State: Township's accounting OK

Building fund practices 'acceptable'

BY BRAD KADRICH STAFF WRITER

After initially agreeing with local criticism of how Plymouth Township officials document money in the

township's building fund, Michigan Department of Treasury officials late last week reversed themselves, calling the township's accounting practices "acceptable"

In a letter dated Sept 25,

Suzanne Schafer, administrator for the department's Local Audit and Finance Division, told township Treasurer Ron Edwards, The Department of Treasury feels the most appropriate manner is to create a separate fund and allocate all related overhead costs to this fund The Department of

Treasury will allow local units to continue to account for this activity within the General Fund, as long as the local units fee structure is not intended to recover the full cost of the enforcing agency'

What does all that mean? "We have made clear how the treasury department feels it

should be done,' said Terry Stanton, public information officer for the Department of Treasury, but the way Plymouth Township is doing it would be acceptable

The flap started when township resident Don Schnettler,

After being elected in 1999, Michele Potter said she had to undergo a learning curve before comfortably settling into her role as a Plymouth city commissioner

Its been challenging at times, and its been very rewarding," said Potter I feel I've made a positive contribution over the past four years, and I'd like to serve

another four I like seeing the city thrive, and it seems to be more vital now that it ever has been'

Potter is one of five candidates seeking four seats on the city com mission in the Nov 4 general election Just as the first four years have been, Potter knows the next four will be challenging for the commission as residents will also decide the

Team effort brought Westland chase to successful conclusion

At the beginning, Plymouth Township Police Officer Scott Linton wasn't sure what he had, only that the car he was behind looked similar to one Westland police were looking for

By the time he was in the middle of a high-chase pursuit that


frequently exceeded 115 mph, Linton knew he was chasing an alleged killer, information that made focusing on catching him that much easier

Linton, a five-year veteran of the township police, was the first to spot the Corvette being driven by Michael Lamont Schofield Sept 11, moments after Schofield and his companion, 24-year-old Leslie

Gordon of Detroit, allegedly shot six people, killing four at a Westland party store

And it was Linton who stayed with the Corvette during a chase that started on I-275 in Plymouth Township and ended up in a residential Detroit neighborhood at McNichols and the Southfield



Cougar sighting reported in area

Was that a cougar spotted in a field near Michigan and Haggerty Monday morning? Canton police are treating the report as authentic although no additional sightings had been reported as of Wednesday afternoon

About 9 a m Monday a resident reported sighting the animal in the Michigan/Haggerty area Police and animal control officers responded and reported finding tracks, apparently belonging to a cougar, in the general area The cougar is believed to be traveling along a river bank in that area.

According to police, based on the size of the footprints, it is believed to weigh approximately 70 pounds. It isn't known if the animal was a pet or if it has been declawed.

Dr Patrick Rusz, head of cougar research at the Michigan Wildlife Conservancy, saïd-the cougar shouldn't be a threat to people and will not attack unless provoked He said nothing should be done if it is seen again because it will probably leave the area on its own

"They're telling us not to touch it," said Canton Police Lt Rob Cripe

According to the wildlife conservancy, cougars are protected under the Endangered Species Act and cannot be harmed except to protect human life and, by permit only, to protect

A cougar was reportedly spotted in Van Buren Township about two weeks ago

But Bill Sutherland, owner of Varmint Police, said he's skeptical that the cat is a wild cougar "My theory is it's somebody's

(pet) cat,' he said "They turned it loose or it got loose
Sutherland said he did find

Sutherland said he did find tracks and based on those he estimates the critter to weigh 60 to 80 pounds

He says he doesn't believe there are any wild cougars or mountain lions or similar animals in the state. But he says until he sees the animal himself, he's not drawing any conclusions. And he's still checking out the area.

Emily Brock, president of Canton Hills Homeowners Association which is north of Michigan and east of Lilley, said she hasn't seen any cougars but she has seen coyotes and a fox in her neighbor-

They (Varmint Police) are telling us to ask people to stop feeding the deer," she said

"That attracts other predators"
She said a rabbit was killed in her gazebo last week. She doesn't know what killed it, but there are coyotes in the area and at least five cats have turned up missing.

"Because of all the building that's going on," she said, "they (wildlife) are being pushed into our neighborhood. I live in the woods and love it because I love nature. But I don't want to live with cougars and coyotes."

Cougar Park marchers get regional top 10

Band's show a work in progress, but performance earns 6th place

Still a work in progress, the Plymouth-Canton Educational Park Marching Band's performance of their exotic show, "Souls of the Gypsy Caravan," earned the 170 marchers a spot in the top 10 finalists among the 28 bands from five states at the Bands of America Regional Competition held at the Pontiac Silverdome Sept 27

'I was thrilled with their performance at finals," said a pleased Marc Whitlock, director of bands at the Park. "When they went out on the field they were hungry to do a great job and they did"

Assistant Director Brian
Miller agreed "I thought they
did fantastic," he said "There
was a big improvement from
the preliminary competition
and also from the previous
day's practice"

That's something Joe Lorenz, a Canton senior percussionist, recognized

'We definitely improved from the preliminary to the finals competition," he said "There was a big energy difference and I think we did really well We just went out and put all we had on the field It's a great feeling coming off the field knowing that's your best performance so far"

This was the first regional competition for Angel Ayoub, a Plymouth freshman and clarinetist

I thought we did pretty good tonight," she said "Marching band is cool It may be a lot of work, but it pays off"

With about two-thirds of their show complete, the hometown performers captured the sixth-place trophy with a score of 74–35. The top spot went to the Centerville Jazz Band from Centerville, Ohio, 81–25. Other Michigan bands in the finals included Reeths-Puffer from Muskegon, seventh with a 73–4 and Jenison High School, 68–0 for eighth

With a teaching philosophy of perfecting each portion of the show before adding the next, Plymouth-Canton was

the only one among the finalist bands with an incomplete show "I think the judges recognized that our show has a certain amount of depth and emotion," said Whitlock

He was impressed with the abilities of the bands, from Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Ohio and Kentucky, in this year's regional competition


"This is the strongest display of talent I have seen at these regionals in quite a few years," said Whitlock "Of the top six bands this year, all have been Bands of America Grand National finalists and three of them, including Plymouth-Canton, have won the championship"

Whitlock said he sees a trend toward stronger and stronger performances Many of the bands over the years, he said, including Plymouth-Canton and Marion Catholic from Illinois, have been trend-set-

Other groups over time begin to figure out the formula for success and the playing field becomes much tighter, and that is very good," said Whitlock

"It has nothing to do with competition, it has everything to do with pushing the activity to a new level"

This was the first time in 15 years the Bands of America

"We are thrilled to return to Pontiac after so many years, said Bands of America President and CEO Scott McCormick "We have many of the finest bands in this region of the country performing

One of the challenges of performing in the Silverdome, according to Whitlock, is the echoing "We call the Silverdome the echo chamber,"

ne said "When the musicians hear three different tempos in our production all going at the same time with three echoes at the same time too, they really have to watch the drum majors," he explained

"With the speed of light much faster than the speed of sound, they have to trust what they see more than what they hear"


Expressway, concluding with one suspect dead of a selfinflicted gunshot wound and the other eventually being bound over for trial in the brutal murders of four people

Initially, Linton focused simply on the driving When word of what the driver had done came over the radio, things became clearer "I was just concentrating on the driving and not losing him," said Linton, who, with the rest of his shift has been nominated for departmental honors "Once I heard there were three kills, the decision process got a lot easier

CHASE BEGINS

The drama started shortly after 8 pm, when Westland police put out a be-on-thelookout for the suspect vehicle, originally described as a Trans Am When the BOL came over the radio, Plymouth Township officers, as is policy, spread out to several points from which they could help in any potential arrest

Linton spotted a look-alike vehicle, the Corvette, at Haggerty and Massey He fell in behind it while it got onto I-275 Shortly thereafter, the report came that the suspect vehicle was indeed a Corvette Sgt Jeff Felts, "Charlie Platoon" commander, told Linton to wait for backup

When the backup arrived, in the person of K-9 Officer Steve Cheston, Linton "lit up' the Corvette, which then accelerated The chase was on

"Any time a surrounding community has a call out, we seal off that border,' Felts said "That's what we did (Linton) heard this and, sure enough, he picked them up

Once the Corvette had been picked up, staying with it became everyone's focus Plymouth Township had three cars behind it as the chase wound along northbound I-275, then onto eastbound I-696 The Corvette would pull

ahead - as much as a quarter mile at one point - but traffic forced it to slow down just enough to allow Linton to keep it in sight I think there were only maybe 10 or 20 seconds of the whole chase that I couldn t see him," Linton said I could see debris and dust from where he was passing on the shoulder '

RADIO WAVES

Meanwhile, local dispatchers were scrambling to keep information flowing in an effort to alert Plymouth Township officers, and cops from surrounding jurisdictions, aware of the Corvette's position

'I wanted to make sure I knew where they were, said dispatcher Jason Hayes 'We had to make sure we didn't lose them, because I had to give directions'

Even so, Schofield was putting space between his Corvette and the police on I-696, until a Michigan State trooper was able to get in front of him and force him to slow, allowing pursuit to gain valu able distance

Considering the driver was wanted in connection with four brutal killings, Felts and Linton said the move was defi nitely courageous It was a gutsy move by the

trooper, Linton said It probably made the difference Southfield police moved in

as the chase turned onto the Southfield Expressway Schofield got off the express way at McNichols and crashed the Corvette He and Gordon left the vehicle, and Gordon was reportedly struck by a passing vehicle before continuing her flight

SHOTS FIRED

At one point, a shots fired" bulletin was broadcast, sending a momentary shock of fear through Felts

I was pulling my hair out because I didn't know if it was one of my officers,' said Felts The call came in, 'two down,' and I don't know if it's two cops or two bad guys'

Southfield police eventually cornered Schofield in the residential area, where he shot himself Gordon was arrested and, during a preliminary hearing in 18th District Court last week, was bound over for

During the exam, video from the party store's surveillance camera showed the gruesome details of the killings It was film officers involved in the case had seen, and video that had a large impact on them

'The gratifying moment for me was when I saw the surveillance video, and I saw how cold-blooded they were,' said Officer Marcy Messing, a threeyear veteran and one of the officers who pursued the Corvette I realized who we had caught, and what they had done'


While Linton is deservedly getting much of the credit for the successful conclusion to the chase - he's up for state and national honors - Felts pointed out the important role dispatchers played, both in Westland and in Plymouth

Had they waited another 30 seconds for more information. or another minute to get it out these people could have escaped law enforcement that day," Felts said They are as responsible as anyone else for catching these people"

the leader of the Citizens for Responsible Government group which ran a successful petition drive to force funding for a new township hall to a vote of the people, complained to the state about the manner in which township officials were tracking and using the money in the building fund, among other allegations

Schnettler alleged the township has taken money from building department revenue and misused it for other department expenditures he says aren't permitted by

It's all part of Schnettler's wondering how the township plans to pay for a new town ship hall, on top of the other projects that have been undertaken, such as Miller Park, the new soccer park and the sprayscape at Plymouth Township Park

'How are you going to pay the \$400,000' Schnettler asked board members at the last meeting, referring to the estimated payment if the township sells \$6 million in municipal bonds to fund the

"You're going to lose building funds, and I almost guarantee you're going to lose dispatch"

Edwards has maintained all along the township was accounting for its funds properly, but the state initially disagreed

Referring to a January 2002 policy letter, the state at first told the township it was in violation of accounting practices by holding building permit fees from one year in the general fund for the next year But Edwards pointed out a subse-

quent policy letter, issued later in 2002, that spelled out the way the accounting could be accomplished

According to Edwards, many municipalities do it that way, because most building funds are collected at the beginning of a development project, but not expensed until the end, for items such as inspections

'The billing invoice comes now, when they're starting the project, Edwards said 'But its 9-18 months in most cases before the project is finished When are most of your inspections done and

expenses incurred? At the end '

There are some 800 outstanding building permits in the township, according to Edwards, and a reserve fund of some \$400,000 at the end of 2002

Those funds are kept in the general fund, to be used to cover costs when the outstanding building permits are completed

When the state initially told the township it was in violation, township officials hired the author of those state policy letters, former Local Audit Division chief R L Balderman, as a consultant In a letter to Edwards, Balderman wrote, The information contained in the Charter Township of Plymouth audited financial statements clearly indicates (state) requirements have been

(state) requirements have been met"

The Department of Treasury agreed with Balderman and issued last week's letter. In terms of the state, that closes

the matter
'The department isn't doing an investigation, and doesn't intend to do one," Stanton said

flow shortage in the 2004-05 fiscal year However, instead of raising taxes, Potter said there's more that can be done to alleviate the problem

The city is a business, no different than a General Motors or Wal-Mart,' said Potter "Their first cuts come where their highest expense is – people

"The city has not looked at that at all," she said of possible reductions in employees. 'I'm not advocating we lay off people, but if it comes to raising taxes or laying off people – as long as the services are still provided at the same level we have with less people – maybe that's what has to happen. It's up to the department heads and city manager to look at those processes and evaluate them, and I don't think they've done an in-depth evaluation yet.'

In fact, Potter has concerns with the way the numbers for the budget have been presented to the commission

'I think when you look at the potential deficits between last year, this year and going into next year, they're not budgeting for any federal grants, which is a decrease in revenue, however, that's also a decrease in expenses because you don't have the match," she said 'State shared revenues have gone down to the tune of \$29,000 from last year to this year, but the sale of service has jumped to \$40,000 cemetery revenues are up and they re not considering parking fine revenues, which last year was \$15,000

Potter said the city administration, along with commissioners, need to take the blame for the city's budget woes

'I don't think any blame can be placed toward any one group or one person," she said "I think we're all to blame for where we are today I just don't think we're as bad off today as others think we are

"If the Headlee goes down, it forces the city administration to look at running a lean, mean fighting machine," Potter said

'We're still plowing roads, still sucking leaves, still picking up trash, but doing it without raising taxes'

As for the Sheldon Road-CSX underpass project, Potter is definitely against spending \$503,000 of taxpayer money to make it a reality "I don't think it's fair to ask

taxpayers to bear the burden of another bond issue to pay for an underpass that will minimally affect our traffic flow," she said

City Manager Paul Sincock has been looking at alternative ways to deliver police dispatch and fire department services to the city, at a lower cost than the current contract with Plymouth Township Potter said all city services should be scrutinized for cost savings, as long as it provides the same level of serv-

"It's been very difficult, especially in regards to the fire department," she said

'You see expenses for new fire equipment, to hire new staff and for ALS (Advanced Life Support) training we pay a portion of that, yet we have no say whether they should occur

"We're a customer who should be able to say whether we need the service, and if we don't need it, we shouldn't have to pay for it,' Potter said

Along with Potter, other candidates for the city commission include incumbent Dan Dwyer, Peter Bunting, Anthony Guilhom and Dave Workman







Supervisor Mann called the meeting to order at 7 00 p m and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag All members were present except Mr Griffith who was excused

Mrs Massengill amended the agenda by adding under Unfinished Business Item I 1 Repeal of the Current Uniform Traffic Code Ordinance No C 2003 04 and Item I 2 Adopting by Reference the Revised Uniform Traffic Code for Michigan Cities Townships and Villages provisions of the Michigan Motor Vehicle Code and provisions of the Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act Ordinance No C 2003 05 and upon request from Trustee Arnold remove Item J 5 under New Business Review of audio tapes from July and August 2003 Board of Trustees meetings She then moved to approve the Agenda for the Tuesday September 23 2003 Regular Board of Trustees Meeting as amended Seconded by Ms Arnold Ayes all

Mrs Massengill moved to approve the Consent Agenda for the Board of Trustees Regular Meeting of September 23 2003 as submitted Seconded by Ms Arnold Aves all

Mr Don Schnettler questioned whether Board members had received a copy of the letter from the State telling them the Township is in violation by not having a Building Code Fund set up He also reiterated his objections to not having his questions regarding finances answered at the meetings

Mr Mann stated that he was informed by the State that they had reopened their once closed investigation upon the urging of Mr Schnettler Mr Mann stated that the States letter was not based entirely on correct information He felt the State would be issuing a revised letter in the near future retracting part or all of the previous letter The State quoted one Treasury Department letter (2002 2) which their findings were based on however, there are two additional Treasury Department letters guiding townships on handling building code funds which were not addressed and which cover how Plymouth Township and most surrounding communities are conducting business

Mr Edwards referred to two letters from Mr Balderman former Chief of the Local Audit Division who wrote the two letters instructing municipalities on how to handle the funds which the Township follows

Mr Munfakh questioned why Board members did not receive copies of the earlier letters He said he would appreciate copies in the

Mr Mann replied that he receives a lot of letters in the transaction of Township business and not all letters are copied to the Board The Board is welcome to come in and look at anything they like

In answer to Ms Arnolds comment on the findings of Plante and Moran during the audit Mr Edwards said Plante and Moran found the fund balances were reserved in the General Fund The Township has followed everything correctly and many communities in Southeastern Michigan are doing the same In fact the Township acted conservatively in assigning costs to the building department

Mr Charles McFarland spoke regarding the paving of Ferguson Street which is part of the SAD for Robinson Subdivision. He objected to the road being only 22 ft wide with no curbs and no drainage and his cement driveway approach being removed and replaced with asphalt and the cement pile that remains across the

James Anulewicz Director of Public Service introduced Rhett Gronevelt of Orchard Hiltz and McCliment project engineers Mr Gronevelt presented pictures taken of the area during the heavy rains on Monday September 22 which showed no standing water in Mr McFarland's driveway or front yard He stated that Mr McFarlands complaint will be monitored through out the winter months Mr Gronevelt addressed Mr McFarland's statement that his cement driveway approach was removed and replaced with asphalt The policy is to replace existing concrete approaches with concrete if it is removed otherwise asphalt is installed. 



Township should open hall plan

Critics of Plymouth Township Supervisor Steve Mann say he hasn't been open enough about the overall plan for building a new township hall at Ann Arbor Road and Haggerty

The township and auto magnate Don Massey recently signed a purchase agreement to buy some nine acres of land for the \$12 million project Mann plans to finance half of that total by selling \$6 million worth of municipal bonds

A grass-roots group called Citizens for a Responsive Government circulated petitions and acquired more than enough figures to force the township to take the bond sale to a vote of the people That election is scheduled for Nov 6

In the meantime, CRG organizer — and supervisor candidate in 2004 - Don Schnettler continues to pound away on the idea that Mann hasn't talked enough about the plan to give residents an informed opinion Mann, obviously, thinks the numerous items in the township newsletter, saturation coverage by local media and rebroadcast of the taped township meetings ought to suffice

While we tend to agree he's been pretty open about the plan, we also think the plan could be presented in a more cohesive fashion, in its entirety The township planning commission held a meeting at St Kenneth's Church last October, at which director of municipal services Jim Anulewicz went through every available detail

But that was a year ago Since then, while individual details have been discussed fairly frequently, no clear picture has been drawn, and some questions have emerged

For instance, since the sale of the DPW building is being counted on to subsidize the new hall, what is going to happen to the DPW staff and equipment? All that has been offered thus far is a vague reference to the possibility of building a new building, perhaps somewhere on Ann Arbor Road, for the equipment, while moving the staff to

While Mann and the other electeds at township hall have been quite open about their plan for paying for the project, the numbers are still a little soft. More explanation about exactly where the money will come from is needed

Mann has been adamant the township will not raise taxes to pay for the project. The delineation of funding hasn't been as clear In today's economic times, it's difficult for people to believe a government is solvent enough to pay \$12 million for anything without raising taxes

If Mann wants the bond issue to pass, he needs to explain it a little further Toward that end, we believe he should schedule a town hall-style meeting and lay everything out for his residents — the voters he'll need to pass the issue — at once

If he does that, he kills two birds with one stone Informing his residents, and quieting the critics. It's a win win, for the government and for the people it represents



Many people agreed that the fundamental problem here is one of culture everybody's culture Universities are mainly teaching and learning institutions Not surprisingly, their culture is academic and somewhat risk-averse, although there are some researchers who are champing at the bit to commercialize their discoveries The culture of state government is hardly academic, but even more risk-averse And it tends to be top-down, bureaucratic and slow Changing these cultures is not easy, although most agreed that the universities especially the University of Michigan and Wayne State — had made real progress over the past few years

By contrast, the culture of the entrepreneurial community is entirely different Risk is not only something to be grudgingly accepted, it is welcomed as the great spur to success Tasks that state governments or university administrations would chew on for months are for entrepreneurs in the flush of creation a matter of a few days Impatient, mercurial, driven, demanding, selfabsorbed, passionate - all these words characterize that strange and wonderfully creative minority of people Their mantra is, "Live by the sword, die by the sword," and the fact is that

Finding a way to encourage this culture and not strangle it is tough, especially when one considers how utterly different are the cultures of the automobile industry here in Michigan and the high tech firms in Silicon Valley

To illustrate, as the conference drew to a close, most participants felt pretty good — maybe even slightly self-satisfied — that it represented the first step in what should become a regular dialogue But then Bill Orabone, a quintessential entrepreneur type from Ann Arbor, got up "What are you people talking about when you say 'study this' or 'consider that '? Who's really going to drive this process? Where's the action? Much of what this conference has considered is essentially mediocre!"

There could not have been a better illustration of the gap between the cultures Bridging this gap is the most difficult problem we face in Michigan if we are to accelerate technology transfer and foster a thriving entrepreneurial


Progress being made

et me start off by thanking the Observer for giving me the opportunity to help keep local residents informed about state government In this monthly column, I ll do my best to bring you up to date on the latest initratives that affect our local area

An important issue to many residents is speed limits on county roads, and more specifically, having a proper voice in getting them reduced Many recall the bicyclists death on Morton Taylor about seven years ago Homeowners had to fight tooth and nail to get the speed limit lowered

One of the first bills I introduced this year will give Michigan townships more control over local speed limits Thankfully, the bill was

signed into law and is now known as Public Act 65 of

county road commissions and the State Police could decide speed limits on county roads in any given township The new law injects some common sense in the process Local officials and area residents know best which speed limits are the safest and most efficient for

their area. Michigan townships, especially in western Wayne, have grown rapidly and many of these rural county roads have become unsafe for pedestrians and motorists

Under the new law, if a township, county road commission and State Police determine that traffic speed on a county highway is too fast or slow for conditions, they can unanimously establish a reasonable and safe maximum or minimum speed limit

Township officials and residents deserve a voice in this important process Many times, school children have to navigate these roads after being dropped off from school The new law empowers us to help set the most optimum speed limits for our communities

In other important news, \$7 25 million in federal funding will be allocated to help stop ash borer infestation in southeast Michigan

In April, I called on the US Congress to provide financial assistance to help combat emerald ash borer infestation, which has taken its toll on western Wayne County With strong bipartisan support, the state House approved my resolution and sent it to Congress

A portion of the federal allocation will fund more than 100 staff in southeast Michigan to help control the exotic species of beetle

The funding will help provide a strong line of defense to help stop the infestation and prevent total catastrophic loss of our ash trees If the Dutch elm disease devastation in the 30s taught us one thing, it's that we can't ignore the problem **Educating students at every level of** curriculum must remain our top priority, even during challenging fiscal times. The school aid budget is the most influential long-term investment we can make on our state's future.

In the summer of 2002, the ash borer was identified in Wayne, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, Livingston and Monroe counties It already has killed 5 million trees in the six-county area

With approximately 1 billion ash trees in Michigan, the infestation has the potential to affect Michigan's forest ecology, decrease property values and cut production of an important and versatile lumber resource

Although the ash borer is slowly creeping out of southeast Michigan, we can't give up the fight There are still many ash trees in western Wayne County that can be saved

Along with the new public acts, a definite highlight so far for me was when I voted to restore the \$6,700 foundation grant for every Michigan student We also reinstated funding for gifted and talented programs under the school and budget for fiscal year 2004, despite tough budgetary times

Educating students at every level of curriculum must remain our top priority, even during challenging fiscal times The school aid budget is the most influential long-term investment we can make on our states future

In non-legislative news, I was happy to sponsor the first-ever Canton Area Senior Summit this summer More than 220 senior citizens from throughout western Wayne County enjoyed the event

I am pleased it was so well-received by seniors Although the bar is set high for next year's event, we can make it even better I'd like to turn the Senior Summit into the premier senior event in Wayne County



Oakland nursery under scrutiny for violating ash tree quarantine

State and federal agricultural officials are investigating an Oakland County tree nursery for breaking a quarantine meant to stop the spread of the emerald ash borer, an exotic beetle that has already killed millions of ash trees in southeast Michigan

According to Michigan Department of Agriculture spokesperson Sara Linsmeier-Wurfel, the unidentified nursery broke the quarantine by shipping more than 100 ash trees to a Maryland nursery back in April After a joint investigation with the US Department of Agriculture, the state is ready to charge the owner of the nursery with breaking the quarantine It is the first time someone has been accused of such a breech

'We're in the process of seeking charges against the business. Linsmeier-Wurfel said

An investigator with the Maryland Department of Agriculture discovered the EABinfested trees at a Prince George's County nursery during a routine inspection in late August After questioning the nursery owner, it was determined that the Oakland County nursery shipped 121 ash trees in two shipments April 2-3 Prince Georges County is in suburban Washington DC

'Our inspectors had been instructed to keep an eye out for infested ash trees,' said Sue duPont, a spokesperson with the Maryland Department of Agriculture "While inspecting the nursery, our inspector found exit holes on many of the trees, which is a classic sign of the emerald ash borer She brought back some bark samples from the trees, and it was determined they were indeed infested?

Roughly 90 of the trees were still at the nursery and were immediately destroyed. The rest had been sold as landscape trees, and were tracked to three different locations Maryland officials are working with property

According to Michigan agricultural officials, the emerald ash borer has already killed or damaged six million trees in southeast Michigan The initial six-county quarantine, which includes Oakland, Wayne and Macomb counties, was expanded to 13 in August, and now includes Genesee, Ingham, Jackson, Lapeer, Lenawee, Shiawassee and St Clair counties

The quarantine prohibits all transfer of ash trees or ash tree products from the quarantined

According to Linsmeier-Wurfel, the state has sent the case to the Oakland County Prosecutor's office, which will decide whether or not to charge the local nursery for violating the quarantine She expects a decision to be made within a week or

"The way the law is spelled out, the penalty for violating the quarantine is up to \$100 per incident But what is an incident? Is it for each tree or for each load of trees? That will be up to the prosecutor Were hoping for some fairly swift action to this,' Linsmeier-Wurfel said

In addition, Linsmeier-Wurfel said the nursery is facing the possibility of federal charges, because the nursery allegedly did not get the proper certification to send agricultural products across state





If you really want the most beautiful sound, it's best to go with a grand "Opening the lid allows the tone to enter the room," he said

Cost is, again, another consideration when purchasing a piano Steinway vertical pianos start at \$16,000, Miller said

Portable keyboards, which are part of the line of digital pianos, start at \$1,000 "You can get digital pianos in the shape of a grand that are \$25,000," Miller said

The advantage of digitals is their recording capability and they closely emulate acoustic pianos Hammell car-ries eight or nine models with



Home entertainment centers take center stage:

The home entertainment center is fast becoming the focal point of living rooms and great rooms. When it comes to choosing an entertainment center, there are almost as many choices as there are channels on your cable television.

And be it traditional or modern, finished in cherry, oak, maple or mahogany, the entertainment center is becoming less of an afterthought and more of a necessity for homeowners seeking to decorate their homes

'It's the anchoring piece to the room, and when customers come in looking at entertainment centers, they're getting the entertainment center first and getting other furniture to go around it," said Jodi Caden

Caden, who has been designing custom-made entertainment centers for Designs Unlimited of West Bloomfield since 1996, said her job is not to spotlight the expanding array of electronic equipment wending its way into many homes, but to conceal it from view when it's not in use

Caden said people are not only looking for wall units that will hold electronic equipment but seeking integrated units that contain storage space for stereo equipment and speakers, books, DVDs, and video games

'People come in and say 'I have all this stuff How do I hide it?'' Caden said

'Its my job to come up with a design for an entertainment center will look gorgeous The equipment will be functional but it will be hidden so you don't have to look at it'

Customers begin the process with a visit to Designs Unlimited's 3,000 square foot show room, where they check out floor models and browse through the company's portfolios

Caden then visits the homes of potential customers to measure space and determine what entertainment center styles will complement the room

Then Caden comes up with a three-dimensional drawing of the design she's come up with

Caden said the average price range for a custom-made entertainment center from Designs Unlimited is \$5,000 to \$15,000

It's the most expensive piece in the room now,' Caden said

It's really the biggest and most predominant piece in a room'

Since the focal point of most entertainment centers is the television, television sets often dictate the style, size and even the look of the home entertainment center

The 36-inch television set has become the standard size, according to Mark Morganroth, owner of Sherwood Studios in West Bloomfield

"We do more of those than any other, but plasma will be the new generation," Morganroth said

Plasma television sets don t require the depth of standard television sets but they don't necessarily dictate smaller dimensions for home entertainment centers

The trend is for larger entertainment centers, according to Paul Franks, owner of Franks Furniture in Wayne, which has been specializing in home entertainment needs for the past 20 years

Besides offering predesigned and custommade wall units built to house audio and visual equipment, Franks also offers motorized theater seating for the home

Franks Furniture has several cabinets and wall units on display in its showroom in several styles, including traditional, arts and crafts, mission, country French and shaker, but Franks said customers more than likely opt for a custombuilt unit

"Wider TVs mean wider TV cabinets," Franks said "Every one of our customers has different needs A lot of them come into the showroom and say 'Gee, that's pretty close' and we go from there"

Franks said the price of a home entertainment center at Franks Furniture ranges from \$500 to \$8,000

\$500 to \$8,000 "We have high-end looks," Franks said

Franks said some of the features most important to his customers include storage capability and a cabinet that angles the television so all



"We design with or without doors, with the opening just a hair bigger than the television so the television has a custom fit,' Franks said

Franks said corner cabinets have also become popular with customers as have custom-built towers on each side of the television cabinet which are designed for storage, or to display curios or books

"We stock merchandise, but there are so many variations and variable," Franks said "People often come in with something in mind, but come away with something different that they're much more excited about



Leather fits everywhere in the home

It's not limited to accessories for the desk and furnishings for the study

Most people buy leather because they feel it's indestructible, said Joelle Aittama, president, All About Leather Inc at Michigan Design Center in Troy "But it can feel beautiful, it can be elegant

There is really so much you can do with leather'

Good leather mellows with age, holds up and looks nicer Good leather can be like an heirloom - it lasts that long," said Bill Wolf, chief executive officer and vice president. Newton Furniture, with stores ın Lıvonıa, Bloomfield Township, Novi and Utica

Leather is not only durable outlasting fabric 4 to 1 - but versatile - there are different kinds of leather, just as there are different kinds of fabric And leather has its own special richness and warmth


'The oil from your hands works into the leather and gives it additional character over time,' said Ellen Adelman, president, Creative Collections at Lacoff's at Michigan Design Center

It takes about 20 seconds for leather to adjust to your body temperature, Wolf said

Such natural markings as wrinkles, insect bites, manure burns and fence marks make a hide distinctive and naturally beautiful These appear as veining or marbling on the surface of leather Depending on how it has been treated by the manufacturer, leather on furnishings can have a variety of textures and looks Special terms are involved (see related article)

STYLING

A buttery, very smooth hand (feel) a vinyl-like sheen, a stiff touch a surface bearing a mechanically imprinted pat tern such as alligator or floral -

these are just a few examples of the types of leather that are available

And if you prefer to keep the furniture free from minor marks and scratches from everyday wear, you can select protected leather

"It depends on the household," said Dave Gornall, manager, Classic Interiors of Livonia

Leather furniture can be trimmed in many ways as well Nail trim in nickel or dulled brass, woven welting and fabric fringes are some of the trims on view at All About

And leather and fabric and leather can be combined in one furnishing, heavier fabrics are best for these combinations, Aıttama saıd

Gornall said a new furnishing in leather is home theater seating A style of home theater recliner by Bradington-Young comes with electric or manual adjustment, and cup holders in the arms The individual recliners can be arranged in a curve or a straight row

"Everybody can have leather in their home in different accents,' Adelman said

Examples in the Creative Collections showroom include lamps, wastebaskets, mirror and photo frames, and a patch work vase Tables and pedestals feature leather tops and bases made of other mate-

When shopping for leather furniture, keep in mind that the frame construction is important

"It should be a kıln-drıed, hardwood frame, eight-way hand-tied," Gornall said Also check the cushions and

along the arms "Always look at cushion tops, see that everything is tight," Aittama said 'Leather will give, you want to be sure it can't pull loose The tension along the arm (should be) neat and tight'

CARE

Leather can be easier to care for than fabric, especially if it has been treated The leather ın furniture has been permanently preserved in the tanning process and doesn't need maintenance beyond simple cleaning, the Arizona Leather Web site says

Aittama recommends wiping pure aniline leather with a cotton diaper

'There's really no need to clean it with any cleaners,' she said "You can vacuum it with a brush attachment, keep dust off it so it won't be grinding it in ' Arizona Leather offers these tips at its Web site

For stubborn spots and stains, use a mild solution of Liquid Ivory soap and clear lukewarm water Apply the

Stabulous FURNITURE 2003 Hire an interior designer to wade through choices

If the task of creating a new look for your home threatens to be more demanding of your time or takes more energy than you would like, the services of a professional interior designer may be just what you need

An interior designer will present you with design ideas based on your personal taste, provide the resources necessary to get the job done, use his or her knowledge and experience to assist you in creating a space that fits your lifestyle, and help you set realistic expectations of the project, based on your budget, timeline and desired end results

But a relationship with an interior designer is long term and, unlike most professional relationships, it's also very personal

Before the designer can work with you, you must have defined your own tastes, and that is keeping a file of ideas from shelter magazines you've read, visiting designer show houses and furniture galleries, and noting the names of local designers whose work appeals to you

And, it means establishing a realistic budget

Before we sign a contract, there's a lengthy interview process with a prospective client to make sure we're a good fit," said Barbara Krass. owner of Colorworks Studio in West Bloomfield Township Krasss work will be seen on a Detroit segment of HGTVs Designer's Challenge

"I ask for a wish list what does the client expect - the end results? How easy is it for the client to make a decision? The interior designers job is to define the job and narrow things down We're not there to show everything that's on the market Sometimes a client would prefer to do the shop

ping herself She wants to see everything on the market! In that case, I suggest an hourly rate for consultations Or, I may suggest that she choose another designer"

Mary Lujan, owner of Heppelwhite's Design Studio in Rochester, is noted for rooms done in a classic style

"My designs can be ten years old, but they never look dated because they re not trendy, said Lujan

I look for clients who are really ready to work as a team, and who have familiarized themselves with my style so they know what to expect I have a portfolio of my projects here in the studio and on my web site, and several of my projects have been featured on

Christmas walks Lujan has also decorated model homes for Turnberry, in Lake Orion Like Krass, she likes a client to have a file of rooms or details that she likes Both Krass and Lujan say that most of their business comes from word-of-mouth

The situation in a retail setting is likely to be more spontaneous than that in a design studio

Theres more demand on the interior designer to elicit information from a potential client who has just dropped in, without prior research

I try to ask as many ques tions as possible, said Lisa Wolfe, design consultant at Walker/Buzenberg Furniture in Plymouth

How is the room going to be used? How many people are going to use it? Often, I go to

the home, measure a room and do a floor plan Most people know what they want - I just fine tune it

"Sometimes people will have an inspirational piece their grandmother's quilt, or an antique, and well design a room around that It's important to let people know right away that I m not going to order them to throw everything out and start from scratch Most people know what they want -my job is to make it as easy as possible and to see that the finished room looks like

Barbara Krass notes that you can find a designer on line. through the Designer-On-Call service offered by the Michigan Design Center (MDC), through the American Association of Interior Designers (ASID) 'designer finder' service, by word of mouth, or through articles in local newspapers With Designer-On-Call, you can arrange for a free one-hour design consultation with a professional designer on-site at the MDC, located in Troy

Or, fill out a detailed information form provided on-line by the American Society of Interior Designers (ASID)

You will be provided with names of area designers who fit your profile

When you ve decided, go to the designer's office, meet the staff and go through his or her portfolio

When all is said and done, the key to a successful client/interior designer relationship is good communication, according to Mark Morgenroth, owner of Sherwood Studios in West Bloomfield Twp

When a client hires a designer, it's important to understand the clients needs and wants, as well as their feelings and taste level said Morgenroth

of ourselves Basically, formal living rooms are a creation of builders says John Wohl, interior designer with TVI. Inc in Royal Oak and a designer on call at the Michigan Design Center in Troy

We really only live in a couple of rooms in our house, he says But we can recapture that living room space by making it a sanctuary for relaxation or an entertainment center depending on our lifestyles. It doesn't have to be a place intended for visitors to admire from afar and has an invisible Do Not Enter sign for the people who live there day in and day out

He recommends adding whatever will create that sense busy with work all day or involved in a business and were dealing with a lot of issues, to have things that are comforting to us in a space, is nice," Wohl said

A curved conversation sofa is perfect for cozy chats with family and friends and is the right kind of furniture to draw people into the living room, explains Paul Franks, owner of Franks Furniture, a family run business for 40 years at the same location in Wayne

'It makes that living room more livable," explains Franks

Add an entertainment armoire, with two large doors on top and another two on the bottom, to hide the television and sound system Since more and more people are buying large screen televisions, Franks offers custom entertainment centers to fit any size wall, television or other large piece of equipment

Innovations in illumination brighten spaces in style

Hand in hand with the proliferation of great rooms and two-story-high ceilings have come innovations in the lighting industry that can better brighten big spaces

In essence, though it remains functional first and foremost, lighting for living rooms and great rooms has become more of an aesthetic statement and less of a functional necessity

The myriad options available to consumers unfold from functional lighting, task lighting and accent light, the three basic types of lighting that manufacturers produce and that lighting designers recom-

Track lighting used to be used to light up a room, but now it is used for task lighting, said Ken Sheets, salesman at House of Lights in Rochester 'It is generally used to highlight a sculpture or a painting'

Within those lighting categones is a wide array of terms that includes pin-up lighting, under- and over-lighting, throw lighting, monorail lighting, track lighting, recessed lighting and cable and rope lighting

Functional lighting is used when it's important to see clearly from one end of a room to the other Task lighting zeroes in on curio cabinets Accent lighting exists to highlight anything from a wall

hanging to trophy on a mantel "Lighting sets the tone of a room,' Pine Tree Lighting sales manager Mike Belesky said 'Lighting used to be very utilitarian Now people use it to

decorate a house It's as impor

tant now as a piece of furniture"

Sheets said cloth shades are more popular now on lights, while painted finishes require less maintenance in terms of dusting, he said Earthtones are popular on the lamps themselves

'Shades on lamps are more decorative," Sheets said "They are rustic and contemporary Our look here (at Rochester) is more 'traditional, transitional, while our Farmington store would feature something more contemporary But the lamps are more elaborate today'

Pine Tree in Lake Orion specializes in working with builders to provide lighting design for approximately 250 new homes each month

While table lamps have long been considered integral furniture features of any living or great room, Belesky is speaking of how lighting itself - the shadows it casts and the areas ıt ıllumınates – can produce an effect much similar to a furniture arrangement or a piece of art 'You can create any type of mood or atmosphere that you want," Belesky said

Much of the innovation in lighting the big rooms in a home has risen in tandem with the increasing popularity of halogen lighting, which burns brighter and whiter and aims truer than the more traditional incandescent lighting

The bold, white beam of halogen stays tight and doesn t diffuse itself as does incandescent lighting Halogen is often incorporated in the recessed ceiling lighting systems that are now taking precedence over once-popular track light-

The downside to halogen lighting, which contains a

filament made out of tungsten steel and operates with halide gas, is that its a very hot light

"Track lighting is not used as much as it used to be because ıt busies up a ceiling,' Master Lighting sales and lighting consultant Janet Iannicello said 'Track lighting is usually the last ultimatum rather than the first

Iannicello, who has worked in the Canton store for 19 years, said that large hanging fixtures, like chandeliers, are making a comeback, especially in terns of lighting a large living room or great room People still use table lamps

but you can really enhance a big room with a big fixture," Iannicello said 'It's more of a formal look. More of a statement."

In terms of table lamps, Iannicello said the trend many consumers are picking up on is to live large and to turn to oversize, wrought-iron lamps with either a painted or brushed surface

Consumers are also looking for more energy efficient lightıng, like low-voltage florescent lighting, which generally comes with a higher price tag

"I think suppliers really need to come down on the prices of bulbs, Iannicello said 'When it first comes out, it costs



Dagwood Bumstead was a master at the art of creating a sandwich One might quibble with the eccentric ingredients he chose to cram between two slices of bread — eagle talon, fish (preferably two days old), tin of sardine oil, cold and gooey pot of spaghetti, one gallon of mayonnaise and one fried egg over easy but it was his style and unrestrained appetite that he is perhaps best known

Sandwich lovers would agree Creating a good sandwich is more that just slapping a few cold cuts between two slices of white bread and calling it a meal A carefully constructed sandwich would satisfy even the pickiest of eaters and doesn't require a sack fries as an accompaniment

WAY BACK WHEN

Historically speaking, the sandwich is said to have originated with English nobleman John Montagu, the Fourth Earl of Sandwich (1718-1792) The legend goes that Montagu was gambling in the wee hours of the morning in London in 1762 when he ordered a waiter to bring him roast beef between two slices of bread The Earl was able to continue gambling without having to get his fingers greasy like he might have from a traditional

English meal Sandwiches have evolved from Montagu's informal convergence of meat and bread into many forms, including the pannini, submarine, grinder,

muffuletta, hoagie, wrap, open-face, pita pocket and croissant among the most popular With the wide-spread interest

in low carb meals, Atkins dieters, who have grown tired of eating slices of meat and cheese devoid of bread, are opting for lettuce to hold their sandwiches together The thin green wraps are suitable envelopes for their food and are both low in calories and carbohydrate-free

Chimentos Italian Market owner, Frank Chimento, believes fresh ingredients are the key to a good sandwich, whether it's a pesto and buffalo mozzarella sandwich on rye or his favorite Italian submarine sandwich on focaccia bread

It's the freshness of the sandwich that makes the difference Its made while you wait and not ahead of time," the Livonia business owner said

Chimento meticulously slices and stacks five different meats together, including sweet capiacola, Italian-style herb turkey, Genoa salamı, mortadella and

atanzas Creek Winery (MCW) was founded in 1977 by Sandra and Bill MacIver The original winery was estabhshed on the site of an old dairy farm in Sonoma County's Bennett

By 1985, the MacIvers had built a modern, state-of-the-art winery and decided to specialize in making three varietal wines chardonnay, merlot and sauvignon

Heald 'We chose to stay with chardonnay," Bill explained, because we felt it was a hallmark wine, sauvignon blanc because we were developing a style that excited us and brought something new to the world of sauvignon blanc, and merlot because we wanted to be one of the early pioneers of a varietal we particu-

When asked why they dropped cabernet sauvignon from their line, a move that surprises most people, the MacIvers said that with so many cabernets being produced by a plethora of wineries in a myriad of styles, there was little challenge left in the varietal

While refining their style, as many as 100 individual experiments were conducted at the winery each harvest

The experiments included pressing temperature, picking criteria, tank versus barrel fermentation, juice oxygenation, vine virus, juice fining, clonal selection, yeast types, aging on the lees, stirring regimes, barrel toast, barrel age, wood source, coopers and vineyard maturity, to name a

The Matanzas Creek philosophy stressed that there are ways to make better wine

This included an active research program at the winery and implementation of proven methods

'We made wine with a quality goal in mind," Sandra reemphasized, learning and applying new lessons each year, knowing that if we reached our goal, an appreciative audience would be

At the beginning of the 1990s, MCW's vineyard acreage doubled from 40 to 80 acres and plantings of syrah were added The first syrah was released with the 1994 vintage

LEGACY PASSES ON

After more than two decades of success, the MacIvers retired in 2000 and passed the MCW torch to long-time friend Jess Jackson (of Kendall-Jackson fame), a man who knows how to both grow and source grapes and build brands Matanzas Creek now has the benefit of additional quality fruit from the Jackson family's Bennett Valley vineyards

The new owners have returned cabernet sauvignon to the MCW portfolio along with viognier Current winemaker Gary Patzwald said, With a focus on continued quality improvement, the vineyard and cellar operations are keenly centered on merlot and cabernet sauvignon, as well as chardonnay and sauvignon blane As this decade unfolds, Bennett Valley fruit sourcing is an important facet of this winemaking opportu-

No hot water, defects, irk homeowners

I live in a condo and we have had no hot water for a number of days. The board's president told us to contact the management company who told us that it's the tenant's responsibility to have the boiler fixed. More and more problems are being handled this way by not being handled. What course do we have, as tenants, in this situation? It all depends on what your condominium documents say and your rights against your landlord under your lease You are entitled to the useful enjoyment of your premises as a tenant regardless of whether or not you own a condominium Your landlord/co-owner should be advancing your interest with the association, assuming it is the association's responsibility to fix the hot water heater If, in fact, it is the co-owner's responsibility, that is between you and the

co-owner Good luck

My parents bought a home five years ago, and since then they have encountered numerous structure problems, some of which were hidden by the seller. My question is, since we have been encountering all these problems over this span of five years, can we still take legal action against the previous owner for not disclosing some of this information in real estate documents, or is it too late? You might take the position that this was a breach of contract, which allows you to pursue the claim for six years from the date of the breach of the contract, but there is, of course, no guarantee that a court will look at it as such Negligent and/or intentional misrepresentation would be the basis of your claim You are best advised to consult with an attorney, but I would certainly attempt to pursue the matter if you can establish that these defects were hidden purposefully by the seller

Absent sellers don't necessarily take less for home

Is this a wish come true for home buyers?

The sellers had to move to Alaska They're now making payments on the house in Anchorage and the one they still own here They're paying two sets of utility bills every month They're paying for snow removal at their new place and lawn cutting at the old place

Are these desperate sellers? Can you just about whisk their house out from under them as they become overwhelmed by all the expenses?

Maybe, said Lynn DeJohn And maybe not

DeJohn, a Realtor with Quality Real Estate Properties GMAC, Plymouth, said she has an answer for buyers who believe they have the upper hand over absentee sellers

"If you're thinking of squeezing, give it a try," she said "Write that offer Bring something to the sellers Let them show you how desperate they are Sellers have three options about an offer accept, reject, or counter"

But the sellers might not be desperate at all, DeJohn said They might have the economic ability to operate two houses, she said Or their former home might now be in the hands of a third-party company that has advanced them the equity they had in the property and is handling the operating expenses, she said

So don't take it for granted that you can steal a house just because of the sellers situation," she said

It's really like any other deal, she said 'You make an offer so you can find out how low the sellers are willing to go But at the same time, you have to know how high you're willing to go"

DIFFERENT ROLE

In Andy Sakmar's 30-plus years in real estate, he said, he's learned that the agent for absentee sellers has additional responsibilities

If the sellers don't have a friend or neighbor looking after the house, Sakmar said, the agent takes on that task, following up on showings by other agents and seeing that lights are off and doors are locked Sakmar is the broker at Century 21 Sakmar &

Associates, Rochester "The absentee sellers are not

really at a disadvantage, Sakmar said, "but their agent might be We deal through faxes and express mail and when you try to negotiate over the phone, there are things that might be more difficult to pull together than if you're face to face

And because of "that popular misconception among buyers, he said, 'it might be a little more often that we get offers further off the mark But there are no distress sales in these situations

At the same time, he said, the emptiness of an empty house can be a disadvantage 'A furnished home always shows better,' he said "Empty reveals flaws

How far away the sellers might be is not the issue, according to Richard Halmekangas, broker, One Way Realty, Livonia It's whether they're there or not

When sellers are occupying the home," Halmekangas said, "there is an unconscious tendency for the buyers to believe the sellers are set and not going to negotiate much

"If the house is vacant, the tendency is to assume that the sellers are in trouble'

If there's a disadvantage on either side of the deal with absentee sellers, Halmekangas said, it

could be for the buyers, who might not be able to gain "intimate knowledge of the house, the well-being of the house"

"You don't just buy the house, you buy the owners,' he said "Are they persons of character, did they maintain it, did they do what they said they were going to do? Repair things properly or just patch them up?

BE PARTICULAR

And then there's Jody M White, broker, Rice Realty, Westland

She said the absentee sellers all have no problems "if they have the right agent"

The "right agent," she said, is someone who knows the local market very well, has an extremely high sense of responsibility and is an excel-

lent communicator The sellers, she said, have to have continual "reassurance about the market They need comfort They have to know what's going on'

As for advantage or disadvantage to the buyers, she said, as in any home sale, the sellers might remain unknown strangers "Buyers might never know who the sellers are"

Higher FHA limits open more doors

an you imagine buying a \$200,000 plus home with only \$6,270 out of your own pocket? The FHA's small down payment provision and the market's continued low mortgage interest rates have now created compelling reasons for renters to buy homes now instead of later

You may be an FHA mortgage candidate if you have a very small down payment, if you have slightly bruised credit, or if you cannot otherwise qualify for a conforming mortgage With the FHA, you may receive your down payment as a "gift," and you may use a nonoccupant co-borrower, if required, to help you qualify

The Department of Housing and Urban Development has increased the maximum FHA loan value for single-family dwellings in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw, Lenawee, and Livingston Counties, to \$209,000 The monthly payment on FHA mortgages at the upper limit is about \$1,060 per month on Adjustable-Rate Mortgages, and close to \$1,285 per month for a 30-year fixedrate loan Add on a few hundred dollars a month for real estate taxes, homeowners insurance, and mortgage insurance, and you are in your own home

Current renters should be able to buy a home using the FHA guidelines for almost 40 percent more than they currently pay for monthly rent and still come out ahead Let's say your current monthly rent is \$1,200, and your marginal tax bracket is 33 percent The payment on a home purchase of \$200,000 (assuming property taxes and homeowners insurance of \$2,800 and \$600 per year, respectively) would be about \$1,630 per month

TAX BENEFIT

Because you will be receivıng an ıncome tax benefit-ın this case approximately equal to 33 percent of the \$17,200 of taxes and interest you will be paying during the year-your effective monthly home payment will be reduced by about \$475 This makes it about \$45 per month cheaper (over \$540 annually) to own your home instead of renting

Need more? As your \$200,000 home appreciates at even a mınımal 4 percent per year, it will be worth about \$225,000 in 36 months yielding a four-fold return on your original 3 percent down payment. Thanks FHA!

Rates for 30-year mortgages falling again

After rising sharply since late June, rates on benchmark 30-year mortgages retreated for the third week in a row, a trend that should help keep the housing market humming

For the week ending Friday, Sept. 26, the average rate on 30year mortgages dipped to 5 98 percent from 6 01 percent a week ago, the mortgage company Freddie Mac reported Thursday in its weekly nationwide survey of rates

The rate was the lowest since late July, when 30-year mortgages averaged 5 94 percent Rates on 15-year fixed-rate

mortgages, a popular option for refinancing, held steady at 5 30 percent this week Rates for one-year adjustable mortgages edged down to 3 77 percent, from 3 81 percent

The averages for mortgage rates do not include add-on fees known as points

Thirty-year and one-year ARMs each carried an average fee of 0 6 point this week Fifteen-year mortgages carried an average 0 5 point fee

A year ago, rates on 30-year

mortgages averaged 5 99 percent, 15-year mortgages were 5 41 percent and one-year adjustable mortgages stood at 4 22 percent

In mid-July rates on 30-year mortgages slid to 5 21 percent, the lowest in more than four decades But then investor concerns about the economy and the Federal Reserve's handling of short-term interest rate policy pushed bond rates up, causing long-term mortgage rates to rise In the past three weeks, however, rates on 30-year mortgages have gone down

Freddie Mac economist Amy Crews Cutts, explaining the drop below 6 percent for 30year fixed rate mortgages said that "investors in bond markets were calmed by assurances from Fed monetary policy-makers that no action would be taken until 2004" to raise short-term interest rates

She was referring to the Fed s decision last week to hold a key short-term interest rate at a 45-year low of 1 percent and the Fed's statement that short-term rates may stay at such low levels for some time

Oregon property values rise despite wildfires

THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

When wildfires forced residents of Camp Sherman to evacuate for a few weeks in late August and early September, home builders Chris Peters and Jim Christian didn't worry there would be less demand for their work

"Property values keep going up here," Christian said "People just buy insurance and hope their house doesn't burn"

If anything, the Booth and Bear Butte fire complex, which has burned 90,824 acres and continues to cook, has slowed builders in their quest to put up new homes in the area

'We've missed a bunch of work over this," Peters said "About a month"

Though wildfires in the area the past two years have interrupted summer vacations, caused evacuation hassles for residents and hurt tourism, they haven't put a damper on people's desire to live among the trees here

Property values in Camp Sherman and neighboring Black Butte Ranch, both about 10 miles west of Sisters, have continued to soar And new buyers, ready to purchase homes that can range in the millions of dollars, keep com-

There are reasons for this seemingly counterintuitive phenomenon dizzying growth

in this part of Central Oregon during the past decade, faith in firefighters and the belief that "it won't happen to me' when it comes to houses burning

"The fires haven't had any effect but short term,' said Rad Dyer, owner of Ponderosa Properties, one of the largest real estate companies in Sisters 'As soon as one's resolved the market comes back Already in Camp Sherman, buyers are coming back to look'

MOUNTAIN VIEW

Mike Reed, co-owner of Coldwell Banker Reed Bros Reality, said in some cases fires last summer increased property values in Black Butte because mountain views from houses were widened

"This year we are ahead of last year for sales, and last year we were ahead of the year before," he said "The numbers don't he'

The thick Deschutes National Forest, dry weather and activities like hiking and skiing have made this part of the state a growing tourist area It has also become a Mecca for retirees, as thousands of Oregonians and others from diverse parts of the country arrive every year

According to the 2002 census, Redmond and Bend, both about 20 miles from Sisters,

Much of that boom has spilled over to the Sisters area And residents know the population magnet will continue to drive property prices up

Ten years ago, Baby Boomers Laurie and Kevin Adams bought a 3,200 square foot house in Camp Sherman for \$185,000

Today it's worth over \$500,000, Laurie Adams said And worries about wildfires?

There is one camp of people who say you've had your fire and the likelihood of a second one in the same spot is slim," she said "I m in that camp'

Last summer, the Cache Mountain fire burned two houses in Black Butte Ranch Fires this summer came within feet of dozens of other houses ın Camp Sherman

None of that discouraged Joe Lautze and his wife from building a house. The retired couple is living in an RV this summer while they wait for construction to be completed They were evacuated from Camp Sherman twice because of wildfires, but can't wait to move in to their dream home

"If you talk to others you know how well organized the effort has been" to protect houses, said Lautze

Indeed, dozens of residents interviewed here raved about how well firefighters managed

the fire So far, over \$25 million has been spent fighting it, making it the second most expensive fire in the country this summer, said Robin Vora, spokesman for the US Forest Service

Dave Baumgartner, a division supervisor who worked to protect homes in Camp Sherman, said many residents he dealt with had little understanding of the forest or the risks of wildfires

"They think it won t happen to them," he said 'We struggle with that

Baumgartner said that as the number of inexperienced forest dwellers who move into the woods increases, it will become more difficult to get them to observe fire prevention techniques, such as thinning trees around property and putting on metal roofs to guard against falling embers

That could lead to more houses getting burned, he said Still, fire threats aside, population growth in the woods in this area won't likely subside anytime soon

Roger White, who has owned the only grocery store in Camp Sherman for eight years, says he expects to continue seeing new faces of residents every year

"This is one of the crown jewels in Oregon recreation,' he said "And the houses are going up faster than you can blink"


When you review cars, it's helpful to have a neighbor like Dennis Because when Dennis, a high-school senior, gets excited about an automobile, you know to pay special attention And you know what? Dennis was all over the Mercedes-Benz C230 Kompressor Sports Coupe Of course, the fact that he owns a Kompressor himself -the least expensive Mercedes-Benz sold in the United States -- was part of the equation But Dennis owns an automatic-transmission Kompressor, and he wanted to see what the six-speed manual I was reviewing was all about So we took it for a spin

His conclusion and mine The 2003 C230 Kompressor Sport Coupe offers a phenomenal driving experience, especially in the manual-transmission model, where you feel in total command of this sleek sparkplug The automatic-transmission Kompressor pales just a bit, and only by comparison

Dennis occasionally complains that the 18-liter. super-charged and intercooled, four-liter engine is a bit underpowered, but with a car this size, the 189 horsepower generated by the engine gave me rabbit-like starts, nifty acceleration on street or highway, and a great feeling of capability My only complaint about the six-speed is that appropriately collaring all of this power apparently required relatively closely spaced gear intervals, almost to such an extent that it's easier using second gear to accelerate from stop than bothering with first gear Kompressor also posts satisfactory gas mileage too 21 mpg in the city and 31 on the highway

At suggested retail prices beginning around \$25,000, Kompressor does indeed make the class and power of a Mercedes-Benz affordable to just about anyone The C-Class sports coupe is one of several steps in the evolution of that part of the Mercedes line from being solely a sedan to a comprehensive model line Yet the coupe, being small and a two-door, has a youthful, zesty spirit all its own, which complements the more traditional Mercedes-Benz aspects of its personality

The fact that Kompressor is out to make a different

statement than Mercedes is used to making becomes obvious from just looking at the vehicle at a standstill Seven inches shorter than its sedan sibling, the coupe is about a half-inch lower as well And the designers made the most of that compact silhouette, giving the Kompressor coupe an aggressive nose-down, wedgeshaped profile, complete with a spoiler on the rear The optional 17-inch alloy wheels complete the look of a roadready rocket

Among the many nifty features of this car is the fact that the Kompressor coupe features a window panel underneat the integral rear spoiler Normally, the spoiler would block a part of the driver's rearward vision But this clear-panel feature gives the driver sufficient visibility to help in parking and other maneauvers

The version I drove didn't have one, but a popular option on this car is a Panorama sliding sunroof From the front windshield to the rear spoiler, nearly everything is glass. Just press a button, and the front half of the roof slides over the rear, leaving a roof opening that is about one-third larger than a conventional sunroof Both rearseat passengers also have a skyward view through a fixedglass pane And because the front part of the Panorama sunroof slides over the outside of the car, it doesn't reduce

headroom To electrically operated roller blinds on the inside shadele interior from the sun when the roof is closed

Inside, Kapressor is impressive as well. The most endearing the is that Mercedes-Benz designers resisted whatever tentation they might have felt to mix colors and material the interior and went with classic allblack surroutings Driver and front passenger have extra lateral sport Access to the rear seats is relatively easy thanks to one-lever feature that lifts and moves the front seats forard, giving the average person ample room to climbto the two-seat rear There's decent cargo space, especial when the asymmetrically dividing rear seats are empled Valuables are kept invisible in the back, thanks the shelf that raises and lowers with the trunk lid

I did hear sne complaints about the small size of some of the corol knobs, and I found the one drink holder an inadjuate number (even though it cleverly folds down in the center console)

But that's pking at nits And I was so busy having fun with the Kompssor sports coupe that I didn't have time to do much of the







Hamlisch opens Ford Center season

Oscar- and Grammy-winner Marvin Hamlisch can take the heat in Paris

The newsmaking European heat wave was misery for some this summer, but the record heat didn't stop Hamlisch and his family from enjoying the Eiffel Tower and other attractions

One hundred degrees in Paris can still work, he explained

Hamlisch performs Saturday at the opening of the 2003-04 Ford Community & Performing Arts Center season He has written or co-written pop hits including, Nobody Does it Better and Lollipops and Rainbows, recorded by stars from Barbra Streisand to Carly Simon to Kenny Rogers

THE RUNDOWN

**1/2 (out of four)

uch like last year's enjoyably scrappy Cradle 2 the Grave, The Rundown is a stupid, disposable action film, essentially Hollywood's version of a B-movie It features second-tier stars performing low-octane stunts, stuff like kicking and punching instead of car chases and explosions

The upside is that the cast seems to relish their role as box office underdogs, clearly having more fun than the entire cast of the *Matrix* trilogy combined And isn't that why we go to stupid action films? To have fun?

The Rundown keeps its focus very limited – four characters, really – and the resulting work is tight, funny and exciting

Beck (Dwayne Johnson, aka The Rock) is a debt collector for a crime lord. His real ambition is to open a restaurant, but to do that he must pull off One Last Job – locate the boss estranged son in Brazil and bring him home.

But when he finds Travis (Seann William Scott), he is quickly pulled into

Travis' mission to uncover an ancient gold artifact called "El Gato de Diablo," which could make them both a lot of money, as well as free thousands of slave laborers who toil under the cruel hand of the ruthless gold miner Hatcher (Christopher Walken)

The fight scenes are the main draw and they are executed with skill and, oddly enough, restraint True, Beck's ability to be repeatedly smashed in the face with a tree and walk

away unharmed is pure fantasy, yet the film never devolves into the kind of anything-goes idiocy of *Charlie's Angels* or *The Matrix* The editing of the fight scenes is stylish and efficient with a neat reliance on close-ups, director Peter Berg cares more about faces than effects, and that s a good sign

Indiana Jones is Berg's clearest influence here, with Travis representing the archeology element and Beck providing the bemused fisticuffs

Scott, best known for his iconic role as Stifler in the *American Pie* films, is acceptable as the comic relief but mildly disappointing

Johnson, on the other hand, is as close

to the perfect action hero as you're likely to find He's as brawny as Schwarzenegger, more likable than Stallone and probably a better actor than either of them Action heroes usually stumble when they're called upon to deliver emotion, but Johnson holds his own in

a refreshingly brief speech about 'How He Came To Be This Way'


Look closely at Johnson's face – behind the brawn, he is a funny-looking geek trapped in a pro wrestler's body Johnson's goofy employment of overwrought expressions would be called 'overacting' if somebody else attempted it, but his natural personality and terse line delivery make it work

Walken, for his part, plays himself yet again, proving once and for all that hes no longer a human being Like Al Pacino, Walken has been in so many films that the English language apparently no longer carries any meaning for him. He recites lines like "You're dead, you just don't know it yet" as if he means, "Try this delightful raspberry jam"

The result, of course, is pure Walken – weird for the sake of being weird Somehow it doesn't matter, though, for Walken spends much of the film standing in front of video security monitors, overlooking the action and adding his bizarre commentary

The film keeps returning to him for quick, one-seconds quips delivered in extreme close-up *The Rundown* knows its strengths – Johnson's charisma, Scott's attitude and Walken's Walken-ness – and utilizes them well





'The Boneyard' is worth trying to dig up

hink of the world's great actresses, and pretty soon the name Phyllis Diller is bound to come up

Granted, her film oeuvre has been rather shm, but she actually is listed in the 1934 production of Maniac, one of the most

bizarre — and worst movies ever made

And speaking of bizarre, not to be overlooked is her bravura performance in The Boneyard, a 1990 production that withstands the ages and is worth seeking out

The Boneyard starts straight-forwardly enough Alley Oates, a reluctant psychic investigator, agrees to help the local police seek out the story behind a particularly grisly murder Three chil-

dren were killed by a crazy mortician who kept them locked in his basement and fed them 'leftovers' derived from his clients

But this isn't as nasty as it seems, for the undertaker insists the kids weren't kids at

as a long-standing family obligation and fed them the bits o others to keep them from seeking dinner on their own

And further, he says, they're not dead They are, however, in the local morgue, known affectionately as The Boneyard.

Enter, Ms Diller She portrays Miss Poopenplatz, the night shift manager of the Bonevard She's nearly bald, but that charming laugh of hers is unmistakably present. She also has a dog, a particularly obnoxious poodle named Floofsoms

Well before you can say bow-wow-wow. the little rascals have indeed come back to life to raid the refrigerator, and anyone standing in front of it, including Miss Poopenplatz, whom they turn into a 10foot-tall bug-eyed zombie hell-bent on killing everyone How that happens is best left undescribed here

Anyway, the rest of the film follows the cast being chased through The Boneyard by the little drooling, skeletal zombies, who very badly need dental care

Ah, but there's more Dear Floofsoms laps up some of the goo spilled by the dead body of Miss Poopenplatz This results in one of the most bizarre scenes in perhaps the history of filmdom

mutant poodle with a pink ribbon in its hair is so hilamous that one of the cast members bursts out laughing Im not sure that was in the script

The Boneyard has just about everything going for it There are actually a couple of genuinely chilling scenes in this slopfest. the cast is good, the demons are appropriately awful, theres plenty of gore and goo

and there's a 10-foot tall mutant poodle And Phyllis Diller



Second City-Detroit still laughing 10 years later

Flashback – Sept 15, 1993 – metro Detroit's abuzz over the anticipated opening of The Second City Detroit and its first revue – *Power to the People Mover*

Flash forward – Sept 18, 2003 – opening night of The Second City-Detroits 10th anniversary revue. The Tigers are playing across the street at Comerica Park and it's crowded downtown, something you couldn't say 10 years ago.

There's no reason to "stay on the highway until we get to 8 Mile, anymore – things are changing downtown and The Second City-Detroit is part of it



Although Williams' language in Menagerie is unquestionably beautiful and elegant, his character studies are just as engaging, said Griffith


"It's easy for the audience to get caught up in the language of the play, but they don't necessarily pay attention to what's happening with the characters We're focusing more on the characters"

Meet Hemigod, Detroit's next music stars

Who will be the next big Detroit music success story?

Some signs point to Hemigod – A band that defiantly ignores the local hipster garage music scene opting for straight-up rock n roll, and power chords Rebellious Hemigod plays what it wants – big, loud, rock n roll with some Southern twang

Reminiscent of Led Zeppelin, but not mimicking, Hemigod is long-hair, shirt less, low rise jeans and great guitar – pure rock n roll At this moment, a deal is in the works with Atlantic Records, an album scheduled for release by January, followed by a video, and possibly another stadium tour with friend Kid Rock.

Hemigod signed on to Top Dog, Kid Rock's record label Atlantic Records expressed interest soon after The band that has been together for several years hasn t even put out a CD, but has played to sold out audiences throughout the Midwest and South while touring with Kid Rock

Hemigod's emerging success is because of its talent, but it takes more than good songs to get attention, it takes luck Hemigod's four-leaf clover is Kid Rock.

Rock, as everyone in Detroit knows, has a golden touch Proof is Uncle Kracker, of Rock's Twisted Brown Tucker Band, whose album *Double Wide* went Platinum

"We can't thank (Rock) enough, said Hemigod bass player Eddy McCauley

GETTING STARTED

Hemigod lead vocalist Tim Authier sang with Kid Rock Then Rock introduced him to guitarist Bobby East, who plays with the Twisted Brown Tucker Band

Ironically, Bobby and I both held onto each other's phone numbers for weeks and we both happened to call each other on the same day," Authier said

They met, started making music, and then hooked up with bass player Eddy McCauley, another Rock friend with strong musical roots Then, like so many rock groups do, they went through several drummers before finding Todd Glass

Hemigod and Kid Rock have a bit of what McCauley calls Southern "hick" in their music

Rock expected his audience to appreciate Hemigod and he was right.

"When we played live, after each song, especially in places like West Virginia and Arkansas, the crowd went wild," Authier said "I thought (Kid Rock) was playing a joke on us and walking on stage behind me after each song to get the crowd going but he wasn't It was electrifying



Hemigod plays pure rock n roll and they make no apologies about it

HEMIGOD

Musical genre: Straight up rock n roll and Southern twang

Albums: None but an album is scheduled for release by January

What makes them special: They ve played stadium concerts with Kid Rock as the opening band

THE MUSIC

All the guys in Hemigod have been play ing for years. Authier, who also writes much of the lyrics, said he sings because it's the only thing he can really do well

And their music isn't exactly politically

"We play music that makes people want to go out, drink and have sex, not to save the rain forest," McCauley said "If you have a conscience, thats great, but do it on your own damn time I m tired of geek rock We aren't a nice little band We don't wear suits and we don't have gimmicks. And yeah, we're a bit pessimistic We all got picked on in high school, but we aren't complaining. We certainly aren't Radiohead, who s'a great band but how many people actually listen to them in

their cars? We're straight up rock n' roll " So who is Hemigod's audience?

"I don't know," McCauley said "Drunks? When we play we want people to feel like rock stars, we want it to be fun We want it all"

The band's influences include death metal, bluegrass, British-invasion rock and homegrown They've created songs titled *Hate You Now*, which begins with great guitar by East and a strong voice by Authier

It has a Southern hard rock feel and is about love gone sour *Hate You Now* starts slowly and as the intensity builds it explodes just when you need it to

The nasty, even harder song *Pledge Allegiance to the Bomb* (which has no correlation to 9/11) goes – "got money to burn, got stomachs to turn, and I got something to show you right now—and it's gonna be the time of your life so help me, Lord"

Its sex, drugs, rock n' roll, the way it was in the 1970s

WHAT THEY AREN'T

Hemigod isn't Detroit garage rock. They don't try to be and don't want to be Maybe that's what separates them from the rest

'There's all this talk that Detroit has a great music scene, but it doesn't exist,' said McCauley "No one is willing to go check out a band they never heard of, Detroiters would rather go to the dance club The local music scene is dead, really Years ago a local band could attract 1,000 people Now they're lucky if they can get 300"

McCauley and Authier said they know some people want to see them fail

"We really don't care," McCauley said
"People call us sellouts because we play
music that a lot of people like What's
wrong with that? We play what we want to
play We aren't going to play garage just
because a few people think it's cool There's
a hundred bands out there trying to sound
like The Hives, and you know they all
sound the same'

"We play rock n' roll and we don't give it a second thought," Authier said "There's a tremendous amount of pressure right now and some people want us to do things to make us fit in Well, f--- you, we aren't bending"

Hemigod is confident, but not arrogant or naive enough to say they're the next Guns n Roses or even Grandfunk Railroad — even though their fans give them that praise

"To me rock is dead, Authier said "Where's the Deep Purple? Zeppelin? It's not around anymore, but I'm still going to play what I feel'

The members of Hemigod want to be big rock stars They want to make a milhon bucks They want the stadium shows and they aren't giving apologies Now, that s rock n roll

Its easy to miss In a former coffee shop, tucked into a corner location at Orchard Lake and 13 Mile roads, OJ's is the kind of spot that gathers fans by word of mouth

Yet, not solely that way Eyen Suzuki, who goes by "OJ," a nickname acquired while earning a fine arts degree at La Salle Institute of Arts in Montreal, Canada, has been gathering devotees for some time

He first became known to lovers of fine Japanese food at Musashı ın Southfield, then at Kyoto in Troy When Little Tree was located in Royal Oak, OJ packed in sushi fans After he tired of designing the menu served on Northwest Airlines flights to Japan, he did a stint at Cherry Blossom in Novi before launching out on his own in July 2001

Born in Taiwan to a Japanese mother and Taiwanese father, 39-year-old OJ, who speaks five languages, was raised in Japan and educated in Canada

He learned classical Japanese culinary arts in Japan

FOODIE FUN

Many elements make OJ's a different spot for Japanese food Judge first by the name Sushibar Why not the conventional two words Sushi Bar?


OJ doesn't follow even Japanese convention, which he says is 'slipping away from tradition and authenticity, even in Japan Traditional Japanese food and traditional sushi are disappearing

To make Japanese food properly, a chef needs classical training Today, many of these chefs do not know how to use knives properly'

A printed menu? For sushi, yes For every-

thing else, it's handwritten in English and kanjı (Japanese characters) If you want to know the specials, posted on the board behind the sushi bar, you either need to be able to read kanjı, have OJ translate or be lucky enough to have 20year-old Corey Carroz as your waitperson

Carroz is studying Japanese at Oakland Community College and he enjoys practicing his Japanese





Among OJs personal favorites, great for sharing, are maguro yamakake, tuna, Japanese mountain potatoes and wasabi soy sauce topped with dry seaweed or tako nuta, steamed octopus, cooked scallions and wakame seaweed mixed with tangy miso vinaigrette

Sashimi moriawase, an assortment of freshly sliced seafood, served with miso soup and wakame su, that accompanies all main courses, is a good way to taste the freshest seafood of the day

Chirashi, which OJ translated as "scattered sushi," is another seafood lover's delight with assorted fresh-sliced seafood, sweet omelette, shutake mushrooms and salmon roe scattered over sushi rice

One more not to miss is saba morumi miso tsuke vaki, mackerel marinated with morumi miso (sweet red miso) and rice wine sake, then cooked on an open grill

A MOOD

Seating only 36, OJ's is a rather humble spot with pinewood tables and other accents emphasizing the wedgwood blue walls An open ceiling with spotlights and a few Japanese hanging lamps create a soft glow

Although there's no kids menu, OJ said,





Dance the night away at upscale Sevin

You have to dress well to get through the nightclub doors of Sevin – formerly known as Sin in Pontiac And if you arrive past 11 pm expect to wait in line

Hailed as the only nightchub of its kind in the Midwest, Sevin is a club with unique drinks and a stylish, dynamic atmosphere that s reminiscent of nightspots in the Big Apple

The newest nightclub to open in Oakland County, at 40 W Pike St, Sevin caters to an "upscale college crowd," but also has the fixings to please a more mature demographic

"I heard there was great music here, so I came," said Emily Savickis, 21, from Dearborn Heights "I hope to drink and dance and go home in one piece

The two-story venue offers techno and hip hop music, a 220-seat patio and a 1,800-square-foot dance floor featuring caged dancers, waterfalls and over \$100,000 worth of sound equipment and lights

For those who want to take a break from the dancing scene, Sevin offers a martini jazz lounge, a beauty salon and a private party room that hosts everything

from surprise birthday parties to bachelorette parties The 21,000-square-foot building also has a VIP room, which boasts a dark, fantasy-like atmosphere reminiscent of Studio 54 and all the elaborate excess that went along with it

"It's crazy – it's bananas," said manager Ray Hughes "There isn't anything like this in the Midwest, and I'd argue that It's hard to compete when you put so many aspects into one nightclub

The club is open Wednesday, Friday and Saturday Wednesday is 18 and older, featuring dance, hip hop and R&B music Hughes said the club accommodates about 1,000 club-goers on a typical

Wednesday, while Fridays and Saturdays aim to cater to a more "experienced" age group of older professional adult couples who come in and frequent the club's jazz lounge

From now through the end of the year, women will never pay cover at the night-club, said Hughes Guys pay \$5 on Wednesdays, \$10 on Fridays and \$15 on Saturdays

At Sevin, all you need is money, energy and stylish nightlife attire' Leave your headbands, hats and tennis shoes at home

'We still enforce a dress code and try not to let riffraff in since that's where a lot of problems start, said Hughes "When you enforce a dress code, people don't come in their Kmart specials People take the time to dress up Its a sexy crowd"

To avoid the overwhelming lines that form, Hughes recommends to get a spot in line around 10 p m. The club is packed by 11 p m. to midnight

"Business has been amazing," he said "Nobody can come close to doing the numbers we've opened"

The drink of choice for the beautiful people at Sevin is the Sevin Deadly Sins, which holds beer, seven full shots of liquor and comes in a fish bowl with dry ice for \$15

Manager and head bartender Jamie Austin won't divulge the drinks ingredients

"It's a secret, he said, "Leave it to your imagination It's the No 1 seller, because once people see it they order it all night"

Other popular drinks include Yager Bombs, Cosmos and 'anything with Redbull in it, according to Austin

'Heidelberg Project' artist has something to say about America

Don't hide behind the flag That's one message to take from An American Show, an exhibition of American Flag-themed pieces, by painter, sculptor and urban environmental artist Tyree Guyton

Best known for creating Detroits Heidelberg Project, a controversial outdoor installation, Guyton has taken American Flag elements from his other work and incorporated them into new multimedia works

An American Show opened last week at the Batista Gallery in Ferndale and continues through Friday, Nov 7

In the meantime, Guyton is collecting pennies - about 700,000 - enough to cover the exterior of a Detroit house The project is called the House that Makes SENSE and will serve as a children's art gallery and workshop

To better understand An American Show, consider Guyton's take on Americans' patriotic rush to buy up and put up the American Flag after the 9/11



Guyton hopes his American works cause people to think more about combat in the Middle East and world poli-'We're living in a crazy time,' he said "I find myself questioning everything that's being said by our leaders right now'

But don't misinterpret Guyton's irreverence in American, most bear his signature colored polka dots One piece showcases the Stars and Stripes from the confines of a bird cage

"I'm talking about bouncing back, he said of the exhibit, in particular a series of works in which coil-spring mattresses seem to mimic and frame and grow out

tics, American forces the viewer to take a second, more conscious, gaze at our national symbol

"In the context of today, I think that's important to all of us as Americans," said Detroit artist Charles McGee, one of Guyton's instructors





It's easy for Jon Weiss to have a blast at work. He's a human cannonball – shot out of a specially designed machine during the Greatest Show on Earth – Ringling Bros and Barnum & Bailey Circus, now playing at the Palace of Auburn Hills

He's been doing the act longer than anyone else, since 1987, and figures he's been shot out the cannon 5,500 times

It's very dangerous,' said Weiss, whose wife Laura presses the button that launches him into space 110 feet as fast as 65 mph "You're relying on your ability and the machinery"

Serious stuff for a guy from Long Island, NY, who auditioned for the show after graduating from Clown College in 1981 He never dreamed he'd still be touring and traveling with Laura and their three children, ages 8, 5 and 3

'I never chose it," he says about his career "I look back and can't believe it I truly enjoy what I do No one can fake it"

The only drawback is life on the road – 11-and-a-half months out of the year Time off is spent in Long Island visiting family, home is a 45-foot house trailer

On the plus side, he and his wife are able to be a part of their kids' lives 24 hours a day They've traveled all over the country, Canada and Mexico

"My kids don't see color or race," he says 'I teach them that we're all equal and have strengths and weaknesses It's OK to make mistakes as long as you learn from them"

Weiss encourages people to come to the show an hour early for the preshow, where they can mingle with performers, try on costumes, get autographs, pet animals and have their picture taken






