## Partnerships start at home

It isn't hard to understand why Plymouth city commssloners and Plymouth Townshy board members mmednate
ly look at the possiblity of partnership with a jaundiced eye Neither side is exactly ecstatic about how agreements for emergency dispatch and fire protection services have worked out from a contractual standpoint Commissioners think they should have more of a say in how those operations are financed, since they foot at least
a quarter of the bill Townshap board members figure the a quarter of the bill Township board members fig But with the city facing a $\$ 12$ million budget deficit and desperate for any partnerships that will help them teaming up with the townshup
The last tume the ctry made such a proposal, it didn't work
out so well The cty out so well The cty would have essentaaly taken control o much of the townships park system and run recreatio The benefit to the township would have been reduced costs to residents who participate in these programs anyway and the creation of a de facto recreation program without the cost of establishng it Township board members balked because they didn't want to give up control of their parks
That's certanly a vald concern, though it shouldn't have been a deal breaker Surely there is a way to work out such detalls to the mutual benefit of all parties concerned
While a partnership with Northville might make financal sense, and there would seem to be a natural inclination to look that way since City Manager Paul Sincock's wrfe Traci, heads Northnlle's recreation program, we thnk an The same can be sald for puble works and certanly for public safety issues There's already an intergovernmental agreement in place for dispatch and fire Why not revisit it if commissioners are unhappy? It makes more sense to the township, too, since refinnng the existung agreement and therefore retaining the revenue gen
should be preferable to losing it completely
We applaud city officials for trying to look outside the box in digging itself out of ats financial morass And, if township board members contmue to balk, the crty is certainly obligated to find the best avarabable deal City and township residents have always taken pride in the sense of "communty" this area fosters Thelr gov
ments should make every effort to keep it that way

## Education act needs to be re-evaluated

The goal of the federal No Child Left Behnnd Act is 100 percent proficiency in reading and mathematics by 2013-14
In Sunday's Observer $\begin{gathered}\text { Eccentric Newspapers, w }\end{gathered}$ found general support for the goals of NCLB Local education leaders were skeptical about reaching 100 percent but they were supportive of increased accountability, regular testing and a national standard for proficiency But NCLB has become a hot political issue Though the act was passed by an overwhelming bipartisan vote 1 . administration for not adequately funding the program The Bush administration argues that spending on education has grown over the last fôur years, even while allowng that funding for NCLB is not at authorized levels But, they argue, the funding is adequate to do the job
Educators in our communties, and across the country, are telling the administration that the funding is not adequate to meet the current demands and will be even less adequate when the government begins to impose "remedies" on Title I schools that fall to reach adequate yearly progress
In add
In addition, educators are complaining about various aspects of the program that they assert are unfarr Notably
they object that special education students and students they object that special education students and students school's general population for testing, which puts some schools at a disadvantage toward reaching AYP
Educators also complain that for high-achieving schools in the suburbs, it becomes harder each year to exceed an already high level They also point out that in test because they don't think the test is meaningful for therr educational goals NCLB requires 95 percent of students take the test for a school to reach AYP
We believe the administration and the Congress need
to reach out to the education communty, listen to thenr to reach out to the education community, listen to theil vews and work toward fine-tuning a program with such
laudable goals

eaders with long memorres may remember Something called the University Investment which met on and off during the fall of 2002 The 1dea was to invent a vehicle for a broad cross-secuniversity system benefits the state and to consider how best to deal wrth a terrible state economuc clumate The panel deliberately did not include universty folks, whose participation could have seemed self-serving
that our discussions were pretty much true to the onginal idea We wound up writing a report that was duly disseminated to various and sundry, mcluding the governo
and the state Legslature We also urged the University Presidents' Councll to follow up on some of our suggestions This report, signed by Irvn
Reid, president of Wayne State Phil Universty, and Mike Boulus, Phil executive director of the UPC, arrved recently

nuts, sweet and spicy lentil nuts, sweet and splcy lentil African curry casserole) But I was particularly drawn to a short chapter at the back of the book that offers 13 breads that would be perfect for a snowy Sunday morning with the newspaper Despite a love for hot wholeand dried frut, I'm reluctant to make them Most mornings it is because there is no time On weekends it is because cooking is the last thing I want to Robertson's solution is to cook the graus overnight in a
slow cooker so your cereal is

low temperature and require about elght hours, perfect for starting as you turn in For dishes that require less cookang time, Robertson sug
gests plugging the slow cooke into a tumer switch, the sort that turns lamps on and off at preset tumes These nexpensive devices are avalable

In fact, what Chrysler promised with the 2004 Durango is exactly what the company delivered a longer, wider, higher and more powerful Durango than the earher version, finally giving the company ment that it hasn't had since some of those great big Grand Cherokees of yesteryear helped create the category
I appreciate the fact that Chrysler stuck to its rather than cringe at the possibilty that red to rather than cringe at the possibility that radical on fire in protest But having sadd that, for all the expectations that Chrysler has been heaping on the 2004 Durango, I'm not sure the larger-dimensioned vehicle lives up to the rest of its hype
My overall impression was favorable, certannly, but I didn't find that the Durango SLT version I
drove stood out in any significant way from compe drove stood out in any significant way from compe-
tition including the Chevrolet Tahoe, Ford Expedition or Toyota Land Cruiser The new model


It only takes Durango eight seconds to reach 60 m.p.h. with the new Hemi V8
now gives Chrysler a reasonable entry in that derby, but that's about all I can say for it
Durango's styling certamly is an improvement over the rounded and rather soft shape of its predecessor, which was trallblazing for the segment when the first Durango hit the market a few years ago The new version has more organic design, with sharper lines and some creases As such, it definite ly cuts a more impressive figure on the road -
although a reviewer for The Wall Street Journal recently wrote that "the front end resembles a wild boar sniffing the ground "
Under the hood is where Durango makes a good deal of 1 ts impression and separates 1 tself a bit from the competition Chrysiers new Hemi V8 engine, a 5 7-1ter monstrosity that Dodge features horsepower, which far outpaces competitors such as Expedition ( 260 hp ) and Acura MDX (265) You can feel it, too, in how the Durango responds at stoplights with a powerful growl, cruises in passing mode and excels everywhere else as well it takes course, the Hemi is a $\$ 900$ option, not the standard engine

And equally predıctably, all that power and
erve come at a price gas muleage Durango gets a paltry 13 miles a gallon in the city, which is nearly at the low end of practically every mainstream SUV that's ever been introduced, and only 18 mpg on the highway In an era of $\$ 170$-a-galion gasoline a particularly glarng problem for sales of this new model
Though it's built on a truck platform, Durango handles well enough, with firm and sharp steering low-range gears that are a must for drivers who would want to take it off-road Yet the vehicle didn't include running boards, which I thought was a glaring oversight for something that is so high off

Inside, room in the second and thurd rows was ample, and the DVD player for rear passengers in the Durango has become sine qua non in its category Controls were well laad out and easy to use There were amenities aplenty in short, Durang stakes
Just not one that stands above the rest

## Far out $A^{2}$ festival embraces independents

The outer limits of independent film drives the Ann Arbor Fulm Festival But this year's event, slated Tuesday, March 16, to Sunday, March 21, at Ann Arbor's historic Michigan Theater, embraces all the ranks of self-supporting movie makers
In th 42 nd year, the festıval has opened its competition to video and dig1tal formats - the less expensive and more accessıble filmmakıng technıques currently fueling the independent movement
"It means that you will see more independent and experimental films," sard Chrisstuna Hamilton, festıval director "The level of competition rose dramatical ly, too"
Entries numbered 1,600, compared to only 500 last year, she sard

Of the 105 works selected for the festival, seven come from local filmmakers, meluding Late, by Diane Cheklich of Royal Oak, and Ash Wednesday 2 by Brent Coughenour of Southfield
Genres include animation, narrative, documentary, short and feature-length film

The festival, which runs moves as early as noon and as late as 10 p m darly, also features special programs 'Out Night," for instance, offers gay and lesbian films while 'Other Vorces subsumes West Philadelphia's Lost Film Festival and a screening of the move Fourth World War The feature-length documentary made by a former Ann Arbor resident takes on the effects of corporate global ization
"Other Voices is dedicated to lookng at films that are kind of out of the mamstream medıa,' Hamilton sard, describmg Fourth World War as a must-see for festival goers It's a tough subject, but its a very uplifting film It shows many instances where people have made a difference
There's also SuperCinematics, which showcases off screen activities, from stage performances to art exhibitions organized as part of the film festival
Ann Arbor dancer and choreographer Peter Sparling, for example, kicks off the festival with a performance at the

## 'Starsky \& Hutch' runs out of humor

They could have played Ponch and Jon or Crockett and Tubbs or even Lenny and Squiggy - and they probably will some day
For now, you can sit back and watch the sporadically amusing, comfortably numbing famliarity of Ben Stiller and Owen Wilson bouncing off each other in Starsky छ Hutch
It's not so much a mone version of the 1970s buddy-cop TV show as it is Zoolander with guns
Here, as in that 2001 move about dımwitted male models, Stiller plays the uptight guy who takes himself way too seriously and Wilson plays the easygoing guy whom everyone likes

That these off-screen friends have established such an easy on-screen camaraderie is a good thing and a bad thing
They're obviously comfortable with each other and they can be fun to watch, though the script amounts to hittle more than a sernes of sketches, loosely held together by the grooves of a chicka-chic-ka-wa-wa soundtrack and the growls of Starsky's Gran Torino engine
But Stiller (who plays Starsky) and Wilson (Hutch) have fallen into a predictable rut following nearly identical performances in Meet the Parents, The Royal Tenenbaums and, most recently, Zoolander
Instead of male models, they play undercover cops who look hike male models - or, rather, like male models look today in emulating the style Paul Michael Glaser and David Soul cultivated on the TV series nearly three decades ago, with sunglasses that were too big and jeans that were too small
Old School durector Todd Phillips, who co-wrote the script with John O Brien and his Road $\operatorname{Tr} p$ writing partner Scot Armstrong, goes truly old school here, and the attention to detal is obsessive from the bad perms and Fu Manchu mustaches to the elght-track tapes and pimped-out Lincoln Continental that Snoop Dogg drıves as Huggy Bear, Starsky and Hutchs informant
(Snoop is a natural choice for the role, by the way, if only because he appears to have provided his own wardrobe)
But the novelty of gawking with horr1fied fascination at the Superfly style of the times grows old quickly, and the fact that this is a one-joke movie becomes painfully obvous after about 45 minutes - at

which point, you're only about halfway done
There is some semblance of a story line, though, and it entalls showing us how opposites Starsky and Hutch ended up as partners on the mean streets of Bay City
While investigating a murder, they begin to suspect the wealthy Reese Feldman (Vince Vaughn), a drug kingpin who has developed a special stran of cocane ("New Coke," If you will) that impossible for drug-sniffing dogs to detect

Really, though, the case is just an excuse for Starsky and Hutch to play dress-up
They pretend they're bikers in an Easy Rider takeoff and play mimes to infiltrate Feldmans daughter's bat mitzvah They even go to a disco with a couple of cheerleaders (Carmen Electra and Amy Smart) who may have information on the killing
(While they're there, Starsky competes in a dance-off that's a rip-off of the "walkoff" he participated in as Derek

## Zoolander)

But tt's clear that Starsky and Hutch only have eyes for each other, if the TV show had a vague homoerotic vibe, the movie practically outs them

Not that theres anything wrong with that But speaking of Seinfeld, heres an idea Maybe Stıller and Wilson will play mone versions of Jerry Seinfeld and Cosmo Kramer in 20 years Starsky \& Hutch a Warner Bros release is rated PG 13 for drug content sexual situations partal nudity language and some violence Running time 97 minutes Two stars out of four

What he is best known for are his actions on Nov 25, 1970 On that day, he and four other members of the Shield Society went to Army Headquarters in Tokyo, where Mıshıma took the base commander hostage and demanded that he be allowed to address the troops In his subsequent address to the soldiers he implored them to rebel against Japan's U S -imposed constitution and help him in his quest to restore Japan's Imperial system

# Enioy good food, drink, $m$

There will be rivers of green beer and mounds of corned beef for sure, but St Patrick's Day in the Detroit area has blossomed in recent years to offer much more diversity to both rowdy revelers and quieter celebrants who come together on a day that marks the coming of spring

Everyone's Insh on St Patrick's Day, the old adage goes, and the growing number of Irish pub and restaurant owners in the area are all set to treat ther guests to a day filled with good music and good food and drink.
"The Gumness flows here, it's our bloodline,' said Sam Khashan, who along with father and son team John and Shane Callaghan opened Sean O'Callaghan's three years ago in Plymouth
With woodwork and glasswork imported from Ireland and a floor plan designed to replicate Victorian-style pubs that exist in Ireland, O'Callaghan's is emblematic of the authentic turn new Irish pubs like Shanahans in Livonia, Dick O'Dow's in Birmingham and Conor O'Neil's in Ann Arbor have taken in this country

Normally, O'Callaghan's menu features a broad range of seafood dishes, steaks, chops and pasta as well as traditional Irish food like bangers (Irısh sausage), Shepard's pie and lamb stew, but O'Callaghan's will offer a limited St Patrick's Day menu, including fish and chips, corned beef dınners and sandwrches
"Everyone wants a Guinness and a corned beef melt on St Patrick's Day," said Khashan, who expects to see a line at the pub's door when the establishment opens at 7 am on the big day
Besides the appearance of the pub, and the menu, which has been carefully designed by O'Callaghan's executive chef John Schofer, Khashan is most proud of an Irish import that's as indefinable as it is pleasurable
It's called the craic (pronounced crack) of the pub
"It's what we would call the buzz," Khashan said "It's socializing, singing along and conversation When all that comes together that's the real feel of a pub."
To ensure that the cratc at O'Callaghan's hits the high 90s, Khashan is planning on flying over the Oyster Boys, a group of musicians from County Monaghan in Ireland
"That's as traditional as it gets," Khashan said

## NEW

The newest Insh pub to hit the area is Shanahan's, which recently opened in the space formerly occupied by Tremors, in the Holiday Inn of Livonia adjacent to Laurel Park mall.

Former Tremors customers won't recog-

nize the place, as its been completely gutted and rebuilt to include gothic, cottage and rotunda sections to replicate features of the Old Sod
"It's almost hke a museum, there's so much to look at," said assistant general manager Ann Marie Spayd "When people walk in, they're awestruck. It almost looks like and old Insh castle when you walk in"

Spayd said that besides offering authentic Irsh cuisine, music and a drawing for a trip to Ireland on St Patrick's Day, Shanahans has made arrangements for discounted rooms at the Holday Inn for customers who don't want to drunk and drive
"We'd like to get away from how everyone associates St Patrick's Day with drinking," Spayed said

Although the level of partying on St. Patrick's Day is on the rise in Ireland, due promarly to the example set by the United States, St Patrick's Day in the old country very much remains a holy day, accordng to Conor O'Nel's Dublin-born general manager Caroline King
"We don't do the whole drnnking thing," King said "We go to Mass, then we go to the parade, and it always rams"

His tales in songs from his previous album like $H e$ 's $M y$ Son, Remember Me, Let's Go and I Have Been There have all been chart-toppers
