# Edison to plug in new equipment



Detroit Edison will make \$500,000 worth of improvements to electrical equipment in Old Village in an effort to remedy power problems that have plagued the area for years.

Detroit Edison officials said last week they'll spend \$500,000 to replace 75 to 80 percent of electrical components in Old Village by mid-February.

While that is good news for residents and business people in the historic north side of town, several who attended a meeting Wednesday at city hall wanted more information on damage claims.

The meeting was sparked by nu-

merous complaints this summer from Old Village electrical customers. While they say service has been bad in the area for years, power surges and power outages this summer were especially bad.

Old Village resident Larry St. George told three Edison officials, "A power surge caused quite a bit of damage to my electrical appliances and those of my neighbors. What will be done to make up for the damages?"

"We will review every one of them," said Edison Regional Manager Larry

Eix. "Some we will probably do something about, others we will not," he said.

Damage claim forms were available at the meeting, and several residents took them. "If we feel there was negligence on our part, we will pay claims," Eix said. But he added that when damages are storm related, "We generally don't pay those kind of claims."

# Scholars set high goals

Good news has arrived at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park from Evanston, Ill., home of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

Eight seniors, six from Salem High School and two from Canton High School, have been named semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship Program.

Canton students Albert Hamood and Jeremy Stillings, and Salem

students Jahi Chappell, Steven Decker, Jessica Engle, Andrea Frey, Heh Shin Kwak and Erin Reid are among 15,000 high school seniors chosen as semifinalists in the 41st annual National Merit Scholarship Program.

"It's very exciting, because this is a national competition," said Salem counselor June Swartz. "If you are a merit scholar, you're known everywhere."

Said Salem counselor Jan Dersey, "We have an unusually high

number of semifinalists this year. Last year we had none at Salem; this year we have six. We are pretty proud of that. Generally speaking, the kids are really outstanding and wonderfully well-rounded, in both academics and athletics."

# Arrest prompts suit

A Plymouth Township couple is suing Plymouth Township and the police department, charging defamation, false arrest, and malicious prosecution. Timothy and Ofelia Cruz also are charging intentional infliction of emotional distress and violation of due process.

Their attorney, Gregory Rohlf of Novi, said Friday he will file the complaint seeking \$10 million in damages today in Wayne County Circuit Court.

Also named in the suit are Plymouth police officer Eric May-

ernick, Investigator Steven Mann, and Dwayne Jones of Auburn Hills.

The case stems from an incident the afternoon of Aug. 11, 1994 at the Amoco gas station on Ann Arbor Road near I-275. It resulted in an ethnic intimidation charge being brought against Cruz and his brother Anthony Cruz by Plymouth Township police.

The brothers, traveling with Anthony Cruz's 1-year-old daughter Nikole, were on their way to pick up a car the day of the incident.

# Prison staffers help athletes

"We are so gifted with our jobs and our health," said Lt. David Clifton of Scott Correctional Facility. "Seeing athletes (in the Special Olympics) struggle to cross the finish line really gets to you. I don't know any of the kids personally. I like to do this because they are all special to me."

Clifton was on hand in Thursday's early morning chill as 35 state prison employees, dressed in Torch Run T-shirts and running gear, assembled to begin their 3.1-mile leg through Plymouth and Northville townships — part of the international fund raising Law Enforcement Torch Run '95.

The route took Scott and Western Wayne correctional facility officers, supervisors and clerical staff from Western Wayne on Five Mile Road, east to Scott Correctional Facility and up Beck Road and back, with a stop at Our Lady of Providence Center for mentally impaired youngsters. The group finished its run/walk at Scott.

Employees and inmates from the two prisons raised \$5,500 for Michigan Special Olympics, a year-round, community-based sports program for children and adults with mental impairments.

The Michigan Law Enforcement Torch Run is now the largest money raising event for Special Olympics in the country. Last year, law enforcement personnel including police officers, sheriffs, U.S. marshals, firefighters, FBI agents and inmates in Michigan raised \$370,000.

Founded by Eunice Kennedy Shriver, Special Olympics now thrives in 120 countries, supported entirely by private donor funding, said Westland's Ron Read, southeast Michigan regional manager for Special Olympics.

"Mrs. Shriver did this because she was determined that her mentally handicapped sister and others could enhance their sense of self-worth, self-confidence and self-esteem through sports," said Read.

The state's Torch Run provides 20,000 mentally impaired residents with an opportunity to train and compete in 22 sports ranging from volleyball to snowshoeing.

"Today is overcast and chilly. But if it were raining, these correctional officers would still be doing this. Contributing," said Read. "That's what it's all about. Special Olympics isn't an organization; it's a movement of people helping people."

Concurrent runs were held throughout Michigan last week. A 700-mile, nonstop relay began in Copper Harbor in the Upper Peninsula and ended in Detroit. Two others began at the Mackinac

Bridge and traveled down the east and west coasts of the state. Steve Ostrovich, a Western Wayne corrections officer and a member of the Redford Roadrunners, helped organize the Plymouth Township run.

He hopes that through the Torch Run, individuals including the daughter of a close friend will be helped. "She is 9 and has Down's syndrome," said Ostrovich. "Special Olympics helps kids get more involved in everyday life. Hopefully, they can find cures."

"Our inmates gave \$500 this year," he added. At Scott, prisoners participated in their own walkathon Wednesday to raise money, said Clifton. Scott's totals for this year aren't yet in. Last year, the inmates — doing time for offenses ranging from shoplifting to murder — raised \$5,000.

The lives of prison employees Gary Gillow, Larry Carpenter and Lynn Laird have been touched by individuals with mental impairments. "That's one of the reasons we're out here," said Carpenter, a

Western Wayne transportation officer. "I pray that there is a cure not only for my wife's niece, but for everyone with that type of illness."

Carlos Horn, a corrections officer at Western Wayne, doesn't know anyone who is mentally impaired. "I figure everyone should help," said Horn, a Flint International Track Club member. "I'm not a rich person, so what I can do is give my time."

Others from Scott and Western Wayne who ran and walked included Robert Warner, Charles Swadling, Lisa Brown, Starr

Tiekong, Darlene Leannais, Joanne Koptur, Eileen Rogala, Dave Kroske, Regina Hill, Judy Williams and Amy Lucas.

Laird, a Canton resident who works in the business office at Western Wayne, said, "I taught special education in Traverse City, and I can tell you this is a great cause. I love Special Olympics."

# Oct. 4 court date set on firefighter's challenge of ruling

A Plymouth firefighter's challenge to a city attorney ruling that he can't run for city commission is scheduled to go before a Wayne County Circuit judge Oct. 4.

City Attorney Donald Morgan has sought a judge's ruling on the matter. Morgan has said his reading of city ordinances and state

law would prohibit someone who works in a department overseen by the city commission from seeking a commission seat.

City Clerk Linda Langmesser said she's hoping for a quick resolution of the question. "I have to get the ballots out by Oct. 9," she said.

Until a ruling is made, Plymouth Community Fire Department firefighter Bill Warren remains one of six candidates vying for four seats on the city commission in the November election.

Warren's attorney, Andrew Nickelhoff, has filed a counterclaim before circuit Judge Marianne Battani, who is scheduled to hear the case. Nickelhoff maintains Warren is not a city employee and free to run for elected city

office, as the city fire department was actually merged into the Plymouth Township Fire Department.

"The Plymouth Community Fire Department was created by agreement of the city and township," Nickelhoff said. "That agreement very clearly states that fire department employees are employees of the township and

are the responsibility of the township. Their paycheck comes from the township under the township's rules and regulations," Nickelhoff said, adding firefighters report to the fire chief and township supervisor.

"The city commission can ask questions, but doesn't have any control over how the fire department is run," Nickelhoff said. But Plymouth Mayor Doug Miller said that by the contract creating the joint department, the city is entitled to have a representative involved in contract negotiations. "Any change in the size of the department or the expense of the department has to be

approved by us," Miller added. City officials maintain that according to state law, it has been deemed improper for a person working for a city department to make decisions on pay raises or other supervisory matters over a department the individual works in.

Nickelhoff responded, "Mr. Warren's experience as a firefighter might be very helpful."

"There are a lot of constitutional questions that come into play here, the right to run for office, it's a very fundamental constitutional right," he said. "You don't restrict that except under very narrow circumstances."

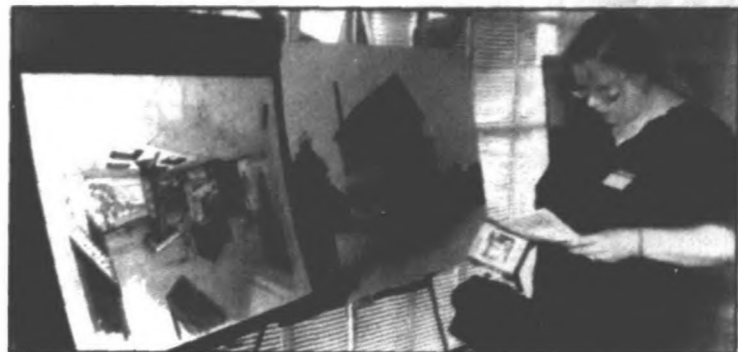

## Mill restoration celebrated

The centerpiece of rural Wayne County life during the late 1800s was once again, in 1995, the focus of a great gathering. Residents and public officials from throughout Wayne County were on hand Wednesday for ribbon-cutting ceremonies marking the newly-restored Nankin Mills.

Wayne County Executive Edward H. McNamara and Commissioner Kay Beard, whose district includes Garden City and Westland, paid tribute to a "self-motivated and hardworking parks staff, several citizen groups that have raised money for the facility and the various

levels of government that cooperated in making it all happen." The restored facility, on Hines Drive, just east of Ann Arbor Trail in Westland, houses the administrative offices of the Wayne County Parks staff.

The parks staff is working to reopen the Nankin Mills Interpretive Center.

The \$1.5 million restoration and renovation was done with a combination of grants and matching funds from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, the city of Westland, the Friends of Nankin Mills, the Friends of Wayne County Parks, Wayne County government and several other sources.

"This is a way to recognize our history," McNamara said. "Children, as well as adults, will be able to come to Nankin Mills and see what life was like around the turn of the century. It brings the past to the present and then leaves something behind for the future."

Nankin Mills was built in 1863 and became the center of the community called Pike's Peak. The community encompassed the mill, blacksmith shop, general store post office, print shop and several homes.

Henry Ford visited Nankin Mills during his childhood and remained interested in it when he grew up. Ford believed that

a balance could be created with "one foot in industry and one foot on the ground of nature."

In 1918, Ford bought the mill from Floyd Bassett, the last miller, and opened it as a village industry in 1920. The first product was screws.

The mill was renovated and the dam rebuilt in a joint agreement with Edward Hines and John Haggerty, personal friends of Ford and two of the original Wayne County road commissioners.

The county eventually rebuilt all dams along the Rouge River in exchange for use of the land as a park.

The mill was later converted

into a machine shop to produce stencils for making parts for the Ford automobile. To produce enough power to run the machine shop, Thomas Edison built the first prototype hydroelectric generator at the mill.

Ford was said to have been so proud of his generator at Nankin Mills that he replaced wooden walls around the generator with the glass-enclosed show case that stands today.

The Wayne County Road Commission acquired Nankin Mills in 1948 from Clara Ford and opened it as a nature center in 1956. There were exhibits on all three floors and animals in cages outside the mill.

In 1967, Nankin Mills was designated a Michigan historical site. The nature center was closed in 1979 due to the county's financial problems.

The parks division is continuing to raise money to develop the displays and educational programs for the new Interpretive Center.

Friends of the Nankin Mills will host a wine and cheese fund-raiser from 5-8 p.m. Thursday in the newly restored building. Tickets are \$20 per person and available by calling Denise Johnson, president of Friends of the Nankin Mills, at 261-3633 or Kathy Myers at 421-7213 or Tom Brown at 467-3183.

## Planning commission OKs proposed skating facility

## Residents report sightings of animal that looks like cougar

Canton Township resident Debbie Mackinder became an inadvertent big-game hunter last week as she nearly ran down an animal she identified as a cougar on her way to work.

The St. Joseph Hospital nurse said she spotted the animal standing in the southbound lane of Ridge Road between Cherry Hill and Ford at about 5:45 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 21.

Mackinder, 41, barely swerved in time to miss the animal, she said, which had suddenly appeared in her headlights. "He just kind of looked at me as if to say, 'What are you doing here?'"

Asked if the animal might have been a bobcat, Mackinder said it was too big for that.

"He took the whole half side of the road. His head was the size of a nice-size pumpkin."

Mackinder said she spoke to a

Canton Township police officer when she returned home from work Thursday. The officer, she said, asked if she might not have seen a dog.

"No," she said. "I am real sure it wasn't a dog. I was wide awake and sober. I can close my eyes and see his eyes looking right at me."

A Department of Natural Resources spokeswoman who declined to give her name said that, if there is a cougar in western Canton Township, it's probably a pet that got loose.

However, it is also possible that the animal Mackinder saw is wild. A wild cougar "can survive out there for quite some time," the DNR spokeswoman said.

Dona Strang, who lives on Ridge Road, said she and her husband and children have also seen and heard a cougar around their property. "We know this thing is here," she said. "Nobody believes us except all the people

who've seen it."

Robert Strang, his wife said, estimated he came within 20 feet of the animal last year behind the barn. The beast emitted an "enormous growl" that awoke others in the house, and Strang backed away slowly, his wife said.

Ella Dawn, who lives with her daughter and son-in-law on Ridge Road, believes she and her daughter, Laura Kosteva, may have seen a cougar last July.

"We were out in the back yard and saw a strange looking animal that just didn't fit in with the countryside," she said. "Whether that was the cougar or not, I don't know. It was a big animal, whatever it was."

Veterinarian Richard Kirchgatter, who farms along Ridge Road, said he hasn't seen or heard a cougar, but it might not be so bad to have one around. "If they eat woodchucks, I'd be all for keeping them around," he said.

# Former Canton resident faces third murder trial

It may seem like O.J. Simpson's murder trial is the longest on record. But O.J. is a legal lightweight compared to former Canton resident Dr. Charles Fisher, accused in the 1984 murder of his wife, Ella Maria Mercado Fisher.

Currently in the Saginaw Regional Correctional Facility, the microbiologist will stand trial for the third time Oct. 9 in connection with the asphyxiation death of Mercado.

Mercado, a nurse, was suffocated with duct tape in the living room of the couple's home on Thornwood in Canton. Fisher was found guilty of first-degree murder by two juries. The first trial was ruled in error based on a comment made by a prosecutor. In late 1991, the Michigan Supreme

Court reversed a second conviction, ruling that a diary kept by Mercado should not have been admitted into evidence.

The state Supreme Court ruled Aug. 9 that evidence regarding Mercado's state of mind is admissible. "We can bring in nine classes of information," said Wayne County assistant prosecutor Bob Donaldson. The evidence can include portions of Mercado's diary, letters written by Fisher, as well as statements from others who spoke to Mercado before her murder.

Donaldson and Canton Detective William Keppen are in the process of tracking down 41 witnesses all over the U.S., as well as overseas. The jury trial before Wayne Circuit Judge Thomas Roumell is expected to last three weeks.

"I've practiced for 12 years, and

this is the only case I know of with this type of procedural history. I've never heard of a case like this," said Donaldson.

Keppen says the Fisher case is by far the most expensive in Canton history. "I don't know of a trial that has lasted longer than this one," said Keppen, who extradited Fisher from St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands following the murder. "It's unusual that it would hang on this long, and that they would be successful in so many appeals."

Traveling to Michigan will be Mercado's parents, Evelyn and Manuel Mercado, who live in Florida. Coming the farthest will be a friend of Ella Maria Mercado's, now living in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. The two attended Wayne State University together, and the friend now heads an Arabian hospital research education program. Other witnesses include Dr.

Joanne Bulley, formerly of St. Joseph's in Ypsilanti and now working in New Hampshire. Relatives from Huntsville, Ala., Lewisburg, Tenn., Hopkinsville, Ky., and Columbia, Mo., also will take the stand.

"It's been very time-consuming. As of now, we've probably gotten in touch with 85 to 90 percent of the witnesses. They're scattered all over," said Keppen.

Surprisingly, said Donaldson, most of the witnesses are still alive, healthy, and able to make the trip.

"I think we are going to be able to put it together," he said. "I know one witness had a severe stroke, but it's one of the attending physicians who did not provide pivotal testimony."

The prosecution also plans to call as witnesses police officers from Missouri, where the Fishers lived before moving to Michigan.

"Charlie claimed to have made a report, saying his wife's life was threatened while they lived there. Iranian men were the culprits," said Keppen.

While Donaldson and Keppen agree the case has cost taxpayers plenty, it's nearly impossible to assign a dollar figure.

"Anytime you fly witnesses in or out of state, it's more expensive," said Donaldson. "The bottom line is, it's our belief he is responsible for this. If we have to keep on trying it, we're going to keep on trying it. I don't care about expense. I care about justice."

Keppen clearly remembers the night of the murder.

He responded at about 3 a.m. to a report of a burglary, following officers George Sharp and Robert Sidor to the Thornwood home.

"It didn't appear there was forced entry, and it didn't look

like the house was ransacked. Expensive things were still there. The only thing obviously out of place was duct tape and rope in the living room and in the bedroom," he said.

"The fire department had found Mercado face down in the living room. Fisher claimed he had been in bed. He heard a noise and thought it was her coming home. Next thing he knew, he was unconscious, tied up and duct-taped himself."

Fisher testified intruders gagged and bound both him and his wife, and that he was unable to revive her once he freed himself. He currently is doing time for solicitation of perjury.

The court has appointed two new attorneys for Fisher, formerly represented by Ken Mogill.

Scholarship Qualifying Test, taken by more than one million program entrants. The highest scorers — about one half of one percent of the state's high school graduating class — were designated semifinalists.

Finalists are considered for one of 2,000 National Merit \$2,000 scholarships within each state. Some 400 corporations, company foundations and organizations will support about 1,100 merit scholarship awards for finalists who meet the award sponsor's preferential criteria.

"Semifinalists advance to the finalist level by fulfilling additional requirements that include having an outstanding academic record, being endorsed and recommended by the high school principal, and submitting SAT scores that confirm the student's earlier PSAT performance," said Elaine Detweiler, public information director for the National Merit

Scholarship program.

"Other important information about the student's educational interests and goals, as well as participation and leadership in school and community activities, is provided in the application the semifinalist and an official from the high school must complete."

"As long as they give us some money, it's worthwhile," joked Stillings, who plans to study government, politics or law at Georgetown or Tulane universities. "It's really a great honor to be picked for something like this," he added. "I know a lot of colleges take a look at this award. It should help out with college."

About 90 percent of the semifinalists are expected to become finalists, based on their "potential for success in rigorous college studies, given the professional evaluations of their academic abilities, skills and accomplishments," said Detweiler.

About 200 colleges and universities are expected to sponsor more than 3,800 merit scholarship awards. Scholarship winners will be announced beginning in April. The scholars will join some 20,000 others enrolling in 600 higher-education institutions in 1996-97.

The case against Timothy and Anthony Cruz was dismissed on a directed verdict April 28 by Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Cynthia Gray Hathaway. Hathaway ruled there was not enough evidence to try the case.

According to the complaint, Cruz's brother was attacked at the station by another customer, and the plaintiff came to his brother's aid. Police responded, but took a statement only from the customer, identified as Jones, Rohl said. Police "never gave the plaintiff nor his brother an oppor-

tunity to relate what happened," Rohl said. All three were taken to the station lockup, where Cruz was photographed and fingerprinted. Jones was transported to the station, but immediately released, Rohl said.

Cruz is charging Jones with making false and defamatory statements about him in the media.

Plymouth Township Police Chief Carl Berry was unavailable for comment, as were Mayernick and Mann. Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen McCarthy was

also unavailable.

Anthony Cruz is pursuing legal action with separate counsel, Rohl said.

Previously, Anthony Cruz was convicted of unlawfully driving away Mann's police cruiser.

Cruz suffered a loss of income as a result of the incident, Rohl said. "This gentleman has a very lucrative business in Mexico, which he was unable to tend to during pendency of the litigation. He couldn't leave the country."

Rohl said the first court date is expected at the end of October.

Eix said a rebuilding of much of the system in Old Village would start Oct. 2. But Old Village property owner Mike O'Shea told Edison officials, "I came here tonight to hear what Edison is going to do about damages. Where's someone from your legal department?"

"We don't trust you; you might as well come in here with tails and horns," another resident said. "What we want to do is start the process," said Edison's Michael Palchesko, public affairs manager.

The Edison officials appeared before about 25 residents and

business people, during an Old Village Development Authority meeting. Palchesko told the group, "We are aware of the concerns you have; we want to provide you with the reliable electrical service you deserve."

Greg Durbin of Liberty Street said he'd lived all over the state, but only in Old Village had he experienced electrical problems that resulted in damaged appliances.

Eix said the performance record of electrical service in the area "does not meet our standards; that's one of the biggest reasons we're doing something about it." He said one power surge experi-

enced in August by several Old Village residents happened after a power pole guy wire near the railroad tracks was pulled out of the ground. That caused wires to cross and cause the power surge, he said.

Other residents wanted explanations about wires falling to the ground on clear, calm days; frayed, swaying wires; and failure to answer service calls.

"Shame on us," Eix said. "We will be out there." He took names and addresses from a handful of residents, saying he'd get back with them about concerns.



# Tax suits, protests are alive and kicking

Tax protesters are fighting Wayne County's 911-Emergency service, Oakland Community College, suburban buses, overall state spending and a new Tiger Stadium.

Here is your guide to who's suing whom, who's threatening and who's petitioning in Wayne and Oakland counties:

## 911-E in Wayne

Rose Bogaert of the Wayne County Taxpayers' Association has filed suit in Wayne Circuit Court to block collection of 4 percent tax on telephones for 911-Emergency service.

Her suit was filed by Ron Chapman, a Troy attorney and former Dearborn school board member. It contends the tax was passed without a vote of the people as required in the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment (Art. IX Sec. 31) to the Michigan Constitution.

The county board imposed the tax in 1987, nine years after voters approved the Headlee Amendment.

Chapman's brief, filed Sept. 19, says the revenue is a tax and not a fee because it's paid by everyone with a telephone while the service is used only by those needing emergency ambulance, fire or police service.

"They're very much concerned about this," Bogaert said Tuesday at a joint meeting in Pontiac of Michigan Taxpayers United and the Oakland Taxpayers

League. "There's never been an accounting of this 911 service. The county has never done one. Ameritech (telephone company) has refused."

"The towers used for 911 will also service garbage trucks and recreation (department) vehicles. They (governmental agencies) won't pay," added Bogaert, a Dearborn Heights resident and Crestwood school board member.

Chapman's suit also names Ameritech as a defendant, asking the court to enjoin the telephone company's collection of the county tax.

## OCC, SMART

Voters in June approved 0.8 mill for Oakland Community College, lying mostly in Oakland County, and a fraction of a mill in May and June for SMART, the suburban bus service in suburban Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties.

Bill McMaster, Michigan Taxpayers United chair ("volunteer"), told a group of 40 that "we have found a way" to rescind both property tax increases.

The tool: a recall. "There are recalls of public officials. Well, we can recall a tax increase," said McMaster, pointing to the general election of 1996 as a target date.

Petitioning for a tax recall will be more complex with the SMART proposal because it was levied in only 20 of Oakland's 40-plus communities.

## State spending

McMaster is working with Detroit attorney Peter Macuga II on a suit that says Gov. John Engler and the Legislature are levying taxes beyond the income limits allowed in the Headlee amendment (Art. IX Sec. 26-27).

"Sue the bastards!" is how McMaster headlined his announcement of the meeting. He argues that total state revenues of \$26.4 billion are 13 percent higher than in March 1994, when voters approved the Proposal A school funding plan, and that the increase is "four times the rate of inflation."

The Headlee Amendment fixes revenues at a percentage of total personal income of Michigan residents. "These weasels have not put in certain things," said McMaster, citing University of Michigan football revenues. "We're going to hang them on their own audit."

U-M handles about \$2 billion a year, according to the Michigan Manual. On the revenue side, "auxiliary enterprises," which appears to include athletics, brings in nearly \$120 million, and its

hospitals' revenues are \$822 million.

Macuga is the attorney who won a 7-0 State Supreme Court decision overturning Wayne County's surtax on real estate property transfers. People who sold their homes since 1990 are entitled, under the class action suit, to recover the overpayment, amounting to \$60 on a \$150,000 home.

Macuga told the taxpayers group the research will take some months. McMaster is a plaintiff, and Macuga said he wants up to 15 individual co-plaintiffs. "In this scenario, we want government looking at individual taxpayers," Macuga said.

The attorney said he expects state government to use "the Thieves' Defense: 'Your honor, you can't make us pay it back — we already spent it.'"

Meanwhile in Lansing, state Sen. Gary Peters, D-Bloomfield Township, released his letter to state Treasurer Douglas Roberts saying "state revenues (are) over the constitutionally established

Headlee limit by \$220 million. As you know, this will exceed the Headlee one percent trigger level by \$42 million and force the Legislature to take action to refund the excess funds."

Peters, a member of the Senate's tax-writing Finance Committee, referred to Art. IX Sec. 26 which says the state must refund, pro rata, the personal income tax and single business tax when revenues exceed the constitutional limit.

Peters asked Roberts, the Senate Fiscal Agency and House Fiscal Agency to convene promptly to propose a remedy.

## No to stadium

Sen. George Z. Hart, D-Dearborn, blistered the Sept. 20 decision by Gov. John Engler and the Michigan Strategic Fund board to put up \$55 million in land acquisition and infrastructure for a new Detroit Tigers baseball stadium in downtown Detroit.

"We are blowing all of our economic development money for more than one year on this one project," Hart said in a news release in Lansing. Hart, whose district includes Garden City, said the fund has put up only \$30 million for everything else in the state.

Hart said he and several unnamed lawmakers are considering both legal and legislative action.

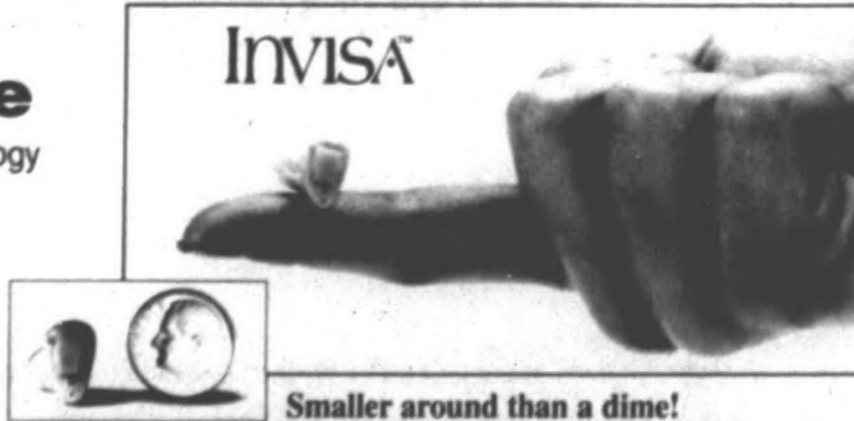

# Dad wants S'craft to admit his 10-year-old daughter

A Farmington Hills man has filed an age discrimination complaint against Schoolcraft College with the Michigan Civil Rights Commission after his 10-year-old daughter was refused admission to the school.

Warren Schroeder wanted to place his daughter Stacey, a sixth-grader at Our Lady of Sorrows, in Schoolcraft's weekend college program specifically for a Saturday morning pre-algebra course which started this month.

Stacey took a remedial math course in Farmington Public Schools' high school summer program and earned a B grade, according to her father. She has taken Saturday enrichment programs through Schoolcraft's program for talented and gifted children (TAG).

"The college recommended

someplace like Cranbrook, or Detroit Country Day School," said Schroeder. "That's expensive and far away. Schoolcraft is in our back yard and Stacey is already comfortable there."

Schroeder's admissions application was returned by John Tomney, dean of student services, who stated that "Stacey is more than welcome to continue in the TAG program, but as a 10-year-old, she would not be admissible under our guidelines."

Conway Jeffress, vice president of instruction and student services at Schoolcraft, said that had Schroeder's request for his daughter to take the pre-algebra course been simply for enrichment, "Then as a single course, this would be a different issue and we could have talked about it."

On the application form, Schroeder checked the box indicating the primary educational goal in attending Schoolcraft is to

take classes to earn a certificate or associate degree.

"She is not a high school graduate, doesn't have a general equivalency diploma, was not recommended by a high school principal, has no ACT or SAT college test results and is not eligible for admission," said Jeffress.

In a letter to Schroeder, Jeffress suggested that Stacey should be in classes with people her own age and of her own ability.

"This will allow her to acquire both knowledge and social maturity at a rate consistent with her ability to handle it," he wrote.

Schroeder has cited age discrimination statutes in his complaint before the civil rights commission. As compensation, he is seeking that Schoolcraft admit Stacey.

"It may take a long time, but I'm going to win this fight," he said.

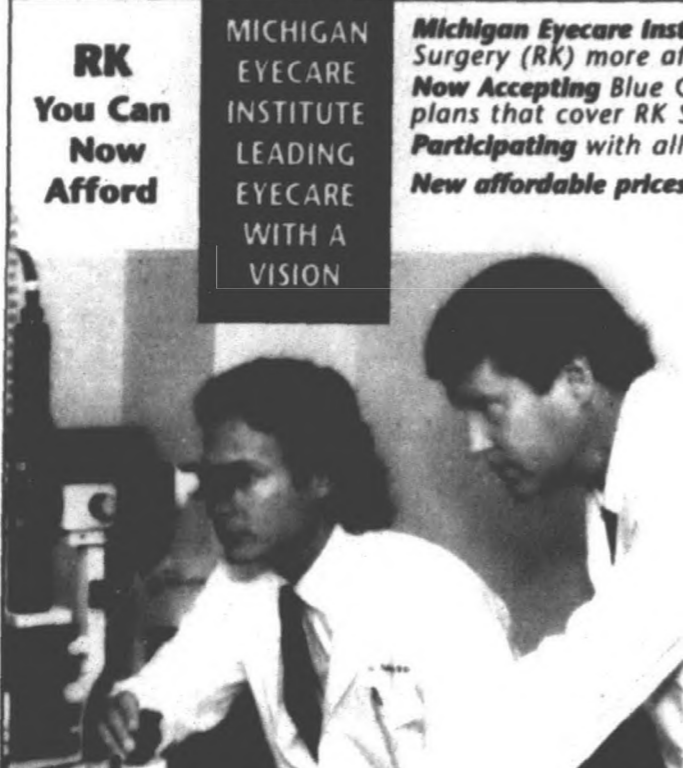

### Chicken soup, cookies are comforts of fall

**F**all is one of my favorite seasons. I love watching leaves slowly change from green to yellow, orange and red. Apples are ripe for picking, and cider is flowing at local mills. As nights get colder we yearn for comfort foods — chicken soup and homemade cookies.

Speaking of soup, Donna Cash of Plymouth recently enjoyed a bowl of Greek Chicken and Rice Soup with Lemon at a local restaurant and wanted the recipe.

Well Donna, it doesn't get any easier than this and I hope you enjoy the results!

AVGOLEMONO SOUP

- 2 quarts strong chicken stock or broth
- 1/2 cup raw short grained rice
- 4 eggs
- Juice of 2 large lemons (about 1/2 cup)

Bring the stock to a boil and add the rice. Cook, uncovered, until the rice is tender, about 20 minutes. Remove the stock from the heat.

Beat eggs with a beater until they are light and frothy, about 1 minute. Slowly beat in the lemon juice. Slowly beat in 2 cups of the warm soup, beating constantly until well blended.

Add the egg-lemon-soup mixture to the remaining soup, beating constantly. Heat but do not boil. Serve immediately. Serves 6-8.

*Chef's secret: we made this at the Janes Gang dinner table and added some chopped chicken meat to the soup and it was great!*

• Joanie Kimball of Birmingham is hoping to find the reason why all of her cookies turn out crispy and hard. Joanie says she'd treasure the secret for soft, chewy cookies.

Well Joanie, to answer that question, I called momma, and checked with the folks at Pillsbury who wrote "The Complete Book of Baking," (copyright 1993, Viking Books, \$25).

The word from the pros is that the softest cookies are made with a 60-40 blend of solid vegetable shortening (i.e. Crisco) and butter or margarine. Make sure the fats are "creamed" sufficiently with the sugars so the final product is light and fluffy.

The pros also recommend not using dark cookie sheets. They prefer "air cushioned" baking pans covered with a sheet of baking parchment for best results. Check your oven temperature, and make sure the racks are in the center of the oven for optimum results. Good luck!

• Mary Fieber called with a question that gets repeated monthly. She wants to know the recommended apple sauce substitute for oil in a recipe.

Anytime you see a recipe that calls for oil and is baked, you can easily substitute half the oil with real applesauce. For an even better taste, try a thicker fruit puree. The 50-50 ratio remains the same.

• Rosalie Sea of Redford wanted a recipe for Key Lime Cake. Well, since Aunt Edna and Uncle Orrn used to have a trailer in Marathon, just north of Key West, momma found this easy-to-make tea cake that's just perfect for an afternoon repast.

KEY LIME CAKE

- 1/2 pound butter (2 sticks)
- 3 cups granulated sugar
- 5 egg yolks, beaten
- 4 cups all purpose flour
- 1 cup milk
- The grated rind and juice of 2 key limes, (about 1/3 cup of lime juice and 1 tablespoon grated rind)
- 5 egg whites, stiffly beaten
- Confectioners' sugar

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F. Cream the butter, adding the granulated sugar gradually, until light and fluffy. Add the remaining ingredients except the egg whites and confectioners' sugar and mix until well blended.

Gently fold in the beaten egg whites. Divide the batter between 2 loaf pans (9 by 5 by 3-inch). Bake for 1 hour at 325 degrees F. Remove from the oven and cool. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar. Best when served with ice cream. Makes 2 loaf cakes.

## GARDENERS CULTIVATE COMMUNITY TIES

**T**here's a common belief that modern society has "lost touch with its roots," and that cyberspace has replaced wide open space as our natural milieu.

But a look at the number of community gardens in the area proves that there are still a lot of people who could certainly afford to buy tomatoes and green beans growing vegetables for the opportunity to dig and weed and water, and for the joy of sharing the experience with their neighbors.

While some of the gardens limit access to senior citizens, most of them are inter-generational, with gardeners of all ages swapping hints and vying for the earliest tomato. There are more people who "put foods by" i.e., can or freeze their harvests than you might think. And the folks in West Bloomfield, Troy, and Southfield donate their extra produce to those who are less fortunate.

"Our gardeners have a wonderful time," said Sue Wagner, of the Livonia Department of Parks and Recreation. "There are no age restrictions so we have seniors and families with small children mingling and exchanging advice in the 250 plots. There are no fences, so it's a very informal family atmosphere." The Livonia community gardens are southwest of the Greenmead historical buildings at the intersection of Eight Mile Road and Newburgh.

The Southfield community gardens are on

the former Mary Thompson farm; Thompson willed the farm to the city of Southfield, to be used as gardens by senior citizens.

"There are just over 100 plots, and they're always fully used," said John Webb, who supervises the gardens on Evergreen, between 10 and 11 Mile Roads. "Some gardeners have been in the same plot for 20 years or longer."

Everybody agrees that the summer of 1995

pumpkins got rained out, too.

"Tomatoes were good, though; they like heat and water. I grew a white tomato this year — it's traditional red on the inside, but white on the outside. They're very striking when sliced on a plate."

Webb also grew a yellow pear-shaped tomato, sweet, beautiful, and a lovely dish when sliced and arranged alternately with red tomatoes.

"I grew a yellow beet, but I haven't tasted it yet," said Webb. "The top of these beets looks like grass, and when they first came up, I pulled them out. Luckily, when I realized they weren't grass, I had enough seeds left to re-plant."

The Southfield gardens are adding a drainage system as insurance against another wet summer. "The ground was just saturated, and the roots rotted," explains Webb. "The cantaloupes that survived had no flavor. It's the worst year we've ever had for cantaloupe," he says sadly.

"But," he adds, with the optimism that every gardener needs, "I planted sweet potatoes, which don't usually grow this far north. The rain and heat were good for their growth, so I guess it's not a total disaster."

Webb used to can, but now he, like many of his fellow gardeners, gives his surplus to

was tough on gardens, and, therefore, gardeners. The spring was long and cool. The summer was either hot and dry, or hot and wet. Weeds thrived, and so did bugs.

overnight and cook it outside on the grill in the summer."

McDonald Tower, a Southfield residence for seniors.

Bob Kline, a master gardener who has cultivated four plots in the Livonia community gardens for 15 or 20 years, cans and freezes his produce, in addition to making his own wine and jelly. "I brought home enough produce yesterday to feed half of Livonia," says the ebullient Kline. "I spent the afternoon shelling lima beans and preparing broccoli for the freezer, and I'm trying to figure out what to do with all those to-

matos."

One of the things he does with them is make tomato jam. Kline grows over 30 varieties of tomatoes. "I get my seeds from the Seed Savers' Exchange, and most people wouldn't recognize the tomatoes I grow."

One of Kline's favorites is Hawaii, a tomato the size of a pea that grows in clusters, like grapes. It's very sweet, and one of the reasons Kline grows it is that people always ask him for the seeds.

Kline grows hot peppers be-

cause "they're cute." He doesn't eat them, but he does use them as a natural insecticide. "Just grind them enough with enough water to make a liquid," he explains. "And spray it on the plants. It really keeps bugs away."

Kline makes a couple of dozen loaves of zucchini bread with cranberries, some of which he donates to St. Genevieve's (Catholic) Church bake sale in Livonia. He buys cranberries and freezes them, so they'll be on hand when zucchini is in season. He also

freezes zucchini so it'll be on hand when cranberries are in season.

Carl Sibert has had a garden in the Livonia community garden as well as in his backyard since moving to Livonia in the early 1960s. Kay Sibert doesn't garden herself, but she cans and/or freezes the green beans, tomatoes, acorn and butternut squash, snow peas, and other good things that Carl harvests.

"In 1994, Carl planted 72 broccoli plants, and I froze broccoli,"

said Kay. "But in 1995 we have hardly any broccoli at all. It was just too hot."

Like Kline, she freezes grated zucchini, to be substituted for potatoes in potato pancakes. "There's more moisture with zucchini than with potatoes," said Kay, "but I just add a little more flour."

"We really like zucchini — I invented a tasty dish with young zucchini and Parmesan cheese. My husband and children and grandchildren love it, and even my son-in-law, who gags at the mention of zucchini, likes it."

Another favorite of the Siberts is a zucchini pie that Kay swears tastes exactly like apple pie.

## PISTACHIO-WHITE CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

- 1 1/4 cups (2 1/2 sticks) butter
- 2 cups firmly packed light brown sugar

- 2 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 cup old-fashioned rolled oats
- 12 ounces white chocolate chips
- 1 1/2 cups pistachios, coarsely chopped

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. With an electric mixer at medium speed, cream butter with sugar in a large bowl. Beat in eggs and vanilla. In a medium bowl, combine flour, baking soda, baking powder, and oats.

Gradually add the flour mixture to the butter mixture and combine. Stir in chocolate chips and pistachios.

Drop batter by heaping teaspoons about 2 inches apart onto ungreased cookie sheets. Bake for 8-10 minutes until light golden brown. Let cool slightly on cookie sheets; remove to wire racks to cook completely. Makes 4 dozen.

Suzanne Mitchell, who created this recipe, recommends serving these cookies with pistachio ice cream.

## HOMEMADE ROASTED RED PEPPERS

- 6 red peppers, split, seeds and veins removed
- 1/4 cup olive oil

Place red peppers directly on a vegetable grill over hot coals or a preheated gas grill. Brush with olive oil. If you don't have a grill, peppers can be placed on a baking sheet, brushed with oil and placed 4 inches from the broiler. Cook until skin chars and turns black, about 8-10 minutes depending on how hot your grill or broiler is. Remove from grill, rinse under cool water to remove blackened

skin. Pat dry. Place in a bowl with just enough olive oil to cover. If desired, a small amount of garlic or onion can be added, but it is not necessary. Refrigerate until ready to use. Makes about 1 1/2 cups roasted red peppers.

## BOB KLINE'S ZUCCHINI BREAD

- 3 eggs
- 1 cup cooking oil
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 2 cups grated zucchini
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 3 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts
- 1/2 package cranberries

Beat eggs until light and foamy. Add oil, sugar, zucchini, and vanilla. Mix lightly. Combine dry ingredients with nuts and cranberries, and add to oil mixture. Stir just to blend. Divide batter between two greased and floured loaf pans. Bake in a preheated 325-degree F. oven for one hour, or until a knife inserted in center comes out clean. (This bread freezes well)

## BONNIE KICHAK'S ZUCCHINI PIE

- Filling:
- 8 cups zucchini, peeled and sliced as thick as pie apples
  - 1 cup granulated sugar
  - 1/2 cup lemon juice
  - 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
  - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
  - Aisins (optional)
- Crust and topping:
- 4 cups all purpose flour
  - 1 cup brown sugar
  - 1 cup granulated sugar
  - 1 teaspoon cinnamon
  - 3 sticks cold margarine

To make filling: Cook zucchini and lemon juice on top of stove until tender. Add sugar, nutmeg, cinnamon and raisins, if used, to hot mixture. Set aside to cool. Mixture will be moist. Do not drain.

To make crust and topping: Blend flour and sugars. Cut in

margarine with a pastry blender.

Press half of mixture in the bottom of a 9 by 13-inch baking pan. Bake in a preheated 350 degree F. oven for 10-15 minutes, until slightly browned.

Spread zucchini mixture with juice on top of cooked crust. Add the 1 teaspoon of cinnamon to the rest of the crumb mixture and sprinkle over zucchini. Pat down lightly. Bake 40 minutes in a pre-heated 375 degree F. oven.

- 2 scallions, with tops, chopped
- Salt and pepper to taste

Arrange tomatoes on a serving dish or individual dishes. Combine ginger with lime juice and spoon mixture evenly over tomatoes. Sprinkle with scallions and seasonings, and serve at room temperature.

## Department store blues

# Discounters deliver brand names for less

While change is fundamental to life, the changes in retailing in the last 20 years have been extremely troublesome to large department stores especially, and, to a lesser degree, specialty stores and discounters.

Macy's, Hudson's and Marshall Field were the venerated department stores of the 1950's and '60s. They represented quality of merchandise, selling services, and prestige that only a Bloomingdale's retains today.

Kmart arrived in 1961 with a discount store concept that capitalized on the weakness of department store basements and laid the ground work for the discounting of nationally advertised labels that prevails today.

Department stores hurt themselves badly by overemphasizing the pressure for advertising money, for money to offset markdowns, and for merchandise return privileges from brand manufacturers. While these same

stores were building up the value of brands, the discounters negotiated a much better deal for the same merchandise.

At the same time, the discounters created stores with checkout counters and very little service. The result — a selling price for identical label merchandise that is significantly less

COMMENTARY

Department stores countered by cutting service in a major effort to reduce operating costs. But, this too has been counter-productive.

The greatest failure of department stores has been the lack of merchants who understand merchandise and managements that have the courage to take strong and unique approaches to merchandise and merchandise presentation. There are too many stores and too much boredom in their merchandise and in their merchandising presentation.

Instead of buying into merchandising ideas and concepts that can provide a unique identity, buyers go to brand manufacturers to buy what the manufacturers consider their most important styles, which are of course

the same for everyone. No wonder stores are boring!

Notable exceptions are Nordstroms, (due to open at Somerset North in Troy next year), which emphasizes service and depth of stock, and Bloomingdales which emphasizes fashion and a creative approach to merchandising.

As a final indication of the rate of change, it should be noted that Kmart has been upstaged by the very profitable Walmart stores, and is currently battling to restore its profitability and share of market.

"My booth is the first of its kind in Michigan," the young entrepreneur explained. "I picked Wonderland Mall because the start up rent was low and I wanted to be somewhere with a lot of foot traffic."

If all goes well, Hamilton plans to expand POD 2000 to other malls in the metro area. Naturally, he's busiest during the after-school hours and on Friday and Saturday nights, but from time to time, a mall walker wants to "hook up" to check out this 21st century form of entertainment.

"My grandkids really get into these computer games," said John Vaughn of Livonia eyeing the attraction. "Maybe I'll have a try one day to see what it's all about. I've seen reports about these kind of machines on television, but I thought they were a few years away."

Made in Great Britain, Hamilton's two state-of-the-art pods feature two games: Zone Hunter and Dactyl Nightmare. Zone Hunter puts a solo player or partners, in a race for survival against evil and the clock. With one hand on a trigger mechanism, the player moves forward and through a three-dimensional playing ground, shooting bad guys.

"Not bad guys, actually," Ham-

ilton corrected. "Monsters."

Players move their heads up and down while "virtually" falling through the floor and ascending to the rooftops during the game. The speed of play is matched to a player's expertise. It's not a game for the self-conscious, and it's as much fun to watch people playing the game in the middle of a mall, as it is personally blasting away at the monsters.

"The Zone Hunter and Dactyl Nightmare games are just like the latest arcade games you would find at Cedar Point," Hamilton said. "But now you don't have to travel far to try them out."

Mall spokeswoman Cathy Peters said offering shoppers entertainment opportunities is a growing trend in the mall business.

"Providing entertainment venues is a new thing for the shopping centers," she said. "Virtual reality games are very popular with teens today, so Wonderland is excited and happy to have these games for them."

POD 2000 is open during regular mall hours in the court near Montgomery Ward. Sometimes, there are waiting lines to play after the mall movies let out on weekends. For more information call (313) 513-6989.



## Handling adversity

### Salem, Canton vie in a different kind of meet

Emotions run high when Canton and Salem teams tangle, but the emotions were different when the two swim teams met at Canton Thursday. The competitive edginess was tempered by an event outside the sport — the tragic loss Canton coach Ron Krueger suffered when his son, Dan, was killed.

Suddenly, the importance of the meet shrunk. Emotional support for the Krueger family poured in from throughout Plymouth and Canton communities, and beyond.

There were doubts that the meet would take place at all. But it did, and Krueger was there. And once in the water, girls from both teams directed their energies toward their competitions — and that worked well for a solid Salem team that prevailed 120-66 in Canton's pool.

"The kids handled it very well," said Salem coach Chuck Olson. "Ron wanted the meet to go on — that's why we had it. That's the way

he is. It definitely wasn't easy for him, but he did a great job. And the girls swam well for him.

"Initially, there was a moment of silence for Danny. There were a lot of people there who weren't at the

funeral because they couldn't be. But once that was over, it was all business. It was back to work."

Although the score indicated a

## Krueger takes coaching future 'a day at a time'

The questions couldn't help but surface, quietly, from the periphery.

What now?

What would Ron Krueger do? His 18-year-old son, Dan, a standout wrestler at Redford Catholic Central, had been killed in a car accident last Sunday (Sept. 17).

All Plymouth and Canton seemed to mourn with the Kruegers — a tribute to someone so young, who had had such a positive and far-reaching influence on so many.

"The funeral was incredible," Krueger said. "The people at Schrader's (Funeral Home) said they never had a bigger one."

But now, what about Ron? What would he do?

The answer was quickly forthcoming. One of the teams Krueger coaches, Plymouth Canton's girls swim team (as well as Salem's wrestling team), hosted its biggest rival, Plymouth Salem, in a dual meet Thursday.

Many doubted the meet would take place. Salem coach Chuck Olson, one of those who urged Krueger — a wrestling coach — to take the Canton swim job when it opened last summer, had his doubts.

The meet was held. And Krueger was there, with his wife, Dolores.

"He was there for them," said Olson. "They were there together."

To many, their presence was shocking. But Olson, who wasn't entirely sure what Krueger would do, wasn't surprised by his decision, either. "It's the way he is," he said.

The night wasn't easy for Krueger, certainly. "I was pretty stiff, cardboardish," he said.

But coaching has its own rewards. When Canton's Angie Frost splashed to a first-place finish in the 100-yard freestyle, Krueger said it gave him something that had eluded him since the tragedy — peace of mind, if only for a brief moment. "When she won, I was just so happy for her," he said. "I had it out of my head for awhile."

How long can that kind of therapy be effective? No one can answer that. Krueger makes no predictions regarding his coaching future: "I'll

take it one day at a time, that's all I can say."

When he doubts his own abilities to coach — "When I feel it's not right, when I'm not helping," Krueger said — he'll give it up.

In simple terms, the loss of Dan

was a tragedy for many, he had touched so many lives in his 18 years.

That loss would be compounded if his father left coaching — because he, too, has had such a far-reaching, positive effect on so many young lives.

## Final-play stop gives Salem an OT victory

You don't get points for failed gambles in football games, but perhaps they count for something in life.

Coach Lauri Niskanen made a mild departure from the conventional Friday night when he went for two points instead of settling for a second shot at a tie-breaker series, and it cost Farmington a chance at a victory.

Lineman Tom Bish and linebacker Tim Kocoloski of Plymouth Salem wrapped up Farmington upback Wesley Cornwell, who received a flip from the Falcons' holder on a fake extra-point try, to give the Rocks a 35-34 victory and snap a season-long three-game losing streak.

Cornwell never had a chance to move because Bish and Kocoloski had the play so well snuffed out, they almost beat him to the toss.

Jake Siskosky, who carried 34 times for 227 yards in the game, had just scored for the fifth time in the game on a one-yard sweep of right end to pull Farmington, also 1-3, within a point.

Farmington rallied from a 28-7 halftime deficit on Siskosky's 17 carries for 155 yards. He scored on runs of 22-, 54- and 45-yards in the second and third quarters as Niskanen ran him again and again.

Quarterback Nathan Gray started the overtime with a 6-yard option run, and then made it into the end zone on his second squirm to break a 28-28 tie. Brian James kicked the vital extra point to make it 35-28.

Siskosky ran three times to the end before Farmington called timeout.

"We told them on fourth down we were going to go for two after we scored," Niskanen said. "We were going for a win. We didn't want to drag it out."

"I don't care what level you're at, you're going to be second-guessed. Why don't you line up in a formation and run a play?"

"Well, first of all you can't fall behind 28-7 and expect to win. We've practiced that play all season. And you've only got about 30 seconds to

make these decisions."

The decision sends several messages to Niiskanen's kids — and their parents.

By gambling, he let them know it's okay to take a risk — even if you don't make it. And he showed them something else with his willingness to accept responsibility for the consequences.

Farmington had Salem fans moaning about the prospect of a fourth-straight loss when it took the opening kickoff and marched 71 yards to a touchdown, Siakosky scoring on a 4-yard run.

Siakosky carried 12 times for 60 yards in the drive, including

bursts of 11 and 19 yards on his first two rushes.

"They marched right down the field," Salem coach Tom Moshimer said. "But they've done that twice already this season and both times the teams they did it to came back to win."

"I told our kids we could do it, too. They'd just seen that happen on film."

It took the Rocks three plays (one a penalty) to knot the score.

Matt Johnson went left with a pitch, thanks to a nifty block in the backfield by Kevin Grim, and swept 58 yards to score.

A roughing-the-punter call gave Salem the ball on the Farmington 39 early in the second quarter and Gray hit Randy Mack with a 19-yard pass before Grim followed a penalty with a 28-yard romp.

Gray scored on a 4-yard run with 4:54 left in the half and hit Mack with a 41-yard pass that put the ball on the three with less than a minute to play. Johnson was stopped twice at the one before Gray snuck it in to make it 28-7.

"We should never have let them back in the ball game," Moshimer said. "I'm disappointed that we did. I told our kids you can't be a good team and let people back in

the game.

"I think what happened was they took control of the line of scrimmage in the second half. But we threw more in this game than we might have in the past and I think that helped."

The misdirection and pitches that worked for Salem in the first half were not there in the second. Salem also turned the ball over twice while the Rocks' defense was suffering from a near-terminal case of Siskosky-itis.

Farmington fans who might want to chide Niiskanen might want to remember he made a successful gamble in the last minutes that kept Plymouth from getting the ball until only 48 seconds remained.

On 4th-and-3 at the Farmington 45, the Falcons snapped the ball to upback Nick Latra and he gained 10 yards to help his team maintain possession for three plays and a punt.

The next gamble failed, however, and sent Farmington to another loss.

"I never suspected it," Moshimer said of Farmington's failed two-point fake. "Not a bit."

His kids were ready, though. And there is nothing lucky about that at all.

# Chiefs battle back to edge Franklin in triple overtime

Big plays — the team that makes the most, wins. It's often just that simple.

Plymouth Canton and Livonia Franklin found themselves mired in a game full of big plays and missed opportunities. Something had to give as the end of the third overtime approached, and Canton defensive end Jason Masur provided it, knocking down David McMullen's fourth-down pass to preserve Canton's come-from-behind 26-20 victory.

"That was just a great play," said Franklin coach Rick Lee, adding, "for Canton."

The win improved the Chiefs' record to 2-2. Franklin fell to 1-3.

The Patriots had the early lead, scoring with 1:50 left in the opening quarter on a 23-yard option pass from Brian Facione to Paul Terek. It was the first of two TD catches for Terek; he finished with seven receptions for 115 yards.

Giving Canton quarterback Rob Johnson too many chances can be a mistake. Johnson collected the bulk of the yardage in the Chiefs' game-tying, fourth-quarter, 65-yard drive, 39 of them coming on an option play that reached the end zone. Jason Pennebaker's extra-point kick tied it at 7-all with 6:48 remaining.

The Chiefs put together another drive late in the game, thanks to a 27-yard run by Mike Rener

(65 yards on 10 carries) that got them to the Franklin 21 and a 16-yard Johnson scramble that put the ball at the 6 with 25 seconds left. But Pennebaker's 22-yard field goal try bent wide left with 10 seconds to go, forcing OT.

The Chiefs got the initial possession (each team starts with a first down at the opponents' 10-yard line) and capitalized, with Johnson completing an 11-yard pass to Eric Sarrault at the 2 and Rener scoring on the next play. A bad snap on the extra point try left Johnson to scramble, short of the end zone.

Franklin scored on its first play, a McMullen 10-yard pass to Terek. But 5-foot-7, 160-pound noseguard Shaun Dyer busted

through the line and blocked Brandon Bell's extra point, leaving it tied at 13.

The Patriots got first possession in the next round and scored on a 4-yard swing pass from McMullen to Brett Karowski. Bell's placement made it 20-13. The Chiefs also converted, Johnson passing 11 yards to Penne-

baker on a post pattern. Pennebaker's placement tied it at 20-all.

Canton started with the ball in the third round, and the possession was a short one: a 10-yard TD pass from Johnson to a wide-open Nick Belyk in the middle of the end zone. Another bad snap caused Pennebaker's placement

to go wide right, making it 26-20.

Franklin's Jeremy Betley lost 5 yards on first down, but a questionable interference call on a Johnson interception gave the Patriots another first down at the Canton 7. However, two runs sandwiched around an incomplete pass garnered just four yards.

## Chiefs collect 1st dual triumph

The winning streak didn't last long for Plymouth Canton's golf team.

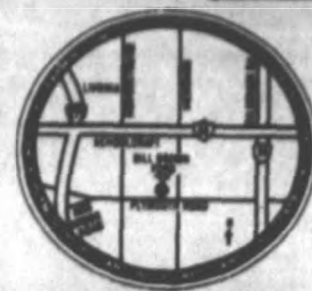

### Hyundai targets value-driven buyers with upgraded Sonata

ARLINGTON HEIGHTS, Ill. -- Hyundai has aimed its 1995 Sonata at family buyers who are driven by price, safety and value considerations.

The South Korean carmaker, which has struggled to grab a stronger hold in the U.S. market, has redesigned the \$13,299 Sonata inside and out for 1995 so it provides improved handling, performance and safety features.

The Sonata, equipped with dual air bags, has more interior room than any other car in its class -- and that's saying a lot since it includes the

school in suburban Chicago, the Sonata handled better and delivered quicker acceleration in head-to-head testing than the Camry, Grand Am and Accord.

The 1995 Sonata has changed considerably over the 1994. Small pillars and more glass allow the driver more visibility -- 108 degrees of vision. It's 20 percent stiffer and has less body roll than the previous model.

Standard: The double overhead cam 2-liter 4-cylinder powerplant provides 137 horses when mated to a 5-speed manual transmission. The 4-speed automatic transaxle is a worthy option,

Also optional is a 3.0-liter V6 that provides 147 horsepower, a definite improvement over the 4-cylinder.

The Sonata rates high as a quality family-car option. It has enough interior room to hold three passengers in the back and trunk cargo room for anything from luggage for four to a month's worth of groceries.

The base Sonata comes standard with air conditioning, power steering, tilt steering wheel, tinted glass, full wheel covers, dual remote mirrors and an AM/FM cassette stereo.

The V6 engine is not an option on the base model, but is available

on the GL and GLS trim levels. The Sonata GL package adds automatic transmission, power windows, power door locks and heated power mirrors. The GLS trim includes the V6 engine, automatic transmission, dual body color power-remote mirrors, deluxe grille treatment with bright accent, gas shocks, alloy wheels with high performance radials, cruise control, overhead map lights, premium AM/FM cassette stereo and a six-way adjustable driver's seat.

Hyundai also offers a 24-hour roadside-assistance program.

Safety equipment available includes anti-lock brakes, four-wheel disc brakes, child-proof rear door locks, enhanced side-impact occupant protection, an energy absorbing steering column, and reinforced side pillars and roof for rollover protection.

The ABS system incorporated in the Sonata is one of the best, with sensors located independently in each wheel for optimum driver control and function.

The dual air bag system has an incident recorder -- much like the

black box on airplanes. It will provide critical impact data for later analysis.

Hyundai has discontinued its free three-year bumper-to-bumper servicing contract in 1995. The contract, which Hyundai officials say has helped build consumer confidence in the company's cars, had given buyers free oil changes, tune-ups and other maintenance.

A two-year option is being offered for \$250.

"We have great confidence in the quality of our cars and we're not opting for the service to maintain the lowest cost of Sonata in its segment," said Doug Mazza, chief executive of Hyundai's U.S. operations.

"Research showed us owners wouldn't opt for the service, but would rather have a lower-priced car."
