## A Model Life

From the runways of Paris, this ex-Louis vuitton model helps make Detroit a little prettier
or a guy who spends most of his days in ragged jeans, a white Tshirt and a tool belt thed around his waist, it's hard to magine Detrout's Phil Cooley strutting down the fashion runways of Paris, Milan, London and Tokyo It's even harder to imagine him sitting still long enough in a chair for someone to sculpt his black hair, which is not even brushed today, and apply makeup to his pale skin, which now sees more sawdust than soap
Whether he's ripping out interiors of gut-rehabs, pouring granite countertops in the apartments he's building on Michigan Avenue, or working on the barbecue restaurant, Slow's, he's opening with two other partners, Cooley's line of work is physically demanding - in a much different way than the two and a half years he spent looking pretty on the male modeling circuit

Theres no skıll involved Men are mannequins You see the "blue steel of Derek Zoolander Hilarious, but not true at all The men just stand there," says Cooley flippantly, as he counts off the myths of male modeling There are no free clothes, male models get pard significantly less than females, and you're certamly not
going to be a household name as a male model

Not that he was looking for fame and fortune anyway Cooley, a natural archetype of the herom-chic look, didn't even set out to be a model intentionally Still a film student in Chicago, he was casually walking down the street when he noticed he was being followed After a few blocks, he was finally approached, and when his pursuer popped the question - "Are you a model?" - he assumed it was a pick-up line, not a serious inquiry from a Ford agent

He did it for the travel, and ended up loving it for the drinks and food On his as a jet set model

He had to walk wear rubber breasts for the cover of UpStreet, and pose outside in his bathing suit during a snow storm
When it came to shows he didn't want to do, Cooley had to be clever Chuckling,
busiest days, he was hustled to three shows a day on motor scooter, and there was always a full spread By the time he arrived at his second show of the day, he was greeted by a towering pyramid of champagne "I was constantly with a glass of champagne in my hand I drank a lot while I was mod eling to deal with some of the absurdities," laughs Cooley And the absurdrthes were plenty
he remembers an Yves St Laurent show They were selecting guys to stand outside in the freezing cold for very little pay but, of course, if you got picked, your agency would make you do it
"I knew I didn't want to do the job, so I went in there and just put my finger in my nose," he reminisces
There was a lot that did impress him though
It makes sense, in his current line of work, that he was most inspured by the photo shoot settings - from the Lyric Opera House in Parns to an abandoned building
And, the creatinty of the designers most of all, Keith Warren of Louis Vuitton - made hum thunk in new ways
"It made me just appreciate beauty, and not to over-think things too much At the same time, analytically, it did improve my ideas of color and line," he says
If his endeavors in downtown Detrott are as interesting as his foray into the modeling world, the city has a lot to look forward to

Dr. Levi, I'm trying to educate my kids about cavities.
What should I tell them?
Tooth decay is another name for the disease known as cavittes A cavity is the result of your tooth enamel, dentin, berng destroyed over long term exposure to harmful bacteria
The bacteria is caused by your teeth being frequently exposed to foods rich in carbohydrates (starches and sugars) like pop, ice cream, milk and cakes Ironically even fruts, vegetables and juices can lead to tooth decay
Many cavities originate in the hard-to-clean areas between teeth So it is important to brush and floss regularly When that is not convenient, encourage your children to thoroughly rinse the mouth with water after consuming any food product Upon returning home, they can brush with a fluorde toothpaste For younger children, use only a pea-sized amount of paste and encourage them to spit often while brushing Flourde toothpastes can upset young stomachs Since many cavities can easily go undetected, it is most important to schedule routing dental check-ups with your dentist Ignoring even tiny cavities can lead to greater trouble down the

Although bowties have traditionally been worn with tuxes, the current trend is toward regular suit tres worn with wing collar or straight collar tuxes Benkert suggested a long silver tie, or black grosgrain

On top of that, the suits fit only as good as
