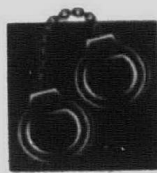

Prison death a chilling reminder

The murder of a state corrections officer last week reminded prison staff of the potential danger of their jobs at Plymouth's Western Wayne Correctional Facility.

"Anytime something happens with-

in the Michigan Department of Corrections or out of state there's a camaraderie, it affects you," said Pat Rodger, administrative assistant to warden Kenny Robinson.

"Because you're working in a prison, it could be you anytime, but you

can't be fearful about that," Rodger said.

Still, she said, the death of a female prison storekeeper Feb. 5 at Huron Valley Men's Facility raised concerns among prison staff here. "It will be a little while before it goes away," she said.

Robinson passed a memo to all Western Wayne staff the day after the murder.

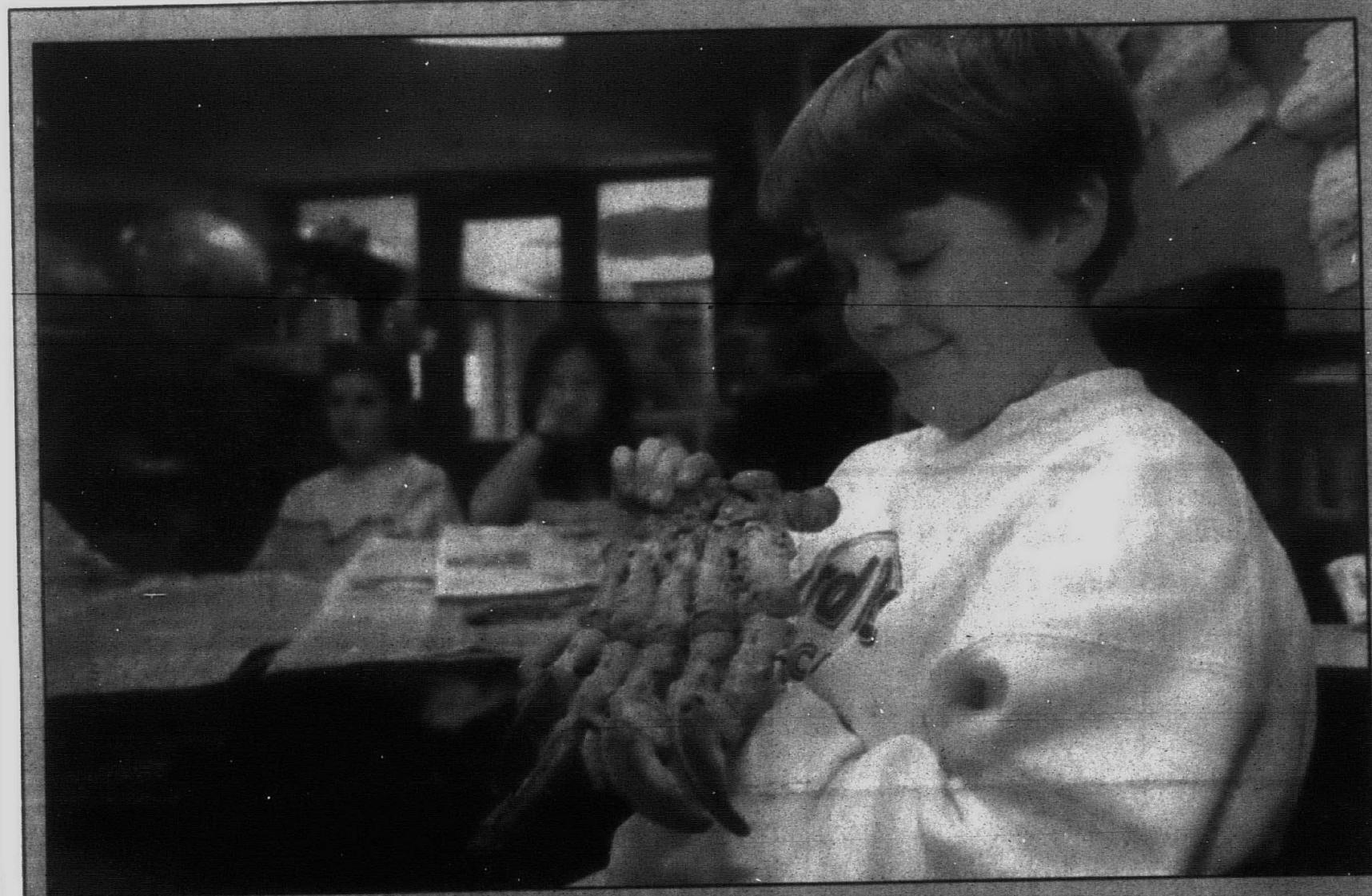
"Many questions still remain — the whys, the whos and the how comes. These may never be answered. "But let us take this time to re-

member the business that we are in, and that the hazards are always there," he wrote. "This is a wake-up call to bring to light the nature and seriousness of this business, and that we must always be alert to physical, verbal and non-verbal signs.

"We have been very lucky here at WCF to never have had something like this occur," Robinson continued. "And I hope and pray that this should never befall any of you."

In Rodger's 15 years working for

Miller students take cut at learning

Fifth-graders at Miller Elementary were visited Friday by a young woman who has made a career of her love for science.

A research pathologist at the University of Michigan, Pam Lincoln of Canton Township often visits Plymouth-Canton schools, bringing with her such things as model volcanoes that really erupt, pig hearts for students to study and dissect, and most recently, artifacts and speci-

mens from laboratories and the Museum of Natural History at the University of Michigan.

"Pam is very enthusiastic. She loves her job, and she's a wonderful role model for children," said Terri Michaelis, who teaches fifth-graders in the Talented and Gifted program at Miller.

Lincoln's lesson tied in with a unit on the human body.

"We've done the skeletal system, and were looking to do an enrichment activity. Pam was my commu-

nity resource," said Michaelis.

Students examined a rabbit skeleton; bear vertebrae and claws; and a cow scapula. They also observed a human tibia that had been broken, and that hadn't mended properly.

"The last part of the lesson was to look at a small section of rat spinal cord. With their hands, they touched their own spinal cords and could feel the same section they could see in the section of rat vertebrae," said Michaelis. "The children were fascinated."

Students finished the lesson by cutting into the rat spinal cords.

While dissection is an optional activity for students in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, 65 of 71 students chose to attend Lincoln's session.

"Because of the wide range of students' backgrounds, we really could not say that we would require a dissection in any grade level," said Kathy Harenda, math and science cur-

Teen charged in bomb threat faces hearing

Canton's David Scott Sowers, 18, charged with making bomb threats at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park, is free on bond pending a competency hearing and criminal evaluation at a Detroit Recorder's Court clinic.

The evaluation was ordered by 35th District Court Judge John MacDonald at Sowers' arraignment Feb.

5. MacDonald set a bond of \$5,000 or 10 percent. A \$500 bond was posted Feb. 6, and Sowers was released from the Dickerson Facility, a jail in Hamtramck.

"Right now, they're looking at the end of March for the competency hearing," said Marion Belding, 35th District Court administrator. "The judge will review their evaluation, and that is scheduled hopefully to be

done by April 11."

The purpose of the evaluation is to "assess emotional stability and their state of mind then and now; and whether they understand what they did," said Belding.

The court entered a not guilty plea for Sowers.

Nearly 5,000 students and teachers were evacuated from PCEP at 9 a.m. Jan. 26 after at least 15 threatening

calls were received by the switchboard at Plymouth Salem High School.

Malicious use of the telephone is a high misdemeanor punishable by up to six months in prison, a \$500 fine, or both.

A second suspect, an unemployed

Students with a 3.35 GPA will not be in competition with students with 4.0 GPA's. All students invited to attend will be honored and receive a Scholarship or Merit Award. Last year awards totaled \$15,000.

The awards dinner will be held Tuesday evening, May 14, at the Plymouth Manor, a co-sponsor with the Plymouth Observer and Canton Observer newspapers.

Candidate sees need for change

U.S. Senate candidate and talk-radio host Renna Romney told a group in Plymouth Friday that Republicans in Washington, D.C., need fresh blood to keep the movement going.

"Everywhere I go in this state and when I do talk radio, there is this enormous sense out there that we have started something," she said.

Romney's remarks came before the Plymouth Rotary Club at the Mayflower Meeting House.

On campaign issues, Romney opened with the need for a balanced budget amendment. She said the real road block to an agreement on the balanced budget is entitlements, including welfare.

When people were in trouble in the past, they came to their neighbors for help, Romney said. "It's no longer charity, it's a tax and some people call it legalized theft."

"They say 'I'm entitled to it.' It's gone from charity to entitlements," she continued.

"When we pay our bills it does what it does long-term to a family, it offers breathing room to plan the future," Romney said.

She also said she supported a budget line item veto and "a fair tax system."

"We have created a welfare system for all kinds of corporations," Romney said. Flat-tax proponent Steve Forbes "is on the right track but he's not there," Romney said.

"Let me tell you why I'm running. I want to bring to Washington common sense," she said.

As a talk radio host on WJR-AM, Romney said, "What I heard from my audience is this country

galloped along pretty well until 30 or 40 years ago."

People, she said, want a return to "the values of the founding fathers, the work ethic, the value of believing a person is responsible for their own actions."

"Talk radio has really done a great deal for the country," she said. "It is the town meeting we haven't had for many years in America."

Romney said the Republican freshman class elected to the U.S. Congress in 1994 tried to do the right thing, but it's been thwarted by the president and the Senate.

"I don't have all the answers," Romney said, adding she'd seek them "by bringing good people in the room" and talking about the nation's problems.

Among audience members reacting to Romney's address, Ed Schultz said the portions that appealed to him were her call to return to common sense and basic values. He said he'd vote for Romney.

John Morano said, "The balanced budget is definitely something we have to deal with," adding it was too soon to tell if he'd vote for Romney.

Feb. 27 vote likely on golf contract

Plymouth Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen McCarthy said she hoped to wrap up negotiations on a new Hilltop Golf Course contract and present it to township trustees at a board work session next Tuesday.

But negotiations with American Golf Corp. weren't finished in time for the meeting, so township trustees will likely vote on the matter at their Tuesday, Feb. 27, meeting.

So far, both sides have tentatively agreed to a five-year contract with a five-year option. The township would get a minimum of \$250,000 in golf course proceeds this year and \$325,000 in the fifth year of the contract, the year 2000.

Proposed 1997 paving projects are work on Ann Arbor Trail from Deer to Hamilton, Farmer from Blunk to North Mill, Blanch from Sheldon to Adams and Harvey from Penniman to William. Cost of these projects is estimated at \$630,000.

Doctor earns kudos

Ross D. Zafonte, D.O., medical director of the Traumatic Brain Injury Unit at the Rehabilitation Institute of Michigan, has been selected by his peers to be included in the first edition of "The Best Doctors in America: Midwest Region."

The regional guide and its companion volume, "The Best Doctors in America," is regarded as the pre-eminent referral guide to the medical profession.

The guide is based on an exhaustive survey in which more than 5,000 doctors in the Midwest are asked to rate the clinical abilities of their peers. Only those earning the consensus support of their colleagues are listed.

Also selected was Bruce Becker, M.D., vice president of Medical Affairs at the Rehabilitation Institute.

Zafonte joined the physiatry staff at the institute and the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Wayne State University School of Medicine in January 1992.

In 1993, he was appointed to his current position as medical director of the traumatic brain injury unit. Zafonte also is chief of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Detroit Receiving Hospital, and co-director of the Neurotrauma Clinic at University Health Center.

He also serves as an assistant professor of physical medicine and rehabilitation at the Wayne State University School of Medicine.

Zafonte has lectured and written extensively on the topic of neurotrauma rehabilitation. In 1994, he received the "Young Investigator Award" from the National Head Injury Foundation.

A graduate of NOVA/Southeastern University of Health Sciences, Southeastern College of Osteopathic Medicine in Florida, Zafonte completed his internship at Detroit Osteopathic Hospital and his residency at Mount Sinai School of Medicine in New York, N.Y.

Zafonte loves sports and is a former minor league baseball player. He and his wife, Cheryl, live in Plymouth.

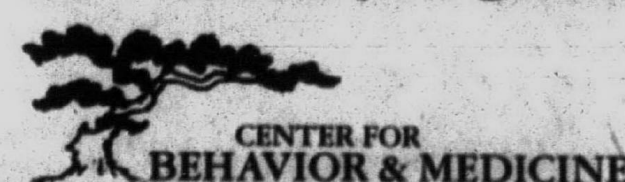

Singers plan Big Apple trip

Some Plymouth and Canton singers will make their Carnegie Hall debut this fall.

Members of the Plymouth Oratorio Society have been invited to join conductor Leonard Riccinto and other area choir members Nov. 24 to perform in New York City.

The group will perform Vivaldi's "Gloria" in honor of the season. "It is a great honor and opportunity for many Plymouth area residents and students of Eastern Michigan University and alumni to have this opportunity to perform in Carnegie Hall," said John Stewart, a former Plymouth Township trustee and longtime oratorio society member.

The Carnegie Hall performance is happening because Riccinto was selected to represent the Mid-America Choral Conductors Association by conducting a performance at Carnegie Hall.

Members of several choir groups he heads will join the program, including the EMU Uni-

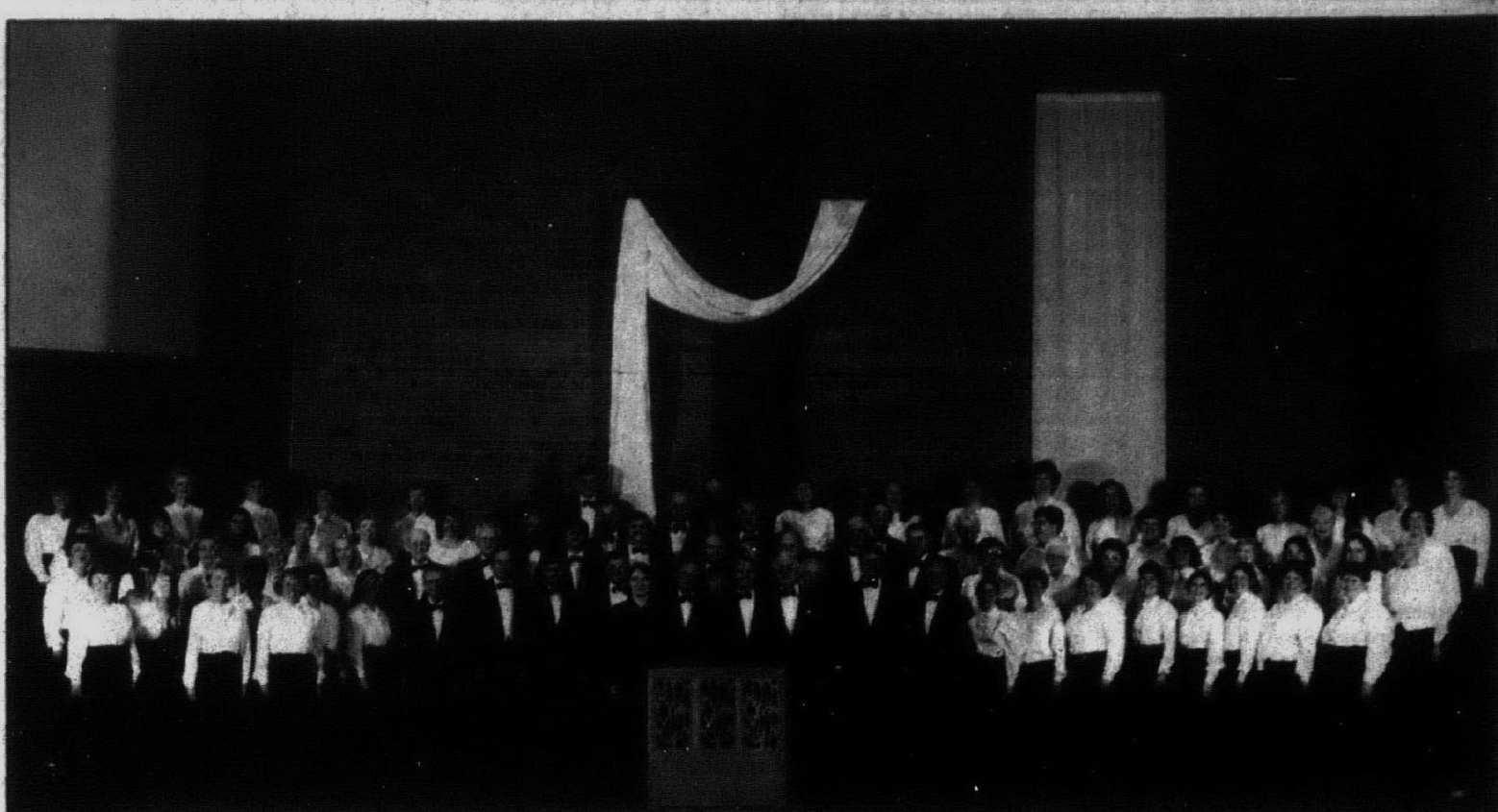
versity Choir; Festival Choir; Measure for Measure, a 60-man choir group; and members who can attend from the Plymouth Oratorio Society. Also singing will be 50 choir students from the two Plymouth and Canton high schools.

"He's asked anyone in the Plymouth Oratorio Society to go if they care to," said society publicity chairwoman Karen Chapin. She estimated about half of the 92-member group will attend. Cost to travel to New York City and lodging is \$699.

The Plymouth Oratorio Society was formed 10 years ago. Chapin said she joined five years ago because, "I enjoy a singing experience with other people that are excellent at it, it's not often that you get to do this kind of music."

Of the Carnegie Hall concert, Chapin said, "A lot of people are really really excited. It's an opportunity that doesn't come along every day."

The Plymouth Oratorio Society was formed, according to a group mission statement, "For

dinner at Ernesto's in Plymouth. "That's what we get a chance to celebrate."

The news for the evening included the agency's plans to open an office at Michigan Avenue and Sheldon in Canton. That's slated for mid-year, Yagiela said, and will involve sharing office space with First Step and other agencies. Growth Works juvenile justice programs will be run primarily from the Canton site.

Growth Works offers a number of services to area young people and their families, including substance abuse treatment,

counseling and job placement. Seven people were honored during the Feb. 8 dinner.

Sue Davis, the agency's director of community services, presented awards to Karen Plants and Cornelius von Spronsen, volunteer mentors. Board vice president Rita Lowenstein presented awards to Kelly Tessmer and Jim and Gail Lafferty, in recognition of their support of those in recovery from substance abuse, including recovering youth.

Max Lafferty, Jim and Gail Lafferty's son, was killed in an auto accident in December 1995.

More than \$3,000 was raised in memorials following his death, and agency officials plan to dedicate a group room in his memory. The younger Lafferty was involved with Growth Works.

Yagiela presented an award to Jeff Horton, who has a local plumbing business and shares office space with Growth Works. Horton, who was also lauded for his support of those in recovery, has offered jobs to three recovering youths.

Office volunteer Diane Geddes, who was unable to attend, was also honored.

Yagiela discussed plans for the agency's 25th anniversary this summer. Growth Works has established competitive pay and a retirement plan for its staff, he said, indicating it will be around for awhile.

The agency was reaccredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations in 1995, and received a reaccreditation with commendation, putting it in the top 25 percent of such facilities. On a less positive note, Yagiela said that 8 percent of those in the Youth Assistance program got

into further trouble with the law by committing a second offense.

"So we're getting kids who are a little further along in terms of their progression."

The agency also started an Employee Assistance Program for the 35th District Court, and may expand that to other organizations.

More and more young people are using drugs at a younger age, Yagiela said, citing University of Michigan studies which show extensive use by eighth-graders.

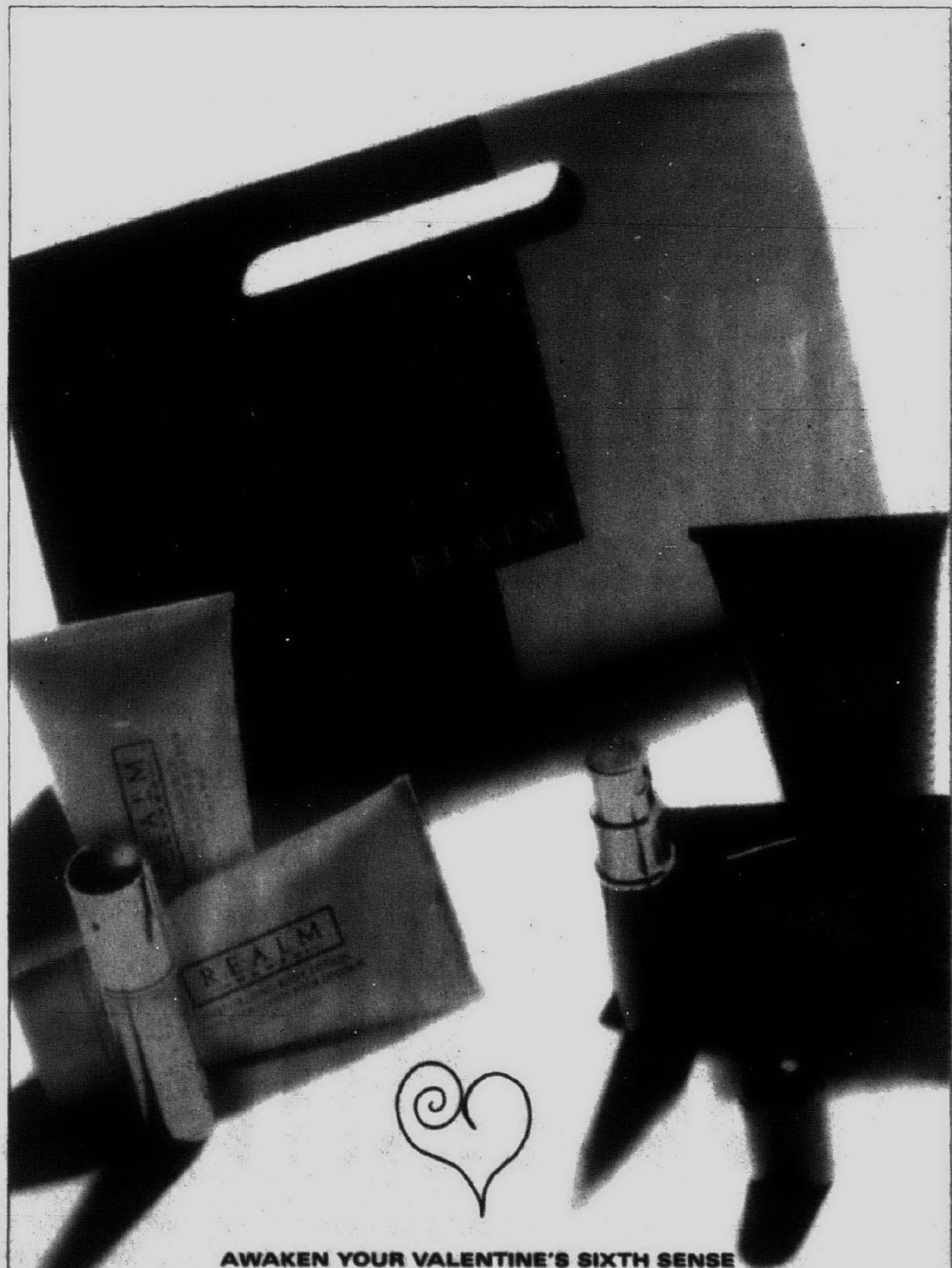

the corrections department, she served five as a corrections officer. "Anytime you get involved in a physical confrontation you've got to use your head and know when to back off, when to get help — that's just part of the job," she said.

She said about half of the corrections officers at Western Wayne are women. The inmate population at the all-male prison is near its capacity of 756.

Her husband, Tom, also works in the prison system, as assistant deputy warden at Mound Correctional Facility in Detroit.

Rodger said Huron Valley, because it houses prisoners serving life sentences, is considered a more dangerous place to work than a prison such as Western Wayne, where prisoners serve no more than two years.

"When you get to Huron Valley where guys are doing life, what's another life sentence, big deal," Rodger said.

But that's not to minimize the potential danger corrections officers face at Western Wayne, she said. To keep physical confrontations from starting, inmates must

be reminded of the rules, she said. Troublesome inmates must be reminded that violations can mean losing privileges, or can lead to segregation from other prisoners, Rodger said.

Of situations that can pose the greatest danger to corrections officers, Rodger said overseeing a large group of inmates — up to 120 gathered at meal time — poses the greatest risk. "You need to remember where you're at and be aware of your surroundings," she said.

In dealing with inmates, "You can be friendly to them but you cannot be their friend because you cannot play favorites," Rodger said.

Some Western Wayne officers have sought counseling from the prison's employee services department since the Feb. 5 incident. "I think the main thing when you hire in the department of corrections is it's a job a lot of people wouldn't want to take. There's not always going to be an easy day," she said.

"We are a unique bunch. When something happens we all feel it, we all hurt."

riculum coordinator for the district.

"There are many reasons why it is valuable, and as many reasons why it is questioned. How it is left is that when a teacher is teaching the curriculum, if there is an enrichment activity that she wishes to do, she is required to send a letter to the parents so they are informed. It must be done on a voluntary basis, so if there are children who do not wish to participate, an activity can be provided in another way."

Michaelis said she knows dissection is "an area of controversy for some people, but we didn't have any parents express concerns. A couple students said they

just weren't comfortable with the idea yet, or had squeamish stomachs."

Lincoln answered students' questions about the specimens.

"She explained that if she would have had to turn the old rabbits loose, they would die. Often, no one steps forward to give a home to an old rabbit. Sometimes animals aren't treated in the kindest way, and they get diseases when they get old," the teacher said. "Mrs. Lincoln said she doesn't want them to suffer, and sometimes this is the most humane thing."

Lincoln has proved herself to be "a great resource for informa-

19-year-old from Canton, will not be charged.

"There were two people who were together when this occurred, but what we believe is that one person did all the calling," said Canton Detective Jerry Hardesty.

Hardesty said he was led to Sowers by school authorities, and that Sowers confessed. "School security received a tip that several people may have been involved. I just started to track down those various leads," said Hardesty. "I was able to determine that David Sowers was the person who did it. I did an interview at his home, and he confessed."

Both young men are graduates of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools. It was a case of the individuals having "too much free time" and making the threats for kicks, said Hardesty. "That was part of it. The other thing was to try and get some of their friends out of class," said Hardesty.

A bomb threat involving a PCEP school bus Jan. 29 is still under investigation.

Police are pleased with the course of the joint investigation. "We've worked very well together,

not only to put a closure on this one, but to curtail such acts in the future," Hardesty said.

A number of parents complained that they should have been notified about the school evacuation so they could pick up their children at PCEP. Others claim school officials should have had students stand further than 40 feet away from the building during the 20-minute evacuation.

"Look at it from the schools' perspective. When you have 5,000 kids on one campus, how is it going to be possible to contact the parent of every child who goes there? The school system has an extremely difficult situation there. You want to give this the seriousness things like this deserve, but if you let kids out of school every time this happens, you wouldn't ever have school in session for a whole week. If you try, you can find fault in just about any situation."

Students and staff were told there was a fire drill and remained outside while a fruitless search was conducted by Canton police, school personnel and Michigan State Police.

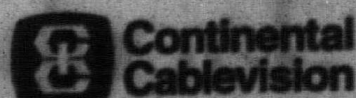

Locals wary of county tax proposal

A proposed ordinance requiring local municipalities to notify the county in a timely manner of plans to capture tax money, raised some concerns at the Conference of Western Wayne meeting Friday.

Under the proposed ordinance, communities must declare intent to establish a local development finance authority, or a downtown development authority, giving the county time to stop the capture of the county's part of the tax money for the project.

At the monthly meeting of western Wayne mayors and supervisors, Wayne County Commissioner V.oe Chair Kay Beard told CWW members about the ordinance, which has had first read-

ing before the commission and is expected to have its second reading on Thursday.

Redford Township Supervisor James Kelly asked why the county decided to do this. "Is it going to have the ability to kill a project?" he said.

"It's only the county money. We can't veto any other dollars," Beard said, adding that the county didn't make the rule, the state Legislature did. The county is only setting up an ordinance requiring that the information be submitted to the county in a timely manner, Beard said.

The notice must inform the county commission of the date by which it must act by resolution, and the specific name and address of the clerk of the local governing body with which the coun-

ty commission must file the resolution. The resolution would exempt the capture of county ad valorem property taxes.

Before the meeting, Commissioner Michelle Plawewski, Dearborn Heights, said she is all for communities being able to capture money for downtown development authorities.

The problem is that the county hasn't been getting notices from communities. "If this is trying to get us in line — that's fine," she said.

"No way am I going to interfere with communities as they move to recapture money," she said.

The county has lost millions and millions of dollars over the years because of communities capturing county tax money, Beard said.

She praised the current proposal by Westland to establish a DDA. Westland has done an excellent job of analyzing the project and there will be considerable return on the money, she said. "These are the kinds of things that help us to make a decision," she said. "Obviously we want to go along with our local communities," she said.

"I can appreciate that the county wants that kind of information," CWW Chairman Thomas Yack, Canton Township supervisor said. But the county didn't provide any cost analyses in relation to the Willow Run Tradeport proposal, he said. Maybe the county should be the model, he said.

"I couldn't agree with you more," Beard said.

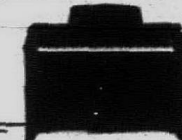

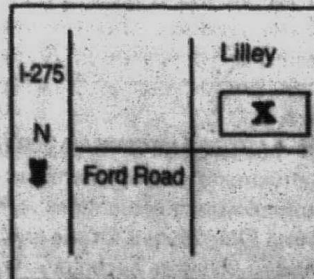

School program successful, but awareness of it still lags

The Spectra Program — being piloted for ninth-graders at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park this year — is such a success that it's being offered to next year's ninth-graders.

The "school-within-a-school" at PCEP provides "rigorous, dynamic academic preparation, integrating English, social studies, science and math so students will understand how ideas are interconnected," said Spectra teacher Cyndi Burnstein.

Participation is voluntary. "The two-year program is designed to accommodate 120 ninth-graders who will begin in 1996, as well as the 109 10th-graders who began as freshmen in the fall of 1995," said Burnstein.

Burnstein said Spectra teachers "keep running into people who are confused about Spectra," especially in light of the new Journey program for at-risk students. "We're having a problem with people understanding this is not for gifted students, and not for kids who are at risk," said Burnstein. "The concept of an alternative for the regular kid with a highly rigorous program is just foreign for some reason."

Many students are attracted to Spectra because it allows for closer connections at PCEP, which has two high schools and more than 4,500 students.

The goals of Spectra are to promote "a feeling of community through closer communication and shared experiences, and an opportunity to enjoy the friend-

ships, academic opportunities and extracurricular activities of PCEP," said Burnstein.

"The pilot program stresses integrating the content of four subjects and challenging the students with many problems and projects that require them to combine the knowledge and skills learned in each of the four disciplines."

Teaching English along with Burnstein are Mary Beth Carroll and Lauren Pearson. Social studies teachers are Barbara Brownlie, Kelly Bullard and Rebecca Miller.

'90s Valentines speak out on relationships

Hallmark, those producers of Valentine's Day greetings since 1915, report that more than 925 million valentines will be exchanged on Wednesday.

And Hallmark can thank the Romans for the flurry of mid-February card sales, for without their pagan celebration of Lupercalia upon which Valentine's Day is loosely based, there would be no winter celebration of Love.

Did you know the Feb. 14 holiday has little or nothing to do with the Roman priest Valentine, martyred in 279 A.D. for performing weddings against a direct order from Claudius II? It seems Claudius wanted his men off fighting wars and not at home with wives and lovers.

Instead, many historians believe the roots of Valentine's Day sprang from the Roman Lupercalia, a fertility festival honoring the two mythical wolf pups Remus and Romulus. In fact, Pope Gelasius set aside Feb. 14 in 469 A.D. with the hope of supplanting the Lupercalia with a Christian theme.

Valentine's greetings as we know them date from 1750. These were entirely hand made until commercial cards came on the scene around 1800. The first valentines were aimed strictly at lovers, while today's cards reflect contemporary life situations. Hallmark has more than 1,500 designs and messages in print to include everyone from family members to special friends and co-workers.

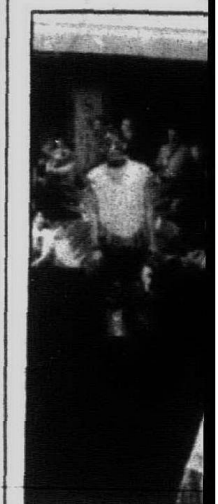

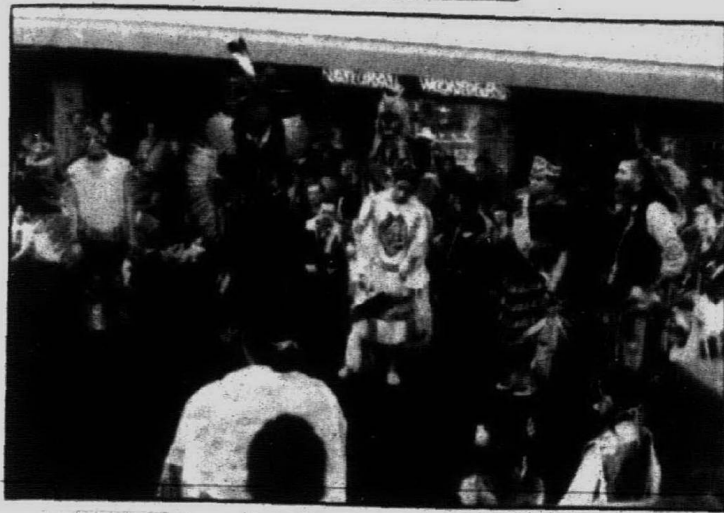

Suburban commissioners offer new plan to fund youth services

A proposed ordinance spelling out a formula for allocating tax money for youth services is expected to come before the Wayne County Board of Commissioners this week.

It was introduced by seven suburban commissioners, including local commissioners Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia; Bruce Patterson, R-Canton Township; Michelle Plawewski, D-Dearborn Heights; and Vice Chair Kay Beard, D-Westland. It was sent to the Committee of the Whole and is expected to come up Wednesday. If it moves out of committee it could come before the commission during its regular meeting Thursday.

The proposal sets up a formula for allocating the one-tenth millage funding approved by voters in 1988 for youth programs. The money is to be used for programs aimed at reducing youth crime. The money, \$1 million annually, would be divided equally between the city of Detroit and the suburbs. The cities of Highland Park and Hamtramck would be included in the city of Detroit allocation. The suburban money would be split on a per capita basis be-

tween the Downriver Community Conference, the Conference of Western Wayne and the Conference of Eastern Wayne.

Currently, there is no formula in place to allocate the money, said McCotter, who also represents Plymouth and Plymouth Township. The suburban communities aren't getting a share of the money, he said. "We think this is the best compromise way to do it," he said.

Plawewski, who also represents Redford Township and part of Livonia, said she was disappointed the proposal didn't have enough votes for approval at the Feb. 1 meeting and was sent to committee. "I think this is the best thing for Wayne County," she said.

It isn't a suburbs vs. Detroit issue, but a way to guarantee that programs have funding, she said. Some programs have to seek money from the county each year, she said. This way at least it's written and people know it's coming, she said.

Beard, who also represents Garden City, said she supports the proposal because of the many needs in the out-county area.

She cited gang problems in most of the suburban communi-

ties as a need to be addressed, including getting money to programs such as DARE. As for taking money from Detroit programs, she said, "Detroit needs it badly, and we need it badly as well."

Some money has been allocated in out-Wayne County each year, but no real system has been put in place. "It's been catch as catch can," she said.

"I think it makes sense to do it on a more structured basis," she said.

Patterson said that while the proposal is still in flux, the suburban commissioners are trying to distribute the money according to a formula. But it has turned into an issue pitting all of the suburban commissioners against the Detroit commissioners.

Detroit commissioners are taking the position that the money should be allocated based on population, he said.

Currently, about 97 percent of the money is spent in Detroit and about 3 percent in the suburbs, Patterson said.

With eight suburban commissioners and seven Detroit commissioners, for the measure to fail, it would be a question of who breaks rank, he said.

I seek out reasons to cook, to create, to satiate and to nurture. And if being an optimist is only half enough, I also pride myself in being a hopeless romantic. I send flowers, cry at the movies, perform crazy random acts of kindness, and am head over heels in love.

Comforting recipes

I saw "The Bridges of Madison County" twice, and believe it or not, actually got excited when the "Recipes of Madison County" by Jane Hemminger & Courtney Work, (copyright 1995, Oxmoor House Publishers, \$14.95) crossed my desk. If you didn't see the movie, which stars Clint Eastwood and Meryl Streep, I couldn't imagine a better Valentine's Day rental.

In a nutshell, she offers. He accepts. And from that moment on, the lives of an Iowa housewife and an adventurous photographer are passionately intertwined.

Lovers of romance and food will really enjoy this book because it was written after the movie, which portrays the strong role food plays in strengthening the bonds of intimacy in all relationships. The simple offering of food nurtures romance.

In "The Bridges of Madison County," food plays a key role between Francesca and Robert. She takes a dinner invitation on the Roseman Bridge for Robert. Green peppers stuffed with wild rice - a perfect choice for this meal; subtly they symbolize a contrast between the heaviness of Francesca's everyday life and the freshness of her encounter with Robert. The simplicity of Francesca's stuffed peppers, a jelly jar of flowers, and blues on the radio set just the right mood for this steamy evening.

Food is also a physical expression of caring and compassion.

Food has a special way of saying "you're special." That unexpected pot of chicken soup from a friend feeds the soul as much as it nourishes the body. Remember folks, it could all start, as it did in the movie "over a simple glass of iced tea."

The recipes in the book are easy, comforting, Midwestern food at its laid back best. Unlike true love, there's nothing complicated in the book.

Classic love

Nurturers of classic love will appreciate "At Home With the French Classics" by Richard Grausman (copyright 1988, Workman Publishers, \$14.95). It's a compilation of the great French recipes that have been updated and simplified for the contemporary American kitchen.

Chef Grausman goes into great detail about the heritage of classic French cuisine. His suggestions for Veal Orloff require a steady hand over the Kenmore range, but it's well worth the effort. Whether he's discussing the benefits of a classic Bouillabaisse or harkening the need for proper cookie molds for making impeccable Madelines, lovers of candlelight, soft music, low wattage light bulbs, red roses and the desire to cook to seduce will appreciate this book.

Having once been hailed as the father of cajun cuisine, Paul Prudhomme has once again floated to the top of the pot with his new tome "Fiery Foods That I Love" (copyright, 1995, William Morrow Publishers, \$25). This book contains fiery additions to basic recipes. In his usually unusual food pairings, Prudhomme stirs a paste of ground pecans and coffee into a plain sauteed chicken for a daring new taste. After trying the recipe and paging through the book, I could only help but wonder where these chefs come up with their ideas?

As with all the recipes in his book, the base for each is a seasoning mix, blend or paste that requires the use of a well stocked herb and spice pantry.

CHINESE NEW YEAR • THE YEAR OF THE RAT

TRADITION SERVES UP
OPTIMISM

Say "rat," and most of us shriek! Rat has a negative connotation as in "you dirty rat," or "I smell a rat." So why are some people looking forward to celebrating the Year of the Rat, which begins Chinese New Year on Feb. 16?

"The rat is ambitious, honest, sincere, generous, and in self-control," said Linda Parker, owner of the Hunan Palace restaurant in Farmington Hills, which is celebrating Chinese New Year on Feb. 18.

If your birthday is in 1912, 1924, 1936, 1948, 1960, 1972, 1984 or 1996, you were born in the Year of the Rat.

According to the Chinese calendar, determined by a lunisolar calendar, this year is 4688.

Each year is named for one of the 12 animals beginning with the rat and progressing through to the ox, tiger, hare, dragon, snake, horse, sheep, monkey, fowl, dog and pig. This cycle of

years is frequently used for astrological purposes, much the same way the 12 signs of the zodiac are used in the west to describe personality traits and tell fortunes.

"He's the leader of the 12 animals in the Chinese Zodiac. People born in the Year of the Rat are smart, and very friendly," added Shen Yu, manager of New Peking Chinese Restaurant in Garden City, which is celebrating new year Feb. 19-22.

In China a whole month is set aside to celebrate the passing of the old year, and to welcome the new. Outdoor parades with ceremonial dragons and fireworks mark the occasion observed some time between mid-January and mid-February. Families feast, and relatives travel for miles to be with one another.

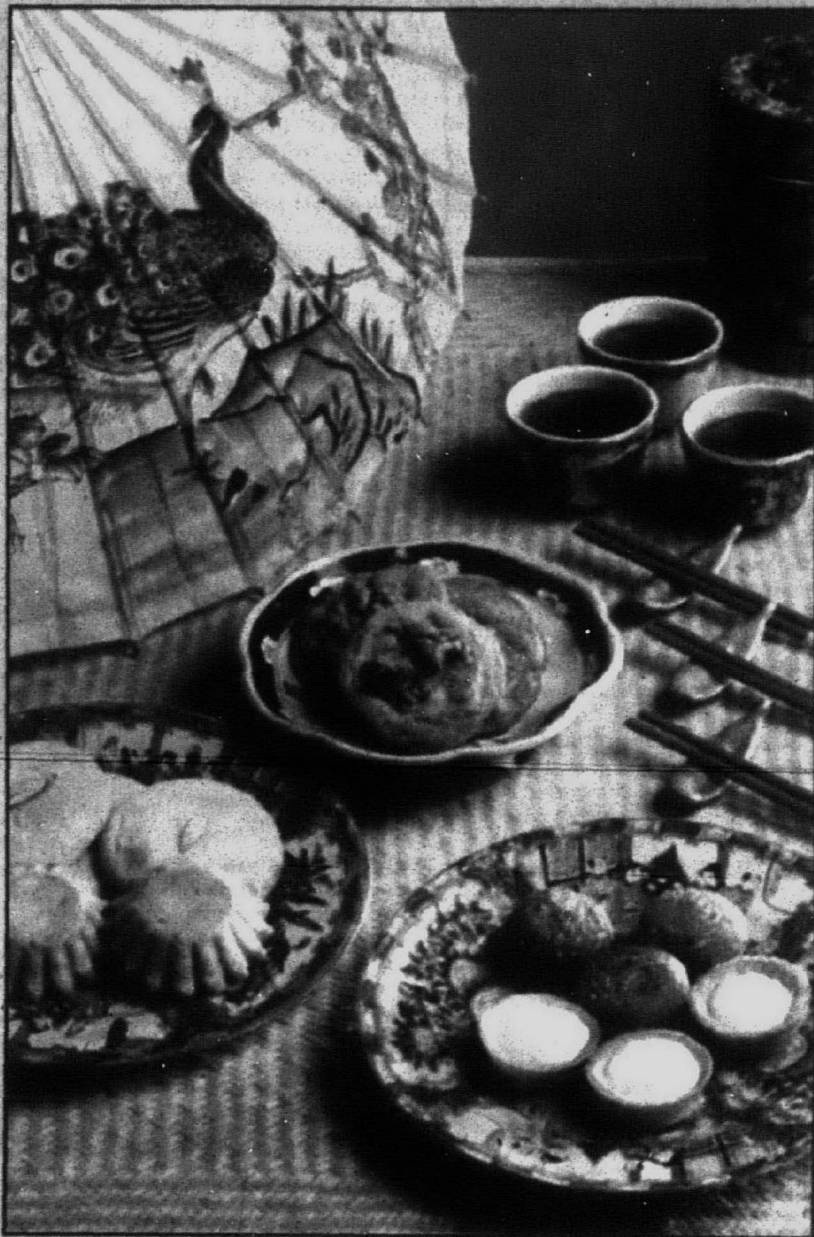
"Chinese New Year is like Christmas - the family gets together," said Paul Leung, owner of Oceania Inn in Rochester Hills, which is celebrating Chinese New Year Feb. 15-18 and 22-24. "The older generation gives red pocket money to the younger generation as a sign of good luck. Also, the Chinese do a good job of cleaning the house to welcome the new year."

Celebrations in U.S. cities with large Chinese populations such as San Francisco and New York, are generally limited to one day.

Local restaurateurs are planning special menus, and will offer entertainment to mark the occasion. No Chinese New Year celebration would be complete without the Lion Dance to scare away evil spirits from the old year, and welcome the new year.

Parker and Chef Jack Dai said they considered characteristics of the animal linked to the coming year, and then determined the special dishes that they would prepare. For example, Peking Duck, which requires two days advance notice, symbolizes ambition. The menu also includes sesame beef, Chinese style shrimp and colorful desserts.

On the menu at New Peking is a gold fried dumpling, that looks

like a gold nugget, "so everyone who eats it will become rich," said Yu.

"The Year of the Rat is also seen as a year of opportunity, and also a good time to launch new ventures and make new investments. It's the year of optimism," said Marshall Chin, one of the managing partners of Mon Jin Lau in Troy, which will celebrate new year on Feb. 18.

"For our Chinese New Year celebration we focus on what we do well, and our menu is based on popular items and specialties," he said. The menu includes Macadamia Nut Crusted Salmon with lemon grass sauce, Asian vegetables and Thai rice noodles. Entertainment includes Lion Dance, magicians, fortune tellers, and music.

Oceania Inn's menu offers a Dim Sum Platter, Tender of Steak marinated in Black Pepper Sauce, and stir-fried chunks of chicken breast with a mixture of Chinese vegetables and mushrooms in oyster sauce.

Parker, Shu and Leung told me Chinese New Year menus

often include a whole fish with the head and tail on. The head symbolizes a good beginning, and the tail a good ending. In Chinese, fish means enough - that you always have plenty of what you need - money, food, and good health. Noodles symbolize long life.

"A lot of the time we have oysters," said Leung, "so you will be prosperous in your business."

Baking and pastries are also a part of Chinese culinary traditions. Cookies are cut into a round shape like a wheel to symbolize wholeness and continuity.

For a Chinese New Year party at home, cooks at the Crisco Kitchens suggest decorating your table with bamboo mats, inexpensive paper parasols, and brilliant red and gold napkins. Rice bowls can hold a variety of condiments, and colorful chopsticks and stands will add to the atmosphere. A Chinese restaurant can supply a bountiful main course, leaving time for baking cookies full of Oriental flavor.

Respect your diabetic sweetie's diet

My friend called me the other day to say her 20-year-old son has diabetes. She asked me to talk to him and "tell him what to do." Well, the only thing I could tell her was to learn everything she could about diabetes. I couldn't give him a "cookbook" lesson in diabetes without knowing much more about his lifestyle. After all, diabetes is a complicated disease that has no known cause or cure. In diabetes, the body does not make enough of the hormone insulin. The job of insulin is to get sugars (from the foods we eat) out of the blood stream and into the muscle and brain tissues.

If left untreated, a person will die. If treatment is "half-hearted" - that is, a person only sometimes controls their blood sugar - then serious illness can result from

diabetes complications including kidney failure, blindness, heart attack and circulation problems sometimes requiring amputation. This is serious and scary stuff! The best option: control your diabetes!

If you have a loved-one who is diabetic, you don't necessarily have to forego something sweet on Valentine's Day. However, respecting and accommodating your sweetie's diet requirements is a far greater gift than any box of chocolates.

New studies indicate that diabetics who check their blood sugar throughout the day have a greater understanding of what foods have the strongest effect on their blood sugar levels. The good news is that some people have found that their bodies can tolerate an occasional sweet treat with little or no effect.

Still, it is imperative that dia-

betics stick to a diet that has been formulated for their particular needs.

The meals we eat everyday contain a mixture of protein, carbohydrate and fat-containing foods. We use protein foods to build and repair our body, we use carbohydrate foods for energy for our muscles and brain, and we use fat foods to cushion our internal organs and absorb fat-soluble vitamins. Of course, this is just a small part of what protein, carbohydrate and fat do; there is much more to it.

Digestion, breaking down food for our body to use, is a complex process that starts when we put food into our mouth. Our body responds and sends out digestive enzymes and hormones. As the food moves into our stomach and intestines, these enzymes and

TIPS FOR CONTROLLING DIABETES
(good for the whole family)

- **Food is ok if you make good choices.** A "junior" hamburger or roast beef sandwich, along with a side salad and milk makes a good meal. Or try corn-on-the-cob, baked beans or a dinner roll instead of french fries, biscuits or coleslaw.
- **Read food labels.** "Dietetic" doesn't mean "diabetic." Be careful of added sugars - they come in many forms including sucrose, fructose, dextrose, maltose, lactose, corn syrup and honey.
- **Low calorie sweeteners** let you enjoy the sweet taste of sugar without the extra calories or effect on your blood sugar. However, foods with low calorie sweeteners are not necessarily calorie-free. For example, diet koda has no calories, but sugar-free hot cocoa does.
- **Eat a fruit or bread serving before exercising.** But speak with your dietitian if you are involved in serious sports training on how to balance your meals for your activity.
- **Try to avoid fried foods.** If you must eat something fried, then count in an extra three or four fat servings for every fried item you eat.
- **When eating in the home of friends,** tell them you have diabetes and have to eat selectively. This will save the embarrassment of your host urging you to eat "just one piece of chocolate cake."
- **If you are traveling by air or train,** ask in advance for special meals.
- **If you must drink alcohol,** do so only in moderation with your doctor's approval. Never drink on an empty stomach and avoid sweet wines, liqueurs or mixes that contain sugar.

WILD RICE STUFFED GREEN PEPPERS

- 1/2 cup chopped green onion
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine, melted
- 1 1/2 cups beef broth
- 1/2 cup brown and wild rice blend
- 1/2 cup sliced celery
- 1/2 cup finely diced carrots
- 1 (14 1/2 ounce can) diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 cup fresh sliced mushrooms
- 1/2 cup chopped zucchini
- 2 tablespoons fresh chopped parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 2 large green peppers, stem ends sliced off and seeded
- 2 tablespoons tomato juice
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Saute onion and garlic in butter or margarine in a large saucepan until tender. Add broth, rice, celery and carrot. Bring to a boil; cover, reduce heat to a simmer and cook for 25 minutes or until rice is almost done. Remove from heat, stir in tomatoes, mushrooms, zucchini, parsley, basil and thyme. Place peppers in a saucepan. Cover with water. Bring to a boil; cook 3 minutes or until tender-crisp. Drain and stuff with rice mixture. Place peppers in a greased casserole and spoon any extra rice around pepper. Cover with foil and bake for 25 minutes at 350 degrees F. Baste with tomato juice after 15 minutes. When almost done, remove foil and top with Parmesan cheese. Serves 2.

MEDALLIONS DE VEAU ORLOFF

- (Veal Medallions Orloff)
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil or butter

- 8 medallions of veal (1 to 1 1/4 inches thick)
- Pinch of salt and fresh ground pepper
- 1 cup finely chopped mushrooms
- 1 cup Sauce Mornay (recipe follows)
- about 1/2 cup milk
- 1 ounce grated Swiss cheese
- 2 cups white rice, cooked

Preheat oven to 475 degrees F. Coat a large skillet with the oil or butter and saute the medallions over medium high heat until done, about 4 minutes. Cover the pan after turning the medallions. Season with salt and pepper. Divide the mushrooms into 8 portions. Place the veal on an oven-proof serving platter and spread each medallion with mushrooms.

Heat the Mornay sauce and thin with 2 tablespoons of milk. Spoon an even coating of sauce over each medallion. Thin any remaining sauce with remainder of milk until it is the consistency of cream and bring it to a boil. Coat each medallion with a second coating of sauce. Sprinkle a little cheese over the top of each medallion and place in the upper third of an oven until the sauce bubbles and the cheese is golden, about 10 minutes. Serve surrounded by cooked rice. Serves 8.

MORNAY SAUCE

- 2 1/2 tablespoons butter
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 2 cups milk
- Dash salt and pepper
- Pinch nutmeg
- 2 ounces Swiss cheese, grated

In a medium saucepan, heat the butter over medium heat. Add the flour and cook, stirring frequently until the roux is a pale yellow and frothy, about 30-45 seconds. Add the milk and stir well with a whisk until the sauce thickens and comes to a boil, about 2-3 minutes (this is a classic Bechamel sauce).

Reduce the heat and season with salt, pepper and nutmeg. Whisk vigorously for 10 seconds and stir in cheese. Sauce will thicken to the consistency of heavy cream. Makes about 2 cups.

COFFEE-NUT CHICKEN

- Seasoning mix
- 2 tablespoons lightly packed brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons ground chile peppers
- 2 teaspoons ground dried ancho chile peppers
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 1/2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 1 1/4 teaspoons onion powder
- 1 1/4 teaspoons dried oregano leaves
- 1 teaspoon dried basil leaves
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- Coffee-nut puree
- 1/2 cup pumpkin seeds, toasted
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans, toasted
- 2 tablespoons poppy seeds, toasted
- 2 tablespoons sesame seeds, toasted
- 1 cup chicken stock
- 2 tablespoons lightly packed brown sugar

- 3 tablespoons instant coffee
- Remainder of recipe ingredients:

- 1 (3-4 pound) chicken, cut up
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 2 1/2 cups chicken stock

Combine the seasoning mixes in a small bowl. Set aside. Process the toasted seeds and pecans with the stock in a blender or food processor until smooth. Add the brown sugar and instant coffee. Process for 1 minute. Set aside.

Sprinkle the chicken with 2 tablespoons of the seasoning mix and rub it in well. Heat the oil in a heavy 5-quart pot over high heat for 4 minutes. Brown the seasoned chicken in batches, large pieces first, skin side down for 2-3 minutes on each side. Remove chicken and set aside.

Add the onions and 1 tablespoon of the seasoning mix to the pot. Cook for 5 minutes. Stir in 1 cup of stock and scrape the bottom of the pot to loosen the brown bits. Stir in the coffee-nut puree, the remaining seasoning mix and the remaining stock. Bring to a boil, then return chicken to the pot. Reduce heat to low and simmer chicken until tender, about 30 minutes. Remove from heat and serve. Serves 4.

hormones do their thing — they break down the food into tiny particles including amino acids from protein foods, glucose from carbohydrate foods and fatty acids from fat foods.

Once in the blood stream, these particles are carried gloriously to all parts of our body. If you have a cut on your foot, the amino acids in the blood go there to help heal your skin. If you are ready to exercise the glucose particles are there for your muscles to use. If your body has all it needs, the fatty acids are there to be stored away, ready to be mobilized when you need the energy.

People with diabetes can break down and use protein and fats, but they do not have the insulin needed to use carbohydrates (glucose). So without the insulin the glucose doesn't get "picked-up" out of the blood to go to the brain and muscles. It just stays in the blood and increases with every meal. The muscles and brain never get to use the glucose. That is why people with uncontrolled diabetes walk around feeling tired and listless even though their blood is pumped full of the glucose their body needs.

The truth is, having blood full of sugar is not healthy. Sugar-coated cereals may be fine for some, but sugar-coated blood is not good for anyone.

Controlling blood sugar is simple and important.

■ Go to see your doctor. Get on the right medication and stay on it. Diabetes is chronic — it has no cure. You can't stop taking your medicine if you "feel better."

■ Go to see a registered dietitian. Call your local hospital and make an appointment with a dietitian. You can learn what to eat, when to eat, and get valuable information on how to control your blood sugar.

■ Get some exercise. No excuse, get off the couch and have some fun. Move your body.

STRAWBERRY BANANA PARFAIT

- 1/2 cup crushed chocolate graham crackers
- 1 (4 servings size) package — instant sugar-free banana

- cream pudding/pie filling
- 2 cups two percent milk
- 2 cup sliced strawberries
- 4 whole strawberries for garnish

Prepare pudding mix according to package directions using milk.

Layer pudding, strawberry slices and crushed chocolate graham crackers in four parfait or dessert glasses. Chill until serving time. To serve, garnish with whole strawberries. Serves 4.

PEACHY VALENTINE CRISP

- 2 (16 ounce) cans sliced peaches in natural juice, drained

- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 32 chocolate Teddy Graham snacks (1/2 cup)
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 2 teaspoons margarine, melted
- Vanilla frozen yogurt, optional

Combine peaches, dried cherries, and 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon in 9-inch pie plate. Bake at 350 degrees F. for 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, combine chocolate Teddy Grahams, nutmeg, remaining cinnamon and margarine, tossing until well coated. Spoon over peaches. Bake 10 minutes more or until heated through. Serve warm, topped with frozen yogurt if desired. Serves 6.

And, this pasta's ideal mate? A loaf of crusty French bread paired with a quickly-prepared, yet subtly sophisticated, roasted garlic butter.

PASTA WITH HERBED VEGETABLE WALNUT SAUCE
3 tablespoons walnuts, finely chopped

1 1/2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh basil (or 1/4 teaspoon dried)
1 1/2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh dill (or 1/4 teaspoon dried)
6 ounces (about 3 cups dry) bow tie pasta
1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter
1 medium zucchini, trimmed, cut lengthwise in half, cut into 1/4-inch slices (about 1 1/2 cups)
1 medium red pepper, cut into strips
1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons whipping cream
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Heat a large non-stick skillet over medium heat. Add walnuts; cook until lightly toasted, stirring constantly, about 3 minutes. Remove from skillet. Combine walnuts and herbs; set aside. Cook pasta according to package directions; drain. Meanwhile, heat butter in the

same skillet over medium heat until melted. Add zucchini and red pepper. Cook and stir about 2 minutes or until vegetables are almost tender. Add cream; cook 30 seconds. Stir in Parmesan and half of the walnut mixture. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Add pasta to skillet and toss gently to coat. Sprinkle with remaining walnut mixture and serve immediately. Makes 4 servings (about 5 cups).

ROASTED GARLIC BUTTER

1 medium head garlic
1 tablespoon melted butter
1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter, softened
Freshly ground pepper
Crusty French bread

Heat oven to 375 degrees F. Trim off about 1/4-inch from top of garlic head to slightly expose cloves. Place on a piece of aluminum foil. Drizzle with melted butter and wrap with foil. Place in oven and roast until garlic is very tender (about 35-40 minutes). Let cool in foil for 10 minutes. Squeeze garlic from cloves

into bowl; mash with fork. Add softened butter and season with pepper. Serve with bread. Makes 1/4 cup. Can be made ahead.

Roasted garlic is available in jars at most supermarkets. Substitute 1 to 1 1/2 teaspoons for freshly roasted garlic if desired. Leftover butter can be covered and stored in refrigerator for up to one week.

AP — On Valentine's Day, have your cake and eat it, too, with the following recipe for old-fashioned chocolate cake with chocolate frosting. There's almost no fat in this cake, thanks to Barry Bluestein and Kevin Morrissey, authors of "The 99 percent Fat-Free Book of Appetizers and Desserts" (Doubleday, \$27.50).

The authors have replaced the usual butter with buttermilk and applesauce and the typical melted chocolate with cocoa powder. The light, crumbly texture comes from beating in each egg white individually.

**OLD-FASHIONED CHOCOLATE
CAKE WITH CHOCOLATE
FROSTING**

1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup unsweetened Dutch-processed cocoa powder, plus 1 teaspoon for dusting

- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup natural unsweetened applesauce
- 3 tablespoons light corn syrup
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 large egg whites, at room temperature
- 1 cup buttermilk
- Light vegetable oil cooking spray
- 1 recipe Chocolate Frosting (recipe below)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Sift the flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of the cocoa powder, baking soda and salt together into a medium-sized bowl. Set aside.

In a large bowl, combine the applesauce and the corn syrup. Beat with an electric mixer set at medium speed until blended. While continuing to beat, gradually add the

sugar. While beating at high speed, add the egg whites, one at a time. Continue to beat until the mixture is light and frothy.

Reduce the speed to medium and beat in half of the flour mixture, then $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of the buttermilk, until incorporated. Beat in the rest of the flour, then the remaining $\frac{1}{4}$ cup buttermilk. With a rubber spatula, scrape down the sides of the bowl.

Spray two 8-inch round, nonstick cake pans lightly with the vegetable oil spray and spread the oil evenly. Dust each with $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon of the remaining cocoa powder. Divide the batter between the cake pans. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center of each cake comes out clean.

Transfer the pans to a wire rack and cool for 15 minutes, then remove the cakes from the pans to cool completely. When the cakes have cooled, frost with the chocolate

frosting. Let sit for one hour before serving. Makes 12 servings.

CHOCOLATE FROSTING

1 tablespoon light corn syrup
3 tablespoons unsweetened
Dutch-processed cocoa
powder
1½ cups confectioners' sugar
¼ cup boiling water

Combine the corn syrup, cocoa powder, confectioners' sugar and 1 tablespoon of the boiling water in a bowl. Using an electric mixer set at low speed, beat in the rest of the boiling water, a tablespoon at a time, until the mixture is fluffy and glossy. Makes about 1 1/4 cups.

Salem sweeps past Canton

One team is on the mountaintop, the other trying to get there. That described the situation when Plymouth Canton hosted rival Plymouth Salem in a WLAA volleyball match Wednesday.

Getting to the summit is a tough trip, as coaches will attest. Staying there is even more of a challenge.

And yet, Plymouth Salem's volleyball team hasn't had many problems — something Plymouth Canton wanted to change Wednesday when it hosted the Rocks in a Western Lakes Activities Association match.

But the Chiefs, who started last week unbeaten in WLAA play, were not up to the task. They fell in three-straight games to Salem, losing 15-6, 15-12, 15-5.

The win pushed the Rocks' record to 29-6-2 overall and kept them unbeaten in WLAA play at 8-0. It also ran their unbeaten streak in league matches to 31-straight.

Canton, which two days prior to the Salem match lost in five sets to Livonia Churchill, is now 17-9-6 overall and 6-2 in the WLAA.

"It's the mental thing," said Canton coach Steve Anderson when asked about the difference. "You can see it on the court. Player-for-player, we can match up with anyone. The talent is there, all that's missing is the mental part."

In other words: go into a match hoping for anything less than victory and that's what you'll get.

It was most evident in the second game, the pivotal set in the match. After Salem built a 9-5 lead, Canton fought back to tie it at 9-all on Jenny Sikora's tough serving.

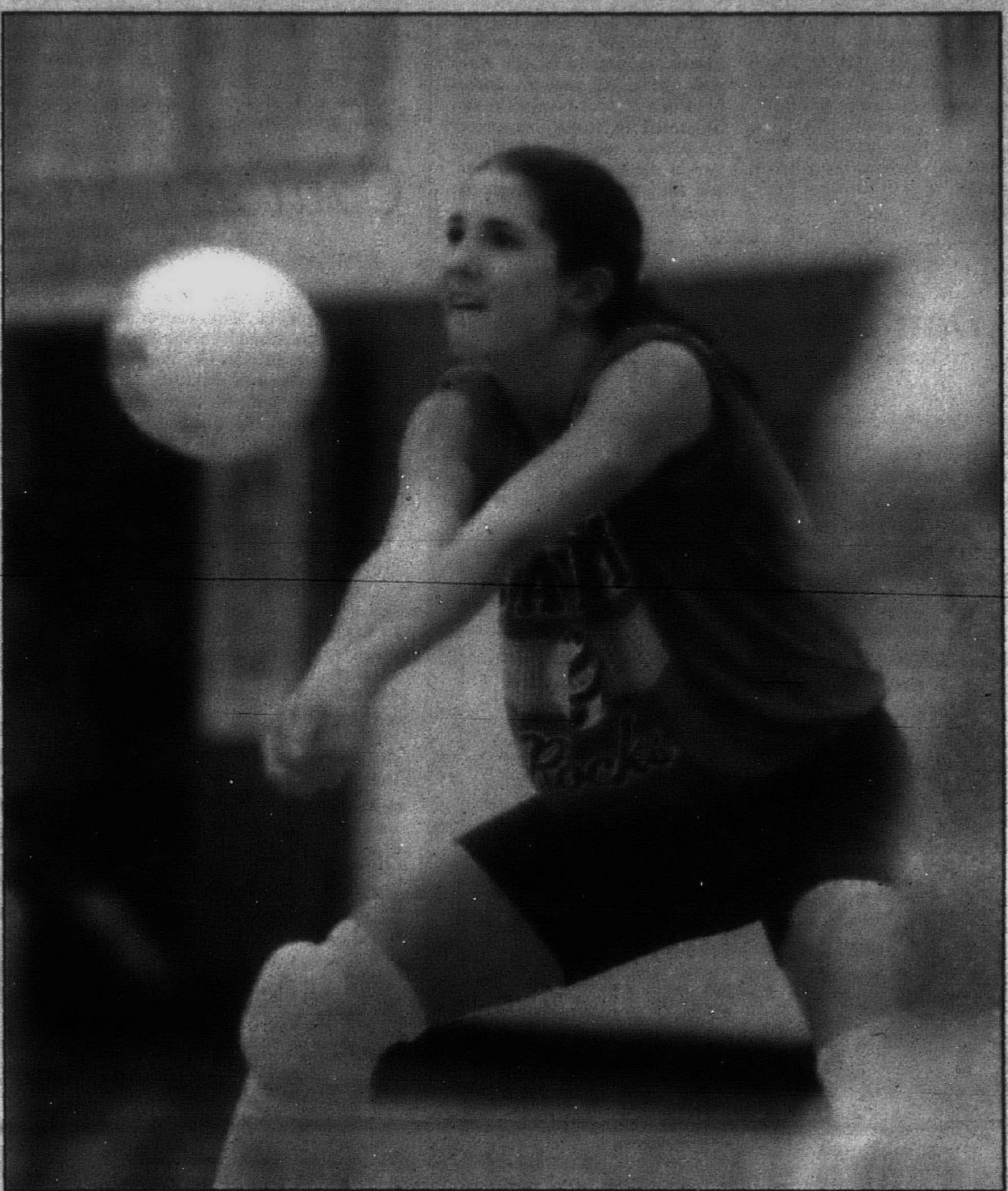
The Rocks again pulled ahead, going up 13-9 before the Chiefs closed the gap to 13-12. But getting close was as good as Canton could manage; Salem closed out the game on Karissa Socia's serve, one point coming on a service ace, the other on a block of a Canton kill attempt.

Socia, a junior outside hitter, had a big match for the Rocks, collecting 17 kills and two block assists. Other Rock contributors:

Senior middle hitter Shellye Sills, nine kills, five solo blocks and six block assists; junior middle hitter Jenny Trott, six kills and six digs; sophomore outside hitter Amanda Abraham, two kills, three solo blocks and four block assists; senior Kim Sheldon, three kills and seven digs; junior setter Karen Springsteen, 15 assists to kills and four service aces; and junior setter Karl Flynn, 10 assists to kills and 14 points served.

Canton got nine kills from senior middle hitter Beth Ostach; six kills from junior outside hitter/middle hitter Jessica Orleman; 20 digs from senior outside hitter Kristie Drinkhahn; and 15 assists to kills from senior setter Amber Wells.

The obvious statistical differences: Canton had only three service aces, usually a team strong point, and made six service errors. "It's usually the other way around,"

Less than 1 percent of high school seniors receive Division I scholarships. Imagine how rare it is to have childhood friends who attended separate high schools end up on scholarship to the same school.

The only other player in Oberlin to announce he's going Division I is CC fullback/nose guard John Spolsky, an Air Force Academy appointee who also played football at St. Michael.

The 53-year-old Catholic Parish is such a hotbed for talent, the annual sports banquet is generally a "Who's Who" for high school speakers, private and public.

Rioux, a coach at St. Michael since 1978 and a Redford Township resident, never lost a game as a junior varsity coach. In 1984 he replaced the retired Jerry Sievert as the varsity coach.

His teams and staff are the envy of the Catholic Youth Organization, winning eight of the last 12 varsity championships at the Pontiac Silverdome.

Rioux has a mind-boggling 135-14 overall record, and statistician Sam Coppola has been there for every one of them. Coppola's son Rick, a St. Michael graduate, was a star quarterback at Livonia Churchill, graduating in 1979.

John Picano, one of the original members of Rioux's staff, gave Rioux the nickname "Boss Hog" years ago.

"My weight was a little portly and since I'm the boss, he decided to call me 'Boss Hog,'" said Rioux, a salesman at Seaman & Patrick.

Curl and Gilbo agree the conditioning at St. Michael was tougher than what they experienced as freshmen in high school.

"I'll always remember him wearing his 'Boss Hog' shirt and telling us to get in the corner of the field to run the mile," recalls Curl. "He's a good disciplinarian. It's like a 'tough love' he has with his players."

Rioux's 1991 team was arguably his best. Four players from that team became high school all-stars last fall: Curl, Gilbo, and CC standouts Spolsky and Mike Smiley. A fifth, CC lineman Jeff Monnette, was named academic all-state.

Joining those five on the All-Observer first-team were former St. Michael players Jamie McFar-

lane (CC) and Ryan Culloty (Stevenson). Two other former Gaels, Tom Smiley (CC) and Todd Wilson (Livonia Churchill), made the second team.

CC usually benefits the most from St. Michael players, but other alumni could be found this year starting on the varsity at Orchard Lake St. Mary (Scott Kerr), Dearborn Divine Child (quarterback Andy Kiasbeth), Plymouth Salem (quarterback Nate Gray) and Stevenson (Rudy Pacheco).

The Gaels' success starts with long-time athletic director Ed Day.

Rioux's varsity and JV staff includes Dave Haddy, Jeff Rioux, Ron Curl, Kevin McKee, John Dupuis, Jim Rouen, Roy Sgroi, Denny Culloty, Dan Haddy, Frank Gilbo, Tim Muldowney, Greg Griffith, Kirk Goodlow and Ron Rzepicki.

None of the coaches gets paid. The home games on Sunday nights at Livonia Clarenceville are the reward, attracting bigger crowds than some high school teams.

"It's very organized, like a high school program," said Dupuis, whose career at St. Michael in the mid-70s was so legendary it took a guy named Pete Rose (Stevenson, '83) to break some of his records. "I don't think anything under Mr. Day has had a losing attitude no matter what the sport. It's always a 'get-after-it' attitude."

Making a (nick)name

Most of the St. Michael players attend school there. The sports teams are also open to St. Michael Parish members and other Catholic children in the Livonia area whose Parish or Catholic school doesn't have a particular sport or a sports program.

Spolsky was a good example, attending St. Robert Bellarmine in Redford, which has no football program. In the winter, Spolsky was playing for St. Robert's basketball team against St. Michael.

Spolsky was so advanced he started on the St. Michael football varsity as a sixth-grader. By the eighth grade, he couldn't play in games because he exceeded the weight limit. He got the nickname "Spuds" from the St. Michael coaching staff and it stuck.

"He reminded us of that little pit bull in the TV commercials

(named Spuds Mackenzie)," said Rioux.

Former St. Michael player Bryan Jeffords, a starter on CC's state championship team last fall, was nicknamed "Quarter Barrel" because one of the coaches thought he looked like one.

He's still called that despite his 6-foot-1, 205 pound frame.

Twelve former St. Michael players were starters in the first-round Class AA playoff game between CC and Stevenson last fall — nine for the Shamrocks and three for the Spartans.

Four were captains (two a side), who went out for the pre-game

coin toss. The year before, Rioux took pride in knowing five former St. Michael and CC players were starting for Northwood University.

"The parents at St. Mike's do an awful lot; there is very good cooperation," said Rioux, a 1967 CC graduate whose daughter Jennifer was an all-stater in track at Livonia Ladywood and now coaches at Wake Forest. "If I could figure out a way to be here August, September and October, I'd be here another 10 years."

TUCSON, Ariz. — The natives say the sun shines 363 days a year here. There isn't a cloud in the sky, either.

This is the perfect place to introduce a new car. It's like a fresh beginning. Even Doug Mazza, chief operating officer for Hyundai, thinks so.

"This new Elantra is as far a step away from the previous model as we can get," said Mazza. "This is another huge step from where Hyundai has been. We're evolving in a way that's healthy to our dealer body and healthy to our customers."

They'll sell a ton of 'em, too, with a base price just over \$10,000. The top-of-the-line, fully loaded Elantra costs \$14,000. Even with the new retrofit, the cost is nearly the same as the model it replaces.

It's got all new sheet metal, all new chassis, a 2-inch longer wheelbase, a 1-inch longer track, a smoother-shifting transmission and more interior hip, shoulder and head room.

The new engine is actually the best part of the car. Designed and developed completely by the South Korean auto maker, this 4-cylinder dual overhead cam "Beta" 1.8-liter

engine provides 130 horses — that's more horsepower than the Cavalier, Civic, Escort and Corolla. The redesign shaved 58 pounds off the engine's weight and provided a 7-percent improvement in fuel efficiency — 24 mpg in the city, 32 on the highway with the manual transmission model.

The engine is very quiet and performs well on city streets and on the highway. During this 600-mile test in southern Arizona, the entire line of Elantras never complained on long inclines and steep hillside roads on the way to Wyatt Earp's hometown of Tombstone. There's a lot of response from the Elantra when you want it, and it reaches cruising speeds quickly.

The body structure is more rigid and the 100-pound reduction in overall body weight of the Elantra makes it much more nimble than its predecessor. And that's saying a lot because the last Elantra was a terrific car.

Speed-sensitive power rack-and-pinion steering provides handling that's usually found on much more expensive sports cars. It holds the road well and has a smaller turning radius for those tight spots.

Better handling is also provided through a new advanced 4-wheel independent suspension that was designed specifically for a smooth, comfortable ride over a wide variety of road surfaces and to accommodate a wide range of driving styles.

There are three Elantras to choose from — the base, GLS and wagon. Yep, I said wagon. It's the first time Hyundai is offering a wagon and this thing is a work of art.

The Elantra wagon is a smartly styled family car that's a serious departure from a traditional wagon. It's actually pretty. And because Hyundai is shooting to sell more than half of its Elantras to women, making it look so good was a good call.

As a driver, you'll never know you're in a wagon because the Elantra wagon's performance and handling are as responsive as the sedan's. Just because it's a wagon doesn't mean you'll suffer sluggish performance or get a clunky feeling when driving it.

The wagon provides overall interior volume of nearly 127 cubic feet — much more than the competition. The rear seat is a double-folding

60/40 split that provides a totally flat loading surface when down.

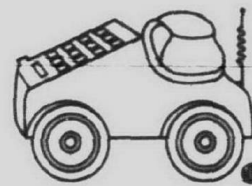
There's also been a significant reduction in what the industry calls NVH — noise, vibration and harshness. Hyundai engineers incorporated extra insulation in the instrument panel, hood and floor areas to kill the sound. The A-, B- and C-pillars are filled with foam to reduce wind noise as well.

Overall styling of the Elantra emphasizes clean lines, body-colored bumpers and a he-man-looking air dam. It commands the road with authority.

The bottom line: The Elantra sedan and wagon are really good choices for a family looking for the versatility of each and want smart styling as well. Look for some good things coming from this auto maker in the future.

(NAPS)-America is sending thousands of cars to Japan. Toyota is exporting the Avalon, a sedan that company's new American-built flagship sedan. It expected to ship more than 20,000 of these cars to Japan, Canada, Taiwan, the Middle East and other world markets during 1996 alone.

The Avalon is made exclusively at Toyota Motor Manufacturing (TMM), U.S.A., in Georgetown, Kentucky. TMM is also the exclusive manufacturer of Camry wagons and coupes, which have been exported to Japan since November 1993.

"Toyota's increased local production, along with a major investment in U.S. research and development and other operations, will further boost our U.S. exports," said Yale Gieszi, executive vice president of Toyota Motor Sales, U.S.A., "In 1996, Toyota's exports of U.S.-built vehicles will climb nearly 70 percent to 80,000 units."

About 20,000 of those exported units are right-hand-drive Toyota Cavaliers, built by General Motors in Ohio for sale by Toyota dealers in Japan. In addition to vehicles, Toyota also exports to Japan TMM-manufactured four-cylinder engines, crankshafts and connecting rods as well as catalytic converters and coated catalytic substrates.

While not even the best American-made car can be driven to Japan, many are being driven in Japan these days.
