed in black leather outfits with S & M overtones, the men and women featured in the Noir Leather fashion shows seem like characters in an X-rated movie. In the photographs of the female impersonators, Gbur captures fleeting moments of their acts unveiling the men's heavy makeup and exaggerated femininity in black and white.

The question is why would a straight chick raised in Grosse Pointe want to focus on sexual persuasions long kept hidden in the shadows?

"I do harsher subjects because it's there. Photography is a way to see reality. It was this whole different aspect of lifestyle that you wouldn't see normally," said Gbur who earned a bachelor of fine arts degree in photography from Wayne State University.

"Art is (meant) to have people see things they usually don't see whether it's a drawing, a painting or a photograph. It gives them a whole different way of looking at things, to give them some kind of insight."

The series taught her about alternative lifestyles. Initially, Gbur had dreamed up the concept for a project to fulfill a final photography requirement to earn her degree. A bit of a rebel, a bit of a photojournalist at heart, Gbur set out with the help of a male friend to portray the gay nightclub scene in Detroit.

"I wanted to spice up my final project but what I found is, there's stories behind the people," said the multi-talented 25-year-old.

Folk roots surface for festival

■ During the last 25 years, The Ark has launched the careers of several folk artists. This month the venue will benefit from the Ann Arbor Folk Festival which will feature an eclectic lineup including Michelle Shocked, Richard Thompson and Bela Fleck.

There are very few folk music venues left in the country that enjoy the benevolent sort of reputation that has been the Ark's for the past quarter century.

It's therefore appropriate that the 17th annual Ann Arbor Folk Festival, set for Saturday, Jan. 29, will serve in part as a fund-raiser for the Ann Arbor institution.

Both the event and the venue have served as launching pad and home away from home for a widely diverse cast of characters over the

years. Though the assembled players at this year's soiree may strike the purists as too eclectic to label "folk," that's precisely where their collective roots lie.

Michelle Shocked, Richard Thompson, Bela Fleck and the Flecktones, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, Tish Hinojosa and David Broza will share the stage with the likes of the House Band, Second Opinion, Deadbeat Society and emcee Cheryl Wheeler this time out. Sure, it's a long way from Tom Paxton and Doc Watson, but consider the following:

Michelle Shocked, best known for her "Short, Sharp Shocked" album and its hits, "If Love Was a Train," "Anchorage" and "When I Grow Up," can trace her roots easily to an indigenous musical homestead in Gilmore, Texas. Rated by critics and fans throughout the country, as the premier recording of 1988, it was a solid seller across the board, which is about as unheard of in folk circles as flying from one gig to the next, as opposed to gasing up the station wagon. Its followup, "Captain Swing," was a most decided sidestep, even for our heroine, but it's Louis Jordan meets Eddie Cochran grooves and songs like "On the Greener Side" and "(Don't You Mess Around With My) Little Sister" helped make it a healthy mover in the record stores as well.

Her latest effort, though, brings her full circle. "Arkansas Traveler," recorded on the Winnebago interstate with an 18-wheeler recording studio in tow, was released in 1992

to still more critical acclaim. It harkens back to "The Texas Campfire Tapes," recorded in the mid-1980s at the Kerrville Folk Festival, direct-to-Walkman by British fan Pete Lawrence and initially released on the British Cooking Vinyl label.

The difference here is that there is a budget and a guest roster from heaven to spice it up. Ranging from Pops Staples to Gatemouth Brown, members of the Band, the Red Clay Ramblers, Taj Mahal and The Hot House Flowers to Uncle Tupelo, Doc Watson, Alison Krauss and Michelle's dad, Dollar Bill Johnston, the magic of this "Arkansas Traveler" lies in the enormous passion that she brings to each tune.

Having seen the Michelle Shocked band, with her dad and

brother in tow, a few years ago, I heartily recommend her to anyone with a taste for music that has something to say and a wholly infectious way of imparting the wisdom — sort of like "folk" music.

One of the finest songwriters on the planet, Michelle Shocked remains one of the most impassioned performers out there.

Richard Thompson, through his affiliation with Fairport Convention, the pre-eminent British folk aggregation of the late 1960s and early 1970s, is a name familiar to folk-rock enthusiasts the world over, though rock fans may be more familiar with his status as one of the most revered electric guitarists on the planet.

DSO makes overtures to younger crowd

To people unfamiliar with the symphony, attending a Detroit Symphony Orchestra concert can seem intimidating or boring.

Keeping that in mind, the DSO started "Overtures," a group geared toward attracting young, urban and suburban professionals. Members of the group throw parties in restaurants like Joe Muer's in Detroit or El Zocalo in the city's Mexican Town district with Detroit Symphony Orchestra performances as centerpieces.

"It was to create a setting for young people to enjoy the symphony (in a) setting that's not intimidating or overly stuffy," said Jill Woodward, public relations director for the DSO.

Steering committee member Lisa Toenniges said the group hopes to pi-

quet an interest in the symphony within the "twentysomething to fortysomething" crowd so they may one day invest in the DSO.

"(It is) to get young people interested and involved in the symphony. The ultimate goal would be that they would one day become a subscriber. There is absolutely no fund raising (with Overtures). Other groups do that," said Toenniges, a Bloomfield Township resident.

At the last Overtures outing, guest conductor Hans Vonk led the orchestra through Schumann's "Symphony No. 2," Prokofiev's "Violin Concerto No. 1" and Stravinsky's "Symphonies of Wind Instruments." Featured soloist was the DSO's concertmaster, violinist Emmanuelle Boisvert. Afterward, the Overtures group as well as a few young DSO members, drove to Joe Muer's in Detroit to chat and to

sample the restaurant's dishes.

Toenniges said that trendy new restaurants are chosen so young adults can be introduced to them inexpensively.

Professionals from a variety of backgrounds attend the Overtures events.

"One of the couples I met from the original committee, she's an attorney and he's in real estate. Another guy writes computer programs for children. Some of the young musicians come. It's a lot of young professionals — single and married," she said.

Toenniges, whose husband Jeff is also on the steering committee, stressed that Overtures is not a formal group. Schedules are sent out at the beginning of each season to those who wish to be on the mailing list. Those interested may participate in any or all of the events.

"The group is not something you need to join and we like to stress that. That way people don't feel like they have to make a commitment which is hard for people our age," she said.

Toenniges, who studied music in college, incidentally found out about Overtures through an article in The Observer & Eccentric Newspapers five years ago.

The next Overtures outing is on Sunday, Jan. 23, when the group throws a joint 3:30 p.m. brunch with the Detroit Institute of Arts' Founders Junior Council at the DIA's atrium. The brunch will be followed by a gallery tour and the concert.

"That should be a real big one; they're two groups that have a lot in common. Overtures can be anywhere from 40 people to 80 people and the

Subtle wit makes 'Snapper'

In "The Snapper," a young woman announces to her parents that she is pregnant. On top of that, she refuses to divulge the identity of the father.

What could have been either depressing or cloying is instead an incredibly wise and often hilarious film about fathers and daughters and their fragile place in the community. The new film, directed by Stephen Frears, plays at the Detroit Film Theatre this weekend only.

Set in Dublin, "The Snapper" is the second film adaptation of Roddy Doyle's "Barrytown Trilogy," short novels about the everyday lives of the Irish working class. "The Commitments," directed by Alan Parker in 1991, focused on a rag-tag group of musicians intent on introducing soul to Dublin, led by a young entrepreneur named Jimmy.

The new movie is essentially about Jimmy's same large Irish-Catholic family, again headed by Colm Meaney as the beleaguered but good-natured father Dessie. While there are no big-name stars in "The Snapper," you'll recog-

nize Meaney as a crew member on "Star Trek: The Next Generation" and be surprised at his tremendous depth.

Dessie has the same weaknesses as any parent. He's incredibly supportive of daughter Sharon, reading health books and generally taking a much greater interest than he did in the birth of his own children. He can be a martyr, too, laying on thick doses of Catholic guilt because the girl's condition has caused him embarrassment at the pub.

The drinking scenes are especially vivid, whether they involve dad and his cronies sharing a pint or the tableful of loud young women shamelessly ogling men on the dance floor. It was on just such a night that the daughter got herself in trouble. Just who exactly she did it with knocks friends and family for a loop.

The other performers are nearly as strong, especially Tina Kellegher as Sharon. Her mother, meanwhile, has that special blend of wisdom and exhaustion that comes from raising a large litter of

children. As in "The Commitments," this movie captures perfectly the cramped living conditions that typify the working class in Dublin and London. The entire family squeezes onto the tatty couch to watch music videos or sail races on television.

And in each action, whether it's a tender pat or a biting vulgarity, the family shows a great natural affection for each other that is hard to convey on screen. More than any film in recent memory, "The Snapper" makes you feel like you're watching real people, not actors.

Give plenty of credit to Stephen Frears, the director of "My Beautiful Laundrette" and "Dangerous Liaisons," who has abandoned Hollywood temporarily to create the kind of subtle film that established his reputation a decade ago. He has made a movie full of small miracles that will creep into your thoughts long after the lights come up.

You may not go home humming Otis Redding songs, as you did after "The Commitments," but you'll be singing the praises of this witty and intelligent film.

Duran Duran/James The Palace of Auburn Hills Jan. 4

"Come Undone" may be the name of a Duran Duran hit single, but it should have been the official name of their winter U.S. tour.

Unlike their show this summer at Pine Knob, which featured an elaborate interactive set designed by Stefanos Lazaridis, the band opted for a scaled-down set that included a black curtain backdrop and simple lighting.

The stripped-down set, however, didn't hamper the show. Plagued by voice problems during the summer and early fall, lead singer Simon LeBon's voice sounded significantly fresher and less hoarse. Ex-Soul II Soul singer Lamua Al Mugheiry boosted LeBon's vocals with her throaty rhythm and blues style. Like the show in the summer, her solo during "Come Undone" was one of the highlights of the performance.

During the two-hour show, Duran Duran opted for a moody, soulful rendition of "Hungry Like the Wolf," and a cover of Grandmaster Flash's "White Lines" (thanks to John Taylor's funky bass playing). The former 1980s heartthrobs

stuck with the original formula when singing many of their hits like "Girls on Film," "Rio" and "The Reflex." The set was less of a "greatest hits" show than the summer, choosing to include more tracks off their latest eponymous album.

Those who missed the show, can catch it on Fox 50's "Front Page" television series, which airs at 9 p.m. Saturdays. A crew filmed the show and backstage footage for a future telecast. (An air date was not available at press time.)

The British pop band James, which opened the show, performed a rather lackluster set. The Palace's massive stage swallowed the band although James boasts an 8-member band, including a violinist. Lead singer Tim Booth danced wildly during a few songs but rocked back and forth during songs off their latest album "Laid." Songs from moody yet hauntingly beautiful album were a significant part of the set which didn't include their alternative pop hit "Sit Down."

Gbur found that while many of the cross dressers were thrilled to pose for her in full drag, only a few would allow themselves to be shown without their makeup. When she tried to interview several of the men as part of the research for the project, they gave her the slip.

"It's this whole facade people put on when I photograph them. It's reality, harsh, that stark. They're afraid of being seen like that. A lot of them like to have that illusion created. They don't like to have that destroyed."

To shoot through the masks Gbur used a Pentax 35mm camera equipped with a wide angle lens, and black and white film. Test shots using color film lacked

the harshness she was after which would unveil the layers of reality.

"I like documentary or journalistic photography; it wakes people up," said Gbur. "A lot of the stuff I do lends itself to black and white. Black and white separates the viewer from the image. It seems to have more impact. The color didn't have the drama of black and white."

Gbur enjoys experimenting with different techniques, shooting from different angles and doing her own printing. In addition she likes to shoot at a fast pace she says, because it freezes moments of our lives.

"I like catching things as I find them. Sometimes I might shoot 10 rolls and not get anything. Art

tells stories of life. Art is music."

The fine arts and music run like silver threads through Gbur's life. The daughter of music teachers, she started taking piano lessons in the third grade. She played violin in the school orchestra then played standup bass in high school. From there it seemed a logical progression to play electric bass with a jazz band.

Three years ago she taught herself acoustic guitar. That's when she became a member of Sister Seed, who won the Metro Times' 1993 award for best folk group and Blue Nation, a seven-member alternative hard rock band.

Gbur's hectic lifestyle finds her dividing time between practicing and recording with the two

groups, working more than 40 hours a week as an assistant to fashion photographer Paul Mobley, and creating her own camera work. She says yet has not decided whether or not she will continue her current series on the alternative lifestyles. However, her latest images focus on female nudes.

"I'm always moving and changing; I think everyone's always growing," Gbur said. "I like working with the figures. I like the human side."

"I'm visual as well as musical. Sound can be inspirational to create an image for me. I can't see doing one and not the other. I love doing both. I'm fairly creative. It's important to me to be creative."

POINTS OF VIEW

Kevorkian is in the tradition of true rebels

What does Dr. Jack Kevorkian have in common with Dr. Martin Luther King, Robert F. Kennedy, Muhammed Ali, H.D. Thoreau, Mae West, George Washington and the mythic Queen Guinevere (a legendary feminist)? All of them are — or were — what I call "RRR's" — Real Righteous Rebels. The RRR embodies all of what it means to be free — and thus to be American.

While preparing a Martin Luther King Day speech that the Lakes Area Council for Diversity asked me to deliver to representatives from Wixom, Walled Lake, Farmington Hills, West Bloomfield, White Lake, Commerce Township and Novi, I was driven to seriously contemplate the nature of real righteous rebelliousness.

An RRR is a righteously reason-driven, altruistic, idealistic, iconoclastic, indomitably dynamic rebel leader who is ready to die for freedom and jus-

tice. He/she is also a dauntless, resiliently innovative individualist who refuses to sit in any "assigned seat." (Does the eagle in the sky have an assigned seat?) RRR's can work from either inside or outside the "system" — but they invariably and veritably are champions of chance. (On a less esoteric note, true rebels are those restless souls who would rather go to hell if it were lively than drift dreamily in heaven.)

Often, one can best characterize an individual by conceptualizing what he isn't. What an RRR isn't is an "N-R" (Non-Rebel) — a dull, mindlessly unquestioning, ethnocentric, frequently bigoted, fearful, obsequious conformist. "What would the neighbors think?" are the first words out of the mouth of an infant N-R. N-R's aren't free. Freedom frightens them. If your friends are all N-R's, never get into any serious kind of trouble or controversy if

you can't bear to stand alone. What an RRR also isn't is a "Ps-R"

(Pseudo-Rebel). Pseudo-Rebels will break a rule simply because it's a rule. Their only cause is to conform to non-conformity in a showy, superficial way. They are rebel wanna-be's — self-aggrandizing, tough-talking but gutless posers who sometimes are also bullies (but only in absolutely no-risk situation). Andrew Dice Clay is a perfect example.

The ideological — and active — antithesis of the Real Righteous Rebel is the "Anti-Rebel" (A-R) — a fanatical protector of the status quo. Anti-Rebels brand Dr. Kevorkian a "Rogue Rebel" — a societal renegade, a rebel gone bad. (Fidel Castro is a genuine contemporary example of a Rogue Rebel, or "RR." Gangsters or leaders of hate groups are more sinister versions.) Anti-Rebels can often be roguish, too — what I call "RAR's" (Rogue anti-Rebels). RAR's are anti-Rebels who stoop to illegal or unfair means to fight

Real Righteous Rebels (or to pretend to fight them in order to gain the political or financial support of other anti-Rebels or of Non-Rebels). Russian ultranationalist Vladimir Zhirinovskiy is an RAR, and clergymen Jim Bakker and Jimmy Swaggart are two particularly lecherous and acquisitive examples.

Anti-Rebels are all wrong about Dr. Jack Kevorkian. He is no Rogue Rebel, but rather a true and Real Righteous Rebel. Rogue Rebels have primarily selfish goals. Dr. Kevorkian, on the other hand, is crusading for every hopelessly-ill human being's right to choose a dignified, pain-free and peaceful death.

THE RESPONSES:

The Dow Jones will be at 3915, a figure derived by averaging all the guesses submitted. The highest number submitted from some eternal optimist was 4400, the low 2900. Fourteen people said school funding will be via the ballot question — the sales tax. Nine said the income tax. An uninformed four said "both." It was a 19-7 vote that said Michael

Jackson won't be convicted of a sex crime this year. A couple of people stipulated that it was more because the wheels of justice revolve so slowly rather than a determination of his guilt or innocence.

It was the Clintons' all the way for "Man of the Year" honors. However, Hillary got twice as many votes as Bill, 11 to 5. Boris Yeltsin got 4.

Assisted suicide won't be legalized in Michigan this year, according to 16 predictors. Ten said it would.

It was also a 16-10 decision that Wayne Fontes would hold on to his job. (And of course this was taken ahead of the Lions winning the NFC Central Division championship.)

Russia will experience the greatest turmoil, according to 12 people. China got seven votes. Israel, Germany, Japan and Iraq were other mentions. Jim Blanchard got the nod for U.S. Senate with 10 votes. Ronna Romney

got five votes; Bill Brodhead, three. Clinton will have the same popularity rating as now, according to the average of predictions submitted. His highest rating was 75, lowest, 35 percent.

Many native Detroiters, most of whom now live in our suburbs, were among the partygoers who said by a 23 to 3 margin that Detroit would be a safer city in 1994. But they were evenly divided as to whether they would go there more frequently or the same as they do today. One person said he/she would go less often.



Do something nutty, bake an elegant torte

Enough talk about diets, New Year's resolutions, healthy this and good-for-you-that. Sometimes the hustle and bustle of holidays makes us nutcases. Now that it's time to settle down, regroup, chill out, take a deep breath, and yield our lives to a higher power, my inner soul begs to spend an afternoon in the kitchen.

I love making a mess creating, using every utensil, and then sinking into my comfy recliner with a glass of milk and my sinful creation. Cooking is therapy for some, a cross to bear for others.

The soul cried out for something nutty. The pantry had but a sprinkling of flour, the sheer remains from the holiday cookie and bread requests.

The refrigerator was as barren as the checkbook, holding forth to the usual condiments, milk and half tub of diet margarine.

Hidden behind the half-green-speckled chunk of dried-out cream cheese in the butter keeper was nothing more than 3 tablespoons of toast-crumbsprinkled butter. In the vegetable crisper was a bag crammed with hazelnuts. Suddenly I was overcome with an idea - I would make a nut cake.

Nutty cake

Some people call them tortes, a term that comes from the German word for cake. Like many of Europe's most elegant desserts, these are made primarily of nuts rather than flour.

Versatile and easily adaptable to the meal or the occasion, they are delicious served with or without adornment. Adding fillings and frosting makes them spectacular. Little or no butter is needed - the oil in the nuts takes its place, so to speak, giving the cake a rich texture.

The very richness of the nuts, however, is not a blessing. If not handled properly, they can make a cake heavy. To ensure maximum lightness, a high proportion of eggs should be used in the basic batter. The yolks and whites should be beaten separately to incorporate air into both.

Cooking tip

A pinch of sugar is beaten into both the yolks and the whites to thicken and ensure stability. The only trick the cook must be aware of is the correct folding technique.

When you are incorporating the beaten whites into the nut batter, incorporate them together in small batches. If the nut batter was added all at once, their weight could cause the entire cake to fall.

Put aside the whisk and dig out the biggest spatula you can find. Swoop into the nut batter with the whites much the same way you would dig into a five-gallon tub of ice cream. Because these cakes contain little or no flour, they are quite fragile. Often the top of the cake settles back down a little when cooling, but this is normal and nothing to worry about.

To help this kind of cake keep its shape, it should cool on top of a wire rack. Invert the cake before serving or frosting so that the flat side becomes the top of the cake. Almost any kind of nut can be used; almonds and hazelnuts are the classic choices. Macadamias, pecans, Brazil nuts and even walnuts can, if you don't mind the pun, "take the cake."

For optimum results, you might be interested in knowing that the best tortes use nuts that are finely ground. Blend, grind or process nuts in small batches, stopping to scrape down the sides of the bowl occasionally.

For maximum lightness, beat the egg whites last. A little trick I learned in cooking school was to fold the beaten whites in clockwise while turning the bowl counter-clockwise. (Reverse the directions if you are left handed.) Fold them into the batter as described and immediately transfer them to a prepared pan and place in a preheated oven.

Since these tortes have the benefit of the oil naturally occurring in the nuts, they can be made two to three days ahead. Wrap the torte tightly, and kept it refrigerated. Remove the torte from the refrigerator at least two hours before eating to get the best flavors. When it comes to frostings and toppings, you can whip up a butter cream or blend a coulis. (Coulis is a fruit puree.) By the time the finished torte is removed from my oven, I am ready to add just a dollop of Cool Whip spiked with a little Grand Marnier or even easier, a dusting of powdered sugar flavored with a pinch of cinnamon or cocoa powder. Happy New Year!

What they say - "Those who indulge, bulge." Let master baker Susan Purdy show you how to reduce fat not flavor.

Baking is a lot like chemistry, it's a science. "You cannot just pick up your favorite recipe and substitute a low-fat item to get the same result without experimentation," said Susan Purdy, author of the newly published "Have Your Cake and Eat It Too," (William Morrow & Co.; Nov. 22, 1993; \$25/hardcover).

"Diet imitation margarine and reduced-fat spreads can contain about 40 percent fat and at least 50 percent water; they, as well as soft tub margarines, are absolutely unreliable for baking," Purdy and I talked about low-fat baking while she was visiting Detroit on a tour as a spokesperson for Knox Unflavored Gelatine, and to promote her book. Her premise is that low-fat doesn't have to taste bad.

A master baker, Purdy's quest to discover low-fat desserts that taste good, began when her mother Frances Joslin Gold was advised to go on a low-fat diet and couldn't have even the smallest slice of a rich dessert.

"Angel food cake, no matter how we tried to disguise it, became old very quickly," she said.

She began her work by analyzing the ingredients to learn the function of each. Then started experimenting to reduce the fat, cholesterol, sugar and salt in "traditional" recipes.

"I don't use artificial ingredients," she said. "All of the ingredients are available in supermarkets. There's nothing odd about them. You can cut back the sugar and salt and keep a good strong taste. I layer flavors and use lots of spices."

Besides recipes which include a nutritional analysis, Purdy's book contains lots of helpful information. She explains how to calculate fat grams and compares the amount of calories and fat in many baking

products including dairy, chocolate and nuts.

She describes the "Lite Touch" notes at the end of recipes as being an adventure story of how the recipe evolved.

Many of the desserts in Purdy's book can be made ahead of time on weekends when you do have time to cook, and frozen do be enjoyed during the week when you don't have time to cook. There are also recipes for muffins, biscuits and pancakes.

"I like these desserts," she said. "They have become part of my repertoire and I hope they will become part of yours."

Here are some of Purdy's tips for

cutting fat, and controlling the amount of salt and leavening in your baked goods.

Make your own cake flour by replacing 2 tablespoons of all-purpose flour with 2 tablespoons cornstarch in every cup. To substitute cake flour for all-purpose flour, use 1 cup plus 2 tablespoons cake flour for every cup of all-purpose.

To add nutritional value to baked goods, you can substitute whole wheat pastry flour for one quarter to one third of the all-purpose flour or cake flour called for in a recipe. Note that moisture absorption differs

HAZELNUT TORTE

1 1/2 cups (about 6 ounces) hazelnuts
 1/4 cup plus 3 tablespoons sugar
 3 tablespoons plus 2 teaspoons flour
 5 eggs separated, and at room temperature
 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar
 3 tablespoons melted butter

Position the rack in the center of the oven and preheat to 350 degrees.

Toast the hazelnuts in a shallow baking pan until skins begin to split, about 8 minutes. Transfer nuts to a strainer and rub nuts with a terry cloth towel to remove most of the skins. Cool nuts completely.

Grease two 9-inch round cake pans and line the base with parchment paper, foil or waxed paper. Grease paper. Dust pans with flour.

Grind 1 1/2 cups of nuts with 1/4 cup of sugar as finely as possible. Transfer to a small bowl and blend in the flour.

Beat egg yolks with 1/4 cup of sugar in a large bowl until pale yellow for 5 minutes. Beat egg whites with the cream of tartar in another bowl until soft peaks form. Beat remaining 3 tablespoons of sugar into whites until they are stiff but not dry.

Fold 1/2 of the nut mixture into the yolks. Repeat with remaining nuts and whites in 2 batches folding just until blended and no streaks remain. Spread batter evenly into prepared pans and bake in the preheated oven for about 30 minutes or until a tester comes out clean. Run a knife around the edges of the pan and invert onto a plate.

Remove the paper and re-invert onto a wire rack. Cool completely.

PECAN SPICE CAKE

3 1/2 cups (12 ounces) pecans
 1 1/2 cups sugar
 3 tablespoons all purpose flour
 2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 1 teaspoon baking powder
 Dash ground cloves
 6 eggs separated, at room temperature
 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar

Position rack in the center of the oven and preheat to 350 degrees. Butter two 9-inch round cake pans. Line the base with parchment paper, foil or waxed paper. Butter paper. Dust pans with flour.

Grind half the nuts with 1/4 cup of sugar until as fine as possible. Repeat with remaining nuts and 1/4 cup more sugar. Sift flour with cocoa, cinnamon, baking powder and cloves onto nuts. Blend well.

Beat yolks with 1/4 cup of sugar until pale yellow for about 5 minutes. Set aside. Beat whites with cream of tartar until soft peaks form then add remaining 1/2 cup sugar one tablespoon at a time. Beat until stiff but not dry.

Fold 1/2 of pecan mixture into the yolks. Fold in 1/2 of the whites. Repeat with remaining nuts and whites in 2 batches folding just until blended and no streaks remain. Spread batter evenly into prepared pans and bake in the preheated oven for about 30 minutes or until a tester comes out clean. Run a knife around the edges of the pan and invert onto a plate.

Remove the paper and re-invert onto a wire rack. Cool completely.

COCOA CHIFFON CAKE

Butter-flavor no stick cooking spray
 1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
 1/2 cup plus 1 tablespoon sifted unsweetened Dutch-processed cocoa
 1 1/4 cups granulated sugar
 2 teaspoons baking powder
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
 1/2 cup canola or safflower oil
 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons warm water
 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
 1 large egg, separated, plus 4 large egg whites
 Pinch of cream of tartar
 2 tablespoons sifted confectioners' sugar
 Confectioners' sugar or unsweetened cocoa

Position rack in the center of the oven and preheat it to 350 degrees. Coat the baking pan (9-inch, 8- to 9-cup Bundt pan) with cooking spray. Lightly sift on unsweetened cocoa, and tap out excess cocoa.

Sift together the cake flour, cocoa, sugar, baking powder, salt and cinnamon into a large bowl. Make a well in the center of the dry ingredients and add the oil, water, vanilla, and egg yolk. Do not mix at this point; set aside.

Place the egg whites in a large grease-free bowl and add the cream of tartar. Using an electric mixer on medium speed, whip the whites until foamy. Add the 2 tablespoons confectioners' sugar and whip until stiff but not dry. Scrape the beaters into the bowl. Set the whites aside and, without washing beaters, return them to the mixer.

With the mixer on low speed, beat the flour and oil mixture just until well blended. In several additions, gently fold the chocolate batter into the whipped whites. Don't worry if a few streaks remain.

Turn the batter into the prepared pan and smooth the top with a rubber spatula. Tap the pan sharply once on the counter to remove large air bubbles. Bake for about 40 to 45 minutes, or until the cake is well-risen and slightly springy to the touch, and a cake tester inserted in the center comes out clean. (The top of the cake will be slightly cracked.)

Cool the cake in the pan on a wire rack for 10 minutes. Use the tip of a long thin knife to loosen the cake from the sides and center tube of the pan. Top the cake with a wire rack or plate and invert. Lift off the

pan, and cool completely. To serve, dust the top of the cake with a light sifting of confectioners' sugar or unsweetened cocoa. Slice the cake with a serrated knife. Yield 16 servings.

Baker's notes: You can make your own cake flour by replacing 2 tablespoons of all-purpose flour with 2 tablespoons of cornstarch in every cup. Cake can be baked in advance, wrapped airtight, and frozen for up to 1 week. It will keep fresh at room temperature for several days.

OATMEAL RAISIN COOKIES

Butter-flavor no stick cooking spray
 1 cup dark brown sugar, packed
 1 large egg
 3 tablespoons canola or safflower oil
 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
 1/4 cup unsweetened applesauce
 1/2 cup very finely chopped apple
 2 cups old-fashioned rolled oats
 1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
 1 teaspoon baking soda
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg

3 tablespoons toasted wheat germ
 1 cup seedless raisins
 Position 2 racks to divide the oven in thirds, and preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Coat cookie sheets with cooking spray or line them with baking parchment.

In a large bowl, combine the sugar, egg, oil, vanilla, applesauce, and chopped apple. Whisk to blend, or beat well with an electric mixer.

In another bowl, combine the oats, flour, baking soda, salt, spices, wheat germ, and raisins. Toss to blend well. Add to the sugar-egg mixture and blend with a wooden spoon or the electric mixer on medium-low speed. Do not overmix.

Drop the batter by the tablespoonful onto the prepared sheets, spacing the cookies about 2 inches apart. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes, until golden brown; the longer cooking time results in a crisper cookie. Use a spatula to transfer cookies to wire racks to cool. Yield 3 dozen cookies.

Baker's note: Batter can be prepared ahead and refrigerated up to 3 days, or frozen for up to 1 month. The baked cookies are best fresh; if desired, bake small batches, and store any unbaked batter in the refrigerator or freezer.

with each type of flour and you will have to adjust or add more liquid to compensate if the batter looks too dry. Whole grain flours are also heavier than white, and they are not recommended for sponge or fine-grained layer cakes.

■ One or two tablespoons sifted soy flour or sifted non-instant powdered milk can be substituted for an equal amount of flour in most cookie or muffin recipes. Soy flour causes quicker browning, so when baking with it, lower the oven temperature by 25 degrees.

■ As a substitute for buttermilk (though lacking its rich flavor), you can make your own soured milk by adding 1 tablespoon white vinegar or lemon juice to one cup 1 percent or 2 percent milk; let it sit for about 3 minutes before using it. Or, blend 1 cup of

skim milk with 2 or 3 tablespoons nonfat yogurt.

■ As a substitute for heavy cream as a sauce, not for whipping, you can use "light" ricotta cheese or low-fat cottage cheese, whipped in a blender, then stirred into a little low-fat vanilla or plain yogurt.

■ In general, as a substitute for one whole egg, use two egg whites; for two whole eggs, use one egg plus one egg white, or three whites. Be aware that too many egg whites in a batter can have a drying effect; use them judiciously. For use in cake batters, eggs should be at room temperature. If they are very cold, set them, in the shell, in a bowl of warm water for about 10 minutes.

■ As a general rule, it is possible to cut the fat from a "traditional" recipe by one quarter to one third.

Watts Family shares favorite tried and true recipes

CHICKEN STIR-FRY

- 1 tablespoon peanut or vegetable oil
- 1 pound skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
- 2 medium carrots, peeled and thinly sliced
- ½ pound mushrooms, sliced
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- ½ cup sliced green onions (cut into 1-inch lengths), included

ing the white part
8 ounces snow pea pods, trimmed
1 can (8 ounces) sliced bamboo shoots, drained
1 can (8 ounces) water chestnuts, drained and sliced
Terriyaki sauce (enough to cover chicken, about ½ cup)
Lemon juice
Soy sauce (optional)

Cut chicken crosswise on a diagonal into very thin slices. Place in a resealable bag and marinate in refrigerator overnight in terriyaki sauce.

Preheat wok. When hot add oil and heat. Add 5-6 pieces of chicken to vegetable oil and stir frequently.

Remove cooked chicken and set aside. Repeat cooking chicken until all chicken is cooked.

Add fresh vegetables, any combination can be used, to wok. Stir frequently. When vegetables take on bright colors (2-3 minutes) squeeze lemon juice over them. Cover and steam for 1 minute, remove from heat.

Put all cooked chicken back into the wok, squeeze on lemon juice, soy sauce (if desired) and heat 2-3 minutes. Place on plate and garnish with parsley.

Serve with rice.

Cook's note: This dish is excellent for adults as they can combine chicken and vegetables and serve on

rice. Children often choose to eat their chicken separately with barbecue sauce with their vegetables and rice on the side.

LOW-FAT CHOCOLATE SWIRL CHEESECAKE

- 1 (8-ounce) package semi-sweet chocolate morsels, about 1 cup
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 ¼ cups Graham cracker crumbs
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- ¼ cup Promise margarine, melted
- 2 (8-ounce) packages low-fat cream cheese, softened
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- ¾ cup sugar

½ cup non-fat sour cream or yogurt
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
Eggbeaters equivalent to 4 eggs

Ingredients should be at room temperature. Use a 9-inch springform pan.

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Over hot (not boiling) water, combine semi-sweet chocolate morsels and ¼ cup sugar; heat until morsels melt and mixture is smooth. Remove from heat; set aside.

In a small bowl, combine Graham cracker crumbs, 2 tablespoons sugar and the margarine; mix well. Pat firmly into 9-inch springform pan, covering bottom and 1 inch up sides; set aside.

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and lemon juice until light and creamy. Gradually beat in ¼ cup sugar. Mix in sour cream (or yogurt) and vanilla extract. Add Eggbeaters, slowly, beating well. Divide batter in half.

Stir melted chocolate mixture into one half. Pour into crumb lined pan; cover with plain batter. With a knife, swirl chocolate batter through plain batter to marbelize. Bake 60 minutes or until only a 2-3 inch circle in center will shake. Cool at room temperature; refrigerate until ready to serve.

Cook's note: For deliciously different flavors, vary the crumb crusts, use cinnamon-flavored Graham crackers.

CASEINATE IN YOUR COFFEE?

Can a person who is sensitive to milk products expect to safely use a "nondairy" product? Those with milk allergies, therefore, should not allow themselves to be lulled into a false sense of security when they see the word "nondairy" on a label. If a check of the ingredients reveals that caseinate is present, those with a sensitivity to milk should be wary. Under the Food and Drug Administration's new standardized labeling law (which becomes fully effective May 8, 1994), caseinate will have to be identified as a milk ingredient in the statement when used in foods that claim to be nondairy.

½ cup packed brown sugar
½ cup granulated sugar

½ teaspoon baking powder

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees and coat 2 baking sheets with nonstick cooking spray.

Beat the egg, peanut butter, and sugars with an electric mixer until smooth. Add the flour, baking soda, and baking powder and beat until well mixed.

Drop the batter by rounded teaspoonfuls about 2 inches apart onto the baking sheets and bake for 10 to 12 minutes or until the cookies are lightly browned. (For a classic peanut butter cookie appearance, flatten each cookie with the tines of a fork just before baking.) Cool on the cookie sheet for 2 minutes and then cool completely on a wire rack. Repeat until all the cookies are baked.

Bean enchiladas easy one-dish meal

AP — Instead of waiting for stuffed tortillas to heat through in your oven, let them sizzle in your skillet, in a third of the time. Just as speedy is the prep time, made fast by convenient canned ingredients.

Top this easy one-dish meal with a generous sprinkling of Cheddar cheese. Serve the enchiladas with your choice of sour cream or guacamole or both.

CREAMY CHEDDAR-BEAN ENCHILADAS

½ pound ground beef
1 medium onion, chopped (½ cup)
10-ounce can enchilada sauce
10¼-ounce can condensed cream of mushroom soup
½ cup milk
4-ounce can diced green chili peppers, drained
1½ cups shredded Cheddar cheese (6 ounces)
1 cup shredded carrot
3 tablespoons cooking oil
Ten 6-inch corn tortillas
8-ounce can red kidney beans, rinsed, drained and slightly mashed
½ cup chopped pitted ripe olives (optional)

Dairy sour cream or guacamole (optional)

For sauce, in a 12-inch skillet cook ground beef and onion until meat is brown and onion is tender. Drain off fat. Stir in enchilada sauce, condensed soup, milk and chili peppers. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, for 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, set aside ½ cup of the cheese. Stir together remaining cheese and carrot; set aside.

In a heavy medium skillet, heat oil. Dip tortillas, one at a time, in hot oil for 10 seconds or just until limp. Drain on paper towels. (Or, omit oil and wrap tortillas in microwave-safe plastic wrap. Cook on high or 100 percent power for 1 minute or until softened.)

Spread some of the beans down the center of each tortilla. Place a scant 1½ cup of the cheese mixture on each tortilla. If desired, sprinkle with olives. Roll up tortillas; place in the sauce in the skillet. Cover and cook about 5 minutes or until heated through. Sprinkle with reserved 1-3rd cup cheese. If desired, serve with sour cream or guacamole. Makes 5 main-dish servings.

Grocery shopping tips will save you money

AP — Week after week of careful shopping can add up to huge savings. For 1994, resolve to shop smart by using some of the following ideas.

Shop with a plan

Shopping with a list is the best way to keep impromptu purchases to a minimum. Even if you're running to the store to pick up something for dinner, take a mini list. For major shopping trips, keep an ongoing list in your kitchen to jot down foods as you run out.

This adage still rings true: Avoid grocery shopping when you're hungry; otherwise, you'll buy extra items on impulse.

Compare prices. Check the unit price on canned and packaged foods. Then purchase the container that costs less per unit. The "large economy size" will often have the lower unit price. But it may not be a bargain if you have to throw some away.

Buy larger packs of meats and poultry (at a lower cost per pound) and freeze them in family-size portions.

Chicken hindquarters are a great buy. You can make a meal out of the drumsticks, then bone the thighs for a stir-fry another night.

When ham is on sale, ask the butcher to slice all or part of it. (Most butchers will do this at no additional cost.) At home, freeze the sliced ham in quarter-pound portions for sandwiches later on.

You'll pay almost double for frozen seasoned vegetables compared to plain veggies. When you have more time for cooking, buy plain vegetables and add your own sauce or seasonings.

For quenching your family's thirst, buy powdered drink mixes or cans of frozen juice concentrates (such as lemonade) rather than an endless supply of carbonated drinks.

Clip those coupons

Using cents-off coupons is a way of life for many of us. Try these pointers to make your efforts pay off:

Only use coupons for those items that you normally buy. Purchasing an extra food, just because you have a coupon, is no bargain if your family won't eat it.

Get your children involved in clipping and organizing coupons. The payoff: let them keep half of the coupon savings.

Look for stores that refund twice the value of a manufacturer's coupon. Some grocery stores will accept both a manufacturer's coupon and the store's coupon (from a newspaper ad) on the same item. When you can use two coupons on one product, the coupon savings really add up.

Make time to file coupons by category in an easy-to-tote box. Take your coupons with you whenever you shop.

While shopping, compare prices of other foods in the category to see whether the product with the coupon is the best value.

Be a penny-wise cook

With a little extra kitchen time, you can shave dollars off your grocery bill.

Make homemade "convenience" foods. Fix large batches of waffles, breads, plate dinners, spaghetti sauce and lasagna, then freeze them in smaller portions for later meals.

Turn bits and pieces of leftovers (meats, poultry, rice, pasta and vegetables) into a delicious soup or stew.

When a recipe calls for half a can of a fruit or vegetable, freeze the other half in a freezer container. That way, you avoid a refrigerator full of odds and ends that wind up getting pitched (if you don't make a soup as mentioned above).

Salem rally wrecks Canton



When city rivals clash, all sorts of factors are open to analysis. But what this one boiled down to was a battle between two of the best players in Observerland: Canton's Matt Paupore and Salem's James Head. This time, the win went to Head and Salem.

Power vs. perimeter. Plymouth Salem had the power, courtesy of James Head. That translated into a boys basketball victory over Plymouth Canton: 64-57 Friday at Salem.

"It was just a case of tonight, James Head came up big," Canton coach Dave VanWagoner said. "We didn't have an answer for James."

"Tonight we ran into a Big Ten basketball player who played like one."

The Chiefs, now 2-4 overall and 0-1 in the Western Lakes Activities Association, tried to offset Head's power game with Matt Paupore's outside shooting prowess. It nearly worked, but not quite; Head finished with 27 points and 10 rebounds, Paupore totaled 25 points.

Although Head controlled the game down the stretch — he scored 13 of the Rocks' 21 fourth-quarter points, converting 5-of-6 shots from the field — he wasn't nearly as effective in the first half. "He was stepping out on the perimeter too much early on," said Salem coach Bob Brodie.

Considering Canton's weakness is its lack of height — Paupore and Ron Ostach are the tallest starters at 6-foot-3 — having the 6-6 Head, who's headed for Iowa, on the outside offensively certainly suited the Chiefs. Head took just seven first-half shots, making four — one a three-pointer at the halftime buzzer.

Fortunately for Salem, Paupore got off to a slow start, too. He was 3-of-12 from the floor, scoring eight to Head's 10 first-half points.

Head's triple to end the half came five seconds after Canton's Rob Radney had scored to narrow Salem's lead to two. The Rocks, plagued by the Chiefs' perimeter quickness throughout the game, left the court at the half with a 29-24 lead.

They didn't keep it, though. They were consistent in their turnovers, committing 15 in each half, and that allowed Canton to keep it close. When Paupore started finding the range in the third quarter — he converted two threes and had eight points in the period — the Chiefs forced Salem to make some changes.

That left others open for shots. Radney scored twice in the final minute of the third, capping an 8-2 run in the last 2:15 and pushing Canton into a 44-43 lead entering the fourth quarter.

Enter Head, who had attempted just nine shots (making six) from the floor before his fourth-quarter surge. Canton's last lead came on a Paupore jumper with 7:16 left in the game, making it 46-45. Sanjeev Seth regained the lead for Salem with a basket 30 seconds later, and Head insured it by scoring the Rocks' next seven points in an 11-2 run.


James McDonald, a 6-4 junior, added 14 points for Salem. Canton got 10 from Radney.

"It was a good, solid game for James," said Brodie afterward. Not that he wasn't without concerns: "I was worried about (Paupore) finding the range, I was worried about their quickness, I was worried about our turning it over too much."

"We've turned it over a lot this season. But we're inexperienced, really. Plus we're an up-tempo team, so we're going to have a lot of turnovers."

"But I don't care if we turn it over 50 times, as long as we get the win." The Rocks got that, improving their record to 5-1.

The start has been an ominous one. First, Plymouth Salem finished second in the season-opening Western Lakes Activities Association Relays, eight points behind upstart Farmington. So what, you ask? Well, according to Salem coach Chuck Olson, the Relays meet winner goes on to win the WLAA title 80 percent of the time.

Considering Salem is the defending WLAA champs, such a statistic does not bode well. Tuesday's opening dual meet made matters worse — a 93-90 loss to Ann Arbor Huron at Ann Arbor Pioneer.

"It was a good meet, but we didn't swim as well as we should have," said Olson. His disappointment was centered around his team's performance in close finishes: "If it was close, we lost it."

Olson figured the Rocks should

have won the meet by eight points. "But it didn't work out that way," he said. "We just kept giving them points. We kept losing on touch-outs. All we had to do was win one of them."

Olson's hardly ready to write off the season, however. Salem will be a WLAA title contender, to be certain, and will be well-represented at the Class A state meet, too.

Sprint freestyler Fred Locke, a senior, bettered the state qualifying cut in winning the 50-yard free against Huron in 22.35. Locke is the only individual-event state qualifier returning for the Rocks.

Against Huron, he also combined with Joe Ervin, Marc Levitt and Dave Bracht to win the 200 free relay (1:36.85). Other Rock winners were senior Woodie Thomas in diving (212.15 points), junior Eric Seidel.

Orris, Clark lead Chiefs' challenge

Who knows? Maybe the rest of Plymouth Canton's swim season will go like the opening event — above expectations.

Certainly Canton coach Hooker Wellman never expected his Chiefs to finish third in the Western Lakes Activities Association Relays Meet last month. "I figured we'd be fifth going in," he said.

But third it was. Can they match that come the end of the season?

Despite having two of the top swimmers and two of the better divers in the WLAA returning, Wellman won't make any such prediction. Farmington, the surprise winner of the Relays meet, and Salem, the defending WLAA champion, are the top title contenders. Northville and North Farmington are up there, too.

Canton, Wellman figures, isn't as good as those four. "We need another IM'er (200-yard individual medley), another breast stroker, another butterflyer," he said.

So much for what the Chiefs lack.

What they have is impressive, starting with senior captains Mike Orris and Jeff Clark. Orris did not look good at last year's WLAA meet, finishing fifth in the 500 free and sixth in the 200 free as he struggled to overcome the effects of mononucleosis.

But he sure looked good at the Class A state meet. Orris placed fifth in the state in the 200 free in 1:43.36 — seven seconds faster than he went at the WLAA meet — and was 10th in the 500 in 4:44.01 — a whopping 16-second improvement over his WLAA finals performance.

Clark was solid throughout last season, finishing sixth in the state in the 50 free (21.68) and 11th in the 100 free (47.86). At the WLAA meet, Clark was second in the 50 and third in the 100.

"Both had great seasons last year," said Wellman.

The team's third captain, and another swimmer expected to contribute heavily, is senior Joe Foster. His events: the fly and 100 free.

Lady Ocelots slip by Mott

Could this be a turning point? Certainly Schoolcraft College women's basketball coach Jack Grenan hopes so. His team played the toughest segment of its Eastern Conference season prior to the Christmas break, losing to St. Clair, Highland Park and Henry Ford.

But on Wednesday, the Lady Ocelots hosted Mott, which came into the game unbeaten in the conference. The Bears didn't leave that way - SC squeaked out a 61-60 victory, its second-straight league victory.

"This was the first game against a good team that we've staged a comeback and won," said Grenan, as his team improved to 6-5 overall and to 2-3 in the conference.

SC had a five-point lead with eight minutes left, but Mott eliminated that deficit and took a 60-59 lead with 18 seconds to go. The Bears called timeout to set up a press, but the Ocelots broke it and had a 2-on-1 break. When Angie Cerne's short jumper bounced out, Alisa Wechter rebounded for SC. She missed the putback but was fouled.

Wechter converted both free throws to put SC up 61-60 with 13 seconds to play. Again, Mott called timeout, but it didn't help - the Bears never got off a shot.

Cerne finished with 19 points. Wechter and Julie Klos each had 11, with Wechter grabbing 15 rebounds, and Cindy Muha scored 10. Six of Muha's points came in a 40-second span that trimmed a Mott 10-point lead to four with 15 minutes to play.

Sanya Booth's 16 points topped Mott, now 2-1 in the conference. Erin Flynn scored 11. However, both Booth and Flynn had 11 first-half points, and each was 3-for-3 from three-point range.

"We went to a man-to-man de-

fense and completely denied them the ball (in the second half)," said Grenan. Muha, Dawn Newlin and Leanne Hoffman took turns checking the high-scoring Booth and Flynn.

MOTT 82, SC 73: The news wasn't nearly as good for the SC men's team - and not just on the court, where the Ocelots lost their fifth-straight in the Eastern Conference Wednesday at SC.

Semester grades were posted, and once again the Ocelots were hard-hit: Five players were lost for academic reasons, although there were contributing factors in each case, according to coach Dave Bogataj.

By comparison, the SC women's team did not lose a player. All but one of the 12 Lady Ocelots had a 3.0 grade point average or better. Grenan has lost just one player in the past five years to low grades at the end of the first semester.

Bogataj has never been that fortunate. His greatest loss is guard Abu Hamilton, the team's second-leading scorer at 16 points a game. In fact, the backcourt was hit hard: Also lost were guards Ricky Mitchell, Milton Stoudermire and Jacob Endicott. The fifth casualty was forward Schawn Brown.

Four others on Bogataj's pre-season roster left the team before the end of the first semester: Adam Roy (he joined the Marines in November), Herman Sutton, Nate Frye and Herb Taylor.

Not all the news was bad, however. There were three notable additions: Fadi Bazzi, a 6-0 guard who joined the team at the conclusion of the SC men's soccer season; Lamont Fondren, a 6-4 starter at forward last season (he

averaged 8.5 points and seven rebounds) who got the additional credits he needed to become eligible; and Dan Pertulla, a 5-11 guard from Redford Thurston.

Pertulla graduated from Thurston in 1992 and attended University of Michigan-Dearborn for a year.

Bogataj does have 11 players left - perhaps his strongest second-semester team. But the Ocelots are still 0-5 in the conference, 5-9 overall.

Wednesday's outcome could easily have been different - SC was up 38-30 at the half. "We found out what we were doing right at the half and fixed it," Bogataj joked.

It wasn't hard to figure out what went wrong. Mott was 19-of-23 at the free-throw line in the second half; SC was 7-of-12. For the game, the Bears were 28-of-35 at the line (80 percent) to the Ocelots' 19-of-30 (63 percent).

"Ball game," said Bogataj after examining the difference.

Mott, now 5-8 overall and 1-3 in the conference, got 19 points from Kevin Polite, who had just two baskets. Polite was 15-of-16 from the line. Robert Harris scored 15, Tim Herron had 13 and Dwayne O'Neal 10.

SC was led by Todd McNeil's 24 points (he also had seven boards). Dan Nunery had 14, Mark Cady 13 and Steve Whitlow eight. But Whitlow, Cady and Nunery - all guards - fouled out, with six, five and four minutes left, respectively.

The performance of freshmen Bazzi, Brian Boykins and Mike Pichan in their places impressed Bogataj.

If Bogataj can mold what's left of his team into something formidable - SC has six more home games in January - this could be the best Ocelot team in a decade.

Jason Fowler was all-Observer and reached the state meet in diving last season, and teammate Daryl Ballios was the second team all-Observer choice. The two juniors should be among the elite WLAA divers.

Seniors Jason Lehn (breast), John Mogelinnik (sprint free) and Todd Gillihan (100-200 free, backstroke) should be helpful, and Wellman is hoping to get contributions from underclassmen like Jason Sterling (distance free), Jason Nalepa (sprint free) and Scott Stevens (sprint free, breast), all juniors; and Jason McManis (sprint free, back) and Scott Molder (sprint free, back), both sophomores.

The WLAA team title is probably out of Canton's reach, but there are individuals who could

rule their events at the league meet. Both Orris and Clark are possible NCAA Division I recruits - Clark wants to attend Michigan State, which is also a possibility for Orris (his brother Ron is MSU's team captain). Orris is considering Texas and South Carolina, too.

Then again, one never knows the season could end for Canton the same way it began, with a strong showing and a big finish.

Note:Due to a recommendation issued by the Michigan High School Athletic Association regarding pool depth, Plymouth Canton's home meets will all be at Salem. The MHSAA office has "suggested" pools be at least five-feet deep at the end of the pool with starting blocks. Only four of the 11 WLAA teams swim their meets at pools that fulfill this requirement: Salem, Westland John Glenn, Livonia Churchill and Livonia Bentley (which swims at the former Livonia Bentley).

Canton opens its dual-meet season against Ann Arbor Huron at 7 p.m. Tuesday at Salem.





Edith Ann tells it straight

"I do not make things up; that is lies. But the truth can be made up if you know how." So says 5-year-old Edith Ann Bewley.

There's a lot of truth in "Edith Ann — A Few Pieces of the Puzzle," airing Tuesday, Jan. 18, on ABC. It was made up by performer Lily Tomlin, who created Edith Ann more than 23 years ago; writer Jane Wagner, executive producer Gabor Csupo, founder of Emmy-winning animation house Klasky Csupo; producer Sherry Gunther; and director Tamara Varga. And it was set of music by Mark Mothersbaugh.

The precocious little girl with the upturned tongue and mischievous, half-circle eyes was originated by Tomlin before she joined "Rowan and Martin's Laugh-In" in 1970. She based Edith Ann on her own impetuous feelings, rather than any specific child.

"The only thing that I consciously derived from anyone was the speech impediment," Tomlin says. "Small children... sometimes their tongue is too big for their mouth. And their tongue will protrude on a t-h, and so they kind of blow a soft raspberry. They say, 'Ned takes a baththh' or 'Aunt Ruththh.' So when I pitched the character to 'Laugh-In' in the fall of '70, I told (series producer)

George Schlatter, 'I want to use this speech impediment.' So he coined 'And that's the truth.'"

Such was the success of Tomlin's Edith Ann, sitting in an oversized rocker with chocolate smeared on her face and a conspiratorial smile on her lips, that for years that line was part of the vernacular. But Tomlin wanted to give Edith Ann a life of her own — and to get her out of that rocker.

Reluctant to put Edith on the Saturday-morning treadmill, Tomlin finally struck a deal with ABC for two prime-time specials and a possible series. The success of another Klasky Csupo production, "The Simpsons," had each of the rival networks looking for an animated series with broad appeal. In the last four years, no network but Fox has been able to sustain such an effort.

At first, Tomlin and Wagner wanted to animate Edith Ann in clay because they wanted her to seem three-dimensional, not flat. They began to build sets, but realized the project would be too costly and technically difficult. Klasky Csupo's Varga suggested a collage animation technique that combines photographic images with drawings. Watch the sky, the kitchen cabinets and even the milk

cartons in "Edith Ann": The collage is in almost every scene. Producer Gunther is pleased with the result.

"I think it makes it unique in a sense because this technique has only been used in commercials — a cereal box with some animation around it — but it had never been done in a half-hour show. Even more importantly it brings some sense of reality to the Edith Ann universe, which we really were looking for."

Edith's world is full of contemporary reality. In "A Few Pieces," her dad has lost his job, and she tells a neighbor that her dog, Buster, was killed in a drive-by shooting. (Everyone connected with the show hastens to add that this may be Edith Ann "making up the truth.") In the second special, due to air this spring, she loses her latchkey and is locked out of her house; she meets a bag lady, and they spend a homeless afternoon together.

A coffee drinker, diarist and keen observer, Edith Ann is still full of childish insecurities. She takes these to the school psychologist — "the feelings doctor," as Tomlin calls her — and finds a renewed sense of self-worth, which in turn allows her to make up with her castoff friends and even tolerate her baby brother, Vic.





Ashford leaves co-star with angry fans

Don't the producers or sponsors care about what the viewing public likes? He is very popular, very talented and as far as this viewer is concerned the only actor to play the part of Jack. The show will never be the same without him.

Dear Reader: Your views are shared by many "Days" fans, but there is little chance the actor will return any time soon.

I talked with Ashford's co-star, Melissa Reeves, recently and here is what she had to say about the situation: "Matthew knew he was going to be fired, and he had had a feeling for a long time that it was going to happen."

"He kept telling me that we were in a rut and were basically only working with each other, so there was no real room for growth. He said that eventually either he or I would be asked to leave the show. I told him that he was crazy, the fans loved us, and there was no way anything was going to happen. Boy, was I naive."

"I couldn't believe it when he came in and told me that he had been fired. I was in shock," Reeves says. "In fact, I think he took it better than anyone, because he just knew it was going to happen."

"He is happy and he is moving on to other things. I hope they don't push Jennifer into a relationship with another character too soon. I don't think the fans would be too accepting of that."

Reeves received hate mail for the first time in her career after Ashford left. Fans felt she should try to do something to get him back or quit her job in protest.

"I love my fans, but they have to understand that this is a job, and I have to support my family like anyone else," Reeves says. "Believe me, nobody misses Matt more than I do."



Schott, a Plymouth resident, photographed an ice carving of the Pied Piper.

"I belong to the Livonia Camera Club and was looking for scenes I could photograph and enter in competition," said Schott. "This was my first experience in photographing ice. What I really was trying to capture was the light reflecting through the ice.

"It was a very difficult shoot because the artificial light not only shone on the ice, but

also on the background. I was trying to find an angle where the background wouldn't interfere with the main object. That yellow pedestrian ribbon is everywhere, and it ruins the picture. I went through about a roll of film trying different angles."

Schott used a 25-year-old 35-millimeter Minolta 200 with a 70-210-millimeter zoom lens and Fuji 100 ASA slide film.

Schott and his wife, Cheri, live on Dorian Street with their two cats. He'll be back out this year to photograph the Plymouth International Ice Sculpture Spectacular.







Festival chases midwinter blues

Once again, Plymouth will help you chase away the post-holiday, bulging belly blues as the city is transformed into a winter wonderland for the 12th Annual Plymouth International Ice Sculpture Spectacular Jan. 12-17.

More than 500,000 people are expected to descend upon the two-and-a-half square-mile town to have some fun while giving the local economy a shot in the arm.

Mike Watts of Watts-Up, inc., executive director of the festival, says this year's event has treasures galore in store.

Anchoring the festival will be the the First of America Fantasyland, "The Wild Wild West," a country western ice adventure guaranteed to delight and dazzle ice sculpture lovers of all ages in The Gathering.

There won't be a laser show this year, but Miller Icehouse ice-brewed beer will feature a light show with 24-hour viewing.

Celebrity carving competition is set for noon, Thursday, Jan. 13 in The Gathering, said Kelle Morse, the festival's marketing director.

Among the local celebrities expected to vie for glory are TV-2 meteorologist Chris Edwards; the Silver Bullet Band; Gary Graff of the Free Press; Sheri Donovan and Ken Calvert, WLLZ deejays; Mark Pasman, WCSX deejay; Plymouth's Sharon Foster, W4 Country deejay and her husband Chuck Santoni, a WLLZ deejay; and defending champion, Plymouth's Dr. Tom Morse, Kelle's dad.

"He looks forward to this every year," said Morse. "He's anxious to regain his crown," said Sandy Watts, vice president of Watts-Up, inc., the Plymouth company putting on the non-profit event. Morse carved a carousel and donated the prize money to the YMCA.

Others on the guest list include Jim Johnson and the Bruiser George Baier of J.J. and the Morning Crew; Erik Smith of WXYZ news; meteorologist Judy Coy of WJR; sport show hosts Eli Zaret and Denny McLain; and TV personalities Dwayne X. Riley; Don Shane; Rob Kress; John Kelly and Marilyn Turner.

"We've invited Ted Nugent and are hoping he'll be here," said Morse. Even some politicians are on the list — U.S. Senate GOP candidates Carl Pursell of Plymouth and Ronna Romney.

Despite the theft of their ice carving tools, Kris Darby and her students from Plymouth-Canton Educational Park will enter competition.

Exchange students from Switzerland will compete, as will Canadian students and a host of professionals from throughout the U.S. and Japan.

"Last year we had 17 of the top 20 carvers in North America competing here, making it close to a national championship. That's how prestigious this event has become," said Watts, adding that Plymouth's Scott Lorenz deserves the credit for the festival's success, as it was he who conceived the idea after visiting Japan and seeing how popular ice carving is there.

It's fun to watch, Watts said. "It was surprising to me how exciting team competition can be. The ice chips are flying, and in a short period of time, there's a work of art." This year, professional and student carvers will compete for more than \$10,000 in prize money, with \$2,000 going to the professional two-person team winners.

There's a change this year for teams, Watts said. "Team competition used to be a three-four-hour event Friday night. The carvers felt really rushed. They felt they couldn't do their best work. We took the advice of some local carvers who've been to Japan and extended the time they'll have to carve. They'll now have five blocks of ice, and Friday evening through Saturday afternoon to carve. We feel we'll get much better carvings."

New this year is a high school and college team event. "It's the first in the country. There's never been a collegiate team event anywhere that we know of," said Watts.

"We do get a lot of support here from the community colleges in the area. We wanted something to get the students more involved. There'll be prize money and scholarship money for them."

Unchanged will be the single-block professional and student team competition Friday, Saturday and Sunday in Kellogg Park.

Individual professional and student carving competition will take place Saturday and Sun-

day in the Central Parking Structure on Fleet Street off Main Street.

Street sculptures will line Penniman, Forest, Main and Ann Arbor Trail in front of businesses that made donations — \$250 minimum for retailers and \$500 for restaurateurs — to defray costs of the festival.

"The response was very gratifying. We had a great number of people step forward," said Mike Watts.

The festival costs about \$100,000 to stage. "A lot of people don't realize it's not funded by the city. They don't realize it's all citizens and merchants," said Sandra Watts, Watts-Up vice president.

"This is a non-profit concern," Mike Watts said. "Concerned citizens raise all the money. We can't go to the city and say, 'We overspent by \$10,000; can you cover it?' A lot of people don't realize it."

Retailers this year agreed to contribute to a

"Plymouth Gift Basket" to be raffled off, and to stay open longer festival weekend. Hours will be Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m.-10 p.m., and Sunday, 10 a.m.-6 p.m.

Plymouth-Canton middle school students will be involved in the festival in a special way. They'll be asked to draw a design an ice carver could sculpt. A winning drawing will be chosen, and area resident Richard Teeple, executive chef and an instructor at Henry Ford Community College, will carve the design. Another local talent who'll team up with Teeple is Canton's Ted Waker, executive chef at Ford Motor Company's world headquarters.

This year, Home City Ice of Ottawa Lake, Mich. will supply the 400,000 pounds of ice to be transformed with artisans' chainsaws and fertile imaginations.

Furnishing the street sculptures will be Na-deau's Ice Sculptures, Inc. of Forest Park, Ill., which has added the festival to an impressive list of clients including Hollywood movie producers, Miller Icehouse Beer, and the Super Bowl.


