Contribution causes district rift

A \$30,000 campaign contribution is at the forefront of a rift brewing among Wayne County Republicans, with the battle lines drawn by two Plymouth

Township political leaders.

In a letter dated Aug. 3, Carl Berry, chairman of the 18th Congressional District Republican Committee, questions why Thomas Hickey, chairman of the Wayne 18th Congressional District Republicans, accepted the campaign

contribution from a Grand Rapids donor, and why it was used to support political campaigns outside Wayne County.


"This huge single contribution, which dwarfs any and all past individual contributions to other local GOP organizations, by itself raises serious questions as to the reason for the donation, and gives good reason for the Democrats to attack our local party," said Berry in the letter. "... you exacerbated the problem and seemingly confirmed the Democrats' potential allegations by spending \$20,000 on four Republican

primary candidates in Ann Arbor Township, where the Wayne 18th has no history of involvement, and no legitimate power to act nor interests to advance."

Berry said there have been complaints filed with the Michigan Secretary of State's office. However, Ann Corgan, director of the compliance and rules division of the Secretary of State's office, said there have been no complaints filed against the Wayne-18th Congressional District Republi-

Millennium church OLGC ready to open new doors

After years of increasing church membership, Our Lady of Good Counsel will dedicate its new church at 5 p.m. Sept. 9 with a Mass and dedication ceremony officiated by Cardinal Adam J. Maida.

Maida has dubbed OLGC his Millennium Church, according to the Rev. John Sullivan, an eight-year pastor at the church.

There's also an open house for the

entire community and area churches 6-8 p.m. Sept. 10. The evening will close with an ecumenical vespers service and all the churches in town will be a part of that, Sullivan said.

Growing membership at the church, which just celebrated its 80th anniversary, has spawned seven churches in the area, Sullivan said.

"We have been making do with what we've got," he said. "Now we're landlocked. As the parish keeps growing, we have had seven parishes break off. This was the mother

church."


The present church seats 900. The new church will hold 1,499 people seated with standing room for about 700. A social hall will hold 500. The footprint for the new building is 56,000 square feet, Sullivan said.

Housed on 37 acres on North Territorial in Plymouth Township, the \$8 million church with social hall and a patio for parties is the eagerly anticipated first phase. The money was raised through parishioner donations, Sullivan said.

"This project has been in the works for 15 years," Sullivan said. "People started collecting money and they were able to pay for the land. They've been working on it ever since. I'm the third pastor to work on this. It's been a long hard process."

Besides Sullivan, OLGC is served by the Revs. Doc Ortman and Eli Saloman.

"For the people here in the parish, we have never had a social hall with a brand new kitchen," Sullivan said. The hall can be used for weddings if the wedding ceremony is held at

Extra siren provides warning

Plymouth Community fire department officials say a new tornado siren will help ensure that most of the city and township will have coverage in case of a natural disaster.

"When the new siren is installed, the seven sirens in the community will cover nearly 90 percent of Plymouth and about 80 percent of Plymouth Township," said Chuck VanVleck, emergency management coordinator.

The \$14,000 siren, which is being funded with federal money, will be placed at the city's Department of Municipal Services yard at Goldsmith and Lena. The city and township will split the cost of installation, along with the cost of testing and maintenance.

Officials are waiting on Detroit Edison to supply power.

The siren is the result of the July

Township gets new fire truck

The new Pierce fire engine that rolled into the Plymouth area Aug. 22 from the Appleton, Wis., plant will be displayed at the City of Plymouth open house held during Fall Festival.

Fire trucks are an infrequent purchase for the Plymouth Community Fire Department. The \$350,000 Pierce model replaces an American LaFrance engine that's 29 years old and cost about \$72,000.

"We take good care of them," said Plymouth Community Fire Chief Larry Groth, whose department serves both the City of Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

The new truck isn't in service yet. "It will take about three weeks to get everything mounted on it," Groth said. "They are working on it every day. There are brackets that have to be mounted, holders and equipment. It's a beautiful rig."

Residents question results of traffic study

Representatives of MAV Development will take a second look at a recently released traffic study for Plymouth Lakes Corporate Park east of Haggerty and south of Five Mile Road.

The 60-acre, \$150 million project proposes an office complex of up to seven buildings and three parking decks.

The traffic study conducted by Ann Arbor-based Midwest Consulting raised questions among residents, who aren't sure the study was com-

plete enough.

"The traffic study in my mind is incomplete," said Jim Anulewicz, Plymouth Township director of public safety. "We want to make sure we have sufficient circulation flow."

Anulewicz told residents who packed St. Kenneth Church Aug. 30 that he is in favor of the project.

Several road improvements are being considered by the applicant. These improvements will be negotiated with Wayne County which has jurisdiction over the roads. They include:

■ At least an additional lane on Haggerty Road to accommodate the large amount of traffic which is expected to head toward Six Mile, where motorists will access I-275.

■ The addition of a left turn signal at the intersection of Haggerty and Five Mile.

■ The addition of the so-called Michigan turnaround at Schoolcraft and Haggerty, where there is a solid median now.

■ Construction of a road extension that would run along the I-275 side of the project and empty onto Schoolcraft Road.

"It's to our advantage to have that traffic drain out of there as quickly as possible," said John Thomas, a Plymouth attorney representing owner Michael Vlasic, who couldn't be at the meeting due to health concerns.

The conceptual plan with considerations is expected to be on the 7:30 p.m. Sept. 12 Plymouth Township board meeting at town hall located at Ann Arbor and Lilley Roads. Site plan details will follow.

Residents Larry Cooper and Ray Sturdy have assumed a liaison role to cooperatively

work with township officials and the developer and keep abreast of project details. A six-person ad hoc committee will be formed for that purpose.

Dawn Rossi, a five-year Lake Pointe resident, had specific concerns about green space provided in the project, traffic and the number of roads within the park. Anulewicz said two lanes would run inside the project.

She wondered if traffic would pose a similar problem to what she experienced on

Un-Chartered waters

Newest school opens its doors on 1st year

They look like construction trailers in the middle of a soybean field as you drive west along Ford in Canton Township, just east of Ridge Road.

A closer look finds a group of modulars connected by walkways, housing Canton Charter Academy, the area's first charter school. It's a temporary facility until a permanent building is ready for the 2001-02 school year.

"Considering the modular units and the late start, we are overwhelmed with the response," said Jeff Poole, vice president of marketing for National Heritage Academies, the for-profit group running the school.

While National Heritage Academies expected 350 students to be on hand for the first day, the actual count was 267 Thursday, the first day. School officials say they're expecting more students next week. The kindergarten through fifth grade academy, because of class size considerations, has a capacity of 405 students.

Each year National Heritage Academies will add a grade to the school, eventually making it a K-8 facility.

"The first day of classes went very well, considering the teachers were only able to get into their classrooms on Tuesday because the modulars had to be cleaned," said Principal Claudia Williamson. "Everything has come together remarkably well. The parents and staff have been so supportive and understanding."

Each of the modulars contains two classrooms. There is a playscape on the property for recess. And there's an asphalt parking lot. It's all surrounded by construction workers doing site preparation for the new building, along with the fields of soybeans.

"A majority of our students will come from the public schools," said Poole. "Last year, throughout our system, eight percent of the

students were home schooled."

Sharon Pastor of Plymouth Township, who had been home schooling her two children, originally enrolled 8-year-old Matthew and 6-year-old Taylor in Plymouth-Canton's Isbister Elementary. However, she changed her mind when the opportunity came to sign up for Canton Charter Academy.

"I like their moral focus, and I like the uniforms. It keeps kids from being so competitive," said Pastor. "This was the first time in a formal school setting for them, and they really liked it."

"It was fun," said Taylor, a first grader.

"We played games and read books."

Mary Shureb brings her 14-year teaching experience to the academy after spending several years at Fairlane Christian School in Dearborn Heights.

"I've taught for a long time and this is the best," said Shureb. "It's very professional, plus the curriculum is brand new and up-to-date. It's not just the basics."

Shureb said she joined National Heritage Academies because the pay was better than a parochial school, and she liked the idea of a retirement program.

cans.

Berry also noted the Washtenaw County Republicans is sending a letter asking Hickey to explain his actions.

"This money was sent into their area, and they had no knowledge of it," said Berry. "We're wondering why money was sent to Republicans to use against Republicans. I still don't have any legitimate answers."

Hickey said those attending a convention of the Wayne 13th Congressional District Republicans earlier this month discussed the issue and put it to bed.

"The issue, as far as I'm concerned, is closed," said Hickey. "We want a major donor program in the Wayne 13th to develop a grass roots effort that can get the job done. And we expect more donations from outside the district. It all spends the same."

Hickey said his bid for the 13th Congress-

sional seat in 1998 gave him a chance to make a number of political contacts, both inside and outside the district, and he'd like to utilize those contacts to bring campaign contributions to the Wayne 13th.

"In two years there will be redistricting, so we want to reach out to good candidates throughout the area," he said. "That's part of our plan, to help develop grass roots campaigns and candidates."

In his letter to Hickey, Berry said "the Wayne 13th has no power or legitimate reason to endorse in local GOP races in Washtenaw County ... In short, we cannot but conclude you are acting either irresponsibly or illegally ... I hereby ... demand your resignation as Chair of the Wayne 13th Congressional District Committee."

Berry, who is running for Congress against Democrat Lynn Rivers, said he isn't

the only one who has concerns about Hickey's actions, but wouldn't reveal names.

"As District Chair, I'm not speaking just about myself, there are others," he said. "We need to address the issue, and if we don't, shame on us."

Hickey insists that "everything we did, and plan to do, went through the executive committee and the full committee."

"The issue was brought up among floor debate at the convention, and no one made a motion or took any action," said Hickey.

"The issue isn't settled," said Berry. "It's out of my hands, but it's not over."

The 13th Congressional District includes a number of Wayne and Washtenaw county communities, including Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Canton Township, Northville, Northville Township, Garden City and Westland.

Back on the field

National champs use band camp to fine tune new show

How do you improve on being the best marching band in the nation? The answer is certainly easier said than done.

"The goal is to improve our performance level, not our placement," said David McGrath, who begins his sixth year as director of the Plymouth-Canton Educational Park Marching Band. "There is nothing to prove to anybody but ourselves."

And the 197-member band appears ready to do just that. They recently returned from a week of intense practice at camp near Traverse City in the Leelanau Peninsula, immediately following a 10-day mini-camp held at the high school.

"We had a great week and the weather was perfect," said Tom Wysocki, band booster president and head counselor for the camp. "The kids learned more than half the drill charts, which Mr. McGrath said was the most they have ever come out of band camp with."

Kristin Putnam, senior color guard member, said the band worked harder than at any other camp she has been a part of in the last four years. "We can't slack off now," she said. "Now that we have won (nationals) there will be more eyes on us."

Last year's band was named Grand National Champions at the end of the three-day competition among 80 of the nation's top high school marching bands. Their 10-minute dramatic performance of *Thought Crime: Music for an*

Orwellian Era also earned them the Class AAA championship along with awards for Outstanding Music Performance, Outstanding Visual Performance, and Outstanding General Effect.

The 1999 competition marked the end of a decade of stellar award-winning performances nationally and statewide for the hometown band.

Always ranking in the top 10 nationally, last year's national championship was the third in the past 10 years for the P-CEP marchers with back-to-back wins in 1990-91.

"There is that sense of déjà vu with the back-to-back championships," said McGrath. Still, he explained, there was more pressure for last year's show after taking second place nationally in 1998.


"I thought we had a monkey on our back last year after winning second the year before," said McGrath. "How do you come up with a show that is better than second place? There was this pressure to stay at that level or to improve."

Now, he believes, there is less pressure. "We are not afraid to take risks and let it all hang out this year." That's just what they are doing production-wise, he said. "This show is amazingly more complex than anything we have ever done."

That's some feat after last year's fast-paced musical marching drama. This year's production, *Reflections: On Obsessions*, is a dramatic commentary on society's obsession with technology and personal appearance, and the aftermath of those obsessions.

The show will be packed with special effects and props, including nearly 40 seven-by-four-foot mirrors, electronic scrolling signboards, and the creation of a landfill 20 feet long and 10 feet high.

"This is, more than any other show since I have been here, a tough one to explain," admitted McGrath. But the band has a national reputation as one that takes controversial and difficult themes and presents them with challenging music, marching and dance.

"Over the years we have evolved from a band that does pieces like Broadway shows, to one that does commentary on society - the civil rights movement, then a 1984-like big brother world," said McGrath. "This year we decided to tell our own story - our view of the way the world is."

He said the show is in five parts with very distinctive music and demanding drills. "Normally we have 90-100 drill counts in a show," McGrath explained. "This year there will be 130. It is a demanding and powerful show and incredibly fast-paced."

He added that the visual demand is what will take the audience by surprise.

"I think it will be a real treat for the audience, not just to watch and listen to, but to personalize and try to understand. I really think this will be a crowd favorite."

Firefighters think so, too, and reportedly they all want the big, shiny truck at their station.

"We can't split it up three ways," Groth said. The truck is at Fire Station Three at North Territorial and Beck Roads. It will be permanently housed at Fire Station Two at Schoolcraft and Wilcox.

The new rig has many new features not found in the old LaFrance fire truck. Headsets help screen the deafening noise of the siren and air horn. "They've proven that it can do some real damage to your ears," Groth said. "The headset" allows you to talk to the firefighter next to you and also allows you to talk to dispatch. This is a new concept. I think we should put it in all the rigs."

The law requires that no firefighter ride on the tailgate of the truck. "Now your cab has to be totally closed," Groth said. Six can ride in the new truck, which also has more head room. Doors roll up. There're no hinges. "We won't have doors busted off when we are going out of the station," Groth said. "It's happened before."

Trays slide out and hold tools. "In our old truck, there are no such things as a slide out tray," Groth said. "All these compartments have lights. That helps especially when it's dark out and you are looking for a specific tool."

Ladders and poles are enclosed in compartments, protecting them from ice and snow.

A portable foam tank is also a welcome addition for the firefighters, who used to come back to the station to fill them. "We can fill about 80 bottles at the scene of the fire," Groth said. "We filled about 15 the other night at a house fire."

What will happen to the old truck? It may be sold to a collector. It's worth about \$5,000, Groth said.

Groth is also contemplating asking the Plymouth Township board to approve donating the old truck to the Schoolcraft College Fire Academy. "They could use it for training all the new recruits," he said.

Ironically, as Groth was showing off the new truck, George Lasecki, a Highland resident and collector who owns two fire trucks, paid an impromptu visit to Fire Station Three wondering when bids would go out to purchase the old truck.

"We like to play with them," said Lasecki, who's never been a firefighter. "We have a good time with them. My son bought an old dairy farm in the thumb."

One of Lasecki's trucks is a 1927 Seagrave pumper truck used in Royal Oak; the other is a 1965 American LaFrance, Lasecki said. He said he heard about the truck through a newspaper article.

Halyard two years ago and suggested that a survey be done. "Turning left on Halyard from Beck Road, you could not get out. People were creating accidents," Rossi said.

She cited the frustration of employees trying to leave Halyard when there was only one lane out of the industrial subdivision. "If someone was waiting to make a left turn and someone wanted to go right, they couldn't leave," she said.

People might take more chances going left on Halyard from the project. She suggested a stop light at the project entrance on Halyard. A stop light could be evaluated with the activated only during certain times of the day.

Besides the Plymouth Lakes Corporate Park project, Burton-Hatman Development Co. wants to build a \$50 million, 200,000-square-foot office park on 21 acres on Haggerty, north of Five Mile in Northville Township, according to published reports. The developer purchased part of the Golden Bear Golf Center in Northville Township.

OLGC, he said.

Phase 2 will include the administration building, the gym and meeting rooms.

The third phase of the project, a new school, is expected in about 10 years, Sullivan said. The present school has 567 students.

Come December the renovation of the present church will begin to enlarge the school with four classrooms, a science and arts lab and a music room. "That will open up four classrooms in the main school and will give us a chance to start a kindergarten and add a first, second, and third grade," Sullivan said.

Prominent OLGC parishioners include Wayne County Executive Ed McNamara and Michigan Attorney General Jennifer Granholm.

Features in the first building include:

- A baptismal font with a fountain, pool and river. The baptism areas are for infants, older children and adults. Baptism is by full immersion.

- A tower with a red beacon of light.

- Windows with bits of stained glass.

- A handicapped-accessible entrance.

- A large gathering area. The new church organ will be ready in 2002. The old church organ will go to St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish and will be reworked.

- A layout that allows sight of the entire assembly. "We kept a lot of the shrubbery and the trees and built the church right into the side of the hill," Sullivan said. "From the road, the church looks very people-friendly."

Some observers have complained about the long walk from the parking lot to the church.

"The idea is that as you walk closer to church, you put all the stuff behind you," Sullivan said.

The building was built on 13 pillars but there's no superstition attached to the number. "We're redeeming the number 13," Sullivan said. "It represents the 12 apostles and Christ."

The Stations of the Cross will be brought from the present church. A large 15-by-11 foot cedar cross will also be added at the church.

There's also a historical feature outside the church.

Referencing Plymouth historian Sam Hudson's accounts, Sullivan pointed out a circle of trees, the so-called Cooper's Corner. "Chief Tonquish had a ceremonial area in this area," Sullivan said. "Those trees are pretty big and they are all in a big circle, so that could be it."

Sullivan decided to leave that wooded area untouched. "We cannot touch those trees," Sullivan said. "If it is ancient burial ground ... let's just build away from it. Let's leave it."

1997 fire which destroyed 35th District Court in Plymouth. Heavy storms and high winds ripped through the area, causing power lines to fall on the roof, starting the blaze.

Michigan was declared a federal disaster area after tornados destroyed many areas in metro Detroit, uprooted trees and caused other damage.

"As a result of being declared a disaster area, we received an opportunity to enhance our ability

to prevent that building from being destroyed again," said VanVleck. "The city applied for another siren as a deterrent to it happening again, and the feds agreed."

VanVleck said the new siren is electronic and will have a battery backup.

"That way if we lose electricity it will still work," he said. "All the other sirens are mechanical and require electricity to function."

"Before we had to depend on wind direction in hoping everyone could hear the emergency siren," said Acting City Manager Paul Sincock. "This will give us coverage for most of our residents."



Emergency sirens are tested every first Saturday of the month at 1 p.m. Sincock said he expects the new siren to be ready for the October test.

Commissioner criticizes plan to build hotel on county land

The plan to construct an \$80 million Westin Hotel at Wayne County Detroit Metropolitan Airport's new midfield terminal would be a first-class package for airport passengers, but may leave the city of Romulus at a financial loss according to Commissioner John J. Sullivan, D-Wayne.

"(The county) keeps building these things on city property and it's not beneficial to the people of Romulus," Sullivan said. "Every time the county takes land away from the city, they are hurting Romulus."

Since the Westin Hotel is being constructed on the airport's property, the county, not Romulus, will keep the tax revenues from the new hotel and Sullivan feels it could also take business away from existing Romulus hotels near the airport.

So far, Sullivan has been unsuccessful at trying to make property concessions to benefit the city with this project.

"This will be good for the airport, but it's not really helping the city," Sullivan said.

The nine floor, 404-room hotel complete with a fine dining restaurant, fitness center, ballroom, pool, spa, meeting rooms and an executive conference center will be integrated directly

into the new midfield terminal.

The \$1.2 billion midfield terminal, which includes 72 jet and 25 commuter gates and more than 11,000 indoor parking spaces, is scheduled to open in December 2001 with Northwest Airlines as its main tenant.

The county and Detroit Metro Airport, however, don't view the new hotel as a financial threat to the city of Romulus.

"We feel it's important to have an upscale hotel as a part of this new facility," said Michael Conway of Detroit Metro Airport.

Although Romulus won't receive any property taxes from the hotel, it is able to charge a personal property tax on the hotel's equipment. Romulus currently collects personal property taxes from the Marriott Hotel located on the airport's property, Conway said.

But the Westin Hotel, set to open as early as December 2002, has yet to be approved by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners. So an estimate for the personal property taxes Romulus will receive has yet to be determined.

The official recommendation by Wayne County's Department of Airports and Northwest Airlines for the Starwood Hotels & Resorts Worldwide, Inc. and Darryl Berger Companies, Inc. to

design, build and operate the hotel will be given to the county board by Sept. 14 with a final approval expected by the county board as early as Sept. 21.

The hotel construction would begin shortly after its final approval by the county.

"When (the airport) wants my vote in the future, they'll need to make more concessions for the city," Sullivan said.

Concept planning and solicitation for a midfield terminal hotel began over two years ago with Starwood beating out Marriott Hotels and Resorts with more upscale accommodations and facilities.

The county plans to sell bonds to cover the cost of the construction and they will be repaid with the hotel's revenues.

Airport opens new parking lot

A new 1,000 space, long-term economy parking lot was opened at Wayne County's Detroit Metro Airport on Thursday before its Labor Day deadline bringing the number of on-site parking spaces to over 13,600.

The construction plans for Green Lot No. 2, located on the airport's northeast side next to the Northwest Airlines freight building, were announced just three months ago, when parking at the airport was at a maximum due to heavy seasonal travel.

Construction for the new lot,

built on 300,000 square feet of property, was managed jointly by Northwest Airlines and Wayne County.

It was built at an estimated cost of \$1.5 million.

Green Lot No. 2 will serve as an interim parking improvement for the airport until the new midfield terminal opens December 2001 with a new 10-story deck with 11,500 parking spaces. Now under construction, the new deck is the largest parking structure in the world ever built at one time.



Whalers are missing

Is this a mutiny or what?
The Plymouth Whalers opened training camp last Wednesday, but 10 of their key players were absent. That's not the kind of start the defending regular-season champ in the Ontario Hockey League expects.

And it's something that's never happened to the Whalers before. Usually, they might be missing four or five players.

As you may have guessed, these absences were with coach/general manager Pete DeBoer's approval. All 10 were attending, or were invited to attend, NHL camps.

"It's always nice to have this many players being recognized as NHL prospects," said DeBoer. "I think it's a credit to our organization and our coaching staff."

Of the 10, six had been drafted in the NHL entry draft last June, two others had been drafted in 1999, and two more were walk-ons. The rookie camps will conclude next week, with most of the players returning to the Whalers.

However, some of them may be invited to stay for the NHL team's mini-camp.

Current Whalers at an NHL camp are:

• **Rob Zepp, goalie:** Zepp blossomed last season, playing in 48 games and posting a 32-10 record with a .903 save percentage and a 2.37 goals-against average. Zepp was drafted in the first round in 1999 by the Atlanta Thrashers.

• **Justin Williams, right wing:** Williams led the Whalers with 72 points last season, tying for the team lead in both goals scored (32) and assists (40). He was drafted by the Philadelphia Flyers.

• **Libor Ustrnul, defense:** Born in the Czech Republic, Ustrnul came to the Whalers through the 1999 European draft. His size and skills were instrumental in the Whalers' playoff run; he finished with 14 assists. Ustrnul was also drafted by Atlanta.

• **Tomas Kurka, left wing:** Another Czech-born player, Kurka proved to be a pure goal-scorer. His speed helped him tie for the team lead in goals scored (32); he totaled 58 points. Carolina drafted him this summer.

• **Kris Vernarsky, center:** A native of Warren, Vernarsky — drafted by the Whalers in the first round in 1998 — was a defensive checking forward, assigned to the opposition's top scoring threat. He had 14 goals and 21 assists, and was drafted by Toronto this summer.

• **Stephen Morris, right wing:** Another speedy forward, Morris finished with 11 goals and 17 assists last season. He has walked on with the Chicago Blackhawks.

• **Andre Robichaud, defense:** Robichaud has proven to be a solid two-way defenseman, totaling two goals and six assists while displaying his mobility. He has walked on with Carolina.

• **Damian Surma, left wing/center:** A native of Lincoln Park, Surma was second on the Whalers in scoring with 70 points, tying for the team lead in goals scored with 32. Drafted by the Carolina Hurricanes, Surma is still recovering from a knee injury suffered in last year's OHL finals.

• **Jared Newman, defense:** Another Lincoln Park native, Newman made his presence known as a big (6-foot-2, 200 pounds) physical defenseman. Carolina drafted him in the fourth round last June.

• **Nate Kiser, defense:** At 6-1, 190, Kiser has both size and skill. He had three goals and five assists last season, and was drafted by Phoenix in June.

While the Plymouth Canton junior varsity football team was dominating its season-opening opponent, the Ypsilanti Braves, in posting a 34-0 triumph, the Canton freshmen were struggling. The outcome, however, was the same — a win, by a 20-14 count.

Canton earns 2nd-straight win by crushing Farmington, 48-21

Almost 30 minutes after their game at Farmington High had ended Friday night, members of the Plymouth-Canton football team trudged through a darkened parking lot in search of their late-arriving bus.

It turned out to be the first and only time all night the Chiefs would be slowed down.

Paced by senior tailback Jerry Gaines' 252 yards rushing and four touchdowns, Canton cruised by the Falcons, 48-21, to improve to 2-0. The loss dropped Farmington to 0-2.

"Jerry was excellent tonight," said Canton coach Tim Baechler. "Farmington was determined to stop our off-tackle plays, so he was able to get outside on the sweeps. Once he turned the corner, nobody was going to catch him."

Gaines, who averaged 25.2 yards a carry, scored on runs of 55, 80, 5 and 58 yards.

As a team, the Chiefs steamrolled their way to 451 yards rushing and 480 total yards.

Both teams played hot potato with the ball, turning the pigskin over five times each. The turnover-fest was a recurring nightmare for Farmington coach John Bechtel, who watched his team give the ball away five times last week against Northville.

"You can not turn the ball over consistently like we're doing and expect to win," Bechtel stressed. "Turnovers are the number one statistic out there when it comes to deciding who wins and who loses, and it's a stat we're not doing very well in. We will continue to work hard, though, and we will get better."

For the second straight week Canton set the tone early, scoring on the fourth play of the

game when Gaines took an Oliver Wolcott pitch and galloped 55 yards. Junior kicker Brady Burns' extra point made it 7-0 1:09 into the game.

It took the Falcons one offensive play to set the tone for their night: Following a fifty 6-yard run, running back Mike Peterson fumbled the ball away to Canton's Mike Tolhurst.

Two plays later, the Chiefs returned the favor when Wolcott mishandled the center snap and the Falcons' Mike Griffie recovered on the Farmington 33-yard line.

The Falcons capitalized on the miscue, moving the ball 67 yards on seven plays before scoring on Peterson's 1-yard dive. Stephen Wayne's first of three extra points knotted the game at 7-7 with 7:20 left in the first quarter.

Less than a minute later, the Falcons forced another turnover when cornerback Matthew Mikel picked off a Wolcott pass and returned it to the Canton 39-yard line.

Two plays later, the Falcons' Preston Picard ramblled 35 yards through the heart of the Chiefs' defense to make it 14-7.

The good news for the Falcons: They had the lead for the first time. The bad news: Gaines would get the ball back.

Starting at their own 20 after Wayne's kick-off sailed through the end zone, Gaines took a Wolcott hand-off, faked inside then darted outside and sprinted 80 yards for his second score. The run was capped by a get-out-of-my-way stiff arm at the Falcon 20-yard line.

Canton regained the lead minutes later following — you guessed it — a turnover.

Chief defensive back Bill Gazsi picked off a Brett Brown pass with 3:59 left in the first

Said Canton coach Bob Blohm: "You look at the game, and our kids just hung in there and persevered."

Certainly the Chiefs earned the victory. Going into the season, Blohm knew scoring could be a problem; the Chiefs had nearly everyone back from last season's squad (which had trouble scoring), but noticeably missing was leading scorer Janine Guastella, still recovering from a knee injury suffered last spring.

How much do they miss Guastella? Well, Canton's has now gone two games without anyone reaching double figures in points.

On the next play, he found running back Brian Tomlinna wide open over the middle for a 35-yard touchdown. An extra point made it 7-0 at 7:28 of the first quarter.

Salem's first drive wasn't as successful.

Rocks' quarterback David Hoskins, a sophomore, got things started with a 14-yard run on a keeper. Salem ran three more plays before being forced to punt from its own 49-yard line.

The quarter ended with Walled Lake up 7-0. The Warriors began their second scoring drive with 2:18

to go in the quarter, however.

Ziem capped a 16-play, 8:28 drive with an 8-yard touchdown run to make it 14-0. He completed four passes in the drive as well.

Most of Salem's offense came on one play late in the second quarter. Senior running back Brandon Ellison broke into the clear then outraced several Warrior defenders for an 82-yard touchdown run at the 2:07 mark.

Moshimer said the play was typical of his team's performance.

"We played well in spurts," he commented. "But we can't find

one must consider the teams at the top of the WLAA last season — Walled Lake Central, Livonia Stevenson and North Farmington — have suffered considerable losses.

Gone are superstars Todd Mobley of Central and Charlie Stamboulia of North. Teams to watch now in the WLAA race seem to be Livonia Churchill, fourth last season and winner of last week's Livonia city meet, and Walled Lake Western, which returns Kevin Naughton from its fifth-place squad.

"I think we can throw our hat into the ring with five or six other teams," said Salem coach Geoff Baker.

Added Canton's Boyd, "The kids are setting their goals high. They think they have a chance to slip in there."

They may both be right.

Plymouth Canton

The results of Thursday's season-opening Red Hawk Invitational, a five-team meet hosted by Troy Athens, was certainly

encouraging for the Chiefs. That's because they won it.

"We had a great day, we took seven of the 15 medals," said Boyd.

With 14 runners placing in the top 10, optimism has to soar. Leading Canton are team captains Jon Mikosz, who placed third Thursday, Scott Gillen, who was fourth, and Marty Kane, who finished seventh. All are seniors.

Next on the list were juniors Brandon McClellon, who took ninth, and Pat Pruitt, who was 11th, with senior Ryan Stanko 13th and sophomore Jon Western 14th.

"We have as much depth as anybody," said Boyd. "We just don't have a true frontrunner. We should be able to compete really well."

"The key is going to be staying healthy. Our top seniors are going to have to step up and challenge seniors from other teams."

Others to watch for Canton are junior Ross O'Hara, senior Brian

Antonucci, who worked out all through the summer, and sophomore transfer Aaron Lanning, who attended Westland Huron Valley Lutheran last year and has posted impressive times.

Lanning currently is struggling with shin splints and won't be able to compete for perhaps another week.

Staying healthy is something Kane could give a dissertation on. A promising 800-meters runner in track, he was out all of last season with what was originally thought to be a stomach muscle tear but was finally diagnosed as a hernia.

Surgery cured the problem, and Kane has returned "more excited than anyone."

The question now is how well will Canton fare against division rivals like Western and Churchill? And that may depend on how quickly, or if, the Chiefs can develop a couple of runners capable of finishing in the top 10 individually at major invitationals.

Plymouth Salem

"We didn't have a very successful season," said Salem's Baker in summing up 1999. "But that's life after a season with the studs we had two years ago."

Gill and Bolger placed in the top 43 for Salem at last year's WLAA meet. While their loss hurts, the returnees — led by Warner — bolster the Rocks' hopes.

Warner, now a senior, ran a 17:22 at the WLAA meet last year, then followed it with a state-qualifying performance of 16:50 at the regional meet. At the state finals, he finished 41st in 16:32.

"He's our frontrunner," said Baker simply. Should Warner's times continue to drop as they did at the close of the '99 campaign, Salem's hopes could escalate.

There is a solid supporting cast, with seniors Rob Showalter, Greg Kubitski and Kurt Sarsfield. All three ran varsity last season, with Kubitski and Showalter placing in the top 36 at the WLAA's.

Beyond that, Baker will be looking at a group of promising sophomores for support. Dave Anderson, Justin Hajduk, Jim Leddy, Adam Warner and Chris Vraniak all could contribute immediately.


"With those guys, we're going to try and build back some of that old glory," said Baker.

"I think we're right there. If we can win our division, do well in the league, then maybe sneak into the state meet and show (the underclassmen) what it's like, give them a taste . . . That's our goal."

Stevenson remains the major obstacle in the Lakes Division, but North could bounce back from the loss of Stamboulia, and Farmington — which was seventh, just behind Salem, at the WLAA meet last year — is building something, too.

"We have to stay healthy," Baker said. "It doesn't look to be a problem — we have 10 guys vying for the top seven spots — but you never can anticipate injuries."

If Warner can lead them and the sophomores develop quickly, Salem just may make a return trip to the top of the Lakes Division.

Mosquitoes don't enhance hike in woods

After walking through the forests and fields this summer, and being bombarded by pesky insects, I have a lot more sympathy for deer and other animals that do not have a place to hide from these creatures.

We have all felt the sting of mosquitoes this summer. No matter what time of day you venture outside, they find you. Their heat seeking sensors and carbon dioxide detectors combine to direct them to you in a matter of moments.

Sixty-four species have been identified in the Great Lakes area. Different species are active at different times of the day.

Though all mosquitoes have to lay their eggs in water or moist areas so their young can develop in water, they frequent various areas. Some lay their eggs in pitcher plants and are immune to the digestive juices of the plant. The northern house mosquito overwinters as an adult and can be seen in homes any time of the year.

Mosquitoes are members of the fly family. All flies have only two wings for flying. The second pair of wings is modified into structures called halteres. They look like a ball stuck on the end of a stick. Their function is to vibrate with the wings and provide information on the position of the insect during flight.

If you want to see them, look in the wing pits of a crane fly. Crane flies are those large, long legged, delicate insects that look like mosquitoes that got too close to a nuclear plant.

Along woodland trails deer flies are also pesky. Deer flies are not much bigger than a house fly. They are tan with some dark brown spots on the body, but the dark patches are more noticeable on the wings.

Those that bother me spend most of the time buzzing around my head. It's hard to know when they land and are ready to bite.

Females take a bite of skin to draw blood. Protein in blood helps the females to develop eggs. Males eat pollen and nectar. Like mosquitoes, deer fly females must lay their eggs in water.

Occasionally I have the satisfaction of observing a dragonfly feasting on a deer fly. One less to both me or a local deer.

Though a few insects bother me and others who enjoy the trails in summer, they do serve a purpose, other than a gadfly. As larvae they serve as food for larger predaceous aquatic animals. Adults are food for a variety of birds and other insects.

I wish a large flycatcher would have been around to deter the warble fly that was buzzing me on the way to a favorite fishing lake. These flies are large, about an inch long, and very robust.

Females search for warm blooded animals, like deer on which to lay their eggs. If a female warble fly is successful in laying an egg on the skin of a mammal, the larvae will hatch out and immediately proceed to burrow under the skin.

Some species enter the mammal's body through the nose, travel inside the body until they settle near the back of the animal. Once settled under the skin, the larvae mature and create a large wart.

Upon maturity, the larvae burrow out, fall to the ground, pupate, and later emerge as an adult. This was one insect I did not want to have on me very long.

These flies are similar to each other in many ways, but they have developed different strategies for survival.



Despite the sacks, Brown turned in an impressive night, completing 10-of-19 passes for 162 yards. Peterson was the Falcons' leading ground-gainer, racking up 45 yards on eight carries before injuring his ankle late in the third quarter.

Gaines wasn't the only Chief runner to shine. Wilcox rushed for 77 yards on three carries while Fuller netted 76 yards in 16 attempts.

Canton compiled 11 first downs compared to Farmington's nine.



ARTHRITIS AND FATIGUE


However, what if your arthritis, under treatment, improves but your fatigue continues. What is the reason, and what can you do about it?



Farmington Players set stage for future

I know exactly how the Farmington Players are feeling after recently moving out of the barn theater they occupied on 12 Mile for more than 40 years. For the last three weeks I've been working out of boxes in cramped quarters because the main office of the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers in Livonia is undergoing renovations.

While the Players temporary theater at Barnes & Noble Booksellers on Orchard Lake Road in West Bloomfield is expansive and everything the players could ask for, storage space is nil so all of the props, costumes and everything else is stored in president Mary Ann Tweedie's basement. But Tweedie and Players board members Phil Hadley and Cynthia Tupper agree the new \$1.5 million barn theater is worth the wait.

New theater

When it's completed in time for the opening of the 2001-2002 season, the new theater, located on the site of the old barn, will expand seating to 240 from 170. A 15 percent larger stage will allow for interchangeable sets and enough space offstage for actors waiting to come on. And the barrier

free design will make Players' productions accessible to persons with disabilities for the first time. In the meantime, their temporary digs are airy and climate-controlled, unlike the old barn where audiences froze in winter and sweltered in summer.

"This is perfect for us because it's still an intimate setting," said Tupper. "It's a huge gift to the players. We debated whether we should temporarily move out of Farmington, but we're hoping to attract more people from West Bloomfield, and this space is a great fit."

While the temporary location may expand the Players' audiences, Hadley fears the move could have a downside.


"I don't know how people are going to find us," said Hadley, a West Bloomfield resident and Livonia businessman. "Are we going to lose our audience? We know after Farmington and Farmington Hills, our next biggest block of season ticket holders come from West Bloomfield. We hope to attract a West Bloomfield crowd and still keep the audience we've built up over the years."

The new season, opening with Neil Simon's *Fools* Sept. 22, should attract new audiences as well as please the old. When *Fools* closes Oct. 14, James Goldman's *The Lion in Winter* (Nov. 17-Dec. 9) will keep audiences on the edge of their seats listening to every word as King Henry II and his wife battle over which of their sons will inherit the throne. Dorothy Macardie's novel about a ghost comes to life in *The Uninvited*, a play by Tim Kelly and Don Macardie Feb. 2-24. The season ends with a dark comedy about the struggles of prisoners of war during World War II in *Stalag 17* (April 27-May 19).

Attracting theatergoers

As a way of attracting theatergoers and new members before the season opens, the Players will hold a membership meeting and a workshop production of *A Skull in Connemara* 8 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 16, at Barnes & Noble Booksellers, and it's all free.

Religious art is making a resurgence. Churches are commissioning more original art, and moving away from using mass produced statues, a trend begun more than 40 years ago.

For a millennium, the subject of nearly all art was religious. Not until the late 16th century did artists such as Caravaggio begin to create imagery focusing on subjects other than the divine. As a result, religious art remained out of favor for the last few centuries. It's only in the last 20 years artists have begun to re-examine religious and spiritual dimensions in their work.

Barbara Demgen couldn't be happier. In her more than 30-year career as an artist, the Livonia resident has seen few original works of religious art or exhibits focusing on that theme. That's why she's delighted her color pencil drawing of the Madonna University chapel was chosen for the 48-piece *Sacred Encounter* exhibit at St. John Center for Youth & Family in Plymouth Sept. 6-17. Presented by the Archdiocese of Detroit as part of their Eucharistic Congress 2000, the ecclesiastical art display features painting, pastel, oil crayon, clay, photography, stained glass, and sculpture. Viewers expecting to see traditional religious art won't be disappointed, but abstract paintings, assemblages and large-scale sculpture will inspire them to think about the subject in a new light.

Wheaton, director of cultural affairs for the city of Detroit, selected the work for the exhibit from 150 entries.

"I'm interested in seeing the other works in the show," said Demgen, who retired as a visual arts teacher for the Creative and Performing Arts program in Livonia Public Schools in 1992. "I've never been in an art show like this before. I'd like to see what other artists are doing."

While Demgen primarily creates florals, genre scenes and landscapes in watercolor, she would probably do more religious art if there were opportunities to show it. Demgen enjoyed laying down the pastel colors for the chapel where she finds serenity.

"I go to Mass at the chapel with my husband, Jim, and I just love it," said Demgen. "It's like being in another world, another country. I was raised a Catholic, but I see God in so many other areas, I see

a spiritual experience in nature. The Grand Canyon was one of the most religious experiences I've ever had."

Transformations/Conversations

Nancy Thayer eliminates all literal reference in the landscape paintings from her *Transformations/Conversations* series. Three of the works, in which Thayer struggles with questions about life and death, were chosen for the exhibit. Like Demgen, Thayer is an established artist, represented by the Poerner Gallery in Birmingham and Sherry Washington Gallery in Detroit. She's exhibited her work as close to home as the Robert Kidd Gallery in Birmingham and as far away as Italy, The Netherlands and Germany.


"It had to do with metaphysical concepts dealing with truth and reality, questions about life. What is reality? What is illusion?" said Thayer, a Lathrup Village artist. "I'm a deeply religious person and was raised in the Birmingham Christian Science Church. At that time I was questioning what I believed. Is there life after death? Is matter all there is, or is there something spiritual?"

Light shines through the darkness of *Guidance III* and throws reflections onto the mountainous masses emerging from the horizon.

"As you approach the work, you see there's a lot of color and activity going on in those areas," said Thayer. "And it's the light that allows you to focus on these."

The architecture and changing landscape of Woodward Avenue probably defines the infamous boulevard as much as our journeys on it, both today and back when cruising the strip was recreational.

"It's art history," said Marilyn Zimmerman, the producer and director of *Past Visions, Present Insights: The Woodward Avenue Rephotographic Project*, a photographic exhibit of Woodward Avenue images.

Comprised of more than 100 photographs from both public and private collections, the exhibit is on display in Alger Hall at the Detroit Historical Museum through September of next year.

"It shows us what has been lost and is still present, what we need, where we gather, how we celebrate and

what are the day-to-day details that we still celebrate," said Zimmerman, an associate professor in the Department of Art and Art History at Wayne State University.

While Zimmerman's thoughts might sound a bit heavy, what she means is that photographs, by virtue of being "touchstones for memory," remind us of the mood, energy and occurrences of particular time periods. And, since the exhibit she developed contains photographs of Woodward Avenue architecture and scenes from the past and more recent times, Zimmerman believes it serves as a vehicle for contrast and comparison.

Photographs in *Past Visions* and *Present Insights* span 100 years with the oldest image dating back to

Russell Thayer's religious beliefs developed after his marriage to Nancy. An accomplished sculptor, Russell exhibits his brass and cast-bronze *Mysterious Altar*.

"It's a combination of a lot of pieces," said Russell, who taught art history at Delta College for 37 years. "There's several references to art history and includes pieces created more than 30 years ago. I keep putting them on a workbench and rearranging them. It combines the past and present. Your present is made up of little pieces of the past, and sometimes they all come together."

er."

Like Demgen, Russell enjoyed assembling *Mysterious Altar* and would like to create more work in the same vein. He hopes the *Sacred Encounter* exhibit becomes an annual event.

"I don't think there's been a lot of good ecclesiastical work recently," said Russell. "It's all derivative. The other aspect of religious art is an artist isn't going to use the imagery unless it comes from a deep faith. If this becomes an annual event, artists can look forward to something. They'll be planning it in the back

of their head all year long."

Exhibit chairman Alexander Sebastian isn't sure if there will be an exhibit next year, but the Archdiocese might consider doing it every other year.

"It's a wonderful opportunity for artists to express not only their artistic talents but faith," said Sebastian, a Livonia resident and member of St. Edith Catholic Church in Livonia. "There's not many opportunities so the artists were really excited to exhibit and we hope that many families will be able to experience the art. People don't

have much of an opportunity to view religious art."

The lack of venues for showing religious art is the reason Daniel McAfee wanted to present the exhibit. As director of department of parish life and office for Christian worship for the Archdiocese of Detroit, McAfee works with parishes on renovations for which artists are frequently commissioned.

"Although I touch just a handful of artists, I know there's a lot of them out there doing this," said McAfee. "I'm just real excited about it. It's the first time

we've done it, and it shows there's a lot of people working out there to express their faith. We're also trying to expose people to what's going on in the art scene in the Archdiocese of Detroit."

Eucharistic Congress

The art exhibit is a small part of the Eucharistic Congress, a celebration of faith Sept. 14-17. On Saturday-Sunday, Sept. 15-16, youths and families will be able to listen to reflective talks, attend religious services and Eucharistic exposition, and enjoy

musical presentations ranging from Celtic to African as well as view the art exhibit. The congress begins with Cardinal Adam Maida rededicating the chapel at St. John on Sept. 6. An outdoor Mass will be Sunday, Sept. 17 at the former seminary.

"The chapel will be open around the clock, and people will be able to pray before the blessed sacrament. We hope they take that energy back to parishes," said McAfee. "We thought the art exhibit would add a nice touch to that. It adds a visual, tangible element for people to reflect on their faith."

"It's fairly macabre; it's about Irish rural people and it shows them as eccentric," said Hadley.

"It's funny, poignant and startling."

The opportunity to act or direct season productions and workshops are just two of the

benefits of joining the Farmington Players. A bargain at \$40, the year's membership includes one free ticket to each of the season's shows.

"I've made a lot of friends during my 11 years with the Players. We take annual trips to Stratford together, and this year 10 or 11 of us went to New York to see shows," said Tweedie, who's currently in rehearsals for *Fools*, a comic fable about a town in Russia. "We're always looking for creative people to work on sets, sew costumes and become one of us."

"Another way people can help

is with in-kind gifts," added Hadley. "Panasonic gave us a photo copier, but we need countertops, cabinets and a computer for the new theater. It's a significant amount of help that companies can give us that really doesn't cost that much."

Helping hand

This is the first time a performance will be held on the stage at Barnes & Noble even though the space was committed to presenting community events in 1995. Janice Keramedjian, district manager for Barnes & Noble in eastern Michigan, is

enthusiastic about the possibility of other community groups using the space. She's open to ideas and can be reached at (248) 932-6867.

"We always wanted to do it but we've had our hands full running a 35,000 square foot book store," said Keramedjian. "We want it to be a viable part of community theater. The biggest benefit will be the exposure of Farmington Players season ticket holders to our store. This is great. We're excited when you see the good it's going to do in the community."

The Players still have a way to go before work can begin on the new theater so they can eventu-

ally move out of the temporary space. They're currently three-quarters of the way to meeting their goal of \$1.5 million and are planning a golf outing in spring to raise more money.

Before the old barn is demolished, though, the Players are talking about holding one last fund-raiser there. A haunted house is sure to scare people into taking an interest in the new theater. If you'd like to help, call the Farmington Players at (248) 553-2955.

1862.

The newest photograph chronicles Detroit Tigers fans walking along Woodward Avenue after a game at Comerica Park.

Several photographs allow museum visitors to witness the transformation of buildings and spaces. For instance, a French Chateau-style castle first known as the Hecker House — back when Woodward Avenue had a mansion row — is documented in its original state, as well as at later times under different owners. The building later housed Smiley Bros. Pianos. Currently, it is a law firm.

Another example is a building currently occupied by Barry's Hamburgers. In the '20s, it housed White Tower Hamburgers. In between, Harry's Dairy did business there. "That's a wonderful transformation ... the idea that it maintained itself as a diner," said Zimmerman. "Seeing that evolution is very interesting."

Zimmerman, a resident of Ferndale who practically lives on Woodward Avenue, developed the exhibit in 1989, making changes and updates — and lecturing about the photographs — over the last 10 years. The Detroit News' recent donation of its photo archives up to 1984 to Wayne State University and other offerings has allowed for some wonderful additions to *Past Visions and Present Insights*.






"It's sort of like Garanamals (a mix and match children's line) for men." Stokes also adds that both three- and four-button suits are 'in' this season.

Make home shipshape with accessories

The cottage look is a hot trend in home decorating and nautical themes are "in" as a popular accent.

"There are a lot of furniture companies that have dedicated designs to (the nautical) theme," says Linda Thomas, an interior designer and president of the Michigan Chapter of the American Society of Interior Designers.

Leonard Xerri's New England Home stores combine both trends. Xerri, (pronounced "Sherry"), sells the kind of nautical trappings that can give even the most land-locked house the feel and look of a rustic lakeside retreat.

Xerri credits his business expansion to the popularity of nautical trends. He has opened New England Home stores in Great Lakes Crossing, Auburn Hills and recently at Lakeside Mall, Sterling Heights. He'll open another early next month in Twelve Oaks Mall in Novi and he's eyeing a site in Briarwood Mall, Ann Arbor.

"Nautical for the first time in 10 years has become a staple in the home accessory diet," he said.

Xerri, a Macomb County native, has

distributed nautical products throughout the country for years, but opened retail stores within the past few years.

His stores carry functional nautical brass telescopes, sextants and compasses for the avid boater, as well as the classic looks associated with boating off Cape Cod and other older fishing and vacation communities on the east coast.

Specialty items include an array of wood carvings, sepia-tone photographs, carved mahogany ships with brass and copper trim, distressed leather steamer trunks and Maine-made lamps. Fish nets, decorated with matching ornaments, are meant to hang on walls.

New England Home stores also sport authentic items, such as the 160-year-old cashier wrap desk and 130-year-old, Cape Cod floorboards at the Great Lakes Crossing store.

He says customers decorate everything from offices to children's bedrooms in nautical and seaside themes.

"People find the cottage look a relaxing design and subsequently the nautical theme comes from that," Thomas explained.

Xerri says his store aims to make

shoppers feel as though they are visiting Cape Cod or Nantucket years ago. It takes them "away from the 21st century hustle and bustle."

"This is the kind of store your great-grandfather knew and treasured," he said.

And Xerri keeps the do-it-yourself decorator in mind by offering color-coordinated merchandise.

"Everything here from the \$6 ornaments to our \$900 large pond yachts are all color-coordinated," he noted. "And, we've got something for everybody."

Store locations

The newest store, opened last month, is nearly 900 square feet and is located in a prime spot in the lower level of Lakeside Mall, next to Hudson's.

The retailer is closing his Macomb Mall and Laurel Park Place locations and going into

Lakeside, Twelve Oaks and Briarwood.

"These centers were all looking the same so we add to the mix to keep the centers looking different," Xerri explained.

He said the store's nautical theme fits in with Lakeside's name and its proximity to Lake St. Clair.

"There are more boats registered in Michigan than in Massachusetts, Florida and California combined," he added.

Xerri, a graduate of the Pratt Institute in New York, began his business when he visited a fellow graduate in the Philippines. He met resident Americans there who needed a U.S. distributor for products they were selling worldwide.

That's where Xerri came in. "Now my business is only six years old and this year we should make more than \$2 million (in sales)," he said.

He also designs many of the products himself.



Plymouth couple take long journey down under

When the summer Olympics begin a few days from now in Sydney, Australia, a Plymouth couple can watch the TV coverage of the famous continent and say "been there, done that."

They traveled down under this past spring for three weeks, spending two weeks on a cruise ship and one week on land.

Jim and Marilyn Malley of Plymouth Township went on a "Member Recognition Cruise" sponsored by the Automobile Club of Michigan.

Jim retired last year after 40 years with General Motors and Detroit Diesel, a lot of the time spent at the big engine plant in Redford Township, where he was North American traffic manager. Marilyn still works occasionally for Plymouth Township in the clerk's office.

They thoroughly enjoyed the trip despite the long plane rides,



and felt AAA tours provided first class arrangements all down the line.

The tour included 15 days on the 1,350-passenger Sky Princess and stops in New

Zealand (Bay of Islands, Tauranga, Wellington, Christchurch and Dunedin), a day of cruising Fjordland National Park in New Zealand, then a stop at Hobart on Tasmania. The cruise finished with stops at Melbourne, and then Sydney.

The land travel included a couple days in Sydney, then the long trip to the center of the huge continent to Alice Springs via plane. A day was spent at Ayers Rock, then a four-hour flight took them to Cairns, and a day's tour out to the Great Barrier Reef.

"I would go back, but maybe we would stay a day in Hawaii to cut down on the long flight from Los Angeles to Auckland (12 hours)," Jim Malley said.

"Australians are very friendly people. Even if you don't look lost they come up to you, offer to help.

Sydney was very cosmopolitan, well-kept, very clean. There are many, many buses and cabs like in Manhattan, except they don't blow their horns all the time."

The Malleys are originally from Long Island, New York, and have traveled many places, including Tahiti last year and

Alaska the year before.

"Australia, especially Sydney, was very Olympic-saturated," Marilyn Malley said. "Many stores were dealing in just Olympic merchandise." Despite Australian tourism claims, the Malleys found the country expensive. Most people drive small cars because gasoline is \$5 a gallon.

"The food was excellent on the cruise, and the hotel in Sydney was first-class," Marilyn said. One minor problem was American money had to be exchanged, and New Zealand doesn't take Australian currency and vice-versa.

The Australia exchange rate hovers around \$1.60 for every U.S. dollar.

"There are many pluses. The roads are excellent even in the Outback. Customs was quick and easy. You didn't need any shots. AAA handled the visas. We had virtually no trouble. Australia apparently has a very low crime rate," Jim Malley said.

The Malleys said they found Melbourne charming with many buildings restored and many Victorian homes in their full glory.

New Zealand cities reminded them of San Francisco; elevators take residents from their garages up to the hillside homes.


The Great Barrier Reef trip was enlightening, with several hundred people aboard a large catamaran.

"The weather was fine" Marilyn Malley said. "It is their fall although the Outback was very hot and very dry. The Tasmania sea (off southeastern Australia)

was rough in March."

Many people on the cruise were from Western Wayne County, including couples from Farmington, Farmington Hills, Garden City, Livonia, Westland and Canton.

The next Member Recognition Cruise is early spring to the eastern Caribbean aboard the Grand Princess. Malleys intend to be on board.

Make sure everyone gets their 5-A-Day

National 5-A-Day Week 2000 is Sept. 10-17.

What does that mean to you and your family? With the average Michigan adult consuming only 3.7 servings of fruits and vegetables each day, it should mean a call to action.

We've all heard the messages loud and clear. We know we should be eating more fruits and vegetables. They are important foods that offer phytochemicals, natural plant substances that work with dietary fiber and nutrients to protect against disease. Fruits and vegetables are a nutritional bargain; each variety offers a different array of vitamins, minerals and other nutrients.

To top it off, most fruits and vegetables are a caloric bargain. They always are great choices for the weight-conscious crowd.

Falling short

With all that in mind, we still fall short of eating five servings of these colorful foods each day. Many folks simply think it's too much work to prepare fruits and vegetables.

Let's examine how we can change this pattern and make eating fruits and vegetables the natural choice.

What is a serving? It is smaller than what you might think. A serving size is as follows: 1/2 cup of cooked, canned or cut-up fruit or vegetables; 1 cup of raw leafy greens; 3/4 cup of 100 percent juice; 1/2 cup cooked legumes (beans, peas); or 1/4 cup of dried fruit.

Take a look at your measuring cups at home to see how small the serving sizes are. There really is no excuse for not getting five or more servings a day.

How can it be an easy choice at home?

Try a few new strategies to get your family in the habit. Young children can keep weekly charts of the fruits and vegetables they eat. Every time they eat a serving of fruits or vegetables they can check off a square. If they eat five every day, there should be 35 check marks by the weekend. (Of course, you realize for this to be successful the adults in the household will need to set an example.) Reward the child and yourself by doing something active they enjoy.

Plan your shopping

Stock your refrigerator with a week's supply of fresh produce and your cupboard shelves with canned and dried fruits and vegetables. Put frozen fruits and vegetables in your freezer.

What quantity should you buy? For one week, a family of four will need 56 pieces of fruit or the equivalent serving in canned, dried, juice or frozen. Plus, they will need 84 servings of vegetables, either fresh, frozen, canned or juice. If your grocery store trip involves just tossing a bag of apples, a head of lettuce and a bag of frozen veggies in the cart for the week, you're falling short.

Don't let the numbers scare you. By stocking up on the non-perishables, you'll just need to replenish the fresh produce and perhaps a few staple items each week.

Add variety

Buy a new or unfamiliar item each time you shop. How about dried tart cherries? Many kids and adults have never had this Michigan-grown product, yet they are so delicious. The mouth-watering combination of tart and sweet will win you over. What about the great variety of fall squashes soon to come? Have you tried the endless variety of leafy greens as a base for your dinner entrée? Top them with a grilled chicken breast, steamed beans and a warmed bottled vinaigrette for a super simple supper. The possibilities are endless.

Keep it simple.

You can put a small bag of dried fruits into kid lunches, briefcases or the minivan, and mom's purse. Make a batch up ahead to grab and go.

The students in Chef Joseph Gilbert's culinary class weren't the type of folks to shy away from killing a lobster the humane way.

While the idea of killing lobsters makes many people squeamish, the seasoned cooks in Cuisine du Jour were up to the challenge, in anticipation of the four savory dishes they would get to sample at the end of the four-hour class.

a batch up ahead to grab and go. Juices need to be portable, too. Get the shelf-stable juice boxes and freeze or refrigerate before they need to travel. Adults and teens can give up at least one cola beverage a day to have juice.

Spend a little extra to buy pre-cut fresh produce. If the greens are washed and cut, carrot and celery are cut and cleaned and the pineapple is conveniently cored, meal and snack time becomes much easier.

Now that you're convinced you really can eat those fruits and vegetables, start today. Remember the five easy ways to "5 A Day" - fresh, frozen, dried, canned and juice.

ested in cooking."

Among the featured dishes were Lobster Fra Diablo, a spicy red tomato sauce with angel hair pasta; poached lobster salad with mango and jicama; lobster with saffron beurre blanc and angel hair pasta, and a New England clam bake with lobster.

Students broke up into groups of three or four and were assigned a recipe for which to chop and slice the ingredients. They then got to try their hands with the lobsters, cutting raw lobsters in half lengthwise and brushing them with garlic butter for the grill, pulling them from a boiling pot, cracking the shells and digging out their savory meat for the pasta dishes.

Flying in live lobsters from Maine now, when they're in season, is often less expensive than purchasing them from a store locally, said Gilbert, who instructed students to have them arrive the day they're being cooked.

When selecting live lobsters, the ones that are hard to catch are the highest quality and they should be wrapped in a damp towel or seaweed but not submerged in water, prior to cooking.

For boiling, the rule is one gallon of heavily salted water per

lobster. For dinner parties, steaming lobsters gives the chef more flexibility in timing, whereas when they're boiled, they cook more quickly and generally take 10 minutes.

Gilbert showed students to use every part of the lobster for flavor, including the "juice" from the lobsters and the green tomalley, which Gilbert encouraged some of the reluctant students to taste.

On the grill, lobsters are steamed in their own juices and

get a smoky, barbecue flavor, through their shells which are placed directly on the grill, as Gilbert demonstrated.

For a clam bake, a five-gallon pot will suffice, with a upside-down colander and three inches of water at the bottom, for steaming. Gilbert showed students how to pack the pot with seaweed, the live lobsters, partially-cooked redskin potatoes, corn on the cob, clams and mussels, quartered onions and white wine.

Survey: Steaks, burgers preferred

(NUE) - Beef. That's what's on the grill - year-round.

Steak and hamburgers are Americans' favorite and most frequently grilled foods, according to the 12th annual 2000 Weber GrillWatch survey.

Based on a random survey of more than 2,700 American grill owners, the GrillWatch looks under the lid and reports what's cookin'.

Seventy-nine percent of all American households own at least one grill, the survey says. More than half of all Americans use their outdoor grills at least once a week, with another third firing up the grill several times a month. And Americans fire up the grill nearly 1 billion times during the months of June, July and August.

Grilling is no longer just a summer pastime. For most Americans, the survey says, "grilling season" kicks off as early as March and stretches long after Labor Day, lasting into November. That means grilled turkey could become the cornerstone of a traditional Thanksgiving meal.

As a whole, American cooks tend to grill a few favorites most frequently, but they are not opposed to some experimentation.

Nearly everyone grills the standard meats including hot dogs and chicken, but once you move beyond four standbys, the list of most widely grilled foods contains some surprising entries including fish filets, shrimp, beef and pork roasts, and vegetables other than corn and potatoes.

Some of the most inventive responses to the survey include alligator with portabella mushrooms, barbecued reuben sandwiches, bacon-wrapped whole duck and bear.

Want some fresh ideas? The survey asked its respondents what new foods they had grilled in the last six months. Those fastest growing grilled foods include: pizza, whole fish, bruschetta, asparagus, pineapple, desserts and mushrooms.

CINNAMON APPLE PIE

9-inch double crust (homemade or store bought, such as Pillsbury)

Filling:

- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon candies (red hot), crushed
- 1/3 cup honey
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3 to 4 cups thinly sliced peeled pie apples (about 3 or 4 medium)
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine

Glass:

- 1 teaspoon half and half or milk

For crust, prepare recipe and press bottom crust into 9-inch pie plate. Do not bake.

Heat oven to 450°F. Reserve dough scraps for cutouts, if desired.

For filling, heat lemon juice in small saucepan. Add crushed candies. Stir until dissolved. Stir in honey and cinnamon. Arrange apples in unbaked pie crust. Drizzle with honey mixture. Dot with butter. Moisten pastry edge with water. Cover pie with top crust. Cut slits in top crust to allow steam to escape. Decorate with pastry cutouts, if desired.

For glaze, brush top crust with half and half. Place pie in oven. Reduce oven temperature to 350°F. Bake for one hour or until filling in center is bubbly and crust is golden brown. Cool until barely warm or to room temperature before serving.

Filling yield: One 9-inch pie.

CHEDDAR CHEESE CRUST APPLE PIE

Crust:

- 1 1/2 cups flour
- Dash salt
- 1/2 cup shortening - cut in
- 1 1/2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese (about 6 ounces)
- 4-6 tablespoons cold water

Divide in half.

Filling:

- 6 cups sliced apples
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons flour
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon or nutmeg

To make the crust, combine crust ingredients. Divide dough in half for top and bottom crust. Press bottom crust into a 9-inch pie plate.

Mix the four filling ingredients together. Put into a bottom crust. Take 2 tablespoons margarine and dot over the filling.

Top with crust. Slit top and bake at 425°F for 35 minutes.

LOBSTER WITH SAFFRON BUEIRE BLANC

Lobster meat from one lobster (about 1 pound)

- 1 ounce (shot glass) white wine
- 1 ounce vermouth
- 1/2 ounce white wine vinegar
- salt and pepper to taste
- 2 tablespoons shallots, minced
- 6 tablespoons butter, chilled
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 20 threads saffron

Combine the white wine, vermouth, vinegar, salt and pepper and shallots in a small saucepan. Reduce to two tablespoons of liquid remaining. Add heavy cream and saffron. Add cold butter, a little at a time, whisking the whole time until all has been incorporated. Remove the saucepan from heat. Add lobster meat and serve over rice or pasta.

GRILLED LOBSTER WITH GARLIC BUTTER

Garlic butter:

Two cloves garlic, sliced thin. Sauté in butter until brown. Add two tablespoons cold butter to the pan to cool the hot pan. Pour into a small bowl. Add chopped parsley, salt and pepper

One live lobster:

Split one lobster in half. The tomalley and coral can be removed and saved for further use.

Crack the claws with a firm blow, using the back of a knife.

Season with salt and pepper and brush with garlic butter. Place on grill, shell-side down. Cook 8 minutes. Turn to the meat-side down and cook 4 minutes longer. With a clean brush, brush again with garlic butter and serve hot.

- 4 cups sliced, peeled tart apples
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- Topping:
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1/2 teaspoon baking powder

Toss apples with sugar and cinnamon. Pour into crust. Bake at 375°F for 30 minutes.

Combine the first four topping ingredients, flour, sugar, baking powder and salt, in a bowl. Stir in egg, butter and vanilla until smooth. Add coconut. Spoon over hot apples, carefully spreading to cover. Bake for 30 minutes longer, or until apples are tender.

MAPLE SYRUP APPLE PIE

Crust:

- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour, divided
- 1/4 cup water
- Pinch of salt
- 1 cup butter-flavored shortening

Filling:

- 1/3 cup maple syrup, divided
 - 4-5 large tart apples, such as Granny Smith, peeled and sliced into wedges
 - 3/4 cup sugar
 - 1/4 cup lemon juice
 - 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 - 1/2 cup raisins (boil approximately 1 minute in water to plump, then drain)
 - 1/2 cup walnuts, coarsely chopped
- Topping:
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
 - 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
 - 1/2 cup cold butter or margarine
 - 1/2 cup walnuts, coarsely chopped

In a small bowl, combine 1/4 cup flour and water until smooth; set aside. In a large bowl, combine salt and remaining flour; cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Add reserved flour mixture; knead gently until dough forms a ball. Press dough onto the bottom and up the sides of an ungreased 10-by-2-inch quiche or pie pan. Spread half of the syrup over the crust.

Arrange apples, raisins and walnuts over syrup. Combine sugar, lemon juice, cinnamon, vanilla and remaining syrup; drizzle over apple mixture.

For the topping, combine flour and sugar in a bowl; cut in butter until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in walnuts. Sprinkle over filling. Bake at 350°F for 60-70 minutes or until apples are tender.

Martial art teaches self-defense Israeli style

The atmosphere in the Dragon Academy of Martial Arts in Livonia is hot, humid and tense. Ten men and women, some in their teens, many in their 40s, are warming up on the mat, punching, dodging and sidekicking their imaginary opponents. Every few seconds, the instructor yells SWITCH! and the students do a quarter turn to face their evasive foes.

Welcome to a class on Krav Maga, the newest martial arts craze to hit the nation. Hebrew for "contact combat," Krav Maga is a lethal form of self-defense and street fighting developed in the 1950s for the Israeli Defense Forces. It's an "anything goes" type of martial arts that uses keys, coffee cups, briefcases or whatever is at hand as weapons.

It's not judo, tae kwon do or kickboxing. "Krav Maga has its own style. It's based on the body's instinctive reaction to danger," said owner Nick Colling, a certified Krav Maga instructor who trained for 300 hours under two Israeli commandos. "If you're attacked, you don't have time to think of move number 31."

Krav Maga is all about defense and attack. "I have people say Krav Maga looks really violent," said Colling. "I say, wow, what do you think an attacker is?"

Reaction time

"GO!"

Lying flat on their backs at the end of the mat, the students jump up and rush to the end of the mat then return and resume a prone position. It's an exercise in honing reaction time. Responses to false commands are reprimanded.

"The goal is to go from a very passive position to a very aggressive position quickly," said Colling. Alertness is the key to survival.

Students learn to respond to attack from a variety of natural postures — sitting down, lying down, falling backward, any position where movement is limited. "We train for a position of disadvantage. Anything else is a better situation," said Colling. "Our goal is to put the students in a horrible spot and teach them they can get out."

Once the fight has begun, defendants assume a

"combat" position — feet shoulder-width apart, knees slightly bent, with most of the weight on the forward foot. The body is turned slightly inward to minimize a target and protect the groin. The hands are held away from the body at shoulder level with palms extended. This position allows for the delivery of

quick, sharp punches, kicks and overall body defense.

Debbie Wade, 40, an emergency medical technician from Westland, is sold on Krav Maga. "Between this and the tae kwon do, I really do feel a lot safer. It's also helped me to lose weight, and the knees are getting better."

Her son, Brian, 15, is a 6-foot, 210-pound football player who wears a size 14 shoe. He's big and intimidating. He's also a potential mark for people who think they can take "the big guy" down.

"This teaches you good street-fighting techniques. If you're in the unfortunate position to have to use it, it helps you out. It teaches you to take them down so you can get away ... or take them down so they don't get up. They can teach you that, too."

Julie MacGillis, the head of testing in tae kwon do at Colling's studio, prefers the more traditional martial arts. A second-degree black belt in tae kwon do, she prefers the discipline's more meditative and spiritual aspects. "I'm meeting some similar goals in self-defense through tae kwon do, just going about it in a different way."

Lightening strikes

Raul Rodrigues, a Wayne County deputy sheriff who's been taking Krav Maga for six months, is lying on his back, chin curled toward his chest, knees bent. One shin is

raised parallel to the floor, its foot flexed. Marquis stands in front of Rodrigues protected by a cushion.

THOMP! In a lightning move, Rodrigues lifts his hips and strikes the cushion. "More heal, come on, Raul, buddy," shouts Colling from across the room. THOMP! THOMP! Rodrigues strikes his leg out again and again.

Rodrigues is on his feet now, giving Marquis a solid knee to the solar plexus. The knee is lethal in Krav Maga and is used to land blows on the face, ribs, thigh, groin and stomach. Krav Maga, says Rodrigues, keeps him fit for his occupation. "You never know when you'll have to put the strength to the test. My pulse is good, my blood pressure great, and I've lost 10 pounds. It makes me more alert to my threat. It makes my response time faster."

Rodrigues would not hesitate having his family learn Krav Maga. "It's important they know how to protect themselves if dad is not there to protect them. Sometimes waiting causes problems."

Marlene Dahlin, 46, of Livonia signed up for the class with her daughter Christina, 13. "I thought both of us could use it. Hopefully, we'll never have to use it. I get a real good aerobic program with a purpose to it. We leave here at 9:30 p.m. and I'm wide awake."

Christina likes using her fists. "It's fun to get in there and try some punches. It's fun to make contact with the pads."

Fun and fitness are important, said instructor Greg Marquis. But so is self-confidence. "Attackers prey on the meek and those who lack self-confidence," he emphasized. "I tell them (the students) an attack will happen on their worst day. You're not attentive. Criminals like to have power over their victims."

Fighting should always be the last resort, said Colling. "If you can walk, talk or run away, do that. If you know Krav, you won't feel like a coward." However, if you can't run, Krav Maga prepares you to fight.

"It's better to give than receive. Keep that in mind," said Colling.



Qualifying for a new mortgage is easy


Pebble Creek is served by city water, sewers and sidewalks. It's within the Howell school boundaries.

The property tax rate currently is \$21.56 per \$1,000 of state taxable value, half of sales price for new construction. That means the owners of a \$250,000 house there would pay about \$2,700 the first year.

Terry and Carol Warren ordered a story-and-a-half.

"We fell in love with the pond in that area," Carol said. "We're building a house out there. We have a walk-out."

"We like the openness. The master is down. There's three bedrooms upstairs, and we made one into a loft. My husband likes the idea of city sewers," she said.

Sometimes they come looking for you.

Especially in a tight labor market, employers often go looking for top management and technical candidates. Headhunters are the professional matchmakers that put the deal together.

"Most companies, when they're looking for talent use the passive approach, they take out newspaper ads and wait for the job seeker to come to them," said Paul Theisen, president of Unlocked Potential Inc. of Livonia. "A headhunter goes for the active method. I'm in the marketplace everyday talking to candidates. I may have talked to you five years ago and then I hear from a com-

pany that wants someone with your talents. I can tap into the people I've known."

Unlocked Potential counsels firms on recruitment, hiring, retention and outplacement and helps individuals with career advancement and job search. Theisen started the company in 1995

following experiences as a management recruiter, plant manager and engineer.

Theisen is enthusiastic about breaking out of the usual approach of emphasizing the resume.

"One of the biggest things hurting the recruiters is the focus on the resumes," Theisen said. "Most just take the resume and send it to the company then it's a resume thing. I try to focus on why are you any good, why would a company look at you, what are your accomplishments."

Theisen said he would approach a company and tell them he had a candidate for a job and would lay out all the candidate's accomplishments without divulging the person's name. Then he would work with the candidate on putting together what he calls "a career

Be prudent, look ahead, when taking job

Q. A company that appeared to be in good shape recruited me two years ago. Six months into my new job, the organization was restructured and my boss was transferred. Then there was a major change in the benefits program. A year later, the company was sold and a new management team implemented all new policies. It's been traumatic. How can I avoid a situation like this in the future?
J.D.

A. According to the cliché, the only thing you can count on is change.

For most of us, that's just an abstraction. We think of change in a macro sense, like the way it relates to the Internet or culture or big business strategy. But an important factor in career and financial success is the ability to anticipate and plan for change at a very personal level. It's a mindset that can help us avoid problems, capitalize on opportunities and even find a little peace along the way.

The first task is to challenge every assumption you may have about stability in your immediate environment. Think a consistent record of profitability means your division will remain untouched by meddlers from world headquarters? Throw that one out. Does a good relationship with the boss translate into job security? Probably not. Does low employee turnover create that "one big happy family" feeling? You're in dangerous territory.

Next, look critically at every promise and prognostication. Do you tend to regard top management's stated objectives as fait accompli? Bad mistake. Have you accepted projections of

portfolio.
"The Eagles, top drawer candidates, loved doing this," Theisen said.

Theisen said everyone should be creating a career portfolio, because no one should think they're at the job from which they'll retire.

"Take a spiral notebook. Put it on your desk. Every day, when you talk to someone, write down in columns, the date, title, name of the person, company, phone number and what you talked about," Theisen said.

When the time comes to look for a new job, you'll have a ready list of contacts. Even if they don't have a job opening, Theisen said, you might ask them to help you develop a resume, which alerts them to your qualifications.

Theisen said it's important to keep track of what you do on the job.

"The most powerful interview technique I came up with was this - every Friday, sit down and ask what did I do this week," Theisen said.

He said from this list you could create graphics which show at a glance what you've done and what you're capable of doing.

"The interview becomes easier on you and the company. It focuses on results, on what you can do on the job," Theisen said.

The headhunter's job doesn't end with making a connection.

"You go out to the company and you both fall in love with each other," Theisen said. "I help put you together but before the company makes an offer, I check to see you are who you say you are. ... In a nutshell that's how it works, being a matchmaker. What people forget when I put you with a client company, it's your responsibility to make that decision."

Theisen said some headhunters will pressure a job candidate to take a job offer, but he said it's important for the applicant to decide if this job is really for him/her.

"My philosophy is do whatever I can to help the client make a good decision. I'm the third guy in the party, I help the candidate make the proper decision and help the company make the proper decision," he said.

Theisen said a candidate has to check out a company thoroughly before making that big decision. He suggests visiting the company during the day and then casually calling some employees in the evening to get a more honest view of the company and working conditions.

growth and security as they relate to you personally without qualification? That's naive. It's also important to understand that the interests and needs of those in a position to impact your business life are likely to evolve. If it's their welfare vs. yours, guess who wins?

A friend of mine accepted a job as a Sales Manager with a private company several years ago. Gary was concerned that the company was a good candidate for a takeover and expressed his fears to the owner. The boss looked him right in the eye and said, "I have no intention of selling." Six months later, the firm was bought out. They were negotiating the sale at the same time Gary was interviewing.

Try to look at situations not as they are today, but as they could be tomorrow, next week and in 10 years. This is not an exact science. It involves some research, some guesswork, some "what-if" thinking and some healthy skepticism. You might call it paranoid or cynical. I call it prudent.

In my father's time, particularly in the industrial north, almost any unskilled person could get a well-paying job in a manufac-

turing facility. Sure, there were hiring downturns, layoffs and recessions. But for the most part, jobs at companies like GM or Ford, which gave workers considerable purchasing power, could be found for any warm body. Once in, some extra effort could lead to an even better paying job in skilled trades or supervision.

Things are different for today's unskilled. Oh, there are plenty of service jobs available and, arguably, these could be good positions for young people to pick up some cash while training for better things.

Sure, personal responsibility and ambition still pay off and myriad opportunities exist for those who can only see them and apply themselves. But for a variety of reasons, there will always be a large segment of the population that cannot or will not become computer programmers or cabinetmakers. And to say the least, the chronically unskilled are less likely to obtain high paying jobs today than in 1955.

Ride a fast pony
into the past...
with Mustang

People may change, but at least the 'new' Mustang stays the same

The success story of the original Ford Mustang, introduced mid-year in 1964, is legend in corporate automotive marketing folklore.

A casebook study of vision, it is based on careful analysis, combined with the ability to cut through the auto industry's standard long lead times and the conservative "family car" mind set of Postwar America.

The Mustang was so well received that, though fastback and GT versions were introduced and some detail trim was changed, the basic car continued as originally designed through the 1966 model year.

The next year was going to be pivotal for the Mustang. For the first time since its inception, there was going to be some competition - big competition.

Chevy was reading its Camaro and Pontiac had its Camaro derived Firebird on the board. Chrysler's original Valiant based, fish bowl fastback Barracuda, was being replaced with a well styled, three model armada (convertible, coupe and fastback) with guns aimed directly at Mustang.

Even the Lincoln Mercury division of Ford would have the Cougar, its own up-market coupe version of the Mustang. The 1967 Mustang would have to be changed to look newer and hotter, without

changing much of the greenhouse area and floor plan, or eliminating any of the styling cues that were identified with the already quite popular car.

Though restyled from the rocker panels to the window sills, the 1967 and '68 models retained most of the styling elements from the earlier cars. While the body got marginally bigger, achieved by adding more overhang on each end and curved sheet metal on the sides, the chassis specifications never changed.

The new grille looked similar to the first Mustang. It was taller and wider and jutted out from the top at more of an angle, which made the headlights appear to be deeper set. The sideways "U" shaped depression that trailed off into simulated chrome "scoops" on the first series was exaggerated for effect and given a real scoop look with a pair of deep finned ports behind each door.

The rear panel above the bumper was remade concave to resemble the aerodynamic Kamm-back designs found on the Ford GT40 and racing Cobra coupes. The most changed model was the 2 + 2 hard top that became a true fastback with a roof that sloped all of the way back to the edge of the concave rear panel.

Performance was increased to keep the Mustang the fastest pony car. While buyers could still opt for

a 6 or small V8, performance versions of the 289 cube V8 could be ordered in 225 and 271 HP models. If straight line performance was high on your wish list a new 330 horse 390 cube big block Thunderbird Special V8 was available. Shelby versions included an up rated 271 horse small block in the GT350 and a 428 cube big block in the GT500. In addition, about 50 GT500s were built to order with the better 427 medium riser engine.

Changes were kept to a minimum for 1968 and most were due to newly implemented smog and safety regulations.

The smog requirements differed from state to state, but all cars had to have a federally mandated restraint system (that usually reduced itself to a tangled pile of belts on the back floor) and "break-away" interior components. Side marker lights traded night visibility for cluttered looks.

For '69 there were more special performance models. A horsepower race had developed when Chevy introduced its 396 cubic inch Rat motor in the Camaro and Pontiac brought out its Firebird 400. Not to be outdone, Ford installed a new 335 horse, 428 Cobra Jet V8 engine where the 390s had been in the '67 Mustang.



Beside the GT and GTA (automatic) versions that had been around for a few years, there was a California Special (GT/CS), a Shelby-esque trim package on a standard 2 door sold only in California, plus the High Country Special, basically a re-worked California Special sold through Colorado Ford dealers and the "Cobra Jet" fast-back offered from mid 1968.

Next a convertible was added to the Shelby GT line. It had a factory roll bar and could be had with either small block (GT350) or 428 cubic inches big block (GT500). A new model, brought out later in the year, was the GT500KR (King of the Road) that had an advanced ram-air hood feeding a 428 cube Cobra Jet engine. Ford still had the top pony.

What this "new" Mustang is all about is nostalgia for the west coast "30-something" crowd. They were the secondhand cars that these folks drove to high school. Let's pop a Led Zepplin tape into the stereo and cruise over to the beach and look for Sue, the cheerleader, and the rest of the gang (boy, gang sure had a different connotation in those days).

Sue might be there today, but it will probably be with her second husband and the three daughters by her first, the oldest of which looks surprisingly like Sue did when Led Zep was at the top of the charts. A quick glance in the rear view mirror to make sure the hair is just right... Wow, where did all that space between the shades and the hair come from? Oh, well, at least the Mustang looks the same!

Gasoline refueling advisory and safety guidelines

(NAPSI) - The American Petroleum Institute offers the following consumer advisory and safety guidelines on car refueling to help consumers avoid potential problems with refueling and static electricity.

One of many possible causes of static electricity buildup is re-entering your car during refueling, particularly in cool or cold and dry climate conditions. This can cause a build-up of static electricity similar to shuffling your feet on the carpet when the air in your home is dry. If you return from your car's interior to remove the filling nozzle without discharging the static buildup, in rare circumstances, a brief flash fire could occur at the filling point if the static discharges and the resulting spark ignites gasoline vapors around the fill spout.

A simple precaution to help avoid this potential problem is to stay near the car's fueling point. Do not get back into your car during refueling - even when using the nozzle's automatic hold-open latch. If a flash fire occurs during refueling, leave the nozzle in the car's fill pipe and back away from the car. Notify the station attendant at once so that all dispensing devices and pumps can be shut off with emergency controls. If the facility is unattended, use the emergency intercom to summon help and the emergency shutdown button to shut off the pump.

API is aware of a few unusual fire incidents involving self-service customers who were refueling their cars in cool or cold, dry weather conditions. These incidents may be related to static electricity build-

up and discharge.

Here are additional safety guidelines on car refueling:

- Always turn your car's engine off while refueling.
- Never smoke, light matches or use lighters while refueling.
- Do not get back into your car during refueling - even when using the nozzle's automatic hold-open latch. If you must re-enter your car, discharge the static electricity buildup when you get out by touching the outside metal portion of your car, away from the filling point, before attempting to remove the nozzle.
- To avoid gasoline spills, do not over fill or top off your car fuel tank. The fuel dispenser will shut off automatically when the tank is full.
- Use only the hold-open latch provided on the gasoline pump. Never jam or force the hold-open latch open by using some other object such as the gas cap.
- When dispensing gasoline into a portable gasoline can, use only an approved container. To avoid a static-electricity ignition of fuel vapors always place the container on the ground and keep the pump nozzle in contact with the container when refueling. Containers should never be filled while inside a car or its trunk, on the bed of a pickup or flat bed, or on the floor of a trailer.
