"I am amazed that my team was able to pull off a successful event with less than three months to organize and only two weeks to promote it as a ticketed event," Saunderson sard
'Now that we have a true number of attendees and an entire year to work with sponsors and the marketing, there is no reason why we can't increase the attendance for next year, particularly our international Detroit techno fans '

## Ron Howard masters sentimentality in Cinderella Man

Cinderella Man - People are sentimental, you know,' says Paul Glamatti as Jım Braddocks persuasive boxing manager 'Some people are sentimental" Director Ron Howard is one of them Its a trat that hampered him in some of his earlher films (Cocoon, Parenthood) but one that he learned to temper with $A$ Beautuful Mind, and in the process carned Oscars for best picture and best director for 2001 Howard has brought back that film's sense of emotional balance here - though he goes a bit gooey toward the end - along with its star (Russell Crowe) and screenwriter (Aksva Goldsman) So as you would expect, its flawlessly crafted, superbly acted and inteliggently written Braddock was a real-life prizefighter who came from behind to serve as a symbol of hope durmg the

Depression His story makes for a boxing picture that's as traditional as you can get, wath equal parts warm inspiration and cold, hard punches that send sweat beads flying, camera bulbs flashing and crowds roaring PG-13 for intense boxing violence and some language 138 mm Three stars out of four

Offering only dinner at first, on Monday of this week, Coleman and his chef/partner John Arnold began serving lunch also
Tangerine and sunshine yellow walls with suspended red pendant lights create a cheerful atmosphere where light wood floors and black top tables offer contrasts And what about all those chickens in the window, on shelves and nearly everywhere you look? "Simple,' Coleman sard "First, notice that the color of the many different chickens harmonize with the interior colors of this place

Then, count how many ways you can order chicken here We didn't choose the name Urban Wings without some thought ${ }^{\prime \prime}$
Coleman drives his concept home on a chalk board with a 1954 song lyric by Louns Jordan, band leader of Tympanı Five 'Anst nobody here but us chickens"

## CHICKEN AND RIBS

Colemans research indicated that the West Bloomfield area needed an other than-fried chick en and ribs concept He wanted the location to be near his Farmington Hills residence and a reasonably short drive from Beans \& Cornbread, so that he could personally manage both and that Arnold could direct both kitchens

There are a few chicken and ribs concepts in the metro Detroit area,' Coleman sald 'But our alm
is a fresh and healthy alternative to fast food Healthy-minded diners are seeking roast chicken, not fried What we do fry, is cooked with trans fat free ouls

Urban Wings is also one of only a few eateries offering Rubs that Moo' or beef ribs Chef John uses his own housemade secret barbecue sauce on both Texas-style beef and St Louls style baby back pork ribs Yet the taste is very different Beef has a stronger character, Arnold explaned, and it makes the sauce taste different"

Coleman added, Food should be simple and you should be able to taste it Barbecue sauce must be tangy and it should bite you back a bit"
