## Curtain Going Up

Steve Allen's "Sophie" rancour musical at the Fisher, is testing new lines, songs, and situations in an effort to overcome a weak, insipid book. A few of the tunes that Steve has penned for this musical will bear whistling. Overall though the score is hard to hum on the way home. Old Wally's prediction: too much book to fix in the time left before it opens on Broadway... so "Sophie" will succumb quickly.

Re-writing could save the day. Art Lund's part could be fatted and many of the tinkly, tawdry vaudeville scenes could be deleted. Given enough latitude in the revision the musical biography on the career of Sophie Tucker might make the grade. It still would be better if some of Sophie's old tunes such as "Some of These Days" were included in the show. These songs are so much a part of her life that you inevitably miss them drastically. According to an interview with Steve Allen, the omission of such material was at the request of the producers. Let's hope that they change of heart. "Sophie" will be at the Fisher for another two weeks. You'll no doubt see some changes put into the show all during its run.

Dave Atkinson and Bev. Penberthy give talented performances in a most difficult avant-garde play. "Him" is the last of three plays that Mr. Atkinson has done for the Vanguard. His versatility was never more in evidence. Other commitments out in New York make it impossible for Dave to stay for the rousing Vanguard production of "The Hostage". I'm sure they would find a challenging role for him if he could stay. Let's hope we see more of Mr. Atkinson next season at the Vanguard.

Turning momentarily from the busy Detroit stages to the three-paneled magnificence of the latest Cinerama attractions at the Music Hall... "How The West Was Won"... you have to take stock of all the adjectives necessary for praising a motion picture one-in-a-decade event. "How The West Was Won" sweeps across the screen with the fury of the rapids seen early in the picture and ends boisterously with a train ride that leaves you limp. Never has American history been presented so beguiling. You sit back and marvel at the bravery our early pioneers. Their problems are yours when you view it through the majestic motion of the Cinerama screen. Truly surrounded... every Indian attack make your scalp tingle as you anticipate the worst possible action. Spencer Tracy's well-modulated narration gives you time to recover before the next exciting sequence. You'll have plenty of time to see this super-epic it's sure to be at the Music Hall for at least a year. Plan to go soon since I know you'll want to see the show at least a couple of times.

"Toys in the Attic" opened at the Stables Theater last week. Critics were generous in their praise of Drew Elliot and Shirley Otis. Shirley, as you recall, was in the Livonia-Redford production of "Majority of One." In "Toys in the Attic" she has a much larger part and she performs quite adequately. Pierre Le Marre has accomplished wonders in his small, intimate theater at 22 Charlotte Street since "Toys" is a big show to do at the Stables. They are performing the play every night but Wednesday. Wayne State University Players will conclude a two week run of "The American Dream" and "Zoo Story" by Albee on Sunday, March 17. Joe Barrett, Paul Stolarsky, and Norma Lee Simpson turned in outstanding acting jobs. Watch for the University of Detroit's repertory theatre to open its spring season on March 22 with Schiller's classic "Don Carlos" and Shaw's "Candida." University of Michigan will present the Spanish drama "The House of Bernarda Alba" on Wednesday, March 27 for a four day run.

"Music At Midnight" plays all this week at the Shubert. This absorbing drama about the struggle of a free country versus the communist territories is provocative and well-worth seeing. Plan on going with the local group on Friday night.

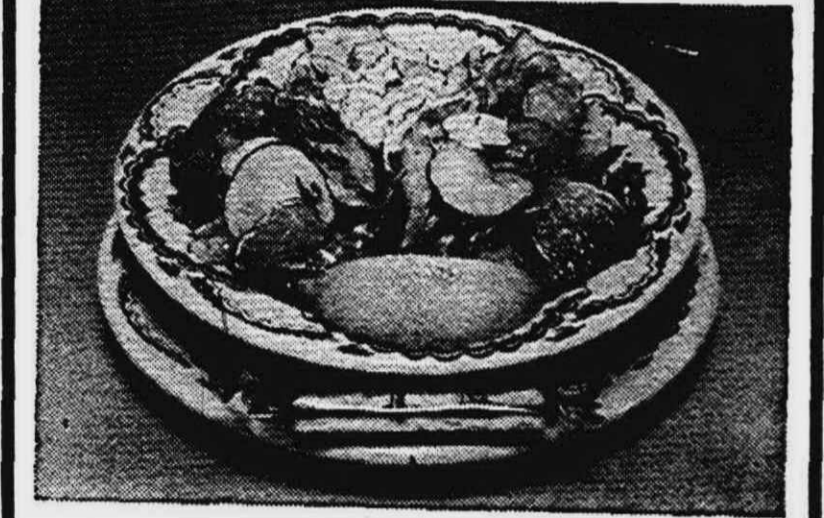
