Cops, fire among possible city cuts

Reduced leaf pickup and cuts in snow removal, police and fire services — even special events in Kellogg Park — could be the end result if voters don t approve a millage increase on Tuesday's general election bal-

Proposal 1, if approved, will

allow city commissioners to raise property taxes from the current 11 mills to a maximum 15 mills in each of the next three years Plymouth city commissioners will be forced to evaluate personnel and service cuts to the tune of \$1 2 million for the 2004-05 fiscal year if

Proposal 1 goes down to defeat According to a list given by

City Manager Paul Sincock to commissioners, nearly threequarters of the monetary cuts could come from reductions in the police, fire and public works departments

In the August memo, Sincock

indicated the city could save \$225,000 in reduced municipal services operations by

■ Limiting snow removal overtime to major streets only

■ Scheduling residential snow removal for only Monday

through Friday, with no provisions for overtime

Of course the scarecrows displayed in Kellogg Park include the requisite witches and goblins to commemorate the Halloween season



Budget maintains millages

The Plymouth Township Police Department will get a little extra leadership, the township's fund balance will grow a little larger and residents will pay the same general operating millage rate as last year as the result of the township board's passage of its 2004 budget Tuesday

The board voted 4-3 to pass a \$12 7 million budget that includes projected revenues that exceed projected expenditures by some \$59,000 According to township officials, it's the first time since 1983 that a budget has happened

The vote established the townships millage rates at the same level as last year 0 8173 each for general operating and fire operating, and 1 6348 for police and fire That leaves the township's total general fund millage rate at 3 2694

The measure also includes a 2percent hike in the law enforcement budget that will be spent largely on personnel Chief Tom Tiderington will be allowed to create a second heutenant's position, a 10b that would include the supervision of the township's com-

Under the proposed organizational chart, the police department would have two lieutenants who would divide supervisory responsibilities over the







District adds \$1.9M to fund balance

Despite tough economic times, the Plymouth-Canton School district added \$1.9 million to its fund balance, giving it a general fund savings account of nearly \$15 2 million

The ending balance doesn't include another \$5 7 million in Durant funds, a one-time award from the state for not properly funding special education programs

It's the third year in a row despite opening three new schools and facing budget shortfalls — that the district has increased its fund balance

The year-end audit of the district's finances for the 2002-03 school year was given to the Board of Education by the auditing firm of Plante & Moran at Tuesday's board meeting

"We could not have done this without the help of our budget managers, who took to heart the financial concerns of the district,' said Patricia Brand. executive director of business services "It's due to this that we're going to be able to survive longer

Survival has become the name of the game for school districts statewide Last year, Gov Jennifer Granholm issued an executive order which resulted in a \$900,000 loss to the district And, with the state facing another billiondollar budget deficit, there are rumors foundation grants could be reduced by as much as \$200 per pupil

'There's been much discussion all over the state on the financial predicament of the state,' said Brand 'At this point in time, the numbers are floating on an every day basis Michigan has lagged behind the general economy

The increase in fund balance is the rosy part of the picture According to Brand, if state funding remains the same, and Plymouth-Canton continues to see increases in student population, the district will still see a budget shortfall of nearly \$1.5 million by next June And, projecting to the end of

the 2006-07 budget year, the

million in the red Brand said other districts are fighting the same problem, including Bloomfield Hills with a \$15 million deficit projection and Royal Oak at \$10 million over the same period

district will be more than \$24

School officials say that with 97 percent of the district's revenue coming from the state, and 90 percent of expenses in personnel, it's difficult to plan ahead in tough economic times

"It's hard when revenues are frozen, or going lower, and costs are going up," said Superintendent Jim Ryan "Some tougher times are coming due to the economy"

Ryan said the \$15 2 million fund balance can erode very

"I will be recommending to the board to use more fund balance to protect the programs we have left," he said "I don't believe there are any good cuts left to make No matter what you do now, it's going to hurt and impact education'

Ryan indicated it will take larger cuts, such as transportation or athletics, to make an impact on future budgets

"We'll continue with spending control as much as we can, but I think the board will rely on fund balance more than ever to get through better economic times," he said

Ryan said using a new diesel fuel that burns better in district vehicles, cell tower revenue and the possibility of establishing the district's own telephone system are innovative attempts to raise revenues and save on costs

Board president Judy Mardigian said she expects the state's economy to turn around, but is still looking at adding more money to the fund bal-

"If we could go into next year with a little bit more added to the fund balance, that would be very helpful," said Mardigian, "especially if the state hands us a reduction in the foundation grant this year"





Marchers take top spot in 24-team field

Park best at Huron Valley for 11th time

Saturday was a chilly, soaked-to-the-bone kind of day for the 170-member Plymouth-Canton Educational Park Marching Band, which endured steady downpours through morning practice and evening performance at the Huron Valley Invitational at Lakeland High School in White Lake

But that didn't dampen the P-CEP spirit and it certainly didn't wash out the dynamic performance of this year's show, "Souls of the Gypsy Caravan

"I thought it was an outstanding performance and everyone really put their hearts into it,' said Jenn Horst, a Salem senior and four-year flutist 'We haven t had a competition for three weeks so we really worked hard for this We practiced all day in the rain, so we were pretty wet It was a little slippery on the artificial turf at Lakeland, but it was fun performing in the rain"

The nationally acclaimed marchers made a grand sweep of Flight I trophies including first place, Best Music, Best Marching, and Best General Effect along with the Grand Champion Traveling Trophy for the highest overall score, 86 55, of all 24 competing bands

This marks the 11th year P-CEP has taken the top trophy of the 13 it has been pre-

Other Observer & Eccentric area bands included Flight III-Farmington Harrison, first, Flight II-Livonia Franklin, fourth, and Farmington, sixth Flight I— West Bloomfield, sixth, and Westland John Glenn, eighth

Kavita Srivastava, a Canton junior and one of the four drum majors, appreciated her band's commitment in spite of the rain "There was this intensity among everyone in the band," she said 'It's what w like to call 'Plymouth Everyone pulled together for the show and we felt there is nothing that can get in our way that, together, we can't over-

come' Band Director Marc Whitlock was pleased with the last outdoor competition of the season "All things considered, they did a really great job," he said Those things included the weather conditions as well as the new material added over the last few weeks

"That means these students will literally be taking three steps per second for three full minutes, he explained And they will be playing complicated music at the same time'

Over the next few weeks, Whitlock added, 'we have a lot on our plate to do and I think we have just about enough time to do it When we are completely finished, we will have a product we can all be proud of'







old female traveling northbound made a lefthand turn in front of them," said Northville Township Police Chief John Werth "The motorcycle struck the vehicle in the right front, and both the driver and pas-

senger were ejected" A Medflight helicopter from the University of Michigan Hospitals was flown to the accident site, but Werth said Lori Rotellini was pronounced dead at the scene Joe Rotellini was taken to St Joseph Hospital in Ann Arbor, where he later checked himself out to

be with his children

Lori, who didn't want to work full-time while her children were at Farrand, was a fixture at Farrand as a volunteer, helping to spearhead two fund-raising drives to buy playground equipment.

"Lori was instrumental in raising a lot of funds for the playground, and helped erect both of them," said Kuhn 'She was out swinging hammers with everyone else She was always working in the building with the kids and supporting classroom teachers

One of those teachers, Issy Sand, taught Joey for three years and became friends with the Rotellini family

'Lorı was always a person

vou could call on, no matter what you needed in the classroom, Sand said "She really enjoyed going on field trips and to camp At camp, she was the one who would go buy water for the kids because they didn't like the well water She

was a real trooper"

For the last five years, Rotellini was a paraprofessional at Gallimore Elementary. helping special education children "Lori worked in the same classroom every day, helping children who needed additional support She did anything to help them become successful,' said Principal Robin Kocher "She also helped with the breakfast program, lunch program, was an aide in the office

and helped in other classrooms 'It's been very devastating," said Kocher "She had a lot of impact here"

No matter who you talk to, what was most evident to everyone was Rotellini's love of her family

"She loved children, and had the patience of a saint," said her sister-in-law Joan Press "Not only for her own children, but also her nieces and nephews She was like a rock with her love and support

"Lori was very kind and giving, never wanted anything from anybody, and just wanted to help,' added Press "She would just show up You didn't even have to ask

communications, investigations and records divisions, as well as the patrol services bureau

The new lieutenant would be promoted from the sergeants' ranks, with a patrol officer then being promoted to sergeant The department would then hire a new officer to backfill the open position

Tiderington had wanted to hire two new officers, but board members balked at that, then reached a compromise to hire one That left police officials to determine how best to fill the

spot
"We're trying to determine if we'd be better off promoting a lieutenant or filling that open patrol position," Tiderington said "We're looking at it to see how it will be the most efficient, but we haven't made any decisions yet"

Board members Ron Griffith and Chuck Curmi wanted to prohibit the hiring of any new officers Curmi suggested taking the two officers now assigned to TEAM duty in the schools and reassigning them solely to the patrol division

"TEAM is just a downsized version of DARE," Curmi said "We don't need to have police officers in grade schools in Plymouth 3

Other big-ticket items removed from the budget include a "jaws of life" package fire department officials were looking to add The department currently has two such devices, and township officials didn't think a third was warranted

Also deleted from the budget were requests for new vehicles for some departments Some had asked for SUVs, they'll be downsized to passenger cars ınstead

"This is a fantastic budget," Supervisor Steve Mann said "We've tightened the belts, refined some line items, cut expenses and we've been real, real cautious in how we spend the township's money'

The budget also adds \$110,000 to the fund balance, raising that fund to some \$5.4 million Mann said with changes in how certain funds are accounted for coming next year, that fund could swell to between \$6 million and \$7 mil-

Only some \$400,000 of that fund is currently earmarked for specific expenditures The rest of it is cash, although the \$1 2 million the township has promised to fund the Sheldon Road underpass and the \$1 8 million contribution toward a new township hall could also come from the fund balance

Mann said the general rule of thumb is to keep a fund balance of some 20 percent of the total budget The township could be well above that next year, Mann said

"If that happens, we'll have to take a look at it," Mann said

Incumbents are among city picks

In what has been a painfully uneventful election season - especially by city of Plymouth standards - candidates haven't done much to distinguish themselves from one another

That means we have to rely on past performance (for the incumbents) and potential (for challengers) Using





Dwyer was a major influence on a committee to develop standards to help deal with a rising number of liquor license requests in the city He has also been the driving force behind the move to build a public restroom downtown, a significant need considering the thousands of people who come to Plymouth for concerts, fairs and festivals

Likewise, Potter has earned re-election She championed a commission to study youth-related issues in the community, and followed through on that campaign promise by bringing to fruition the Plymouth Community Youth Advisory Committee

She's also consistently one of the strongest voices in trying to hold the city administration's feet to the fire in terms of trimming the budget to lessen the impact of budgetary restraints on city residents She also dispelled the idea she'll seek the state House of Representatives seat currently held by John Stewart by promising to serve out her commission term

Bunting has spent the last couple of years earnestly working to learn more about the city He is a devout regular at city commission meetings and has paid attention to issues such as the budget, capital improve-

ments and development Anthony Guilliom is a political newcomer, but the commission is likely to have a strong stable of experienced politicians Some fresh blood would be a welcome addi-

tion Guilliom's financial background would help ease the loss of financial whiz-kid Bill Graham



In an effort to bolster stagnant ticket sales, and bring some \$50 million of revenue to the state in the process, the State Lottery Commission on Monday launched a pair of new games

Club Keno and pull-tab tickets were introduced to nearly 1,000 business establishments with a Class C liquor license - which allows them to serve alcohol by the glass — with the hopes of priming the cash pump that feeds the state

It's a potential revenue stream that will not only fuel the lottery coffers, but also pump millions of dollars into Michigan's education budget. The state in general and the Department of Education in particular can use the money, so trying the games seems to us a good idea

However, lining even a small portion of the state's pockets with ideas so strongly tied to drinking and gambling could be a treacherous course replete with dangerous obstacles

The Club Keno game will feature drawings every five minutes for 20 hours a day Critics can certainly envision someone with a drinking problem sitting at a neighborhood bar, feeding \$10 bills to the proprietor figuring, in an alcohol-induced haze, to get rich by hitting the million-dollar prize any minute now

Lottery Commissioner Gary Peters thinks the state is prepared to help deal with such problems

The \$50 million that could be raised by these new games makes them worth trying The potential social harm is a danger of which the state must be aware, and with which it must be poised to deal

The new Plymouth Township hall proposal is not only about whether or not the hall is a good plan for our township but it is just as much about the exercise of voters rights In the United States, all of us have a

right of representation, but some of our elected officials don't see it that way When it comes to spending at least \$12 million on a project like this, it ap that Steve Mann and friends would rather cater to special interests than to the requests and opinions of voters of Plymouth Township

Steve Mann has been quoted as saying that, 'He was elected to make the hard decisions,' and Ron Edwards has warned voters, "to be careful what they vote for," insinuating that if the \$6 million bond proposal is not approved, other plans to finance a new hall will move forward that will be more costly to the taxpayers

It is a shame that petitioners had to force Steve Mann to place the proposal before the voters Make no mistake Steve Mann only wants your vote on his election day

As I understand it, the Steve Mann/Ron Edwards plan to spend \$12 million taxpayers dollars "without a tax increase" goes like this \$6 million from bonds that residents can pay off at \$400,000 a year for the next 20 years (where will you be in 20 years?) The current township complex could be sold for \$2 million

Now, my math skills may be a bit fuzzy, but that leaves \$4 million to be funded by current township surpluses At township meetings, questions about large surpluses were explained as being set aside for rainy-day emergencies Spending our \$4 million dollar surplus on a township hall does not sound like a rainy-day emergency to me In fact, if our current tax burden allows for \$400,000 per year payments, and a \$4 million dollar surplus, the residents of Plymouth Township are being taxed too much!

The new township hall proposal is a very risky proposition and there are just too many unanswered questions Why cant the existing site be modified to be more efficient? Why are we paying \$150,000 per acre (to Don Massey) when the land is appraised at \$100,000 per acre? What are the total development costs for the property (\$12 million seems to be an estimate)? And, why locate this new hall at the southeastern corner of the township, not to mention that the corner of Haggerty and Ann Arbor Road has very high traffic volume and it will be much more difficult to access by residents

The proposal to sell \$6 million dollars worth of bonds was only approved by

four of seven board members for these very reasons and this is not a very resounding endorsement

With this plan, you can count on being asked to pay more taxes, just like the 15mill Headlee rollback proposal in the city of Plymouth So, hang on to your wallet and your rights Vote no on Nov 6

Legislature wants to balance state budget by cuts alone

ere's an update on the state's budget deficit situation. All I hear from the Republicans is the Johnny One Note song — "cut, cut," — accompanied by a high whining chant of "no new taxes"

And the Democrats, petrified by the memory of what happened during the last big budget crisis in the early '80s, have mostly been silent. Twenty years ago, facing a deficit that was proportionately much worse than this one, new Gov James J. Blanchard persuaded the Legislature to enact a temporary income tax increase. This did the job, the bills were paid without eating our seed corn and crippling the state's universities. But angered voters recalled two Democratic state.

senators who voted for the tax hike, gave control of the state senate to the Republicans and began the rise of their senate leader, one John Engler

So it looks like the reflex arc of the political system will be to solve the budget crisis by cutting expenditures

Well, what does that mean? OK,

fund that pays for K-12 schools These projections are for this fiscal year, i e the one that started Oct 1 Obviously, the best place to start with is the \$9 1 billion General Fund budget, 82 percent of which is made up of the Department of Corrections, higher education (colleges, universities and community colleges), community health (mostly Medicaid), and the Family Independence Agency

Gonna cut corrections, Ms Legislator? Sure it's a good target, given its enormous growth over the past decade In 1980, the department employed 5,000 people, today, with a total budget of \$1 6 billion, it employs 17,000 people, something like 30 percent of the states work force But are you really prepared to endure the wrath of the law 'n' order crowd (not to mention the prison guards union) by voting for deep cuts in prison budgets?

What shout Medicard Mr. Legislator or at least

What about Medicaid, Mr Legislator, or at least those places in the \$2 6 billion Medicaid budget where we have some theoretical legal flexibility to cut? You can kick a bunch of poor kids out of the program You can limit the money we spend on drugs for poor people on Medicaid Or you can dump some poor old people out of nursing homes Mr Legislator, how stony a heart and how tough a skin do you have?

Higher ed Never you mind, Ms Legislator, that you ve already cut more than 10 percent in state aid for colleges and universities over the past couple of years and, as a consequence, tuition increased by 10 percent just last fall But OK, go ahead and take a \$100 million bite out of the \$1 6 billion higher edu-

cation budget, that's around a 7 percent cut, which under the circumstances might seem reasonable

But look again. This time around, the calendar works against you. It's virtually certain, Ms. Legislator, you and your colleagues won't get around to passing a budget until early next year. Universities' fiscal years begin July 1, giving them only six months to make up for budget cuts made at calendar year end. So a cut of 7 percent imposed in, say, January 2004, will have to be made up for by a tuition increase of something like 14 percent, probably at mid-year.

Do you really want to go to meetings with parents of kids in college who are screaming at you for jacking up their tuition bills a full 25 percent over just two years? Not likely

The same calendar problem works against you, Mr Legislator, when you think about plugging the \$350 million hole in the School Aid Fund Nobody wants to do it, but it's beginning to look as though the state foundation grant of \$6,700 per pupil will have to be cut. Let's say you decide on 3 percent or \$185 per kid, effective Jan 1, 2004 — a modest number, you say But as districts are already in the middle of their school year, a 3 percent cut amounts in fact to a 6 percent cut in operations

And you tell me what school district cari cut 6 percent out of its operations during the last half of the year without grave damage

Because you're clever, you might have some clever gimmicks to propose

"Let's cut state government employment back and get leaner and meaner sounds like a good one But state government is already leaner and meaner, down from 70,000 employees in 1980 to 55,000 employees in 2003, of which 17,000 are corrections employees (see above) What about taxing the Indian casinos, which aren't paying tax? Sorry, because the Indian tribes are autonomous nations, that's a federal matter and outside your jurisdiction

I've been talking with Tom Clay, the respected budget analyst for the Citizens Research Council He concludes, "Maybe, if you work real hard, you can cut around \$300 million out of the \$600 million general fund deficit But after that, it gets very, very tough"

After all this, my suggestion to Gov Jennifer Granholm is simple Submit to Mr and Ms State Legislator two entirely different state budgets. In one, go through the exercise of solving the problem by cuts alone, "Engleresque" might be the appropriate term

In the other, propose a radical restructuring of the workings and costs of state government Let'em writhe in pain, urge far-seeing thought and debate

Then remind them that it's the Legislature's job to enact a constitutionally required balanced budget. And making those hard decisions is what they are paid for

Headlee override, hall bond issue prove it's still politics as usual

f you look up the word brouhaha in the dictionary, you'll find a picture of the Plymouth political scene.

This time, though, the real races are for taxpayer money In the city, commissioners are asking residents to allow them to waive the Headlee Amendment rollback to raise the city's general fund millage rate to a cap of 15 mills

Commissioners supporting the action, including Mayor Pro Tem Colleen Pobur, say the commission has no intention of raising it all the way Incumbent Michele Potter, whose seat is up in Tuesday's election and who opposes the idea, says, basically, "yeah, right."

Commissioners Pobur, Ron Loiselle and Stella Greene have been making the rounds of the city's informational meetings, conducted mostly at the Plymouth Cultural Center, where City Manager Paul Sincock has laid out, via Power Point presentation, the effects of the potential millage increase on city services

I watched one such presentation, and found it relied mostly on the city's explanation of its budget, and carried no overt

message of doom, other than to spell out the kinds of cuts that will be made should the question fail at the polls. The potential loss of public safety services, including police officers, was a bit melodramatic, but on point. Of course, numbers can be made to say anything

the presenter wants For instance, Pobur has said the commission won't raise taxes any higher than is necessary to balance the budget, estimating such a hike at 2.5-3 mills As former city Commissioner Sean FitzGerald correctly points out, that's only sixtenths of a mill less than the full 15 mills. More troubling is the use of city personnel to try

to scare the public into voting yes. The city was recently invited to Tonquish Creek Manor, a government-subsidized senior living facility, to accept the grateful thanks of residents for the city's efforts during the Great Blackout of 2003. Two uniformed police officers accompanied them.

City officials took advantage of the opportunity to pitch Proposal I, and just happened to point out the city would lose police manpower if the proposal failed Now, it might not look to you like officials were trying to scare these seniors — who won't be affected by Proposal I one way or the other — into voting in favor of it. But that's how it looked to FitzGerald and other critics

At one of the meetings, FitzGerald asked if it was merely coincidence these uniformed officers, being paid on city time, were at Tonquish Creek the same night the city conducted its briefing. To which Pobur replied, "Theres no such thing as coincidence'

The discussion of a new township hall in Plymouth Township has been a little more heated Fhers have started, well, flying. Theres one put out by Plymouth Facts, LLC, a group registered on the state's Web site by former township Supervisor Maurice Breen, that does the same thing some say city officials are doing. Telling a fuzzy sort of truth.

For instance, the piece claims township officials "never held public hearings on the site development." While we agree more public hearings were needed, the township did, in fact, conduct such a session at St. Kenneth's Church last October

The flier, which may violate state election law because it doesn't indicate who paid for it, also says the township paid \$30,000 for CRESA's needs study, "which duplicates a staff study." In fact, while some of the information is similar, the CRESA study contains far greater detail. Is \$30,000 too much to have paid for it? Perhaps.

The filer also makes some good points Water/sewer fund money is going to be used to help pay the cost of the \$12 million project. The township already owns property on which it could have built — the current site at Ann Arbor Road and Lilley and the DPW property on Port. And officials never put out bids for the needs study, instead giving it to the real estate arm of the township's own auditors, Plante & Moran.

Then there are the requisite fliers advocating the township hall, as well, so many that some residents are getting fed up with them. To date, fliers have been distributed by the Plymouth Township Police Officer Association, the Plymouth Township Firefighters union and the Concerned Citizens for Plymouth Township

And, while the CCPT would like folks to believe its a grass-roots effort to combat the naysayers, a closer look reveals something a little deeper. But look at the names on the Concerned Citizens for Plymouth Township Joe Bridgman is the township's deputy clerk and will run for the office next year if current Clerk Marilyn Massengill doesn't, Dennis Cebulski is chairman of the planning commission, Harry Jachym is on the Zoning Board of Appeals, Roy Hart is on the compensation committee, Elaine Hovey is on the Downtown Development Authority

While no one is questioning the character or the dedication of any of these people, it's still an obfuscation A real grass-roots effort would have more "regular Joes"


And, while no campaign laws are being broken, at least one of the mailings was paid for using a postal permit belonging to Supervisor Steve Mann, the guy who has the most to gain politically if the bond proposal passes in the township

Who says it's not politics as usual in Plymouth?

More than 1,200 individuals collected \$366,000 from over 10,000 donors in this year's efforts, a 33 percent increase from last year. Since its inception in 1997, \$17 million has been raised locally through the Friends for the Cure program.

Overall, the 2003 Race raised \$880,000 in support of local breast cancer screening, education, and special treatment programs, as well as the National Research Grant Program of the Susan G Komen Breast Cancer Foundation

Shari Franko of Dearborn took the first place solicitor award with a grand total of \$5,582 To date, Shari's Friends contributions total \$150,000

Second place winner Karen Sallee of West Bloomfield collected \$4,200

Oakland County Family Independence Agency in Bloomfield Hills gathered to raise \$4,019, taking the third place award

Volunteer Friends for the Cure Co-Chairs Michael Meldrum of Lathrup Village and Tammi DeProfio of Northville both see this as a way of extending their employer Johnson & Johnson's credo into the community

"I've never seen so much accomplished by the enthusiasm and commitment of a great group of people,' said Meldrum, whose wife, Maureen, is the Race Chair and an 11-year breast cancer survivor "It's great to see such broad-based support for a cause that afflicts so many," added DeProfio

SEMCOG: 90,000 area jobs lost since March 2002

Southeast Michigan lost 90,000 jobs from March 2002 to August 2003, according to Employment Change by Community, Southeast Michigan, 1999-2002, a new report released by SEMCOG, the Southeast Michigan Council of Government

Although the losses are still significant, this time period showed smaller losses in manufacturing employment than in previous years and improvements in most other sectors. Southeast Michigan reported 2,233,329 jobs in August 2003, a 2 3 percent drop in jobs from March 2002.

Employment Change by

Employment Change by Community, Southeast Michigan, 1999-2002, shows place-of-work employment at the community level for the first time and shows year-by-year change for eight classes of employment Previously, such data was only available at the county level SEMCOG is now able to identify the locations of almost all employment establishments

LOCAL JOB LOSSES

For the period covered in the detailed report, Canton Township and Plymouth Township were the only communities showing job gains among Observer communities

Canton Township added 478 jobs in 1999-2000, 498 jobs in 2000-2001 and lost 350 jobs in 2001-2002 for a net gain of 626 jobs Garden City added 64 jobs in 1999-2000, and lost 161 jobs in 2000-2001 and 378 jobs in 2001-2002 for a net loss of 475 jobs

Livonia gained 858 jobs in 1999-2000 but lost 3,054 jobs in 2000-2001 and 2,836 jobs in 2001-2002 for a net loss of 5,032 jobs Plymouth gained 342 jobs in 1999-2000 but lost 471 jobs in 2000-2001 and 402 jobs in 2001-2002 for a net loss of 531 jobs Plymouth Township gained 1,253 jobs in 1999-2000 and 797 jobs in 2000-2001 but lost 1,399 jobs in 2001-2002 for a gain of 651 jobs

Redford Township gained 623 jobs in 1999-2000 but lost 551 jobs in 2000-2001 and 684 jobs in 2001-2002 for a net loss of 612 jobs Westland gained 305 jobs in 1999-2000 but lost 754 jobs in 2000-2001 and 1,143 jobs in 2001-2002 for a net loss of 1,592 jobs

The report tracks jobs at the national, state and regional levels While the US gained 2 2 million jobs between 1990 and 2000, the economic recession of 2001-2002 resulted in a loss of about two million jobs Total jobs in Michigan peaked in 2000 with 2,332,242 jobs In 2002, that figure was down to 2,242,452, a loss of 89,790 jobs The most recent job loss number - just over 9,000 from March 2002 to August 2003 - indicates a much slower rate of loss

Most of the job loss in Southeast Michigan was in manufacturing – specifically

in the sectors called apparel from fabrics, rubber and miscellaneous plastics, primary metal industries, fabrication of metal products. industrial and commercial machinery, electronic and electrical equipment and transportation equipment The largest losses were in Detroit, Livonia, Sterling Heights and Warren - each lost over 2,000 manufacturing jobs In Southeast Michigan, 72,000 manufacturing jobs were lost from the March 2000 peak to August 2003 In 1999, manufacturing accounted for 27 percent of the total job gain in the region that year, and from 2000-2003, it accounted for 73 percent of total job

SERVICE JOBS GAIN

Communities with most service-based employment – for example, health care, education, and personal services such as hair stylists, auto mechanics and plumbers – saw slight employment gains

Despite a 5.594-10b loss in

2002, the net gain in service jobs from 1999-2002 was 25,485 Communities gaining significant numbers in service jobs were Detroit (4,290), Dearborn (3,733), Ann Arbor (1,790), Farmington Hills (1,419) and Clinton Township (1,419) The services industry is the largest employer in Southeast Michigan, comprising about 39 percent of total employment

Employment Change by Community, Southeast Michigan, 1999-2002 contains seven maps that illustrate employment change in the region. There are also tables that detail employment by eight classes of employment (such as manufacturing, retail, services, etc.) by county and by every community in Southeast Michigan

"SEMCOG will continue to track employment in Southeast Michigan on an annual basis," said Paul Tait, SEMCOG Executive Director 'I am hopeful that the region will emerge from what economists have called a 'jobless economic recovery' to actually add jobs in coming months – especially higher-paying manufacturing jobs"







Of course, with both schools running a lot, it could make things easy to defend Or not



Truax led DC with 119 of the team's 147 yards rushing, while Matt Forstek was 4-for-17 pass-







Pieces from Life's Crazy Quilt a pleasure to read

"PIECE'S FROM LIFE'S **CRAZY QUILT,"**

by Marvin V Arnett (University of Nebraska Press, \$26 95)

arvın V Arnett grew up during the 30's and 40's in a rented flat near the corner of Herbert and Bangor on Detroit's west side Via brief and lively scenarios in "Pieces from Lifes Crazy "Quilt," she takes us on a lively journey through those growang-up years, providing an upclose-and-personal look at what life was like in one of Detroit's African-American enclaves during that historic

Arnett paints Herbert Street as something of a crazy quilt neighborhood, a place with a split personality' all its own "Factory workers, domestic day workers, welfare families, and just plain hustlers occupied buildings on our side of the street,' she tells

"Our side also could boast of a writer who lived in the small house on the alley Five

teachers, a doctor, several store clerks, a nurse, and numerous city, state, and federal employees occupied the north side of the street Even one of Joe Louis's aunts lived in the large brick apartment buildings directly across the street from our flat"

The title of this memoir was inspired by Arnett's mother, Melissa Grace Sprague, a gifted seamstress who specialized in making crazy quilts and not just for beds and babies In the aging, four-family flat where the Spragues lived, she hung her creations on the thin walls, in order to cover gaping cracks and soften the edge of Detroit's winter winds

In 32 concise chapters,

Arnett fashions a picture of this time, this place, and these people that seems as vivid as one of those quilts made of wools, velvets, ginghams, silks, satins, and other treasures from her mother's cherished "rag bag'

Some of these literary segments are touching and even deeply sad, although none seem ultimately despairing Even the account of the death of the author's sister, Jewel, offers an image of hope at its conclusion, as the family gathers for breakfast on a new day, struggling to regain a measure of normalcy

Other parts of the memoir paint frightening pictures of neighbors (the sanctimonious

Rev Saxon, for example, who makes sexual advances toward Marvin in an alleyway), or events (the 1943 race riots, during which the author's father, William, kept a nighttime vigil, 'his hunting rifle across his knees, and "the sound of breaking glass, running feet, and pistol shots"

in the darkness Several of the pieces add a touch of wry humor to the overall picture In "My Father vs the Church of the True Believers," we witness a memorable event called the Chicken Legs Fracas, during which Arnett's father tangles with a greedy churchgoer over a pair of drumsticks

In "To Thine Own Self Be

True," we see how the future writer gets herself in hot water at the Lothrop Library by checking out an "adult" book In "My Brother and the Katzenjammer Kıds" Wıllıam Sprague gives true meaning to the word, "cool," as he deals with the notorious neighborhood bully

Despite a slight tendency to repeat information, and to lean on cliched phrases now and then, Arnett has put together a splendidly structured memoir "Pieces from Life's Crazy Quilt," a part of the American Lives Series edited by Tobias Wolff, will bring pleasure to many readers, and will hold extra special appeal for those in the Detroit area.



Clean your home at least once a week

My home is clean and picked up part of the time, usually when I am preparing to entertain. The remainder of the time it is a mess. Is there any way to keep my home clean and organized all the time?

Maintain whatever you organize, and clean regularly Maintenance is the best way to avoid a huge mess in your house Cleaning on a regular basis and putting items back where they belong is the simplest, yet most effective main-

tenance program I have found Clean routinely once a week and your house will look clean most of the time Then ask yourself the question, "Do I clean for myself or other people?" Our motivation will determine our degree of suc-

I clean for the pure satisfaction of living in a clean home I do it for me If I never had a visitor, I would still keep my house clean If you clean for others, you will only be motivated to clean when you are expecting visitors This forces you to clean on demand (emergency cleaning is seldom convenient and usually not as effective) I know people who have done some very creative cleaning when they received only a few minutes' notice that

guests were arriving Here are some of their techniques 1 If the dishwasher and the sink are both filled with dishes, carry the exposed dirty dishes to the bathtub, but don't forget to pull the shower

curtain in case your guests need to use the bathroom 2 Fill cardboard boxes with household clutter and hide the boxes in the garage or the basement 3 Of course, you can always shove any items littering the floors under the beds or the couch I do not recommend these methods because they can be stressful It also requires a lot of extra work getting things back to their original location (like carrying all the dishes from the bathroom back to the kitchen)

Establishing a cleaning maintenance program would be a lot easier Your home would instantly be ready for guests and you could enjoy a clean home on a regular basis

Keep your house picked up This means putting everything back where it belongs when you are done using it If you live with other people, this can be a more difficult problem to tackle It may require not only training yourself to put things away, but other household members will need to understand and practice this method as well You may try a positive approach when someone leaves something out "Honey, would you please put this back where it belongs?

If that approach does not

work, you may need negative reinforcement "This item now belongs to me because you did not put it back where it belongs" Train yourself and your family that when you are done using something, you must put it back immediately When you need it the next time you will be able to find it quickly It is so tempting to say, "I'll just put this on the counter for now and put it away later" Before we know it, we have accumulated an entire counter full of 'I'll put it away later' items

We have now increased the length of time it will take to put everything away because we have added a new element, sorting We will have to sort through everything before we put it away Other family members may not share the same philosophy as you They may feel that leaving something out is more convenient because the item is in plain view where they can access it quickly I would rather take a positive approach with them but I am prepared to use, "It's mine now" Maintenance means putting away each item as soon as you are finished using it

Wolf, Dacor and these other high end appliances are selling so well? Those products have real, tangible, measurable quality and their price reflects that" Now here is an industry

leader coming right out and

giving product names of what you should consider purchasing You might think that his list is rather short. It is, and I think that mine would include a few more names I stand behind his statement about the Sub-Zero Manufacturer being one of the best in this country Yes, still American with the old fashioned tradition of building a product with simple design, that does the job better than most and a quality factor that they will absolutely not compromise This writer has nothing to do with Sub-Zero in any way shape or form, but I've heard from enough people to know that when you need help from them, they give it to you in a very accommodating

They very well could be the example of intelligent service that has been lost by so many

other manufacturers

The typical service technician has a standard comment to be made regarding the word quality "Why did they stop making a certain model? It was the best product they had

It is a fact that when the tool-and-die parts used to make a certain model wears out, it cost millions of dollars to replace all of this manufacturing equipment The company Maytag told me years ago that they wouldn't produce any more garbage disposers because the dies were worn out At one time the Maytag disposer could chew up a bucket of bolts Up to this day, no one has ever made a disposer like theirs

In today's world when shopping for a major home appliance, you as a consumer need to do your homework And if you don't, I will be at a home show in your neighborhood or speaking to a group in the area You can feel free to come over and say hello and tell me all about your troubles Besides how do you think I get to write these columns? You teach me Stay tuned





Heating systems shouldbe checked annually

(MS) - More than 60 million US homes are heated by natural gas or propane each winter Homeowners should be sure to have their gas appliances checked now to ensure efficient, reliable, safe and economical operation during the cold weather months ahead

"In fact, we recommend that homeowners have their heating systems inspected every year prior to the onset of the heating season by qualified, licensed contractors or by their local gas company," says Evan R. Gaddis, president of Gas Appliance Manufacturers Association (GAMA), a national trade association which represents residential space-heating appliance manufacturers "When a furnace is operating properly, it is more efficient, which means it saves homeowners money and provides safe, reliable comfort during the winter"

Gaddis points out that there are a number of steps homeowners can take to help their heating systems operate optimally For example, check for signs of problems by inspecting the duct work and venting of the heating system

Look for cracks or openings around the flue or duct pipes If there are signs of rust, it may be caused by excessive condensation inside the flue that could indicate an improperly adjusted burner In this case, the burner needs to be adjusted by an expert

Any heating-system inspection, according to Gaddis, should include oiling the blower motor and fan as well as taking a look at the blower belts for signs of wear A qualified repair professional should replace them if they are cracked or frayed

The burner chamber and pilot also need to be inspected and cleaned with a brush

When cleaning, be sure to vacuum all registers, vents and baseboard heaters to remove any dust, lint and pet hair. While working with registers, it is good to remember that upper floor registers can be closed in the winter and then opened in the summer to allow efficient air control. If ceiling fans are used, remember to point the draft upward, hot air rises, helping circulate warm air throughout the home.

Goldner Walsh celebrates 50 years in business

100 year drought - with no water supply when the well went dry that year – followed by a very rainy season didn't deter Tim Travis and Jım Slezinski

In 1988 the two men purchased Goldner Walsh Nursery from Al Goldner, who ran the business for 34 years Today Travis is president of the nursery, and Ŝlezinski is vice president, a landscape horticulturist and designer

Lots of exciting things have been happening this year as they celebrate and continue to celebrate the nursery's Golden Anniversary You are invited to stop in and walk through the quiet greenhouses and enjoy the peaceful place and see the variety of plants they carry

STARTING OUT

Alfred H Goldner and his wife, Jean Walsh Goldner, started this landscape design and nursery on 7/8th of an acre in what was once a cornfield on the corner of 12 Mile and Southfield roads in 1953 In 1980 they moved the business to its present location at 559 Orchard Lake Road in Pontiac

Al, a native Detroiter, was educated in Dearborn, graduated from Michigan State University with a degree in floriculture and attended Ohio State University doing graduate work

His first job in the horticulture business was to manage Regner's Nursery in Dearborn He was then hired by the J L Hudson store in Detroit as the garden buyer This unique garden 'store' was out of doors, 'seasonally, on one of the roofs of the building

"Al learned a lot during the time he worked for Hudsons," Jean said "I ran the office and my mother helped with the two children I couldn't have done it without her We had a wonderful opening in this area because we specialized in unusual things such as espalier trees, azaleas and rhododen-

"Many other nurseries didn't grow them, so this helped build up the business At one point we grew espalier trees in

She adds that they are

pleased Travis and Slezinski have carried on the name and tradition of the nursery "They are a credit to the community, Jean said

Al brought innovation to the new business with personal service, and introduced the concept of using exotic plant materials into the landscape design, such as those mentioned above Goldner also included Japanese maples, hollies, dwarf conifers, and espalier apple and pear trees He chose daylilies, Hemerocallis, to breed and propagate and continued with this endeavor at his home for 35 years

Goldner traveled extensively visiting gardens throughout the world, thus inspiring ideas from other countries into his landscape designs


He looked for plants he could carry in his nursery He ıntroduced the Dawn Redwood, Metasequoia Glyptostroboides, considered at first to be a "fossil" tree until it was rediscovered in China in 1948 The tree was first sent to the National Arboretum for evaluation Al received a propagated small tree in 1955 and planted it at his home where it majestically stands today

And the years sped by In the 1970s, Goldner's commercial landscapes included annuals (a new innovation at that time) Groundcover and perennial plants were also his trademark in the plans. He was also interested in residential architecture, especially the contemporary homes that were popular in the 1960s and '70s and his landscapes complemented the style of the homes

Goldner enjoyed seeing his landscapes continue to grow and flourish as he revisited them He believed a pictureperfect landscape planting should last for many generations and could be manipulated through correct pruning and judicious maintenance even if the garden was several

years old It was a pleasure for him to visit the sites Goldner once told a customer, that although the resident was paying for Al's landscape services, in reality he was paying for Als pleasure in life, which was his love of the landscape

His landscapes live on not

only at residences but in public places such as the former Detroit Bank & Trust buildings (now Comerica), Kirk-in-the-Hills, Congregational Church in Birmingham, the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island, Cranbrook Gardens, Meadow Brook Hall, and the Bloomfield Township Library

AN EARLY START

Travis said he knew the moment he walked in the store I would some day own it and told Al this that day," Travis \mathbf{said}

"I have always been interested in horticulture, since the second grade and I began working at GW when it was at \ the first location," Travis said "At first I did everything from changing oil in the truck to selling trees I was buying stock and created my own position?

Travis describes himself as self-taught" and experienced a lot of personal growth at that

time 'I graduated from MSU in business/horticulture and became full time operations manager at GW," Travis said 'My career has worked out and continues to evolve, the business never stopped growing"

"A neighbor took me to meet Jim There was a natural spirit about the place and it was a right fit for me Even though Al retired, GW was a business that has not retired Al has done so much for our indus-

"This thriving business gives much back to the community

At this time it is involved in 60 charities,' Travis said

Jım Slezinski joined GW in 1973 as manager of the developing garden center

"As a never ending student of landscape horticulture and design, the past 31 years were a growing experience (pardon the pun) for me at GWN, Slezinski said Besides the influence of Dr Harold Davidson, who is now retired and once taught horticulture to Slezinski while he was in graduate school at Michigan State University, Slezinski is grateful for the 'hands-on" education under the "guiding wing" of Alfred Goldner for 16 years "He was a real pioneer in the field of landscape design and ornamental plants in metro Detroit," Slezinski said

Slezinski expects to continue on "in this wonderful profession of plants and how they relate to people in their daily life, bringing new and exciting ornamental plants and design ıdeas" at Goldner Walsh

Al Goldner's "shingle" on the store reads "To Get the best Plants for any Garden, Goldner-Walsh Inc 29185 Telegraph Road, Southfield 'Plant Material from the country's best growers' EL-6, 1484" This historic sign still hangs at Goldner Walsh Nursery's current location

It still reads true today Jean and Al are presently enjoying retirement at their home



he Chaldean American Ladies of Charity are on a mission Determined not to let the recipes of their culture disappear with every passing generation, they are in the final stages of publishing a cookbook something you don t find in most Chaldean kıtchens

MOTIVATION

Motivated by their desire to preserve authentic and traditional dishes that closely mirror Middle Eastern cuisine — but have their own distinct flavor and style of presentation — the Chaldean char ity group has collected hundreds of recipes over the last several months

"We hope to include about 250 recipes,' Yono said, "but there will be duplicates of some dishes so that we can show the many different ways families prepare the food with a variety of ingredients The idea for the cookbook has been so well-received That's why we had a contest to determine what recipes would make it into publication'

A cooking extravaganza was held Sunday, Sept 21, at The Community House in downtown Birmingham Hosted by CALC, whose membership exceeds 500, the day-long event attracted 400 guests who sampled some 65

The bad news is that some rands have been hurt.

In the UCD survey, only seven percent of wineries indicate they plan to introduce their own super value wine, but 36 percent believe their competitors will

About 70 percent of retailers reported that consumers are concerned with price and value, while others say customers are asking for a wider selection of wines and more information about wine

RE-EVALUATIONS

Wineries are focused on reevaluating their prices, cutting costs, and capturing efficiencies, the survey found

More than 25 percent of wineries decreased case prices, compared to 18 percent increasing

Looking ahead four or five years, wineries and vineyards expect their strongest sales growth to be in high-end wines, while distributors and sellers are eyeing wines priced between \$3 and \$15

The California grape surplus, a result of increased plantings in the 1990s, appears to be over, except for Cabernet Sauvignon and Pinot Noir, Smiley noted

Get into the poultry game with these recipes

s a follow-up to my last article on new and exciting ways to prepare poultry and game, I wanted to share with you some of my favorite recipes

ROASTED BREAST OF PHEASANT WITH CARAMELIZED APPLES AND A HINT OF CURRY

This recipe also works very well with chicken Serves four 4 pheasant breasts

1 /2 ounces unsalted butter 3 dessert apples peeled cored

and diced 1 /2 ounces sugar

2 teaspoons oil 2 ounces white wine 3 ounces heavy cream

4 tomatoes skinned seeded and diced 6 ounces curry sauce (recipe fol

lows below) salt and pepper (for seasoning)

Melt 1 ounce of butter, add the apples and fry over high heat for 1 minute Add the sugar and fry, tossing apples occasionally, until they are golden brown Season the pheasant breast with salt and pepper

Heat the oil in another pan, add the remaining butter and, once sizzling, place the breasts skin side down into the pan

Cook over low heat for about 3 minutes on each side (Be careful not to over-cook them, pheasant is best if left slightly pink, as it

dries out quickly) Remove the breasts from the pan and keep

Pour off the excess fat from the pan, add the white wine and reduce until almost none

Add the curry sauce and bring the mixture to a boil Once boiling, add the cream and reduce slightly Strain the sauce before serving

To serve, reheat the apples in a frying pan Place the breasts in an oven for about 2 minutes to reheat Place the apples in the

center of the plate with the pheasant breast directly on top, and pour the sauce around it Garnish with a bouquet of fresh herbs

ESCALOPES OF TURKEY WITH THYME AND TOMATO

An escalope (or "scallop") is a very thin, usually flattened, slice of meat or fish This is a very simple but effective dish, which takes very little time to

prepare and cook If you have no fresh thyme, any other fresh herb will do, try basil, chives or even mint Serves four

8 turkey escalopes about 3 ounces each salt and freshly ground white

Lightly season the turkey escalopes with salt and pepper Heat the oil and 1/2 ounce of butter in a frying pan until siz-

Sauté the escalopes for about

1-1/2 minutes on each side Remove them from the pan and keep warm

Pour off the fat, add the white wine and reduce until almost none remains Pour in the chicken stock and lemon juice, then add the mustard Bring to the boil and reduce until only 3 fluid ounces remain

To serve, place the turkey in the oven to reheat for about 2 minutes Add the chopped shal lots and the thyme to the reduced stock Place the pan over a low heat and gradually whisk in the cold butter, piece by piece, until it has melted Add the diced tomatoes and stir in the heavy cream Spoon the sauce over the turkey and garnish with fresh thyme sprigs

BREAST OF GUINEA FOWL WITH LENTILS

This recipe also works well with quail, chicken or even duck. Serves four 4 Guinea fowl breasts

Salt and freshly ground white

pepper 2 teaspoons or h ounces unsaled butter 2 ounces bacondiced 4 ounces white ne 12 ounces chickn broth

Add the lentils to the boiling stock and simmer for about 15 minutes Add the thyme leaves for the last 2 minutes

To serve, reheat the breasts in the oven for about 2 minutes Add the diced tomatoes to the sauce and spoon onto the plates Cut the breasts in half lengthways, but leave joined at one end Fan each breast and place in the center of each plate Top each breast with a fresh sprig of



Seafood book answers oceans of questions Pumpkins star in

BY BARBARA ALBRIGHT

(AP) - Any questions about cooking seafood? Chances are you'll find an answer in *The* New York Times Seafood Cookbook

The book, edited by Florence Fabricant (St Martin's Press, \$30), is an orderly and comprehensive survey of the subject You won't overlook that the book has some 250 recipes for more than 70 kinds of fish and shellfish, since that's included in the subtitle on the

"Around the middle of the last century, Americans ate much less fish than they do today, less than 10 pounds per person annually, compared with close to 20 pounds now," Fabricant, a New York Times food writer, says, putting the subject in context

"The numbers are paltry in comparison with those for countries like Japan and Norway, but they represent a decided shift in taste," she

In answer to America's preference for eating more fish, Fabricant assembled and edited recipes from a range of food professionals, that have appeared in The New York Times

To complement the recipes, the book's reference sections supply plenty of information on basic methods of preparation for seafood, including serving it raw, marinating, poaching, boiling, steaming, sauteing, frying, grilling, broiling, roasting, baking, braising, smoking and planking

The book also explores dif ferent varieties of fish, describing each and suggesting handy substitutes, with recipes for each type There is a section

with recommendations for wine to serve with the different types of fish

Of the recipes I tested, salmon cakes with yogurt chipotle sauce had a simple sauce made from only two ingredients and it was delicious However, the batter was very runny I checked with the publisher and was assured the recipe was correct, but next time I will leave out 3 of the 4 eggs it calls for

Following are three other delectable and easy recipes from the book spaghetti with scallops, lemon and bread crumbs, shrimp baked with feta cheese, and shrimp in garhe sauce

Any of these dishes would make an excellent meal served with a tossed green salad, another vegetable of your choice, and a crusty loaf of bread Rice makes a great accompaniment with both of the shrimp dishes

By the way, according to Fabricant, Americans eat more shrimp than any other fresh or frozen seafood, only canned tuna is more popular SPAGHETTI WITH SCALLOPS, LEMON

AND BREAD CRUMBS (Time 30 minutes)

2 cups bread cut into/z-inch

1 pound spaghetti 6 tbs extra virgin olive oil

3 medium garlic cloves minced 2 tbs lemon juice 2 tbs flat leaf parsley leaves

/2 tsp red chili flakes or to taste 1 pound sea scallops tough ten don removed scallops cut into% inch cubes

Bring 4 quarts salted water to boil in a large pot

Place bread crumbs in a food processor fitted with metal blade and grind into coarse crumbs, about I minute Place crumbs in a large skillet set over medium heat Toast, shaking the pan often, until crumbs are golden

Remove crumbs from the pan and set aside

Add spaghetti to boiling water While pasta is cooking, briefly heat oil in the skillet Add garlic and cook until golden, about 1 minute Stir in lemon juice, parsley, red chili flakes and salt to taste Cook 30 seconds Add scallops and cook, stirring, until they are opaque and cooked through 3 to 4 minutes Do not overcook Adjust seasonings Keep warm

Drain spaghetti when al dente, but do not shake bone-dry Transfer spaghetti, still dripping with a little cooking water, to a large bowl, and toss with scallop sauce Sprinkle with bread crumbs and toss well Divide pasta into individual bowls, and serve immediately

pancake-yogurt and fruit-loaf recipes

AP - Since pumpkins lend such a colorful aura to the fallwinter season, this is a good point at which to start looking at ways for cooks to use them

A versatile pumpkin pancake paired with yogurt, an autumninspired dish, could serve as breakfast, brunch or dessert fare, or whenever taste suggests

The recipe, from registered dietitian Elizabeth Ward, author of 'Healthy Foods, Healthy Kids' (Adams Media, 2002), has a nutrition twist Its combination of pumpkin mildly spiced with cinnamon is served with a creamy yogurtraisin sauce instead of traditional syrup

It delivers 'a satisfying fall flavor," says Ward, mother of three children, who developed the recipe for the 3-A-Day of Dairy program "Plus, my kids love the taste of the sweet vanilla yogurt topping and I can give them one calcium-rich serving of dairy For a fast and healthy meal, I often serve 'breakfast for dinner'

The ingredient list doesn't call for fresh pumpkin, so the recipe is useful for backup pantry-shelf provisioning, any time of year

PUMPKIN PANCAKES WITH YOGURT RAISIN TOPPING

(Preparation 5 minutes cooking time 10 to 15 minutes)

For the topping 2 cups lowfat vanilla yogurt

1 cup raisins For the pancakes

1 cup all purpose flour 1tbsp sugar

2 tsp_baking powder /atsp connamon

1 cup 1 percent lowfat milk 2 tbsp_melted butter

½ cup canned pumpkin /2 cup lowfat vanilla yogurt

In a small mixing bowl combine 2 cups vanilla yogurt and raisins Reserve

To make the pancakes Combine flour, sugar, baking powder and cinnamon in a large mixing bowl

Window, door replacement is maintenance

Our board is replacing obsolete windows and stiding doors on condominium units and needs to levy an assessment to do that. Some of the co-owners say that is an addition or improvement to the condominium documents necessitating a vote of the owners. What do you think?

While it is hard to make a determination without looking at a complete set of your documents, it would appear on its face that the replacement of windows and sliding doors does not constitute an addition or improvement to the common elements but 1s, rather, maintenance That was the decision in a recent case out of a circuit court in Connecticut where the court said that the act of replacing the obsolete features of the common elements was not a "substantial change to the real estate," but was part of the association's duty to maintain the common elements in common areas

One of our co-owners in our condominium has been complaining about noise emanating from a neighbor's unit. The complaining co-owner maintains that the association is responsible for enforcing the use restrictions which give a right to the association to enforce the restrictions. The co-owner who is complaining is threatening to sue the association if it does not take action. What do you think?


Normally, a decision to

pursue a bylaw enforcement matter is a business judgment of the board of directors which will not be set aside unless the board was acting arbitrarily, in bad faith or otherwise negligently In a sımılar case out of Louisiana, the court determined that the association has a right, but not the duty, to enforce the rules and regulations The court noted that the complainant/co-owner had a right to pursue any noise violation and that, therefore, the co-owner should be compelled to pursue the alleged noise maker without association liability for failing to do so

You brushed your teeth, washed your face, put on your jammies, if you own any, and got into bed With the turn of the bed lamp switch, darkness sprayed across your room It's night time in your house

do with the structure or the
mechanics of the house,' said
Harold Weine, 'there's nothing
we can do about it"

Weine, of Alert Home Inspections, Southfield, said he doesn't deal with the ghostly or supernatural sounds houses might make, but gets frequent calls about squeaky floors

'The furnace?

Sure it was the furnace? Heat ducts, Weine said, can contribute to the sometimes spooky symphony of a house's night time noises. "If they nailed the sheet metal right to the floor joists," he said, there can be vibrating sounds and tinny rattling.

Pipes can expand and contract with changes in water temperature,' Weine said "You'll hear a banging in the walls," if, say, the washing machine is running

Or, Weine said, that noise might be from waste lines or supply lines that are not properly secured Or, he said, it could be air in the pipes that make a hammering noise Or could it be something else?

"The attic What am I hearing in the attic? Nobody could be up there'

In winter, Weine said, "when the attic is cold, roof trusses

can actually rise up Houses move and settle continuously There's expansion and contrac-

tion, mostly due to weather"
"It's more like a scratchscratch I thought I heard a
whimper'

Animals in the house, Weine said, recalling his encounters with mice and chipmunks and squirrels, and raccoons in the house where the woman couldn't close upstairs windows because she'd let the ivy vines

grow into the bedrooms
'Helps keep the house cool,"
Weine said she told him
"Bugs," he said

"Why can't I just ignore it all

and go to sleep!'
Why? It might be part of the human condition, according to psychologist Carolyn Daitch,

Most of us need to feel we're in control," said Daitch, director of the Center for Anxiety and Emotional Distress, Farmington Hills 'There's a part of our brain that's quite primitive and we inherit it with its survival mechanism not much changed

Take a look at adjustable rate mortgage

Sprinklers are heat-triggered devices that shower water into rooms to control fire and smoke until the fire department can respond

Sprinklers for commercial buildings may require special plumbing and larger dedicated pipes, but Montpelier Fire

Chief Norm Lewis said residential sprinklers can be attached to existing home

Nickleback isn't trying to duplicate success

Nickleback's song, How You Remind Me, was the No 1 tune in the world in 2002 In the world

No song was played more on radio stations across the globe Bass player Mike Kroeger said he and the rest of the band still can't comprehend it

"It's like the size of the ocean, we know it's big, but we can't actually grasp just how to have the No 1 song in the world is beyond anything imaginable, it's out of our reach," Kroeger said.

The hard rock band from Vancouver, coming to the Palace on Thursday, Nov 6, won't even attempt to repeat the success of How You Remınd Me

"Doing it once is wild enough," Kroeger said 'People connected with Remind Me, that connection is one of the best feelings m the world"

Their current album, The Long Road, is already in the Top 10 after just one month Their previous album, Silver Side Up, sold more than nine million copies, went multi platinum, earned four Grammy nominations, four Billboard and four Juno awards

Because of their success, Nickleback finally got what they wanted when they went into the studio last year to record The Long Road complete creative freedom They produced the album themselves

REAL SURPRISE

"We ve pushed things further in every

way possible," said Chad Kroeger, vocalist, guitarist and the band's primary songwriter "We're very proud of this album Fans of real rock music are in for a real surprise'

Mike Kroeger, Chad's brother, said The Long Road still maintains the feel and integrity of Silver Side Up

'We aren't re-inventing the wheel," Mike Kroeger said "We didn't want to write the same album twice, but we respect the type of music that our fans want I'm excited about this album because it has some really, really hard songs on it"

Hard rock, like Metallica, is both Chad and Mike Kroegers original love For bass player Kroeger, Flat on the Floor is one of the best on the album because it's the band's heaviest tune

Flat on the Floor's lyrics aren't pretty The band says it's a true story about a high schooler who gives birth in a restroom and throws the infant in the trash The following track is gentler and reminiscent of country songs that tell whole tales Called ILove the Way You're Leaving Me, it is a song that's expected to crossover to the masses

What's ironic is that How You Remind Me led to Nicklebacks crossover success, but the band's roots are heavy rock They just happened to record a few ballads Nickleback is a band whose original fan base is long haired teens and 20-somethings Today, moms are bringing their kids

New Jolie film succeeds as romance, not drama

BEYOND BORDERS *1/2 (out of four)

here are many things that trouble me about the new Angelina Johe vehicle Beyond Borders What troubles me most is that, as a romance, the film works But I don't think it has any right to

You see, Beyond Borders is a romance "set against the backdrop of a worldwide

hunger epidemic" The themes and images that the film uses are so intrinsically powerful and emotionally complex that anything that is contrasted against them – say, an Angelina Jolie romantic moment – looks downright obscene

Johe plays Sarah, a newlywed living in London She's whooping it up at a charity ball, organized in part by her husband, when it is crashed by activist doctor Nick Callahan (Chve Owen) Nick parades a famished Ethiopian boy named Jo-Jo in front of the crowd, shaming them for their do-gooder excess

It's a scene as uncomfortable as those Save a Child" television commercials, only this time we can't turn the channel One of the party-goers throws the child a banana, and Nick worsens the situation by encouraging Jo-Jo to hoot like a monkey Its excruciating At this point, Beyond Borders is strong, unpredictable and daring

Extra Butter

Daniel Kraus But Sarah's reaction to Nick's actions is disappointingly simplistic. She decides to become a crusader for hunger, and travels to Ethiopia to work alongside Nick. Over the next decade, she follows her crush around the globe, assisting him with the saving of all types of unfortunates.

There were moments that I considered Beyond Borders to be the most offensive film I have seen in years When Sarah first arrives in Ethiopia, she

hurnes to help an emaciated infant I can't be sure, but I believe the child was at least partly computer-generated in an attempt to look even skinnier This seems wrong Even if it were only makeup – or even if the child really looked like that – I feel dubious about his inclusion in an Angelina Johe movie, where his only real function is to help this pretty woman become a socially conscious pretty woman

After Ethiopia, Sarah travels to Cambodia After Cambodia, it's off to Chechnya. The film functions as a travelogue of unsavory places, but places that are every bit exotic as more user-friendly destinations like Prague or Amsterdam Only Beyond Borders is less honest than a travelogue, for it purports to be teaching us something But it does not The entirety of our Chechnya discourse is summanized in a warning given by Sarah's sister "Sarah, you know as well as I do that Chechnya's a dangerous place"

It's hard to gauge the filmmakers' intentions I will give them the benefit of the doubt and simply call their film "misguided" It reminds me of Steven Spielberg's similarly well-intentioned Amistad or, to a lesser degree, Schindler's List – both movies that featured oppressed people as extras in a film chronicling their own demise

The only way that Beyond Borders may have been salvaged as something relevant is if Sarah did not become the World's Greatest Human But the film is dishonest about her pretension, naiveté and ignorance These are not unusual qualities in a human being But if you're a movie heroine, they're strictly not allowed

There are segments of Beyond Borders that work, for the directing and acting is largely successful Owen gives an occasionally powerful performance and the relationship between Sarah and her husband is admirably complicated. But the film is simply too big, and refuses to acknowledge its smallness when seen against the larger scope of world events



'Slime City' drips with gory entertainment

t times, Slime City resembles a cross between Monty Python and the Holy Grail and The Evil Dead A strange brew, indeed

Another entry into the school of goo, Slime City lacks the sophistication of Street Trash (which we reviewed last time)

Dead, l charm cially if talking – and I The girlfine

Beyond Bad

Greg Kowalskı or the energy of *The Evil*Dead, but it does have a charm of its own, especially if you are fond of talking decapitated heads—and I admit I am

The story Alex and his girlfriend, Laurie, find a new apartment for Alex in a somewhat seedy part of town Little do they know that the landlady's father was a wizard, or something, who brewed a gruel of shimy liquid that provides eternal life when ingested

The old fellow, named Zachery, and his cadre of

followers, killed themselves in the basement of the building but not before leaving a stockpile of the stuff

A neighbor invites Alex to dinner and feeds him a bowl of the stuff passed off as Himalayan yogurt. Alex should have known something was amiss when he wakes up in the middle of the night covered with slime. And he quickly develops a habit of killing people — first a bum in the alley then a hooker, who he sends into eternity with a razor.

From there, his life is all down hill Poor

Alex periodically takes to melting and murdering as he drifts toward complete dissolution, morally and physically

He comes to learn that the whole group of people who had committed suicide are returning to possess the bodies of tenants And Alex is in line to host the body Zachery

But by then it is too late Alex is alternately hacking and melting as he loses more and more control to the invading Zachery Finally, Alex kills his best friend then goes after Laurie

This leads to a bravura climax that makes wading through all this plot worthwhile

It goes something like this. He tries to strangle her. She stabs him with fork. This makes him mad, especially as he spouts goo like a fountain when he pulls the fork out. He comes back at her and she stabs him with a huge knife, ripping his guts out. He patiently packs them back into his body and goes after her again. She chops his arm off with a meat cleaver.

This makes him even madder She chops his head off. This really ticks him off, and he sends his headless one-armed body after her, ordering it to "Kill her! Kill her!" But while the spirit is willing, the flesh is weak, and the body falls over

Alex's head has a sudden change of heart and insists he loves Laurie, but it's too late and there's too little left of him to win back her affection, so she stabs his head, which is reposing on the kitchen floor For reasons that are not clear, this causes the head to pop open and Alex's brain comes crawling out Laurie turns this to sushi with the meat cleaver

Subtle, this is not. Nor is it dinnertime viewing And the acting is marginal at best But how can you lose with a crawling brain?

'Pieces of April' not your typical holiday movie

Thanksgiving just wouldn't be
Thanksgiving without a dysfunctional fam
ily reunion but writer director Peter
Hedges comes up with an original take on
the holiday disaster theme in the quiet gem
Pieces of April.

This time its the estranged daughter who tries to unite a divided family over barely cooked turkey plus a bitter, dying mother who wants no part of it

In his directorial debut, Hedges – who wrote the novel and screenplay for What's Eating Gilbert Grape? and the screenplay for About a Boy — gives actress Patricia Clarkson a role to treasure an angry cancer victim named Joy

No saint for Hedges, no nurturing moth er, no words of wisdom. Its sheer rotten luck to be dying in your 40s — especially when your own mother is well into her 80s — and Clarkson makes the most of Joy's unhappy predicament.

Shes a sardonic Mommie Dearest in a badly fitting wig

Breathtakingly mean astonishingly selfcentered Joy lambasts her husband Jim (Oliver Platt), mocks her two teens and despises her eldest daughter, April (Katie Holmes), who has invited the family to her New York apartment for Thanksgiving dinner

And of course, since Joy is dying, the family cannot fight back

Note how she warms to daughter Beth (Alson Pill), an obsessive goody-goody trying to cheer her mother up with a song or two as the family station wagon rumbles on toward the city

Any requests? Beth asks 'That you stop, Joy snaps

Joy also insists she doesn't have a single warm memory of April, waxes on about sexual exploits before her horrified teens and begs her husband to turn the car around and head to a fast food joint for a real holiday dinner

Its the latest in a string of award win ming performances for Clarkson, which also include roles in *Far from Heaven The* Station Agent and the HBO series Six Feet Under

Back at her New York tenement, April finds that her oven is kaput. A kaleidoscope of neighbors emerge as April knocks on doors, desperately trying to find a way to cook a very raw bird



Katie Holmes is April a rebellious woman determined to bring her dysfunctional family together for Thanksgiving



Roughly two years after the Jewish Ensemble Theatre established Campaign Stop Hate in response to the 9/11 terrorist attacks, artistic director Evelyn Orbach said the 2003 2004 season remains dedicated to raising awareness about hate and violence

The seasons first show, *Dirty Story*, is written by Oscar-winning screenwriter John Patrick Shanley and is making its Midwest premiere at JET after a successful run off Broadway

Orbach said she was introduced to Shanley after seeing a performance of Dirty Story in New York and asked if JET could get the rights to produce it in Detroit 'John is very well-known He wrote Moonstruck and many others'

Dirty Story is a dark farce about a dysfunctional couple that fights constantly Orbach said it's really a metaphor for what's happening in the Middle East – an analogy that doesn't really come to light until the end of the first act

She said people will find themselves

wanting to go back and hear limes from the first act again when they understand the true meaning behind the four-person storyline

I wouldn't be surprised if people wanted to see this again and again,' added Orbach—I know all of a sudden it just hit me between the eyes and I wanted to go back to the first act and see it again

A renowned cantor from Temple Israel, Harold Orbach has traveled throughout the world performing and only recently retired – freeing up his schedule to perform under the direction of his wife



Laurie Eisenhower's spirit, confidence keep contemporary dance on an upward spiral

make it look effortless.
That's because the founder of the
Eisenhower Dance Ensemble has a
way of smiling at obstacles that often trouble regional dance companies.

"I have to be positive," said Eisenhower, who is 47 and head of Oakland University's dance program

Facing a weakening economy in recent years, Eisenhower simply slimmed down the size of EDE, tightened up the budget and kept working

Her positive spin has paid off in more ways than one

Eisenhower will receive the ArtServe Michigan Governor's Award for Arts and Culture on Nov 10 And the award, for which there were 170 nominees, will come on the heels of the

opening of EDE's 13th dance season

Joining the company for the Saturday performance at Oakland University is the Los Angelesbased Brockus Project Dance Last August, EDE traveled to Los Angeles and performed with the group Collaborative programming brings exposure to regional dance companies, said Eisenhower, whose latest goal has been to tour the EDE outside the state

"The joy for me is to give the dancers work and the opportunity to work with other choreographers"

Over the years, Eisenhower has opened a dance school, the EDE Center for Dance, founded a second semi-professional ensemble and grown her dance company from one made up of paid-per-performance dancers to a group with an annual operat-

ing budget exceeding \$250,000

Her approach to choreography and working with dancers is as self-possessed and confident as it is toward business. I can crack the whip if I need to, but I think there needs to be a mutual respect, she said "Dancers are intelligent people"

Eisenhower, who currently hves in Rochester Hills with her husband and 14-year-old daughter, grew up in Arizona and danced professionally in California and New York, most notably with Pilobolus Dance Theatre, David Parsons, Chen and Dancers, Harry Streep III and Mel Wong

Nonetheless, she couldn't be happier to have Michigan as her home and EDE's headquarters

"Michigan is a great place to start a dance company It's always a struggle for the arts," she said "But I think I'm able to balance the director part with that choreographer part, not to sound arrogant

Charles Burke, director of education and also director of the DSO Civic Ensembles, says that the new Max is going to alleviate much of the congestion that preceded and followed the concerts, which have two morning performances six times during the symphony season

"This is going to make it better for children and parents," says Burke "There are concessions for kids and places to explore"

Laurie's children, Kail, 11, Alec, 10, and Arden, 7, have been attending since they were each 4, and many nieces and nephews have also helped make the concert series a special family event 'There are three sisters and all their children, so we take up almost the whole first row, says Laurie

For Lisa Reeves and her husband, Julius, the concert series accomplishes several family directives, one of which is enjoying the music

'The children learn to be patient, and I think it's more critical now that Lauren (the couple's 10-year-old daughter) is taking violin. I like to show her what she could become, says Lisa.

After-concert milkshakes have also become a tradition for the Reeveses, par-

ticularly for 7 year old Julian, and it is during that time that the parents have the opportunity to talk about how the music made them feel

"I truly believe that music helps the mind in terms of learning. When you expose children at a young age, it makes a difference," says Lisa

Head to South Haven for hiking, history

South Haven was ThreeOlBags first official stop on our Michigan "West Coast adventure It took us about three hours from Metro Airport, traveling I-94 West to US 131 N, then taking Exit 38B and traveling West on M-43

It didn't take long for South Havener's to point us to South Beach at the mouth of the Black River, where Lake Michigan draws visitors and residents with its calm allure

ThreeOlBags were drawn toward the pier jetting out about 1,000 feet into Lake Michigan, with a bright red lighthouse keeping watch at its very end Like a cherry putting the finishing touch on an ice cream sundae, the lighthouse perfectly completed our idyllic view

Leaving the pier, we passed people relaxing on fancy benches, and met two delightful, visitors to South Haven, Bob and Dawn Rapp from Kalamazoo Meeting interesting people is one of our favorite parts of traveling — we hit the jackpot in South Haven

'We come here often," said Bob Rapp, as his wife, Dawn, nodded in agreement "I used to come here as a boy,' he continued

The couple was just beginning their picnic lunch when ThreeOlBags asked for any tips about the area they might offer

"There used to be a huge casino and hotel, right there, he said pointing to the beginning of the marina. Auto barons depended on the harbor to supply that booming industry with materials transported by train to Dearborn and Detroit after being unloaded from ships at South Haven's pier.

HISTORICAL

Upon their strong recommendation we visited Sheri Lemon, research assistant for the Michigan Maritime Museum. The museum is housed in the Lightkeeper's House, a block south of the pier. You'll see hundreds of books, photos, maps and other items dealing with Michigan's maritime bistory.

If you can drag yourself away from the pier area, the town of South Haven is waiting with rows of small specialty shops, award-winning golf courses, a huge skateboard park, biking, boating, picnicking, horseback riding, camping and hiking

Speaking of hiking, over 80,000 people enjoy the Kal-Haven Trail each year Fall is said to be the best time to enjoy the trail that winds through what was once a railroad between South Haven and Kalamazoo Covered bridge buffs will find one on this popular trail



Suburban poets find refuge in Northern retreat

A middle aged woman dressed in sweat pants stands up in front of the crowd, her hands shaking slightly as she holds the paper

She begins to read a story about a woman contemplating life without her husband, the new life of a divorcee

The room is silent, some watching her, others listening with heads bowed. In a Northern Michigan lodge with knotty pine and fireplaces in every room, suburban poets converge to bare their souls and tell their stories.

It is the fifth annual Walloon Writers' Retreat

The annual retreat at Walloon Lake has become a place where aspiring authors, published poets and nationally renown writers share the same space. In a camp-like setting, the shared experience of facing the daunting blank page seems like the great equalizer.

This year's attendees included Oscar-winning filmmaker Michael Moore, former U.S. Poet Laureate Billy Collins and Joyce Maynard, author the book that inspired the Nicole Kidman movie To Die For, and who was criticized several years ago for revealing her relationship as an 18-year old with writer J.D. Salinger in her memoir, At Home in the World.

John D Lamb, a Royal Oak musician started the retreat five years ago and said he recruited Maynard as a participant to set an irreverent tone to the event

She was kind of being slammed by the publishing world at the time, and Lamb remembered thinking, 'Cool, I want her'

NOTHING ACADEMIC

There's nothing academic about Lamb's retreats

"I didn't want it to be an academic thing I thought I could do something with real working writers and I wanted it to have an irreverent flair," said Lamb "I wanted to do something that was not stuffy, snobbish or something people needed to fear It inspires people to write when they feel like someone is listening"


Participants pay the \$375-\$575 fee to spend the weekend at Michigania, a ranch just outside of Boyne City owned by une University of Michigan alumni association

This year's retreat, held the last weekend of September, had a sold-out crowd of 75 people

"I think it's a wonderful conference. I've been to quite a few conferences and this is one of the best," said Marj Levin,

of Birmingham, a former journalist who is trying to get her novel published

Attendee M L Liebler, who has been a Wayne State University professor since 1980 and directs the Writer's Voice, the arts and humanities arm of the YMCA, is affectionately called the "Godfather of Detroit Poetry"

Liebler, the author of *Brooding the Heartlands Poets of* the *Midwest*, said that poetry and literature have been gaining in popularity and public interest in recent years and the Walloon retreat is proof

'If you would have tried to do this is in the early to mid-1980s, you'd have 10 people here—there was just nothing happening. In 1987, that's when I really noticed something was shaking, but I never thought it would last as long as it has. It shows no decline, and in fact, it keeps expanding. There are more readings, more coffeehouses, more open mics and more retreats

In between the student readings, writing consultations, talks by each of the authors about their careers and then readings in the evening, there is ample time for a hike in the woods or a walk around Michigania.

On the second day, Collins spoke of his position as poet laureate, to which he was appointed by the Library of Congress. He began a program called Poetry 180, in which he compiled 180 contemporary poems and published them on the Internet in an effort to have them read daily in schools with the announcements.

He, too, believes that poetry may be gaining in popularity and said it has to do with people being—sick of public lan guage, the language of the media, politics and advertising

I think people are coming back to poetry as a way of reclaiming their native tongue," he said

Lamb started the retreat five years ago, with seed money provided by his personal friends like Michael Moore

'I started playing up here a lot and I saw that this area lends itself to creativity The stress kind of rolls off of you and in the solitude, you find yourself writing," he said

Lamb's nonprofit organization, Springfed Arts, also puts on an annual retreat for songwriters and school-based songwriting workshops for children

Willober Eversole, of Huntington Woods, was a first-time participant at this years retreat

"I've known about it for three years now, and I decided it's just time to jump in I guess," he said. "I've probably written 18 to 20 poems since I've been here Being out of my home and my routine, it's conducive to writing'

Eversole has self-published three books and writes a monthly column for *Healing Garden* magazine.

"I'm just waiting to be discovered like everybody else"
Back at the retreat, a dozen people sit around a fireplace,
huddled over notebooks. The food is organic, some take
walks, scribble furiously in a notebook or take a boat trip to
catch a glimpse of Windemere, the cottage on Walloon
Lake, where Ernest Hemingway was said to have written
the Nick Adams stories.

Lamb said he's not trying to turn all those who attend his workshops into the next Hemingway or the next poet laureate

Tm not trying to make everybody a published writer I'm trying to make them feel good as a writer and get lost in the writing and forget about themselves. If they come away with one page of good writing that they're willing to show someone, that's pretty good.'


