Township, schools join forces for recreation

BY TONY BRUSCATO

In what is being termed a pilot program, Plymouth Township officials will spend nearly \$20,000 worth of time to develop a master recreation plan for the property surrounding Pioneer Middle School.

And, if the initial project works, township trustees may spend up to \$350,000 to improve recreational facilities at seven Plymouth-Canton schools located within the township.

It's part of an effort to help bolster recreation opportunities for township residents by improving existing play

The partnership is a wonderful opportunity to show tempayors we can partner and maximize tax dellars," said Jim Anulewicz, the township director of public services. "If we can develop the property and maximize the public investment by incorporating

activities for the neighborhood sports during non-school hours, then we are maximizing it one step further."

Anulewicz said he dusted off a township recreation plan developed, but unused, since 1986.

"The plan calls for coordination with the school district,

and providing the district with technical assistance to upgrade the environmental quality of school sites within Plymouth Township," said Anulewics.

Anulewicz said the Pioneer property

is 19.29 acres, with about 10 acres on the site still undeveloped. "I haven't looked at the site, and I

According to Mike Gerou, president of the Western Wayne Chapter of the Eastern Michigan Alumni Association, about 5,000 EMU graduates live in the Plymouth/Canton area.

"I think that is something to be proud of," said the 1979 EMU graduate. "Plymouth-Canton schools is the largest EMU-feeder district."

He attributes the close EMU-Plymouth/Canton relationship to several factors: the low cost of education, a quality education and proximity.

Gerou, a Plymouth attorney, says EMU is "a working class school" that turns out lawyers, teachers, politicians and business leaders, among many others. "It's a pretty wide mix," he admitted.

He attended the Ypsilanti school while working 50 hours a week at Plymouth Stamping. He explained that commuting or living off campus was not out of the ordinary since many of the students did hold jobs. He speculated that many students were attracted to EMU because

Commissioners see plans for Wilcox property

How big is too big for downtown Ply-

mouth? That question may be answered soon as city leaders discuss a proposed high-

rise condominium project for the 2.15

acres known as the Wilcox property on Penniman Street. D&P Ventures has presented its blueprints for a \$10 million condominium enterprise to the Plymouth planning commission. And, while almost everyone on the commission agrees that aesthetically the project would be

a positive for downtown Plymouth, most are concerned the six-story struc-

ture will dwarf the city's crown jewel, Kellogg Park. "I think that's what we're going to hear the most at the public hearing, a lot of concern from the public on height," said Doug Miller, planning commission chairman. "You're going to get a lot of positive feedback on the quality, but the height will be a con-

"It looks like seven stories with the

loft apartments," added Rosita Smith, planning commissioner. "Kellogg Park is a treasure to the city, and it seems this will block it. People are wondering if we'll have tall buildings overlooking the park."

Despite the concerns, Stan Dickson of D&P Ventures believes the setbacks from the street will make the building look smaller than it really is.

"It may be big, but it's massively beautiful," said Dickson. "It won't dwarf the park."

Plymouth city commis ly passed an ordi struction around Kollogg Park to height of 50 feet, or approximately four stories. However, D&P Ventures made its project application a Planned Unit Development, in which the city can overlook the height ordinance for the 75-foot high structure in exchanation having more control of what is p

on the property.

Charter Township Act relating to the duties of the township supervisor; and to adopt the cur-rent edition of Robert's Rules of Order as the operating rules of the new board.

Foul odor

Griffith said he wants the new board to start on a professional and positive note, with professional courtesy.

"This just smelled," Griffith said. "Reorganization is not something taken lightly. Otherwise, all those employees will feel threatened for the next four years."

Clerk Marilyn Massengill scheduled the meeting for 7:30 p.m. Tuesday at Plymouth Township Hall, located at Ann Arbor Road and Lilley. The meeting is open to the public.

"I have no problem revisiting the issue," Massengill said. "It doesn't matter to me." She declined further discussion about the subject.

Treasurer Ron Edwards and Trustee K. C. Mueller, who chose not to run for re-election to a third term, brought the issue to the board. Massengill and Trustee Chuck Curmi joined them in a "yes" vote for reorganization.

Streamlining

Edwards and Mueller cited continuing concerns regarding statutory duties and the streamlining of township operation in a memo which prompted the reorganization of the department headed by Harvey.

"This is something which should have been done a long time ago," Mueller said. "We had to do this for a smoother running of Plymouth Township without personal problems interfering. There were too many times when responsibilities seemed to get away from the supervisor.'

Curmi said he didn't know about the special meeting and questioned why the request had

not come from the supervisor, who typically calls such meetings. "This is strictly an operational agreement," Curmi said. "Management does not have the same protection you have in a union. This happens all the time. The City of Plymouth has removed department heads. I measure results. You have to keep the head count under con-

Sudden change?

Edwards said he hasn't seen any paperwork related to the special meeting. "I don't like what is happening, what they are doing to Steve Mann on his first day on the job," Edwards said. "Any two can call a special board meeting. These two have condoned how the township has been run and all of a sudden they want to change things."

Edwards said they haven't supported him when he has tried to change things.

Retired Plymouth Township Police Chief Carl Berry, who this week filed a Freedom of Information request for all materials connected to the restructuring, said he wouldn't be present at Tuesday's meeting. However, he planned to send Sharon McPhail, his attorney.

Mueller said she has already responded to the township regarding Berry's FOI request. She is OK with the special meeting because it will determine if the reorganization is acceptable to Mann.

Trustee-elect Abe Munfakh criticized the reorganization plan because there was no study on the advantages and disadvantages on something which affects employee positions. "They say it saves the township money," Munfakh said. "Show it to me."



height would mean the end for the house and tree, Dickson replied, "That's certainly an option.

Architect Joe Philips of Plymouth presented the project to the planning commission, telling commissioners, "It's what Jack (Wilcox) wanted. We met with Jack at Ernesto's on Feb. 8 and showed him the plans, and he was just floored."

Wilcox signed over the deed to the property, agreeing to plans for a four-to-six story structure, just before his death on June 30.

The main entrance to the condos will be on Elizabeth Street. There will be three areas with covered walkways to enter the building, with 41 parking spaces outside, 12 carport spaces, and 48 spaces underground.

We paid meticulous attention to detail with the windows, awnings, dormers, chimneys ... a traditional look with brick and stone," said Philips. "It will be a quality building with poured concrete foundation walls, steel frame construction, and concrete plank floors."


The custom-decorated condos are expected to sell from \$450,000 \$675,000.

While the project calls for 50 condomini-

ums, Philips said they haven't ruled out a office and retail on the first floor.

"We think this project is a credit to the community," he said. "It's an opportunity to bring 50 new homes to downtown. It will have a tremendous impact on downtown."

The future of the property could be determined at the Dec. 13 planning commission meeting, during which there will be a public hearing on the six-story plan.

Richard Cundiff of Plymouth

"At Eastern, a lot of us worked. We were first-generation college students, compared to the University of Michigan where the students were second and third-generation college stu-dents. They didn't have to work."

Cundiff received his bachelor's in business administration from EMU in 1964. He returned for a master's in business administration, which he completed in

"I grew up in Ann Arbor," Cundiff admitted, "but Eastern was less expensive and a much smaller school."

With a student enrollment of 7-8,000, Cundiff said he was able to "recognize a lot of people on the campus." That compares with today's student enrollment of 23,000.

Cundiff has fond memories of fraternity events and professors who made the classes interest-

"I remember one professor who threw an eraser at a student who was dozing off," he said. The professors were a little bit more relaxed there than at U of M."

Quality professors

Mike Flanagan, superintendent of Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency, was drawn to EMU for the professors. The Plymouth resident received his master's degree in Educational Leadership in 1974.

The best professors I ever had in education were at Eastern," he said. The graduate program is highly thought of."


According to Flanagan, the undergraduate program for education is also top-notch.

They have an excellent reputation. They produce more teachers for southeastern Michigan than any other university in the country," he said.

Janice Kyko of Canton thought about becoming a teacher. She commuted to Eastern for two years to receive a teaching degree in business and English. After earning her BA in 1977, she traded in her teaching plans for a shot at the law.

Today, the Detroit Edison attorney has fond memories of her alma mater. "The English Department professors were interesting people, and the caliber of teaching was very high," she said.

(daughter) Heitman of Plymouth were especially impressed with art history professor Richard Rubenfeld. Though the ladies did not attend EMU at the same time - Susan earned her bachelor's in 1988 while Brenda is expected to graduate next fall each has fond memories of Professor Rubenfeld's class.

"It's instructors like him that get students to go to EMU and get students to stay," said the elder Heitman.

Plymouth resident Colleen Brown opted for Eastern Michigan University because it das closer to home than Central and Western universities.

"I was looking at teaching colleges like many women of that time were," said the 1967 graduate, "and I knew of kids that were driving up from Blissfield (her home town.)"

Unlike at least half of her classmates, Brown lived on campus which provided her with many fond memories.

"Being in the dorm with the girls, laughing, having fun together, making friends...that is what I remember," she said. "Getting to meet people who lived in the metro area, I had my world expanded."

"We have some money set aside for a pilot program," said Chuck Curmi, township trustee. "I don't see funds being a hur-

Anulewicz said the total project could encompass as many as 90 acres at the seven school sites. Besides Pioneer, the sites include West Middle School, as well as Allen, Bird, Farrand, Fiegel and Isbister elementary

Booher has said spending could range between \$30-\$50,000 per site, depending on what is needed at each location.






Plymouth library gets high rating

By and large, the city and township clerks in western Wayne County agree with Michi-gan Secretary of State Candice Miller's ideas on voting reform, but one feels they don't go far

"There does need to be voter reform," said Canton Township Clork Torry Bennett, "but I think we need to look at evaluating not just the pieces of the process, but to comprehensively look at what kind of changes are needed ... in election law process."

Miller said Wednesday she will ask state lawmakers to net changes in how and when Michigan conducts state elections and to create a state elec-

tions and to create a state elec-tion holiday to encourage voter participation.) It Miller, a Republican, said she supports a state election holiday so registered voters will not have to choose between work and vot-

She also wants the state to adopt a uniform voting system for all 6,376 precincts statewide and to comsolidate elections to four dates per year.

"The presidential election has

According to the Wayne County election clerk's office, the Nov. 8 election saw five different voting systems used in the county: Optical scanner, lever system,

In western Wayne, the Optech optical scanner was used in Livenia and the city of Plymouth; Canton and Garden City used Accuvote optical scanners; and Westland and Plymouth Town-

ship used touch-screen systems. With both Optech and Accuvote, voters use a pencil or mark-er to fill in an area next to candidates' names or "yes" or "no"

beside proposals.

Livenia Clerk Joan McCotter, a member of Miller's special advisory committee on elections 1995-97 which recommended use of a uniform voting system, said the only problem with it is "no one is willing to finance it. one is willing to finance it.

"But maybe the fiasce in Florida will show how important it is," she said, referring to the presidential recount battle.

Marilyn Heldenbrand, who is retiring after 12 years as Red-ford Township clerk, said Wayne County election clerks told her optical scanning count wide wasn't feasible because there are too many cities and townships that couldn't afford it."

A lot of voters are saying "go to absentee ballots entirely," according to Linda Languesser, Plymouth city clerk, although that would increase postage costs, she said. It might save money because no poll workers would be needed, but municipalities still would have to hire counting boards.

Antler stump may be result of an injury

id November is the time of year I am most likely to see bucks, or male white-tailed deer in the park. It is the peak of the rut and males are following females out into open fields where they feed. Most of the time males are very secretive and are seldom seen.

The biggest buck I saw this year had four points on one antler, but only had a stump for the left antler. While looking at the deer through binoculars I noticed the 2-3 inch high stump that was dark in coloration. Unfortunately I could not see much more detail that the darkened stump.

A missing antler does not affect the survival of the animal since it is not crucial for life. It may make it vulnerable if it should get into a pushing match with another buck. A single antler probably would not give the deer as much leverage and push to counter the opposing deer, especially if they were evenly matched otherwise.

It is also interesting to speculate why the antler is missing. Did it break off in a fight? I spotted the deer before gun season started, so I don't think it could have been broken off by a bullet. Maybe the antler did not grow completely.

Growing antlers are very delicate and can be damaged easily. As the bone of the antler is growing, the velvet covering of the antler is nourishing the bone with blood. Blood brings all the necessary nutrients to the growing bone. If the blood supply should be cut off for some reason, the antler would not be able to grow. Maybe the velvet of the left antler was scored around the base like a tree is girdled. This would have prevented any nutrients from getting to the upper part of the antler. Without nutrients the antler would not have been able to grow.

Antler growth can also be affected by an injury to the body. Generally an injury to the right side of the body would cause damage to the left antler. Maybe the animal was injured during the growth of the antler, but the injury has since healed and is no longer visi-

Without closer examination I can only speculate on why the antler did not grow, but it should not affect the buck's survival. Many injuries to animals do affect their survival. House finches afflicted with the bacteria that causes an eye to swell shut is at a disadvantage. If an individual cannot see out of one eye it will not be able to see a predator approaching from the direction of the injured eye. A fast approaching hawk would be able to exploit this disadvantage.

One day we found a blind mouse in our basement. It was a young individual based on its size, so when it ran and did not seem to know where it was going I did not think much about it. But as I watched it a little longer I realized that it had no direction because it could not see. A mouse with this kind of disability would not survive long in the wild. There would be no siblings to help it get food, no parents to ward off predators and it would not be able to see food or physical dan-

Most injuries ultimately result in the death of an animal, but injuries to non-essential areas can permit them

Winter fishing

3 strikes and you're trout



y this time of year, many anglers have put away their rods in favor of shotguns and rifles.

The dedicated fly fisher who is willing to brave cold water. however, has many fishing opportunities in store. Thanks to new trout regulations,

all "flies only" water in the State of Michigan is now open to year-round fishing.

Trout streams that are normally crowded with fishermen and canoes are deserted this time of year. Anglers who truly crave solitude should try fishing during deer season - but be sure to wear some blaze

orange clothing to avoid being mistaken for a deer. The biggest attractions on the rivers now are steelhead and salmon. Salmon entered the rivers in September at the beginning of their spawning runs. Salmon die after breeding, so most of those fish are already dead and gone.

Steelhead don't spawn until spring but have followed the salmon into the rivers to feed on eggs. These giant lake-run rainbow trout will continue to trickle in over the winter until it's time to breed.

Anglers who know the excitement of fighting a steelie from a Great Lakes charterboat should try fishing for them in the rivers.

Flyfishers enter the water to fight the fish face-to-face with light rods. Reels should have a good drag system to prevent the light leader from breaking when the fish

Occasionally, a steelhead will leap into the air and dance on its tail before crashing back into the river. When this happens, the fish can land on the leader, breaking it.

To avoid losing a fish, anglers are advised to "bow before a rising fish." By lowering the rod tip, slack is put into the line to prevent breakage.

The flies used for steelhead fishing are very simple. One of the most effective patterns is the egg fly, which can be little more than a piece of yarn tied to a hook.

Another simple pattern is the green caddis nymph. Both of these patterns are easy for beginners to learn how

Other patterns like the sparrow and stonefly nymphs

are only slightly more complicated. All are available in flyshops at home or near the river.

The flies should be fished as close to the bottom of the river as possible. Some flyfishers use monofilament or running line with split-shot attached to a long leader.

Other anglers use sink-tip flyline with a short leader. No matter which method is used to get the fly down, it is important that the fly drifts naturally at the same speed as the current.

Steelhead can be found all over the state. Some of the best rivers, like the Pere Marquette or the Manistee, are found on the western side of Michigan. The Rifle River and lower AuSable on the "sunrise side" also provide good

These rivers are close to grouse and deer hunting opportunities on nearby state land.

Anglers who cannot make the drive up north can find smaller runs on local streams like the Huron and Clinton rivers, which peak in late November.

To learn more about steelhead fishing, consider joining the Michigan Fly Fishing Club. Meetings are at 7:30 p.m. on the first and third Wednesdays of the month at Clarenceville Middle School in Livonia.







In 1926, Henry Ford began to establish, deep in the Amazon jungle, a unique industrial village that would come to be known as Fordlandia. Ford's plan was to harvest rubber from this vast plantation, thus furnishing his auto company with its own supply and relieving it of any dependence on outside sources. Today, almost all signs of this

dreamy dream have disappeared.

Here and there a scabrous building still stands, or an old water hydrant attests to the long-ago presence of the doomed complex. But mostly, Fordlandia has fallen to the forces of nature. A few years after its inception, this symbol of big ideas, great wealth, and large-scale industry began to succumb to a tiny but highly virulent - form of leaf blight. Within a year or so, almost every single one of the millions of rubber trees planted by Ford's workers was dead or dying.

Now comes Fordlandia, a haunting novel with the auto magnate's experiment as a backdrop. We see it mainly through the eyes of an Argentine named Horacio, who is hired by Ford to comb the shores of Brazil's Tapajos River and recruit labor for the project. Supposedly, Horacio gets the

job because he has demonstrated the ability to solve problems. As we shall see, however, Horacio's talent is ultimately limited. Meanwhile, back at his

sprawling industrial empire on

meet Ford himself, "to some. . . a simple man erroneously thought to be complex; to others. . .a complex man whose genius projected a deceiving aura of simplicity." Whatever Ford really was, Sguiglia does not paint him as a sympathetic character here, but as a man who viewed people pretty much like chess pieces to be manipulated in order to fulfill his inventive dreams. We also meet his head hon-

chos, Charles Sorenson and Ernest Liebold, and his son. Edsel, struggling to make his mark in the shadow of his famous father. 



Step back in time with a visit to historic Marsha

celing a need to get away from it all? Whether it's just for the day or a restful end, you can step back in time and be transported into 19th century small town America, well preserved in historical Marshall, Mich., less than 90 miles west of Detroit.

Here, you can walk through leaded glass entry doors that belong to another era, into a par-lor warmed by a fireplace, filled with details of everyday life from more than a century ago that is.

You can creak up an elegant winding staircase to stay in a room where homemade cookies and fresh fruit wait for you on a doily covered night stand, as they did long ago when travelers stayed at this halfway stop (between Detroit and Chicago) of the Michigan Central Railroad. You can tour the town to view its more than 850 historic homes and businesses displaying architecture ranging from Classic Greek Revival to Queen Anne, and actually go inside some of

Preservation

In fact, the US Department of the Interior has designated Mar-shall a National Historic Landmark District because of its architectural preservation efforts and its important part in American History.

The physical preservation of Marshall and its historical heritage serve as the backdrop to what we found most appealing. What stood out to us was the warm personal touch that seems to be disappearing in our hectic lives. People in Marshall seemed to be in a time warp.

Our first glimpse into this people-friendly lifestyle was when we decided to stay at The Joy House, a bed and breakfast north of the landmark fountain in the center of town. When we called to make our reservations, hostess Marcille (Mickie) Turkeyville

We took the tour hosted by an enthusiastic member of the Marshall Historical Society, whose headquarters are in the Honolulu House.

Talkin' turkey bout wines

n a restaurant, we generally acour the wine list to find a fabulous wine that may be underpriced or one that we have not tasted. Then, we look at the menu to choose the best dish with that wine.

That's all turned around when selecting wines for a Thanksgiving

Generally, the American Thanksgiv-ing menu is set by tradition. The var-ied flavor profile of dishes limits the number of best matches, but an old rule works well, serve the driest wines

Since this is the first Thanksgiving in the new millennium, you might want to play on the 2000 theme. Scattered among our recommendations, you'll find Chilean wines, one of the first countries to have vintage 2000 in the market. There's also 2000 Beaujolais Nouveau from France.

Best bets and WOW whites

Sauvignon blanc is a good bet first wine. Its citrusy nature gets the palate primed for good eats to follow. Getting top nod is 1999 Chateau St. Jean Fume Blanc \$13, followed closely behind by 1999 Robert Mondavi Coastal, \$9, 2000 Undurraga, \$7, and 2000 Santa Rita 120, \$7.

If you want the WOW factor, the 1999 Tablas Creek Blanc, \$33, is the best California imitation of a French wine around. A blend of Marsanne. Sauvignon blanc is a good bet first

wine around. A blend of Marsanne. Viognier, and Roussanne, grapes with origins in the Rhone Valley, it's our top pick among white wines. Fruitier and very exciting is 1999 EXP Viog-

Chardonnay is the preferred white wine with turkey and all the tran-

You can judge this varietal by price. Big fruit, more oak, a higher price. Simpler, little or no oak aging,

chardonnay picks listed by price: 1998 Robert Mondavi Reserve, unfiltered, \$36; 1997 Byron Estate, \$32; 1998 Kunde Reserve, \$32; 1999 Errazuriz Wild Ferment, \$22: 1998 Gundlach-Buncschu Rhinefarm Vineyard, \$18; 1998 Fetzer Barrel Select, \$12; 1998 Bogle, \$9; 2000 Undurraga, \$7; and 2000 Santa Rita 120, \$7.

Mellow reds

OK, so you prefer reds. To have the best taste matches, save those big, rich reds for beef, lamb or game at another time. Turkey, mashed potatoes, gravy, yams, and cranberry sauce cry out for mellow reds, such as pinot noir, merlot, syrah, lighter cabernet sauvignon, but especially Zinfandel. Prices here are all over the board. The fullest-flavored are \$10 and up.

Winner in the Zin category this Thanksgiving is 1998 Dry Creek Vine-yard Old Vines, \$19, followed closely by 1998 Murphy-Goode Liars Dice, \$19, 1997 Haywood Rocky Terrace Vineyard, \$35, and new-comer 1997 Mariah, \$27, from the Mendocino Ridge appellation. Best buys Zins: 1997 Fetzer Barrel Select, \$14; 1998 Chateau Souverain, \$13; and 1998 Bogle Old Vine Cuvee, \$10.

With its superb spice and peppery notes, the 1998 Sanford Pinot Noir, \$35, won this category hands down. Subtler, charming versions include: 1998 Domaine Carneros, \$38; 1997 Byron Sierra Madre Vineyards, \$32; and 1998 Robert Mondavi Carneros

Cabernet sauvignon does not work well with turkey unless it's very fruity. So, the lower-priced wines with little oak aging are generally best matches. We found 2000 Undurrage, \$7, and 1996 Bogle, \$11, fit this bill.

Beaujolais Nouvasu 2000 comes from a great vintage full of bright, ripe, savory fruit. You can't miss with the King of Beaujolais Georges

Duboeuf at \$9.





Margaret Cartier, 82, of Redford Township has decades of practice making her super moist and fluffy stuffing. "I use toast-ing bread, and I use the crusts. It's stupid to take the crusts off." When asked the secret of per-

fect stuffing, Cartier replied: Three beaten eggs and sautéing the onion and celery together in real butter. I also use scalded milk. That makes it real fluffy and pudding like. Also, don't stuff it too tightly into the bird's cavity."

Herbs

When it comes to herbs, stuffing lovers seem to be divided between sage and marjoram. Wysocki prefers the "a real strong flavor of sage," but Sylvia Graye (Alyce's mother) and Cartier prefer to season their stuffing with marjoram, especially their own home-grown variety, which they cut, dry and store in tightly covered Mason jars.

"My mother only used marjoram," said Cartier. "She only knew one herb in her life and that was marjoram. She never knew sage."

If you use poultry season - a blend of ground sage, rosemary thyme, marjoram, savory, or other herb, seeds and salt make sure it's very fresh, no more than a year old, says Garrison. She prefers Bells' poultry season, which comes in a little



CALVADOS RYE STUFFING

The Calvados provides an absolutely heady aroma when the stuffing is spooned from the cavity.

1/4 pound (1 stick) butter 4-6 celery ribs, finely chopped (2 cups)

1 large onion, finely chopped (1 cup)

6 Golden Delicious apples, peeled, cored and chopped (about 6 cups)

18 slices dark or light seedless rye bread, dried and broken into postage stamp-size pieces (about 18 cups)

2 teaspoons dried sage leaves, crumbled 1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper 2/3 cup light cream or half-and-half

1/3 to 1/2 cup Calvados or other apple brandy

Heat the butter in a large skillet until molted. Pour off 1/4 cup and set aside. Add the celery, onion and apples to the remaining butter and cook over medium-high heat, stirring frequently until crisp tendercrisp. Combine the skillet mixture, bread, sage, salt and pepper in a large bowl and toss gently until wellmixed. Drizzle the cream over the ingredients and toss again. Add the reserved 1/4 cup melted butter and 1/3 cup Calvados. Toss gently until well-blended.





Don't groan over leftovers; Fix an enchilada casserole

A big heliday decision, if you come from a small family, as I do, is whether to have turkey with all the trimmings for Thanksgiving or settle for a lesser main course. My family usually went for the turkey – and lots of leftovers. This meant getting good at using up the extra turkey without getting fed up with it.

Since we all liked dark meat, our leftovers were mostly breast meat, which is a lot easier to recycle than drumsticks. The first thing my mother did was strip this meat off the carcass, using the rest to make soup, which provided a flavorful partner to go with the leftovers.

Looking at how we used these leftovers, you can see how eating habits have changed. Our favorite was turkey sandwiches on white toast, slathered with mayonnaise and sometimes bacon as well. Now, I use whole-grain bread, a great slab of tomato, some lettuce and a drizzle of balsamic vinaigrette in place of the mayo.

A vegetable- and fruit-filled curry is another contemporary choice. For this, sauté a whole, chopped Spanish onion and a diced apple in one tablespoon of butter. Simmer them with curry powder to taste, plus a cup of broth, until they turn very soft. Add a large, diced potato, cook until it's tender and

then mix in diced turkey at the end.

Tex-Mex dishes are another way to use up turkey leftovers. For fajitas, I brush sliced turkey with a flick of oil. Toss on a very hot grill just until warm. Then roll the turkey in a flour tortilla, along with grilled onions, green penpers and salsa.

Try Turkey Enchilada Casserole. The turkey goes so well with the corn tortillas, and everyone loves the tangy green salsa and creamy cheese in this cozy dish.

TURKEY ENCHILADA CASSEROLE

- 1 1/2 cups diced cooked turkey
- 1 15-ounce can pinto beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 14 3/4-ounce can creamed corn
- 2/3 cup reduced-fat sour cream, or dairy-free soy sour cream
- 3 scallions, green and white parts, chopped 6 corn tortillas
- 4 (O and decay
- 1/2 cup green saisa
 4 slices low-fat American cheese
- 4 slices low-fat American cheese, or dairy-free soy cheddar

Preheat the oven to 375 °F. Combine turkey and beans in a bowl. Mix corn, 1/2 cup of sour cream and scallions together in another bowl.

Soften and warm tortillas. On a gas burner, place one at a time directly on the burner grid, over a medium flame, until warm and flat, 20 to 30 seconds, turning once. Repeat until all the tortillas are warm. If using an electric stove, use a dry, cast-iron skillet over medium heat. Place one tortilla at a time in the skillet and heat on both sides, about 45 seconds in total. To keep tortillas warm during this process, stack them on a plate and cover with a dish towel.

Spread half the salsa over the bottom of an 8-inch square baking dish. Cover with two tortillas, tearing the second one in half to fit.

Spread half the turkey mixture over tortillas. Cover with half the corn mixture. Lay four slices of cheese over corn. Add another layer of tortillas. Cover with remaining salsa, turkey and corn mixtures. Lay rest of tortillas on top. Spread remaining sour cream over tortillas. Top with remaining cheese.

Bake uncovered until casserole is bubbly and heated through, 25 to 30 minutes. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.

Makes 6 servings. If breast meat is used, each contains 303 calories and 5 grams of fat.

You mean there's more? Pour it on toast

Everybody loves turkey leftovers, especially when recycled into this delicious dish:

OLD-FASHIONED CREAMED TURKEY

- IN TOAST CUPS
- 12 slices very soft white bread, crusts removed 1 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 tablespoon butter 1 small onion, minced (1/4 cup)
- 1/4 cup minced green or red bell pepper
- 1 10 3/4-ounce can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 1/2 cup milk
 2 cups 1/2-inch cubes dark or white cooked
- turkey or chicken meat 1/4 cup diced pimiento
- Chopped fresh parsley for garnish

Preheat oven to 350° F. With a rolling pin, roll the

slices of bread flat. Brush one side of each slice with the melted butter, then fit the slices into 12 2-1/2-inch muffin-pan cup, buttered sides up. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes, or until the crusts are lightly browned. Cool before removing from the muffin pan.

Melt the butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat. When hot, add the onion and pepper and cook, stirring frequently until softened. Reduce the heat to medium and gradually stir in the soup and milk until blended. Stir in the turkey and pimiento and continue to cook, stirring, until bubbly. Place two to three bread cups per serving on each plate. Spoon the creamed turkey into the cups and sprinkle with parsley. Yields 4 to 6 servings.

Variations: Instead of toast cups, the creamed turkey may be spooned over waffles, split biscuits, corn bread, rice, or mashed potatoes.

are simply not cute. As a pediatrician, I can't ignore the prob-lems of obesity in children. I'm impressed by how many kids are overweight and obese.

These are medical



diagnoses that meet specific medical criteria, including the child's height, weight and body mass index (BMI).

The number of overweight children has increased dramatically over a relatively brief period. I see these kids on an almost daily basis. I am not talking about weight issues caused primarily by an underlying medical condition. The current increase in childhood obesity has several causes. Two are especially important because we can modify them: intake of high-calorie foods and a sedentary lifestyle.

Health problems

What are some of the problems caused by obesity? Children can have high levels of lipids. This puts them at risk for coronary heart disease and strokes. Obesity also places our children at risk for diabetes mellitus type II, often called adultonset diabetes. Just a few years ago, when I was a resident physician, diabetes mellitus II was rare in children. Now, its incidence is rising, particularly in adoles-

Obesity can also cause low self-esteem, orthopedic problems, hormonal problems, sleep apnea, depression, psychosocial issues, eating disorders and primary

I think of Jessica. She is already at risk for diabetes at the tender age of seven. We are working with her family to decrease her significantly high levels of lipids and her weight of 170 pounds. Jessica has a very supportive mother who does her best However, it is difficult to change a family's dietary habits and lifestyle, which lead to fewer healthy dinners at home and more eating out. Who can resist the amaz-ingly "cheap" and easily accessible super-sized meals?

Jason, a 120-pound kindergartner, eats several cupcakes every day, and washes them down with plenty of "healthy" juice as he watches an average of three or four hours of television. What started out as a cuptabe here and there has became a daily ritual. Jason recently had his adenoids removed, partly because his weight puts him at whit for alley appea, a politic tially dangerous condition.


Casey, my 16-year-old patient, doesn't want to go to her homecoming dance this weekend. She realizes "out of the blue" that she weighs 75 pounds more than she did exactly one year ago. A diet history reveals that her hearty intake of juice and pop along with her frequent fast-food intake is partly responsible for her signifi-

Don't ignore

Obesity in children should not be taken lightly. It is a growing problem with devastating effects. Sadly, it is a problem we often den't see until after the harmful effects are evident. Periodic well-child vis-its are essential for all children, even those who seem healthy. Height and weight are measured at every visit. A careful look at the growth chart may be the only indication that a child is at serious risk for obesity. And early identification of the child at risk is better than

Programs explore emotions of overeating

ome people are genetically predisposed to gain-ing weight. It goes back to our cavemen days when super efficient metabolisms made use of every single calorie. It was a matter of survival. In today's fast-food, sedentary culture, those people are in trouble.

"When you have a very efficient body, gaining weight is easy because you don't need that many calories to survive. Anything extra you eat immediately goes into storage," said Dr. José Franciso Cara, section head of pediatric endocrinology and diabetes at Henry Ford Hospital.


Problems begin in early childhood when fat cells are forming. Too many fat cells destine a child to fight the fight the battle of the bulge all of her or his life. "No matter how much you diet you can never get rid of fat cells," said Cara.

His recommended antidote for childhood obesity -

The American Heart Association now recognizes obesity as a major risk factor for coronary disease. It also leads to high blood pressure, gallstones, degenerative disk disease and can induce diabetes. Sadly, more obese children are developing Type 2 diabetes, once known as "adult-onset diabetes," said Cara.

Obesity is a complex condition that results from the interaction of genetic, behavioral and environmental factors. It is not easy to treat, especially in a society that uses food as a reward. Little Johnny's soccer team wins the game? Let's go out for ice cream. Mary won a major contract for her company? Let's go out for dinner.

For many individuals, food means comfort. It

The cost of the program is \$400, which includes a free orientation, 10 group sessions, two individual sessions with the social worker, plus workbook and written materials. (Care Choices reimburses families 50 percent of the cost.)

According to Shapedown literature, 85 percent of the children and teens maintained or lost weight during the program. The program's success is based on family commitment. Parents, as well as children, learn and practice the necessary skills for a healthier lifestyle

Their clients so far are group home residents who pay for their sessions with vouchers provided by the county through Community Living Services. However, Koelver and Bedford hope that families from the community people caring for developmentally people or elderly parents at home - will soon find the center's activities programs attrac-

"We want to bring moms and dads and kids and grandparents back together so they can experience memorable times," said Koelver.

The partners have created a program of craft and cooking projects that are offered 9 a.m. to noon and 1-4 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. Clients can attend either session. It's All About You is not a day-care center, they stressed.

"We don't want people to be just dropped off and left for the day," said Bedford.

Also, experience has shown them that shorter sessions are better suited to their clients' activity spans. "Our intention is for our programs to always be positive, never so long they get boring," said Koelver.

Kids and cholesterol: It's not a matter of baby fat

RESEARCH

The more fast food restaurants your community has, the more at-risk you and your kids are for heart disease, researchers say.

Since lifelong eating patterns are established in childhood, it is vital for parents to monitor their children's diets and instill healthy eating habits to keep cholesterol under control.

"We don't have much time to prepare food. Traditionally we and salt because these are the foods kids like and they are easy to feed them," said Dr. Shawna Nesbitt, assistant professor of internal medicine and chief of the Lipid Clinic at the University of Michigan Health System.

The Tecumseh blood pressure study conducted in Michigan

tracked children from age six 6 to their 20s. "The children who had those patterns of high cholesterol, among other risk factors, in early childhood also manifested higher risk for the disease process as they became young adults," said Nesbitt.

Communities where the risk of developing cardiovascular dis-ease is highest have the greatest concentration of fast-food restaurants. The food is quick and inexpensive, but the fat content is much higher than what is recfeed children diets high in fat ommended in national dietary guidelines. Studies have demonstrated that fat content in food away from home, including school lunches and snacks, tends to be at least 10 percent higher in fat content than food eaten at

Children often consume foods high in fat and sodium - hamburgers, pizza and lunchmeats for example. Parents can help lower fat and sodium intake by buying low-fat snacks and foods and by limiting the quantity their children eat.

"One of the biggest problems we have is that even though we purchase low-fat snacks or lowfat milk and low-fat cheese, we have no control over how much children consume and that provides an excess of calories," said Nesbitt.

Any child older than age two should have a total fat content of no more than 30 percent of total calories. The calorie intake for children ages two to nine should be 1,600 calories a day; and for ages 9 to 18, 2,200 a day, said Nesbitt.

Cholesterol alarm

Anyone over the age of two should be concerned about cholesterol, especially if hypercholesterolemia - excessively high cholesterol levels - runs in the family. Health-threatening high cholesterol can develop in early childhood. These children are more at risk of developing early heart disease

"Having high cholesterol levels is part of increased risk factors for children, including obesity, high insulin levels and higher blood pressure," said Nesbitt.

Children don't manifest high cholesterol at the same rates as adults. However, the early stages of that process are evident in studies, said Nesbitt. "The blood vessels of children have what are called fatty streaks, which are the beginnings of the atherosclerotic pro-

Ideally, the normal cholesterol level for children is less than 170. But children with familial hypercholesterolemia have much higher numbers.

"The rates are much higher in children of parents who already know they have early heart disease; that is heart disease in women before age 55 and in men before age 45," said Nesbitt. These children are more likely to have high cholesterol levels that

continue into adulthood. "Having high cholesterol in childhood is genetically related to their parents. One type is homozygous, meaning the chil-

diet," said program coordinator Beth Darnell, a certified social worker. "When the family brings the child to orientation, that's a very strong statement. The parents want to be on the same

During the first part of a twohour Shapedown class, parents and children meet together. It's an opportunity for the children to indulge in a "brag session," said Darnell. They can boast about the amount of exercise they did or about keeping up their food diary. Boasting builds self-esteem and establishes camaraderie.

During the second part, the children participate in a group exercise session. Lastly, both parents and children come together for a common activity. such as learning how to make healthy snacks. Foods are not labeled "good" and "bad," but rather "light" and "heavy." Parents and children also learn how

to read and analyze food labels. A healthy weight-loss for children is one-half to one pound a week, said Darnell. "Even maintaining weight is good because ... many of these children come in the program having gained 15-30 pounds the previous year," ... she added.

Shapedown is a win-win program for the entire family, since it requires parents to act as role models, setting goals not only for their children, but fore themselves, said Darnell. "The family-based component is makes this program successful."





Nesbitt. These children need to be treated not only with dietary mechanisms early on, but also may need medications earlier than other children.

Good example

Nesbitt suggests that the best way to cultivate healthy eating habits in children is by early example at home. "Healthier living habits include increased physical activity and low-fat diets that continue into adulthood," she says.

She notes the general lack of physical activity for many children. "Children spend more and more time watching television, playing video games and in front of their computers; they don't get any physical activity that works off the calories," she says. Nesbitt recommends at least 30 to 40 minutes of aerobic type exercise and games daily for chil-

Parents can help their children by focusing on their own health screenings and practices, said Nesbitt.



Holiday lights - use 'em safely



decorate your home for the holidays, here are a few electrical

safety precautions. Check the strings of lights for cracked insulation on the wire, broken sockets and plugs and missing bulbs. When hanging lights

around your home, make sure hooks or nails holding lights don't hit the

Extension cords should be 16- or 18-gauge wire, and the connections should be wrapped in plastic and sealed with electrical tape. This will protect the connections and keep them from being accidentally unplugged. If you must cross a sidewalk or drive, tape the cord down with weather proof duct tape or enclose the cord in a vinyl cord guard. No more than three strings connected end-to-end.

Strings of 35 and 50 miniature lights use 29 watts, and 70-100-light strings use 48 watts. The average 15amp home circuit will handle 1,800 watts. But you have to consider what else is connected to the circuit such as lamps, a computer, sound system and TV. The larger, candelabra base lights (2 and 3 inches high) require five and seven watts, respectively, per

Setting on and off times for your holiday lights will save dollars on your electric bill. Timers are available as units that plug in or are permanently wired to the circuit. You may want to have more than one timer because many timers have limited amperage.

Send would-be burglars away empty-handed

Police say there are three kinds of burglars - professional, semi-professional and amateur. Housebreakers are usually semiprofessional or amateur, and they generally spend less than five minutes trying to enter a home. Taking precautions that deter or delay them will decrees your chance of being their next victim.

Keep plants and trees that grow close to the house well trimmed. Overgrown bushes make a great hiding place for burglars. Don't make things easy intruders by leaving out ladders or other tools they could use to get into your home. Lock them away a garage or backyard shed.

Keep your yard well lighted. Motion-sensitive fixtures and photo cell light fixtures (that turn on at dusk and off dawn) are effective an also adds to the aesthetic value of your home, and they only use about as milch electricity as a night light.

Make it appear that someone is always at home. Inexpensive appliance timers may be used to turn lights, radios or other items on and off when you are not at home. Some timers may be set for times of day and days of the week.

Install sound deadbolt locks on all entry doors. "It's also a good idea to replace the screws in the strike plate with ones at least three inches long," says Andrea Rosson, an associate at The Home Depot. "This makes it more difficult for an intruder to kick or shove his way in by ripping the strike plate out of the door frame.

All entry doors should also have a peephole, side-lights or a window that allow you to see who is at the door. Find a way to peer outside without being seen. Semi-sheer window coverings or blinds are good options.

Keep a flashlight with fresh batteries velcroed to the bed frame in every bedroom.



any type of house design." The added benefits aren't what you might expect. It's not just hundreds of dollars in potential energy savings each year from lower heating and

cooling bills. Houses with better insulation and tighter construction tend to be quieter. Less noise is transmitted from room to room or from outside sources.

The first aspect of energy efficient design is constructing the "thermal envelope," the structural components that physically separate the living spaces from the outdoors.

Wall and roof assemblies go beyond the traditional "stick"


construction. For example, Structural Insulated Panels (SIPs) are plywood or oriented strand board sheets laminated to a core of foam board.


Since the SIP acts as both the framing avi the insulation construction is much faster, the AHA maintains. The quality is often superior to framed walls because the units are pre-fabricated under factory-controlled

Remember also to demand more insulation than the bare minimum that local building codes require, depending on local climate, the AHA recommends.

For example, in the northeast R-11 in the exterior walls and R-19 in the ceiling simply don't cut it. Go for R-20 to R-30 in the walls, and R-50 to R-70 in the ceiling.

Tightly sealed homes should be ventilated to reduce air moisture infiltration, prevent mold and vent indoor air pollutants to the outside.




























Home work isn't as complex as it may seem

By Joseph Thung Tonar's Hosmowe

Using a ladder on stairs is just as dangerous as it looks. If you must paint a stairwell, use two ladders.

Lean one against the wall on the lower landing and place the other ladder on the upper landing. Then lay a scaffold plank across the two ladders, making sure it's level. Clamp the plank to each ladder to eliminate any chance of it sliding or shifting.

Only use a plank that's specifically made for use on scaffolding. A standard construction-grade 2x8 or 2x10 can break under your weight.

Pickup trick

If you have a wet-dry vacuum, here's a convenient, no-stoop way to use it to pick up wood chips, sawdust and dirt from the floor of a garage, workshop or shed. First, you'll have to buy an extra wand and floor nossle for your machine. Use two metal straps to attach the wand vertically to a wall. Make sure the neggle sits about onehalf inch above the floor.

The next time you need to clean up, simply hook the vacuum hose to the wall-mounted wand and turn on the vacuum. As you sweep the debris toward the nozzle, the vacuum will automatically suck it up.

Stopping paint spatters

The challenge of painting without making a mess doesn't end until the last can of paint is sealed up - and sometimes not even then. Why? There's often a small amount of paint trapped in the rim of the can. When you tap down the lid, the paint squirts out usually right at you as if it were laser-

To avoid getting spattered, place the lid on the can, then cover it with a rag. Lay a 2x4 block across the rag and tap it with a hammer to seal the can. The rag will absorb any paint that shoots out. The 2x4 will protect the rim from being crushed by the hammer.

Spackling screen test

Here's an effective way to patch small- and medium-size holes in drywall using two unlikely objects: a pencil and an aluminum window screen. Start by cutting a square piece of screen about 4 inches larger than the hole. Thread a length of string through the center of the screen. Now, keeping a firm grip on the string, roll up the screen and push it through the hole in the wall. Tug on the string to flatten the screen against the back of the dry-

wall. Then lay the pencil across the hele and tie it in place with the string. Use a putty knife to fill the hele with

spackling compound. Apply enough pressure to squeeze some of the compound through the holes in the screen. When the patch is dry, untie the pencil, cut away the string ends and apply another coat of spackling compound.

If you don't have any aluminum screening, substitute a piece of hardware cloth.

Wallpaper-removal tip

Here's an easy way to speed up the tedious chore of stripping wallpaper. After you perforate the surface of the paper with a wallpaper scoring tool, use a garden sprayer to soak the surface with wallpaper stripper, a mixture of water and distilled white vinegar or

Allow the liquid to seek throu perferations and disselve the adi perferations and dissilve the adher-keep the paper wat for at least 20 a utes. Peel back one corner of the w per. If it easily comes off the wall, the adhesive is dissolved. If it doe spray the wallpaper again and wait 10 more minutes.

An open stepladder, laid on its side, can be used as a makeshift sawherse. Lay the board you're cutting across the legs. Just be careful you don't saw into

Pinishing nails are typically set below the surface of the wood, and then the holes are filled with putty. Here's an easier way to conceal them: Drive in the nails at a slight angle, then set them below the surface. When seen from the opposite angle, the holes will be hidden from view.

Holiday lights add sparkle, charm

New homes and old soon will be decorated with the colorful lights of the holiday season. What is important is that those lights - both interior and exterior - be safety- checked prior to installation.

Claudia Gabay, Detroit Edison's corporate lighting consultant, said when decorating with seasonal lighting, safety should be a

"The hustle and bustle of the holiday season shouldn't prevent people from checking their decorative lights and other trimmings for safety hazards," Gabay said.

"Just because your lights worked effectively last year doesn't mean that everything will be okay this year. A few minutes spent checking cords for potential hazards can possibly prevent a fire or worse."

Nearly every year, tragedy strikes during the holiday season with house fires that start because of faulty or damaged electrical cords and improper use of electrical outlets and electrical decorations.

Lights should be thrown away if they have frayed wires, damaged sockets and cracked or missing insulation. To reduce the possibility of electrical shock or fires, check for an Underwriters Laboratory (UL) label before stringing lights and installing decorations.

Gabay warned that some light sets and other decorations may be stamped with fake UL labels and not designed properly for safe operation. If you are suspicious about a low price on light sets, she said, compare the UL label with another on a name brand set.

Home decorators also should make sure lights are used as the manufacturers intend-

Gabay noted that homeowners can use a simple "touch test" to determine if a light set is potentially dangerous.

"If indoor lights are hot to the touch, I wouldn't use them," she said. Most lights cost from less than one cent to

Department stores still need extra help during the holidays



BY PAM FLEMING SPECIAL WRITER

With holiday shoppers beginning to flood area retail establishments, area department stores are still looking for part-time workers who want to pick up a little extra cash to purchase gifts and decorations.

Marlene Pendell, store recruiter at Kohl's in Canton, said that she hasn't had any trouble finding those extra people to work the holiday rush. "I'm not having a hard time filling positions at all," she said. "I've had a lot of people coming in to fill out applications.'

Pendell said she actually starts the recruiting process for holiday help in September but will be hiring people for a few more weeks. "It's not too late to inquire about part-time holiday work. And, I never stop looking for the right person," she added.

With expanded store hours and more

shoppers, stores depend on part-time employees every year. Pendell said the Canton location hires about 75 parttime people each holiday season, Most work 10 to 20 hours a week, and the pay scale depends on the job and the applicant's experience. Part-time employees also receive a store discount so they can save money on their gift purchases.

Many workers return the next year to work their holiday-season job. "I just had a guy in Receiving to work again this year who was here last year, and I was glad to have him," Pendell said. Most holiday workers are people who have other jobs and just need some extra money for gifts. "Some stay-athome moms work in the evenings after Dad gets home so they don't have to hire a baby-sitter to come to work," she noted.

And, just because the holiday season

ends doesn't mean that the need for part-time workers stops. "A lot of people stay on to work after the holidays are over," Pendell said.

Marty Watz, assistant store manager at JC Penney's in Westland, said he desperately needs extra workers at his store this year. "We're having very limited applications. We have openings available in every department." He said his store also increases its work force by about 75 people during the holiday shopping season, which runs from early November through the first of the year.

The week after Christmas is as busy as the week before with clearance sales, returns and exchanges," he said. The number of hours that holiday-season employees work varies, he said. "We have people working from 15 to 40 hours a week." He noted that JC Pen-

It is my practice to get a date for a call back from the employer at the end of the interview. That is how I understand my responsibility as a candidate and good interviewing technique. All too often, the manager or headhunter does not call beel and I am left hanging. When I then call to ask for updates, I am often put into voice mail and my calls are still not returned. The hard part is trying to determine how aggressive I should be. It would be easier and

ney's also has people who come back to their holiday job year after year. "We hire a lot of homemakers and college students."

Despite efforts aimed at attracting part-time holiday personnel, Wats said there's always a need. "We've tried different things over the years, but mainly we rely on walk in and

less stressful for all applicants if hiring authorities simply kept to the agreed upon call back schedule. No one likes to deliver bad news, particularly telling worthy or

needy applicants that they did not make the cut. It must, however,

Employers and agencies alike are guilty of this silence. They should remember that every applicant is a potential customer, future hire or alternate candidate. For business reasons alone, good relations need to be maintained.

Turning someone down properly involves a telephone call and a conversation. Email or snail mail is unacceptable. And it should be done as soon as practicable, not when it's convenient. The applicant needs to move on to the next opportunity.

Interviewers, please don't make applicants chase you. Take a minute to consider the applicant's perspective and needs. Until the company actually makes an offer, the employer (or agency) is in control. No one likes to be kept in the dark. Make the call. Grant M.

Dear Grant:

Great letter. The absence of deliberate, timely and clear communication is probably the most frustrating part of looking for a job.

Interviewers do have an obligation to provide feedback and, eventually, closure. I suppose there a few employers and headhunters who are just callous, lazy or rude. But not many. Let me shed some light on the silence that frequently follows meetings with recruiters and employers.

This is to explain, not excuse: First, interviewers themselves often have difficulty getting information

or making things happen inside their organizations or with their clients. More often than not, the first person who interviewed you is not the one with the juice. Rather, he or she is an information courier, mere conduit to the decision-maker. When the person who is really in charge simply situates your resume and does not provide your contact with any opinions, verdicts or schedules, the interviewer – like you – is left hanging. I'm as guilty as anyone for doing a poor job of calling people back in these cases. I can tell a person "No, you didn't get the job," but I am embarrassed to tell someone, for the lifth time, five weeks after the first interview, "I still don't have any information for you." Lets of recepition conjugate to the source. information for you." Lots of recruiting assignments start out with great urgency and slowly fizzle.

Next, some interviewers have difficulty telling people "No" when they don't have a reasonable explanation for the decision. Through experience they've learned that a rejected candidate will invariably ask Why? And often there is no crisp answer to this question, or at least not one that smacks of common sense. Many - maybe most - hiring decisions are large ly subjective in nature. I've written often about the disproportionate weight given to likeability. Skills and experience are regarded as givens or secondary factors. Were you the most qualified? Maybe. Did you get the job? Sorry. What HR person wants to explain or defend that kind of conclu-

Recruiters and company interviewers are less reluctant to give bad news than non-news or ambiguous news or stupid news. But you're right. Even if that's all they have, they should make the call.

Included as standard equipment are racing bred front suspension systems, extruded aluminum engine cradle, largest in class fourwheel disc brakes, 16-inch tires, front brake cooling technology, ABS and full functional traction control. The popular On-Star communications system is standard on the SS.

The 3800-V6 in our SS is basically the same engine that powers many sibling General Motors products. It's a bulletproof, 200-horsepower engine, but to pep things up a bit, Chevrolet should consider offering the Che supercharged version currently available in Buick

and Pontiac models.



The lone transmission availability is the 4-speed automatic that offers reliability and performance. Safety-wise, Monte Carlo meets the 2003 govern-

ment standards for head injury protection by offering dual front and driver side-impact air bags as standard equipment. A safety cage construction complements a long list of security features. Included are a new structural headliner, energy absorbing foam in the side pillars, and even a "glow in the dark" in the trunk release handle.

Inside, Monte Carlo's cabin is one of the better we've experienced. Comfort and amenities abound, all dashboard gauges are large and easy to read, and control knobs are within easy reach. The high-end stereo sounded great, too.

Outwardly, the short rear deck on Monte Carlo is captivating with its racy rear spoiler very evident. Huge rear tail lamps are impressive and instant eye catchers as is the



NASCAR-bred hood and front-end arrangement. Overall, Monte Carlo's design is a marriage of style, aerodynamics and logic, with sweeping lines that culminate in excellent visibility

The trunk allows 15.8 cu. ft. of cargo space while reducing the likelihood of cargo damage by adding non-intrusive, gas-assisted trunk hinges. Other specifications include a 110.5 wheelbase, 17-gallon fuel tank, and a 3391-pound curb weight. EPA numbers for the 3.8 V-6 are 20/30, excellent for a car of this size.

The SS base price of \$22,400 is attractive, but can creep up quickly with the noted options. Our model came in at \$26,888 fully loaded, including heated seats (\$120), leather buckets (\$625), upgraded stereo CD (\$223), power passenger seat (\$305) and an SS Preferred Group (\$615).

This car appeals to both male and female drivers, especially those who love NASCAR racing, where Monte Carlo has won more Cup races than any car in history. Four door Chevy enthusiasts may want to check the 2001 Impala, which is built on the same platform and offers identical power train choices.

On the road, Monte Carlo is a good handler for a larger car. Whether merging on a freeway, passing on a two-lane road or just cruising, the SS did everything well.

Bottom line? We hope a Supercharged V6 appears one day, making the SS a true "bowtie" legend performer. Other than that, it's a great






