One thing I hadn't done in about two years of writing this column was drive and revew a Korean-made at the US automotye markentunue to mbble away Japanese companies did a generation ago So recently, I got myself moto the vehicle that arguably is the flag Ship of the Korean "fleet" in the American marketplace Hyundaris Sonata
Korean Incursion here has become such a phenome Kon - and why 1 t 1 sonly likely to contnue to buld Sonata, now in at least tist thrd generation, 1 s an exclamation mark on what Korean auto makers have accomplshed here en the space of just 15 years Back
then ther shoddy build qualty and powertrans com pared quite badly wth the best Japanese and even Amercan models But not any more
The bottom line not only is that the 2004 Sonata $X$ that I drove delivered an overall highly satusfacto performance but also that, for buyers, t1 does so whlle granaly fulililing the other two ncreasingly mportant
crteria un vehcle purchases these days prce and fuel economy Thus premum entry in the mid-level sedan market prouduces 27 miles a gallon on the highway and 19 mpg m the city And $1 t$ delivers all of the above for the amazing stccker price of under $\$ 20,000$ Hyundai has other premum models, nncludng a near--uxury sedan calied XG350 and representatuve
SUVs in the Santa Fe and the new, 2005 Tucson But Sonata demonstrates perhaps best of any of Hyundar's Ine-up the attractiveness of a satsfyng vehchle for such a relatively small price
Sonata creates a great first mpression with an organct handsomeness that is more redolent of
European sedans and of some of the best European sedans and of some of the best Amercan
designs than of Japanese-like spareness Beleve to not, Sonata's overall form reminds me a bit of the felme shape of a Jaguar Rech detalls nclude a wrnkle


The Hyundai Sonata's power, ride and handling are as agreeable as its exterior design
at the door-handle level that runs from the front of the vehicle to the back - a nuce touch, just right an not too much And Sonata's front end, sophistrcated headlight treatment and even wheel covers almost xactly look like a Mercedes-Benzsedan The exterior style comes standard on all thre Sonata models, which range from list prices of $\$ 16,000$ to $\$ 19,800$ Even the base model comes well side-mpact aur bags, AM/FM/CD audoo system, rear defroster, power murrors, power locks with keyless remote, power windows, cruse control, remote fuel door and trunk releases, $60 / 40$ split folding rear seat, variable intermittent whers, four-wheel disc brakes, ers and $15-\mathrm{Inch}$ all-season tres
The problem with that model is that even $\$ 16,000$ might be better invested in a small car with more amentites and better gas mileage than in a vehicle with only a four-cylnder engme and a five-speed manual transmission
But as you move up the Sonata lineup to LX, the top of the line, the price-value equation gets dramatically better At that level, Hyundan includes a 27 -liter 24 -valve, dual-overhead cam, slx-cylnder engme that
churns out 170 horsepower (And the V 6 is avalable in ach of Sonatas versions ) The car accelerates smoothly and authoritatively from a standstill, cruses effortlessly and Idles quetly The automatic transmission is complementarily re
unnoticeable shifts
The ride as well and in this serment giding effortlessly oren price highway speeds with a minmum of wind and ture noise Steerng, too, is responsive In fact, Sonata's power, ride and handling arguably are as agreeable as its exterior design
Interior amenties are where some patche appeared in Sonata's price-value proposition in the Xouches such as luxurously folded padd some nice inside of the doors, a leather-wrapped shift knob and faux wood accents The plush seats provide drving comfort The dashboard is attractive, and climate and audio controls are logically arranged Trunk space is highy adequate, a cargo net handy But I missed things like a sunroof that you can get in this car, goes only so far, I guess But tits still a long, long way
