If ever a story warranted a look deeper than just the headines, it's the one about Plymouth-Canton schools havnng "faling " marks
That's what it looked like Friday, when the Adequate Yearly Progress scores were announced As part of the to make AYP in a varety of areas or face designation as a falling school
Four Plymouth-Canton schools - Salem and Canton
high schools and East and Pioneer midde schools high schools and East and Pioneer middle schools - ended The two high schools didn't make the cut because they fell short of the 95 -percent requrement of students taking the MEAP tests The two maddle schools falled because one sub-group - spectal education students - took the What the AYP rules don't take into account - and what makes them inordnnately unfair to schools that are dong
a good job educating children - is that the MEAP test is a voluntary test Students are not requred to take it In fact, schools across Michigan were having so little up with mertt scholarships as incentives And when you look at the results of those scholarshps, it becomes quite 2003, Canton High School students earned 304 scholarships, while their brethren at Salem earned an even 300 In the AYP grading, both high schools earned an ' $A$ ' for earned a composite ' B ' Still, Canton is on the fallng list earned a composite B Still, Canton is on the falling list
because it fell elght-tenths of a percent below the mark, while Salem is on it because officials could "only" get nine In Plymouth-Canton, off

played a Navy heutenant stranded in Bosma, the faux-Woo moves looked a little forced But you stlll rooted for him to escape unharmed - simply because he was Owen Wilson

But his easygong likabilty is actually a hability in The Brg Bounce
The film is based on an early Elmore Leonard crime novel (which has already has been turned into a move once, in 1969, starring Ryan O Neal) Leonard s language has a rich, recognizable clip thats an ill fit on Wilson, he lacks the edge needed to match the cadence of the dialogue

In Get Shorty, an infintely superior Leonard adaptation, John Travolta was another cool customer, but he had a confidence and a charisma burning beneath the surface that gave him the oomph required in Leonard's writing
Wilson, as drifter Jack Ryan (not to be confused with the Tom Clancy character), seems as if he couldn't care less about the plan he's been dragged into to steal
\(\$ 200,000\) from sketchy real estate developer Ray Ritchie (Gary Sinise) He could go surfing or he could rob a safe - it does\(n t\) really matter

\section*{OUT OF PLACE}

Another problem is that director George Armitage (Grosse Pornte Blank) and writer Sebastian Gutierrez (Gothika) have moved the book s location from Michigan to Hawan, so the trademark low-down-dırtythief element of Leonard's work seems out of place in paradıse
And we re repeatedly reminded that
we re in Hawan, what must be 10 minutes of the film \(s\) sparse 88 -minute running time consist of cutaways and filler of surfers nding gigantic waves in slow motion
Grant chunks of time also are devoted to oghng Ray's scheming mistress Nancy Hayes (Sara Foster) as she parades along the beach in a yellow string biknn, or sunbathes nude, or manipulates Jack and every other man whle weanng some lowcut ensemble that could only be held together with double-sided tape
Nancy is supposed to be the mastermind behind the robbery, but in her first film, Foster (a former model and daughter of songwriter Dand Foster) simply has no presence She s surtably sexy to play the femme fatale, but just seems staff and selfconscious
Actors who know what they re domg, meanwhile, are squandered Bebe Neuwnth is relegated to playing a stereotype as Ray's miserable, rich, drunk wife, and Charlie Sheen has sparse screen tme (and a bad mustache) as Ray's doofus flunke
Morgan Freeman, though, manages to muddle together his usual stately presence as Jack \(s\) boss, a motel owner and parttime judge And he takes part in the move s best scene in which he, Wilson, Wilhe Nelson and Harry Dean Stanton sit around a table playing dommoes, drinking Wild Turkey and making fun of each other More moments like that could make a move worthy of Leonard's name
The Brg Bounce, a Warner Bros release, runs 88 mnutes One and a half stars out of four

Do these threads ever tell a story
Thats why more than 30 quils from The Henry Ford collection are set to go on display starting Saturday Feb 14, at the Dearborn museum
The exhbit titled Quilting Genius runs through May 9
"They are just beautiful to look at and distinctive said Nancy Villa Bryk, interım chef curator at The Henry Ford

Quilting Genius which goes up in the Henry Ford Museum, is free with general museum admission
Of particular beauty are 11 works by well known 19th century quilt maker Susan McCord, an ordinary Indiana farm wife who hived between 1829 and 1909 But from ordinary hands grew extraor dınary quilt work, Bryk said of McCords work They are always just a little bit offordinary When you look at them the designs just kind of vibrate off the quilt
McCord can be seen as a symbol of the many 19th century women who expressed themselves and their aesthetic capabilities through quilting and other crafts, said Bryk. It is beheved McCord created 13 quilts in her lifetme With the recent donation of a 12th quilt The Henry Ford holds all but one
While the McCord collection which ncludes the famous 'Vine Pattern quilt, is the centerplece of the three room exhibit, many eras and quilting styles are repre sented
There is an indigo blue and white quilt

One of The Henry Fords latest acquisitions, 'World War One Preced Quilt,' was made by a tallor who served in the conflict Constructed of heavy wool used to make army blankets, the quilt is covered with World War I Army division pennants
'Its kind of dark with somber colors, but there are these wonderful pennants which are interspersed with patriotic embroidery, Bryk said, noting the quilts tremendous spirit
'Whule all these quilts are stunnungly beautiful, they also have great heart and passion" said Bryk Passion for a life lost passion for the US Army a passion for providing for therr families

Think you can pass the 'Chimpanzee Challenge'?
}

There's a moral to the maze at the Chımpanzee Challenge at the Cranbrook Science Institute, and it's that the world s chimpanzees are fadıng away
"There were 1-2 million in the wild in the year 1900," said Heather Hall, a spokeswoman for Cranbrook 'Today theres only 150,000 because of poaching, hunting and habitat loss
The more we understand primates, the more apt we may be to protect


The Chimpanzee Chaflenge at Cranbrook takes familles through an interactive maze where they mimic the activities of primates such as how to groom each other and how to walk
them, Hall said
Opening Saturday, the interactive walk-through primate maze teaches famulies what chimps need to survive and thrive in the wild At the end, the Jane Goodall Institute provides information about current save-the chimp projects
Hall sand there are four life-cycle stages throughout the 1,700-square-foot maze, from newborn into adulthood Visitors will learn primate characteristics and the threats that could bring them into extinction
The exhibit is being presented in collaboration with the Jane Goodall Institute Hall said it focuses on the hives of chimps in ther natural habitat, rather than in captivity
Visitors enter the maze through a for est facade and must answer questions to determine which route they will travel to get through it A correct answer takes them to the next life cycle, whyle a wrong answer brings them to a deadend
The maze also has sumulated games that let visitors test their physical skills against the strength, agility and communication abilities of chimps
