

As new year dawns, Plymouth area reflects on 2004



From the unusual — an intruder at a day care being shot by police and the collapse of the fountain in Kellogg Park — to the mundane — local elec tions business comings and goings -2004 was an interesting year in the Plymouth community

Perhaps nowhere was change telt more in 2004 than in the local busi ness community where an old eyesore was suddenly swept clean and longtime businesses finally succumbed

Downtown Plymouth lost three of its most venerable businesses this year when the Little Book Shoppe on the Park, Plymouth Office Supply and the Penn Theatre all were shut down

The Little Book Shoppe opened in 1984 and was operated by Jackie Powers until she passed away in 1999 Seller Angelique Burleson said the new owner couldn t make a go of it



The Plymouth-Canton Educational Park Marching Band won yet another state championship and finished in the top 10 at the national competition in Indianapolis

and finally decided it was time to sell We really can't compete with some of the big stores, Burleson said 'We are appreciative of the loyal customers who supported us, but only a loyal few really shopped'

None of the businesses had to wait

long for new suitors The Penn Theatre, which finally closed after switching from old movies to first-run films and back, with a try as a comedy club along the way, has been sold and

### Family takes 'Sysco Kid' suspect off life support

A Plymouth man suspected of nine southeast Michigan bank robberies including Comerica Bank in Plymouth Township - died Dec 21 after family members decided to take him off life sup-

Kenneth J Rosselot, 38, of Plymouth was hospitalized Dec 17 in critical condition at St Joseph Mercy Hospital following a car chase with Michigan State Police cruisers in Canton The chase began earlier that day at 9 45 a m in Chelsea, where Rosselot allegedly robbed the Flagstar Bank, and a witness watched him get into his car and called Chelsea police

Rosselot eventually lost control of his car during the high-speed chase, which led state troopers east on I-94, and ultimately through residential areas of Canton At one point, the chase went right past Dodson Elementary School It ended when Rosselot lost control of his car, flipping it into the air

Local FBI officials believe Rosselot was responsible for nine bank robberies since Sept 3

We re fairly certain that he was the Sysco Kid," said FBI Special Agent Terry Booth, referring to the baseball cap Rosselot allegedly wore when bank surveillance camer antured his image

Monikers, usually pertaining to the perpetrator's MO, apparel or appearance, are often given to bank robbers by the FBI Other bank robber nicknames include the Ziploc Bandit, a wanted bank robber who distributes plastic bags to tellers to fil with cash the 'Bandanna Bandit," who killed himself after being captured and the White Van Bandit caught after rob bing the same bank four times

Improved digital surveillance photography and quick police work are just two reasons bank robbers are getting caught more and more these days, Booth said

'Over the last six weeks, we've been very successful in holding down bank robberies," Booth said, adding that 50 bank robbery cases have been closed Still, Michigan's year-to-date bank robbery number is the second highest in the US, at 449 Only California, with 888, had a higher number of bank robberies in

### Sculptor works way through ice age

#### Plymouth woman carves a niche into festival's success

If you met Tajana Raukar on the street, you could easily see her as a wife, a trained chef, a businesswoman, even a contributing citizen of the Plymouth community And, as soon as you had a conversation with her, her thick accent might lead you to guess that she is also from Croatia

But if someone asked you to guess what kind of tools she uses in her business, I doubt you d come up with the following list, more akin to a medieval battleground than a 21st century business hacksaws, chainsaws, ice picks, die grinders,

blow torches, sanding machines and steam irons

In the modern world, you might assume that she is either a serial killer or a tree trimmer And her profession is quite unique, definitely requiring imagination combined with skill, but, ironically - with a cold twist

Raukar spends most of her time either in the cold elements of the Michigan outdoors or in the confines of a very large cold storage freezer

#### IT'S MAGIC

Raukar is a sculptor, using a simple element quite plentiful at times in Michigan this time of year She works her creative magic on ice She takes giant blocks of ice and transforms them into magnificent displays

of art, expression and joy Her tools become tools of precision and artistic expression as she transports ideas from her imagination into the crystal clear blocks until they draw a symphony of 'oohs'" and 'aahs' 'from an audience of as many as 500,000 in the downtown Plymouth area This sparkling, crystal 'joy' fills the entire community during one week in January - this year, Jan 17-23 - at The Plymouth International Ice Spectacular



### Quake spawns local wave of grief

Relief efforts are under way locally and nationally to help victims of the earthquake and tsunamis that ravaged - and continue to ravage southeast Asıa, kıllıng at least 44,000 and costing billions of dollars ın property damage

An earthquake Sunday off the island nation of Sumatra caused 500-mile-per hour waves in the Indian Ocean and Bay of Bengal US.A Today reported the tsunami is the deadliest since 1755, when Portugal lost 60,000 people in the tidal waves The hardest hit areas were Srı Lanka, India and Thailand, but deaths also were reported in Tanzania, Seychelles, Malaysıa, Myanmar, Bangladesh, the Maldives and Somalia

The aftermath of the tsunamıs is being felt locally, especially in Canton where there is a large Asian population In India, the southern coastal regions were hit the hardest, including the major port city of Madras, according to Mukesh Patel, coordinator of the Shrı Swamınarayan Mandir temple, which is located on Canton Center He said not only have people lost their homes, but they have also lost their sources of livelihood, too

"The poor people are the ones who really get hurt," Patel said, adding that the coastal fishermen have been particularly devastated "None of them have insurance People (basically) survive day to day"

The Indian government is typically slow to respond to disasters, Patel said

'The help will come, but by the time it gets to (the people), it will be too late - that is the tragedy of the whole thing, he said

#### **GREAT LOSS**

A Canton woman, Dhammika Dewasurendra, lost her mother, who lived in Sri Lanka Her mother was drowned by a tidal wave while on her way to visit relatives, a Detroit newspaper reported

A family member said Dewasurendra was too upset to return calls for this story

A local Hindu priest, Shiva Kumar, was vacationing in India - right in the path of the tsunamı He recently telephoned colleagues in Canton to assure people that he was OK Still, people who know him

- and others living in the area - are bracing themselves for

another onslaught "There's another attack from the ocean coming," said Shiva Kumar, another priest at the Hındu Temple, located at 44955 Cherry Hill He added that both commercial and residential areas have been crippled

They just closed all the roads and shopping centers," Kumar şaıd

Canton native Robin Sanborn LaRoy, a 1998 graduate of Canton High School, said three of her friends are in regions devastated by the earthquake and tsunami

Two of them are newlyweds - Mark and Elizabeth Moon of Fenton, who wed in Miami, but honeymooned in Thailand

'They were taking an elephant ride in the mountains with a guide and someone in a  ${\bf Jeep~stopped~them,'~Sanborn}$ Laroy said They attempted to warn them of the tsunamı, but language barriers caused the words of caution to be whittled down to 'Water, water'

Eventually, the newlyweds figured out what that meant

Now, they are subsisting on bottled water and remaining food from the hotel - and trying to figure out how to get back home They have been using someones satellite phone to periodically call their mothers to let them know they're

Amazingly, their belongings made it through the devastation - thanks to mosquito netting "They were told to put their belongings up on their bed to keep bugs off of them,' Sanborn LaRoy said This was enough distance from the floor to keep them from getting drenched

Since they are on a small resort Island off the Thailand mainland, the infrastructure that helped get them there such as ferries - isn't there to help them get back They were scheduled to fly home by Jan 2 "For now they're safe and dry and have food,' she said

#### Scope of local pastor's visit to India may change

The associate pastor of the First Baptist Church of Plymouth is in India to set up a teaching mission trip to Manipur the last two weeks of January

However, Rev Wungreiso Valui will be spending his time in the northeast sector of the country, away from the devastation left by the tsunami that hit the southern coastal areas of India and several Indian islands

As of Tuesday afternoon, Valui's wife was waiting for a telephone call to make certain he completed his trip safely However, Margareth Valui said she didn't expect her husband would be in any danger because of the distance from the area hit by the flood waters, which could result in more than 10.000 deaths

The Valuis and their two children, along with senior pastor, Dr Michael Bryan, will join the mission team next month

Meanwhile, a church spokesperson said plans are being made to schedule a Sunday service to help members of the Indonesian Christian Church of Ann Arbor, which hold services in First Baptist Church of Plymouth gymnasium

Indonesia was hit hard by the tsunamı, and many from the congregation have rela tives and friends who were victims of the disaster



"I come from a family of artists," she said "My mother was a designer, she had a millinery shop in Dearborn She taught me everything I know Dancing at Novi's Walled Lake Casino in its heyday, Zastawny-Moreno said she's always had

a love for music, art and design "I always shelved my art,' she said Her father's unexpected 1969 death changed things I started looking at how short life was I felt it was time to spread my wings'

Answering California's call, she stayed in the state for 28 years, designing costumes and learning about art on the way

While working retail in Virginia, she met Moreno, a trilingual Spaniard with a penchant for painting and photography

"I used to read about Spanish literature, different theatrical plays and musicians from all these Hispanic countries," said Moreno, raised in Guanajuato, Mexico "It was very appealing to be in that environment

Their artistic passions meshed in marriage four years ago

### Waiting and wondering

Canton woman looks forward to husband's homecoming from Iraq

Wartime is always difficult, particularly for military wives like Nicole Zsuzsics

The former Canton resident's husband, Allen 'Zeus" Zsuzsics, is aboard the USS Harry Truman, a Navy aircraft carrier that is currently somewhere off the coast of

Rather than pine away the days worrying about her husband's fate, Zsuzsics, 22, has started an organization called Operation Morale, which is dedicated to helping the sailors aboard the Truman fight their worst fears loneliness and being forgotten

Through the organization, people can write letters to sailors and send them cards or other care packages, which Zsuzsics says go a long way to make them feel appreciated Many of the sailors are looking for pen pals, to help keep them connected to back

Their worst fear is to be forgotten There's so many guys that don't get any letters at all My husband wrote me one time that I needed to do something about it, so I started Operation Morale," Zsuzsics said

Zsuzsics, formerly Nicole Kline, graduated from Plymouth Salem in 2000 and now lives in Chesapeake, Va She married her husband in October 2003, after the two became acquainted through an online military pen pal service Currently she is in Canton visiting her mother, Denise Kline

Nicole said she usually gets daily e-mails from her husband who steals away every chance he gets to find out

about news from home, especially about the couple's 8month-old son, Brady

"He works 12 to 14 hours a day, so he doesn't get much of a chance to use e-mail I never get more than a paragraph at a time, but at least he can tell me hes OK," she said

Every once in a while, her husband gets access to a telephone and calls home, but because of the time difference, Nicole said the calls usually come early in the morning

Most of the time he calls its 2 or 3 in the morning I wake up the next morning wondering if I really talked to him or not,' she said Zsuzsics said communica-

tion from home is so vital for any sailor or soldier in wartime, especially because many of them don t have family to think about or with whom to keep in touch

'Some people don't have anybody and are sitting on ships wondering if anyone even knows they are there,' she said 'Our point with Operation Morale is to make them aware that everyone does know they are there and that we care about them"

Allen Zsuzsics, who is from Kansas, said it makes such a difference for the sailors when they receive letters from home whether it is from someone they know or not

"It's nice to know that people still think and care about us out here Being away from your family is so hard, especially over the holidays I miss my wife and baby so much When we get mail and packages from random Americans telling us how much were appreciated, it makes being gone a little easier,' he said

Nicole said she is counting down the days when her husband returns from his sixmonth tour, though she understands it could end up being longer depending on what happens in the near future War is never exact

I'm just like everyone else I'll probably find out about four days before he arrives home But we're really hoping for six months, which means he will be home in early April,' she said

supply - they take it right out of a lake nearby And the possibilities are unbelievable with such large chunks to work with, Raukar said

A few other animals Raukar has created from ice include parrots, horses, Longhorn cattle, Clydesdale horses, and unicorns When Tajana arrives on the scene other carvers know they are in for a treat, and in the case of competitions, a tough competitor She has won many world championships with the help of her husband, Paul, who handles much of the logistics, and behind the scenes

#### **GETTING DOWN TO BUSINESS**

This is not a hobby for the Raukars Paul and Tajana have made their dream into a business, located in Plymouth, which offers beautiful carvings for major events such as weddings, conferences, business meetings and other social gatherings She and her husband also do carvings for many restaurants and in the Detroit area, along with other festi-

vals in the area They have a specialized machine that produces crystal clear blocks for both their own use and for sale to other carvers in the area They also

have machines that carve ice for commercial logos, shot glasses, centerpieces or sorbet dishes for receptions

This machine can also provide company logos "embossed in ice which the machine cuts into the ice with incredible precision using computer specifications

After starting out as chefs with training nearby at Schoolcraft College, the Raukars began their carving with vegetables, but were quickly enamored with the carving of ice from the first time they gave it a try They especially like the Plymouth Ice Spectacular because it is in their hometown of Plymouth which is also where their business is located It is much like having a sports competition with home field advantage you maintain a level of comfort in your own 'home field " And the Raukars love the downtown Plymouth setting

"The people are so nice," said Raukar, who also said she appreciates how close all the events are to one another "It is easy to go from one event to another, to find a place to eat, stop in and visit other sculptors, and enjoy the overall experience because of the arrangement of the downtown

Raukar is only one of many ice carvers who gather in Plymouth every year with great anticipation

'I try to make ice carving from my heart, express the feelings from my heart to your eyes,' said Raukar,

acknowledging she enjoys the reac tion of the crowd Many times the public relates to the carvings that I have made Last year I carved parrots, and a big Clydesdale with a plow I also did a Longhorn cow

#### **MASTERPIECES**

Raukar works with blocks of ice weighing 300 pounds each, which are strategically stacked and melted or "frozen together with water in order to create a larger mound of ice to carve She usually makes one big sculpture with about 20 blocks and does live demonstrations while the crowd stands in amazement

Raukar feels 'it is different carving in front of stores when compared to competitions because she enjoys the interaction with the crowds

I have to think ahead in case it is warm, you have to be prepared' she said She especially likes creating the larger designs in the gathering area where the sculptures are more spectacular The bigger the better!" is her philosophy

She and Paul have won the world championship six times - against as many as 35-50 other teams They also competed at the Olympics in Salt Lake City, Utah, in 2002, where they finished in fourth place

During competition, the teams divide the work up between the two teammates - sometimes one does the organizing, the planning, the lifting,

thus helping to keep the peace - while the other does the carving

Sometimes both members of the team But as Tajana pointed out, It's very

hard to find two carvers on the same level, of the same thinking, that complement on another Tajana and Paul agree the most dif-

ficult part of the ice carving process is watching it melt away

Of course, that largely depends on the weather

In Alaska, the blocks are five times bigger, and the temperature is so cold you don't have to worry it

will melt," Raukar said

Here, the weather is so unpredictable The ice here is manmade, it is smaller and the dimensions are different

Sometimes Tajana will spend most of a day preparing, imagining, designing and carving, only to watch it melt away by the end of the day But that is part of the excitement of her line of work She is challenged to make her work great in the short time that it

And, of course, the carvers take lots of pictures, so that none of their work will be forgotten

### Many businesses benefit as ice festival success continues

The downtown Plymouth businesses look forward to the Ice Spectacular with great anticipation every year With annual crowds of over 500,000, the event is an advertiser's dream, giving businesses an opportunity to showcase their specialty shops, restaurants, along with the local charm that Plymouth is known

The Plymouth Ice Spectacular is economic development at its very best! said Fran Toney executive director of the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce The event brings people from all over Canada, Ohio even nationwide, and the carvers come from all over the world Whether they are buying mag azines, gasoline or coffee, the biggest comment we get from visitors is, This is the best-kept secret, a friendly, clean, town, close to Detroit, with all the advantages and opportunities nearby, and a small town flavor It is the great American town

Whether visitors ultimately decide to move their businesses or families to Plymouth, or just shop in the short time they re here, the community is showcased in a spectacular way

Our community is one of the favorites of the ice carvers even though there are many around the country,' Toney said 'The Spectacular has been here for years and years, and it is the grandfather and king of them all

According to Mike Watts of Watts-Up, Inc , who coordi nates the event, a study done at the Cherry Festival in Traverse City showed the longer people stay in town for an event like this, the greater the benefit to the town

"For example, if you could get a cup of hot chocolate for the kids, a pastry, lunch, and other activities, then people would stick around, Watts said And, once families with kids see these ice sculptures, they almost always come back again next year, and maybe

even bring some friends Toney testifies to the success of the event for local business-

"People who have only been here for the ice festival will call the chamber months later and say, 'I was here for the ice festival back in January and I was ın a wonderful little store, it has a red door ," Toney said And the chamber will help them locate it Then they come back and do some major shopping It has been incredibly successful

The festival has come a long way Now many downtown businesses make their project ed revenue for weeks or months in just one week Local restaurants are often so swamped during this time that one pub owner literally ran out of beer last year

Stores selling items such as art pieces or clothing find their business picks up during this time, but the real returns for them occur later in the year In some cases, the ice festival merely serves as a marketing tool for future purchases Many shoppers see stores that carry items they appreciate, and will make a point to return at a later date, such as Christmas, to make their purchases

Steve Prokes, owner of the Plymouth Coffee Bean Company on Penniman in downtown Plymouth, said the festival is 'either the biggest or the second biggest" retail week of the year for his business

His shop is very close to the festivities and consistently sponsors a company logo along with a sculpture (this year they sponsored in cooperation with the Coffee Express company)

Their selection of desserts, sandwiches, pastries, coffee, tea and hot chocolate is popular with families who need a warm-up break from the winter elements - and it's open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week

The festival here is a huge family experience, even though it's cold,' Prokes said "Kids of all ages love it! They have so many ice sculputures, its amazıng'







Every year at this time of year, news organizations tend to run lists of "The Year's Top Stories," and this news organization is no different, as you can see by our Page 1

But as a reader pointed out a few years ago, some stories tend to get overlooked when you go back and start listing the best stories of the year In the Plymouth community, for instance, plenty of ink was used for the story about the day-care intruder shot by Plymouth Township police

We wrote ad nauseum about the City of Plymouth's budget problems, the effort to get a new township hall and the dwindling foundation grant for the Plymouth-**Canton Community Schools** 

While those are definitely good stories, some of the best stories in a community like Plymouth often go unreported, because they're selfless acts done by generous people whose only goal is to help other people

Time and again, people in this community have shown the kind of heart that make a community like ours special Whether it's for campaigns as popular and wellknown as the Salvation Army's Red Kettle campaign, which drew some \$140,000 last year, or as subtle as family adoption programs by local businesses, folks around here again proved their generosity Once again, the people in this community proved this year that the best stories aren't necessarily the ones found on Page 1

### Sponsoring ice fest should help business

The Plymouth International Ice Sculpture Spectacular has rolled around again, and this time it has brought with it its annual share of financial problems

The annual ice festival, one of the most popular events hósted in the city, has struggled with money the last several years This year, it looked like the pullout by Farmer Jáck was going to hurt, until Rock Financial stepped up and financed the Children's Fantasyland in The Gathering There are still several chances to help sponsor the event And we believe Plymouth businesses should take advantage of the opportunity, because rarely do better chances to get their businesses out there come along

Want to argue about visibility? The ice festival creates millions of media impressions every year, according to figures compiled by Mike Watts of Watts-Up Inc., who organizes the annual festival Granted, those are estimates based on the potential audiences/viewership/readexship of the various news media outlets that did even the smallest amount of coverage Still, that's a lot of interest Downtown businesses should be able to reap the benefits of having that much media coverage and that many people clogging the streets Township businesses aren't quite as proximate, and so don't benefit as much, but there's still a residual effect for them, as well The ice festival is one of our jewels, and we believe local businesses should take advantage of it by helping to sponsor it

### To improve economy, lower business taxes

As we look forward to what 2005 will bring, no doubt many of us are hoping for an improved economy

We may be hoping in vain — unless the state Legislature takes some bold steps to make Michigan more friendly to business The state's economy, particularly the job market, lags significantly behind the national economy Since November 2001, Michigan has lost 147,000 jobs — more than any other state — according to the State Fiscal Agency Growth in inflation-adjusted personal income has also lagged behind the national average, falling 1 6 percent 2002 and rising only 2.1 percent in 2003. The Single Business Tax discourages companies from adding jobs because it goes up as their payroll increases Since the tax is also applied to benefits, it keeps businesses from offering health care to their employees

Michigan also taxes equipment that businesses own and requires them to collect sales tax, which raises the costs of goods to consumers and of doing business We laud Gov Jennifer Granholm and Oakland County Executive L Brooks Patterson's efforts to go abroad and attract new emerging business sectors to the Great Lakes State But the Begislature needs to do its part, too, by making this a more business-friendly state in which to open up shop

#### Keep feds out

Phil Power makes a good point about overregulation (case in point wine and alcohol sales) in his Dec 2 column "Archaic distribution laws hurt consumers, vintners

His point about the "spider web of regulations covering wine, beer and booze' is well-said However, it is ironic that Mr Power concludes by hoping that the US Supreme Court will rule that the states do not have any authority to regulate alcohol sales, but that all regulation must be done by the federal government pursuant to its authority to regulate interstate commerce

In other words, Mr Power is arguing for more federal regulation, and less authority for the states to decide what is best for their citizens.

Although I agree that Michigan's hquor laws are antiquated and paternalistic, the last thing we need is more federal regulation of anything

I would argue, instead, that the state should change its laws. Why get the federal government involved? Don't we have too much interference from Washington already?

We repeatedly hear conservatives argue that less government is better, and that we, the people, know more about what's best for us than the politicians in Washington Despite that rhetoric, though, the federal government (even under this 'compassionate conservative' administration) keeps extending its con-

Look at our school systems, traditionally under local control Now the federal government (under the "No Child Left Behind" legislation) is dictating not only

the curriculum, but what happens if a school doesn't meet certain federally imposed criteria. Does anybody really believe that Washington knows how to educate our children better than we do?

Our state legal system, too, is coming under attack from Congress President Bush has promised national tort reform Michigan has, over the past dozen years, instituted a number of legal reforms Those reforms were the subject of wide and spirited debate in Lansing and in the press

We, in the State of Michigan, discussed and decided which reforms to adopt and which to reject Why can't Washington accept that? Why does Congress feel they have to force their opinions on us?

Conservatives consistently argue about returning government to the people, but continue to create new federal regulations to take the government away from the people

We hear a lot of talk about our rights under the US Constitution, but the 10th Amendment, the last of the Bill of Rights, has been completely ignored 'The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States, or to the people

True conservatives shouldn't be so eager to ignore that part of our Constitution

If this state and this nation fail to establish education of all children as a top priority and fail to fund it appropriately, we can not expect to continue as world leaders

### New agreement threatens | Term limits still a bad idea safe asylum for refugees

hey have come from El Salvador and Russia,
Uganda and Colombia Iracana a Most of them have been tortured Most of the women have been raped along the way Some die or are arrested on their way to the rundown streets of the southwest side of Detroit

Yet several thousand do arrive every year, finding their way across the globe to an ancient red-brick former convent in the shadow of the Ambassador Bridge called Freedom House, a nonprofit organization dedicated to helping "huddled masses yearning to breathe free" to do just that Those who come here, and who huddle for a few weeks or months in its dormitory-style rooms, risk their lives for the promise of new ones in this

nation or in Canada But now, thanks to a new agreement between Washington and Ottawa, Freedom House's ability to help these people may be largely cut off On Dec 29, something called the "Safe Third Country Agreement," took effect and severely curtail the ability of most of the world's refugees to cross over to Canada, where asylum has been easier to win in recent

What it means is that refugees who land in a nation regarded by both Canada and the United States as "safe" (1 e, free and democratic) will be obliged to apply for asylum there, rather than crossing the border to do so

"This is perfectly reasonable and meant to reduce the abuse of the asylum systems by stopping asylum shopping in both Canada and the United States," said George Costaris, who manages political and economic relations for the Canadian government's consulate in Detroit

David Koelsch, Freedom House's staff attorney, doesn't think it is reasonable. He thinks this is an outrage 'This is an attempt by both governments to cut down on the number of refugees in the name of national security" What it will do, he fears, is doom some persecuted people

"It will also force people to go underground, both in the United States and Canada," he fumed, since the new regulations specify that if refugees apply for asylum and are turned down, they may be detained and swiftly deported Gloria Rivera, a Mexican-born Roman Catholic nun who has run Freedom House for the last five years, is dismayed by the ruling, especially because so many of the refugees who she has helped go to Canada

For many years, Canada has been much more willing to grant refugees asylum than the United States has

Members of her staff have been toiling selflessly to help them win political asylum and get a new chance since 1983, when Freedom House was founded, spurred in large part by local outrage over United States policy in El Salvador and

Many of the founders were Catholic, though Freedom House's charter is scrupulously nonde-

Last year, the house housed more refugees from Albania than any other country, followed by the persecuted of half a dozen nations of sub-Saharan Africa

Far more of them sought asylum in Canada than in the United States Last year, Freedom House helped 2,481 adult men and women take the first steps to apply for asylum in Canada, and a mere 286 apply here

Things will be different now Not entirely, it will still be possible for people from some countries - Mexico, Cyprus and Iraq among them - to bypass the system and make a refugee claim from the United States Those with close blood relations already in Canada will also be able to

But otherwise, if a refugee lands in America first - and there are very few international flights direct to Canada - they will have no choice but to apply for asylum in the United States

If it is denied, they won't have the option, as they have had in the past, of trying again in

They ll be sent back to wherever they escaped from "This isn't about national security, it is economics," said Koelsch In other words, the rich nations of the world no longer want the world's

There is something sad about that, I think, especially given that this ruling comes at Christmas time, when people gather together to remember a homeless and stateless couple whose baby was born in a manger

What is ironic too is that virtually all those making it harder for new immigrants are the direct descendants of persecuted immigrants themselves

Detroit, where the refugees have huddled in Freedom House, is largely depopulated, with less than half as many people as it had half a century

Canada is one of the most sparsely populated nations in the world

Taking in a few more immigrants might not hurt either country Odds are the immigrants would give back more than they receive They usually do, you know

# that enables lazy electorate

n the business world, people tend to trust people who have more experience compared to a green counterpart

In the classroom, parents tend to be more comfortable with a veteran teacher than an educator who's only a year removed from col-

Experience is viewed by most people as a positive attribute, however, many turn the tables when it comes to politics

When Michigan voters approved term limits for state offices in 1992, it was viewed as a quick-fix for the perception that all career politicians were bad It was believed that government would become more efficient and new people would have a chance to serve While the latter is true, the former has not panned out

Since 1998, Michigan

West senators, governor, attorney general and secretary of state can be elected to no more than two, four-year terms Members of the Michigan House of Representatives can be elected to only three, two-year terms Those limits produced some interesting developments in the Michigan

Legislature There are 25 members of the Michigan House who are under the age of 30, a few of whom still live with their parents

A new speaker of the house, who s third in line to run the state, takes over next month He is 34-year-old Craig DeRoche, a Novi Republican, who's in the midst of completing only his first two-year term in Lansing He will appoint a number of lawmakers to committee leadership positions who have a comparable amount of legislative experience

At a time state finances have been in a quandary for several years, there will be a one-third turnover in the Michigan House at month's end, a situation primarily created by term limits This means dozens of new lawmakers need months to get acclimated to their new jobs, learn how the state spends \$39 billion a year and be prepared to make some significant votes on funding for state programs

■ After leaving office, a number of termlimited legislators have been hired to work as lobbyists These lawmakers-turned-lobbyists have more institutional memory and carry much influence over new lawmakers learning their duties Also, these new lobbyists are using their lawmaking experience to promote their employer's agenda instead of promoting the public's agenda.

■ Veteran legislative staffers often have more institutional knowledge and influence on legislation instead of those elected to vote

■ In 2000, as the current economic doldrums were starting, state lawmakers collected more than a \$20,000 a year pay raise. Since a number of term-limited lawmakers would be forced out of office in 2002, there was little motivation for these lame-duck legislators to heed public cries to block these

There's a common joke in Lansing Members of the state House use one term looking for the bathroom at the Capitol, another term learning who they work with, they finally start working on some legislation in the third term, then they have to leave

Our country's Democratic processes are cumbersome and time-consuming because of the number of checks and balances designed to protect citizens and discourage corruption With such short opportunities available for competent individuals to serve in Lansing, the process handcuffs their ability to make a difference, especially for those serving in the minority party


The term-limit policy is a gimmick that needs to be abolished If not, Michigan voters need to at least extend the current penods lawmakers can serve It is not fair to assume all politicians are corrupt Many peo-, ple who run for office have the best of intentions and deserve opportunities to be elected if they do a good job It's not a bad idea to give some motivated, effective lawmakers a chance to serve for an extended period of time Top-notch legislators can play a vital leadership role at times of transition

There's another important element that makes our Democratic process work well A participatory public who actively and fairly scrutinizes elected representatives, their activities and their votes

There are some bad apples who get elected to office, and there is a mechanism to remove troublesome lawmakers vote them out In the House, the voters have a chance to grade their representative every two years

If a more-involved electorate does its job, then there's a better chance their lawmakers will do a better job A civic-minded public does far more for government's effectiveness; than term limits

"I almost died, he said, smiling 'I couldn't believe it' From there, he attended a

national postal forum in Washington DC, where he met the US postmaster general - a rare opportunity He participated in a pre-game commercial for college football and he hopes to take his family to New York City to see the Times Square billboard, which will be up for about a year

Willson is humble about

With the people I was competing against, I think I m as positive about the services we offer as anybody else Maybe they had to draw straws,' he said

### Cold weather no pal to our furry friends

The Michigan Humane Society emphasizes that pet owners should make proper provisions for their animals now before it becomes a life or death situation – and one for which they can be charged with animal cruelty law violations Usually, these charges are misdemeanors which can include a sentence of up to 93 days in jail, a \$1,000 fine, community service and loss of pet ownership for a specified amount of

The cruelty investigators see an increase in calls each winter, said spokeswoman Nancy Gunnigle "Their call volume does go up dramatically when severe weather hits," she said The MHS has four cruelty investigators, she added, and the society receives no government funding

The Michigan Humane Society recommends that pets live indoors with the rest of the family However, at a mini mum animals kept outdoors must have the necessary provi sions as required by law to maintain their health A properly-sized dog house with clean, dry straw as well as a healthy diet and additional calories can help a dog maintain enough warmth to carry him through months of cold weather

Dr Brad Davis, a veterinari an with VCA Animal Hospital of Garden City, doesn't see a great problem with neglected animals in his practice

"There are outdoor breeds of dogs that do very well." Davis said Animals do need access to water and it's important that pet owners make sure water doesn't freeze

Vetermarian Dr Vyvian Gorbea, owner of Plymouth Veterinary Hospital, also doesn't see much neglect in her practice Animals are sometimes overexposed in the winter, she said, and some become overheated in the summer

"If they re outside, they should have a shelter," Gorbea said of dogs

Pets need food and water She educates her clients about such needs

Guardians who are not able to provide for their animals basic needs of food, water and adequate shelter are encouraged to surrender the animals to an animal welfare organization such as the Michigan **Humane Society** 

The following tips will help owners care for their pets during cold weather

■ When temperatures drop, pets should not be left outside for any length of time Even large or long-haired dog breeds cannot withstand severe or inclement weather Bring small or short-haired dogs inside when temperatures reach 15-20 degrees Fahrenheit Larger breeds and thick-coated dogs may remain outside, with adequate shelter, to about 0 degrees Precipitation and severe wind chills should also be taken into account

■ Cats should be kept permanently indoors or at least brought into a warm, animalproofed garage during severe weather

■ Because roaming cats often seek the warmth of car engines, knock on the car hood and honk the horn before starting your car

Shelter is required by Michigan state law for dogs that must remain outdoors for any length of time Adequate shelter means a well built, insulated slant roofed dog house The interior should be just large enough for the dog to stand and to lie down comfortably It should be slightly elevated from the ground for air circulation The door should face away from prevailing winds and have a protective flap to eliminate drafts Clean, dry straw should always be provided for bedding rather than towels, rugs or blankets which may quickly freeze

■ Several types of madequate shelter frequently encountered by investigators include an unheated garage or shed, a dog house that is too large or that lacks straw, or dogs simply tied out to a porch, fence or deck with no shelter at

■ Increase food and water 10-20 percent for outdoor dogs during the winter months

■ If an animal is cold to the touch, or his paws and ears have turned bright red, he may be suffering from frostbite Move the animal to a warmer area and contact your veterinarian immediately

The Humane Society's four cruelty investigators and one field agent handle approximately 4,000 cases of animal cruelty each year, in the cities of Detroit, Hamtramck and Highland Park Suspected animal abuse or neglect in these cities should be reported by calling the MHS Cruelty Hotline at (313) 872-3400 A confidential message can be left 24 hours a day Elsewhere, suspected animal cruelty should be reported immediately to the local animal control or police, Gunnigle said







rian Thelen once bought an Amish-made bedroom set and he was so impressed with the workmanship that he kept buying more of the handmade furniture for the rest of his house. Since then, he's added an Amish living room set with a desk, a computer cabinet, stereo cabinets and end tables.

"The quality is so much better," the Sterling Heights resident says. "You need two people to carry the headboard on our bed. It's very well-built furniture."

### Use a silicone product to treat grout

Rosalie asks, "We recently had our countertops re-tiled, and we got two separate opin ions on how to treat the grout One was to use Old English Lemon Oil, the other to use a silicone sealer

'I chose the oil because it was less expensive, but now I'm wondering if I did the right thing My main concern is to avoid as much future cleaning

as possible

Also, is it possible to change the color of the grout at some future date?

Since both of the products you mentioned are relatively inexpensive the cost to seal the grout shouldn't be the issue here You could be penny wise and pound-foolish by not using a sealer that will offer the greatest longevity

In our opinion, your inter ests would best be served by using a silicone product to seal

the grout Not only will it last longer, but it is highly impervi ous to water, more so than lemon oil

Furthermore, we believe that if you go with the lemon oil rather than the silicone, you may find yourself spending a great deal of your spare time sealing and resealing your

And where silicone generally dries to a clear finish, lemon oil tends to yellow the grout As far as changing the color

is concerned, there are a couple of different ways that this can be accomplished

The first method is by dyeing the grout Obviously, any sealer that may have been previously applied to the grout will need to be removed so that the dye may be absorbed into the grout

A trip to your local hardware store or home improvement center will get you what you need to perform this relatively sımple task

Aquinto doesn't slow down in the summer as she swims




for a club team, plays tennis and works on her impressive gymnastics skills in June, July and August

### Let it snow

### Wintry weather can't stop golf-instruction program

Once the Fox Hills Golf and Banquet Center's new covered, heated instructional facility is officially opened in the next couple of weeks, avid golfers in southeastern Michigan will have another opportunity to thaw out their clubs and swings during the frigid months of

January, February and March
The new facility, which will
become the year-round "office'
of Crystal Mountain Golf
School PGA professionals Scott
Wilson and Brad Dean, will
feature two enclosed, heated
studios for teaching, and four
partially enclosed bays for driving-range practice

Fox Hills, a 63-hole public golf complex, is located on North Territorial Rd in Plymouth Township, approximately seven miles west of downtown Plymouth

"One of the nice things about the video studios is that they are open at one end so that the golfers can see the full flight of the ball once they hit it," said Wilson, a Crystal Mountain instructor since 1994 "They won't be hitting the ball into a screen or net

"Even though it will be cold outside, the tubular heating we are having installed will make it nice and warm in the studios and the driving-range bays. There will also be an artificial putting surface available. The entire structure will be lit at night, too, so the golfers can see where the ball is going."

Wilson said golfers who receive the video swing analysis that the facility offers will get instant feedback from the technology that was designed by V-One, a Livonia-based company

"Before this latest technology came along, we used to video-tape the golfer's swing, then take it inside and plug it into a computer to analyze it," Wilson said "Now, a few seconds after the golfer is videotaped, we can play it back for them right in the studio It's a very advanced system that allows us to use a number of tools"

One unique tool the professionals can utilize is a feature that splits the computer screen in half with the golfer's swing on one side and a PGA tour pro's swing on the other

"It lets the golfer compare his swing to, let's say, Vijay Singh's," Wilson said 'We can also use stop-action and slowmotion, which allows us to analyze the golfers' swings thor-

at the time "Joe, back in 1992, when the Central started up, I tried to recruit him to come to Tulsa," Unger recalled "I had quite a few talented guys come to my team and he decided that he'd rather go to Oak (Oklahoma) City, which was our rival He went there because he didn't think he could make our team when he saw the roster and the guys

#### TRY, TRY AGAIN

Five years later, Unger left Tulsa to take over a New Mexico franchise (Western Professional Hockey League) and again, he tried to get Burton for his team

This time, he got Burton's name on the dotted line But, the Blazers' brass found out about the signing and countered with "a whole pile of money (for Burton) to stay in Oak City," Unger said

Because of his respect for Burton as a person and player, Unger voided the contract with New Mexico and allowed the winger to return to Oklahoma City

The only way he could play ın Oak Cıty was ıf I released him," he said "I did it as a favor to him, I let him go back to Oak City

Eventually, of course, the two would pair up with the Mechanics

Motor City got a late start

on signing players this summer, but Unger knew of at least one player who would fit right in - Burton, who retired after 2002-03, but who still had ability to put the puck

into the net Even though he has great skills and wasn't that far out of shape," Unger said, "I knew it was going to take a couple months for him to get his real game back

"You have to roll with it, and again, that's cost us a little bit because he hasn't been at the top of his game Now, he's getting close, he's starting to get back to where he used to be"

And what about Unger's own return to Hockeytown after a 33-year absence?

'It's been great," said Unger, who played in Detroit from 1967-68 into the 1970-71 season, when he was dealt to St Louis "The only tough part has been the losing

"We're getting about 1,500 to the games (the arena seats nearly 3,000) and the quality of game is real good. The guys work real hard and it's a fun game to watch Plus, I think The Garage' is a neat con-

Winning more would be even neater Unger hopes, with Burton's help, to soon get the Mechanics' collective engine revving and bring more fans out to "The Garage" on Utica Road



### Garden City's Burton revels in minor-league hockey comeback

Scoring a big-time furniture sale might get an employee's name on a bulletin board somewhere for an "atta-boy"

As nice as that might be, it wasn t enough to keep longtime minor-league hockey star Joe Burton - Garden City's answer to Wayne Gretzky with 573 goals, 1,000 points and counting - on board at Art

Van Furniture in Westland Burton, 37, a diminutive, soft-spoken forward for the



expansion Motor City Mechanics United Hockey League franchise, ditched the life of pushing tables and chairs for a rare opportu-

nity He was wooed from Art Van to the Fraser team this summer by Mechanics head coach and former Detroit Red Wings star Garry Unger

"I heard he was selling furniture and I know what it's like," added Unger, "the difference between playing hockey and selling furniture

Nobody had to make a huge pitch on Burton, a 1985 graduate of Garden City High School, for him to rejoin the minors The reason he retired after 2002-03 in the first place was to return to Detroitarea roots, where he and wife Linda (originally from Redford Township) still have their families

"That was the main reason (for his retirement), we just wanted to settle down," said Burton, who nonetheless looks more like a salesman than hockey player I started working with Art Van (But) I figured if I could come home and play it would be a good opportunity for us

"At Art Van, I was making enough money to survive But for me, with the hours I was putting in, and working every weekend and the holidays, it wasn't worth it for me

That's not to say he didn't do a good job with the furniture company over the seven or eight months he was employed there

"He was a real nice guy, cordial and polite," said store sales manager Mike Wiseman 'He did a nice job for us, we re sorry he left"

But Wiseman said he wasn't surprised Burton opted to return to hockey "He definitely still had it in his blood '

Even though Burton only makes about \$900 a week with the Mechanics (that being the salary earned by veterans), he is finding other ways to cash in

Joe and Linda purchased his parents' Garden City home, the very one he grew up in

And now, they'd like it if sons Joe, 4, and Luke, 2, grew up in the small city One day they might become Cougars, too, although the elder Joe only played freshman football at Garden City High School

"I liked growing up in Garden City," said Burton, who played hockey and other sports for the Garden City Youth Association 'It's a good town Hopefully when I m done here I can coach some of the younger kids and try to help out with some of the hockey programs in the area"

#### **COMING AROUND**

On the ice, things are slowly progressing, both for Burton and the Mechanics

Although the team is struggling this season, with a 3-17-2 mark to date, Burtons stat sheet isn't terrible

He has seven goals and six assists in those 22 games

including a three-goal hat trick on Nov 26 against Quad City The goals give him a career total of 572, mostly talhed during a stellar 11-season run with the Central Hockey League's Oklahoma City Blazers

I'm still working on my timing and some of my puckhandling skills are just starting to come back, said Burton, following a recent practice at Great Lakes Sports City in Fraser

For his hat trick against Quad City, Burton showed fans at The Garage (named for the venues nondescript exterior) that he still has the touch

One goal came on a deflection in front of the goalie, another on an opportunistic rebound The third? His shot from between the circles ricocheted off two defensemen and settled over the goal line

"I scored a lot of goals in my career, but I'm not flashy, beating guys 1-on-1 or anything like that," said Burton, who makes the hour commute from Garden City "My biggest asset is my brain I'm smart I know when to go in front of the net and anticipate plays

At this level, the only way you're going to score a lot of goals is you have to pay the price in front of the net

Unger didn't have to be reminded about how Burton knows his way around an enemy goal When the ex-Wing coached Tulsa during the 1990s, he had to watch Burton wreak havoc with his own goaltenders

'He's not a pretty goal scorer," Unger said "He's got a good shot, and when he shoots the puck he shoots it at places where he has a chance to score It's not just a shot on

#### THE RIGHT SPOT

Had the top goal-scorer in CHL history been blessed with

more physical tools, there is no telling how his career might have evolved

"Obviously, I knew I wouldn't make it (to the National Hockey League) because I didn't have the talent or size," said Burton with a shrug

Apparently, that Burton did not fit the brawny hockey prototype came up at Art Van during banter between Burton and co-workers

"People used to kid him," Wiseman said "How can a guy like you score so many goals?"

nger pondered the queshy players with natural ng ability sometimes c proverbial brick wall

between the so-called AA minors and higher levels, right on up to the NHL

"I think maybe his (lack of) size, and even though he is a fairly good skater, as you go up in levels guys get to be great skaters," Unger said

"So if you can't keep up skating-wise, you don't have a chance to get the puck Now, there's a lot of guys down here, that maybe in the right circumstance, maybe could play

on a (NHL) team "But they have to be in the right spot at the right time And sometimes they're not There are a lot of skilled players in this league

"So if you are going to play in this league, why not be the best possible player you can at this Îevel?"

For now, at least, the right spot for Burton is Fraser It's a chance to keep playing the game he loves while scoring goals rather than sales

"I love playing," he said "And as long as I can pay the bills and support my family I will'

That kind of thinking is as on-target as many of Joe Burton's shots







### Watson plays a big role in Wolverines defense

Big things were expected for Gabe Watson when he entered the University of Michigan Unfortunately, the biggest thing about Watson early in his college football career was his weight, which was closer to 400 than 300 Nevertheless, the Southfield High graduate made steady progress his first two years seeing limited playing time at defensive tackle as a true freshman then joining Michigan's regular defensive line rotation last season

This season Watson, now listed at 333 pounds earned a starting position Additionally, Michigan re-designed its

defense, in large part, because of Watson's ability to play nose guard U-M switched from a 4-3 defense to a 3 4 set this season Watsons spot in the middle of the line is vital to the Wolverines ability to play the

That defense begins with a

nose guard," said Wolverines

coach Lloyd Carr earlier this season "If you ve got a nose guard in that defense, you ve got a guy that can go quickly to the side the ball is run to A lot of times it forces the guard and the center to what we call scoop or double team him Gabe is so big and strong that eventually one of those guys has got to come off and block

the linebacker If they stay on

him, the linebackers free If they come off too soon, hes free That's the beauty of that defense I think Gabe has made a real difference in there

Watson responded with a strong season, earning first team All Big 10 honors He made 36 tackles, including 24 solo stops and seven tackles for loss But the numbers don't tell the story of his success His dominance on the line often forced ballcarriers to avoid Watson's territory, permitting other defenders to claim the tackle Watson also forced most teams to double-team him which, again, gave other Wolverines a better opportunity to make the stop

Watson admitted that being double-teamed "gets frustrating at times It's a tough position You want to go against one guy, you focus on one guy in film (sessions) Sometimes you get mad about it but I notice on film that some guys make plays because I am double-teamed Its all a part of the Job

Which doesn't mean that Watson gives up on making plays when he's double teamed

It is kind of hard at times to split the double team, but you just have to keep rushing, he





That's something that you can't coach," Teasley said, "we're just fortunate to have those kind of guards If they can finish we finish, if they can't finish then that play-making ability comes into play'


Alex McMillian led the Rockets with 17 points, including five threepointers, and scored all but three of his points in the second half



# Cell tower construction can be stopped

Our subdivision is fighting with an owner of a lot who wishes to provide for the construction of a cellular tower within our single family subdivision. Do you think we have any recourse to stop

To the extent that the single family home restriction has not been waived, you should be able to enforce it against the construction of a cellular tower In a sımılar case out of Arızona, the construction of a cellular tower on church property within a single family subdivision was deemed to violate the restrictive covenants that prohibited construction of anything other than detached single family dwellings There also may be a provision in your documents that prohibits commercial and/or business activities which might also be supportive of the association's position You are best advised to consult with an attorney to seek the appropriate remedies against the cellular tower company and owner of the subdivision lot before construction begins

I understand that there is a new statute in Michigan regarding judgment liens which I obtained against a homeowner in a condo. I did check the title and found that the association of homeowners filed a lien against the unit. Do I have a priority to that lien?

While a judgment lien has priority over a lien recorded with the register of deeds after a notice of the judgment lien is recorded, there are a number of exceptions including a hen for unpaid assessments or charges due to a condo association, homeowners' association, or property owners' association that arises from or pursuant to recorded restrictions that run with the land Therefore, your judgment lien would not take priority against the associations lien You should consult with an attorney to determine what remedies you have with respect to your judgment lien

### Buyers ruled in '04: They could be picky

With so many houses on the market, buyers could afford to be choosy, and they were in 2004, according to Alissa Nead of Coldwell Banker Preferred in Plymouth

You could look for a home that matched your furniture and some people did said Nead, who was recently named the Western Wayne Oakland County Associations Realtor of the Year Buyers were looking for homes they didn't have to do anything to

This was a great year, said Chris Courtney, WWOCARs 2004 president "But it was definitely a buyer's market Some houses are sitting on the market. In the past, houses would sell within hours or days of being listed. It is been a problem for people who buy a new house before selling the old one. They face having to pay two mortgages."

#### CAUTION URGED

His advice? If you're thinking about moving, sell your house before you buy a new one. He believes some of those houses on the market will begin to move in 2005 'Rates staying low is a good thing, he said 'If rates stay low, below 9 percent, and I don't see them hitting there, that's a good sign for real estate"

Nead said it gives her an ulcer when buyers have two houses – the one they just bought – and the one they're trying to sell

"With low interest rates a lot of people refinanced and rolled their credit into their mortgage," she said "Your home is your biggest asset"

Her fear is that some people will use the equity to pay creditors and be left with little or nothing when they decide to sell their house

There were a lot of foreclosures in southeast Michigan this year Lois Maljak, foreclosure specialist at Home Savers Inc, a Warren-based agency specializing in providing counseling services to individuals facing home foreclosures, estimates that 10-15 percent of homeowners in the country are barely able to make their monthly payments "What we find our families struggling to make ends meet through credit cards and loans, and in turn, set themselves up as a prime candidate for foreclosure,' she said

Buyers were cautious 'People were uncertain about their jobs," said Nead 'With interest rates so low we should have had buyers coming out of the woodwork

Sellers, anxious to move on, invested in landscaping, paint, and other quick fixes to give their homes more curb appeal "Your house is such a personal part of you, said Nead. It hurts sellers feelings when they hear negative comments about their home. But there were so many homes on the market. By the end of the year sellers understood they had to do updates and make repairs.

Schools were the No 1 thing buyers considered in making a home purchase. They mention it even if they don't have children, said Nead 'Good schools are too important for resale'

Consumers are a lot more informed and do their homework

They are more demanding They know what they want, said Marge Whetstine, newly elected president of the Western Wayne Oakland County Association of Realtors 'More and more Realtors are advertising on the Internet

Realtors are also taking on more of a consultant role "We coordinate the sale and guide them right up to closing,' said Whetstine. "A lot of things need to be explained "title work, city ordinances, pricing Pure numbers don't help you sell a house unless you know what's going on in the neighborhood"

People move a lot more than they used to "People's jobs change, they don't stay in a job forever," said Whetstine "You used to see someone stay in a house for 10 years, not anymore"

"There were a lot of first-time buyers because of low interest rates and that's a plus," said Whetstine Some of those firsttime buyers were couples

"Couples used to look at what they what they could afford," said Whetstine "Now they re looking at new construction They re marrying later, and are already through school and have a

Homebuyer needs are changing too "I noticed more buyers didn't care about a formal dining room," said Nead A first

floor laundry room, and library/office was important Master suites that offer a little privacy and a three-car garage are important Whetstine has also noticed that more

retirees are moving back to Michigan to

be with family Homes with two master suites, one for the homeowner, and one for aging parents, are becoming more

Stronger than expected home sales and higher median prices have caused the National Association of Realtors to revise upward its year end forecast Existinghome sales are expected to jump 7 9 percent to 6 58 million in 2004, well above last year s record For 2005, NAR projects 6 38 million sales, which would be the second highest level on record

The national median existing-home price is projected to rise 7.9 percent to \$182,500 for the year. The median newhome price should increase 8.9 percent to \$214,600

New-home sales will rise 8 9 percent to 118 million this year and 113 million are forecast for 2005, just shy of the record expected this year Housing starts are seen at 195 million this year, the highest level since 1978, housing construction is projected at 187 million units in 2005

David Lereah, NAR's chief economist, said that some of the backup in housing demand is being met 'We're setting our fourth consecutive record year for existing-home sales, and even with strong fundamentals such as household growth, low interest rates and an improving economy, we simply can t set records every year,' Lereah said Given the sharp rise over last year's record, a lot of buyers have found the home they've been looking for and we can expect a bit of a breather in 2005, which will remain a historically strong year'

Lereah predicts the 30-year fixed-rate mortgage should rise slowly but average only 6 4 percent next year In 2005, he expects the median existing-home price to rise 5 0 percent and the typical new home price to grow by 5 8 percent

Whetstine is hoping the economy strengthens in 2005 Nead believes housing prices will stay stable, and there wont be huge increases "That will be good in the long run,' she said "You get the big jump, then the big fall Slow and steady will win for consumers

### A loan for every season

s I have seasoned as a mortgage loan officer, I have learned to treat my clients in much the same way as professional asset managers treat theirs In fact, I now view myself as more of a debt manager than a mere mortgage broker As a result of this professional evolution, I take more time at the beginning of the mortgage application process to truly comprehend my chents' long- and shortterm goals

The mortgage selection process is certainly not a "one size fits all" proposition. Choosing the correct fit for a borrower's situation is as critical on the debt side of the house as is choosing the correct investment vehicle for money managers on the asset management side.

Because different borrowers require different strategies to manage their debts – the most sizable of which is usually their mortgage – I will be spending the next several weeks providing specific insights and strategies that borrowers can use during the different stages of their lives

To metaphorically explain these phases, I will break down my four different categories according the seasons Spring, summer, autumn, and winter Phase one spring, represents the first time homebuyer purchasing a property and set ting up a home Summer, the second phase, includes those homeowners who actively building a family and facing all the cash-flow issues related therein Next, autumn involves borrowers who are rapidly accumulating assets and equity And the final, winter, is characterized by equity and asset conversion to cash flow

"Spring' homebuyers, or first-timers, almost never have an abundance of cash with which to make a down payment Additionally, they often have very little to show by the way of work experience and credit history The sum of these risk factors, combined with the need to properly educate the young borrowers along the way, often makes for a good amount of work for the conscientious mortgage loan officer

### Adjustable mortgages down, 15-year rates show rising trend

The mortgage rate picture was mixed Rates on 30-year and 15-year mortgages went up, while rates on one-year adjustable mortgages went

Freddie Mac's weekly survey released Wednesday, Dec 22, showed rates on 30-year, fixed-rate mortgages increased to 5 75 percent, compared with 5 68 percent the previous week.

Rates on 30-year mortgages hit a high this year of 6 34 percent the week of May 13 They slowly drifted downward as the economy hit a late spring-early summer soft spot Recent economic data suggest the economy is expanding at a solid pace

Rates on 15-year, fixed-rate mortgages – a popular option for refinancing – rose to 5 18 percent, up from 5 11 percent

Thirty-year and 15-year rates were the highest since the beginning of December Long-term mortgage rates have remained well behaved even as the Fed boosted short-term interest rates five times this year That's because inflation, while creeping higher, is not currently viewed as a

danger to the economy, analysts say One-year adjustable rate mort-

One-year adjustable rate mortgages, meanwhile, dipped slightly to 4 17 percent, compared with 4 18 percent the previous week

The nationwide averages for mortgage rates do not include add-on fees known as points Each loan type carried a 0 6 point fee

A year ago, rates on 30-year mortgages averaged 5 82 percent with 15year mortgages at 5 14 percent and one-year ARMs at 3 77 percent

Low mortgages rates have supported home sales, which are expected to hit record highs for all of 2004 Sales next year should also do well, according to the National Association of Realtors

The associations chief economist, David Lereah, predicts rates on 30year mortgages will slowly rise next year to around 6 4 percent, still fairly low by historical standards

The Mortgage Bankers Association, meanwhile, reported that refinancings accounted for 48 9 percent of all mortgage loan applications filed last week, up from 46 percent One-year adjustable rate mortgages, meanwhile, dipped slightly to 4.17 percent, compared with 4.18 percent the previous week. The nationwide averages for mortgage rates do not include addon fees known as points.

## The 2005 Honda Civic Hybrid

After decades of barreling down the wrong path with electric cars that were completely powered by punchless batteries, and could reach all of 50 miles per hour for a range of a couple of hundred miles, the global automotive industry finally has figured out that all-electrics never were the answer to making drastic improvements in the fuel economy of their fleets. As it turns out, the answer lay in creating "hybrids" that combine an auxiliary battery with conventional internal-combustion gasoline engine Toyota and Honda were the first to field hybrid cars in the United States, and now the Big Three are in hot pursuit The automotive market will never be the same

It's true that, in some ways, hybrids have been somewhat of a disappointment. For example, there are serious complaints that owners of the Toyota Prius and the Honda Civic hybrids are finding actual mileage performance is 20 to 25 percent lower than the Environmental Protection Agency's labtested -- and eye-popping -- fuel-economy results Consumer Reports found that the Civic, for example, averaged 36 miles a gallon overall, or about 11 miles a gallon less than what the EPA ratings called for This reality check also makes the economic attractiveness of hybrids a little shaky, since with that mileage and even at \$2-a-gallon gasoline, it would take 12 years to recoup the higher cost of a hybrid Civic versus a similarly equipped gas-engine

But the industry's real problem these days seems to be keeping up with demand stoked originally over the summer by \$2-a-gallon gasoline And over the short term, the next few years, auto makers might be introducing so many new hybrid models that they will face shortages of supplies of the robust batteries that help power the cars They're made mainly by three companies Japan's Sanyo


and Panasonic, the Cobasys, which is affiliated with the local technology company Energy Conversion Devices Inc, based ın Troy

For now, hybrids already have reached a sort of watershed. the way I see it That's becuase, for all practical purposes, they can now be reviewed and evalu-

ated just like any other mainstream automobile And that is no mean accomplishment

I recently evaluated a Honda Civic hybrid and was more than pleased by the car's overall performance For a \$20,315 sticker price (and EPA ratings of 46 mpg in the city and 51 on the highway, dubious as those might be), you're getting a nifty machine In fact, in its most significant comparison with a conventional vehicle, on one of those particularly cold recent December mornings in suburban Detroit, after sitting outside all night, the Civic started right up like a charm But the subcompact, gasoline-powered vehicle sitting right next to it on the driveway stirred nary a bit The battery was completely dead that morning, snuffed out by a more or less typical winter day I was impressed by

Designers of hybrid vehicles also have learned a lot in just the last couple of years about how to remove things about these vehicles that are unnecessary reminders to their drivers that there's something different about the vehicle they're occupying It was the original Prius, I believe, that had a pushbutton starting device on the engine -- very strange when you're used to a key -- and a huge, lighted flow chart on the dashboard showing the various paths of energy into and out of the battery, brakes

and other components of the vehicle so that a passenger, presumably, could keep track of when the Prius was using the battery's energy and when it was recharging the battery

Honda -- whose first hybrid was a two-seater called Insight -- found a way, in converting one of its old-reliable fleet vehicles into a hybrid, to negate such oddities The driver uses a key to start up the Civic hybrid much like he or she would any other vehicle And there's no blaring flow chart showing the paths of energy through the hybrid powertrain, instead, as part of the instrument panel, Civic includes a small gauge -- very similar to the fuel gauge -- that simply shows whether the battery is "charring" or "assisting"

While Civic's mileage might not be all that the EPA cracked it up to be, I was still very impressed It seemed that you could drive the Civic hybrid for days and days without really worrying about making sure the gas tank was full enough

The powertrain's performance was fine as well Civic hybrid had every bit as much get-up-and-go as many of the gasoline-powered cars that it competes with in that segment

My only complaint was that Civic hybrid took longer to heat up than I would have liked That may be the one area where the vehicle's hybrid nature is a big disadvantage

# Waitin' on a scene

BY KEVIN BROWN STAFF WRITER

In 2005, expect rock bands to get more emotional and draw inspiration from fresher sources

That's the word from some keen observers of the metro Detroit and national music scenes

"Phat" Matt, 89X FM music director, said young bands with emotional lyrics and vocal styles are winning more attention from radio listeners

"The Used, Taking Back Sunday, My Chemical Romance and Underoath have the most rabid fans as we come into 2005," he said "They are grouped into a 'screamo' category – personally I think that label is kind of dumb, but you hear it a lot

"The appeal is two fold The music alone is incredibly attractive Soft loud dynamic songs that have great melodies, chord changes and even the return of some guitar solos. The lyrics are emotional and direct. Vocal styles can change from a whisper to a scream in just a few seconds. The main thing is the realness of the songs and the bands. The songs are direct and speak to the audience in a real way. The bands are real. They hang out with the audience more than ever before and after shows, so a strong connection is made."

Willy Wilson has a unique perspective as host of the Rhythm and Blues and Beyond show on 101 9-FM WDET, and as promoter for The Magic Bag on Woodward Avenue in Royal Oak, which presents top local and touring rock and Americana bands

"People are tired of being force fed music like Britney

Spears or the Simpson sisters That's why record companies are having a hard time, they're not developing bands," Wilson said "People want to be challenged with their music"

He said this explains the rise of The White Stripes, who create music from sources of inspiration that include traditional blues "I'm glad to see bands like the White Stripes doing so well," said Wilson "It encourages kids to pick up a guitar and make music.'

Last year around this time, some predicted The White Stripes' success would spark more attention to bands lumped in the "Detroit Garage Rock" bag, particularly The Von Bondies, pegged as the next big thing from Detroit Some said that if The Von Bondies could make it big after The White Stripes, even more Detroit bands could follow

It didn't happen – at least not yet. The Von Bondies Pawn Shoppe Heart got serious attention both nationally and internationally, but their popularity did not swell to the level anticipated by some rock writers

"I think they're a really great band and have a lot of potential They didn't sell multi-millions of records, but if you look you see growth from the first to the second record, and I can't wait for the next record," Wilson said.

Wilson notes that some popular Detroit bands labeled Garage Rock such as The Dirthombs and The Detroit Cobras aren't really Garage Rock at all, since they explore funk and R&B

"On other trends to look for in 2005, there's almost a




metal-leaning crossover pop glam rock trend," Wilson said The sound is epitomized by the hit band The Darkness

'They're not an imposing metal band, they're just rocking out having fun I just see it as a mixture of pop and metal They just want to turn up the volume and rock out A lot of new younger bands want to do the same thing

Record Time buyer James Teague doesnt see much changing in hip hop music 'I ve noticed a little bit in some of the newer hip hop tracks there is a tendency go a little more minimal, with less flashy production, like the new Snoop Dog *Drop it Like it's Hot* It's really simple and sounds like the early days of hip hop'

A trend to sample classic soul and disco vocals to create choruses for new recordings is waning, Teague said 'Kanye West has done that quite a bit – I haven't noticed it in any of his newer stuff

Hes observed more use of vintage drum machine and synthesizer sounds by some rock bands, evoking the late '70s and early '80s It's sort of a New Wave sound coming back a little,' Teague said On another trend Teague added, "I have noticed a jump in sales the past two years of solo singer songwriters like Elliott Smith and Jason Mraz"
