If the aerator isn't the

type "faucet repar" into the search engne If your investigation of the faucet proves frutless and nothing looks clogged, then it's time to scrutunze the nipples that come out of the wal
The nipples are connected to angle stops The nipples are connected to angle stops
(shut-off valves) that reside below the sink and (shut-oft valves)
aganst the wall

The first thing you should check is the faucet spout. Unscrew the aerator tip to remove it and turn on the water. If water comes out it means your culprit is a clogged aerator. Clean it with vinegar and a toothbrush.

The nipples and the shut-off valves are almost always made of dsfferent materals Electrolysis occurs when dissmilar metals are in contact
and the resultant corrosion can completely clog the inside of a nupple

It's good to be a Hyundar Motor executive or deal er these days, because this Korean make is defintely on a roll The company's vehicles are movng up smartly in qualty surveys Sales numbers are lookng good Kia, the company's one-time rival for the Korean auto-makng crown, has been vanquished
And Hyundan is in the process of re-launching every And Hyundal is in the process of re-aunching every
model in tts lineup over the next several months In fact, Hyundau not only is targeting Americ automakers who have been havng to get used to its aggressiveness and accomplishments lately - the company also is clearly going after the top-notch targets among Japanese automakers, the Toyotas and Hondas whose staple strength at sedan making is beeng challenged by a Korean com

The 2006 Hyundar Sonata is a great illustration of what's going on with the company overall Clearly, Sonata has compettors such as the Honda Accord and Toyota Camry in its sights And it's getting close enough to get off a good shot
Sonata's styling is very understated and Accordlike certannly, although there was one thing about he LX model I drove that especially stood out to me its
color, which Hyundat calls "dark cmnnamon" It's very rich and very appealing, and I haven't seen anything quite like it on any other vehcle
Anyway, Sonata's charms begin with the fact that it's far from a Far East-made, fuel-sipping econobox Measured strictly by its exterior dimensions, the new Sonata qualfies as a 'mid-size" car, even though the

responsive and quite quet The suspension features a parr of double-wshbones in front, like the Accord, and multuple links in back for benefits such as more sophisticated wheel control and flexbility This is a big mark in Sonata's favor
Sonata offers two engines the standard 24 -liter, four-cylnder wich produces 162 horsepower, whuch understand is adequate, and the engine in the version I drove, the 33 -liter V6 that puts out 235 horsepower Even with the V6, Sonata produces an EPA-rated 20 miles a gallon in the crty and a remarkable 30 mpg on the highway, which deserves huge kudos because the vehicle is so largely proportioned

The styling inside Sonata isn't anything in particular to write home about, includng rather drab stylng
and upholstery patterns But functionally it and upholstery patterns But functionally, 1 does bet-
ter, including a clear gauge cluster, efficient consoles and useful compartments, and radio and clmate conand usefui compartments, and radio and climate con-

Sonata also 15 remarkable for the amount of room? in the rear of the vehicle There's more space in the second row than practically any rival provides, ensurngg long-ride comfort even for three rear passengers

N'Dour also collaborated with Sting, Paul Simon, Tracy Chapman and Bruce Springsteen
You will hear all kinds of musical instruments and all kinds of notes and forms," Ba sald of N Dour's current work, which he categorized as world music
You could say m'balax is Senegal's equvalent to pop music in America, and that N'Dour is the king of $m$ ' $b a l$ $a x$
But that's only in terms of the
genre's notoriety M'balax may be Senegal's most wdely known contrbution to world culture, but the musical genre's rich history of tradition and profundity sets it far apart from pop
For one, creators and performers of m'balax comprise their own community and inherit the artistic role, which is that of a storyteller charged with passing along the country's important narratives
"They re called the 'gmots', and N'Dour is among the griots," said Ba "They are custodians telling the future generations about the history They sing the noble praise of the people

Likewise, the music, which relies heavily on percussion, is inherently narrative
'It is very different from other music It's a kand of language in and of itself You can hear the story and the feeling of the people," said Ba "Even of you are a fore1gner, you know it is sayng what this guy is actually sayng Its a talking drum It's mag1cal"

If I gave out ratings This would get $7 / 2$ stars becauseid be the kind of harsh critic that doesn $t$ hand out 10s easily

Therewas a time not long ago (this summer) when the Shout Out Louds were media darlings, instantly labeled

0"The Next Big Thing" When you are heavs-ly-influenced by the Cure, signed to Capitol Records and hall from Sweden, that label can be somewhat unavoidable The Shout Out Louds play the kind of retro pop that seems to be more typically coming out of New York these days Lo-fi, new wave-tinged $w{ }^{\text {th }} \mathrm{h}$ a focus on the melody and littered with staccato drumbeats, this is music that worships the wall lean And the wall lean's cousin, the stuck out hip
The albums opener, The Comeback, sounds radio-ready, so it's no surprise that when it was released as one of the albums singles, it found arrplay on MTV2

The albums older influences are more easily-deducible Morrissey is all over Please Please Pleasē Go Sadness rests on a Velvet Underground pulse, layered to the very top with Robert Smith There's Desperate Bicycles on 100 Degrees And, after listening to the whole record, I'm conynced that one wouldn't be far off in stating that Shout Out Louds are a younger generation's Wedding Present


But it's the reminiscence of the newer stuff, like Modest Mouse on Very Loud and Oh, Sweetheart and the boy girl back and forth a la Swearnng at Motornsts on $A$ Track and A Train, that sets the Shout Out Louds apart from therr plethora of contemporaries

In the end, Howl Howl Gaff Gaff is good, danceable fun Sure, its derivative, but at least its derivative from the right things If you take it too seriously, you ll
just want to pop in actual Wedding Present And, sometimes, well, sometimes it's nice not to think about it too much

Shout Out Louds will perform Tuesday at the Magic Stick in Detroit The Essex Green and The Sun open

## 'Cookers' simmers but doesn't catch fire

Ets not easy making a hero out of a drug dealer Just look at Blow, the Johnny Depp misfire
Cookers doesn't quite try to make drug dealers heros, but they certannly don $t$ generate a lot of sympathy And that's a big mistake when you have a film with
bascally a three-person cast
