Church compromise on the block

Temple Baptist Church and Plymouth Township officials have worked out a compromise plan to allow the church to build here.

The township board of trustees is scheduled to vote at its 7:30 p.m. meeting Tuesday at township hall on

the proposed settlement of the church's suit against the township.

Trustees say they don't like having a mega-church here, but there's no way around it as courts say churches have a right to practice their religion.

"I think that it's in the best interests of the township because of the risks in this case," said township Su-

pervisor Kathleen Keen McCarthy.

Several neighbors of the planned church have urged the township to fight the case in court: "There is still no question in my mind, and I have talked with several attorneys, that the church would not prevail," said attorney Gordon Didier. "Apparently for whatever reason they (trustees) are extremely reluctant to rely on the courts," he added.

Temple Baptist Church filed a \$5 million suit against the township last year, claiming the planning commission denied the church's freedom of religion by rejecting its plans to build

at North Territorial and Ridge roads.

If township trustees approve the compromise on Tuesday, it would head off a Nov. 1 date in federal court on the lawsuit.

McCarthy said this compromise with Temple Baptist sets a limit on how big the church can ultimately get — something not provided for in other proposals rejected by trustees.

The proposal, spelled out in an 18-page consent agreement, would allow building in three phases. Construction on the first phase would begin next year, but work on the second and third phases can't begin for five years.

Saving greyhounds volunteers' goal

If you see a pack of greyhounds in a back yard off of North Territorial Road, there's a good reason.

The former racing dogs are being cared for by Leslie Forsys of Plymouth and Amy Eversole of Belleville. In April, they started Michigan Retired Greyhounds as Pets (REGAP).

The women are seeking to place the dogs, usually 2-4 years old, with dog lovers in households suited to the breed.

Eversole became interested in the dogs after visiting a greyhound race track down south. Both she and Forsys, who had experience volunteering for another dog rescue group, learned more of the mistreatment of racing greyhounds through the short

documentary film "From Cradle to Grave," and from information collected from the national REGAP organization.

"As soon as they're out of the money three times they're destroyed," Forsys said. An estimated 50,000-60,000 racing dogs are killed each year.

Yet, life's no breeze for the winners. When not racing, they wait standing side-by-side in cramped crates — and are let out only to relieve themselves.

"The racing industry has been extremely convincing in saying they're hyper-violent dogs that can't be pets," Forsys said.

But in truth, the dogs are not aggressive. "They love soft things, they're a real quiet breed," Eversole

said, adding most don't bark.

In ancient times, they were the dogs of royalty and people of distinction. In early Arabian culture, the birth of a greyhound was cause for celebration and they were the only dog permitted to share an Arab's tent or ride atop his camel.

The dog's sprinting ability enables it to reach speeds of 40 mph, yet it can stop on a dime, Eversole said.

To collect dogs intended for slaughter, the women have traveled to racing tracks as far away as Texas and Mexico.

People wanting to adopt a greyhound should know most aren't good with small animals in the house — yet some are. The animals are tested for their ability to get

along with other pets before they're placed in a home.

Cost to adopt is \$175. The dogs are clean, gentle with kids, very social and kennel broken — meaning they usually housebreak easily, say REGAP volunteers. They can become watch dogs but not attack dogs.

While greyhounds don't need more exercise than other breeds — a daily walk or jog will do — they should never be let off of a leash outside a fenced-in area.

"They have tunnel vision — once they see something they're off. They can get hit by a car or get lost," Eversole said.

Leaf disposal method varies in city, township

Do you live in the city of Plymouth or Plymouth Township?

That's important to know when it comes to dealing with leaves on your lawn, as the city and township have different methods for collecting leaves.

In the city of Plymouth, residents are urged to rake leaves to the curb, where they'll be picked up by a leaf vacuum or with a claw-arm shovel.

"We're going to start collecting leaves on Monday (today)," said Paul Sincok, city Department of Public

Works director.

While residents should rake leaves to the curb, Sincok said, "We strongly advise our residents not to block storm drains."

"We anticipate making at least three complete passes through the city during the leaf pickup program," Sincok said, adding it should last about six weeks.

Leaves will be dumped at the county yard near Wilcox Mill, then hauled away for composting by the city's contractor, Mass Trucking. Sincok said 4,000 to 5,000 cubic yards of leaves were collected in the city last year.

"We always encourage residents to run their lawn mower over leaves a couple of times," he said, to cut down on the raking job. The ground-up leaves are also good for lawns.

Sincok said that while the claw device leaves a chalk mark on the street, it does not damage the pavement.

In Plymouth Township, residents can bag leaves in special paper compost bags, or place them in trash containers marked with a "C" or "X."

"Basically, the leaves can't be placed in plastic bags," said Chris Haas, township solid waste coordina-

tor.

The township's leaf pickup program is scheduled to run through Dec. 1.

Paper compost bags are available at Kroger, 44505 W. Ann Arbor Road, and at the township's Division of Public Services Solid Waste Department at 46555 Port St. Cost for 25 bags is \$7.50.

Haas encourages residents not to rake leaves to the street, adding they can clog sewers and cause flooding problems.

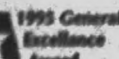

Local drivers whose licenses are suspended could lose autos

If you're driving with a suspended license in Plymouth, Canton, or Northville, beware. You may end up losing your car for four months.

Judges in 35th District Court are beginning to enforce an infrequently-imposed provision of the law that enables courts to impound vehicles for up to 120 days.

They're giving the policy a try because drivers with suspended li-

censes so often ignore courts' revocation of their driving privileges.

"It's the only teeth the law has, other than sending people to jail," said 35th District Judge Ron Lowe. "I can take your license away, but I can't prevent you from driving."

"If there is going to be reinforcement of these traffic ordinances and ramifications, people need to realize that if they violate a court order that says you cannot drive while your license

is suspended that there is some serious punishment."

Lowe said it's common to encounter defendants who've been caught more than once driving with a suspended license.

"It is not unusual to look at files where the person has had several tickets for driving while his or her license was suspended," said Lowe. "You ask if their car has ever been taken away, their license plate confiscated or if they've ever been sent to jail, and

they say no. I tell them, 'You're about to realize there are ramifications. It's obvious that when we tell you not to drive, we can't trust you, so we'll prevent you from driving.'"

Typically, defendants whose cars are being impounded have committed "what I feel are major infractions," said Lowe, adding that Judge John MacDonald is enforcing the same policy.

They are motorists with suspended licenses who are arrested

for driving while under the influence of liquor, or drivers who've lost their licenses after accumulating 12 or more points because they're poor drivers, said Lowe.

Plymouth police Chief Robert Scoggins is all for the idea.

"I think it is a positive action by Judge Lowe," said the chief. "It is something where people have the perception that they get a slap on the wrist from the court."

"Obviously this is a turn from that direction. This is an at-

tempt to enforce a penalty that will get people's attention."

Lowe can't yet say how the policy is working. "It's too early to say whether the word is getting out and people are buckling down."

Scoggins suspects the word will get around. "His action of trying to impose stricter sanctions hopefully will have an impact on deterring people from driving with suspended or revoked licenses."

Fitzsimmons builds war chest to ready for race against Rivers

Former Ann Arbor business executive Joseph Fitzsimmons is preparing to challenge freshman Democrat U.S. Rep. Lynn Rivers in next year's election.

Fitzsimmons, 60, is the first to file for the 13th Congressional seat, and has already raised \$100,000, he said, and hopes to raise \$1 million.

The 13th District includes Canton and Plymouth townships, Plymouth, Westland, Garden City, the southwest quadrant of Livonia and 15 other communities in Wayne and Washtenaw counties.

Like many Republicans, Fitzsimmons stresses self-reliance: "You've got to stand up on your own two feet," he said in an Observer interview Oct. 24. "Go on. Get out of bed and go to work. No free lunches. No free lunches as far as I'm concerned. To me you've got to get up and hit singles over a long period of time. No home runs. To do that, get yourself a decent background, education, self-discipline and you'll be very successful in this wonderful country of ours. But the present situation breeds dependency and failure."

Unlike many Republicans, Fitzsimmons is pro-choice on abortion. "It's a tough decision (to have an abortion)," he said. "I think adoption is a better choice, but it's an individual decision as far as I'm concerned."

His background

Fitzsimmons, an Ann Arbor resident, recently stepped down as chairman of Ann Arbor-based University Microfilms International, where he worked almost 30 years. UMI has been a pioneer in applying technology to acquiring, preserving and distributing a wide range of literature from the Gutenberg Bible to the Canton Observer.

But retirement isn't in the 6-foot, 5-inch candidate's vocabulary. "I'll never retire," he said.

"Once you retire, you die."

Fitzsimmons' business background puts him in good stead with many area Republicans, including Wayne County Commissioner Bruce Patterson, R-Canton Township, 13th District Republican Party Chairman Sean Cox, state Sen. Loren Bennett, R-Canton Township, and Wayne County Commissioner Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, who have all endorsed him.

Early endorsements

Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack also likes Fitzsimmons. "He brings private sector experience and philosophy to government that many times is not there," Yack said.

Although Yack doesn't question Rivers' integrity or fault her performance in terms of constituent service — "Her staff does a good job with problem-solving" — he opposes her nonetheless based on political differences.

Fitzsimmons illustrates the difference between himself and Rivers by noting how she voted and how he would have voted on 40 "key votes" in the current Congress' first 100 days.

Rivers' votes differed from Fitzsimmons' positions 24 times.

"She is on the far left, as liberal as can be," he said. But that is not entirely clear, he added, because "she's voting on a Republican agenda."

Rivers' response

Rivers said Fitzsimmons' characterization is unfair because she supported several provisions of the Republicans' Contract with America. "If you look at the options available to me on any given vote, you'll see that I've tried to do the reasonable thing," she said. "I hope we're going to deal with reality in this campaign and not get into mudslinging."

Rivers, Fitzsimmons said, "is, in my view, tied to (U.S. Rep. David) Bonior and takes direction from him."

Rivers responds: "My husband would laugh (at that). I don't take direction from anybody."

Fitzsimmons characterized himself as a free agent. "I have

no ties (to other political figures)," he said. "I believe I'm an independent thinker and will vote my conscience and what I think is best for our people."

Campaign issues

In his campaign, Fitzsimmons said he will emphasize four items: ■ Crime/drugs: He favors an "all-out war" on people who use and sell illegal drugs. "I think we've got to get tough on that issue. We can get rid of 80 percent of the criminals by getting rid of the drugs."

Education: "To be productive you've got to be literate. I want to get (kids) hooked on books or hooked on the computer screen."

■ Inefficient government: "We have to find a way to get the waste out of the process. I can tell you that in the Medicare system practically everybody is on the take one way or another."

■ Overregulation: "Reduce the tremendous number of regulations we have, especially those that are focused on making it difficult for business, especially small business, to perform. I want (small businesses) springing up like flowers. That's where all the growth is coming from."

Fitzsimmons said he plans to serve no more than six years if elected. "I have no interest in staying any longer than that," he said. "I think I can make a major contribution in that period of time."

Then he added, "I suppose I could go over, but my point is that I think turnover is good. I'm really against long-term politicians."

If elected, Fitzsimmons said he will return to the district often. "I'm looking to be back here Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday," he said. "I will spend as much time here as I absolutely can."

Fitzsimmons is the only child of Joseph and Frances Fitzsimmons and grew up in Newark, N.J. Joseph was a butcher, Frances a teacher. Fitzsimmons has an electrical engineering degree from Cornell University.

A Michigan resident since 1966, Fitzsimmons has five grown children, including a son, Joe Jr., living in Canton and a son, Mike, who is an orthopedic surgeon.

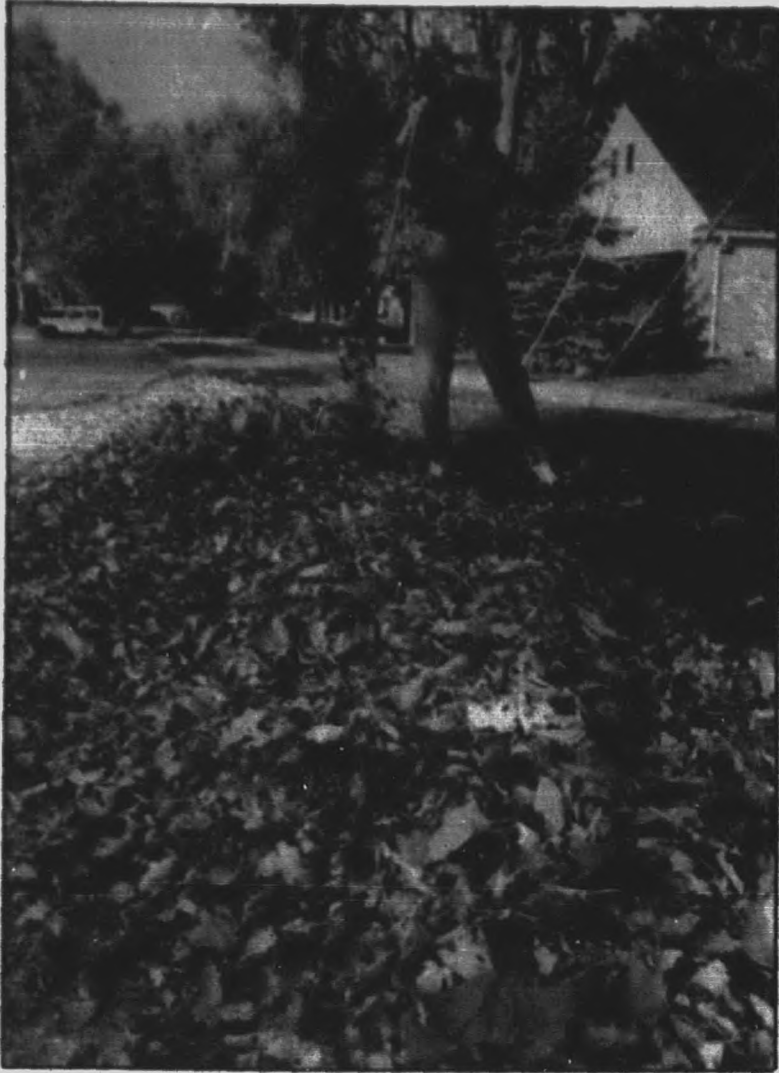

Maximum capacity of the main worship center would be 3,500 by the plan. The number of Christian concerts would also be reduced from earlier negotiated totals, down to 14 per year, other than Christmas and Easter season concerts.

During Christmas season, one concert would be allowed per weekend day for four weekends. During Easter season, one concert would be allowed per weekend day for three weekends.

"This has been very frustrating for everyone, and it's not what I'd like to see personally out there," McCarthy said. "But given all the legal ramifications and risks to the township, I have to do what's best for the township," she said.

Trustee K.C. Mueller agreed. "Given the situation with the current federal laws, this is the best compromise we can agree to," she said.

"Both sides are probably going away a little bit unhappy, so that

probably says it's fair," Mueller said, adding the proposal gives the township a guarantee against future church expansion.

Temple Baptist pastor Brad Powell said Friday, "We've done a lot of negotiating, we've come to some real good understanding about what the project will be. It looks like a win-win situation for the township and for Temple Baptist."

"It appears to us they have finally settled it, but until they ap-

prove it it's all negotiation," Powell said.

"I'm not going to be happy with the result," said Trustee Ron Griffith, adding, "That doesn't mean I won't vote for it."

"We're at a point based on the legal opinions where we need to get the best deal we can get that will make sense to both parties," he said. "I wanted less traffic congestion than I think we're going to have to live with."

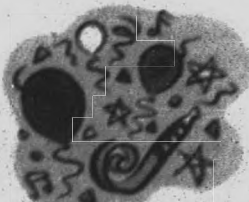

Teacher certification

New rules will allow 'experts' to teach

Charter schools — like the Nah Tah Wahah and El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz public school academies — would be able to set their own standards for professional teacher orientation under new "alternative teaching certificate" rules approved by the State Board of Education.

The board gave the controversial rules 5-3 approval Oct. 18 and forwarded them to the Legislature for approval under the Administrative Procedures Act.

The rules are designed to allow experts in their fields to teach in public schools without going through the lengthy teacher certification process — college courses in education, student teaching under a mentor and provisional certification.

Under current rules, say those who want change, Lee Iacocca couldn't teach business, U.S. Sens. Carl Levin and Spence Abraham couldn't teach civics,

and filmmaker Ken Burns couldn't teach Civil War history in Michigan public schools.

Nah Tah Wahah is a Potawatomi culture and language academy in Menominee, and El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz offers a "holistic, Afrocentric curriculum" in Lansing, according to the Michigan Partnership for New Education's report to the State Board. They are among 37 charter schools. Charter schools would have broad powers to set standards and request "expert in residence" teaching permits under the new rules (see sidebar).

"Exert great caution," Jerry Robbins, dean of Eastern Michigan University's College of Education, warned the board, citing his experience in Georgia.

"Some (alternately certified teachers) were very good, but it was a disaster in other cases," Robbins went on. While teachers recruited from as far away as Germany to teach science, math and foreign languages knew their sub-

jects, they didn't know classroom management and how to motivate kids.

"There was enormous turnover. Many didn't survive the first semester. It was a wasted year for the kids," Robbins said.

Said Paula Wood, dean of Wayne State University's College of Education: "There's a consistent, positive relationship between student achievement in science and teachers' background in both education courses and science courses. Best student performance in math results from teachers who had higher numbers of math methods courses."

Wood said teachers who haven't taken courses in how to teach don't know curriculum development, don't know a variety of teaching methods, don't know cooperative learning, don't know about different learning styles and don't know classroom management.

Board president Clark Durant, however, urged immediate board

approval over protests from some members and the two university deans that the document had been kept under wraps until a few days before the meeting.

Voting yes were Republicans Durant of Grosse Pointe, Marilyn Lundy of Detroit, Gary Wolfram of Hillsdale, Sharon Wise of Owosso and Ruth Braun of Saginaw.

Voting no were Republican Dorothy Beardmore of Rochester Hills and Democrats Kathleen Straus of Detroit and Barbara Roberts Mason of Lansing.

The split is becoming a familiar one. Durant's group disdains the advice and input of educators and praises the marketplace as it junks "rules and regulations" that impede parental decisions.

Durant attempted to ridicule teacher certification standards by saying a Farmington School District principal recently rejected EMU's Dean Robbins as a math

Split state board adopts new rules

Currently, a Michigan public school teacher must have earned a bachelor's degree and taken teacher preparation courses from a State Board-approved college; passed tests on basic skills, specific skills in the academic area; and teach in a classroom supervised by an experienced mentor.

Under new State Board of Education rules, two new kinds of teaching certificates for public

schools would be added:

1. **Experienced Individuals** teaching certificate for secondary schools. It would be valid five years and be renewable. The person must:

- Have at least a bachelor's degree from "an accredited" or State Board-approved college.
- Have five years of work experience in the area where he or she is to teach. Military and Peace Corps experience can be counted.

(Opponents noted that the applicant isn't required to have been successful in his/her work.)

- Passed basic skills and subject area tests.

■ Meet requirements of "an education profession orientation program provided by a local school district, a public school academy, an intermediate school district, or a State Board-approved" college, or other entity approved by the State Board.

2. **Expert in Residence** teaching permit.

A person need not meet academic requirements but must have demonstrated talent, knowledge or experience as "requested by a local school district, public school academy or intermediate school district."

The certificate is requested by the district or academy and is valid only in that school and only in the subject area. It may be revoked.

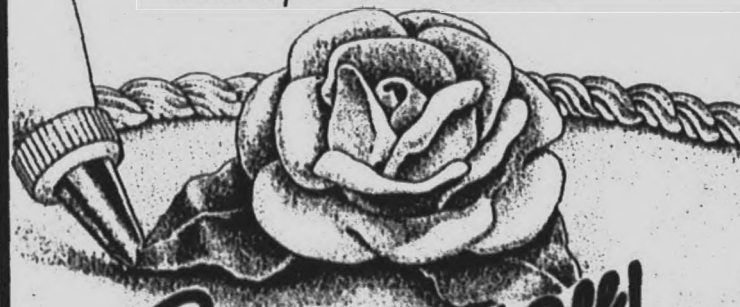

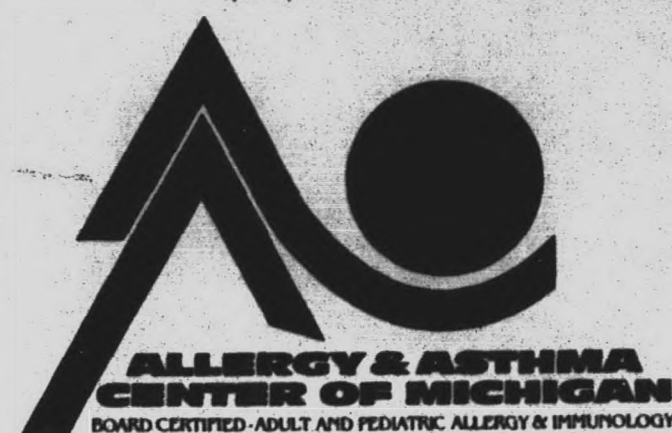

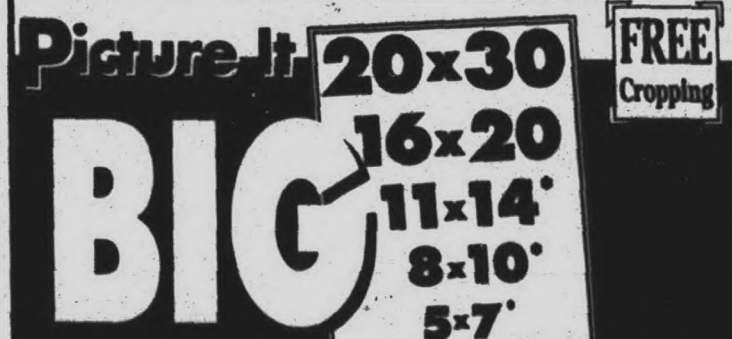

County puts local road projects on hold

Wayne County roads officials claim that as many as 31 of its federally-aided road improvement projects scheduled for 1996 and 1997 may be postponed for several years because of action taken by Gov. John Engler.

County officials are speaking out after the governor's announcement last Wednesday that the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) plans to keep \$192 million in federal road funds from coming to cities and counties over three years so MDOT can pay for several of its new highway projects.

County officials said the road improvement projects in jeopardy will affect county roads in nearly every Wayne County community. "By this unconscionable action, Gov. Engler has in effect canceled 31 significant road improvements on our road system alone," said Russ Gronewelt, Wayne County's director of public services.

"The roads that pass in front of our houses and businesses are being sacrificed to MDOT can build new freeways," added Gronewelt.

Engler's plan calls for completion of the new Haggerty Con-

struction of Canton Center Road. ■ Garden City — resurfacing of Cherry Hill Road. ■ Livonia — reconstruction of Seven Mile and Eight Mile roads. ■ Plymouth Township — resurfacing of Haggerty and Plymouth roads. ■ Westland — Resurfacing of Van Born Road through Westland and Romulus. ■ Wayne — Resurfacing of Venoy Road.

Nearly 300 municipalities, road commissions, county boards of commissioners and statewide groups such as the Michigan Municipal League (MML), the Michigan Association of Counties (MAC) and the Michigan Township Association (MTA), have sent resolutions to the Michigan Legislature decrying the condition of all Michigan roads and calling for a hike in the Michigan gasoline tax which has not been increased in almost 12 years.

Michigan ranks 49th in the percentage of roads under state jurisdiction and 30th in state highway mileage. Historically, local governments in Michigan have received more money because they are responsi-

ble for a much larger road system. The action to cut local construction funds in half follows on the heels of the soon to be felt impacts of the phase-out of Build Michigan monies which many locals used to supplement operating revenues.

The employees' role is to observe and report," Taylor said. "They are advised not to attempt to apprehend anyone involved in an apparent crime. But their vehicles can serve as havens until the proper authorities arrive."

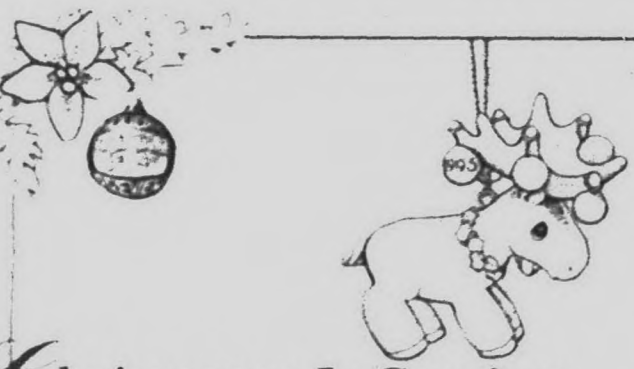

Priest to discuss welfare that works

Welfare, a subject hotly debated in Washington, D.C., will be the topic of a luncheon address by the founder and president of The Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Wednesday, Oct. 25.

The Rev. Robert Sirico will speak on "Welfare that Works" at the noon luncheon at the Detroit Athletic Club, 241 Madison, Detroit. Tickets cost \$20 and reservations are necessary.

A Catholic priest and full-time pastor, Sirico founded the Grand Rapids-based institute, a nonprofit think tank, to expose future religious leaders of all faiths to free-market ideas.

Sirico points out that without a change in the current welfare state, the condition of the poor will remain the same. The whole system discourages productivity and discourages giving on the part of the private sector, he said.

Sirico has proposed that government take less of a role and allow people to keep their charitable dollars. The Christian obligation to help others, he said, "would be more readily apparent and easier to carry out."

"The private sector is not being asked to duplicate the welfare state," he said. "Private charities need not spend what the government now spends on welfare. A third of the welfare budget is

three times the amount needed to raise all poor people above the poverty line.

"The evidence shows that as the government role is dramatically reduced, contributions to charitable organizations would rise. People give when they know there is a need and when they know their money will be wisely spent."

With a country that has grown dependent on government aid, Sirico believes that block grants, money channeled from the federal to state level for governors to dispense, represent a move in the right direction.

But, as Sirico sees it, the most

positive thing is people are working with alternatives and thinking of solutions that could bring an end to the current welfare system.

"We know of organizations which are successful at serving the needy without government funding," Sirico said. "It is our task to make these groups known to the wider community, including our legislators, because their way works better."

The ideas he spouts now are in sharp contrast to his earlier beliefs. At one time a left-wing political activist, he helped get Tom Hayden elected to office in California. His ideas, however, changed after reading such works

as F.A. Hayek's "The Road to Serfdom," Milton Friedman's "Capitalism and Freedom" and Ludwig von Mises' "Socialism and Human Action."

Those works had a profound effect on him and convinced him that the unfettered free market served mankind's material needs and promoted freedom better than the socialism he had promoted. They introduced him to natural-law thinking, led him back to the Catholic church of his youth and eventually to the priesthood.

But while in the seminary, Sirico found his views weren't shared by many of those teaching there, so he founded the Acton Institute, named for British historian Lord Acton, best known for his warning that power corrupts and "absolute power corrupts absolutely."

The institute publishes a newsletter, "Religion & Liberty," and sponsors intensive three-day seminars to bring those entering the pulpit together with free-market scholars. It also sponsors a series of seminars for business leaders.

"The market fosters a number of positive virtues, such as thrift and hard work," Sirico has said. "In a truly free market, no one can make money without doing someone some good."

teacher for an experiment.

But Robbins embarrassed Durant by replying: "The principal at Farmington was right. My credentials are from other states and have expired." Robbins quoted the unnamed Farmington principal as saying, "Look at whose interests are to be served" — not the would-be teacher's but the students'.

"Success for kids is a three-legged stool: (the teacher's) knowledge of the subject matter, the ability to impart that knowledge to kids, and the hiring and placement. A person qualified to teach first grade may be a disaster with sixth-graders," Robbins said.

"Don't throw out the research we know exists. Read the research," said WSU's Wood during the audience participation part of the meeting.

Durant's assistant, Michael Warren, led a formal presentation on existing and proposed rules with three favorable witnesses — a procedure board member Straus criticized as stacked toward one point of view.

Pete Sinclair, of the Michigan Association of School Boards, said, "I can teach firefighting (in state-run courses) but not in the public schools. My daughter is a CPA (certified public accountant) and can teach accounting in a community college but not in a public school."

Jack Biddle, of the Michigan Association of Secondary Schools Principals, said his group could support the state board plan "with safeguards." He added, "Schools have had real problems hiring so-called professionals as coaches . . . Being successful in business does not guarantee one's teaching ability."

Ward Staffield, a 17-year staffer with Ingham Circuit Court, said he'd like to make a mid-career switch to teach history and coach.

But he said he can't get night courses in universities to complete his education course requirements, and couldn't spare 14 weeks away from his job to do student teaching.

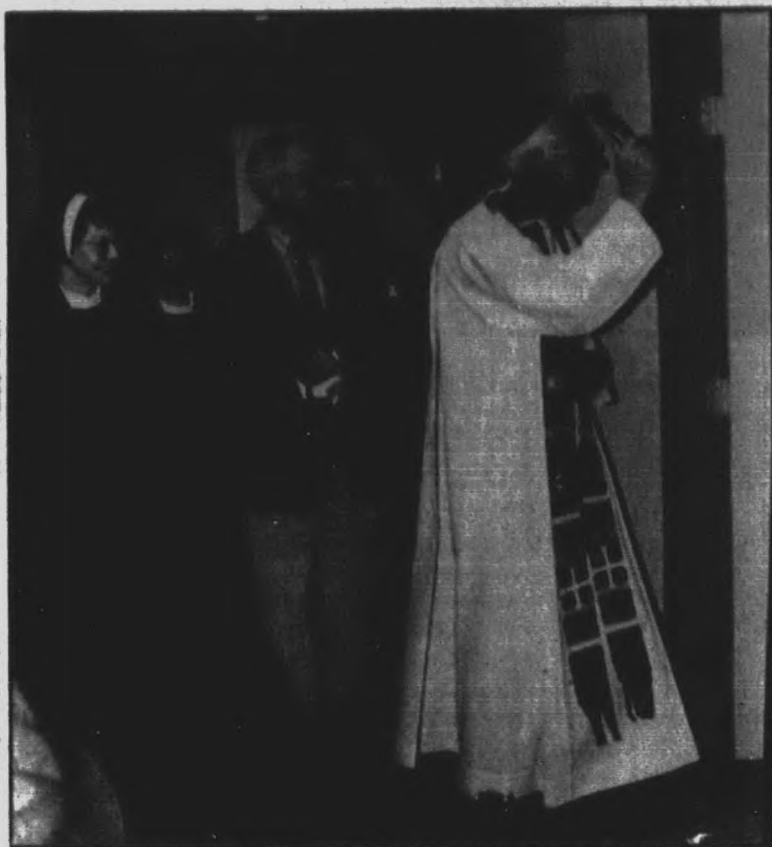

Auto activity accounts for recent business slide

The Detroit Area Business Activity Index compiled by Comerica Bank registered 163 in September, sliding back eight points from August's 14-point economic surge.

In August the index stood at 171, while in July it registered 157.

"At a level of 163 in September, Detroit's economy was operating 2 percent above year-ago levels, and for the first three quarters of 1995, the index was up 2 percent over last year," said Comerica Bank economist David L. Littmann.

"In the third quarter alone, Detroit's economy was up a robust

5.5 percent from the third quarter of 1994.

"August's surge represented an unusual burst of activity, stemming from the auto changeover in July," Littmann said, adding that September's decline showed:

■ Continuing deceleration in the automotive sector.

■ Slippage in electric power sales and aggregate financial activity.

Comerica Bank compiles the Detroit Area Business Activity Index monthly from eight measures of regional activity which are seasonally adjusted, corrected for inflation, and expressed as an index with 1982 as base year equal to 100.

Madonna dedicates Maertens building

Thanks to the generosity of one area family, Madonna University School of Business, the university's out-reach program, the newly formed College of Continuing and Professional Studies and Center for Research have a new home within walking distance of the campus.

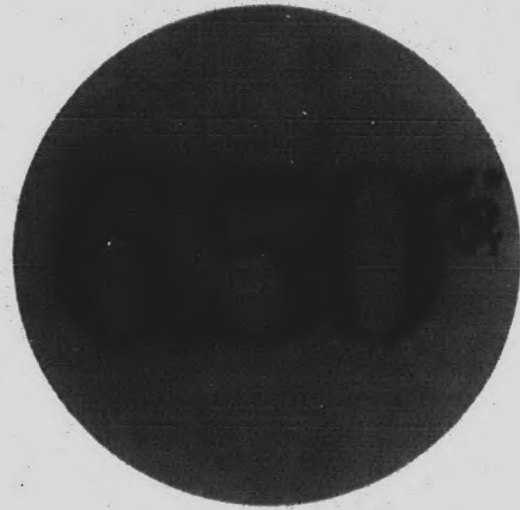

Some foods are better without a grain of salt

We discarded the salt shaker long ago at our house and mainly keep a box of Morton's handy for when it comes time to clean a wooden salad bowl.

But I would be lying if I told you the Janes Gang cooks without a grain of salt.

You don't need a salt shaker to add salt to foods. I was shocked when I read the label on my favorite canned chicken broth and learned it is loaded with sodium. Then there's the fat-free salad dressing mix, the package of taco seasoning, the ketchup bottle, and of course, fast food burgers to which we do occasionally succumb.

But as Gomer Pyle would say, "Surprise, surprise, surprise!" There are some foods that actually taste better without the addition of salt. Take a garden fresh salad.

Dress it with good olive oil, a splash of lemon juice, and a hint of chopped garlic, toss it and you get the flavor Mother Nature intended it to have. Freshness, and the lack of salt, make for greater tasting vegetables, especially when steamed, boiled or stir-fried and dressed only with a splash of fresh lemon.

Contrary to popular belief, the pasta you usually add a handful of salt to while boiling will not taste insipid without the addition of salt. There are also a number of intriguing salt-free sauces that are available.

Homemade salt-free mayonnaise is enlivened with a healthy tablespoon or two of plain yogurt. Meat, fish and poultry need not be ensconced in salt, and really will cook better and retain more of their juices without the shake of salt before roasting, baking or pan frying.

But what is today's health conscious cook supposed to replace salt with? Are there any magical jars of secret condiments that can actually do what salt does - make your food taste better?

Yours truly enjoys a prepackaged product called "Mrs. Dash Table Blend," which is a blend of herbs and spices that actually replaces flavor. But to be perfectly honest, it can't even come close to replacing the needed salt in a tabbouleh salad, homemade gravy or french fries.

Flavor enhancers

Researchers say that the best substitute for salt is fresh lemon. Not the reconstituted bottled version, but the real stuff, freshly squeezed. They say it tends to bring out natural flavors, especially in meat, fish and poultry. Lemon, of course, is paramount in the broiling of fish.

Vinegar and wine also have the ability to add flavor. Pork responds remarkably well to vinegar and does even better when brushed with a mustard-honey glaze to counteract the bitterness of the vinegar during the last 45 minutes of cooking.

A sprig of rosemary tucked innocently inside a pork roast will offer a scent you will remember in the kitchen and not just a great new taste.

Many dishes are immediately associated with a specific herb. A lamb roast awakens at the touch of mint or rosemary. Saltimbocca, the specialty of Rome, is subtly scented with sage.

A good steak or roast, rubbed with a split clove of garlic, can do you no wrong. Basil loves noodles (i.e. pesto), and a good bay leaf can do wonders to a stew. Always right, parsley is a must have when making a fresh vinaigrette, even something made up in a Good Seasons cruet, while oregano works wonders when coupled with anything in a tomato base.

Spices

Ditto for spices. The classic French blend quatre spices (four spices) contains five tablespoons of ground cloves and three tablespoons each of ginger, nutmeg and pepper. This blend is used generously in the making of hearty soups, rich sauces, meats, and even fruits.

You say bechamel and I say the white sauce for macaroni and cheese would be absolutely nothing without a fresh grating of nutmeg.

Nutmeg also gives a touch of the unusual to the humble meatloaf or meatball or the classic cheese and spinach pie. The list is endless.

Many of you are like me and are looking to modify your daily intake of salt. That's what food police are warning us to do, but be advised - cheese, prepared sauces such as soy, Worcestershire, mustard and pickles all contain excessive amounts of salt.

50ifty things to do with apples

- Grate apples and low-fat cheese for a filling for an omelette.
- Add diced apples to a spinach salad.
- Mix and puree diced apples, frozen strawberries, frozen concentrated fruit punch and low-fat plain yogurt for a creamy drink.
- Toss cubed turkey, plain yogurt, chopped apples and walnuts together; serve as a salad or in pita bread.
- Add diced apples and raisins to rice cooked in apple cider for delicious rice pilaf.
- Apples make great "dippers." Try dipping slices in spreadable cheese or peanut butter. Thin the peanut butter with applesauce for smoother dipping.
- Saute julienne-style apples and carrots; sprinkle with herbs.
- Mix applesauce with wine and lemon juice; serve over baked chicken breast.
- Add apple slices and apple cider to melted butter and chopped onions; pour mixture over baking fish, such as haddock or cod.
- Stir sherry into applesauce; serve with ham or pork entree as a garnish.
- Mix apple chunks or applesauce into low-fat plain or vanilla yogurt and season with a dash of cinnamon.
- Turn a peanut butter & jelly sandwich into a peanut butter & apple sandwich. Substitute apple slices for jelly on peanut butter sandwiches.
- Mix apple chunks into oatmeal or put on top of pancakes to energize your breakfast.
- Apples and cheese are a great combination for a dessert tray. Gouda, Swiss, Monterey Jack and Cheddar go well with apples.
- Toss apple chunks in a chicken and vegetable stir-fry. Coat with a sauce made from 1/2 cup apple cider, 2 tablespoons teriyaki sauce and 2 teaspoons cornstarch. Cook until sauce is thickened.
- Layer classic Reuben ingredients on caraway rye bread. Add apple slices before placing cheese slices on sandwich.
- Grill chickens with a sauce made from applesauce, lemon juice and tomato sauce. Or pour the sauce over chicken breasts and bake.
- For a quick dessert, microwave whole or pared apples in cider until tender. Sprinkle Grape Nuts cereal on top for added crunch.
- Freeze individual serving containers of apple juice or applesauce and put in a lunch bag to keep other foods cool. It will thaw by lunchtime, yet still be cold.
- Core an apple. Cut it in half and carve out some of the flesh. Fill the cavities of both halves with tuna, ham or chicken salad or peanut butter and raisins. Place the two halves together and you have a portable, totally edible package.
- For each quart of hot mulled apple cider, add 1 cinnamon stick, 1/2 teaspoon whole cloves, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/4 teaspoon allspice and thin orange wedges dotted with cloves. Bring to a boil, then simmer for 10 minutes.
- Add canned apple slices to prepared granola. Serve as a topping for French toast, pancakes, and waffles.
- Fill 4 cored apples with a mixture of 1 cup chopped cranberries, 1/4 cup sugar, 1/4 cup apple cider, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, and 1/2 cup chopped nut meats. Bake, cool slightly, then serve with a spoonful of whipped topping.
- Combine apple juice and instant tea, and add a cinnamon stick.
- Combine chopped, canned apple slices with pancake batter. Serve with warmed maple syrup mixed with applesauce.
- Make apple butter: Combine 5 pounds of peeled and sliced apples, 2 cups apple cider, 2 teaspoons cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon each allspice, cloves and nutmeg. Cook until apples are soft, then add 2 cups brown sugar. Cook slowly for several hours until thickened and smooth.
- Add diced apples to chicken salad made with yogurt. Sprinkle with hulled sunflower seeds.
- Combine cooked sliced apples, vanilla and cinnamon and add to low-fat yogurt.
- Place tuna salad mixture on toasted whole wheat bread. Top with sliced apples, raisins and bean sprouts.
- Use apples in baking a spicy coffee cake.
- Warm up Halloween parties with an "Apple Brandy Sizzler." Mix 2 ounces brandy, 6 ounces of apple cider, 1/2 ounce lime juice, 1 cinnamon stick and 2 cloves. Heat, but do not boil. Remove from heat, and add 1 teaspoon dark rum and a slice of lime.
- Try apple butter on roast beef, ham or roast chick sandwiches. Spread between slices to keep bread from getting soggy.
- Mix freshly chopped fresh apple and chopped walnuts into cranberry sauce.
- Prepare the Thanksgiving turkey with apple-walnut stuffing, and garnish with decoratively sliced apples.
- Decorate a room with baskets of fresh apples and whole nuts. Use a light coating of mayonnaise to give apples a holiday glow.
- Create fancy carved apple garnishes for hors d'oeuvre trays.
- Serve canapes and cheese slices on apple disks, slices or wedges instead of crackers.
- Top apple slices with pate cheese, sour cream or sausage rounds.
- Put round apple slices on one side of the chops-and-dips plate for a healthful alternative to chips.
- Apple candle holders: Select a large, round, squatly apple, core from the stem end, but don't puncture through the blossom end of the apple insert candle. Decorate with side pieces of greenery.
- Mix vanilla yogurt and applesauce together and freeze for a frozen.
- Spread applesauce over hot oatmeal, ice cream or pudding or mix in granola for a sweet crunch.
- Make Jell-O with apple juice instead of water for an extra tasty snack or dessert.
- Mix chopped apples and peanut butter and spread on celery sticks.
- Stir together crunchy peanut butter and applesauce. You can mix raisins or toasted wheat germ. Keep this easy-to-spread mixture in the fridge for quick snacks. Spread it on bread or crackers or use as a healthy and delicious dip.
- Spoon canned, precooked apples over sliced ham. Sprinkle the ham with ground cloves and the apples with ground cinnamon. Broil, and serve as a main dish.
- Combine canned apples with complementary foods, such as prepared carrots or sweet potatoes.
- Fill the cavities of one halved acorn or butternut squash with canned apple slices. Sprinkle with brown sugar and a pinch of cinnamon. Dot with butter, if desired. Cover and bake 10-12 minutes on high in the microwave until tender.
- Toast slices of bakery pound cake, top with heated canned apple slices, then pour on a sauce made of vanilla yogurt thinned slightly with milk.
- Just pick up an apple and bite it!

Michigan's harvest, one of the best

October is National Apple Month, when we celebrate America's favorite fruit.

There are about 7,500 varieties of apples grown worldwide and 2,500 varieties grown in the United States. About 250 varieties are grown in Michigan, but only about 12 major types for retail.

"This has been the greatest year ever for Michigan apples," said Patrick O'Connor, spokesman for the Michigan Apple Commission. "We're looking at a record 28.8 million bushels, an increase over 1993, when we also had a record crop."

"The weather that was detrimental to so many other agricultural products was perfect for producing big, juicy apples. The recent weather - cool nights and warm days - is just what we need to develop flavor and color."

Michigan ranks second nationally in apple production, exporting apples to South America, Europe, and even Saudi Arabia.

Unlike so many other industries, most of our state's 1,400 apple growers are still "Mom and Pop" businesses, with orchards of 50 acres or less.

One of these family-owned orchards is Davies Orchard and Cider Mill, in Salem Township. Co-owner (with husband and in-laws) Judy Davies has been growing Paula Red; McIntosh; Jonathan; Empire; Red and Yellow Delicious; Ida Red; Winesap, and Rome apples from 2,000 trees on a 20-acre farm for just over 20 years. They recently added Gala and Jonagold varieties.

The Davies have a retail store in the barn where they also sell cider and honey, and doughnuts on weekends when business is brisk. They also have a thriving u-pick business.

"We keep the trees sized down so people can pick their apples without ladders," said Davies. The Davies' customers receive a fact sheet that includes several methods for putting apples by.

"The important thing is that there's a steady temperature, between 32 and 40 degrees,"

said Davies. "A temperature fluctuation is bad for apples. One of the best ways to store them is to put them in a plastic bag and keep them in an extra fridge in the garage or the basement."

"Some people wrap apples individually in newspaper and store in the attic in a Styrofoam container. An attic is better than a garage because it gets a little heat leak from the rest of the house. A detached garage is a little too cold, depending on the severity of the winter, of course, but in an attached garage you can store them against the inside wall, as I do. I had an aunt who used to put them in plastic bags and store them in the attic under a pile of blankets."

Davies has been in the apple business for 23 years, and she still loves apples. "There are so many varieties, and each has a different flavor, how could I get tired of them?"

"I have hundreds of apple recipes on file, but my favorite is still good old American apple pie."

Apples are a good source of vitamins A and C, and minerals. A medium apple provides 4 grams of dietary fiber. The soluble fiber in apples, called pectin, is similar to that in oat bran and can be a factor in cholesterol reduction. An average apple has just 80 calories, contains 170 mg. of potassium, is high in complex carbohydrates, and has no sodium or cholesterol.

A recent Michigan State University study revealed that apple eaters had fewer respiratory infections and tension-related complaints. Additionally, a USDA study found that the mineral boron in apples makes bones stronger and may help prevent osteoporosis.

It's true what they say, an apple a day keeps the doctor away.

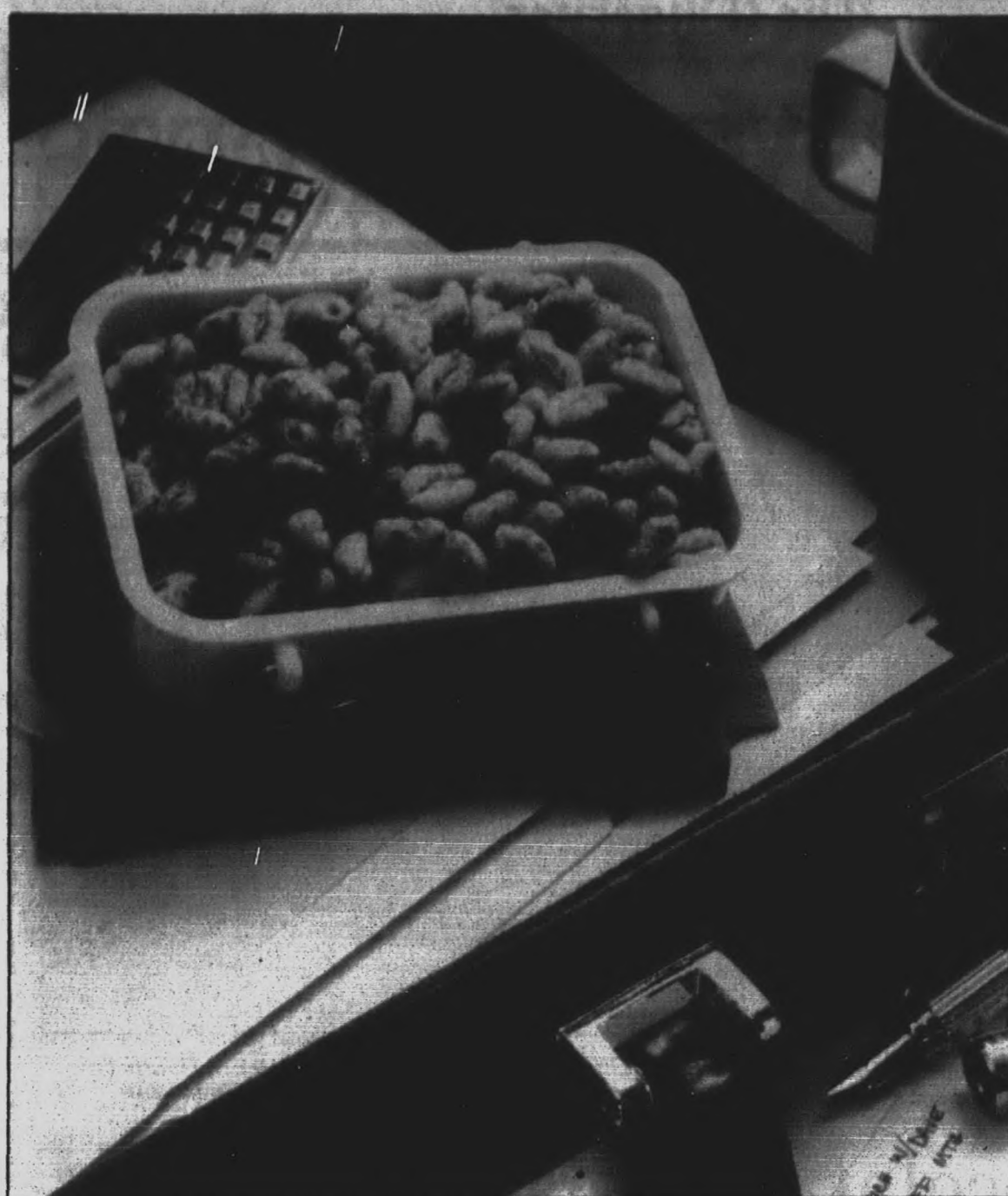

4 medium stemmed turnips (about 1 ¼ pounds), washed, peeled and sliced into ¼-inch thin rounds
1 medium red onion (about 5 ounces), peeled and sliced into paper-thin rounds
7 large, well-ripened plum tomatoes (about 1 ½ pounds), washed, ends trimmed, and sliced into ¼-inch rounds
2 teaspoons extra-virgin olive oil
½ teaspoon coarse salt
½ teaspoon freshly milled black pepper
1 tablespoon minced fresh oregano or 1 teaspoon dried oregano

Adjust oven rack to center of oven; preheat to 350 degrees F.

Lightly grease a 9- by 13- by 2-inch ovenproof baking dish with olive oil cooking spray.

Arrange half of the turnips in an overlapping pattern in prepared baking dish. Scatter half the onion slices over the top. Arrange half of the plum tomatoes in a single layer over onions. Brush surface of tomatoes with half of the olive oil.

Sprinkle half of the salt, pepper and oregano over top. Arrange second layer the same as first with remaining ingredients. Cover with foil and bake in preheated oven 350-degree F oven until turnips are tender when tested with the tip of a knife, about 55 to 60 minutes. Remove from oven and discard foil.

Adjust oven rack to 4 inches from heat source and preheat to broil setting.

Return turnips to oven and broil until a light crust forms on surface of tomatoes, about 3 to 4 minutes. Serve hot or at room temperature. Makes 6 servings.

The displays at the Disney Store enticed Maggie with Snow White's dress and Belle's ballgown. There was Jasmine's fancy finery and Cinderella's renowned homemade creation. But none compared, in Maggie's eyes, to Cinderella's actual wedding dress, complete with slippers, veil and headband.

If Pocahontas is more your style, her cute ragged-edged costume comes with moccasins. Tinkerbell's carries a magic wand. Maybe you would rather be a furry Simba or the creepy Gollath the Gargoyle with wings. John Smith and his sword and shield are here, as are Captain Hook, Peter Pan and Winnie the Pooh. It's Disney character heaven, priced from \$28-\$42.

For older, if not wiser, Halloween celebrants, check out Van Bean's at 2823 North Woodward in Royal Oak. This venerable costume shop, serving customers since 1947,



went out of business last April but reopened for Halloween and will remain open until Jan. 1. All of the costumes are for sale at the rental prices — some real masquerade bargains.

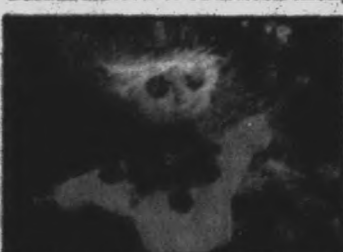
Hot items this year are vintage Colonial-style tapestry and velvet waistcoats inspired by Interview With A Vampire. Also look for Confederate uniforms; Southern belle hoop skirts; wild '60s flower child halters, vests and bell bottoms; and jaunty sailor suits. Boxes of accessories will spark your imagination. Dig through piles of hats, veils, shawls and Cleopatra collars.

Costume sales are expected to top \$400 million this year, according to University of Detroit Mercy marketing professor Michael Bernacchi, J.D. In his newscast, The Mike-escape, Bernacchi shares his haunting research.

It's scary to think that more than \$784 million was spent on Halloween candy alone last year, an average of \$3 per American. All Hallows' Eve is ranked as the third biggest party day of the year and has emerged as the start of the holiday season for retailers.

Speaking of treats, Jacobson's has a corner on goodies. I found candy corn in decorative tins (\$5.95) and Bright Fright votives (\$8.95). Tall bewitching cans hold mini chocolate chip cookies (\$9.95). Pumpkins are filled with jellybeans and chocolate jack-o-lanterns (\$4.95). There's even witch's brew (\$3.95), spider cookie dough mix (\$9.95) and table accessories to ensure a perfect party.

If you're really into weird stuff, call 800-231-6000 for a Brainstorms catalog, the best of the bizarre. Besides the biggest selection of spooky skeletons, you'll find mechanical fleshy hands, gelatin-shaped body parts and a Face Mask Magician with instructions on how to make hundreds of wacky faces. There's a professional-style Ninja suits, groovy glasses with flashing lights, even a Doggie Bones costume for Fido. It's an amazing accumulation of oddities. Finally, to ward away the goblins, the folks at Four Seasons Garden Center in Oak Park recommend a Pumpkin Head Scarecrow. With cornucopia nose and cucumber



eyes, he's sure to frighten evil spirits while he charms fairy princesses and all other good little trick-or-treaters.

Now, sink your teeth into delicate dark chocolate blended with fragrant raspberries in bittersweet chocolate.

Finally, finish m-m-m-ing and pick up another piece.

The recipes and designs belong to Jerbeau Chocolates of Camarillo, Ca. whose president, chocolatier Katalin Coburn, 40, said she continually challenges the limits of presenting high quality chocolates to appreciative customers. She came to town recently as a guest of Hudson's 10-day festival, "For the Love of Chocolate," in the Marketplace departments.

"Chocolates are an affordable luxury," Coburn explained, after meeting with customers at the Oakland Mall in Troy. "That's why sales of gourmet chocolate skyrocket during recessionary times. People rationalize, 'I can't buy this \$200 coat, but I can buy this \$2 bar of chocolate.' It's instant gratification."

An instant hostess gift. That's one of the reasons Hudson's has reopened its candy departments, positioning them in high traffic areas usually on the main floors, according to Fiore Tierno, group manager for Hudson's

Marketplace Foods.

"Gourmet chocolates are a very giftable item along with wines and champagnes," he said. "Based on our customer's requests, we're bringing both back to our Marketplaces in a big way this fall. People out shopping, short on time, want to grab a gift for their family or the hostess of a dinner party they may be attending. Pretty, delicious chocolates are perfect."

Coburn agreed that the chocolate business is good. Though her product is available through gift shops and fine department stores, she is looking for a southern California site for a Jerbeau Chocolate Boutique. In the

Selling spooky is big business

■ The popularity of Halloween continues to grow, delighting specialty retailers selling animated grim reapers, screeching witches and flickering candelabra.

Clap your hands and a huge black spider scurries up a rope. Welcome to Halloween USA where things really do go bump in the night!

Our beloved goblin-filled holiday has become big business. Halloween is not just costumes and carved pumpkins anymore, but motion activated screaming black cats and electronic witches stirring bubbling brews for people who want to create their own scary scenes.

In 1977 when Chris Bearss opened his first Gags & Gifts store (of which Halloween USA is an entity), sales of holiday-related merchandise consisted of a boxed costume with a plastic mask. Today, the Farmington Hills resident under his parent company Gags & Games, employs 80 to 100 people to sell everything you'll ever need to celebrate Halloween, from animated spiders to a nine foot dragon manufactured in Gag Studios in Livonia.

"Halloween's a fun holiday. It allows people to express themselves. Every person out there is a kid at heart," said Bearss, co-owner with John McIntire of a dozen Gags & Gifts in Livonia, Westland, Rochester, West Bloomfield, and Canton Township.

"We aspire to be to Halloween what Bronner's is for Christmas."

According to assistant store manager Theresa Fischer, people can't seem to get enough of the electrified skull candelabra with flickering lights, animated spiders that crawl along the floor, and the squirming rat caught in a trap.

"People are really into the lights and effects, anything that moves or

past three years, sales have increased by 40-percent.

"I began managing my parents' retail chocolate manufacturing business in 1977," she said. "By 1982, I decided to separate the wholesale operations to produce a superior line of American chocolates made with American ingredients, no added preservatives, waxes or fillers. I wanted a clean product."

"From time to time, we had to lower our profit margins, but I'm proud to say, we never lowered our product standards."

Born in Budapest, Hungary,

Coburn emigrated to the U.S. with her family at age 13. She graduated from University of Southern California where she studied medicine. Her father's illness brought her into the business.

Coburn and her husband are raising three children in Agoura, Ca. With homefront help from her mother, too, she's able to cross the country a few times each month, representing Jerbeau Chocolates.

"The name Jerbeau came from combining my family name, Jambo, and the name of the Hungarian chef whose recipes launched the firm, Gerbeaud," she explained. "Our staff numbers between 60 and 110, depending on

the time of year. We make three kinds of chocolates — American-style (honeycombs, strawberry cremes, toffees and peanut butters), European-style (hazelnuts, nugats, fruits and marzipans), and Truffles.

"My children got their first 'taste' of the business this summer when I paid them \$2 an hour to fold boxes. They did very well. By the end of the summer, they earned a raise!"

Coburn described herself as "driven" and "focused." She said she thinks and worries endlessly about the business.

"To relax, I run four times a week, or my husband and I go rock climbing. You can't think of anything else while climbing, it

requires all your attention. This helps me."

Coburn works with three charities that are close to her heart: Pediatric AIDS, Special Olympics, and Planned Parenthood. Customers will soon see a new Jerbeau product on the shelves, a high-energy "health" bar inspired by the need for sustenance while rock climbing and the long, away-from-home, hours required of families today.

"Watch for my power bar," she said. "Fuel food. Complex carbohydrates. And it'll taste good, too. I promise."

Versatile rice will help stretch food dollars

AP — Rice's versatility and nutritional benefits can fit into anyone's diet, but it can also stretch the food budget.

Because of its mild flavor and ability to absorb other flavors, rice can be incorporated into almost any recipe for soups, salads, main dishes and desserts.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recommends the largest portion of a diet should come from the rice, bread, cereal and pasta group. Recommended daily intake is six to 11 servings; with a serving defined as half a cup of rice.

The nutritional benefits of rice are many.

"Rice is high in complex carbohydrates, and when combined with beans or lentils, it is considered a complete protein," said Melissa Mixon, extension human nutrition specialist at Mississippi State University.

If nothing is added during preparation or serving, rice is low in fat, sodium and has no cholesterol. A single serving has only 103 calories for regular mill white rice and 106 calories for brown rice.

While brown rice provides slightly more fiber, vitamin E, phosphorus and calcium than white rice, most of the rice sold in the United States is enriched. Enriched rice is high in iron, thiamin and niacin.

By adding rice to a dish, you can increase the number of servings in a meal.

"Rice is an extender of the food dollar. It can be used in most dishes and adds to the number of portions," said Mixon. "It is low in cost and in the uncooked form can be stored in an airtight container on a shelf or in a pantry for long periods of time."

Once rice has been cooked, Mixon said to treat it with the principles of food safety in mind.

"If cooked rice is left at room temperature for more than two hours then it should be thrown away, especially if the dish contains any kind of meat," said Mixon. "Remember to always refrigerate immediately after serving."

Here are some nutritious recipes using rice:

EASY PORK FRIED RICE

1 1/2 tablespoons vegetable oil, divided

2 eggs, beaten
1 cup diced fully cooked ham
1 cup finely chopped fresh mushrooms
1/2-cup thinly sliced green onions
3 cups cooked brown rice, chilled
1 tablespoon reduced-sodium soy sauce

Heat 1/4-tablespoon oil over medium heat in large skillet or wok. Add eggs and cook without stirring until set. Invert skillet over baking sheet to removed cooked eggs; cut in 1/4-inch strips.

In a skillet, heat remaining 1/4-tablespoon oil over medium-high heat. Stir-fry ham, mushrooms, and onions in oil about 3 minutes, or until mushrooms and onions are tender. Stir in cooked rice and reserved egg strips; sprinkle with soy sauce. Toss lightly; heat thoroughly. Makes 4 servings.

TURKEY AU GRATIN

1 Package (4.5 to 5.2 oz.) broccoli rice au gratin rice mix
1 cup cubed smoked turkey
1 jar (2 oz.) pimento
12 buttery crackers, crushed

Prepare rice mix in 2-quart saucepan according to package directions. Add turkey and pimento; heat thoroughly. Transfer to serving dish; top with cracker crumbs. Makes 4 servings.

Add spice to sweet potato pie

AP — The following recipe for sweet potato pie uses vanilla and cinnamon instead of the more commonly used flavorings of pumpkin pie spice, nutmeg and cloves.

Try adding chopped toasted almonds or macadamia nuts to the crust, then garnish with whipped cream, topped with additional nuts.

SWEET POTATO PIE

1 1/4 cups cooked mashed sweet potatoes

1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
1/2 cup packed French vanilla instant pudding mix
1/4 cup evaporated milk
2 large eggs, at room temperature

6 tablespoons butter or margarine, softened
1 1/2 tablespoons vanilla extract
1 teaspoon cinnamon
9-inch unbaked pastry shell

In a large bowl of electric mixer, combine first nine ingredients. Beat at medium speed until well blended. Spread evenly into unbaked pastry shell.

Bake in a 450-degree F oven for 10 minutes. Reduce temperature to 350 degrees F; bake 40 minutes longer or until set. Cool on wire rack. If desired, garnish with whipped cream, raspberries and mint leaves. Makes 8 servings.

Before transferring, the Canton product played scored 15 points, grabbed 22 rebounds and had four assists while seeing limited action in 19 games for the Division I Broncos.

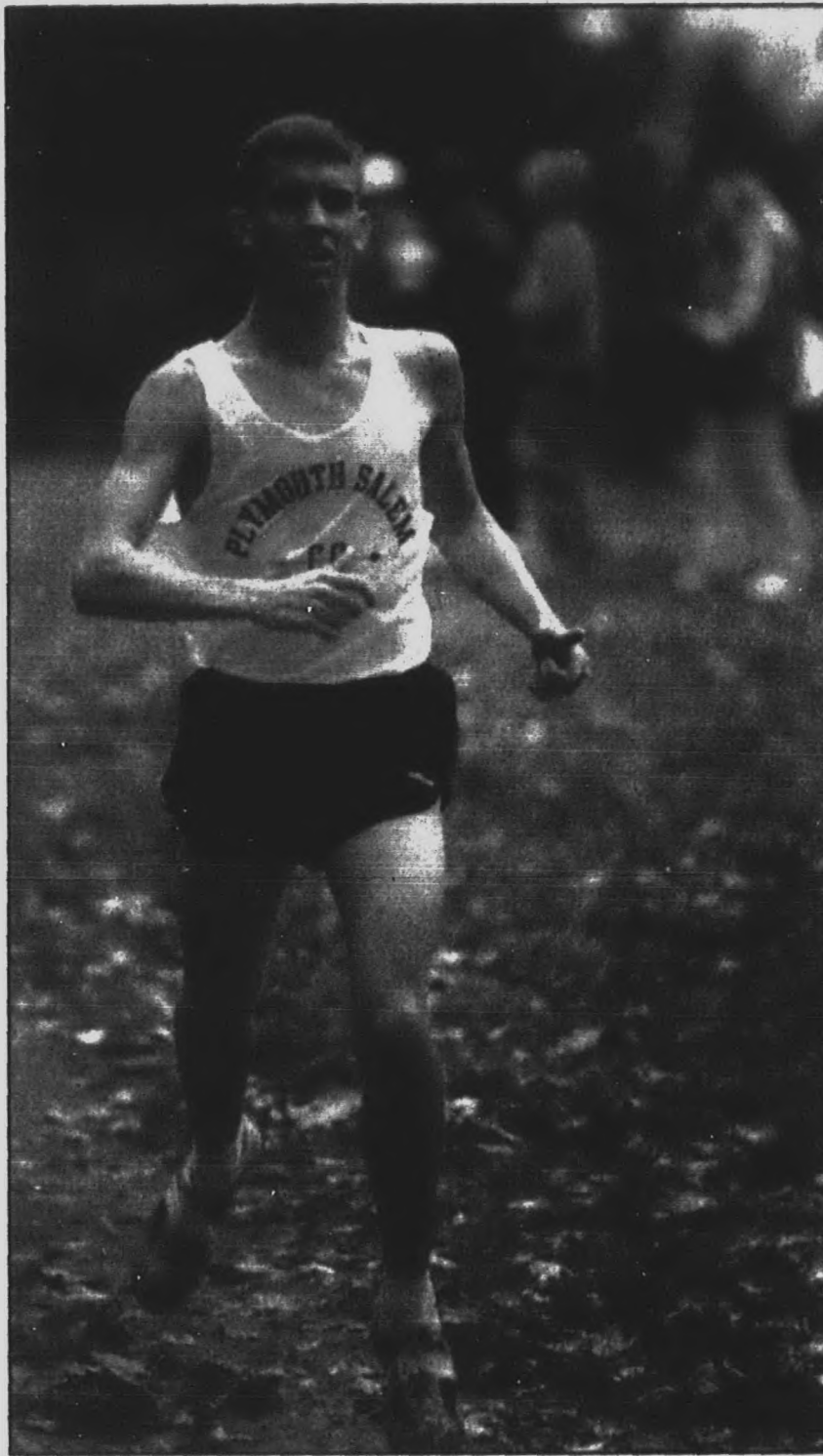
Welchans sharing

Bieniecki wins race; Salem 2nd

After 16 years of coaching boys cross country and three runner-up finishes, Walled Lake Central's David Darnton has a league championship team.

The Vikings put four runners in the top 11 and held on to edge Plymouth Salem for the Western Lakes Activities Association title Friday at Cass Benton Park.

Central had 70 points and Salem, with the individual winner Jared Bieniecki, 72.

Defending WLAA and Western Division champ Plymouth Canton was third (97), North Farmington fourth (114) and Livonia Stevenson, behind fifth-place finisher Rob Block's school-record time of 16:54, took fifth (134).

"It's much more satisfying than it might have been," Darnton said, regarding the first-place finish, "because we have a special group of seniors and winning it with them makes it more special. They get credit for turning the program around."

The Vikings, who were bridesmaids last year as well as 1985-86, were led by senior Rob Donovan's second-place finish in 16:39.

Central was looking strong when Rich Jahnke placed eighth (17:05), senior Jim Jahnke ninth (17:17) and sophomore Steve Adams 11th (17:23).

The duel with Salem was closer than Darnton would have liked, but junior Eugene Vyorkin clinched the win in 40th place (18:19).

"It's been an interesting season, because some meets our fifth runner has won it for us," Darnton said. "This time it was really our first-place runner, Rob finishing second instead of fourth or fifth made the difference, and he beat some very good runners today."

"Rob and Steve Adams ran their best races this year and, with a two-point difference, it would not have taken much for us to slip into second place. That's why it's a team sport."

The contest between Central and Salem was so close there was no

predicting the outcome until the very end of the race.

"I knew our fifth-place runner was around 40th, and I knew where the Salem runners were," Darnton said. "You could tell it was close. If we had been 30th the whole time, I would have been pretty confident."

The Vikings will try to qualify for state next weekend in regional action at Davisburg against Holly, Brighton and Lakeland — the Nos. 2-3-4 teams in the Class A rankings.

"There is a way for a fourth team to get out of the regional, if four runners qualify as individuals — and most likely we'll get three," Darnton said. "If we can get a fourth runner to run his absolute best, we can make it."

Salem had two of the top three runners — Bieniecki ran 16:28 and senior Scott Pengelly was third (16:45) — and five within the top 28. But the numbers just didn't add up right for the Rocks.

Freshman Nick Allen was 16th, freshman John Little 24th and sophomore Japbir Gill 28th.

"We knew we had to have help from our other five runners, because Central's pack is that tough," Salem coach Geoff Baker said. "A couple of places either way, and it's a different story."

"I figured (Bieniecki and Pengelly) would run one-two, but Scott hurt his ankle Monday. The rest PRed. You can't get down on them about that. That's all you can ask."

"It's always a disappointment. We came here to win, not be second. But we did the best we could today."

Senior Ian Bedford paced the Chiefs with a fourth-place finish. Evan Crocket was 18th, Shaun Moore 23rd, Jason Vergari 25th and Sanjay Sharma 27th.

"I was very happy with the way our guys performed," Canton coach Mike Spitz said, adding the goal was to finish third. "It would have taken a supernatural event for anything other than that to occur. We ran to our potential."

Loss tumbles Chiefs from playoff berth

The playoffs started Friday for the Walled Lake Central football team. They ended for Plymouth Canton.

Hosting Canton in a Western Lakes Activities Association crossover game with playoff implications for both teams, Central combined a stellar defensive effort with a late fourth-quarter touchdown to post an exciting 10-3 victory.

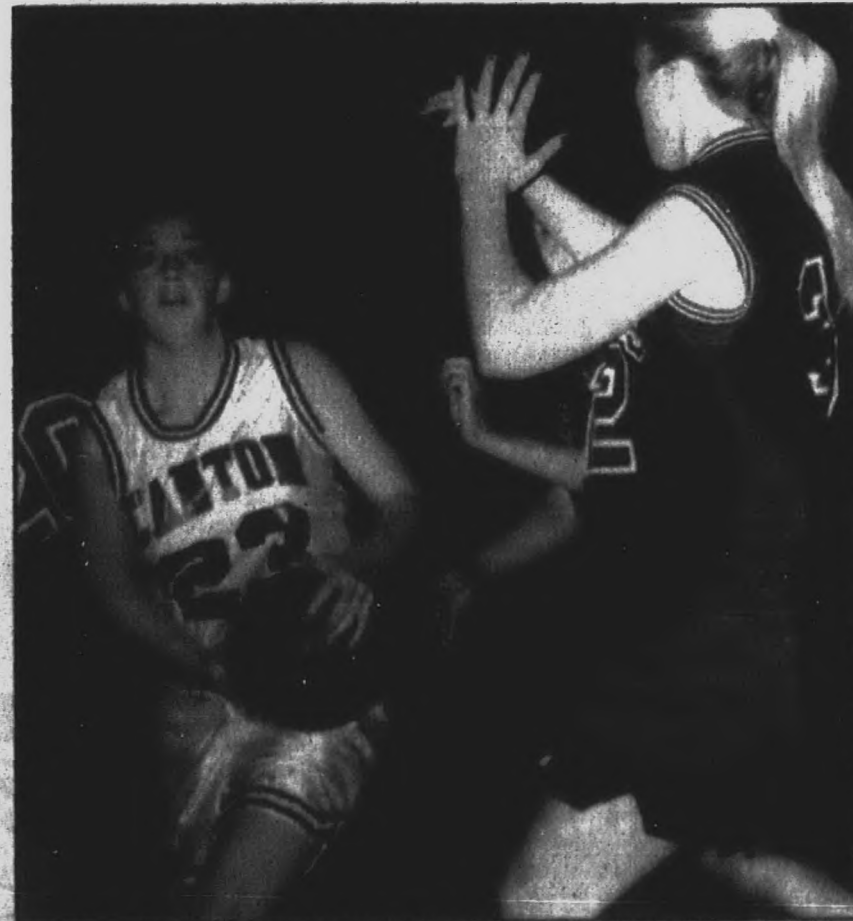

Stevenson girls retain league title as expected

Livonia Stevenson captured the first jewel in the triple crown for girls cross country by repeating as Western Lakes Activities Association champions Friday at Cass Benton Park.

The Spartans, undefeated in dual meets, winners of all six invitational titles this year and now WLAA champs, move on to the Class A regional this Saturday at Ann Arbor's Buhr Park.

Stevenson, expected to challenge Troy Athens for the state title, took five of the first seven places to win the Western Lakes championship for the third time in the 1990s.

Stevenson scored 21 points with state-ranked Farmington second with 57 and Plymouth Salem third with 96. See statistical summary.

The sophomore tandem of Kelly Travis and Kelly McNeillance took first and second, respectively, with times of 19:26 and 19:54 over the rain-soaked 5,000-meter course.

North Farmington's Becky Naglik (20:01) and Salem's Leah Retherford (20:02) were wedged in between Stevenson's Jeannette Stojcevski (20:04), who ran the all-time sixth best Spartan time; freshman Kim McNeillance (20:18) and Laura Pilon (20:19).

"This is the best group I've ever had, and I've had some awfully good kids and teams," Stevenson coach Paul Holmberg said. "But we still have to prove ourselves going into the regional."

"We don't have to change our routine a great deal. We'll still do our basic work, only shorter and faster reps."

Despite a cough, Travis repeated as individual champion as

temperatures plummeted and the winds kicked up late Friday afternoon.

"It was really slippery and you had to watch your step on the wide turns," Travis said. "All during warmups it was pretty rough, but we're pretty used to it. We ran a meet against Salem that was worse than this, but it got a little cold at the end."

Farmington, which also impressed by placing five girls in the top 16 and six in the top 20, tried to force the pace at the beginning.

McNeillance, who ran her best time of the year on the Cass Benton course, hung behind eighth-place finisher Ann Grimaldi of Farmington (20:25) during the first mile before making her move.

"I was looking to pass their number one girl," McNeillance said. "After the first mile I was third. I knew they would try to go out fast. We could guess so."

Farmington, which lost its first dual meet of the year to Stevenson on Tuesday at Oakland Community College, 21-37, put forth a fine showing.

Behind Grimaldi for the Falcons was Kate Adams, ninth; Ellen Adams, 11th; Theresa Derwinski, 14th; Amie Cameron, 15th; and Natalie Dawson, 20th. (Stevenson's sixth runner, Jessica Cyburt, was 19th.)

"I'm pleased," Farmington coach Liz Zynda said. "We felt all six could medal. Ann (Grimaldi) has grown so much as a runner and the medals for the day go to Ellen Adams and Amie Cameron."

"Our goal was to get as close to Stevenson as we could. We scored 57 points and I'm proud of it. Stevenson is a good team. They wouldn't be tied for first (in the state rankings) if they weren't."

Farmington will also vie at the Buhr Park regional this Saturday.

"Farmington is a good cross country team and one of the better teams we've seen in the state," Holmberg said.

The Stevenson coach believes everything is in order for a run for the state crown.

"Our long distance work is basically done," he said. "We've established a fantastic base since June 19. I'm excited. We've had 10 good weeks of competition."

"Half of these girls are ninth and 10th-graders and I have to keep reminding them to stay serious."

"But when the gun goes off, they're very competitive."

That's the first jewel for the Spartans, and now second jewel awaits.

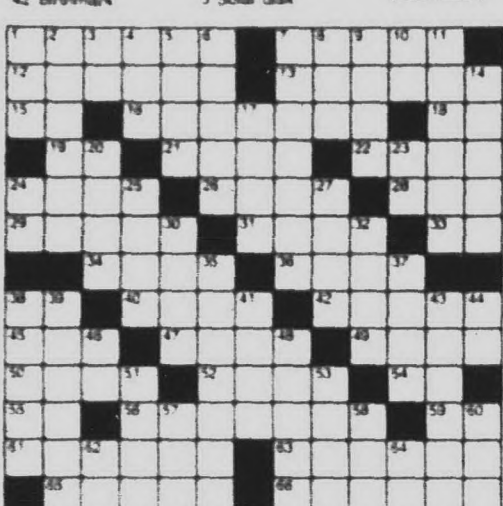

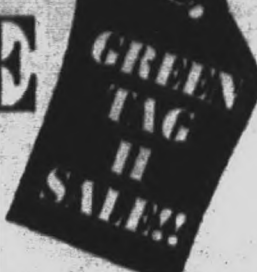

Suzuki Samurai:

Fun on the cheap

Unique, bare bones, four-wheel-drive and fun to drive.

And it has an option some one like me would be stupid not to have. A rugged, powerful, 1,500-pound capacity, front-bumper-mounted winch with a 25-foot cable.

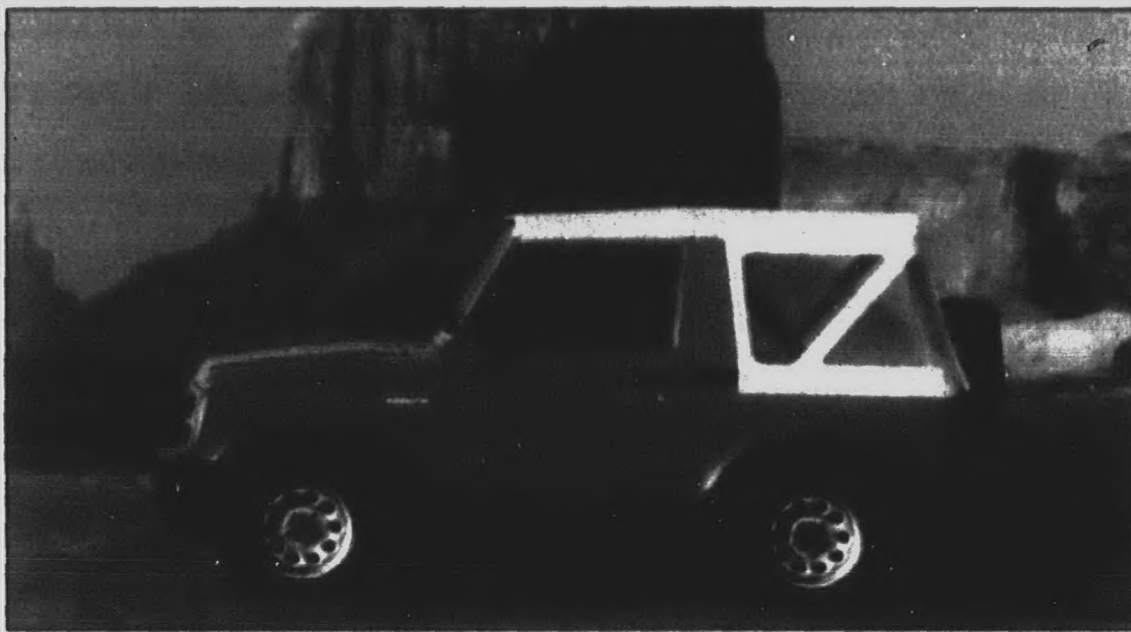
Surely the winch could get me out of any stuck-in-the-mud off-roading adventure while I'm dressed in my Sunday best, right?

The new Suzuki Samurai never provides a dull moment in everyday driving experiences. Nearing a decade on U.S. soil, the Samurai isn't cheap on performance, yet is cheap with its \$10,000-range sticker price. Find a better price for a sport utility 4X4 and you should buy it.

The Samurai has a 1.3 liter, electronically fuel-injected, four-cylinder inline, four-stroke cycle, water-cooled, overhead cam engine that promises a top 66 horsepower at 6000 rpm.

A bit of a problem with acceleration in rush-hour highway situations, but tooling around the city, the Samurai takes care of itself.

It isn't usually the first vehicle away from the light, but keep in mind that it gets 28 mpg in the city, 29 mpg on the

material that its new leaf-spring suspension on the Samurai provides "a comfortable, yet sturdy ride." Comfortable? No. Sturdy? Well, if you enjoy feeling every pebble in the roadway, this baby's for you.

But isn't that what a sport utility is all about? The ride's rough. But rough is what you expect from an SUV, right?

Instrumentation is easy to read and simple to understand. All controls, from heating/cooling to stereo radio, are easy to reach and within grasp of the steering wheel.

Standard equipment includes the deluxe canvas top, Halogen headlamps, dual sport mirrors, tripmeter, two-speed intermittent windshield wipers and four-wheel-drive indicator lamp.

The Samurai tested had a removable canvas top. I tried to remove it. It proved to be more trouble than it was worth. On the freeway, the top

flapped wildly in the wind — even all sealed up — and I could barely hear the stereo — even at full zip.

The best part of the Samurai is outfitting it for your personal needs. Here are a few of the accessories available: Chrome wheels, front bra/mask, chrome front guards, automatic free wheel hubs, off road lamps, tailgate security box, fog lamps, surf/sailboard carrier, ski carrier, luggage rack, hatchback removable hardtop, bikini top and boot, tonneau cover, altimeter/inclinometer, a host of stereo systems and plush mats.

All in all, if you're looking for a great value in a small sport utility vehicle, the Samurai is the one for you.

But if you can afford a higher-priced 4X4, you'd be disappointed if you opted for this one.
